COMMANDERS DIARIES INSTRUCTIONS

AIM

1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organisation and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

GENERAL

- 2. Entries will be made daily on AF C2118, each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.
- 3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties in the Field", Chapter 5, Section 1.

RESPONSIBILITY

During Non-operational Periods

4. A Commanders Diary will be made by commanders of all formations.

During Operational Periods (see note 1)

- 5. A Commanders Diary will be made in duplicate by:-
 - (a) Commanders of all formations.
 - (b) Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a Brigadier or above.
 - (c) Heads of services not below the rank of Lieutenant Colonel.
 - (d) Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
 - (e) Unit commanders.
 - (f) Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

COMPILATION

- 6. Both original and duplicate copies will consist of:
 - (a) Cover (AF C2119).
 - (b) Index as printed on cover.
 - (c) Narrative (AF C2118).
 - (d) Annexes as shown in the Index.
- 7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes will be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer will be included.
- 8. The annexes will be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an Annex NIL will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters, the relevant papers should be grouped as annexes starting at B.

- 2. The War Office or headquarters concerned will be responsible for instructing units to submit Commanders' Diaries where the conditions of the unit's employment make this necessary. Wherever possible the beginning and end of the period will be clearly stated. Notwithstanding the above, on the outbreak of global war all units and formations which are not at the time submitting these reports will start compiling them with effect from M day and will thereafter render them in accordance with paragraphs 15 and 16.

1. This report covers the period 1 - 31 Dec 63.

Unit Activities

- 3. RAR. No major training activities took place during the month.
- the CO and RMO attended a Senior Officer's Health Day conducted at TERENDAK by the FETC School of Health. Fourteen personnel also attended one day health courses conducted by the FETC School of Health in TERENDAK.
- 5. 102 Fd Bty. The arrival of all members of 102 Fd Bty, issue of stores, and organisation of the Battery following the relief of 103 Fd Bty, was completed by 23 Nov 63, and training commenced on 25 Nov.
- A battery deployment exercise was conducted during the period 9 14 Dec 63 following an earlier troop exercise in late Nov 63. One command post exercise took place on 18 Dec 63. All gun numbers were requalified to Class 3 level during the period.
- 7. Battery personnel attended the following courses:
 - a. Unit Emplaning Officers Course. One officer and one Warrant Officer trained in SINGAPORE.
 - b. FAC Refresher. Both Troop Commanders attended a course under RAF arrangement at ASAHAN on 13/14 Dec 63.
 - c. Battery Air Loading and Testing Teams. Six teams are now trained (one per gun).
 - d. Navigation. Day and Night navigation exercises have been held in conjunction with troop and battery exercises.

2/ ...

- 8. 2 Fd Tp. The Troop as part of 11 Indep Fd Sqn RE is allocated to Operation CROWN, an airfield construction project near MUKDAHAN in THAILAND. 11 Indep Fd Sqn RE will be responsible for the initial site preparations for the project and is expected to be in THAILAND for at least three months. The Squadron Advance Party, including an element of 2 Fd Tp, departed from SINGAPORE for BANGKOK by LST on 29 Dec 63.
- 9. Prior to preparing for departure for Operation CROWN, 110 Troop spend one week on a troop jungle exercise in the KONGLOI area for acclimatisation purposes after relieving 4 Fd Tp on 15 Nov 63.
- 10. A meeting was held on 30 Dec 63 at this Headquarters to review the establishment and equipment table of 2 Fd Tp, in order to resolve current stores and equipment problems referred to in previous reports. OC 2 Fd Tp and HQ FARELF representatives were present. The recommendation of the meeting was for the Troop to be established and equipped on the same basis as the other two troops of the squadron, with a small increment for purely Australian administration. 2 Fd Tp will submit a recommended establishment and equipment table to this Headquarters.

Comman d

- Brig F.R. EVANS, OBE arrived in the theatre on 2 Dec 63 and assumed command of Aust Army Force FARELF vice Brig D. VINCENT, OBE on 6 Dec 63. Brig VINCENT departed by ship for the UK on 14 Dec 63.
- 12. Calls by Brig F.R. EVANS, OBE have been made on the Australian High Commission in KUALA LUMPUR and SINGAPORE, all major headquarters in MALAYA and SINGAPORE and to all Australian units in MALAYA and SINGAPORE.
- 13. Department of External Affairs withdrew the diplomatic privileges of the Australian Army Commander on change of command.

