COMMANDERS DIARIES  
INSTRUCTIONS

AIM

1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organization and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

GENERAL

2. Entries are to be made daily on AF C 2118 (Adapted) each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.

3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties (Australia)" Chapter 2, Section 12.

RESPONSIBILITY

During Non-operational Periods

4. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled by commanders of all formations.

During Operational Periods (1)

- 5. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled in duplicate by:
  - a. Commanders of all formations.
  - b. Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a brigadier or above.
  - c. Heads of services not below the rank of lieutenant colonel.
  - d. Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
  - e. Unit commanders.
  - f. Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

COMPILATION

- 6. Both original and duplicate copies are to consist of:
  - a. Cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted).
  - b. Index as printed on cover.
  - c. Narrative (AF C 2118) (Adapted).
  - d. Annexes as shown in the Index.
- 7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes are to be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer is to be included.
- 8. The annexes are to be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an annex NIL will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters, the relevant papers should be grouped as annexes starting at B.

**DISPOSAL**

13. **Original Commander's Diary.** This is to be forwarded monthly, unless otherwise ordered, by the seventh day of the succeeding month direct to AHQ.

14. **Duplicate Commander's Diary.** This must be clearly marked as a duplicate. It is to be sent separately from the original to AHQ one month after the original has been despatched but not before the former has been acknowledged.

15. When overseas, both copies of diaries are to be sent through the Army Records organization in the overseas theatre but at different times.

16. **TOP SECRET Supplementary Diaries.**

a. The documents referred to in Paragraph 9 together with a list of them made out on AF C 2118 (Adapted) must be placed in separate cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted). All details must be filled in and the cover clearly marked in red: "ANNEX Z — OFFICER ONLY". It may be convenient to group the papers by appendices.

b. Supplementary diaries must be forwarded under the normal rules for TOP SECRET correspondence, to AHQ. The inner envelope must be plainly marked:

General

1. Last week enemy activity through-out SVN continued at a low tempo. However elements of the 6 NVA Regiment attacked RVNAF Marines in western Thua Thien Province as combat associated with Lamson 720 increased. Elsewhere enemy activity was light and scattered, and many enemy units through-out the Republic appear to be refitting and resupplying. Rice collection activities continued in the coastal areas of VC MR-5. Intelligence indicated that enemy personnel replacements are moving into the southern half of the republic and that enemy is emphasizing seaborne logistical infiltration in the southern delta.

MR 1

2. There were 21 incidents reported during the week 6 of these were enemy initiated. The total results of these were: Frd; 36 KIA, 154 WIA, 1 MIA, 1 truck dest., En; 310 KIA, 2 POW, 15 KBA, 1 detainee, 74 I/Wpns, 2000 SA rds, 1 RPG launcher, 20 RPG rds, 1 12.7 HMG, 2 cases 12.7 mm rds, 3 cases MG rds, 5 82 mm Mor rds, 80 hand grenades, 200 uniforms and 25.3 tons of rice.

MR 2

3. There were 8 incidents reported during the week 2 of these were enemy initiated. The total results of these were: Frd; 13 KIA, 29 WIA and one three quarter ton truck dest. En; 29 KIA, 2 detainees, 34 I/Wpns, 15 CSW, 1 RPG launcher, 50 RPG rds, 100 82 mm Mor rds, 8 cases of MG ammo, 130 hand grenades, 13 AT mines 16 cases TNT, 2 ton assorted ammo and 70 blankets. CIA.

MR 3

4. There were 2 incidents reported during the week, they were both enemy initiated. The total results were: Frd; 5 KIA, 1 CSW and 1 I/Wpn missing. En; 9 KIA, 1 CSW, 1 I/Wpn, 1 claymore mine and 2 satchel charges CIA.

MR 4

5. There were 16 incidents reported in MR 4 during the week, 5 of these were enemy initiated. Total results; Frd; 10 KIA, 43 WIA, 3 MIA and 1 I/Wpn lost. En; 176 KIA, 21 detainees, 25 I/Wpns, 41 hand grenades, 18 CSW, 60 mines, 10 AT mines, 1 60 mm MOR base plate & bipod captured and 10 sampans destroyed.

Forecast

6. The tempo of enemy activity is likely to increase next week. However, this increase most likely will be spotty, of limited duration, and characterized by economy-of-force actions. The strongest indications of such increased activity come from MR 3, where enemy forces are believed to be preparing for possible attacks on targets in SR-1, Saigon and VC MR 7. In this connection, Long Binh Post and Bien Hoa Airbase have been mentioned. Attacks on the larger objectives probably would be limited to ABF and terrorist incidents, while ground action most likely will be directed against LOC, RE/PF targets and the Pacification system. B-5 Front forces believed to be preparing for increased ABF on Allied positions, and in western MRTTH combat will be in proportion to the threat posed by Lamson 720.

