General

1. This week there have been no major incidents within PHUOC TUY Prov, There were only 3 contacts with Task Force class. These were on 2 and 6 ipr. There were: .

The frd cas but 1 en was WIA BT. There were 2 mine incidents during the week resulting in 3 Aust WIA and 2 APCs damaged.

En Unit IDs and Locs.

- 2. <u>D445.</u> The only ID made during the week was of c3 coy at YS588722 on 3 Mar 71. However tracks showing signs of recent heavy use were sighted on 4 and 5 Apr 71 up to 4000 m west of this loc. The movement had been in a westerly direction. It is thought that C1 D445 is still located in the southern LONG HAIs.
- 3. CHAU DUC. On 4 Apr an agent report was received at BINH BA (eval VN C3, Aust F3) stating that 6 cadre personnel from CHAU DUC had been in the area of the KIM LONG Rubber Plantation(YS 4483).
- 4. C25/ LONG DAT. It is thought that C 25 Conc Coy (LONG DAT District) is still located in the LONG HAI hills.

Mine Incidents

- on 2 Apr 71 at YS 614802 an APC det a 20-301b mine on Rte 328. This resulted in 2 Aust WIA and extensive damage to the APC.
- 6. On 4 Apr 71 at YS 622667 an APC det an 801b mine on Rte 328 this resulted in 1 Aust WIA (later ret to duty) and moderate damage to the APC.

General

1. Last week, the enemy maintained a relatively high level of activity in the northern half of the republic. In the southern half, however, activity was light to moderate. The shelling of KHE SANH decreased, although the enemy initiated numerous small ambushes and ground contacts on and north of QL 9. Intelligence indicated the presence of elements of the 270 NVA regt and two additional sapper bns in NW QUANG TRI Prov. The 3 Phase of the enemy's Winter-Spring Campaign in VC MR 5 was initiated with a substantial increase in ground actions and attacks by fire. Significant fighting took place in the highlands. In the remainder of the country, with the exception of a determined attack on the CANG LONG District town in the Delta, economy of force tactics characterised a normal week of light to moderate activity. Of significance in the last week or so have been un sually hy attks on three district capitals. The actions at IUC IUC, PHU NHON and CANG LONG will undoubtedly have serious repercussions on the community defence and local developement program in widely scattered areas of the country.

MR 1

There were proported incidents reported during the week, 22 of these were enemy initiated. The total results of these were Frd; 206 KIA, 402 WIA, 9 trucks, 242 tons of 8" ammo, 7,000 gals MOGAS, 2 X 155mm Howitzers dest, 5 I/Wpns and 1 AN/PRC 25 set 3 rt. Enemy losses were 239 KIA, 14 suspects det, 57 I/Wpns, 14 CSWs, 21 RPG rds, 70 Hand Grens and 1 AN/PRC 10 CIA.

MR 2

There were 21 reported incidents during the period 17 of these were enemy initiated, the total results of these were Frd 58 KIA, 183 WIA, 118 MIA, 2 helis, 8 I/Wpns, 1 155mm Howitzer, 1 60mm Mor, and 1 radio lost, in one incident US SOIs were compromised. Enemy losses were 48 KIA, 2 suspects detained, 28 I/Wpns, 10 CSWs, 2 RPG rds, 8 HGs, 1 satchel charge and 1.5 tons of rice.

MR 3

4. There were 8 incidents reported throughout the MR during the period, 7 of these were enemy initiated. The total results of these were: Frd, 22 KIA, 78 WIA 1 MIA, and 1 I/Wpn lost. Enemy losses were 7 KIA, 1 PW, 1 I/Wpn, 1 CSW, 2 tons of riceand 1 ton of flour CIA.

MR 4

There were 13 is cidents reported during the period 10 of these were enemy initiated. The total results of these were: Frd; 82 KIA, 107 WIA, 16 MIA, 1 155mm howitzer, 1 OH 6A, 40 I/Wpns, 2 radios and 1 AH 1G. Enemy losses were: 32 KIA, 2 PW, 23 I/Wpns, 9 CSWs, 88 HGs, 15 mines and 2 60mm Mors CIA.

Forecast

Next week, with the exception of QUANG TRI Prov and the B3 Front, enemy initiated activity probably will be at light to moderate levels throughout the Republic. The en's current surge in VC MR 5 is expected to run its course early in the week, although continued heavy fighting in the DUC DUC area is possible. The continued reinforcing of enemy units in the U MINH Forcest probably will result in heavier fighting in the future, but next week in the Delta only light to moderate enemy activity is expected.

1. Activity has returned to a low level over the past week, their being only 9 contacts resulting in 2 en WIA (BT) and no frd acs.

En Unit IDs and Locs.

- 2. <u>D445.</u> A VC hilled at YS 513539 on 14 Apr has been ident as an assist squad ldr from C1 D445. This indicates that C1 is still located in the LONG HAI Hills. It is thought that the remainder of D445 is currently located in the area W and SW of BINH GIA.
- 3. C25. There has been 1 agent report(doubtful) stating that on 10 Apr 1 pl of C25 deployed from the LONG HAIs to YS 537554 with the task of collecting taxes and food. It is still considered that C25 is still located in the LONG HAI Hills.
- 4. C41/CHAU DUC. Once again there have been no positive ID of C41 or HQ CHAU DUC District Unit but it is thought that they are possibly located in the BA BINH area (YT 4704) in S LONG KHANH Province.
- 5. HQ BA LONG. Once again there have been no positive IDs, but it is probably located in S LONG KHANH Prov in the vic of NUI BE BAC(YS6199).
- 6. There was only 1 mine incident on 11 Apr at YS 613717 when a tank det a 60 801b mine. There were no frd cas but the tank was extensively damaged.

General

Last week, enemy activity was moderate throughout the northern half of South Vienam, while it remained light to moderate in the southern half. In Western Quang Tri Province, the expected enemy interdiction of QL 9 and sapper attacks did not materialize; however, several minor ABF were conducted. For the most part, the third phase of the Winter-Spring Campaign in VC MR-5 terminated during the week. In the highlands, B-3 Front forces continued to conduct ABF and ground attacks in the Dak To area, especially at FSB 6, sustaining heavy casualties. In GVN MR 3, enemy activity decreased slightly except in the Saigon area, where terrorist indidents increased. In the Delta, enemy activity continuedat light to moderate level with ABF and ground attacks against RF/PF outposts and ARVN night defesive positions. The most significant of these actions was the everrunning of three RF/PF outposts.

MR 1

In MR 1 last week there were 16 reported incidents of these, 9 were enemy initiated. The total results of these were: Frd /9 KIA, 80 X WIA, 1 X AH-1G helicopter and 1 M-113 destroyed. En; 46 KIA, 34 PWs, 10 I/Wpns, 4 CSWs, 5 X 105mm Shells, 50 blocks TNT, 724 X 82mm Mor rds, 32 X 60mm Mor rds, 17 M16 mines, 10 122mm Rkts, 100 HGs, 3 tons of rice, .6 tons of potatoes CIA, and 1 junk destroyed.