Aid to the Malaysian Army

14. Enquiries have already been made regarding proposed Australian assistance to Malaysian Forces. Advice of any relevant information on this subject would be appreciated.

Amah's Dispute

- AHQ approval (incl finance authority) has been received for the implementation of the scheme for individual employment, rather than War Office employment of domestic servants. The date of inception of the scheme in MALAYSIA is still not firm but is expected to be 1 Apr 64 further advice will be provided when available.
- The finance authority recently given does not provide the soldier with sufficient money to pay the servant at the current theatre agreed rate of pay. In addition, several restricting limitations have been included which are considered not to be a Force requirement. A further submission on these aspects will be made to AHQ.

Visitors

17. During the month the following visits were made from the Headquarters:-

- a. Brig F.R. EVANS, OBE; introductory calls to Aust High Commission, all major Headquarters in MALAYA/ SINGAPORE and all Australian units in MALAYA/ SINGAPORE during the period 3 21 Dec 63.
- b. Maj K.P.R. CAREY; liaison visit to AATTV reviewing area allowances during the period 5 19 Dec 63.
- 18. Maj H. HATTON, DMO & P(L/AW) Army Headquarters discussed FARELF integration of light aircraft with this Headquarters during a one day (6 Dec 63) stopover en route to the Exercise AIR BOON CHOO Planning Conference in BANGKOK.

Future Activities

- 19. Orientation visits to SOUTH VIETNAM. These will recommence on 7 Jan 64 for officers of the Force. Three officers will visit SOUTH VIETNAM every two weeks from the 7 Jan 64.
- 20. Border Operations. A request for the use of 3 RAR on the MALAYA/THAI Border Operations may be anticipated. The requirement will be for a tactical headquarters with 2/3 companies for a period of two months possibly from Feb/Mar 64.
- 21. AHQ Draft Adm Instr 2/63. A review of this draft instruction will be undertaken during Jan 64. The draft instruction with our comments will be passed to HQ FARELF for concurrence before return to Army Headquarters.
- 22. Operation CROWN. The main body of 2 Fd Tp will arrive at the construction site at 7 can 64. Brig EVANS will visit the site on 21 23 Jan 64 in the company of the Chief of Staff, HQ FARELF.

INSTRUCTION 1/64 - ARA OFFICER ORIENTATION
VISITS TO SOUTH VIETNAM

General

1. This instruction replaces all previous correspondence

- 1. This instruction replaces all previous correspondence relating to the procedure of AUSTRALIAN army officer observer visits to SOUTH VIETNAM.
- 2. Two observer teams of AUSTRALIAN Army Force FARELF each of three army officers, will visit SOUTH VIETNAM every two weeks for a period of eight days. The visits are sponsored by the UNITED STATES Military Assistance Command VIETNAM (MACV).

Aim

- 3. The aims of the visits are:
 - a. to enable officers to gain first hand knowledge of counter-insurgency warfare and observe counter-guerilla techniques and methods,
 - b. to enable officers to gain knowledge of the peoples and terrain of SOUTH VIETNAM.

Visiting officers will act as a source of intelligence wherever possible.

Allocation of Vacancies

Units in TERENDAK will be allocated vacancies through HQ 28 COMWEL Inf Bde Gp by this Headquarters. Officers serving elsewhere in MALAYA and in SINGAPORE will be nominated direct by this Headquarters. Nominations will be made by this Headquarters one month before the proposed visit. Nominated officers will be responsible for obtaining clearance from their respective OCs etc for the visit.

Briefing

Nominated officers will report to GSO2 HQ Aust Army Force for briefing at 1400 hrs on the day prior to departing for SOUTH VIETNAM. This briefing will be mainly of an administrative nature (operational briefing will take place in SAIGON). In particular observers will be instructed on the form the report which they will submit on return from the visit. (see Annex A). On completion of this briefing they will then report to JIB(A) Representative at PHOENIX PARK. Transport to and from PHOENIX PARK will be provided.

Publicity

6. The visits are to be regarded as CONFIDENTIAL, and, in particular, officers will not divulge any information about the pisits to the Press or any other publicity agency.

