COMMANDERS DIARIES INSTRUCTIONS

AIM

1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organization and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

GENERAL

- 2. Entries are to be made daily on AF C 2118 (Adapted) each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.
- 3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties (Australia)" Chapter 2, Section 12.

RESPONSIBILITY

During Non-operational Periods

4. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled by commanders of all formations.

During Operational Periods (1)

- 5. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled in duplicate by:
 - a. Commanders of all formations.
 - b. Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a brigadier or above.
 - c. Heads of services not below the rank of lieutenant colonel.
 - d. Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
 - e. Unit commanders.
 - f. Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

COMPILATION

- 6. Both original and duplicate copies are to consist of:
 - a. Cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted).
 - b. Index as printed on cover.
 - c. Narrative (AF C 2118) (Adapted).
 - d. Annexes as shown in the Index.
- 7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes are to be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer is to be included.
- 8. The annexes are to be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an annex NIL will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters, starting at B.

DISPOSAL

- 13. Original Commander's Diary. This is to be forwarded monthly, unless otherwise ordered, by seventh day of the succeeding month direct to AHQ.
- 14. Duplicate Commander's Diary. This must be clearly marked as a duplicate. It is to be sent separately from the original to AHQ one month after the original has been despatched but not before the former has been acknowledged.
- 15. When overseas, both copies of diaries are to be sent through the Army Records organization in the overseas theatre but at different times.
- 16. TOP SECRET Supplementary Diaries.
 - a. The documents referred to in Paragraph 9 together with a list of them made out on AF C 2118 (Adapted) must be placed in separate cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted). All details must be filled in and the cover clearly marked in red: "ANNEX Z OFFICER ONLY". It may be convenient to group the papers by appendices.
 - b. Supplementary diaries must be forwarded under the normal rules for TOP SECRET correspondence, to AHQ. The inner envelope must be plainly marked:

OPERATIONS SUMMARY

a. General

(1) 1 ATF continued Operation TOAN THANG III in AO MAJURA and the 1 ATF TAOR. HQ 1 ATF (Main) remains at FSPB KERRY YT1313.

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

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Section 1. III Corps Tactical Zone.

