COMMANDERS DIARIES  
INSTRUCTIONS

AIM

- 1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organization and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

GENERAL

- 2. Entries are to be made daily on AF C 2118 (Adapted) each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.
- 3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties (Australia)" Chapter 2, Section 12.

RESPONSIBILITY

During Non-operational Periods

- 4. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled by commanders of all formations.

During Operational Periods (1)

- 5. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled in duplicate by:
  - a. Commanders of all formations.
  - b. Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a brigadier or above.
  - c. Heads of services not below the rank of lieutenant colonel.
  - d. Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
  - e. Unit commanders.
  - f. Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

COMPILATION

- 6. Both original and duplicate copies are to consist of:
  - a. Cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted).
  - b. Index as printed on cover.
  - c. Narrative (AF C 2118) (Adapted).
  - d. Annexes as shown in the Index.
- 7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes are to be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer is to be included.
- 8. The annexes are to be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an annex NIL will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters, the relevant papers should be grouped as annexes starting at B.

**DISPOSAL**

13. **Original Commander's Diary.** This is to be forwarded monthly, unless otherwise ordered, by the seventh day of the succeeding month direct to AHQ.

14. **Duplicate Commander's Diary.** This must be clearly marked as a duplicate. It is to be sent separately from the original to AHQ one month after the original has been despatched but not before the former has been acknowledged.

15. When overseas, both copies of diaries are to be sent through the Army Records organization in the overseas theatre but at different times.

16. **TOP SECRET Supplementary Diaries.**

a. The documents referred to in Paragraph 9 together with a list of them made out on AF C 2118 (Adapted) must be placed in separate cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted). All details must be filled in and the cover clearly marked in red: "ANNEX Z — OFFICER ONLY". It may be convenient to group the papers by appendices.

b. Supplementary diaries must be forwarded under the normal rules for TOP SECRET correspondence, to AHQ. The inner envelope must be plainly marked:



Movement Instruction 1/71 HMAS Jeparit - Voyage 35

Time zone used throughout the instruction: HOTEL

1. Situation.

HMAS Jeparit's ETA Vung Tau is 21 Jan 71. The vessel is carrying s/tons of cargo for discharge at Vung Tau. On completion of the discharge it is to backload approximately s/tons for RTA.

2. Mission.

To discharge/backload HMAS Jeparit during the period 21 - 26 Jan 71.

3. Execution.

a. General Outline. The discharge/backload of the vessel is to be carried out in three phases:

(1) Phase 1 Discharge of dangerous cargo at anchorage B16 in Vung Tau Roads.

(2) Phase 2 Discharge of general cargo. The vessel will berth at De Long Pier to discharge all general cargo.

(3) Phase 3 Backloading is to commence as soon as one hold is empty. All backload is to be ready for call forward at 2 hours notice from 220700H.

e. Shifts. Two 12 hour shifts are to be worked daily. These are to be:

f. Security. The D & E Pl, in conjunction with AFV Pro Unit, is responsible for a 24 hour surveillance of the discharge/backload operation, to guard pilferage and any form of attack against the ship, cargo or personnel.

g. Hatch - guards/Shotguns/Picquets. The following units are to provide D & E Pl with personnel for the above duties during the period 21 - 26 Jan 71, and personnel detailed are to report to the HQ 1 ALSG Conference Room at 191400H for briefing by D & E Pl Comd, 2Lt C. Anderson:

h. Military Police AFV Pro Unit personnel are to set up a Traffic control point at the southern end of the De Long Pier and a personnel check point at the foot of the vessel's gangway. The De Long Pier is out of bounds to all personnel not having a specific task in the discharge/backload and to all vehicles not listed in sub - paragraph 4.C. of this instruction.

i. Briefing All members involved in the discharge/backload operation are to report to the 1 ALSG Conference room at 191400H for briefing. Instructions to be given to all security personnel are attached as Annex 'B'.

Administration and Logistics

a. Transport

(1) Discharge Alaska Barge and Transport and 5 Coy RAASC vehicles are to be used for the movement of cargo from the De Long Pier to 1 ALSG area. AB & T will move the major portion of the cargo. 5 Coy is to provide 2 x 5 ton trucks, fitted with high - sides, for the movement of small or broken items to Det 30 Terminal Sqn yard. These vehicles are to be available at 2 hours notice.

(2) Backload All units are responsible for arranging for the movement of unit cargo for backload to the De Long Pier. This is to be done through SCQ (Ops).

(3) Water Tanker 5 Coy RAASC is to provide 1 x 5000 gallon water tanker and operator for the washdown point. This is to be in position at the De Long Pier by 230700H.

e. Washdown Point The washdown point is to be established immediately to the south of the De Long Pier. It will operate during daylight hours, but units providing personnel to man it are to ensure that relief personnel are available on the change of shifts in case it is required to operate at night. The washdown point is to be under the direct control of the Terminal Supervisor of each shift. The following units are to man the washdown point:

(1) 5 Coy RAASC	1 driver
(2) 55 EWPS	1 NCO
(3) 2 AOD	1 OR

f. Rations. HQ Coy 1 ALSG is to provide rations for all personnel on duty at De Long Pier during the discharge/backload operation. The picquet commander on each shift is to notify the R&F kitchen of the number of meals required by each shift.

g. Quarantine Civil health authorities in Australia and Army Medical staffs here have requested that special attention be given to preventing rodents from boarding the vessel while it is in Vung Tau. Plague infested rats have been found in the Vung Tau area.

5.

Command and Signals

a. Control SCQ (Mov) is to exercise overall control of the vessel's turnaround. The working of the vessel and call forward of backload are to be controlled by the Terminal Supervisor of each shift.

b. Communications See Annex 'A'.

c. Signal Operators 110 Sig Sqn is to provide a total of four operators (two for each shift) for the period of the discharge/backload operation. The operators are to report to the HQ 1 ALSG Conference Room at 191400H for briefing.