Visit Routine

Observers will normally depart SINGAPORE for SAIGON by civil aircraft on a Tuesday arriving SAIGON at 1110 hours (local time), and return on the following Thursday week arriving SINGAPORE at 1310 hours (local time).

- On arrival at SAIGON Airport, observers will be met by 8. the Naval/Military Attache's Assistant, S Sgt NOLAN, who will conduct observers to their accommodation. Following lunch, observers will report to the AUSTRALIAN Embassy (Address, 7th Floor, CARAVELLE Hotel). The Naval/Military Attache, Lt Col P.G. OXLEY will further discuss the visit with the observers, issue personal weapons, and introduce them to officers of HQ USMACV. A detailed intelligence and operational briefing will be given to the observers at HQ USMACV, following which, the observers will be allocated to individual ARVN (Armee Republique VIETNAM) Corps areas. Little choice may be expected in this allocation unless HQ USMACV has been adequately forewarned through this Headquarters and the Australian Embassy SAIGON. It is anticipated that visits will be restricted mainly to III and IV Corps Tactical Zones, where the majority of actions are taking place. (See Annex C).
- During in-country travel observers will be sponsored by US Advisory Groups. The US officers are extremely co-operative and will do all they can to assist observers. It must be stressed however that observers should be prepared to use initiative during their visit in order to see all points of interest.
- 10. Observers will return to SAIGON by 1200 hrs on the Wednesday previous to their return. A brief initial report of their visit will be required by the Naval/Military Attache. It is normal to call on the AUSTRALIAN Ambassador, Mr HILL, prior to departure from SAIGON.
- 11. On return to SINGAPORE, this Headquarters will meet the observers and arrange their return to units. No debrief will take place, however, observers will submit a report of their visit in triplicate to reach this Headquarters within ten days of their return.
- 12. Visits by senior officers (above rank of Major) will be dealt with as individual cases and programmes will be arranged for them.

Administration

13. Personal Requirements

Each observer will be in possession of the following: -

- a. A Security clearance to SECRET level.
- b. An Official AUSTRALIAN Passport with a current SOUTH VIETNAM Entry Visa for a ten day visit.
- c. An International Health Certificate detailing current inoculation against:-
 - (i) Smallpox
 - (ii) Cholera
 - (iii) Bubonic Plague
 - (iv) Tetanus (TAB)
- d. Sufficient Paludrine, in accordance with current instructions.

Air Travel

Travel to and from SAIGON will be by Pan American Airways as arranged by this Headquarters. Luggage will be restricted to 66 lbs. Civilian clothing will be worn to and from SAIGON. All in-country travel will be by UNITED STATES Army, Airforce or Marine aircraft. Uniform will be worn on in-country journeys.

Clothing

15.

a. The following list is a guide to the clothing requirement for the visit:-

one lightweight suit
one pair lightweight trousers
sufficient civilian shirts
three sets of greens (no shorts)
belt, boots, bush hat, water bottle,
haversack and poncho.

b. Dress worn in UNITED STATES Messes is informal (planter's rig) outside duty hours. Observers should carry enough basic equipment to be able to sleep out at night, less blankets which are obtainable from messes. It is the exception to sleep out during the visit. Laundry facilities in SOUTH VIETNAM are not good.

Photographic Film

A limited amount of 35 mm black and white film is available to observers at this Headquarters. The supply of this film should not be relied upon, but will be made available whenever possible.

Finance

17. The AUSTRALIAN Cash Office SINGAPORE will advance each observer US\$100 before departure to SAIGON, which is accountable on return to either the AUSTRALIAN Cash Office in SINGAPORE or TERENDAK. Meal and accommodation charges of up to US\$5 a day may be anticipated. Receipts should be obtained where possible.

Accommodation in SOUTH VIETNAM

Accommodation in VIETNAM will be in UNITED STATES Bachelor Officers Quarters and in Advisory Group Messes. Security for personal property cannot be guaranteed, however small items of value may be left at the AUSTRALIAN Embassy SAIGON.

19. Personal weapons will be issued by the Naval/Military Attache for the duration of the visit. Observers should be aware that no weapons can be taken into or out of SOUTH VIETNAM.