MR 2

In MR 2 last week there were 39 reported incidents 15 of these were enemy initiated. The total results were: Frd 91 KIA, 281 WIA, 53 MIA, 53 I/Wpns, 1 X 5 ton truck and 1 ARVN bus Destroyed. Enemy losses were 1693 KIA, 21 PWs, 194 I/Wpns, 38 CSWs, 1 X 60mm Mor and 1 Radio.

Enemy losses were 58 KIA, 1 PW, 111 I/Wpns, 10 HGs, 2 CSWs, 2.4 tons SA armo and 3 Sampans destroyed.
- Next week, enemy activity likely will continue at a light to moderate level throughout SVN with the possible exception of the B 3 Front. In W QUANG TRI Prov, the enemy maintains the capability to interdict QL 9 and to conduct sapper attacks and ABFs. For the most part, in VC MR 5, enemy activity is expected to be light as he continues to resupply and refit; however, more fighting in the DUC DUC area is possible. Activity by B 3 Front elms in the DLK TO area is likely to continue but at a reduced level. Attacks along QL 9 and 14 are also possible. Throughout MR 3, enemy activity probably will stay at a low level and terrorist incidents in Saigon may continue. In the Delta, light to moderate enemy activity is expected.

General

Week except in the Tri-Border area of Kontum Prov. In Quang Tri and Thau Thien Provinces, enemy activity was extremely light as major B-5 Front and MRTTH units probably were consolidating rear logistical areas. In VC MR 5, activity was light and scattered. Although the 95B NVA Regt remained in the vic of PHU NHON, activity in the B3 Front was cone in the vic of BEN HET as the enemy maintained his pressure on FSB 6 in the first step of a campaign to dominate the area. However, the intensity of his attks subsided. Reports indicated that the enemy has received a significant number of replacements since the fighting Tan in the area. Light activity prevailed in MR3 and 4, although the number of rnds expended per ABF in MR3 increased noticeably, indicating that the enemy may be solving some of his supply problems. An SL - 8 infiltration trawler was sunk in territorial waters off AN XUYEN Prov. The intensity of infiltration by trawlers, which increased markedly after Sihanouk-ville was denied, remains high and is indicative of serious supply problems facing the enemy in the southern Delta.

Elsewhere, there are few indications of any significant increases in enemy activity, although some rise is expected from the very low levels in northern MR1 and southern MR 4, and Allied ops in western THUA THIEN Province probably will meet substantial enemy resistance. For the most part, siege type tactics are likely to be used; however, the enemy will not hesitate to sacrifice sizeable numbers of troops when he beleives it advantageous, and several reports have mentioned preparation of a tank corridor along route 512. Throughout the country, the enemy will pursue his political activities, stressing terrorism and proselyting.

1 ATF TAOR

General

1. There were 13 contacts with task force elms during the week however, enemy initiated activity remained at a very low level throughout the prevince. There were no mine incidents reported however two mines were located and dest in situ by infantry patrols.

- 4. CHAU DUC Documents CIA and 1 VC KIA(ident) on 19 Apr at YS507844 ident elms C41 Conc Coy CHAU DUC. On 20 Apr at YS 531879 positively ident C41 Con Coy and other elms of HQ CHAU DUC Dist.
- 5. C25 There has been no identof C25 Conc Coy (LONG DAT Dist), however it is possible that it has moved from the LONG HAI Hills to the area SW of XUYEN MOC.

1 ATF TAOR

General

1. There were only 3 contacts with task force elms during the week, once again reflecting the very low level of enemy activity within the province. These contacts resulted in 2 VC KIA(BC) and 4 VC WIA (BT) while there were no Aust casualties. There was one mine incident in which an APC received minor damage. There were no cas in this incident.

Enemy Unit IDs and Locs

- 2. CHAU DUC On 24 Apr a rallier indicated that HQ CHAU DUC and C41 (total str 30 persons) were located up to 20 Apr at YS498863 in a bunkersystem. This was borne out by several documents captured in this area last week. It is probable that CHAU DUC have now moved to the extreme north of AO LISA or even into S LONG KHANH.
- D 445 On 28 Apr documents captured by A Coy 2 RAR indicated that D445 had passed through this area about 18 Apr probably taking wounded to K76A hosp in S LONG KHANH. Following the series of contacts between elms of D445 and 2 and 3 RAR over the past 6 weeks it is thought that they have aborted their mission of attacking RF/PF posts in DUC THANH area and have moved into LONG KHANH to avoid the constant harrassing by 1 ATF troops. Even though there is no definite knowledge of casualties suffered by D 445, it is thought that at least 15 erem have been KIA or WIA since D445 left their base in the NUI BE Mts. C1/D445 still remains in the LONG HAI hills.
- 4. C 25 It is still not known whether C25, Long Tat Conc Coy, remains in the LONG HAI Hills or has moved east to the "LONG GREET" area.

1. Throughout the Repuplic last week, enemy initiated activity was at a very low level. The lack of significant contact or cache discoveries in W QUANG TRI and THAU THIEN provs indicate that forces on LAMSON 720 have not yet threatned the enemy's logistical system. The enemy initiated only scattered minor incidents in the 5 provinces of VC MR 5, where his forces are beleived to be preparing for coming tacticle ops. Activity continued at a reduced level in the highlands, although several contacts in the BEN HET-DAK TO area and in S PLEIKU Prov indicate that B3 Front forces remain in forward positions and possibly are regrouping for continued attacks. Activity was light and scattered in MR 3, where the enemy continued to contest Allied initiatives between THUNG LAP and DAU TIENG. Enemy activity remained very low in MR 4. Analysis shows that DT 2 VC Regt, one of 8 enemy regts in the delta, has been disbanded, with its 3 understrength Bns being subordinated either to Province or MR HQ.

MR 1

In MR 1 last week 11 incidents were reported, 3 of these were enemy initiated. The total result s of these were, Frd, 13 KIA, 51 WIA, 1 M 113 and a scout dog killed. Enemy losses were 77 KIA, 6 suspects det, 1 truck, 1 23mm AA gun, 1 CSW, 9 I/Wpns, 27 RPG rds, 500m commo wire and 5 tons rice.

MR 2

21 incidents were reported in MR 2 last week, 8 being enemy initiated. Total results were, Frd, 73 KIA, 13 WIA, 22 MIA, 1 5 ton tractor, 1 POL tanker and 13 I/Wpns. Enemy losses were 136 KIA, 48 suspects det, 20 I/Wpns, 19 CSWs, 33 tons of rice and 5 RPG rds.

MR 3

In MR 3, 8 incidents were reported 6 were enemy initiated. Results were: Frd, 12 KIA, 89 WIA, 3 Sheridan Tanks, 2 UH-1H and 1 0-1G. Enemy losses were 56 KIA, 5 I/Tpns, 2 CSWs and 7 60mm Mor rds.