1 ATF TAOR

14 - 20 May 71

General

1. Last week enemy initiated activity remained at a low level throughout Phouc Tay Province. There were four contacts only with Task Force elements resulting in 4 VC KIA and nil friendly casualties. No mines or booby traps were detonated although several were discovered and destroyed.

En Unit ID's and Locs.

2. D445. The majority of D445 subunits and the HQ have remained in the vicinity of the Phouc Tay/Long Khanh Province border approx 10,000 n'E of Can My. C1/D445 is still located in the Southern Long Hai Hills (Minh Tam Secret Zone).

3. C25/Long Dat Conc Coy. No positive ID was made during the week, however several agent reports have indicated that elms of this unit have exfiltrated from the Long Hais into the major population centres nearby during the past 3-4 days. This has followed an intense period of recruiting in the Dat Do/Long Men area.

4. Chau Duc. HQ Chau Duc along with C41 Conc Coy has now been split into two groups. NW of Duc Thanh the guerilla elm, redesignated Gp 13, has been engaged in resupply, while the second elm is currently located in the same general area as D445.

Vung Tam Special Zone.

5. There was one incident on the night of the 19th, when a booby-trapped grenade was placed under a Vietnamese Jeep outside a restaurant in Vung Tam City. The gran was discovered and removed by the NP.

En Capabilities and Intentions.

6. At present D445 and Chau Duc appear to be having resupply problems and do not pose an immediate threat to the populated areas of the province. However, likely targets for the future are RF/PF posts in the Duc Thanh district or at Xuyen Moc. C25 may be preparing for attacks on RF/PF compounds in the Dat Do area during the next few days.

General

1. Enemy initiated incidents inside MR 3 remained at a low level during the past week. LCT operations in SR 1 continued to meet stiff resistance, and cache discoveries in the eastern part of the MR indicate that the enemy has been fairly successful in caching supplies there.

MR 3

2. During the week there were 15 incidents of which 4 were enemy initiated. 1. Enemy initiated activity increased slightly over the past week. There were 3 contacts with 1 ATF elements resulting in 4 VC KIA and 1 Aust WIA. There was one mine incident resulting in moderate damage to an APC and 2 Aust WIA. There were two significant abduction of PSDF members by the VC. The first occurred at 26 0100 hrs May 71 when 20 persons were forcibly taken from Long Dien. The enemy here probably being elements of C25 Long Dat Concentrated Coy. The second at 25 0200 hrs May 71 occurred on Long Son island when 20 VC from the Long Son guerilla and Baria City unit abducted 9 members of the PSDF. All 9 members returned at 25 1000 hrs May 71 having been instructed not to rejoin the PSDF and to warn all the people to disband the PSDF. A total of 22 weapons captured by the VC in the 2 incidents.

En Unit ID's and Locs

2. D445. No positive ID's were made and it is thought that all units of the bn have remained in the same general areas as last week on resupply ops.
3. Chau Duc. No further information has been received on Hq Chau Duc or Gp 13. They are still thought to be engaged on resupply operations.
4. Long Dat. C25 has been active during the week operating out of the Long Hai hills into Long Dien and Dat Do. The formation of C21 now appears certain.

En Capabilities and intentions.

5. It is not likely that any major attacks will be launched in the immediate future due to resupply problems facing D445 and Chau Duc. C25 and C1/D445 will probably continue resupply and recruiting activities in the VC Long Dat District during the coming week.

VTSZ

6. There have been no significant incidents during the past week.

a. There has been a crisis at the end of every dry season. We do not know exactly how much water we have, although 17 Const Sqn is finding out. Our water drawing capacity is becoming very limited. It is hoped that a great deal of water will be discovered. However, during the wet season we will develop the drawing capacity.

c. Proper Supervision by Officers and NCOs will cut this volume down. Rationing of Units is undesirable but it is up to Unit officers to police water usage. The problem of consumption is in personal use.





When he was about to get into his vehicle he noticed a grenade between the two front seats. The pin was removed and the lever would have been released if the driver had sat in the front seat.