(A) Enemy Activity

- 1. During the past week enemy initiated actions continued at a reduced rate throughout the III CTZ. Of the divisions, elements of the 9th were the most heavily committed, while the elements of the other divisions either engaged in small size contacts or avoided contact.
- 2. The 271st Regiment lost 54 KIA in two attacks SE of BEN SOI (XT 1142), and the 2-272nd Regiment suffered 81 KIA at FSB DIAMOND (XT 342 155). In other actions, an element of the 95C Regiment lost 20 KIA E of TAY NINH City (XT 3446), and the 209th Regiment lost 38 KIA in contacts in and N of the MICHELIN Plantation.
- 3. Of the Sub-Regional Regiments, the 3-268th Regiment suffered 49 KIA ENE of TRANG BANG (XT 556 219), and the 1st NVA Regiment, in its first major action since it entered III Corps, suffered 43 KIA in a clash with ARVN forces NW of BEN LUC (XS 614 772).
- During the week, IIFFV determined that the 320th NVA Regiment was also referred to by the enemy as the 209th NVA Regiment. In order to avoid any further confusion between the AKAs (also known as) of the 1st NVA Regiment and the 320th NVA Regiment, IIFFV has decided that the 320th NVA Regiment will, in future, be referred to as the 209th NVA Regiment.
- 5. Captured documents have revealed that the THU DUC VC Regiment has been disbanded, and its battalions have been resubordinated to Sub-Region 4 as "spearhead" units.
- Statistics for the week showed that there were 80 enemy initiated attacks compared with 113 last week. Of these, there were 21 mortar attacks and 14 rocket attacks compared with 30 mortar attacks and 35 rocket attacks last week. Details of some of the enemy initiated incidents are:-
- a. At 301025H, XT 560 555, in BINH DUONG Province B/1-4th Cav received RPG fire from an UNKNOWN SIZE NVA force. The fire was returned with organic weapons supported by artillery and airstrikes. Results: 38 NVA KIA; 7 US KIA and 9 US WIA. 9 AK-47 rifles, 1 SKS rifle, 1x60mm mortar, and 1 RPG-2 RL captured.
- b. Between 011035H and 012230H, from XT 809 119 to XT 821 079, in BINH DUONG Province, 2-505th Abn, LRRP Team 17, and 120th Avn received SA, AW, and RPG fire from an unknown size VC force. The fire was returned with organic weapons supported by a light fire team. Results: 15 VC KIA and 1 VC PW; 3 US WIA. 5 AK-47 rifles, 1x.45 cal pistol, 6 AK-47 mags, 180 rounds of SA ammunition, 6 grenades and 3 RPG-2 rounds c tured.
- c. At 031700H, XS 648 565, in BINH LONG Province, A/2-60th Inf received AW fire from an unknown size enemy force. The fire was returned with organic weapons supported by arty and gunships. Results: 11 enemy KIA; 1 US WIA. 3 AK-47 rifles, 1 M-1 carbine and 2x9mm pistols captured.
- d. At 050130H, XT 342 155, in TAY NINH_Province, FSB DIAMOND received SA, AW, RPG, HMG, and mortar fire followed by a ground attack from an unknown size NVA force. The fire was returned with organic weapons supported by artillery, a light fire team, a Spooky and airstrikes. Results: 31 NVA KIA and 1 NVA PW; 4 US KIA and 13 US WIA. One RPG-7 round, 12 AK-47 rifles, 1 RPG-7 sight, and 1 RPD MG captured. One 107mm rocket, 11 AK-47 rifles, 8 RPG-7 rounds, 81 grenades, 9 bangalore torpedoes, 12x75mm RR rounds and 34 RPG-7 rounds were destroyed

Assessment of Enemy Intentions

- The present indications are that the bulk of the enemy Main Force elements are being withdrawn to more secure base areas in order to regroup and to absorb replacements, and the probability of large scale co-ordinated attacks has diminished.
- It is estimated that the 9th Division retains the capability to carry out sharp localized attacks along the Cambodian border from W of TAY NINH City to the ANGELS WING area, while the other divisions will probably concentrate on harassment and ambushes to protect their base areas and supply routes.
- It is assessed that the enemy is presently analysing the failures 10. of his current Offensive and reassessing his strategy while the bulk of the Main Force units are being given time to rest and refit before resuming large scale activities. It is expected that the immediate enemy actions will consist of harassment, ambushes, and attacks by fire of varying intensity, at scattered locations in the III CTZ. It is possible that large scale enemy actions could develop around the TAY NINH City area.

Fnemy Losses.

For the week there were 1209 enemy KIA (BC), 106 PWs, and 147 returnees (Hoi Chanh). There were 346 individual weapons and 81 crew-served weapons captured and 24.72 tons of rice were captured or destroyed.

(B) Friendly Activity

Results in Campaign TOAN THANG III (Complete Victory) for the week 12. were:

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Enemy losses: 874 KIA, 143 detainees; 191 SA, 28 crew-served weapons, 21,494 SA rounds, 235 HE rounds, 153 grenades, 38 mines, 1 sampan, 4.60 tons of rice and .8 tons of salt captured; 22 SA, 22 crew-served weapons, 3,260 SA rounds, 330 HE rounds, 163 grenades, 10 sampans, 37 mines, 27 booby traps and 26.7 tons of rice destroyed. Friendly losses:49 KIA, 332 WIA; 9 helicopters, 3 tanks, 8 APCs, 2 ACAVs, 7 trucks, 3 ROME plows, 2 boats and 1 M42 damaged; 3 helicopters, 5 APCs, 1 truck and 1 boat destroyed. ARVN forces carried out an additional 81 operations resulting in 239 enemy KIA against 29 ARVN KIA.