MR4

5. 29 incidents were reported 7 of these were enemy initiated. Results were: Frd, 40 KIA, 98 WIA, 9 MIA, 32 I/Wpns, 3 radios and 1 AH-1G.
Enemy losses were 283 KIA, 44 PWs, 2 HOI CHANHS, 56 I/Wpns, 7 CSWs, and 43 Grens.

Next reek, activity throughout the Republic probably will increase. The enemy will fight to defend important logistical points in W QUANG TRI and THAU THIEN, the targets of LAMSON 720. The enemy is expected to conduct a surge of activity in VC MR 5. This phase of his spring - summer campaign will probably be of limited intensity and duration. Little change in activity is forecast in MR 3, while in MR4 enemy activity is expected to increase, particularly in KIEN HOA and DINH TUONG Provs and the CA MAU Peninsula. Propaganda, proselyting, terrorism, abduction and extortion will be emphasised throughout the republic.

MOVEMENT OF STORES TO SAIGON AND LONG BINH

General

1301. This section details the requesting procedures for movement of stores to Saigon and Long Binh.

1302. Means of movement are :

- a. By backloading on routine US Army convoys. Dates can be obtained from the Log Ops Branch. This method is unsuitable for movement of small loose items unless packed in locked conexes.
- b. By RAASC transport.

Procedures

- 1305, Units requiring movement of stores are to :
 - a. Complete an Application for Space (AAF T58) and submit this to Det 11 MC Gp 48 hours before the required date of uplift.
 - Arrange for a receipt of stores at the destination shown on the AAF T58s. For Engineer or Ordnance origin stores for Long Binh contact the appropriate Australian Army representative (Phone 926 6412).
 - delivered. Report discrepancies to the Log Ops Branch

1304. Det 11 MC Gp is to :

- a. For US Army transport, prepare copies of the TCMD and submit to the Movement Control Centre (MCC) Vung Tau.
- b. Arrange the date/time of uplift with MCC and inform the requesting unit 24 hours beforehand.
- c. For RAASC transport, arrange the tasking with the SC Q (Ops).
- 1305. The SC Q (Ops) is to inform unit representatives of the intention to use RAASC transport two days before the planned date. Detailed loads will be arranged at the 1030 hours Log Ops Conference the day before the convoy runs and units informed of loading timings.

Priority Movement

1306. All requests for movement of priority stores to Saigon or Long Binh will be made direct to the SC Q (Ops) on EMU 63.

SECTION 10

General

1001. This section details the vehicles and equipment subject to tasking and the circumstances in which tasking will take place.

1002. The SC Q (Ops) is responsible for the tasking of transport and equipment.

Vehicles and Equipment Subject to Tasking.

1003. All 1ALSG unit's vehicles, trailer equipment and forklifts are subject to tasking. Means are:

- a. Routine tasking of RAASC transport.
- b. Brigading of unit domestic transport/equipment.

1004. Unit vehicle/equipement holding and serviceability states are to be forwarded to the Log Ops Branch each week as detailed in Section 14 of these SOP's.

1005. The procedures for tasking RAASC transport for routine maintenance of the force is detailed in Section 3 of these SOP's.

Brigading of Unit Transport

1006. Brigading will take place when :

- a. Routine bids for transport axceed the RAASC availability.

SECTION 7

HANDLING OF HMAS SYDNEY AT VUNG TAU

Introduction

701. The converted RAN aircraft carrier, HMAS SYDNEY transports troops, vehicle, equipment and unit stores to and from Vung Tau approximately three times a year. Annex A to this section gives background information about the ship.

702. The ship's Captain's directive requires HMAS SYDNEY to depart from Vung Tau by 1400 hrs on the day of arrival, having anchored at a pre-allotted stream station at 0700 hours. Although COMAFV is able to direct that she return to complete an operation HMAS SYDNEY will not remain at anchorage beyond 1400 hours each day. The movement and terminal operations involved must therefore be planned to avoid unnecessary delays.

Aim:

703. This section details the procedures to be adopted for the terminal operations involved with the arrival and departure of HMAS SYDNEY.

Organization

704. The operation is primarily of a Movements nature. Co-ordination of ALSG, ATF and US recourse and requirements, however, requires that Q (Maint) Branch be responsible for the overall co-ordination of the operation.

- 705. The organizations involved in the terminal operation are:
 - a. HQ 1 ALSG Overall supervision.
 - b. Det 11 MC Gp Detailed planning of the movement and terminal operations.
 - c. Det 30 Terminal Sqn Cargo checking.
 - d. 110 Sig Sqn Radio operators.
 - e. 5 Coy hasc Transport
 - f. 2 AOD Vehicle preparation team.
 - g. AFV Pro Unit Traffic control; Security.
 - 1. ALSG Units Security picquets

 - b. Alaska Barge and Transport Inc. (AB & T) stevedores on barges and tugs.

Diridica of Responsibilities

- 707. HQ 1 ATF will normally lay down the security required for the movement of personnel between Nui Dat and Vung Tau and return. This will affect the means of movement required and the need to provide security forces enroute. The degree to which HQ 1 ATF is required to control the operation will depend on the means of movement to and from Vung Tau. In any case HQ 1 ATF must be included as the action addressee for all movement instructions originating at HQ 1 ALSG and be represented at all briefings or conferences dealing with the operation.
- 708. Air resources and/or road movement security elements are to be arranged with HQ 1 ATF. Where road movement is involved, HQ 1 ATF is responsible for the control of movement between Nui Dat and Cat Lo naval base. Once past Cat Lo naval base 1 ALSG assumes control for the remainder of the operation. For the return trip 1 ATF control resumes at Cat Lo.

Duties

709. Duties of the various organizations are shown in Ahnex B. Annex C details the duties of HMAS Sydney.

Phases

- 710. The operation is carried out in three phases:
 - a. Phase 1 Preparation
 - b. Phase 2 Concurrent discharge and loading of passengers and cargo
 - c. Phase 3 Movement of cargo to Nui Dat.

/711

711. Phase 1 commences some weeks before the due date of arrival of HMAS Sydney. Liaison is carried out with HQ 1 ATF and the out-going unit/units by DAQMG(Maint) and OC Det 11 MC Gp. During these visits the following points are to be covered:

- a. If possible at this early stage, the transportation mode to be used to move personnel to and from Vung Tau, and the alternative movement plan.
- b. Documentation for personnel and cargo to be submitted by the outgoing unit.
- c. Requirements for packing of unit stores.
- d. Baggage able to be carried by personnel.
- e. Any special requirements such as disposal of ammunition needed for the move to Vung Tâu.
- f. When cargo is to be ready for collection.
- 712. After the initial visit the out-going unit is to be issued with a written brief covering in detail all requirements of the unit for their preparation to move. This is to be issued by OC Det 11 MC Gp. Further confirmatory liaison visits closer to the day of departure will help to avoid last minute delays.