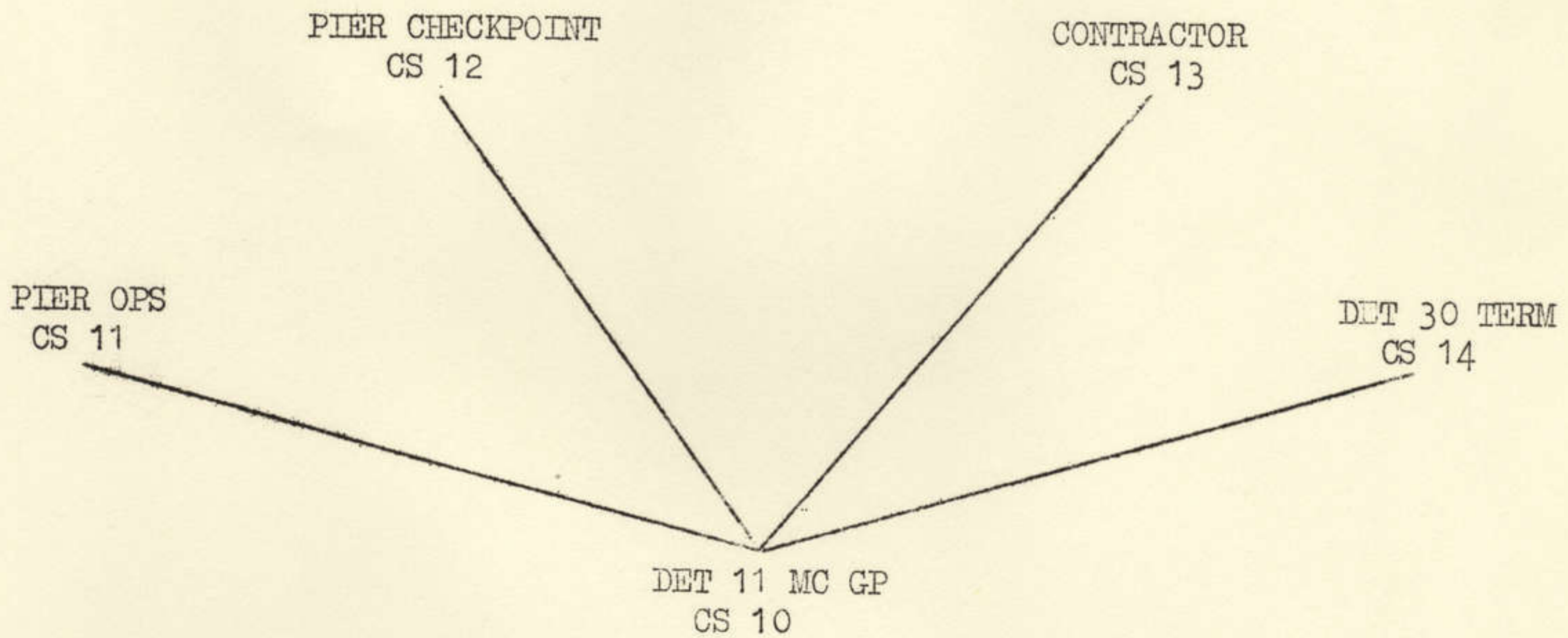

RESPONSIBILITIES OF SECURITY PERSONNEL

1. The following details the responsibilities of personnel acting as Hatchguards, Shotguns and Picquets while the vessel is at Vung Tau:

a. Hatchguards.

- (1) Are posted in the ships hold.
- (2) Are to remain in the hold until relieved by the Picquet Comd.
- (3) Are to report pilferage by any person immediately it is seen. The Picquet Comd is to be called and he will inform the Provost on duty at the gangway.
- (4) Are to take up a position of safety in the hold, from where all stevedores working can be watched.
- (5) State of weapon readiness is 'LOADED'.
- (6) Are not to read during tour in hold.
- (7) Are not to consume alcoholic liquor during the 12 hour shift.
- (8) Are to wear uniform properly at all times.

b. Picquets.

- (1) Are to remain at their post until relieved by the Picquet Comd.
- (2) Are to continually search the water surrounding the ship in their area of responsibility (this will be detailed by the Picquet Comd.)
- (3) Are to throw concussion grenades into the water in their area of responsibility during the hours of darkness. These are to be thrown at least 10 yards from the vessel to prevent hull damage.
- (4) Are to inform the Picquet Comd immediately any floating object is sighted that is not readily identifiable. The normal Rules of Engagement for 1 ALSG apply when a swimmer is sighted. The Picquet Comd will decide whether or not floating objects are to be engaged by fire.

- (5) Are not to read whilst at post.
- (6) Are not to consume alcoholic liquor during their 12 hour tour of duty.
- (7) Are to wear uniform and equipment properly at all times.
- (8) State of weapon readiness is 'LOADED'.

c. Shotguns.

- (1) Are to position themselves on the vehicle from where they are able to both control the driver and see all of the cargo.
- (2) Are not to sit in the drivers cab under any circumstances.
- (3) Are to stop the vehicle immediately on seeing a piece of cargo fall from the truck or in danger of falling.
- (4) Normal Rules of Engagement for 1 ALSG apply during the time the vehicle is moving between De Long Pier and 1 ALSG area.
- (5) In the event of cargo falling from the vehicle, the first passing Australian vehicle is to be stopped and the senior member is to be instructed to ring the SC Q(Ops) during working hours or the 1 ALSG Duty Officer after hours.
- (6) Are not to read while at post.
- (7) Are not to consume alcoholic liquor during the 12 hour shift.
- (8) Are to wear uniform and equipment properly at all times.
- (9) State of weapon readiness is to be:
  - 'LOADED' to - on between 0600 hrs and 2300 hrs.
  - 'ACTION' to - on between 2300 hrs and 0600 hrs, during 12 hour tour of duty.
- (7) Are to wear uniform and equipment properly at all times.
- (8) State of weapon readiness is 'LOADED'.

c. Shotguns.

- (1) Are to position themselves on the vehicle from where they are able to both control the driver and see all of the cargo.
- (2) Are not to sit in the drivers cab under any circumstances.
- (3) Are to stop the vehicle immediately on seeing a piece of cargo fall from the truck or in danger of falling.
- (4) Normal Rules of Engagement for 1 ALSG apply during the time the vehicle is moving between De Long Pier and 1 ALSG area.
- (5) In the event of cargo falling from the vehicle, the first passing Australian vehicle is to be stopped and the senior member is to be instructed to ring the SC Q(Ops) during working hours or the 1 ALSG Duty Officer after hours.
- (6) Are not to read while at post.
- (7) Are not to consume alcoholic liquor during the 12 hour shift.
- (8) Are to wear uniform and equipment properly at all times.
- (9) State of weapon readiness is to be:
  - 'LOADED' to - on between 0600 hrs and 2300 hrs.
  - 'ACTION' to - on between 2300 hrs and 0600 hrs, during 12 hour tour of duty.
- (7) Are to wear uniform and equipment properly at all times.

1 ATF TAOR

General

1. The level of enemy activity rose during the week with 1 ATF having 5 contacts for 24 enemy KIA.

En Unit Identification

2. D445 On 31 Dec 70, SE of XUYEN MOC (YS 690668) HQ B/7 RAR and 1 Sect 1 Tp B Sqn 3 Cav Regt ambushed approx 40 VC resulting in 21 en KIA (BC) 9 WIA (BT) 13 I/Wpns and 4 CS Wpns CIA. En KIA were ident as: 2ic D445, members of C2 Coy D445, Recce Pl C5 D445, PCS LONG DIEN (Rural) and several LONG DAT Committee members.

