# COMMANDERS DIARIES INSTRUCTIONS

### AIM

1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organization and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

### GENERAL

2. Entries are to be made daily on AF C 2118 (Adapted) each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.
3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties (Australia)", Chapter 2, Section 12.

### RESPONSIBILITY

#### During Non-operational Periods

4. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled by commanders of all formations.

#### During Operational Periods (1)

5. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled in duplicate by:
  - a. Commanders of all formations.
  - b. Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a brigadier or above.
  - c. Heads of services not below the rank of lieutenant colonel.
  - d. Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
  - e. Unit commanders.
  - f. Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

### COMPILATION

6. Both original and duplicate copies are to consist of:
  - a. Cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted).
  - b. Index as printed on cover.
  - c. Narrative (AF C 2118) (Adapted).
  - d. Annexes as shown in the Index.
7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes are to be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer is to be included.
8. The annexes are to be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an annex NIL will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters, the relevant papers should be grouped as annexes starting at B.

## DISPOSAL

13. **Original Commander's Diary.** This is to be forwarded monthly, unless otherwise ordered, by seventh day of the succeeding month direct to AHQ.
14. **Duplicate Commander's Diary.** This must be clearly marked as a duplicate. It is to be sent separately from the original to AHQ one month after the original has been despatched but not before the former has been acknowledged.
15. When overseas, both copies of diaries are to be sent through the Army Records organization in the overseas theatre but at different times.
16. **TOP SECRET Supplementary Diaries.**
- The documents referred to in Paragraph 9 together with a list of them made out on AF C 2118 (Adapted) must be placed in separate cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted). All details must be filled in and the cover clearly marked in red: "ANNEX Z — OFFICER ONLY". It may be convenient to group the papers by appendices.
  - Supplementary diaries must be forwarded under the normal rules for TOP SECRET correspondence, to AHQ. The inner envelope must be plainly marked:





1 ATF TAOR

General

1. The rather high level of enemy activity has declined somewhat this week with the majority of contacts occurring in the beginning of the reporting period. The enemy's method of operating remains generally the same however, daylight movement E & NE of the LONG HAIS by LONG DAT on 6 Nov appears unusual.

Order of Battle

2. A PW taken by 2 RAR/NZ near PHU MY on 4 Nov has given details of the formation of a new BA LONG Engr Coy, designated A2 Engr Coy. The PW stated that D65 has been permanently withdrawn from its normal AO to BA LONG Province near the NUI MAY TAO. Personnel have been drawn from D445, D440 and D65 to form the new unit and take over responsibility for mining the fire trails in NE PHUOC TUY and SW BIEN HOA. Current strength stands at 16, a HQ and 2 Pls.

En Units Ident and Incidents

3. a. D445 No ident of this unit was made during the week. Contacts with SAS patrols in the area of LONG B MA on 4&6 Nov 70, heavy track activity in the area of YS7482 almost certainly indicates the unit is in the general area. No result was established as a result of a contact yesterday with 7 RAR in vic YS8073, however the tactics and weaponing of the 8-15 en indicate poss elm of D445.

b. LONG DAT The LONG DAT security section and AN NGAI Guerrilla unit were ident in contact with 7 RAR on 6 Nov near LONG HAI. A sighting of VC by MSF on 5 Nov was probably also LONG DAT.

c. CHAU DUC. The VC who rallied to the Ready Reaction Force on 2 Nov, near Phu MY, after being wounded in a contact on 31 Oct has given further information on the movements of CHAU DUC. A recapitulation of the movements since early Oct is as follows,

(1) 9 Oct 70. All agencies returned to the NUI DINHS.

(2) 11 Oct 70. A supply party of 12 was sent to HOA LONG. 2 members of this gp rallied, the remaining 10 had not returned to the NUI DINH'S by 24 Oct.

(3) 17 Oct 70. The remaining members were split into three gps, the major gp stayed in the NUI DINH'S, 30 members went to NGAI GIAO and a smaller gp to THAI THIEN.

(4) 22 Oct 70. The gp from THAI THIEN returned to the NUI DINH'S with 40 litres of rice.

(5) 24 Oct 70. CHAU DUC sent a supply party to PHU MY. They were contacted on 31 Oct by 2 RAR resulting in 1 KIA and 1 HOI CHANH.