Section 2. SOUTH VIETNAM (excl III CTZ) and NORTH VIETNAM

(A) Enemy Activity

13. Country wide the number of attacks and ambushes decreased this week, and preliminary reports indicate that there were 12 attacks in I CTZ; there were 16 attacks and 1 ambush in II CTZ; and there were 9 attacks in IV CTZ.

(B) Friendly Activity


- 14. I Corps Tactical Zone. There were 11 FW and 16 ARVN large unit operations resulting in 1009 enemy KIA against 89 friendlies KIA.
- 15. <u>II Corps Tactical Zone</u>. There were 13 FW and 21 ARVN large unit operations resulting in 265 enemy KIA against 22 friendlies KIA.
- 16. IV Corps Tactical Zone. There was 1 US and 92 ARVN large unit operations resulting in 1015 enemy KIA against 69 friendlies KIA.

Section 3. SOUTH VIETNAM Summary

17. The number of friendly large unit operations increased from 227 to 236. The number of operations with contact remained at 111. The number of enemy KIA decreased from 4664 (adjusted) to 3220.

OTHER INFORMATION: New Booby Traps. Recently it has been noted that enemy forces are displaying more patience and ingenuity in rigging booby traps in order to make them more effective. Details of some of the new booby trap techniques detected are:

a. An expended LAAW, (any souvenir or eye catching device could also be used) was half buried in the centre of a trail. Approximately 12 inches in front of it was a buried grenade fitted with a pressure firing device with the prongs barely evident at ground level. This type of rig has also been found with a pressure activated electrical contact hooked up to the LAAW and the grenade with electrical blasting caps. Both rigs are set to go off by either pressure on the grenade fuze or tampering with the LAAW.





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b. Another device consisted of a 105mm round placed under a hole (about 8" X 12") located in the centre of a trail. The hole was lined with wood on two sides and covered with soft bamboo. Over this a sheet of tin, with wires leading down to the booby trap, was placed and then the trap was covered with a piece of parachute silk and finally covered over with dirt. This booby trap had a combination pressure/pull firing device as a fuze, similar to those on hand grenades, as a detonated. Another similar trap was discovered with a trip wire rigged under the tin and with the booby trap beside the hole.



Section 1. III Corps Tactical Zone.