Comment. The presence of the VCI with D445, apart from liaison, is not clear. It is possible that D445 were planning further ops in the LONG DAT area.

3. A HOI CHANH who rallied to NUI NHON yesterday (7 Dec 70) stated that after the contact on 31 Dec 70, C2, C3, and C4 had all withdrawn back to the NUI MAY TAOs having only a small party in the area. He made no mention of C1/D445 which is still in the LONG HAI. He is still undergoing interrogation.

4. C1/D445 / LONG DAT: A number of incidents have occurred in the LONG DAT area during the reporting period. The enemy unit responsible has not been identified but is either C1/D445 or LONG DAT (C25).

5. On 30 Dec 70 at LANG PHUOC HAI (YS513527) 124 RF were engaged by an estimated Pl of en using SA and B40 fire, resulting in 1 RF KIA, 4 RF WIA. En cas unk. On 31 Dec 70, NW of PHUOC HAI (YS490551) Aslt Pnr Pl 7 RAR contacted 3-4 en with no result.

6. On 4 Jan 70, MATT 5 with 701 RF Coy reported receiving 50 - 60 X 60mm Mor and SA fire from 3 base plate posns at YS 490505, YS 484504 and YS 486506. Bushrangers suppressed the area and no Frd cas. were reported. On 6 Dec 70, 5/B/7 reported 10-12 rnds of 60mm Mor impacting 300 - 400 metres to the west of their posn (YS477586) the base plate posn was est at YS455555 by VR.

Comment: In all of the above incidents, no positive unit identification was made, however LONG DAT or C1/D445 are almost certainly the unit responsible.

7. CHAU IUC have been identified in contact after a long period of remaining out of contact. Early AM on 5 Jan 71, LA VAN Hamlet (YS465774) was attacked by approx 20 VC. The en used RPG, M26 grenades and blast grens, some of which failed to detonate. Results 3 PF and 1 PSDF KIA, 7 PF WIA, 4 X M16 rifles and 1 ANPRC 10 set destroyed. No positive unit identification was made but they were thought to be CHAU IUC conc Coy C45 supported by NGAI GIAO Guerrillas.

8. A PW taken by 586 RF Coy at YS 433635 on 6 Jan 71, stated that CHAU IUC were to move from their old base in the NUI DINHS to an area east of Route 2 near the SONG RAI A contact with approx 20 VC by 1 Sect 1 Tp B Sqn 3 Cav Regt at YS 486635 at 071945H Jan 71, resulting in 3 VC KIA and 1 VC PW has led to a tentative ident of the KIA as belonging to CHAU IUC. The result of this contact tend to substantiate the PWs statement. Such a move by CHAU IUC, if indeed it is taking place, would only be made under BA LONG direction, whose intentions are unk.

9. On 3 Jan 71, at YS453885, 37 PF Pl located 4 VC in a tree resulting in 1 VC KIA and 3 VC PW. All were identified as members of CAO SU District.

10. PHUOC LOI GUERRILLAS On 5 Jan 71, 2 Sect 1 Tp B Sqn 3 Cav located an occupied bunker at YS 515575, resulting in 5 detainees, 2 I/Wpns, 4 Grens and 2 M16 mines CIA. All were identified as members of the PHUOC LOI Village unit including PCS and Village unit 2 i/c.

11. H 10 Med Dispensary On 5 Jan 71, A/2 RAR located two bunkers systems (YS 223691, YS224692) used 2 hrs prior to entry and a further system (YS 226697) used 5 mins prior to entry. A sighting of 1 VC was made and tracks in the area indicated movement by upto 50 people. No identification was made but the enemy in the area were probably from H10 dispensary SR 4.

12. Phuoc Buu 7 Dec 70, 10/D/7 located 6 Bunkers at YS 651608 which had been used upto 3 days prior to discovery, 1 Rice husking machine, 2000lbs unhusked rice and a mound of husks suggesting that 3000lbs of rice had been processed recently, were discovered. This system was probably worked by PHUOC BUU Guerrillas in sp of D445.

13. BINH BA Guerrillas On 6 Jan 71, 655 RF Coy contacted unk no of VC at BINH BA (YS 4574) Results 1 VC PW (WIA) now DOW. Identified as BINH BA village Guerrilla Unit Comd.

GENERAL

1. Last week, enemy activity remained at a low level. Mining of LOCs was prevalent in MRs 1 and 2 and continued reaction to ARVN ops in MR 4 was noted. There was little change in the disposition of enemy troops, although elms of the 7 EVA Div were ident in Nth TAY NINH Prov. For the most part the en abided by his New Years cease fire declaration, although two significant attacks were executed in MR 3, and the en responded to ARVN activity in the U MINH Forrest.

MR 1

2. During the past week in MR 1, enemy activity remained at the same low level noted in previous weeks. This activity was characterised by light and scattered attacks by fire and harrassing activity. Mine and booby trap incidents were prevalent. For the most part, major enemy elms continued to refit and supply.

3. 7 ABFs of less than 20 rmds and 4 ABFs of 20 plus rmds took place during the reporting period, mainly in QUANG TRI Province. The most significant occuring NE of DONG HA (YD2372) where the FF lost 2 KIA and 8 WIA from an ABF of unk number of 60mm Mortar(Poss 27ONVA Regt B5 Front).

4. 4 significant mine and booby trap incidents occured resulting in 3 Frd KIA, 42 WIA and 2 APCs destroyed, 5 Caches were located containing 9.2 tons of rice throughout the MR.

MR 2

5. In MR 2 last week, enemy initiated activity remained at a low level and the disposition of his forces remain unchanged. Enemy initiated incidents were scattered throughout the MR, while the mining og two trains evidenced the enemy's continued effort to interdict Allied LOCs.

6. Three significant ground attacks took place during the week.

(a) On 28 Dec 70, HAMONG KOTU HAMLET (ZA 1195) NE of KONUM City, received a mor and RPG attack followed by a ground assault resulting in: Frd 6 KIA (4 civ) 13 WIA (10 Civ). En 9 KIA (En unit was 304 LF Bn VC KONUM Prov).

(b) On 27 Dec 70, LUNG THO Hamlet N of BONG SON was entered by an est en Pl (Poss elm 8 LF Bn VC BINH DINH Prov) resulting in Frd 6 KIA (2civ) 7 WIA (6 civ) En losses unk.

(c) On 28 Dec 70, a logistic support activity on the PHAN THIET airfeild received 40 X 82mm mor followed by a ground assault resulting in Frd 2 KIA, 14 WIA (9 US) En losses unk. (Poss elm 482 B LF Bn VC BINH DINH Prov).

