38. RATIONING - C COY BASE AYER KALA

40. KD CLOTHING

Personnel returning to AUSTRALIA are reminded that KD Clothing, although NOT worn here in MALAYA still remains on the members charge in his AAB 83.

Consequently NO free reissue of KD can be expected when the member returns to AUSTRALIA.

The only exception to this rule is when the Commanding Officer has permitted write off of the items.

This write off can only occur when the items are found to be unserviceable within the expected life of the garment. (in this case 2 years for trousers KD, 6 months for shirts KD).

41. INSTRUCTIONS FOR DRIVERS OF MECHANICAL VEHICLES

Paragraphs 52, 53 & 54 of the above instruction are reproduced hereunder:-

52. Entering of Hotels, etc. An Army driver or a person of the Australia Army on duty with a driver, will not, whilst on duty, enter any hotel, public house, or cafe except for the purpose of obtaining meals at normal meal times when absent from his normal place of subsistence and after permission has been obtained from an officer or NCO, if one is present.
53. Consumption of Intoxicating Liquor.
  - (a) A driver having been warned for duty will not consume intoxicating liquor within two hours of assuming such duty.
  - (b) A driver is forbidden to consume intoxicating liquor whilst on duty.
54. Carriage of intoxicating liquor. A driver will not carry or permit or suffer the carrying of intoxicating liquor in his vehicle unless such intoxicating liquor forms part of his load duly authorised by an officer, who will endorse the AAF G2 to that effect.

42. ACTION TO BE TAKEN BY PARENTS IN RELATION TO CHILDREN BORN IN  
SINGAPORE / MALAYA

AUST Army Force ADM INSTR No A9 PART V is reproduced hereunder:-

NOTIFICATION OF BIRTH

31. When a child is born to the wife of an Australian serviceman in a British military hospital, the hospital registers the birth of the child. One copy of the Certificate of Registration of Birth is then forwarded to the Civil Registrar of Births and Deaths and one copy is handed to the child's parents.
32. Should a child be born to the wife of an Australian serviceman in a civilian hospital one of the parents must register the birth with the Registrar of Births and Deaths.
33. The Certificate of Registration of a Birth is NOT a Birth Certificate. A Birth Certificate may be obtained by presenting the Certificate of Registration of a Birth to the local Registrar of Births and Deaths accompanied by the necessary fee.

REGISTRATION OF A CHILD AS AN AUSTRALIAN CITIZEN

34. A child of an Australian serviceman who is born in MALAYA/SINGAPORE is, at birth, automatically a British subject but NOT an Australian citizen.
35. Before a child may be registered as an Australian citizen the male parent must himself have such citizenship. The following are Australian citizens -
  - (a) Persons born in AUSTRALIA
  - (b) Naturalized Australian citizens
  - (c) Persons registered as Australian citizens

The procedure to be adopted where the father wishes himself to be registered as an Australian citizen is contained in Part VI of this instruction.

36. To register a child born in MALAYA/SINGAPORE as an Australian citizen the parents should complete two copies of Form No 1 (copy attached as Annex 'H') and forward them through his unit to the relevant Australian Commission together with the following attachments -
  - (a) Marriage certificate
  - (b) Child's birth certificate
  - (c) Two(2) passport sized photographs (2 in x 2½ in) of each parent
  - (d) Evidence of the father's Australian citizenship. Any of the following documents provide this evidence -
    - (i) Birth certificate
    - (ii) An extract of entry
    - (iii) Naturalization certificate
    - (iv) Registration certificate
  - (e) Mother's passport for endorsement plus \$1.00 fee

37. The application should be lodged as soon as possible after the birth of the child and in any case NOT later than one year after the date of birth.

MALAYA ALLOWANCE

38. Immediately a child is born to an Australian serviceman MALAYA/SINGAPORE, the member must notify his unit and obtain a "Form 'C' Variation of MALAYA Allowance Advice". This form will be completed by the member and submitted to his unit pay representative who will make the necessary adjustments to the member's pay and allowances.
39. The additional food allowance of 4/2 per day shall be entered in the member's pay book immediately the Form 'C' is received.