Terminal Operations Conference

713. A Terminal Operations Conference is held approximately ten days before the arrival date of the ship. Attendance at this conference is:

a. Automatic:

- (1) DAQMG(Maint) Chairman
- (2) OC Det 11 MC Gp Operation briefing officer.
- (3) Cargo Officer HMAS Sydney Naval IO.
- (4) Representatives of ALSG units involved in the operation.
- (5) Representatives of 1 ATF units embarking and disembarking.

b. By invitation:

- (1) HQ 1 ATF representatives preferably from:
 - (a) Q branch
 - (b) G(Ops) or G(Air) branches
- (2) 159 Tn Bn (Tmnl)
- (3) Alaska Barge and Transport Inc

- 714. DAQMG (Maint) is to chair the conference and ensure all matters are co-ordinated and understood by all concerned. OC Det 11 MC Gp will, however, normally give the operational briefing section of the conference.
- 715. If the operation involves a road move HQ 1 ATF may require an additional conference to co-ordinate their responsibilities in this regard. Even so, wherever possible, in the interests of economy the two conferences should be combined.

Documentatio.

- 716. Documentation to be prepared for submission to Det 11 MC Gp by going units or units submitting cargo for return to Australia by HMAS SYDNEY are:
 - a. Personnel:
 - (1) Nominal Roll of draft 25 copies
 - (2) Strenght return AAF T51 12 copies
 - b. Unit Stores and Weapons. Vehicle/Equipments.
 - (1) Application for space T58 2 copies.
 - (2) Certificate of Safety and Cleanliness 2 copies per container (BMSS). One copy in each BMSS. Other copy to Det 11 MC Gp.
 - c. Individual Luxury Items:
 - (1) Application for space T58 2 copies.
 - (2) Certificate of Safety and Cleanliness 2 copies per container one copy in each container. The other copy to Det 11 MC GP.
 - d. MFO prepared in accordance AFV SOP's.
- 717. Documentation emanating from 1 ATF units is to be submitted to Det 11 MC Gp on D-1 by 1200 hrs. Documentation applicable to 1 ALSG stores is to be submitted to Det 11 MC Gp by 1600 hrs D-4.

Movement of Stores:

718. All unit stores and vehicles or equipments emanating from 1 ALSG units are to be handed over to Det 11 MC Gp at the Vung Tau Subport Hard on D-1 according to timings laid down in the movements instruction.

Liaison/Control Helicopter

719. Q (Maint) Branch is to submit a transport air request for one utility helicopter to be available from 0700 hours until the ship sails on D day. This helicopter is used for embarking and disembarking the boarding party and for other liaison or control tasks allotted by DAQMG (Maint).

Ships Boarding Party

- 720. A boarding party consisting of the following personnel is to be placed aboard HMAS Sydney as soon as possible after arrival. These personnel have priority for air movement:
 - a. DAQMG (Maint) over-all control and helicopter backloading.
 - b. Radio operator.
 - c. Det 11 MC Gp 1 Offr.
 - d. Chairman group 1 Offr & 2 OR from Det 176 AD Coy RAASC.
 - e. Det 30 Terminal Sqn 1 Offr & 2 OR cargo checking.
 - f. 2 AOD 1 WO/NCO, 4 OR Vehicle preparation.
 - g. Ships Cargo Officer (may move with barges)
 - h. AFV Records 1 Offr/NCO.
- 721. Other personnel who will require air movement to the ship are:
 - a. Comd 1 ALSG.
 - b. Representatives disembarking unit up to 4.
 - c. Representatives embarking unit up to 4.
 - d. Cash Office 1 Offr.
 - e. Public Relations Representatives up to 6.
 - f. Army Records Representative 1 NCO.
 - g. Other personnel at the discretion of the DAQMG (Maint).
- 722. Visitors to the ship, not having an operational need to embark, are to be kept to a minimum.
- 723. Reserved.

724. Reserved.

Movement of Personnel

725. The method of moving personnel to and from Nui Dat will depend mainly on the weather at the time of arrival of the ship. The usual method of movement will be by air, from Nui Dat directly to the flight deck of the ship. The alternative is to move the embarking personnel from Nui Dat to the Vung Tau sub-port by road, and thence to the ship by the ship's organic Landing Craft Mechanised Type 6 (LCM6) of which there are six. The disembarking troops move soncurrently in the opposite direction by the same means.

726. Whichever means is employed, a specific operation to move personnel to and from the ship must be planned on each occasion. Factors to be considered are:

- a. Air movement between Nui Dat and the ship is the fastest method of changing over units, provided a minimum of three CH-47 Chinook aircraft are used.
- b. Road movement will usually require in excess of thirty TCVs.

 Six packets of five vehicles spaced approximately 20 minutes

 apart will reduce congestion at the sub-port. Each five

 trucks will carry one LCM6 load.
- c. Ships army staff is to notify by signal of the numbers required to be disembarked each lift.
- d. Det 176 AD Coy RAASC provide two dispatchers at each end of the air journey to marshall and brief troops emplaning and deplaning.
- e. In a road move, the embarking unit is to provide sufficient marshalls to brief and control personnel at the sub-port prior to boarding the LCM6's.

Documentation Checks

- 727. Disembarking personnel leave the ship under the direction of ships army staff. They are finally checked by Det 11 MC Gp:
 - a. If for movement by road at the subport.
 - b. If for air movement on leaving the ship.

Life Belts

728. Before disembarking from HMAS Sydney each passenger is provided with a life belt. This must be collected at the subport hard and re-issued to embarking passengers. In air moves these are placed beneath the aircraft seats, one for each passenger.

Ammunition

of ammunition either before leaving Sydney or, preferably, on arrival at the subport. If moving by air these magazines/belts are NOT to be placed on or in weapons. Similarly embarking passengers if moving to Vung Tau by road will be required to replace any full magazines with empty magazines before embarking on the LCM. If air movement is employed no ammunition should be carried although this is a matter for the embarking unit commander's discretion.

Hand Luggage

730. Passengers moving to or from the ship are to be restricted to one piece of hand luggage in addition to personal webbing and weapon. Total all up weight of luggage on or carried by the man for air movement is restricted to 100 lbs.

Documentation - Disembarkation

- 731. Ship army staff are required to prepare nominal rolls for disembarking personnel by numbers required for each movement agency unit load:
 - a. DCO 6 copies to be handed to MC at hard or aboard the ship, depending upon whether air or road move.
 - b. Army Staff HMAS Sydney file 1 copy.
- 732. These nominal rolls, being made out according to the movement agency unit load, act as air manifests if this agency is employed.

Documentation: Embarkation.

- 733. Documentation already provided by the embarking unit is to be used by the MC staff aboard ship to check personnel aboard. They are to be distributed:
 - a. Ships Army Staff 6 copies.
 - b. Remaining 19 copies in accordance with current AHQ/AFV instructions.