7. Two incidents of L of C interdiction took place:

(a) On 29 Dec, NW of TUY HOA (CQ 1360) 22lb of exp. was detonated by a cargo passanger train. Results: 1 Engine, 1 Flat Car and 4 rails damaged)

(b) On 28 Dec, NW of CAN RANH BAY a train detonated a mine resulting in 1 Engine, 5 Box Cars, 1 Flat Car derailed and 80 metres of track damaged.

MR 3

8. In MR 3 last week, significant enemy activity declined to an extremely low level as most enemy units continued to avoid contact while concentrating on resupply ops. Enemy units primarily employed small scale harrassing actions and terrorist activity designed to counter the GVN Pacification Program. Although the enemy generally appeared to abide by his declared cease fire, there was a significant ground attack launched against PSDF elms in HAU NGHIA Prov and a major attack by fire conducted against ARVN units in Nth TAY NINH Prov.

9. The following ABFs and ground attacks took place during the reporting period:
- (a) On 31 Dec 70, an ARVN NDP, NE of THIEN NGON received 50 X 82mm mor rnds resulting in 3 Frd KIA, 32 WIA (1 US). En unit was poss elms of 165 NVA Regt 7 NVA Div)
  - (b) On 31 Dec 70, BAO DIEU Hamlet NW of CU CHI was attacked by an unk no of enemy (Poss elms of 1 VC Sapper Bn SR1) Results 20 Frd KIA, 1 WIA, 1 MIA 14 I/Wpns and 1 Radio MIA. En losses unk.

MR 4

10. During the past week in MR 4, enemy initiated activity cont at a very low level as the en generally observed his New Years cease fire declaration. Most enemy activity consisted of harrassment and small scale ground attacks targetted against outposts and troop positions in the western part of the mil region. The most significant incident was an attack on an Advanced Tactical Support Base at Ca Mau, which caused 16 US cas. The enemy continued to coordinate his effort against the GVN Pacification Program.
11. Incidents are too numerous to mention individually: There were 10 Frd initiated incidents resulting in 110 En KIA 88 Detainees for frd loss of 3 KIA and 9 WIA. The enemy initiated 7 major incidents resulting in 25 Frd Kia, 122 frd WIA and 4 MIA for an en loss of 9 KIA (known).

CAMBODIA

General

1. One of the major effects of the US/ARVN Cross Border operations in 1970, was to force VC/NVA in the base areas along the border and some Main Force units in SVN into Cambodia. Up until this time, Cambodian forces were not hostile and VC/NVA Forces took only those measures necessary to secure infiltration routes and base areas. After the cross border ops, Cambodian forces launched some ops against communist forces and hostilities began.

Enemy Forces

2. The communists control all of the N and NE areas of Cambodia while Cambodian forces control only those areas around the major population centres. Other areas, although the Cambodian Govt. claims are contested, are generally under the control or the influence of the enemy.

3. All L of C are cut except for Route 1 and the river traffic up the Mekong River. These two L of Cs are subject to interdiction and last week a POL convoy moving up the Mekong was ambushed and forced to turn back.

Enemy Intentions

4. The enemy are carrying out two:

(a) Re establishing old base areas and Lines of Communication (incl building new base areas.)

(b) Creating new units based on Cambodian communists with NVA/VC cadre. Establishing a communist infrastructure, similar to that in SVN.

5. Captured docs indicate that 141 NVA Regt and 165 NVA Regt, 7 NVA Div and E6 VC Regt, 5 VC Div have moved back into Base Area 352 (Fishhook) and base area 350 respectively with elms in northern TAY NINH and BINH LONG Prov. Documents also indicate that new enemy comds are being formed. 275A VC Regt/5 VC Div is possibly redesignated 205 Regt which may include indigenous communists, while 275A and 174 VC Regts may come under control of BINH LONG Gp HQ, and lose subordination to 5 VC Div. BINH LONG Gp may be an indigenous communist HQ with VC/NVA cadre. Many docs and interrogations have revealed the enemy's urgent requirements to set up a communist infrastructure. Many hamlets and villages in NE Cambodia already have this with indigenous controlling up to district level organisation.

6. The enemy have at least 4 Divs 1 NVA and 7 NVA Divs and 5 VC and 9 VC Divs currently in Cambodia plus a number of independant regimental sized units. It would appear that the enemy are not carrying out a general offensive but are content to maintain pressure on the LON NOL govt, interdict L of C and set up indigenous infrastructure.

Friendly Forces

7. Cambodian army is now approx 120,000 Strong (100 bns) but lacks, training, leadership experience and heavy fire support. FANK (Cambodian Army) are conducting holding ops only except for a few unsuccessful route clearing ops.

8. ARVN have been conducting ops in Cambodia since the cross border ops began in 1970. Ops are now confined mainly to the Parrots Beak and Fishhook areas although Riverine and Route Clearing ops are being conducted with FANK.

9. US provide only air support with an interdiction role. Air Strikes in support of combat ops are not being carried out.

MR 3

Enemy Activity

1. Enemy activity continued at a low level in MR 3 throughout the week. TAY NINH Prov and WZ C were the centre of most activity where, in addition to sapper and light ground attacks, the enemy launched a number of mortar attacks, incl one of 37 X 82mm mor rds against a base camp (XT175950), and one of 36 X 82mm morrds on a district hq (XT115505). There were also seven 122mm rockets fired; two against an engr compound (XT331903); four against KATUM (XT3690) and one against TAY NINH west (XT167514). These attks caused only light cas.

2. Elsewhere in MR 3 activity was light and scattered and was directed primarily anti-pacification ops. There were no terrorists incidents reported from SAIGON.

Friendly Activity

3. Over the period 3 to 6 Jan Allied Forces in MR 10 recovered 3 significant caches (YT375922, XT700571, YT509838) which included 4 tons of wheat, 3.4 tons of rice, a large qty of bicycle tyres and parts, ammo and clothing. The material was probably intended for MR 6, MR 7 and MR 10.

Enemy Locs

4. Although the trend of movement by elms of 5 VC and 7 NVA Divs continues to suggest the possibility of future increased tactical activity within RVN, no major changes in deployment were noted during the week.

Enemy Capabilities and Intentions

5. The interrogation of two civs detained near XUAN LOC on 3 Jan indicates the enemy's continued use of civs and hired commercial vehicles to transport locally procured supplies. The detainees described the purchase of goods in SAIGON, the bribing of officials enroute to XUAN LOC, and a transfer point near XUAN LOC (vic of YT658040) at which point they were detained before being able to dispose of their load. The reports provide further examples of the enemy's continuing dependence upon local purchase and existing road networks to support his logistic system.