SECURITY OF ARMS AND AMMUNITION - PARAS 10, 12, 42 and 46

3 RAR RO 137/58 is hereby cancelled.

INDIVIDUAL RESPONSIBILITY FOR SAFE CUSTODY OF ARMS AND AMMUNITION

10. Arms and ammunition, once withdrawn from unit or sub-unit central custody (e.g. arms kote, armoury, or Q Store) become the personal responsibility of the individual to whom they are issued from such central custody, until properly returned.

12. Whilst in individual custody (VIDE PARA 10) weapons and ammunition will never be left unattended at any time, i.e. they will either be carried by the individual or otherwise left continuously in his sight at a range of NOT more than 6 feet. Immediate and severe disciplinary action will be taken for breaches of this order, and officers and NCOs will constantly be alert to detect offenders. Particular attention will be given during daily barrack room inspection to ensure that arms and ammunition are not left lying about.

LOSSES OF ARMS AND AMMUNITION

42. Any member of 3 RAR discovering the loss of arms and/or ammunition on issue to him or to any other member of such unit, will immediately report loss by the quickest means to his Company Headquarters.

46. An individual who is responsible for the loss, through negligence, of arms will normally be tried by court martial. Loss of ammunition is a lesser offence, provided an immediate report is made. The most stringent action will be taken where unreported losses are subsequently discovered.

SAFE HANDLING OF WEAPONS

3 RAR STANDING ORDERS FOR MALAYA No 1 PARA 36 is Reproduced hereunder

TRAVELLING BY RAIL

36. "On MALAYAN Railway trains pistols will be UNLOADED, rounds will be kept separate in a safe container. Rifle ammunition will remain in clips and will be kept in pouches or bandoliers, except in the case of sentries who will have charged magazines for the period of their duty only. The charged magazines will be kept in a pocket and ONLY put onto the rifle in an emergency or when ordered by the Officer, WO or NCO i/c Train. Weapons will be loaded only in an emergency or on the orders of the Officer, WO or NCO i/c Train. Automatic weapons will NOT be carried on MALAYAN RAILWAY Trains".

45. VENEREAL DISEASE

- A. 1. Under no circumstances will the infection itself with venereal disease be the subject of disciplinary action.
2. Every member of the Australian Military Forces suffering from any form of venereal disease, as soon as he becomes aware that he is suffering will report the fact to his commanding officer or other proper military authority.
3. Disciplinary action will be taken under Section 11 of the Army Act against any member who, having contracted venereal disease, fails to report the fact to proper military authority. "Proper Military Authority" will include, where applicable, a medical officer of the RAAMC or RAMC. It does NOT include a civilian practitioner.
4. No financial penalties will be imposed on a member because he is absent from duty on account of venereal disease, whether or not due to misconduct.
5. Although infection itself will not be the subject of disciplinary action, repeated infections may well justify consideration being given to the desirability of discharging the member under AMR 184 (1) (iv) (Unfit for the duties of his Corps).
- B. Members who fail to report infection with venereal disease will be charged as follows:-

46. USE OF FIREARMS FOR SPORTING PURPOSES

HQ 17 GUR DIV/OCLF Letter GD 1114 A (PS) of 5 Feb 59 is reproduced hereunder:-

1. There is excellent game shooting and fishing to be had in MALAYA and I am keen that all ranks who wish to do so should take full advantage of the opportunity for such sports. Two incidents have recently occurred however in which soldiers were found to be in illegal possession of arms and engaged in illegal shooting. I want it made quite clear to everyone that I will not tolerate illegal shooting, fishing or poaching in any form.

2. Game Shooting

The rules regarding shooting game in Malaya are perfectly clear:-

- (a) A shot gun owned by an individual or by a unit in Malaya or Singapore must be licensed with the Civil Police.
- (b) Before a shot gun may be used for shooting game, although it may be licensed with the police, a game license must also be obtained from the State Authorities concerned, normally from the State Game Warden. (This is also applicable to smooth bore service weapons used for shooting game). If it is used in more than one State a game license for each State will be required.
- (c) In the State of Johore wild pig only may be shot. Licenses as in (a) and (b) above are still required.
- (d) Service rifles will NOT be used for game shooting.
- (e) Unit commanders will personally ensure that no game shooting is carried out unless valid and appropriate game licenses are held and that this is fully understood by all ranks.