Cargo

- 734. Cargo for back/load to Australia is to be loaded onto barges at the subport on D-1 under Det 11 MC Gp arrangements. A guard is to be provided overnight. Barges are to be positioned alongside the ship by AB & T tug as soon after the ship becomes stationary as practicable.
- 735. Cargo being off loaded is to be prepared, in the case of vehicles, by the vehicle preparation team and off loaded by ships crew onto the barges provided by AB & T.
- 736. Det 30 Terminal Sqn checkers are to check the loading and off loading of all cargo and acquit documentation before leaving the ship.
- 737. Off loaded cargo is then to be moved, with escorts, by the barges to the subport where it is to be transported under Det 11 MC Gp arrangements to addressee units. Cargo for Nui Dat is to be given priority and is to be moved to Nui Dat on the day of arrival.

Return of Boarding Part

738. All boarding party personnel who have completed their task and visitors to the ship are to be cleared by helicopter ICM or barge as soon as practicable. Some boarding party personnel will be required to remain until the ship is ready to depart. These are flown off by the last sorties of the liason/control helicopter.

Communications

- 742. A communications instruction is to be included in the operation instruction. Prepared by OC Det 11 MC Gp, it is to include communication between:
 - a. Q (Maint) operations room (control)
 - b. DAQMG (Maint) aboard HMAS Sydney.
 - c. Det 11 MC Gp embarkation group aboard HMAS Sydney.
 - d. OC Det 11 MC Gp at subport hard.
 - e. Vung Tau air Terminal MC party if applicable.
 - f. Aircraft if applicable.
 - g. Nui Dat Terminal MC perty if applicable.
 - h. Provost escorts for road movement if applicable.
 - i. Any other links desirable for a particular operation.
 - j. St Kilda helipad.

Administration

- 743. Accommodation, ratioing and transport within the Vung Tau area, for transit personnel are to be arranged with HQ Coy 1 ALSG by Q (Maint) Branch.
- 744. Meals or rations for overnight picquets or picquets remaining with stores until transported to their destination are to be arranged with HQ Coy 1 ALSG or where practicable, parent units.
- .745. Philanthropic organizations prepared to provide refreshments for embarking or disembarking personnel are to be encouraged except that due consideration is to be given to any delays likely to occur as a result of their operations.

BACKGPOUND INFORMATION ON HMAS SYDNEY

Description

1. HMAS Sydney is a RAN aircraft carrier modified to carry passangers and limited cargo in the form of vehicles, unit stores and equipment.

Cargo Handling

- 2. HMAS Sydney is fitted with:
 - a. Cranes

Two three ton cranes.

Cne NCK crane.

One 15 ton crane.

b. Landing Craft

Six LCM 6.

c. Catamarans

Sufficient for vessels lying along both sides.

- An RAN cargo handling organization exists on board the vessel.

 Its responsibility, through the Cargo Officer, is:
 - a. Liaison with the appropriate movement authority for the acceptance and/or refusal of cargo within the limitations of the JOINT POLICY and MOVEMENT INSTRUCTIONS.
 - b. SHIPS SIDE to SHIPS SIDE for stowage, safety and cargo handling.
 - c. Provision of stevedoring requirements within the SHIPS SIDE TO SHIPS SIDE responsibility.
 - d. Liaison with appropriate movement authorities to ensure that port facilities and methods of discharge/loading of personnel and cargo are within HMAS Sydney.'s operational directive.

14.

- When the loading is complete in Australia the Cargo Officer flies up to arrange the reception of the vessel. In conjunction with HQ 1 ALSG he plans the discharge and loading of the vessel. The Cargo Officer brings with him:
 - a. A directive from the Captain.
 - b. Manifest.
 - c. Stowage plan.
- 5. In general terms the directive covers neval matters but there may be matters dealing with cargo handling.
- An army component known as Ships Army Staff HMAS Sydney is included in the ships complement. It has no responsibility for cargo operations.

Naval Command

- 7. The Captain HMAS Sydney is responsible for the safety of the ship and may exercise this right at any time by halting operations if necessary.
- 8. Naval Staff Officer (NSO2) HQ AFV assists the Cargo Officer in implementing the naval aspects of the Captains directive and provides the command liaison between HQ AFV and HMAS Sydney.
- 9. The normal means of discharge is:

a. Personnel

- (1) Ashore by LCM6 provided by HMAS Sydney.
- (2) To destinations by air or road depending on tactical considerations at the time.

b. Cargo

By barges, lighters, or landing craft as available to Vung Tau port and further movement by road.

10. Personnel and cargo being loaded are backloaded by the means employed to discharge personnel and cargo.

UNIT/SERVICE RESPONSIBILITIES HMAS SYDNEY OPERATIONS

I - HQ 1 ALSG

- 1. HQ 1 ALSG is responsible for the conduct and control of the operation. This includes:
 - a. Co-ordination of all eloments involved.
 - b. Planning and execution of the discharge and loading in conjunction with Cargo Officer HMAS Sydney.
 - c. Forecasting the requirement and obtaining the resources from supporting transportation organizations.

 - i. Ensuring the documentation for disembarking and embarking personnel is completed.
 - j. Providing transit accommodation for personnel delayed overnight.
 - 1. Providing currency exchange for persons with destinations other than Nui Dat.
 - m. Preparing and issuing all staff signals relating to the operation.

II - ALSG UNITS

Det 11 MC Gp

- 2. Det 11 MC Gp is responsible for:
 - a. Issuing and implementing the movement instruction and supervising its execution.
 - b. Co-ordinating all movements and terminal aspects of the plan.
 - c. Establishing MC posts as required at:
 - (1) IMAS Sydney.
 - (2) AB & T Hard.
 - (3) ATF
 - (4) Vung Tau Airfield
 - d. Calling forward personnel for loading on the supporting transportation media.
 - e. Checking nominal rolls/air manifests and retention fo prescribed copies.
 - f. Advising DAQMG (Maint) on stato of disembarkation or embarkation.
 - g. Briefing embarking/disembarking personnel at Vung Tau Hard on subsequent stages of the operation.
 - h. Arranging call forward of stores as required by Det 30 Terminal Sqn.
 - i. Arranging on movement of cargo to all dostinations.
 - j. Receiving bids for space and processing them.
 - k. Preparing manifests and other necossary documentation for evacuated cargo.
 - 1. Dispatching the shipping documentation.
 - m. Clearing the ship's manifests prior to the ship's departure. (In conjunction with 30 Terminal Sqn).

- n. Initiating staff signals related to the operation.
- o. Mairtaining a record of the state of discharge or loading.
- p. Initiating any tracer action required on short delivered cargo.
- q. Compilation of nominal rolls.
- r. Co-ordination of backloading.

Det 30 Terminal

- 3. Det 30 Terminal Sqn is responsible for:
 - a. Documentation and checking of all cargo being handled.
 - b. Arranging the order of discharge in accordance with the movement plan. This is to be undertaken on board HMAS Sydney by unit members of the boarding party.
 - c. Manning Terminal Sqn Transit area.
 - d. Advising Det 11 MC Gp on the clearance of the ship and the port.
 - e. Arranging with Det 11 MC Gp for the call forward of cargo for loading,
 - f. Assisting MC with embarking or disembaring personnel if called upon.