GS MATTERS

3 RAR Border Operations

- Following Department of Defence approval, HQ FARELF plan to place the major element of 3 RAR under operational command of 2 Fed Inf Bde, for anti-CT operations in the PERLIS/NORTH KEDAH area of the MALAY/THAI border, for the period 19 Feb 5 Apr 64. A tactical headquarters with two/three rifle companies will be deployed. 1 NZ Regt are planned to replace 3 RAR on the Border for the period 6 Apr 19 May 64.
- 4. Malaysian authorities desire the Aust battalion/NZ battalion to be employed rotationally on Border operations for twelve months. They will not be released for Border operations during the period 19 May 19 Aug 64 because of 28 COMWEL Inf Bde Gp exercise commitments.

Request for 3 RAR Employment

The procedure for requesting the use of Australian Forces laid down in para 18 of the Directive for Commander Australian Army Force proved to be unsuitable for the recent request for the employment of 3 RAR on the THAI/MALAYAN border. While a Tri-service organisation existed on approach direct to AHQ by the GOC-in-C FARELF was considered satisfactory. Now, however, with MALAYSIA independent and a unified command for the FAR EAST in existence, the C-in-C FAREAST as a member of the Malaysian Defence Council normally receives the request for military assistance from MALAYSIA. He then would make the approach to AUSTRALIA. The direct communication with AHQ should, it is felt, be used only after the use of the Australian troops have been authorised.

Border Operations Force Title

6. HQ FARELF advised on 7 Feb 64 that the "17 GURKHA Division Operational Force" ceased to exist on 1 Feb 64 and is redesignated "The MALAYSIA/THAILAND Border Operational Force". Army Headquarters has been requested, vide our A 12 of 8 Feb 64, to revoke the existing Declaration of the Governor - General and issue a new Declaration covering the redesignation of this title of the Force. Until this is done soldiers of 3 RAR deployed on Border Operations will be on war service and not active service.

Directive for Border Operations - CO 3 RAR

7. A directive to CO 3 RAR similar to that issued to CO 2 RAR is necessary to clarify command channels while 3 RAR is committed to Border Operations, and has been requested from Army Headquarters.

BORNEO Operations

8. Although a cease-fire has been in operation along the MALAYSIA/KALIMANTAN Border since 25 Jan 64, UK reliefs and reinforcements are continuing as previously planned, less the reinforcement of one battalion from HONG KONG without replacement. The Command structure has been strengthened with HQ 5 Fed Inf Bde now commanding the EASTERN Bde Area (TAWAU and SANDAKAN Residence) and HQ 51 (GURKHA) Inf Bde Gp soon (mid Feb 64) to command the CANTRAL Bde Area (4th and 5th Division SARAWAK and SABAH less TAWAU and SANDAKAN Residencies). HQ 99 (GURKHA) Inf Bde Gp continues to command WESTERN Bde Area (1st, 2nd and 3rd Division of SARAWAK).

Operation 'DUSTER'

9. 4 Fed Inf Bde, located in SINGAPORE. have issued an Operation Instruction (Op 'DUSTER') with the aim of countering infiltration by armed raiding parties in SINGAPORE and JOHORE. Each infantry battalion of 4 Fed Inf Bde has permanently one platoon at 30 minutes notice and one company less one platoon at 4 hours notice.

FARELF ORBAT

10. The disposition of major FARELF units, less logistic elements, as at 1 Feb 64, is shown in diagrammatic outline at Annex 'D'.

Operation CROWN (see previous report para 22).

- 11. 2 Fd Tp RAE less a small rear party arrived at UBON on 7 Jan 64 and moved to the airfield construction site near MUKDAHAN. The troop is responsible for the construction of a hutted camp on the construction site, which at this stage involves much plant operation in dusty conditions. Hours of work are long, amenities are limited and present accommodation is tented. CRE Operation CROWN has commented favourably on the work done by 2 Fd Tp RAE.
- 12. Commander Aust Army Force accompanied the Chief of Staff, HQ FARELF, on a visit to Operation CROWN during 21 23 Jan 64.

 GSO 2 Aust Army Force will also visit MUKDA IN in mid Feb (see para 1).

Re-organisation of HQ FARELF

Operational and planning branches of HQ FARELF are now located with HQ FAR EAST and operational elements of HQ FEAF and HQ FE Fleet. The aim of this concentration is to enable unified planning and single service planning to proceed simultaneously. The G staff officers of FARELF involved in planning intend to spend most of their

time at HQ FAR EAST and liaison with them has become less easy. The organisation is still very much experimental. (HQ Aust Army Force 133/1/2 of 4 Fob 64 to AHQ refers).