Assessment for MR 3

6. IIFV have estimated that the enemy may attempt increased activity during the coming week as the commencement of a general period of heightend activity over TET. Cambodian border areas heavy attacks by fire and some ground attks against ARVN forces are expected, with the aim of inflicting hy losses. Within MR 3 ABFs are expected particularly in the NW area. However the most common form of enemy activity is expected to be small unit actions against the pacification programme and attacks against lightly defended outposts.

5. The interrogation of two civs detained near XUAN LOC on 3 Jan indicates the enemy's continued use of civs and hired commercial vehicles to transport locally procured supplies. 1 ATF TAOR

General

1. 1 ATF troops were involved in 3 contacts during the reporting period with nil results. 3 Aust were wounded by a mine and an APC received slight damage. The most significant incident this week was the capture of THI HAI LOAN the Party Chapter Secretary of HOA LONG.

Enemy Unit Identification and Locations

2. On 7 Jan troops of A Sqn 3 Cav Regt ambushed approx 20 VC who were wearing packs and who approached from the north. Three enemy were KIA and THI HAI LOAN, the Party Chapter Secretary of HOA LONG who is also a member of the CHAU DUC District Committee was captured. LOAN is the wife of NAM KIEM, Party Chapter Secretary of CHAU DUC. She is in possession of valuable tactical information but is not as yet prepared to divulge it. Documents CIA in the contact identify CHAU DUC.

3. D445. Information has been received that the main elms of D445 were moving North towards NUI BE (centre of mass YS8489) on 2 Jan following the hy losses sustained in the contact with 7 RAR and B Sqn 3 Cav Regt on 31 Dec. However, later information has indicated that an elm of the unit has now returned to the area north of XUYEN MOC. It is believed that the unit may now possibly be divided into three gps the Comd Sau Thu and C1 are in the LONG HAIs; a group probably including HAI KHANH (the Pol Offr) and at least C5 are just north of XUYEN MOC; and the remainder, incl some wounded, may be in the area of NUI BE.

Enemy Capabilities and Intentions

4. There have been 2 further mining incidents in the area of NDP GARTH. In one (YS455880) three Austs were wounded and an APC was damaged; and in the other a US helicopter was destroyed and the pilot KIA (YS485895). There have been nine mining incidents in the area of GARTH (YS4590) since mid Dec. This mining is probably being carried out by local guerrillas assisted by BA LONG Prov Engrs.

5. Two 60mm mor attacks have been carried out from the LONG HAIs, one against an RF unit (YS 4950); and one apparently directed against a 7 RAR ambush posn. This offensive activity is probably the work of LONG DAT possibly assisted by C1.

6. Agent reports and the interrogation of a PW in MR 10 suggest that increased enemy activity is planned for allied MR 3 for the middle of Jan. This may commence on about 15 Jan and continue until middle of Feb, with the possibility of the maximum effort being made prior to TET (26 Jan). Indications of possible targets in PHUOC TUY are AP DINH Hamlet (YS 373617) of BARIA, several locs in LONG DIEN (YS423605), LONG DIEN Sub Sector, (YS410603 and YS 430593), DAT DO and XUYEN MOC. However, since 1 Jan 7 RAR has captured over 4 tons of rice in the PHUOC BUU area. The loss of the rice and the hy cas sustained by D445 on 31 Dec contact, with the attendant morale problems, will be a serious set back to the probable plans of D445 to re entre LONG DAT, in order to carry out ops there in accordance with the recent BA LONG directive, specifying LONG DAT as the area of primary importance. However, a short move back into LONG DAT for one or two of the attacks of the nature of the recent probes against PHUOC THANH (22 Dec) and LA VAN is a possibility over TET. Attacks on a larger scale are beyond the capacity of the enemy.

RVN

General:

1. Enemy initiated activity throughout SVN was at a very low level last week. The only exception to the pattern of light attacks by fire, scattered small ground contacts and minings which characterised this activity were two sizeable ambushes on QL 22 in TAY NINH Province. Identification of elms of 9 VC Div in one of these ambushes, together with previous identification of elms of the 7 NVA Div in TAY NINH Prov significantly increases the threat in NE MR3. Elsewhere the disposition of enemy forces remains generally unchanged.

2. Reports received throughout the Republic continue to refer to increased enemy activity in the next few weeks in conjunction with the enemy's "Winter-Spring Campaign". Such an increase could build up gradually or could be launched with a sudden "D" Day. Although the enemy probably has the capability to coordinate such a "D" Day throughout the Republic, at this time no such simultaneous surge is indicated. The timing of any increase is unclear and will probably vary from region to region. Next week, activity is expected to increase noticeably in MR4 and possibly in MR1, but remain at a relatively low level in MR2 and 3. Economy of force tactics will almost certainly prevail.

MR 1

3. During the previous week in MR 1, enemy activity increased somewhat; however, it remained at a rather low level. This activity was characterised by light and scattered attacks by fire and limited ground probes directed against allied outposts. For the most part, the enemy continued to avoid contact with allied units as he concentrated on refitting and resup efforts.

4. Friendly forces initiated 13 major contacts resulting in 2 Frd KIA, 12 Frd WIA, 24 Suspects detained, 4 Crew Served wpns and 82 I/Wpns CIA. Caches totalling 5 tons of rice, 10 X 122mm rockets and 20 X 107mm rockets were located.

5. Frd forces det 3 booby traps resulting in 12 Frd KIA, 31 WIA and 1 APC destroyed. 3 helicopters (incl 1 DUSTOFF A/C) received ground fire, crashed and burnt. 7 Frd KIA and 2 MIA.

MR 2

6. In MR2 last week, enemy initiated activity was at an extremely low level and was limited to light and scattered attacks, primarily in the B-3 Front. The enemy generally avoided contact with Allied units, possibly in preparation for increased activity in the near future.

7. Only four major frd initiated contacts were reported res in 43 en KIA, 2 en Det, 8 Frd KIA and 3 Frd WIA.

MR 3

8. In MR 3 last week, enemy activity remained at a low level except in TAY NINH Prov where two major ambushes were conducted against 18 ARVN Div convoys on Route 22. Elsewhere in MR3, however, most enemy units avoided contact while concentrating on resup ops. There were some indications last week that the enemy may attempt a phase of increased activity from 16 to 25 Jan. In possibly related info, agents cont to report sightings of enemy units near LONG BINH/BIEN HOA mil complexes, while enemy divisional elms have been reported in BINH LONG and TAY NINH Provs where they are believed to be engaged in an effort to divert ARVN attn from CAMBODIA. Despite a report of an increased number of suspect personnel in SAIGON, there was only one reported terrorist incident in the city last week.