2 AOD/102 Fd Wksp.

- 4. These units are responsible for:
 - a. Providing a vohicle prequration party for depot vehicles on the vessel.
 - b. Collection of vehicles from the hard and their delivery to depot.
 - c. Preparing and delivering vehicles to be backloaded.

HQ Coy

- 5. Administration of transit personnel.
- 6. Other units assist with personnel, vehicles or equipment as coordinated by Q (Maint) Branch.

159 Tn Bn (Tmnl)

7. Provision of terminal facilities including civilian stevedores, lighters and barges and if required, landing craft.

Alasks Barge and Transport Coy

- 8. AB & T is the stevedoring organisation, under the direction of 159 Tn Bn. It carries out:
 - a. Handling of cargo from or to ships side.
 - b. Delivery of cargo to 1 ALSG.

RAAF

9. Provision of a lisison helicopter.

HQ 1 ATF/1 ATF Units

- 10. Close collaboration between 1 ATF and 1 ALSG is essential for the success of operations.
- 11. 1 ATF's responsibilities include:
 - a. Delivering personnel to uplift point as required by MC.
 - Accepting responsibility for movement of personnel from
 1 ALSG handover point.
 - c. Nominating the air terminal when applicable.
 - d. Arranging currency exchange for Mui Dat personnel.
 - e. Preparing unit nominal rolls/air manifests.
 - f. Preparing "Application for Space" for backloaded cargo.
 - g. Requesting the necessary movement media for personnel and cargo in accordance with normal procedures.

HMAS SYDNEY

- 12. HMAS Sydney performs the following tasks to facilitate the army operation:
 - a. Establishes communication with HQ 1 ALSG through 110 Sig Sqn
 - b. Provides landing space for helicopters.
 - c. Provides catamarans to aid movement of craft alongside.
 - d. Prepares passengers for disembarkation in groups laid down by Det 11 MC Gp.
 - f. Receives incoming passengers from Det 11 MC Gp and conducts them away from the embarkation points.
 - g. Issues and receives the necessary documentation for passengers disembarked/embarked.
 - h. Controls the movement of craft alongside and handles lines to such craft.
 - i. Lays down and supevises sfety aspects of the ship board operation.
 - j. Discharges and loads cargo to and from lighters as requested by the checker from Det 30 Terminal Sqn
 - k. Operates mechanical handling equipment on board and stows cargo es required.
 - 1. Issues to Det 11 MC Gp all documentation on incoming cargo.
 - m. Receives the following do cumentation from Det 11 MC Gp on completion of loading:
 - (1) Statement of Cargo shipped.
 - (2) Safety certificate, if required.

ORDERS FOR THE WEST GATE GUARD

General

- 1. The West Gate is to be manned at all times by a Guard condisting of at least one NCO and 6 ORs.
- 2. The GSM, HQ 1 ALSG, is responsible to the GSO2, HQ 1 ALSG, for the conduct of the Guard.
- 3. Pl Comd, D & E Pl is responsible to GSO2 HQ 1 ALSG for providing the Guard.
- 4. HQ Coy is responsible for:
 - Provision and maintenance of accommodation and equipment allocated to the Guard.
 - b. Provision of bedding and meals required by the Guard and, if necessary prisoners.

Duties

- 5. The Guard is to:
 - control the movement of personnel and vehicles entering or leaving the 1 ALSG area through the West Gate in accordance. with the instruction below.
 - provide immediate assistance, only, to 1 Pl 2 AFCU piquet, or any: other person in an emergency, except that under no circumstances is the guard to be reduced to less than four persons on duty at the West Gate.
 - Receive into custody persons duly committed by Australian/ New Zealand Officers, WOs and NCOs.
 - d. To man one GPMG mounted at the West Gate.

Vehicle Control

6. Aust/NZ Service Vehicles

a. 0600-1900 hrs

The Guard is to check Aust/NZ Service wehicles passing through the West Gate and ensure:

- (1) That drivers are in possession of a valid Transport Work Ticket (AAF G2).
- (2) That drivers of single running vehicles proceeding beyond the Vung Tau Special Zone are in possession of a valid Free Running Pass and that condition of the pass are complied with.

b. 1900-2300 hrs

As for sub para a above except that the Guard is to ensure that vehicles proceeding to Vung Tau have a person on duty as shot gun and two long barrelled weapons.

c. 2300-0600 hrs

As for sub paras a and b above except that the Guard is also to ensure that all vehicles are recorded in the Veh/Pers Log attached at Appendix 1.

In the case of a convoy, the Convoy commander is to declare the number of vehicles in the Convoy, destination and details of any non Aust/NZ service personnel.

7. Other Vehicles

a. US Vehicles and Aust/NZ Civilian Vehicles

- (1) These vehicles are only to be permitted to enter the 1 ALSG area if:
 - (a) All persons in the vehicle are identified as US/Aust/NZ.
 - (b) US persons and Aust/NZ Civilians have specific invitations to visit a Unit or persons in 1 ALSG or are proceeding to the 1 Pl 2 AFCU area only.

Note 1

If persons other than US/Lust/NZ are included in the vehicle, the vehicle is not to proceed into the area without an escort who is a member of 1 ALSG.

Note 2

If a vehicle is permitted to enter the 1 ALSG area to visit 1 Pl 2 AFCU facilities it is to be parked in the special area provided.

- (2) All such vehicles are to be recorded in the Veh/Pers Log as they enter and leave the 1 ALSG area.
- Where such a vehicle is permitted to enter the area to visit the 1 Pl 2 AFCU area and proceeds beyond that area the Guard is to contact AFV Pro Unit (EMU 128), and give details of the vehicle so that it can be escorted out of the 1 ALSG area.

b. Non Aust/NZ/US Vehicles

- (1) All vehicles other than Aust/NZ/US entering or leaving the 1 ALSG area through the West Gate are to be stopped and searched for illegal goods and are to be recorded in the Veh/Pers Log.
- (2) Vehicles with a 1 ALSG vehicle pass may be permitted to enter the area if:
 - (a) The vehicle is not carrying any illegal goods.
 - (b) All persons have exchanged their civilian ID card for valid AMF passes.
 - (c) A member of 1 ALSG accompanies the party as escorts.
- Vehicles without a 1 ALSG vehicle pass are not to be permitted to enter the 1 ALSG area without clearance from HQ 1 ALSG (GS Branch) and are to be escorted by a member of 1 ALSG who shall be responsible for the conduct of the party.

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Note 1

Vehicles found to be carrying illegal goods are to be held at the West Gate and reported to HQ 1 ALSG as follows:

- a. During normal working hours: To IO HQ 1 ALSG (EMU 51).
- b. Outside normal working hours: To Duty Officer.
 HQ 1 ALSG (EMU 11/31).

Personnel Control

Aust/NZ Service Personnel

a. 0600-2300 hours

Aust/NZ Service Personnel are to be given free acess to and from the 1 ALSG area provided they are:

- (1) In possession of a valid ID Card and ID Discs.
- Properly dressed in accordance with 1 ALSG Standing Orders Chap 2 Sect 2.
- (3) On duty or in possession of a valid leave pass.