(6) The party that went to NGAI GIAO divided into 2 gps, the one commanded SAU SUONG remains in that general area, the other with THI BA THAO (the asst PCS) has returned to BA LONG Prov HQ possibly as a protection element for four signallers returning a damaged radio.

The major portion of CHAU DUC probably remains located in caves in the NUI BAO QUAN.

Enemy Capabilities and Intentions

4. There is no change to previously reported assessments. One infiltration of HOA LONG was reported during the week, by a small gp from CHAU DUC on 6 Nov. This gp may have been arranging supplies to be picked up by a larger gp from the unit early this week. A resupply from HOA LONG or from LONG SON using the VUNG TAU CITY units contacts will possibly occur in the near future.

1. Enemy initiated activity remained at a low level last week and was characterised by 10 small scale attacks by fire. Torrential rain undoubtedly restricted enemy activity, and allied ops although hampered by rain, probably continued to pre-empt some en activity as well.

2. One small arms cache was located near TA LUONG and 4 rice caches totaling 9 tons were located. There were 5 significant contacts resulting in 93 en KIA, mainly from VC QUANG DA Province.

MR 2

3. Enemy activity in MR2 occurred mainly in VC MR 5. Severe flooding in the coastal plains and some highland valleys undoubtedly restricted local en activity.

4. There were 3 significant ground attacks during the reporting period

a. Elms 8 LF Bn in VC BINH DINH Province attacked PSDF Security force nth of BON SON, on 6 Nov. Res Frd 9 KIA 2 WIA 2 wpns MIA.

b. On 2 Nov 9 LF Bn (PHU YEN) entered TON LONG hamlet abducting 12 Civs- 70 PF Pl did not react.

c. 177 RF Coy were engaged by an estimated 2 pls of local guerillas NE of PHAN RANG. Res 2 Frd KIA 10 Frd WIA.

There were 7 ABF'S of which 4 consisted of 20 plus rds.

MR 3

5. En initiated activity remained at a low level despite indications of a planned increase of offensive activity in some of the sub-regions. In consonance with his declining ability to supply his military units in some areas, the en is increasing his emphasis on guerrilla ops to harass allied units and intimidate the population.

6. On 1 Nov 70, PHU LOI base camp received 8 X 107mm Rkts wounding 2 US personnel. Poss 516 Rocket Coy SR 5. On 2 Nov 70, 4 X 122mm Rockets impacted in SW portion of SAIGON. 6 Civs KIA 15 WIA. Gunships and Arty reacted with U/K res, poss 74 NVA Arty Regt. On 5 Nov 61 PF Pl outpost was attacked by elms 264 LF Bns results: 5 PF KIA 10 PF WIA, unk en loss.

MR 4

7. Enemy initiated activity fluctuated between light and moderate level directed against the pacification effort. 6 scattered ABF's took place mainly against PF/RF post resulting in 29 Frd KIA 61 WIA and 9 MIA for a known en loss of 7 KIA. During the coming week, activity is expected to remain at a moderate level as the en continues to direct pressure against PF and RF posts.

GENERAL

1. The level of activity decreased significantly during the week, with only 4 contacts with no result on ~~position or~~ unit identification.

POSITIVE

Enemy Unit Ident

2. D445. No firm ident has been made of D445 during the week. Numerous signs of activity in the area E 63-66, N 78-81, which was used in the past as a trg area for D445, could possibly indicate that a coy of D445 is moving through the area prior to its re-entry into Tan Ruu/Song Rai area. There appears to be a link between the enemy activity to the east of Xuyen Moc and the known locations of the VC gardens. and the presence of D445 in this area may be related to recent harvest at this time.

3. CHAU DUC. No firm ident has been made of CHAU DUC in the last week. An agent report indicated that an element of CHAU DUC has moved from the NUI DINHS in th RUNG SAT, north of LONG SON. Recent discovery of extensive and well constructed bunker systems in the area, lends credence to earlier assessments, that a number of en gps besides CHAU DUC have been relocated from the general area of route 15 into this area. Sniffer readings and track patterns north of the NUI DINHS indicate that an element of CHAU DUC have moved through the area. A group of CHAU DUC is still loc in the area of NGAI GIAO.

LONG DAT, D65 and A2 Province Engr Coy.

4. No new confirmed info has been received regarding any of these gps. The discovery of bunkers over the last 3 days and a 7 ton rics cache yesterday, SE of XUYEN MOC by 7 RAR, indicates that this is a cache area, probably built by the PHOUC BUU Guerrillas on behalf of the XUYEN MOC rear services. This unit has traditionally been employed in a rear services role providing supplies for D445 and BA LONG.