- 1. During the past week, enemy initiated activities continued at a reduced level throughout the TAOR, although harassment, particularly attacks by fire at scattered locations, showed a slight increase towards the end of the period.
- 2. There was one particularly successful enemy rocket attack against the Sector HQ Compound in TAY NINH City on the night of 11th April. Incoming rockets hit the ground floor of the three story Sector HQ building, of which, the upper stories housed RF troops, and the ground floor was used for munitions storage. The results of this attack were: 30 RF KIA, 77 RF WIA; 5 civilians killed, 9 civilians injured; also 50 PWs, detainees, and draft dodgers were injured. The following material was destroyed: 6 jeeps, 7 Dodge trucks, 2 GMC trucks, 2 Gas Tankers, 5 tons of rice, 20,980 gallons of MOGAS, 7,699 gallons of oil, 804x155mm rounds, 5,157x105mm rounds, 92x3.5 rockets, 7,678x81mm rounds, 3,667x60mm rounds, 77,188x.50 cal rounds, 149,476x.30 cal rounds, 598,409xM-16 rounds, 8,202 M-79 rounds, 2,089x38 cal rounds, 37,585x45 cal rounds, 109,487 Garand rounds, 99,358 BAR rounds, 4,167x4.2 mortar rounds, 4,312xM-26 hand grenades, 183xM-72 LAWS, 2,2024xAP mines and 314 claymores.
- During the week the 3-271st VC Regiment lost 34 KIA S of BEN SOI (XT 0939); the K4-1st NVA Regiment lost 47 KIA SE of BEN LUC (XS 6472), and the 2-268th VC Regiment lost 33 KIA NW of TRUNG LAP (XT 5620). Other major enemy manoeuver elements continued to avoid contact.
- 4. Statistics for the week showed that there were 50 enemy initiated attacks compared with 80 last week. Of these, there were 12 mortar attacks and 13 rocket attacks compared with 21 mortar attacks and 14 rocket attacks last week. Details of some of the enemy initiated incidents are:-
- a. At 100930H, YT 106 259, in BIEN HOA Province, a 9th Div Ranger Team received SA and AW fire and a command detonated booby trap from an unknown size VC force. The fire was returned with organic weapons supported by artillery and ground reinforcements. Results: 11 VC KIA; 1 US KIA and 3 US WIA.
- b. At 101830H, XT 007 574, in TAY NINH Province, a 25th Avn Sniffer Ship received HMG fire from an unknown size NVA force. The fire was returned with organic weapons supported by arty, gunships, and airstrikes. Results: 63 NVA KIA; negative US losses.
- c. At 111100H, XT 582 537, in BINH DUONG Province, B/2-34th Inf received SA and AW fire from an unknown size VC force. The fire was returned with organic weapons supported by arty, gunships, and airstrikes. Results: 11 VC KIA; 1 US KIA and 1 US WIA.
- d. At 110320H, XT 560 280, in HAU NGHIA Province, B/1-5th Inf received SA, AW, and RPG fire from an estimated enemy company. The fire was returned with organic weapons supported by arty, Spooky, and a light fire team. Results: 33 enemy KIA; negative US losses.

Assessment of Enemy Intentions

- 7. During the past week enemy actions have been characterized by scattered attacks by fire and, while the enemy has employed elements of his Main Forces in forward attack positions, the majority of the regiments are believed to have been withdrawn to secure base areas to regroup and refit, and it is estimated that the overall combat readiness of the enemy is again increasing.
- 8. There are no indications of any enemy plans to resume large-scale Corps wide operations, and it is assed that the enemy is revising his strategy after his failures to breach the approach routes to SAIGON.
- 9. It is estimated that there is no major threat against the Capital Military District at this time, but enemy forces are capable of harassment, particularly attacks by fire, against Allied installations and Provincial centres throughout the Corps Zone and with an increasing ground attack capability in the TAY NINH City region and in other areas to the N and NW of the TAOR.
- 10. Until such time as the enemy determines his strategy, his immediate course of action will probably continue to consist of scattered attacks by fire and limited ground actions throughout the III CTZ.

- For the week there were 1019 enemy KIA (BC), 59 PWs, 155 returnees (Hoi Chanh); there were 373 individial weapons and 85 crew-served weapons captured; and there wer 29.05 tons of rice captured or destroyed.

- 1. Members whose pay has been increased as a result of the revised pay grouping system are required to pay increased DFRB contributions.
- 2. A pre-1959 entrant who has previously elected not to pay additional contributions will not pay any additional contributions, neither will he receive a higher rate of pension.
- 3. A pre-1959 entrant who has not made such an election and who finds the additional contributions now required too heavey to pay may make arrangements as follows:
 - a. Elect not to pay the additional contributions, in which case he becomes entitled to the Commonwealth share only of the additional category numbers. Such an election is irrevocable and applies to all further increases in category number. Full details are given in ARO 117/67. Elections must be made on DFRB Form 130 within 4 months of the date of occurrence, or
 - b. If his total contribution exceeds 5% of his pay, apply to the DFRB Board to defer all or part of the additional contribution. Applications must be made on DFRB Form 121. In this case, the amount of contribution defered is payable plus 5% compound interest, on termination of service. A member entitled to a pension on retirement must repay the amount owing within 1 month of retirement, or if he does not do so, receive an actuarially reduced pension.
 - c. The DFRB Act also provides that the DFRB Board may pay the premiums on certain assurance policies held by members. Full details are available from the DFRB Board.
- 4. Any such election must be made before 23 Apr 69.
- The DFRB Board may accept an election made after 23 Apr 69 if special circumstances exist. Any election submitted after 23 Apr 69 must have a written explanation of the lateness of the submission attached to the election form.

