AIM

1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organization and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

GENERAL

- 2. Entries are to be made daily on AF C 2118 (Adapted) each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.
- 3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties (Australia)" Chapter 2, Section 12.

RESPONSIBILITY

During Non-operational Periods

4. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled by commanders of all formations.

During Operational Periods (1)

- 5. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled in duplicate by:
 - a. Commanders of all formations.
 - b. Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a brigadier or above.
 - c. Heads of services not below the rank of lieutenant colonel.
 - d. Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
 - e. Unit commanders.
 - f. Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

COMPILATION

- 6. Both original and duplicate copies are to consist of:
 - a. Cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted).
 - b. Index as printed on cover.
 - c. Narrative (AF C 2118) (Adapted).
 - d. Annexes as shown in the Index.
- 7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes are to be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer is to be included.
- 8. The annexes are to be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an annex NIL will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters, tarting at B.

54. SAFETY ON HELICOPTER LANDING SITES - THE IROQUOIS HELICOPTER

General

1. There is a need for all members of the Army to be aware of the dangers associated with working in close proximity to Iroquois helicopters.

Main and Tail Rotors

- 2. The main rotor blade assembly weighs approximately 850 lbs, possesses a high energy potential and will cause instant death to personnel, or considerable damage to equipment which may enter the rotor disc when it is rotating.
- 3. The main rotor is normally held at a height of thirteen feet above the ground; however, it is capable of dipping to within 1.7 metres (5 ft 8ins) of the ground surface. On uneven or sloping ground, or when the aircraft is being manoeuvred close to the ground, these distances may alter appreciably.
- 4. The tail rotor of the Iroquois helicopter rotates at approximately 2,200 RPM and in certain light conditions this rotor may be invisible. It is capable of causing instant death or damage to equipment. The bottom of the tail rotor disc is approximately 1.7 metres (5ft 8ins) from the ground when the helicopter is on a flat surface. However, as with the mainrotor, this distance may alter considerably due to uneven ground or whilst the aircraft is manoeuvering close to the ground.
- 5. Should either rotor strike a heavy, or a dense object, the aircraft may disingegrate and thus could cause injury or loss of life to the crew and to personnel in the immediate area.

Control at Landing Sites/Points

or a small landing site, with few helicopter movements, it is sufficient for a nominated trained soldier from the occupying sub-unit to meet all helicopters, indicate the landing point if necessary, and control the movement of vehicles and personnel on the site. At a large sub-unit, with three or more landing points, a trained group under command of an officer or NCO is to be nominated. The size of the control party will depend upon the intensity of helicopter movements as much as on the number of landing points in use.

Movement on Landing Sites/Points

7. No movement is to take place on the landing site while an aircraft is manocuvring; nor is any attempt to be made to approach an
aircraft ontil authorized by the point controller. The directaft
aptain will indicate to the controller by the "thumbs up" signal
when it is safe to approach the helicopter.

- 8. When approaching or leaving a helicopter, only the forward are between 9 o'clock and 3 o'clock is to be used and personnel are to duck under the rotor disc. Under no circumstances will a helicopter be approached from the rear.
- 9. Troops are not to deplane without permission from either the pilot or one of the aircrew. This will be indicated by the "thumbs up" signal. After deplaning, troops going to ground are to keep clear of the 11 o'clock 1 o'clock arc as, in the event of engine failure on take off, the aircraft will come down immediately forward of its landing position.
- 10. Vehicles are not to approach closer than twenty metres from an operating helicopter; stores are to be manhandled over the intervening distance.

Static Electricity

11. Whilst the helicopter is in flight, it will build up a static electricity potential. The strength of this charge will vary according to climatic conditions and the time of flight. Because of this static electricity, the hoist cable should always be allowed to touch the ground to dissipate the charge before it is touched by personnel on the site. The static electrical charge is not lethal but can cause discomfort if the cable is touched before it is earthed.

Unit Routine Orders

12. The contents of this Routine Order are to be published in Unit Routine Orders and are to be brought to the notice of all personnel prior to training or operations with Iroquois helicopters.

55. PRIVATELY OWNED WEAPONS

- 1. The possession of privately owned and captured enemy weapons, explosives or ammunition by Army Component members in Vietnam is prohibited. This applies to those personnel on temporary duty with, or attached to AFV.
- 2. Unit and sub-unit commanders are to carry out periodic checks to ensure that no privately owned, or captured enemy weapons, explosives or ammunition are in the possession of personnel under their command or supervision.
- 3. This order is to be promulgated in unit Routine Orders Part 1 every three months.

56. SAFETY IN THE HANDLING OF AMMUNITION

1. A number of instances have occurred where soldiers have been injured through the misuse of ammunition including explosives and pyrotechnics.

/3.

- 2. Safety should be stressed continuously as an over present need, and the responsibilities of leaders for the safety of the soldiers they command cannot be over emphassised.
- 3. "Blinds", explosives or pyrotechnics, or components thereof, are not to be interfered with by any unauthorized person.
- 4. Tampering with ammunition for any purpose is prohibited.

The general conduct of our troops on leave has been poor. The number of offences increased sharply during the period. Military Police checks on the 1 ALSG perimeter wire and at the West Gate between 0500 hrs and 0800 hrs each morning resulted in fifteen (15) members reported for various offences. The wearing of Hippie style dress whilst on leave is becoming prevalent and impossible to police. It is obvious that units are not enforcing matters of dress. The standard of dress and general conduct of members of V Company, 2 RAR, who were on leave over the weekend 27-28 Mar 71, left much to be desired. There is no leave party from NUI DAT at the Peter Badcoe Club to-day.

22. Anti-Vice

The VD rate for the month is 19.6%. 2272 Girls were checked for VD through the clinic at the Le Loi Hospital. Of those checked 446 resulted positive. The number of girls that were checked by the clinic during March was a third increase on February. The 1.38% increase in VD would be a result of the heavy influx of American R and C personnel into VUNG TAU. The Australian Military Police Anti Vice Team still only conists of two (2) NCOs. Six new bars have been opened in VUNG TAU during the month and approximately 100 girls have arrived from SAIGON, being employed in the bars.

RULES OF ENGAGEMENT 1 ALSG

- 1. These rules apply to all members of 1 ALSG when within 1 ALSG areas of responsibility, and at other places not governed by other FMWAF orders.
- 2. These orders do not override the requirements:
 - a. To exercise normal safety precautions and
 - b. To conserve ammunition.
- 3. The Rules of Engagement are as follows:
 - a. Rule 1

When fired upon or when porsons inside or outside the 1 ALSG perimeter wire are positively identified as hostile:

- (1) SHOOT TO KILL.
- b. Rule 2

When persons or objects are discovered actively penetrating the 1 ALSG perimeter wire or present in the 1 ALSG areas of operation defined as AO's ROBYNNE, ANITA, MARGARET, JOSEPHINE, SUZANNE, JUDY and SHERRYL.

- (1) Challenge HALT. DUNG LAI.



SECTION 30

PASSPORTS AND VISAS

General

30.1 This section details the present requirements for obtaining passports and visas.