Note 1

If identified as an officer of 1 ALSG, no leave pass is required.

b. 2300-2400 hrs

As above except that persons not on duty are to have late leave and their names recorded at the West Gate Guard Room.

c. 2400-0600 hrs

Service personnel entering or leaving 1 ALSG outside the hours 0600-2400 hrs or in contravention of these requirements are to be reported to parent units with a copy of the report to HQ 1 ALSG. The report form is attached as Appendix 2.

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9. US Personnel and Aust/NZ Civilians

- US Personnel and Aust/NZ Civilians may be permitted to enter the 1 ALSG area unescorted once their identities and destination within 1 ALSG are established and details have been recorded in the Voh/Rers Logo
- b. The departure of all such persons is also to be recorded in the Vel Pers Log.
- 10. Civilian Employees Civil employees with a valid AMF Pass may be permitted to contor the 1 ALSG area under escert. Civil employees leaving the 1 ALSG are to be searched under Civil Labour Office arrangements, however the West Gate Guard may be required to assist the Civil Labour Office in searching male civilian employees. Entry/exit of civil employees is to be recorded by Civil Labour Officer.
- 11. Other Persons Other personnel are not to be permitted to enter or leave the 1 ALSG area unless they are accompanied by a member of 1 ALSG who shall be responsible for the conduct of the party and the visit has been cleared by HQ 1 ALSG (GS Branch). Such persons are to be lodged in and out of the 1 ALSG area.

Escorts

- 12. Escorts for civil contractors vehicles, 1 ALSG buses between 1900 and 0600 hrs and for visitors to HQ 1 ALSG are to be provided from the escorts allocated to the West Gate Guard.
- 13. Escorts for visitors to units are to be provided by the unit being visited.

Personnel Placed in Custody

- Australian/NZ Service personnel who are duly committed by an Australian or You Zealand Officer, Warrant Officer or NCO, provided always that the persons committing a servicemen into custody gives verbal advice at the time of the committal of the charge (s) which is/are to be preferred and a written Charge Report is prepared as soon as practicable after the committal.
- Searching Persons committed into custody of the West Gate Guard are to be searched and knives or other weapons, matches, cigarettes lighters or any dangerous objects taken from them.

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- Reception Book: The Guard is to maintain a Reception Book in which is to be recorded the following details of persons being received into custody.
 - a. Regimental number, rank and full name.
 - b. Unit.
 - c. Date/time person received into custody.
 - d. The alleged offence (s).
 - The rank, name and unit of person committing the member into custody.
- Property Book The Guard Commander is also to maintain the Property Book in which he will enter the number, rank and name of every member committed into custody. All articles taken from the prisoner are to be recorded in the Property Book. Care is to be taken to ensure that sufficient description is made of all articles to assist in subsequent identification. Where no articles have been removed from the prisoner, a NIL entry will be recorded. Entries are to be vertified by the prisoner signing his name or by counter signature by the NCO receiving the articles, should the prisoner refuse or be unable to sign. When the prisoner is transferred to someone else's custody or them he is released, he is to sign the Property Book for the property returned to him. When a prisoner is unable to sign, the person receiving the prisoner is to sign as having received the property.
- Accommodation As far as possible prisoners are to be placed in separate cells. Where this is impracticable by reason of the numbers of persons in custody up to three prisoner may be placed in one cell. When a prisoner is drunk or violent he is not to be placed in a cell with a person who is in a similar condition.

19. Treatment

- Each prisoner is to be provided with clean bedding and meals are to be served to him in his cell during normal meal times.
- A prisoner is to be allowed to visit the toilet on request but is to be escorted to and from the toilet. The guard is to remain outside the toilet.
- Drunken or violent persons committed into custody are to be deprived of their boots.
- d. Prisoners are to be visited at least once every two hours to ascertain their condition.

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- 20. Letters Whilst in custody a prisoner may receive any letter that is addressed to him, and is to be provided with paper and pen to write letters unless he is drank or violent or, in the opinion of the guard comd, to give the prisoner a pen could be dangerous to the prisoner or others.
- 21. Prohibited Items A prisoner is not to be given books, cigarettes or other luxury items whilst he is in custody.
- 22. Visits Prisoners may be visited by the following personnel:
 - a. Duty Officer HQ 1 ALSG.
 - b. The prisoner's Unit Commander or a Unit Officer appointed by the Unit Commander.
 - c. A Padre if requested by the prisoner.
 - d. A duly appointed Legal Officer or Defending Officer.
 - A Medical Officer if requested by the prisoner or other wise necessary.
- 23. Employment Each prisoner is to keep his cell clean and may be given light duties in the Guard Room provided that no danger would result from his being so employed.
- Release of Persons Committed into Custody The Guard Comd is not to release an officer or soldier committed to the custody of the Guard except on the direction of one of the following authorities:
 - a. Comd 1 ALSG, or
 - b. DAA & QMG 1 ALSG, or
 - c. The person who committed the officer or soldier to custody, or
 - The OC of the unit or detachment of which the officer or soldier in custody is a member, or
 - The OC AFV Amenities Unit (if the officer or soldier in custody is normally from a unit outside 1 ALSG but is temporarily a member of AFV Amenities Unit), or
 - A Military Policeman of AFV Pro Unit (if the officer or soldier was committed by a member of that Unit).

The GPMG

25. The GPMG is to be manned at all times.

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- 26. The weapon is to be "loaded" as defined in 1 ALSG Standing Orders unless otherwise directed by GSO2 HQ 1 ALSG:
 - a. Breech empty.
 - b. Working parts forward.
 - c. Safety catch on.
 - d. Belt on weapon.
- Normal 1 ALSG Rules of Engagement apply and are to be placed in view of the person manning the gun.
- 28. The weapon is to have one belt of 200 rounds on the weapon and 1000 rounds as first line reserve unless otherwise directed by GSO2 HQ 1 ALSG.

Tour of Duty

- Each guard is to mount duty by 0900 hrs for 24 hours. No member of the guard is to do consecutively more than one tour of duty. No member of the guard is to be posted for more than 2 hours at one time.
- Guard Changeover The outgoing Guard is not to dismount until the incoming Guard Commander has been fully briefed, inspected the Guard Room and accepted the stores on charge and posted sentries have been duly relieved by members of the incoming Guard.
- Consumption of Liquor No member of the Guard is to be under the influence of alcohol or any other drugs when he mounts duty and no member of the Guard is to consume alcoholic liquor or any other drug during his tour of duty.

Dress

- 32. All members of the Guard are to be dressed as follows:
 - a. Hat KFI' or beret as appropriate to corps or unit.
 - b. Clean, starched Shirt and Trousers Drill Green.
 - c. Belt Pastol. Blacked with brass polished.
 - d. Boots (P.
 - e. Lanyard as appropriate to Corps or Units.