Available intelligence indicates that elements of up to two companies are located in the eastern end of LONG GREEN, and that HQ D445 Bn with one company is probably located South of XUYEN MOC in the general area of YS6663. Other elements of the battalion are probably dispersed in the LONG HAI hills and on supply missions in other areas of PHUOC TUY Province.
- C23, the XUYEN MOC Platoon, is reported to be located in the vicinity of YS6868.

- 5. VC forces in this AO probably obtain rice, salt and fish supplies from the populated areas of DAT DO, LONG DIEN and BARIA. Some of the gardens probably support the personnel of D445 Bn while some is probably moved North and North West to the 84th Rear Services Group complexes in the PHUOC TUY -LONG KHANH border area.
- The CAPE TAMBO area is also believed to be used from time to time as a ship to shore supply transfer point for stores en route to the 84th Rear Services Group complexes.
- Elimination of D445 and C23 and destruction of installations, caches and food growing areas in AOs GITTIDG, COOCHE and ERIGHTON-would significantly reduce VC influence in PHUOC TUY Province.

ENEMY SITUATION IN PHUOC TUY PROVINCE 041200 H TO 181200 H APR 69

General

1. Enemy initiated incidents within the province have decreased significantly during the reporting period. However, due to Operation OVERLANDER, enemy activity along the WESTERN and NORTHERN border areas of the province has increased.

WEST of Route 2

- Enemy activity in this area was the most significant for the reporting . . period.
 - a. HAT DICH. Most enemy units contacted in this area appeared to be moving EAST. This trend, together with identifications, suggest that:
 - (1) Elements of HQ 274 VC Regt, 2/274 and 3/274 were located from the SUOI LE, SUOI DA stream area, vicinity YS 3185 to the SONG CA river area vicinity YS 3884, but have now moved further EAST, NORTH EAST and SOUTH EAST.
 - (2) SR-4 units operating in AO HUME, initially appeared to move closer to areas occupied by 274 VC Regt but, as Op OVERLANDER progressed, gradually drifted out of the AO and avoided contact. Within 48 hours of the occupation of AOs MARULAN and PICTON, most enemy supply movement had ceased.
 - (3) D 440 LF Bn elements have been engaged while on rice carrying tasks between ROUTE 15 and its base area SOUTH EAST of XUAN LOC. This is possibly to supplement storage areas being exhausted by 33 NVA Regt and elements of HQ MR-7 which appear to be in that area.
 - (4) There has been a significant number of friendly initiated contacts in this area, resulting in large quantities of materiel being captured and many caches, base camps and bunker complexes have been destroyed or made unusable for enemy occupation.
 - b. DUC THANH. Little significant enemy activity has been reported in this AO during the reporting period, although agent reports indicate that it may be developing into an important enemy rice collection area again, as MF elements in the LONG KHANH - PHUOC TUY Province Border area increase.
 - c. NUI THI VAI NUI DINH ROUTE 15. Reports are still being received concerning enemy activity in the mountain complex but no positive identifications of units has been made. Two road blocks have been set up during the reporting period and a route security post at YS 271661 received three RPG-2 rounds and small arms fire on 13 Apr 69. There were no friendly casualties. It is considered that an element of D 67 Sapper Bn is still in this area and that it will continue to interdict Route 15 with the assistance of local guerrillas.

SOUTH of 1 ATF TAOR

Enemy activity in this area has again decreased during the reporting period. There were two friendly initiated and six enemy initiated incidents in the DAT DO -LONG DIEN area and it is considered that C 25 Company and local village guerrilla units were responsible.