9. On 11 Jan 71, NW of THIEN NGON (XT1788) 18 ARVN Div convoy was ambushed by poss elms of 141 NVA Regt 7 NVA Div, resulting in 7 Frd KIA, 8 Frd WIA, 2 I/Wpns MIA, 15 trucks, one radio and 1000 rds of 105mm and 155mm ammo destroyed. En losses were 25 KIA and 3 I/Wpns CIA.

10. On 10 Jan 71, N of TRAI BI (XT1172) an 18 ARVN Div convoy was ambushed by elms of 1 and 2 Bn, 271 VC Regt, 9 VC Div. Res 11 Frd KIA, 13 Frd WIA, 2 Frd MIA, 2 trucks 100 X 155mm and 120 X 105mm rounds dest. En losses 58 KIA, 2 PW, 5 I/Wpns 1 X 75mm RCL and 2 XAA MGs CIA.

MR 4

11. During the past week in MR 4, en initiated activity was at a low level. The activity was characterised by light and scattered stand off attacks, mostly harrassing in nature. Agent reports were received which indicate that the low level of activity was used by the enemy as a final planning and preparation stage for a ten day period of increased tactical activity to end prior to the first day of the TET Holidays.

12. 2 ABFs were reported.

a. 11 Jan 71, 9 RF outpost SW of KIEN AN was attacked by poss elms D 2 VC Regt. 1 Frd KIA and 11 Frd WIA. En losses unk.

b. 13 Jan 71, Duong Dong airfeild on PHU QUOC island (US 8730) received 30 X 82mm Mor rds fired by local guerrillas. Results 5 Frd WIA, 1 X 105mm Howitzers and 1 aircraft damaged.

13. Two water mine incidents were reported:

a. On 13 Jan 71, SW of GIA RAI (WR4800) an LCM 8 struck a water mine, received 3 X RPG rds and sank. Frd losses were 1 KIA and 13 WIA.

b. On 11 Jan 71, NW of THOI BINH, an LCM 6 det a water mine and sank res. 3 frd WIA.

1 ATF TAOR

General

1. The level of enemy activity remained the same as for the previous weeks. 1 ATF had 5 contacts resulting in 9 En KIA and 2 Aust KIA and Aust 16 WIA.

En Unit Locations and Identifications

2. D445. On 17 Jan 71, Sector forces op SE of NUI NHON Hamlet(YS 5863) received a HOI CHANH ( [REDACTED] of [REDACTED] ) Following up info from [REDACTED] APCs and a ptl from HQ C/7 RAR located a cached 82mm Mor complete at YS 658727. This Mor was the only one possessed by C4 (Hy Wpn Coy) D445. On 18 Jan, DAT DO Int & Recce Sqd and APCs from Sqn HQ A Sqn 3 Cav Regt were led by [REDACTED] an ammo cache located in 3 small bunkers at YS 537658. 27 X 82mm mor rds, 9 tins of charges, 9 tins of fuses, 1 B40 rd and 1 D8 directional mine were recovered.
3. On 17 Jan, at YS719814, an APC detonated a 50lb mine laid on route 329. 3 Aust were WIA and an APC was extensively damaged. Approx 1 hr later in the same location a bushman scout det a 25 - 30lb mine resulting in 1 VN KIA and 10 WIA - HOI CHANH Le stated that a section of C4/D445 had been mining Route 329 between 14 - 16 Jan 71.
4. On 19 Jan 71, 8/C/7 located 2 bodies in a grave at YS710704. Bodies were tentatively identified as soldiers of sapper recce pl of C5/D445 and they have been credited to B/7RAR and APCs contact on 31 Dec 70. KIA for this contact now stands at 23.
5. On 19 Jan 71, at YS 487559, Int sqd from DAT DO contacted an unk no of en resulting in 1 VC WIA CIA later DOW, identified as a member of D445.
6. No ident has been made of CHAU DUC during the week. An agent report eval C/3 stated that 25 persons from CHAU DUC were located in vicinity YS 4785.
7. LONG DAT On 15 Jan 71, at YS449569, a ptl from 5/B/7 RAR contacted approx 20 VC resulting in 2 VC KIA (BC) 1 Aust KIA 2 Aust WIA. VC KIA identified as Comd LONG DAT Mil Proselyting Sect and member of LONG DAT Postal Sect. On 16 Jan 71, at YS 456542 6/B/7 RAR contacted an est 20 VC resulting in 1 Aust WIA, 5 VC KIA (BC) and 7 WIA (BT). Docus contained no exploitable info however F & E was mentioned and 2 of the KIA were women which indicates LONG DAT. Food being carried indicates that they had just been on a resupply mission, probably to LONG DIEN.
8. BA LONG Engrs On 17 Jan 71, at YS 479882, an APC det a 20 - 30 lb mine resulting in moderate damage to the vehicle and no cas. This incident is in keeping with the pattern of mining carried out by BA LONG Engrs in this area.
9. BA LONG Munitions Factory. An SAS ptl found a munitions factory on 19 Jan 71, in vicinity of YS 730868. A large qty of tools and eqpt plus 5 I/Wpns were loc. Docus identified this factory as belonging to HQ BA LONG Province and indicate that members of LONG DAT and CHAU DUC are or were being trained there.
10. LONG PHUOC On 18 Jan 71, a PW, (CIA by 23PF Pl on 14 Jan 71 at YS457638) led LONG DIEN NP to LONG LIEN village where 2 females were detained. The party then moved to a bunker at YS448622, where 3 persons were taken PW. Identified as Troop Proselyting Cadre and guerrilla from LONG PHUOC village and Pl Comd C41 CHAU DUC Conc Coy.

11. CAO SU On 20 Jan 71, at YS460891, 9/C/2 RAR contacted and killed 1 VC identified as a member of CAO SU district. NFI.
12. On 21 Jan 71 at YS 488825, A/2 RAR contacted and killed 1 VC identified by docus as coming from K6 D440. When D440 was **disbanded**, K6 Coy was split up and sent to re inforce CAO SU district and BA LONG Province. This VC was probably a member of CAO SU.
13. Other Items of Reporting Interest. On 16 Jan 71, BEARCAT (YT 1601) received 3 X 122mm rkts (nil cas or damage) on the same day, FSB BULSAK (YT 2193) received 8 X 107mm rkts (nil frd cas). En unit is probably 74 NVA Arty Regt.