3. Fishing

Unit commanders will check with State Game Wardens whether fishing licenses are required and, if so, to which waters and to what type of fish they apply. Unit orders will be issued as necessary. Fishing with grenades or explosives will cease forthwith.

4. Surplus Arms and Ammunition

During the Emergency units may have acquired excessive and surplus issues of arms and ammunition. Some individuals are in possession of unauthorised arms and ammunition. The time has now come to put this matter right. Your attention is drawn to Special Formation Routine Order Serial 55 issued on 15 Dec 58 with particular reference to paragraphs 13 to 24.

The following urgent steps will be taken by all units:-

- (a) All surplus arms and ammunition (including grenades) in possession of Service personnel will be handed in forthwith to unit stores and taken on regimental charge. No legal action will be taken against those handing in such ammunition before 1 Mar 59. However, I want each unit to include in its Standing Orders that after 1 Mar 59 anyone found in illegal possession of ammunition will be most severely punished.
- (b) Unit commanders will ensure forthwith that shot guns which are unit welfare property, or the property of individuals in the unit, are licensed with the police.

1. GENERAL

The CO will appoint a regimental audit board consisting of three members:

- (a) The president
- (b) Two members

who do NOT control or manage any of the unit funds i.e.,

- (a) The Regimental Fund account
- (b) The Officers' Mess
- (c) The Sergeants' Mess.

2. ASSEMBLY

The audit board will be assembled within one month of the close of each quarterly period and will conduct an audit of the books of account, vouchers, statement of affairs and any other documents up to the end of the quarter.

3. AUDIT

The audit will cover a thorough examination of all the books of account, statements of receipts and expenditure, bank statements and any other documents, ensuring that where applicable, -

- (a) liabilities are NOT omitted from the statement of affairs
- (b) assets are NOT over estimated
- (c) entries in the books of account are supported by vouchers.
- (d) All vouchers in support of payments are scrutinised and cancelled to ensure that they are NOT used again.
- (e) That proper books of account are kept in accordance with current instructions ie.,
  - (i) relevant MBI's
  - (ii) Rules for Officers and Sergeants Messes.
- (f) On examination of vouchers the auditors must pay particular attention to the expenditure incurred. Any item of a contentious nature must be referred to the CO.
- (g) The bank balance and cash holdings must be verified independently.
- (h) That adequate provision is made for the depreciation of regimental and mess property.

4. STOCKTAKING

The audit will include an independent stocktaking of all stores etc., of each fund. A stocktake by any other person is NOT acceptable.

5. FINALISATION

The proceedings of the audit board will be recorded on an AAF A2 in quadruplicate, signed by each member of the board, certifying as to whether or NOT the accounts as produced are considered to show the correct financial position of each fund. The disposal of the AAF A2 is