EAST of ROUTE 2

- There has been considerable track and trail activity in this area but no firm locations or identifications have been made.
 - a. LONG GREEN LIGHT GREEN. There has been considerable movement of stores across the beaches adjacent to this. area, stogether with confirmed movement of large groups through the LONG GRILLIN. Contacts during the opening phase of Operation SURFSIDE have failed to identify the small groups of enemy encountered. However, a number of agent -/2

reports tend to indicate the presence of at least one company of D 445 LF h.

b. XUYEN MOC - NUI TAM BO. There has been no confirmation of the presence of large groups of enemy in the area to the SOUTH and SOUTH EAST of KUYEN MOC. However, a significant number of reports from different sources indicate that D 445 LF Bn has established its headquarters and a training area to the EAST of the NUI MO ONG - NUI KHO complex. It is probable that the XUYEN MOC District guerrillas are also in the area EAST of XUYEN MOC, and that elements of 84 Rear Services Group are located in the XUYEN MOC District engaged in logistic support of LF and MF units in the EASTERN half of PHUOC TUY Province.

NORTHERN BORDER AREA

This area is becoming more significant due to a probable influx of Main Force units which have been forced out of the WESTERN HAT DICH border area by recent 1 ATF Operations. The WEST_EAST movement across Route 2 towards the SONG RAI and possibly towards the MAY TAO area by large numbers of enemy has been reported by many sources. It is considered that Main Force elements of MR-7 may intend to use this area as a secure base in which they can carry out regrouping and retraining for future operations.

CONCLUSIONS

There are no indications of a buildup of enemy forces near the population centres of the SOUTH but sporadic harrassing raids by local guerrilla units can be expected to continue. Due to 1 ATF operations, particularly the HAT DICH area, food, equipment and materiel support has been denied to the majority of Main Force units and greater efforts by Rear Services elements to furnish depleted logistic supplies can be anticipated. An increase in track and trail activity throughout the Province should be noticeable.

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Section 1. III Corps Tactical Zone

1. For the fortnight, significant enemy initiated activity was continued at a moderate level, although, an increase in attacks by fire was noted towards the end of the period. The 9th VC Division has been the most active of the enemy Main Force regiments. Two of its battalions, the 271st and the 272nd, have suffered heavy losses, and it is now likely that these battalions are resting and refitting in Cambodian santuaries.

2. A summary of significant enemy initiated ground actions and losses for

the fortnight is:

The 272nd VC Regiment lost 198 KIA and 8 PWs captured in an attack against US FSB DIAMOND (XT 327 215); the 271st VC Regiment lost 213 KIA and 6 PWs captured in an attack against US FSB FRONTIER CITY (XT 190 287); the 18B NVA Regiment lost 102 KIA in two contacts N and NW of DAU TIENG (XT 4557 - XT 4360); and the K4-1st NVA Regiment lost 31 KIA NW of RACH KIEN (XS 6871).