En Capabilities and Intentions

5. No change.

1 ATF TAOR

General

1. Three enemy initiated incidents occurred in the TAOR during the past week which represented a significant rise compared to the recent reporting periods. 1 ATF had 8 contacts resulting in 4 enemy KIA and 1 possible.

Enemy Initiated Incidents and Identifications

2. At 2155H on 29 Nov 70, a reinforced enemy of 50 - 60 VC, possibly C2 and C3, of D445, launched a ground attack against 386 RF compound supported by 60mm mortar fire against NHAN DUC hamlet (3 rds) Artillery compound (3 rds) and District HQ (18 rds) 386 RF received 6 rds. The enemy successfully breached the wire and systematically began to search for equipment. The results were 6 RF/PF KIA, 5 RF/PF WIA, 4 Civs WIA, 6 RF/PF CIA (3 later released) 10 X .45 pistols MIA, 39 M16 MIA, 1 X M60 MIA, 1 X M79, 66 bayonets MIA 2 X AN PRC 25 radio sets MIA and 600 kilos of rice MIA.

3. The three RF who were released said that the main body went west and then moved south and east where they camped at approx YS6865 then moved NE. The attack was noteworthy not only because of the liberal amount of mortar and RPG ammo expended, but clearly indicated that the LF enemy retain the capacity to harass isolated GVN agencies.

4. On 1 Dec 70, at 2030H, a composite Radar and protection party from 1st NZ were engaged by 3-4 enemy with automatic weapons fire. Enemy involved were possibly LONG SON Guerrillas.

5. On 2 Dec 70, at approx 0255, 1st RF Coy received an attack by 2 enemy using SA fire. Enemy involved were possibly PHUOC HAI Guerrillas or LONG DAT. Results 1 RF WIA.

Enemy Locations

6. D445. The location of the unit is unknown at the present time, but is possibly NE of XUYEN MOC.

7. LONG DAT DIST. 2 VC KIA in the LONG HAIS on 27 Nov have been identified as coming from the Mortar Sect C25. The daylight movement is unusual; the main body of LONG DAT remain in the LONG HAIS possibly in the NUI CHAU VUEN feature.

8. No identification was made with CHAU DUC during the week, the main body is believed to be in the NUI DINHs with elements in the RUNG SAT north of LONG SON and an element in NGIA GIAO.

9. No info has been forthcoming concerning D65 A2 Province Engr Coy, Baria or VUNG TAU City units.

OTHER ITEMS OF REPORTING INTEREST

10. VN Special Forces on 3 Dec 70, killed 15 enemy out of 15 engaged in the vicinity of YS 234685. Tentatively identified as being from H212 Hosp/SR 4.

MR 1

1. In MR 1, last week, enemy initiated activity was at a low level and characterised by attacks by fire and harassment. Again, the enemy attempted to avoid major contact with Allied units and was concerned primarily with logistical activities.

2. On 26 Nov 70, in THAU THIEN Province, 132 and 918 RF Coys while guarding 2 railroad bridges received a mortar and ground attack from an unk sized en force, possibly PHU LOC LF Bn MRTTH. One bridge was destroyed and one heavily damaged, 2 RF KIA, 13 RF WIA, 2 US WIA, 2 RF MIA and 6 I/Wpns lost, the en losses were unk.

MR 2

3. In MR 2, last week, enemy initiated activity generally remained at a low level and was characterised by light and scattered attacks by fire and limited ground probes. Harassing actions along lines of communication, in particular on QL 19, continued at an increased level (up about 50% for the past 2 weeks), undoubtedly as a reaction to ARVN ops in Base Area 701 and the withdrawal of elements of the 4 Inf Div. Such an increase is also in accordance with en plans for a winter offensive. The disposition of major enemy units in the MR remained generally unchanged, and most major units remained out of contact.

4. On 21 Nov 70, at the MANG GIANG PASS a US and an ARVN convoy travelling in opposite directions sustained mortar, SA, RPG and auto wpns fire from an est en Bn poss from 95B NVA Regt, the results were 8 Frd KIA, 15 Frd WIA and 7 vehicles dest, 11 veh damaged and 30,000 gals of pol dest.