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Equipment

- 33. All members of the Guard are to take the following items of equipment to the Guard House:
 - a. Personal weapon.
 - b. Three filled magazines.
 - c. Belt Pistol with Pouches Small Arms attached .
 - d. One filled water bottle.
 - e. Weapon cleaning kit.
 - f. Toilet gear.

Reports

- At the conclusion of each tour of duty the Guard Commander is to submit a laport using AAF A&B to the GSM HQ 1 ALSG. This report is to include copies of the following:
 - a. Leave Figures as advised by Doty Officer HQ 1 ALSG.
 - Handover Certificates for persons taken into custody or released from the Cells.
 - c. Veh/Pers Log.
 - d. Copies of AAF A52 and A300 for personnel AWOL apprehended during the tour of duty.
 - e. Guard Offence Reports.

1 ALSG STANDING ORDERS CHAPTER 2

SECTION 31

ALCOHOLIC LIQUOR

General

31.1 This order defines the policy relating to the sale, consumption and possession of alcoholic liquor by members of 1 ALSG, and by Australian and New Zealand visitors to 1 ALSG.

Definitions

- 31.2 a. 1 ALSG Fixed Limits are:
 - (1) within 1 ALSG perimeter wire,
 - (2) within the compound fence of R in C Centre, Le Loi Street, and
 - (3) Rooms 815, 816, 817 and 818 of the Grand Hotel.
 - b. Vung Tau Special Zone (VTSZ) means Cap St Jacques up to but excluding the Phuoc Tuy province boundary, and includes 1 ALSG.
 - c. Spirits includes whiskey, gin, brandy, rum, vodka and liqueurs.
 - d. Alcoholic liquor includes beer, wine and spirits.

Purchase and Consumption

- 31.3 Within 1 ALSG Fixed Limits, alcoholic liquor is to be sold and consumed only at authorised messes, clubs, and canteens, during trading hours approved by Comd 1 ALSG.
- 31.4 In the VTSZ, except as approved by Comd 1 ALSG and subject to para 31.5, alcoholic liquor is to be consumed at the time and place of purchase; spirits are to be sold only by the nip; beer and wine are to be opened at the time of sale.
- 31.5 When authorised, in writing, by his commanding officer or by an officer nominated by him, a member may purchase unopened alcoholic liquor for the following purposes:
 - a. mailing to Australia,
 - b. carriage to Australia on R&R or RTA, and
 - c. carriage to a function, as approved by his commanding officer.
- 31.6 Sales in messes, blubs and canteens are to be made only to members of that mess, club or canteen, and to invited guests. Entrance of non-members to a mess, club or canteen will only be at the invitation of a member.
- 31.7 Personnel warmed for guard, picquet or driving duty are not to consume alcoholic liquor during the four hour period prior to commencement of that duty nor during the period of that duty.

/31.8 Unless

31.8 Unless on authorised stand-down, members of 1 ALSG should not consume alcoholic liquor before normal daily stand-down at 1700 hrs Monday to Saturday and 1200 hrs on Sunday.

Possession

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- 31.9 Within 1 ALSG Fixed Limits, members are not to be in possession of alcoholic liquor except:
 - a. when on the premises of an authorised mess, club or canteen,
 - b. when attending an authorised unit function in a unit area or beach barbeque site,
 - c. when proceeding on R&R or RTA,
 - d. when it has been purchased for dispatch or carriage to Australia within 36 hours of purchase,
 - e. when it has been purchased with his commanding officer's approval for carriage to an approved function, or
 - f. when engaged in authorised carriage of bulk liquor.
- 31.10 Except as provided in para 31.9, or as authorised by Comd 1 ALSG, members are not to have alcoholic liquor in sleeping or living quarters or in working areas.
- 31.11 Alcoholic liquor received by mail or other means is to be deposited in a facility nominated by the commanding officer of the recipient.
- 31.12 Alcoholic liquor is not to be taken from 1 ALSG Fixed Limits except that:
 - a. Commanding officers may give written authority for personnel to take beer or wine to a particular function. Details of the function and the amount of alcoholic liquor authorised are to be included in the authority.
 - b. Comd 1 ALSG may give written authority for personnel to take spirits to a particular function.
 - c. An officer with an R in C authority for accommodation at the Grand Hotel may take alcoholic liquor to his accommodation.

Trading Hours

31.13 Unit commanders may authorise unit messes, clubs or canteens to sell alcoholic liquor within the following hours:

a. Monday to Saturday

1700 - 2200 hours

b. Sunday

1130 - 1300 hours 1500 - 1700 hours

1830 - 2200 hours

31.14 Permission to trade outside these hours must be sought from Comd 1 ALSG.

/Control

Control

- 31.15 Commanding Officers are to:
 - a. Ensure that personnel proceeding outside 1 ALSG Fixed Limits are not drunk.
 - b. Ensure that there is no irrational or excessive consumption of alcoholic liquor, and that disciplinary action is taken where breaches of these orders are detected.
 - c. Promulgate unit orders consistent with these standing orders.

RETURNS - ALCOHOLIC LIQUOR

- 1. Average Beer Consumption. Each unit conducting unit messes, clubs or canteens is to submit a monthly return to HQ 1 ALSG showing average daily consumption per member. A separate return is required for each mess, club or canteen. Returns are required within seven days of the end of the month.
- 2. Bulk Beer Drawings. 1 Pl 2 AFCU is to submit to HQ 1 ALSG a weekly return of unit bulk beer drawings. The return, for the period Sunday to Saturday, is required by the following Monday.
- Bulk Spirits Drawings. 1 Pl 2 AFCU is to submit to HQ 1 ALSG a monthly return of unit bulk spirits drawings. The return is required within seven days of the end of the month.

MAILING OF SPIRITUOUS LIQUORS

- 1. Commonwealth of Australia Postal Regulations prohibit the transmission of certain inflammable substances. This includes liquids having a 'flash point' of less than 80 F.
- 2. Spirituous liquors with a 'proof rating' greater than 85 Proof (74 Proof UK) are not to be transmitted by mail to Australia.

- NOTE. Spirits marked * will not be sold to mail to Australia.
- 4. Spirits may not be imported to Australia under the special defence force concession. Spirits are subject to concession only when a member brings them personally into Australia on R and R or RTA.
- 5. However, members may post spirits to Australia provided that:
 - a. The member is prepared to pay duty.
 - b. The spirits have a flash point greater than 80°F, or proof rating below 85 Proof.
 - c. Bottles are packed so that damage will not result to other items should the bottle break.
- If a bottle breaks and the contents damage other articles, the member is liable to pay full compensation to the PMG for the damage caused.
- 7. Before signing the Certificate of Inspection, officers are to:
 - a. (1) Check that the proof rating does not exceed 85 Proof US (74 Proof UK),
 - (2) Check that the flash point is below 80°F.
 - b. Ensure the bottle is safely packed.
 - c. Delete the words "or essence of wines or spirituous liquor" from the Certificate of Inspection.