- On 16th April, friendly forces carrying out a ground sweep operation SW of THIEN NGON (XT 0379) found the bodies of 93 enemy KBA. They were probably killed as a result of a B-52 strike placed in the area on 6th April. No identification of the enemy unit has been reported, but it is possible that it could have been an element of the 101D NVA Regiment.
- 4. Statistics for the week ending 26th April showed that there were 73 enemy initiated attacks compared to 80 the previous week. Of these there were 18 mortar attacks and 24 rocket attacks compared with 12 mortar attacks and 14 rocket attacks in the previous week. Details of some of the enemy initiated incidents are:
- a. At 150315H, XT 327 215, in TAY NINH Province, FSB DIAMOND received SA, AW, RPG, HMG, and 82mm mortar fire followed by a ground attack from an estimatimated two battalions of NVA. The fire was returned with organic weapons supported by arty, a light fire team, Shadow, Spooky, and airstrikes. Results 198 NVA KIA and 8 NVA PWs; 13 US KIA and 9 US WIA. Eight AK-47 rifles and 9 RPG-2 RLs captured.
- b. At 170225H, XT 327 215, in TAY NINH Province, PB DIAMOND III received 40 rounds of 82mm mortar fire from an unknown size NVA force. The fire was returned with organic weapons supported by arty, Shadow, and a light fire team. Results 20 NVA KIA; negative US losses.
- c. At 181845H, XT 433 600, in TAY NINH Province, Team B/1-11th Cav received SA and AW fire from an unknown size NVA force. The fire was returned with organic weapons supported by arty, airborne rocket artillery, and was reinforced by Team A. The contact continued throughout the day and finally was broken at 1930H. Results: 80 NVA KIA; 7 US KIA and 27 US WIA.
- d. At 212145H, XT 573 263, in HAU NGHIA Province, B/1-5th Inf night defensive position received SA, AW, and RPG fire from an unknown size NVA force. The fire was returned with organic weapons supported by arty, a light fire team and a Shadow. Results: 26 NVA KIA; negative US losses.
- e. At 261100H, XS 598 604, in LONG AN Province, B/2-47th Inf received SA, AW, RPG-2 and M-79 fire from an estimated two platoons of VC. The fire was returned with organic weapons supported by airstrikes, gunships, and arty. Results: 53 VC KIA; 2 US KIA and 15 US WIA.
- f. At 260035H, XT 202 292, in TAY NINH Province, FSB FRONTIER CITY received 20 rounds of 107mm rocket fire and 275 rounds of 82mm mortar followed by a ground attack from an unknown size NVA force firing SA, AW, HMG, RPG, and 60mm mortar. The fire was returned with organic weapons supported by arty, a light fire team, a Spooky, and airstrikes. Results 213 NVA KIA and 6 NVA PWs; 1 US WIA. One HMG, 25 AK-47s, 6 RPG2 RLs, 1 LMG, 1x75mm RR, 4x60mm mortars, 10 SKS rifles, 1x82mm mortar, and 1x107mm RL were captured. One 82mm mortar round, 30 RPG-2 rounds, 102 grenades, 17x60mm mortar rounds, 6x75mm RR rounds, 4x57mm RR rounds, 100 lbs of web gear, and 8700 rounds of SA ammo were destroyed.

Documents and a PW captured SW of KATUM revealed that the 95C Regiment has relocated from its AO, E of NUI BA DEN, and has been replaced by the 18B Regiment. 9th Division elements are operating from santuaries within CAMBODIA against targets from W of TAY NINH City southwards to the ANGELS WING area. The 141st Regiment is probably still regrouping N of the FISH HOOK in CAMBODIA. Full details of the probable locations of enemy Main Force units is:

Assessment of Enemy Intentions.

- 6. The enemy appears to be concentrating on resupply and replacement activities, but at leas one regiment from each of the divisions is being held in forward attack positions. Limited and local attacks are probably planned by these elements, but there are no immediate indications of a renewal of a co-ordinated offensive within the Corps Zone.
- 7. It is assessed that the Winter-Spring Campaign finally faltered and ended in March, and Agent reports now state that a Summer-Autumn Campaign is being planned. It is probable that enemy forces will conduct small actions with a concentration on attacks by fire, in order to conserve manpower, until such time as the start of the new Campaign is determined. It is also possible that there could be a sharp increase in enemy initiated activities towards the middle of May to climax with a high point on 19th May on the occasion of HO CHI MINH's birthday.

Enemy Losses

11. For the week ending 19th April, there were 1019 enemy KIA (BC), 106 PWs, 148 returnees (Hoi Chanh); there were 369 individual weapons and 97 crew-served weapons captured; and there were 52.10 tons of rice captured or destroyed.