Re-organisation of 17 GURKHA Div

14. On 1 Feb 64 the present responsibilities of HQ 17 GURKHA Div/MALAYA Area are to be split between HQ 17 Div, a new HQ located at KLUANG, and HQ MALAYA Area located at SEREMBAN. The detailed responsibilities of these two headquarters are contained in the directives to the respective commanders, forwarded serarately. The outline responsibilities are:-

a. HQ 17 Div

Training of 28 COMWEL Inf Bde Gp 99 GURKHA Inf Bde Gp 3 Cdo Bde RM

In addition HQ 17 Div will command any forces initially committed from FARELF on any future operations, similar to the BORNEO Operations.

b. HQ MALAYA Area

Administration of all formations and units in MALAYA including those under command of HQ 17 Div for training.

SEATO Exercise AIR BOON CHOO - THAILAND 20 - 29 Apr 64.

15. The SEATO tactical air exercise AIR BOON CHOO takes place in THAILAND during the period 20 - 29 Apr sponsored by THAILAND. US and UK. Elements of FARELF are to take part in the exercise to practice their SEATO role within the limits imposed by the exercise. These will be:-

Tac HQ 28 COMWEL Inf Bde Gp
Det 656 Sqn AAC
Det ASSU 249 Sqn
FE Ground Liaison Group less 1 GLO
Selected staff for Joint HQs.

This element will total approximately 200 all ranks. It is likely that approximately thirty five Australian personnel on integrated appointments of HQ 28 COMWEL Inf Bde Gp will participate in the exercise.

Visit of AHQ CGS Exercise Writing Team

16. Lt Cols J.B. WATCH and J.B. SALMON and Mr J.D. DOYLE of JIB spent one day in SINGAPORE on 30 Jan 64 en route to THAILAND for ground reconnaissance of the area covered by the 1964 CGS Exercise. While in SINGAPORE the AHQ Team called on operational branches of HQ FARELF and JIB SINGAPORE. GSO 2 Aust Army Force and Photographer Aust Army Force are accompanying the team in THAILAND.

Visits to and from Aust Army Force

- 17. a. Comd Aust Army Force visited MUKDAHAN and UBON during the period 21 23 Jan 64 accompanying Chief-of-Staff HQ FARELF on a visit to Operation CROWN.
 - b. Six officers of 3 RAR visited SOUTH VIETNAM on orientation visits during January. Due to the recent coup US authorities have advised that these visits will again be postponed indefinitely.
 - c. Col D.D. MAITLAND, RAMC exchange officer and designate DAH AHQ visited MALAYA/SINGAPORE during 30 Jan 2 Feb 64.

During his visit Col MAITLAND visited Australian units in TERENDAK and FARELF School of Health.

d. Col W.C. BUNTING, D Qtg AHQ arrived in SINGAPORE on 4 Feb 64 for a visit to SINGAPORE and TERENDAK. He will depart on 11 Feb 64.

AG MATTERS

AATTV - Status of Forces Agreement

18. The status of members of AATTV as prescribed under UN Treaty Series Volume 185(1954) is not clear. The privileges and immunities which are generally recognised under International Law for Diplomatic Staffs are understood, but we do not know what privileges and immunities will be recognised by the South Vietnamese Government, as they are applicable to members of AATTV. Clarification of this subject was sought from AHQ in our memo 234/2/1 of 31 Dec 63, but to date no reply has been received.

Disposal of Claims in the FAR EAST

- a. Claims Commission, War Office, through HQ FARELF, made a proposal on Inter-Governmental Mutual Waiver of Claims in Mar 61. This proposal was represented to AHQ in Apr 61. Despite further correspondence since that date the subject remains unresolved.
 - b. Concern is felt with regard to a lack of clear direction by AHQ on the responsibility of the Director of Claims FE to act on behalf of the Australian Government in processing tort claims in the SE Asia area. This initially applies to 2 Fd Tp RAE, currently operating in THAILAND, 1 SAS Coy to participate in the SEATO Exercise 'LITGAS' in the PHILLIPINES and AMF personnel in HONG KONG.
 - c. A submission on these two facets of Claims Disposal was made in our memorandum 76/1/7 of 31 Jan 64.