MR 3

5. Enemy activity remained at its current low level last week as most enemy units continued to maintain a low profile and avoid contact. The en pattern of creating light to moderate indirect fire attacks against widely scattered targets continued, with 2 light rocket attacks against the QUAN LOI Base camp and VUNG TAU City. This indicates that the en attempted to demonstrate his military presence within the MR while he concentrated on contesting the GVN pacification prog. at the hamlet and village level. Agent reports and other sources continued to indicate that the en has a planned phase of increased activity, possibly toward the end of Dec. TAY NINH Province and areas west of saigon are the most likely targets. Additionally, a prisoner captured near VO DAT indicates the 33 NVA Regiment has planned to disrupt the dry season harvest ops in the rice bowl area of BINH TUY Province. Recently 1 and 2 Bns of the Regt have been ident in the area.

6. On the 21 Nov, NE of CO DAU HA, an Unk sized en force, poss D14 LF Bn initiated a series of contacts with RF, PF and PSDF resulting in 5 Frd KIA, 12 WIA for an en loss of 3 KIA.

7. On 27 Nov NE of XUAN LOC, several PSDF personnel defected and sabotaged the 70 PF pls comms bunker, they then joined an Unk sized en force, poss 1/274 VC MF Regt to attack an RF compound. Results 5 PF KIA, 7 PF WIA and 5 PF MIA 21 I/Wpns were lost along with 3 radio sets.

8. On 26 Nov 70, at TAN NHUT Village, 301 RF Bn, 187 PF pl and 36 PSDF received 8 X 60mm Mor rds plus RPGs and SA fire from an est en coy possibly 6 VC Bn LONG AN. The results were 5 Frd KIA, 3 Frd WIA, 1 Frd MIA, 7 X M16 MIA and 1 PRC 10 radio MIA.

MR 4

9. During the past week, in MR 4, enemy initiated activity rose slightly to a moderate level. Outposts, troop positions, and lines of communication remained primary targets of the enemy's conservation of force tactics. These tactics, in the form of stand off attacks and limited ground attacks achieved substantial results, at a minimal cost, indicating that the en selected his targets well.

10. The enemy initiated 9 major ground actions and 6 mortar and other indirect fire attacks resulting in 47 KIA 140 WIA for an known en loss of 8 KIA.

  - (3) US Logistic HQ operating in direct support of 1 ALSG.
- h. Planning, execution and command of any deployment of a forward ALSG detachment in support of 1 ATF operations.

Staff Capt Q (Ops)

- 2. The Staff Capt Q (Ops) is responsible to DAQMG (Maint) for:
  - a. Receiving, processing, co-ordinating and aquitting all signal demands placed by 1 ATF or other Australian units including :
    - (1) Maintenance Demands (MAINTDEMS)
    - (2) Priority Maintenance Demands (PRIMAINTEMS)
    - (3) Operationally urgent Demands (OPDEMS)
  - b. Supervision of and follow-up action on any 'to follow' items arising out of signal demands.
  - c. Supervision of and reporting of any misuse of signal demand procedures.

  - (5) Maintaining a table of equipment operators by name, unit and expected date of RTA. Arranging with G Branch for necessary courses to provide replacements for equipment handlers who are RTA.

  - (9) Vietnam Regional Exchange.
- d. Attendance at the Logistic Operations Co-ordinating Conference (LOC). LOC is held at HQ USASUPCOM, SGN at 0745 hours daily except Sun.
- e. Contact Q Ops Branch of HQ 1 ALSG at 0730 and 1630 hours daily and before leaving the Long Binh area.
- f. Ensuring that a contact telephone number is left with the duty officer at the Branch of the AC/S Security Plans and Operations (SP and O) when absent from USASUPCOM SGN.
- g. Monitoring the logistic flow of 1 ALSG requirements from Long Binh to Vung Tau. In this regard the SSCLO is to :
  - (1) React to problems encountered by HQ AFV and HQ 1 ALSG in obtaining information on stores from Long Binh depots.
  - (2) Follow through all operational demands ( Combat Emergency ) and advise Q Ops Branch of completion of action at Long Binh

7. Staff Capt Q (Mov) is responsible for planning and staff supervision of general administrative movement in so far as Det 11 MC Gp has responsibilities to HQ AFV for such movement.



SECTION 11

PROPERTY DISPOSAL YARD PROCEDURES

General

1. The Property Disposal Yard (PDO) is a US Army installation located at Long Binh. The PDO makes available surplus or used items written off US Army unit ledgers.
2. Free World Forces have access to the PDO Yard.