# SECRET

1. AT 220330H, PHNOM PHEN airfield received a hy ABF consisting of 60mm and 80mm Mor rds. This was preceded by a ground attack on the military portion of the airfield by an est 10-20 enemy sappers who placed explosive on or near parked aircraft. No real resistance was offered by local guards. Results. 42 Aircraft destroyed, 16 belonging to ARVN/VNAF, 16 Damaged, extensive damage to bldgs and hangers, control tower and comms destroyed. The runway was not damaged but was littered with debris.
2. On the same day a tpt compound was attacked by fire and 500 tons of ammo dest. Also the Naval base at CHRUY CHANG VAR on the MEKONG received 30 rds 82mm Mor, no serious damage.
3. On 23 Jan, plastic explosive detonated in a bldg in the grounds of the HQ for Asian Migration, the bldg was destroyed and 3 persons were injured.
4. 24 Jan, an explosion did hy damage to a service shop in the Cambodian Electric coy in the city injuring 5 pers.
5. According to a HOI CHANH who rallied on 31 Dec 70, a special sapper bn commanded by an unknown senior col and composed of 300 men arrived in the vicinity of PHNOM PENH in Dec 70. Their mission is said to be to assassinate police, important officials and high ranking officers in FANK and to attack all foreign agencies consulates and embassies.
6. There is no current ident of the units involved but a large op of enemy is reported to be in the vic of Route 26 approx 20kms west of the airfield. This is an ARVN report and as yet unconfirmed.
7. On 25 Jan a case containing 25lbs of plastic exp was found in front of the RVN Embassy but it failed to detonate. On 26 Jan a gren was thrown into a bus but was thrown back out by a passenger, 3 civs were wounded. On the same day an explosive device exploded in a market wounding 1 civ. Fank continued to report the presence of a large enemy force in the vic of of route 26 west of that area two days ago. Two other units sent to its relief have arrived.
8. Route 4. Following the junction of ARVN and FANK forces some ARVN troops have begun to withdraw. The road however will remain subject to interdiction as en forces are still in the general area. Reopening to large scale traffic depends upon repair of bridges dest by en. Withdrawing ARVN tps eng an unknown sized enemy force along Route 16 near KOMPONG TRACH on 24 Jan Results 1 Frd KIA and 30 En KIA.
9. SVAY RIENG. On 27 Jan ARVN Forces had 6 seperate contacts in PARRTOS BEAK with nil frd cas but 46 En KIA and some wpns CIA. En unit may possibly been elms 267 VC MF Bn and 504 VC LF Bn. Latter unit has been in the area since July 70.
10. KOMPONG CHAM. ARVN Cross Border ops continue in the area east of MEKONG NONG Route 7. No current border reports of contacts since 26 Jan when 48 ARVN base at KREK received an ABF of 40 X 80mm Mor rds. Enemy forces in the vic of border with TAY NINH Prov incl 141 NVA Regt, 165 NVA Regt and 209 NVA Regt.
11. No reports of current activity elsewhere in CAMBODIA.
12. Forecast. En activity is likely to continue at present increased level but no major attk on PHNOM PENH seems likely although further terrorist activity can be expected.

General

1. As expected, activity in VC MR 2 and 3 increased noticeably last week, but remained at a generally low level throughout the rest of the country. However, sustained ABFs were conducted by B 5 front elms, and regts. recently returned from CAMBODIA maintained a moderate level of activity in N TAY NINH Prov. A contact in the B 5 front area gave indications of a new enemy unit. Several regts recently re-introduced into SVN remained along the northern border of GVN MR 3. Otherwise, there was little change in the disposition of enemy units.

2. The enemy has declared a cease-fire which commenced 0100hrs on 26 Jan and terminates 0100 hrs on the 30th. Evidence which specifically mentions enemy plans during this period is scattered, low level and conflicting. For example, a captured document in SR-1 ordered enemy units to observe the cease fire; an agent report from DA NANG mentioned a "general offensive" to be conducted during the lunar New Year holidays and a PW captured in VC MR-5 stated that the NVA 21 Regt was preparing for attacks during the TET holidays. On balance, considering all evidence and the enemy's activities during the Christmas and New Year's cease fires, isolated violations are probable, but a coordinated, deliberate violation on a large scale is unlikely.

MR 1

3. During the past week in MR 1, enemy activity remained at a low level and was characterized by light and scattered attacks by fire. The CON THIEN area of NE QUANG TRI Prov sustained most of the abf's from probable elms of the 84 NVA Arty Regt and in a 16 Jan contact, evidence of a new unit thought to be targeted against CON THEIN was developed. Elsewhere throughout the MR, enemy dispositions remained relatively unchanged. Again the enemy attempted to avoid major confrontations with Allied units as he prepared for a possible increase in tactical activity in the near future.

4. There were 5 enemy and 6 frd initiated incidents in the MR during the reporting period resulting in 7 frd KIA and 33 WIA while enemy losses were 45 KIA, 13 ~~asst wps~~ ~~CIA~~ and 3.5 tons of rice CIA in 3 separate incidents.

5. On 19 Jan SW of HOI AN, elms of 2d Bn, 5 US Marine in an NDP sustained (at BT 1147) a ground atk from an unk number of en (possibly an elm of the D3 NVA Bn, Front 4). There were no frd losses. En losses were 11 KIA and 10 hand grens CIA.

MR 2

6. In MR 2 last week, enemy initiated activity increased somewhat from last week but remained at a relatively low level. This activity was characterized by light and scattered atk's by fire in VC MR 5 and VC MR 6. For the most part the enemy continued to avoid contact with allied units, possibly in preparation for an increase in activity during the coming week.

7. There were 3 enemy and 5 frd initiated incidents resulting in 5 frd KIA, 26 WIA and 19 MIA while enemy losses were 43 KIA, 4 suspects detained and 3 asst wps CIA.

8. In BINH DINH Prov on 17 Jan NE of BONG SON, PSDF from the THIEN CHANH Hamlet, while fishing offshore, were engaged (at BS9511) by two to four enemy in sampans. The PSDF were forced ashore where they were ambushed. ARVN Arty supported. Frd losses were 2 KIA, 1 WIA and 19 MIA. Enemy losses were one suspect detained.

9. On 16 Jan NE of BONG SON, an elm of the 40 ARVN Regt engaged (at BS 9006) an unk sized enemy force with small arms fire. Frd losses were 5 WIA while enemy losses were 9 KIA. The enemy force involved in these two contacts possibly was elms of the 8 LF Bn.

MR 3

10. In MR 3 last week, enemy initiated activity increased somewhat but nevertheless remained at a relatively low level. In BINH LONG and TAY NINH Provinces, where 3 or 4 divisional regiments have deployed, activity continued at a moderate level with the most significant contacts occurring south of TRAI BI on highway 22. An agent reported that enemy intentions in TAY NINH included destruction of depots and 1 of c in an attempt to isolate ARVN troops in CAMBODIA. Elsewhere in MR 3, enemy activity continued to be limited by lack of supplies and personnel to harrasing actions and terrorism. Nevertheless, the enemy shifted his target pattern by conducting light indirect fire attacks primarily against Allied installations including PHUOC VINH, FSB BANDIT II, the BIEN HOA airbase and the THAI Base Camp at BEARCAT.