Visiting Forces Act 1963

20. To ensure that the correct disciplinary code is applied to AMF members in FARELF, it is necessary that we be advised of all disposal order action effected under section 24(1)(b) of the Act in regard of personnel posted to FARELF. A proposed procedure was submitted in our CONFIDENTIAL Signal A26 of 24 Jan 64 to AHQ. To date no advice has been received.

Emergency Leave to AUSTRALIA

21. a. Current instructions governing the grant of emergency leave, with travel at public expense, is contained in AHQ memo A25:/8/27 of 20 Mar 62 (Annex 'A'). Considerable concern is felt on the application of these terms to personnel serving in MALAYSIA, in comparison to the conditions applicable to personnel serving in AUSTRALIA. It is felt that as the travel distance involved in most cases are comparable with those that could be met in AUSTRALIA, that similar conditions for the granting of travel at Public Expense could apply.

- A relaxation of the current instruction affecting members in FARELF was sought in our Signal A14 of 7 Jan 64.
- c. This reference signal related to a Cpl F.C. MITCHENER who was disallowed travel at public expense even though the case was described by AHQ as being rather tragic.

 To date no advice has been received.

Change of Status of Employment of Domestic Servants (Amahs)

22. AHQ approval has been received authorising domestic servants to be employed by individual soldiers rather than by the War Department and for them to be paid by the member in accordance with a recently approved Domestic Servants Allowance. Regrettably the allowance authorised was not as requested by HQ Aust Army Force and would result in these employees receiving less pay than the statutory award. In addition, an unfair financial liability has been imposed on those members whose amahs choose to 'live in'. These anomalies require a further submission to be made to AHQ. The date of inception of the proposed is still indefinite but it is expected to be not before 1 Apr 64.

QMO MATTERS

Movement to AUSTRALIA - Costing of Sea Travel

The recent decision on the method to be adopted in assessing the relative costs of sea or air travel leave the service with no discretionary authority. The resultant cost to the individual places sea travel out of reach of most who would normally have travelled home this way. In certain cases hardship to the individual family is occasioned. A detailed submission on this subject will be made.

Rental Ceilings - Hirings

The changed circumstances in SINGAPORE over recent months have made it increasingly difficult to obtain houses within the rental ceilings allowed. In this regard Australian allowances fall short of UK and NZ and in the past month have resulted in the loss of four officers houses. A review of the position as at 31 Dec 63 and seeking an increase in the present ceiling is being prepared. In addition, the measures necessary to re-establish and maintain a satisfactory position have been discussed with the Director of Quartering during his current visit to FARELF.

NAAFI Trading Rights and Disbursement of Profits - TERENDAK Camp

25. A series of contentious papers on this subject have recently been prepared by HQ 28 COMWEL Inf Bde Gp highlighting certain unsatisfactory aspects of NAAFI trading in TERENDAK Camp particularly as it affects the Australian and NZ soldiers and families. These papers were submitted to the Chairman and Managing Director of NAAFI during their just concluded tour through FARELF. They will also form the basis of discussions planned to be held with the Managing Director of ASCO, Mr J. HIND, during his visit to FARELF commencing 5 Feb 65. Further submissions will be made to AHQ on this subject.

Administration of Military/Services Attaches.

26. The responsibilities of HQ Aust Army Force for the administration, particularly financial, of Australian Services Attaches in this theatre is not clear. Demands for equipment, clothing and necessaries, stationery, maintenance of equipment (cameras, watches etc) are continually being received. The majority of the demands can be met but only through UK sources. As no standing, capitation, or maintenance charge is paid to the UK for these services, the problem requires investigation and issue of appropriate instructions.

Re-classification "Private Hirings" to "Australian Hirings".

The problem of conversion of houses currently occupied and negotiated for by individuals as "Private Hirings" permitting their official acceptance and continued administration as "Australian Hirings" by HQ Aust Army Force, is pressing, to overcome cases of financial hardship being experienced, almost without exception, by the present tenants. This is a procedural financial matter and requires concurrence only. A full case has been submitted to AHQ.