1. There is considerable apprehension in many units that influenza virus immunisation frequently produces flu like symptoms with resultant loss of manpower.
2. Many members are concerned as they have suffered influenzal type attacks of illness following previous injections.
3. The purpose of this instruction is to reassure units that the present vaccine is considered to be free of side effects and safe to use. Many thousands of persons were immunised in PNG Comd during the 1970 epidemic with no adverse reactions.
4. HQ AFV has conferred with AHQ that the present vaccine is safe to use.
5. All units are reminded that AHQ has directed that all serving members in SVN are to be immunised against influenza.
6. Any member who has had a previous reaction or illness following flu immunisation is directed to inform the RAP staff of 1 Aust Fd Hosp. Such members will be interviewed and individually assessed by a medical officer.

TURNAROUND REPORT - HMAS JEPARIT VOYAGE 37

General

1. HMAS Jeparit arrived at Vung Tau on 19 Apr 71. The vessel sailed from Vung Tau on 22 Apr 71.

Timings

2. The following summarizes the timings of the major events in the turnaround:

a.	Vessel anchored at F16 Vung Tau roads	- 191718H
b.	Discharge of dangerous cargo complete	- 191800H
c.	Berthed at De Long Pier	- 191853H
d.	Discharge commenced	- 191930H
e.	Backload commenced	- 201900H
f.	Discharge completed	- 211130H
g.	Backload completed	- 212000H
h.	Sailed for Sydney town	- 221300H

Cargo

3. The cargo handled in this operation is as follows:

a.	Discharged	- 2709 s/tons
b.	Backloaded	- 315 s/tons

Discharge

4. 5 pallets of jet-engine starters for 2 Sqn RAAF were discharged at anchor in the stream. They were conveyed by barge to the beach where they were loaded onto RAAF road transport.

5. General cargo was discharged alongside the De Long Pier and conveyed to 1 ALSG by AB & T and 5 Coy RAASC road transport.

Backload

6. All backload cargo was treated against vermin, then washed down and inspected for cleanliness prior to being loaded aboard the vessel.

### Civil Contractors

7. All stevedoring was done by AB & T. Their handling was good and the vessel had a full complement of stevedores for the entire operation.

8. All civil aid stores for the various civil projects were taken for storage in Det 30 Terminal Sqn. They will be transported to the various project sites as civil transport becomes available.

### Documentation

9. All documentation for the discharge/backload was carried out by Det 11 MC Gp and Det 30 Terminal Sqn.

10. The ship's documentation was not forwarded to Det 11 MC Gp until 18 Apr 71. This would have caused a major problem had the ship arrived on the scheduled date of 17 Apr 71.

11. The Cargo Out-turn Report compiled by Det 30 Terminal Sqn is attached as Annex A.

### Cargo Marking

12. Marking of service consignments was good. Marking of the civil aid projects' cargo was again almost non-existent, but SCQ (Mov) 1 ALSG has made this point to Mr R. Allen, Second Secretary of the Development Assistance Section of the Australian Embassy Saigon, in general conversation.

### Packaging

13. Although there was only minimal damage to the fabric bulk cement containers, there was no damage caused to other cargo by these. The containers were still not palletized as recommended.

14. There is a requirement for a greater number of steel banding straps on both the timber packs for Det 55 EWPS and the reinforcing steel for the civil aid projects. These items are being damaged due to the inadequacy of packaging and by method of stowage.

### Cargo Stowage

15. The bundles of timber mentioned in Paragraph 14 above were again stowed in the wings of the hold. As the other cargo is removed, they fall into the centre of the hold or jam with the other cargo, causing the strapping to break or individual pieces to be broken.

### Security

16. Security was provided by D & E Pl and AFV Pro Unit with attached RAAF Police personnel as follows:

- a. Picquets around the ship throwing concussion grenades at random intervals during the hours of darkness and at slack water.
- b. A hatchguard in each hold.
- c. Shotguns on all cargo carrying vehicles travelling between the pier and 1 ALSG.
- d. A personnel checkpoint on the ship's gangway.
- e. A vehicle checkpoint on the road leading to the pier.

17. No pilferage was detected at Vung Tau. What little had occurred was discovered when the hatches were opened and had happened en route, probably in Singapore.

Damage


18. The damage on this voyage was minimal. About 50% of the Det 55 EWPS timber bundles were broken, but most of the timber salvaged, as were the bundles of reinforcing steel for the civil aid projects. The 2 AFCU losses totalled \$49.25.

Conclusion

19. The turnaround of the vessel was carried out within the scheduled time, due to the very good stowage of cargo.

Recommendations

20. It is recommended that:
- a. 30 Terminal Sqn again be contacted with a view to having both the bundles of timber and reinforcing steel block-stacked to prevent damage.
  - b. The recommendations pertaining to the palletization of fabric bulk cement containers be adhered to.
  - c. BMSS for 2 AFCU be stowed vertically in one part of one hold to ensure an even flow of these to the bulk-store.