11. In TAY NINH Prov on 21 Jan, east of GO DAU HA, the 25 ARVN Sp Bn was shelled (XT4125) with 20 X 82mm Mor rds (possibly fired by elms of the D14 LF Bn) ARVN arty and US gunships returned fire. Frd losses were 6 KIA (incl 3 VN civs), 19 WIA (incl 5 VN civs), 1 APC damaged and another APC destroyed. Enemy losses were unk.

12. On 18 Jan south of Trai Bi, the 165 RF Coy, while on a road clearing op on H 22, was ambushed (XT1361) by an unk no of enemy. ARVN arty and US gunships supported the 161, 162 and 871 RF Coys reinforced in the contact. Frd cas were 3 KIA and 6 WIA while enemy losses were 35 KIA, 1 suspect detained, 1 LMG, 3 RPG launchers, 6 AK47s, one telephone, 8 shovels and 20 RPG rds CIA. During interrogation, the prisoner ident the 3 Bn 271 VC Regt.

12. In MR 3 there were 11 en and 7 frd initiated contacts in all resulting in 20 frd KIA and 80 WIA, enemy losses were 83 KIA, 1 Detained and 16 asst wpns CIA.

MR 4

13. During the past week in MR 4, enemy initiated activity increased with the preponderance of the incidents occurring either in or on the periphery of Base Areas 400, 470, 490 and 483. Additionally, although most targets continued to be poorly defended the intensity of the enemy's attacks was greater than normal. Reports continue to indicate that the enemy throughout the Delta is still refitting and resupplying his units and that activity will continue to increase.

14. There were 16 enemy and 13 frd initiated incidents resulting in frd: 80 KIA, 216 WIA and 17 MIA, enemy losses were 114 KIA, 30 detained and 44 asst wpns CIA.

15. On 15 Jan SW of TINH BIEN, one recon pl of the B 43 Border Ranger Camp was ambushed (VS9468) by an enemy force (possibly elms of the 18B NVA Regt, 1 NVA Div). Elms of the 9 ARVN Div Recon Coy, 2 CAMBODIAN inf coys, 1 coy of the 2 Bn, 14 ARVN Inf, and 1 US Air Cav pl, supported by gunships, were inserted in 3 locs. The contact lasted approx 22 hrs. Frd losses were 21 KIA, 70 WIA and 6 MIA. Enemy losses are unk.

16. Other incidents are too numerous to mention.

1 ATF TAOR

General

1. The level of enemy activity in PHUOC TUY except for the COURTENAY Rubber area returned to a low level during the reporting period. 1 ATF had 9 contacts resulting in 9 en KIA. All contacts were confined to the COURTENAY Rubber area.

Unit Identifications and Locations

2. HQ SR 4 On 22 Jan 71, at YS 438888, 9/C/2 Anzac and APCs contacted approx 5 VC resulting in 4 VC KIA (BC) 1 VC WIA (DOW). 1 AK 47 and 2 .45 Cal pistols CIA. Docus CIA from bodies tentatively identify members of HQ SR 4 and SR 4 Rear Svcs. It is felt that the remainder of this unit is west of the VIET COUNG Rubber in the approx area of YS 3887.
3. LONG DAT There has been no contact with LONG DAT during the week. A VC flag some propaganda leaflets and letters written to members of 302 RF Coy on ni 26/27 Jan 71, were probably placed there by LONG DAT.
4. D445 There were no confirmed identifications of D445 during the reporting period. The Bn is possibly located in the NUI MAY TAO/NUI BE mountain area committed to resupply and reorganization after unsuccessful ops against allied units in the XUYEN MOC District.
5. D65 A HOI CHANH, [REDACTED] who rallied to (US) 2/25 Inf Bde at FSB BEVERLY on 13 Jan 71, revealed that D65 Engr Pn has been disbanded and that the 4 Coys were assigned to SR 4, designated C210 Engrs.
6. On 22 Jan 71, at AP DONG (YS423645) HOA LONG Int and Recce Sqd, NP and NPFF, captured 1 VC ([REDACTED]) in a bunker, he was ident as [REDACTED] CHAU IUC. He stated that D65, after disbanding would send troops to reinforce CHAU IUC CONC COY, C41 to bring the strength up to approx 100. Comment: More collateral is needed to confirm the statements made in paras 6 & 7, however, if reinforcements are being received into CHAU IUC from D65, this will significantly increase the threat th villages along Route 2.
8. CHAU IUC No contact with the main body of CHAU IUC was made during the week. [REDACTED] stated that CHAU IUC has just completed 7 days of political training. During a bunker search op on 25 Jan 71, by 10 MID and SECTOR Troops in AP BAC Hamlet, 1 bunker was located at YS 420647 and 1 VC was KIA, a further bunker was loc at YS 418646, 1 VC KIA and 1 PW. The PW was ident as TU SINH A/PCS HOA LONG, KIAs were ident as D/Chief Youth Org Sect CHAU IUC and a cadre from BA LONG respectively.
9. On ni 22/23 Jan 71 CAM MY village was attacked by an est pl of enemy using 7 X B40 rds and 7 rds of mor fire (CAL UNK). 2 PSDF and 3 Cvi WIA, 2 VC KIA, 3 VC KIA (poss). No positive ident was made from docus CIA, however, it was felt that the enemy unit involved belonged to the BA LONG Provincial unit. Although CHAU IUC are in the area, it is beleived that they were not responsible.
10. H10 Hosp SR 4 On 26 Jan 71, at YS451883, 9/C/2 Anzac contacted 2 en who approached their NDP. The enemy appeared to be moving toward some houses, after the contact was initiated, SA fire was received from en in the houses. A sweep of the area revealed 3 VC KIA (BC), 1 VC WIA (BT), 2 X K54 pistols, 1 K54 pistol, and 1 AK 47 CIA. A search of the houses revealed 1 VN KIA, 1 VN WIA. The VC have been tentatively identified from docus as coming from H10 Hosp SR 4. The wounded VN has as yet to be classified.

11. CAO SU On 27 Jan 71, 9/C/2 Anzac stopped a vehicle containing a wounded Vn plus a driver at YS451883. The driver indicated that he was taking the VN who was wounded by the Aust, to DUC THANH to rally. The driver later took NP to meet three illegal residents who wanted to rally.
12. On 27 Jan 71, at YS 445883, 9/C/2 Anzac received 3 ralliers from CAO SU village unit. Very little information has yet been exploited.