Refrigeration 3 RAR TERENDAK

- 28. The 500 cu ft refrigerator provided by AUSTRALIA as a "go-it-alone" project for the battalion at TERENDAK, has been condemned by both Medical and Engineers. This equipment has been in service in CANBERRA Lines, TERENDAK only a little over two years yet must now be replaced.
- In addition one effect of INDONESIA's "confrontation" has been the substitution of deep frozen vegetables for fresh on UK Ration Scale No. 24 which forms the basis of rationing for 3 RAR. Without any deep freeze capacity combined with unserviceable refrigeration unacceptable losses of food has resulted.
- HQ FARELF have been examining this problem but it is felt that as 3 RAR is the only battalion involved, it can be solved only at AUSTRALIA's expense. (HQ NEW ZEALAND Army Force have provided deep freeze units as a "go-it-alone" for their unit being the only other one in FARELF on Ration scale No. 24.) A submission will be made to AHQ as a matter of urgency on this subject after completion of the current investigation by HQ FARELF.

Stores Accounting - AATTV

Difficulty is being experienced by both HQ Aust Army Force and AATTV in arranging for an adequate system of stores accounting. Initially, except for small quantities of clothing no stores were held. However, with the recent releases of wristlet watches, light weight accommodation equipment etc, and with increasing demands for maintenance issues it is obvious that some stores accounting procedur for the unit is necessary. Arrangements made for the issue of a storaccount number for AATTV in order that they become a self accounting unit now appears impractical as insufficient administrative staff exist on their establishment to cope with this added responsibility. This problem, it is felt, must be determined by AHQ. A submission will be made to AHQ after a Q Branch liaison officer visits VIETNAM later this month.

New Works - Construction of Office Block - HQ Aust Army Force.

32. HQ FARELF are currently studying our submission for the construction of headquarters and office accommodation for HQ Aust Army Force. This will conform in siting and style with the FARELF re-building plans in the TANGLIN area. The subject has been discussed with the Director of Quartering and plans, costs, timings etc will be forwarded to AHQ when known.

Works Programme - TERENDAK

33. The progress of construction of the Part 1 Works and current stage of the Part 2 and Part 3 Works Services at TERENDAK will be demonstrated to and discussed with the Director of Quartering during the current visit. A summary of these projects will be forwarded separately as a result of this visit



- 1. This Routine Order will be read in conjunction with MBI 16-1 and AHQ Adm Instr 3/58 and replaces HQ Aust Army Force Routine Order No 3 which is hereby cancelled.
- 2. Personnel may be returned to AUSTRALIA for any of the following reasons:
 - a. completion of overseas tour, or training attachment;
 - b. becoming medically unfit for service in the FAR EAST theatre;
 - c. for administrative reasons e.g. on compassionate grounds, on disciplinary grounds, for discharge etc.
- 3. A member who is to be returned to AUSTRALIA on completion of overseas tour will be relieved, unless an extension is approved, during the period 2 to $2\frac{1}{2}$ years after his arrival in MALAYA/SINGAPORE. A member's relief is usually demanded by HQ Aust Army Force before the 2 year period has elapsed but the reinforcement will not normally arrive before this time.
- 4. A period of six months is then available during which the reinforcement arrives and the relief takes place. Generally, the relief will occur in the first two months after the 2 years has elapsed, but the member being relieved cannot consider himself entitled to leave MALAYA/SINGAPORE under 2½ years.

Procedure for Personnel who RTA on completion of Tour of Duty

- One of this revised Form is attached as Annex 'A' to this Order.
- 6. Units will ensure that Parts 1 and 2 of the Form are completed and forwarded in duplicate to HQ Aust Army Force four months before a member completes 2 years of his overseas tour. Where a member wishes to remain for a period over 2 but less than 2½ years and the unit is agreeable, the reinforcement demand should specify the month during which the member desires to RTA and the relief should arrive. The Forms A6 are required to reach HQ Aust Army Force no later than the twenty eighth day of the relevant month.

Extension of Tour of Duty

7. Extension of a tour of duty relates to service in excess of $2\frac{1}{2}$ years in the FARELF area. There is no objection to an application for an extension of a tour of duty being made well before the $2\frac{1}{2}$ years has elapsed, in fact early application is desirable. A copy of this Application Form is attached as Annex 'B' to this Order.

8. It is not necessary for an application for an extension to be made when a member wishes to remain in the area for more than 2 but less than $2\frac{1}{2}$ years.