Purpose

3. The facilities of the PDO Yard are available to 1 ALSG units for salvage material for which no entitlement exists. The material is for unit and not individual use.

Conduct

4. Authorization. Accordingly requests for PDO material may be made only on behalf of the unit commander by the senior Q representative, such as the QM, CQMS or SQMS. A register of authorised ordering personnel is to be held at Logistic Operations Branch of HQ 1 ALSG. Units are responsible to keep the register up to date by advising the operations clerk of changes of postings.
5. Procedure. The request procedure is as follows :
  - a. Units forward copy of demand/receipt form (Annex ) in duplicate to Logistic Operations Branch.
  - b. Staff Capt Q Ops will forward consolidation of requests to SSCLO by telephone.
  - c. No more frequently than once a month, SSCLO will arrange with PDO for available demanded items to be drawn and will advise Logistic Operations Branch of the collection date.
  - d. Staff Capt Q Ops will notify all units concerned and task a vehicle for collection of the material.
  - e. The vehicle and authorized unit representative are to report to SSCLO at Long Binh with the number one copy of the demand/receipt form (from Staff Capt Q Ops).
  - f. Material will be signed for by SSCLO. Individual items are to be signed for on the same docket by the unit representatives.
  - g. The SSCLO will adjust the copy of the demand/receipt form which will be signed by the unit representative and retained.

h. Within 3 days of receipt units are to take the material to charge as if it was Regimental Property in accordance with the provisions of Standing Orders for Equipment. Staff Capt Q Ops is to be advised of the CRV number for endorsement of the number two copy of the demand/receipt.

i. Logistic Operations Branch is to maintain a file of demand/receipt vouchers and supporting US Army dockets.

6. Restrictions. Units are expressly prohibited from making direct contact with PDO Yard.

INTRODUCTION OF THE JOINT SERVICES STAFF MANUAL -  
SERVICE WRITING JSP(AS)102 - CORRESPONDENCE

References: A. Joint Services Staff Manual - Service Writing JSP(AS)102  
B. AHQ 810/R8/45 of 4 Sep 70

1. The replacement of SD(Aust) by JSP(AS)102 as the authoritative publication on service writing has introduced changes in the types and layout of correspondence applicable to the Army. The purpose of this letter is to point out the significant changes, and where appropriate, provide supplementary information to assist in their implementation.

Types of Correspondence (Chapter 3 paragraphs 309, 313, 314, 315 and 319)

2. The two types of correspondence listed in SD (Aust) as 'Service Letters' and 'Inter-Departmental Correspondence' are defined as 'Official Letters' in JSP(AS)102. Apart from terminology, there is no change in the format or description of these letters.

3. JSP(AS)102 refers to 'memoranda' as a type of correspondence. AHQ is at present considering its adoption for Army use and at the same time the desirability of introducing a combined 'Handwritten Memorandum and Minute Form'. Until this matter is resolved the memoranda as described is not to be used by Army.

Sub-Paragraphing (Chapter 2, paragraph 241 and Annex B)

4. Changes relate to the use of punctuation, capitals, lower case and block indenting. The rules applying to sub-paragraphs are as follows:

- a. Where sub-paragraphs contain complete sentences they should commence with a capital letter and end with a full stop. Such sub-paragraphs should be introduced by a complete sentence. An example is this sub-paragraph and the sentence immediately before it.
- b. Where sub-paragraphs are not sentences they should commence in lower case and end with a comma or semi-colon as appropriate. They are introduced by an incomplete sentence. In a listing of such sub-paragraphs the word 'and' is placed at the end of the second last sub-paragraph, and the last sub-paragraph ends with a full stop, eg,

/ 'Capital



'Capital letters are used for every letter of:

- a. subject or title,
  - b. main headings,
  - c. codewords, and
  - d. security classifications.'
- c. For sub-paragraphs such as described in b. a comma is used at the end of each where there is no other punctuation in the sub-paragraph. Otherwise a semi-colon is used. Do not use a mixture of commas and semi-colons in the one listing of sub-paragraphs.
- d. A combination of complete and incomplete sentences is not acceptable. Therefore, care must be exercised in composition of paragraphs which contain sub-paragraphs.
- e. Indenting of sub-paragraphs is such that successive lines start directly under the first letter of the text as in these sub-paragraphs.