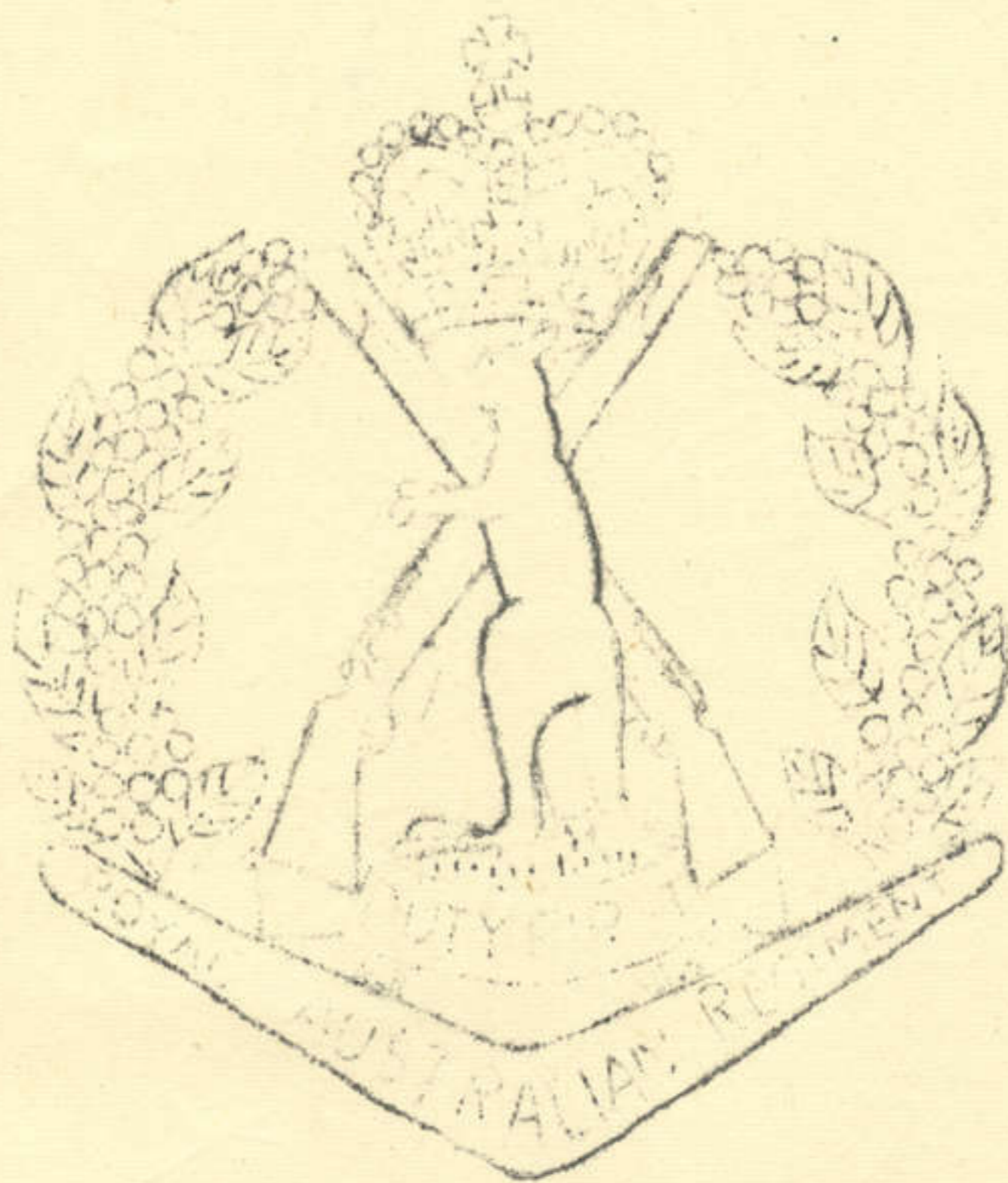

3 RAR MAJOR WAR TRAINING  
INSTRUCTION No 3 1959INTRODUCTION

1. 3 RAR will withdraw a company at a time from anti communist terrorist operations and will carry out major war training over a two month period from company operational bases.
2. Support Company are already training for major war on this basis. See Training Instruction No 1 1958.

AIM

3. (a) To bring 3 RAR up to the required standard in major war training to enable it to fulfill its primary role.
- (b) Notwithstanding 3 (a) above it is essential that at the conclusion of major war training sub units are rested, healthy and fit to continue the secondary role - CT operations.

SCOPE OF TRAINING

4. With the above aim in view training will concentrate on the following aspects:-
  - (a) Major war basic training up to and including company operations.
  - (b) Headquarter training by Bn HQ and Adm Coy.
  - (c) A complete overhaul of all aspects of administration.
5. Revision of anti CT techniques will be completed the week following major war training before re-entering operations.

ORGANISATION FOR TRAINING

6. After time is allowed for movement to and from training areas, public holidays and rest days the amount of time available for training and administration is strictly limited. It is therefore important that all training be carefully planned with a view to deriving the maximum benefit from the time and facilities available.
7. Sub-units will carry out major war training as follows:-

23. Will not carry out major war training.

MEDICAL

- 24 (a) A Medical Orderly will be present at all times during live shooting.
- (b) Field dressings will be carried by all personnel.

PROTECTION

25. Although the risk of CT intervention is slight, during training company commanders will ensure that they at all times protect themselves against possible CT action. Sentries will be posted at all times with each group of personnel when away from Company Bases. 10 rounds of SAA appropriate to the weapon will always be carried by sentries.

CONCLUSION

26. Within the framework of training for major war and other associated activities considerable scope exists for commanders at all levels to plan and organise activities. Every opportunity will be given to platoon and section commanders to accept responsibility, display initiative and enthusiasm and conduct their own training.