Procedure for Personnel who RTA as Medically Unfit for Service in MALAYA/SINGAPORE

- 9. Immediately a unit becomes aware that a member is to be returned to AUSTRALIA under unit arrangements for medical reasons it will:
 - a. in the case of a single/unaccompanied member;
 - (1) take administrative action to clear the member for movement to AUSTRALIA;
 - (2) complete and forward Form A6 to HQ Aust Army Force;
 - (3) advise AUSTARM SINGAPORE by signal of the date available to move.
 - b. In the case of a married/accompanied member:-
 - (1) take administrative action to clear the member and his family for return to AUSTRALIA;
 - (2) complete and forward Form A6 to HQ Aust Army Force;
 - (3) advise AUSTARM SINGAPORE by signal date available to move.
- 10. Where a member is to be returned to AUSTRALIA through medical channels the unit will advise AUSTARM SINGAPORE by signal the rank and trade/appointment of the replacement required.
- 11. Where a dependant has been medically boarded and found to be unfit to remain in MALAYA/SINGAPORE the following action will be taken:
 - a. Application for RTA of member and his family will be submitted to HQ Aust Army Force FARELF, through normal channels.
 - b. On receipt of approval for RTA, a unit will:-
 - (1) take administrative action to clear the member and his family for return to AUSTRALIA;
 - (2) complete and forward Form A6 to HQ Aust Army Force;
 - (3) advise AUSTARM SINGAPORE by signal of the date available to move and rank and trade/appointment of the replacement required.

PROVISION OF TRAINING INCREMENT REINFORCEMENT HOLDING UNIT - PLAN REFIT/RAMAH

Reference Australian Army Force 133/4/3 of 31 Jul 63.

- On the assumption that the whole of the Jungle Warfare School FARELF would close down if plan RAMAH were implemented, this Headquarters had previously planned to shadow post the Australian staff of Battle Wing to the staff of the Reinforcement Holding and Training Unit (Australian Component). This staff consists of one Captain and two Sergeants.
- At a recent conference at HQ FARELF it was decided that Battle Wing, Jungle Warfare School would remain open if plan RAMAH were implemented. This would enable the training of reinforcements for BORNEO to continue uninterrupted.
- As it is desirable that the staff of the Reinforcement Holding and Training Unit be in the Theatre when RAMAH is implemented there are now two alternatives for the provision of those personnel previously shadow posted from Battle Wing:
 - a. From 3 RAR rear party (to be replaced from AUSTRALIA with the implementation of plan REFIT).
 - b. To hold a Training Cell of one Major/Captain and two Sergeants surplus to 3 RAR establishment for immediate movement to Jungle Warfare School on mobilisation. Until mobilisation this Cell would assist 3 RAR in normal training activities and other Australian units from time to time for NCO courses etc.

Of these two alternatives the latter appears to be preferable, subject to AHQ approval.

Before this proposal can be submitted to AHQ your advice is requested on the following:-

- a. Whether the proposal is acceptable to 3 RAR.
- b. Whether such a Training Cell could be gainfully employed before mobilisation.
- c. Whether accommodation difficulties would arise.

REINFORCEMENTS - BORNEO OPERATIONS

Reference HQ Aust Army Force 22/1/16 of 26 Feb 64.

- 1. Unit moves to and within MALAYSIA for operations in BORNEO are:
 - a. HQ 51 Inf Bde Gp assumed command of Central Brigade Area with effect from 16 Feb 64.
 - b. 10 Flt AAC, equipped with Scout aircraft, will arrive, ex UK, in HMS BULWARK in late Mar 64 as a semi-permanent increase to the FAR EAST force levels and will remain in FARELF for the length of the present emergency. Initially the Flight will be stationed with 656 Sqn AAC at KLUANG.
 - c. 79 Cdo Bty RA will also arrive in SINGAPORE on HMS BULWARK.
 - d. HQ 29 Cdo RA will move by air to SINGAPORE in mid-Mar 64.
- Following the declaration of closure of air space over EASTERN MALAYSIA to unauthorised aircraft, a LAA Bty of 12 Regt RA is at 48 hours notice to move from TAMPIN to EASTERN MALAYSIA (KUCHING). A LAA regt and an infantry battalion are at 7 days notice in the UK to fly to EASTERN MALAYSIA.