12. For the week ending 26th April, there were 1148 enemy KIA (BC), 113 PWs, and 152 returnees (Hoi Chanh); there were 386 individual weapons and 59 crew-served weapons captured; and there were 29.50 tons of rice captured or destroyed.

(B) Friendly Activity

- Results in Campaign TOAN THAN III (Complete Victory) for the week ending 19th April there were: Enemy Losses: 962 KIA, 199 detainees; 165 SA, 31 crew-served weapons, 17,560 SA rounds, 1,083 HE rounds, 183 grenades, 14 mines, 1 sampan, 58.55 tons of rice and 5.02 tons of salt captured; 43 SA, 46 crew-served weapons, 56,172 SA rounds, 1,128 HE rounds, 587 grenades, 124 mines, 18 sampans, 59 booby traps, 6.85 tons of rice and .30 tons of salt destroyed. Friendly losses: 54 KIA, 305 WIA; 13 helicopters, 3 tanks, 10 APCs and 3 ACAVs damaged; 2 helicopters 5 tanks, 5 APCs, 2 ACAVs, 2 trucks, 1 ROME plow and 1 howitzer destroyed.
- Results in Campaign TOAN THANG III (Complete Victory) for the week ending 26th April there were: Enemy Losses: 985 KIA, 113 detainees; 176 SA, 30 crew-served weapons, 96,310 SA rounds, 676 HE rounds, 381 grenades, 34 mines, 1 booby trap, 2 sampans, 9.00 tons of rice, .41 tons of salt and .05 tons of miscellaneous food were captured; 17 SA, 4 crew-served weapons, 6,313 SA rounds, 335 HE rounds, 125 grenades, 50 mines, 47 booby traps, 56 sampans, 22.45 tons of rice and .01 tons of miscellaneous food were destroyed. Friendly losses: 38 KIA, 267 WIA, 2 MIA; 12 helicopters, 14 tanks, 6 APCs, 4 ACAVs, 6 trucks, 3 dozers and 1 ROME plow damaged; 3 helicopters, 3 APCs, 3 ACAVs and 2 trucks destroyed.

Section 2. SOUTH VIETNAM (excl III CTZ) and NORTH VIETNAM

(A) Enemy Activity

- 15. For the week ending 19th April, the number of countrywide enemy attacks and ambushes increased. There were 13 attacks in I CTZ; there were 17 attacks and 1 ambush in II CTZ; and there were 23 attacks in IV CTZ.
- 16. For the past week the number of countrywide enemy attacks and ambushes decreased. There were 16 attacks in I CTZ; there were 14 attacks in II CTZ; and there were 19 attacks in IV CTZ.
 - (B) Friendly Activity (Period 12th 26th April 1969)
 - 17. In I CTZ there were 24 FW and 33 ARVN large unit operations resulting in 1288 enemy KIA against 122 friendlies KIA.
 - 18. In <u>II CTZ</u> there were 25 FW and 45 ARVN large unit operations resulting in 304 enemy KIA against 23 friendlies KIA.
- 19. <u>In IV CTZ</u> there were 2 US and 185 ARVN large unit operations resulting in 1762 enemy KIA against 89 friendlies KIA.

(C) Other Items

Enemy Use of Delay Fuse Mortar Ammunition. A document captured 12 kilometres southwest of TAM KY City (BT 217 140) in QUANG TIN Province by A/2/1 Infantry on 3rd April and dated 13th January 1969 states: In the immediate future, 82mm mortar units will use delay fuse ammunition. Delay fuse ammunition should be used only in attacks by fire against enemy strong points, depots, airfields, and rear base areas. Delay fuse ammunition will not be used for attacks by fire which will be followed by infantry assaults. (Extracted from III MAF PIR 15-69).

Section 3. SOUTH VIETNAM Summary

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21. For the week ending 26th April, the number of friendly large unit operations decreased from 254 to 227. The number of operations with contact decreased from 115 to 98. The number of enemy killed increased from 3379 to 3662.