Subscription Block (Chapter 2 paragraphs 229-235 and Annex E)

5. The significant change from the rules contained in SD (Aust) is in the situation where an officer signs for a superior. This rule is amplified as follows:

- a. When a subordinate staff officer knows he will be signing for a superior, the word 'for' is typed before the superior's appointment in the subscription, eg,

- b. When the subordinate staff officer signs in the absence of his superior over the superior's subscription, he writes his rank after his signature and writes the word 'for' before his superior's rank in the subscription, eg,

### Abbreviations

6. Although there is no change in the rules for the use of abbreviations, JSP(AS)102 unfortunately gives the impression in examples of types of correspondence that they should not be used in addresses, dates and subscription blocks. The position is that abbreviations may be used in all forms of correspondence within the Army. Rules governing their use other than within the Army are laid down in Chapter 2, paragraph 246.

### Layout of a Minute (Chapter 3 paragraph 320 and Annex H)

7. Due to the Army printed minute form being different from that shown in the example in JSP(AS)102, it is necessary to adopt a modified layout pending the introduction of a minute form common to all Services. The difference is that the Army form makes provision for addressees.

8. The layout to be adopted is as follows:

- a. When using existing stocks of the Army minute form, continue the present procedure of showing addressees on the addressee printed line, eg,  
  
To Ops; Trg; For Information: Engrs
- b. When typing a minute to multiple addressees necessitating the use of plain paper or multilith masters, follow the format shown in the reference. This format, it will be appreciated, follows the layout for action addressees, information addressees and references used in official letters. An example is given at Annex A.

(1) Fork lift/operator state is critical. Up to date accurate information must be passed immediately to SCQ (Ops) if the states of any equipment or operators change before the arrival of the "Jeparit". Requirements at local discharge points can be met at the moment.

(2) Attention is directed to both the safety precautions in use of equipments and the guide lines issued by G Branch to assist Officers to exercise their prerogative.

(3) All units concerned in the operations are to be familiar with the provisions of ALSG Standing Orders. Briefings must be accurate and cover all detail. No officer or other rank is to be in any doubt as to the full nature of his duties. Furthermore dereliction of duties detected by any officer is to be reported to me or SCQ (Mov) immediately - not one voyage later.

c. Accuracy of Information. It is essential that information passed to Log Ops Branch requiring action at US Army logistic, HQ's is checked for accuracy. It is both unprofessional and quite contrary to the interest of the Force to establish a reputation for inaccurate complaints. On the other hand, armed with detailed pertinent information, appropriate action can be taken at USASUPCOM level.

d. Visit to USASUPCOM. DAQMG (MAINT) will visit SSC Mon/Tue next week. Please ensure that problems currently being worked on are updated by midday 30 Nov 70. Details of new problems required in writing by midday 30 Nov 70.

e. POL and Rations. Significant short falls experienced in both these commodities during the week. It is hoped that they will be made up by Mon next week without any ill effects being felt by units. The predicted exception to this will be the continual shortage in Propane. Rationing will continue when stocks become available.

9. Comments

a. The city has been reasonably quiet except for two nights 24/25 Nov. On Tuesday several incidents occurred involving our troops and ARVN paratroopers. No one was injured and our patrols were on the scene to break up the disturbances before they worsened. On Wed night at 1800 hrs an incident occurred near the Flags Area which involved our soldiers, ARVN and Vietnamese "cowboys". Stones were thrown by the cowboys which resulted in five Australian soldiers being injured and treated for minor cuts at 1 Aust Fd Hosp. At the Chief of Police Conference this morning, it was reported that an Australian serviceman tore up a Vietnamese flag at about 1800 hrs on Wed 25 Nov, and escaped from an angry crowd. SIB are investigating to apprehend the soldier. At present Sp Coy 7 RAR are on leave.

122. ALLOWANCES FOR OFFICERS OF AFV VISITING SAIGON.

1. It has been the practice for HQ AFV to pay the hotel account for cost of meals and accommodation for officers visiting Saigon overnight and who are accommodated, for example, at the Continental or Embassy Hotels.
2. Because all charges are included in the account received by HQ AFV, an unnecessary additional administrative workload is created in determining admissable charges and recovering inadmissable charges.
3. In future HQ AFV will pay the account for the cost of accommodation only and the officer will be paid the normal Saigon Meal Allowance of \$US 5.00 per day to pay the cost of meals. This allowance may be drawn on arrival in Saigon.

123. OBSCENE LANGUAGE
