	1		To QUANG NGAI from DANANG. Visited 25th Division for briefing on DO XA operation, and Sector situation. QUANG NGAI Sector in bad shape. DO XA just starting. Several items of hardware; much VC fire at landing aircraft; no VC contact. Discussed operation with Generals TRI, THIEM, CHIEU, STILLWELL. General STILLWELL agreed to the placing of Maj MURPHY AATTV at NHA TRANG. Tried to fly into DO XA with a group of three HUEB's. Weathered out. Returned to SAIGON.		
	2		Briefed Lt. Col. MONAGHAN, Maj MURPHY on latter's move to NHA TRANG. First rain of the new wet season (apart from sprinkles) last night. Looks like an early wet. Small aircraft carrier MSTS "CARD" sunk at SAIGON wharf this morning early. Resting on bottom superstructure showing. VC sabotage. Probably recoverable, "CARD" is a helicopter ferry from the PHILIPPINES.

	5		Caribou crashed at TAN HIEP near MY THO. Whole complement of 15 dead. Apparently engine failure.		
	6		Discussed R & D personnel projects with Major MAXWELL up from SINGAPORE.		
	7		To BAN ME THOUT with visitor from Defence. Helio. Good progress has been made by Captain PETERSEN in organising the RHADS.

	8		Took Defence visitor for briefing at US Embassy. Discussed employment of Captain TEAGUE at QUANG NGAI with Mr. Ralph JOHNSON of US Embassy, who wants him down there more or less full time. Agreed so long as we hold the house in DANANG.		
	9		CAN and DONG executed today, in SAIGON and HUE respectively. VC attempted preparation of Cong Ly Bridge on road from SAIGON to TSN Airport discovered.

	11		General Maxwell TAYLOR arrives.		
	12		Secretary McNAMARA arrives. Conference with THOMPSON (BRIAM) on broadening scope of war by political action.		
	13		Farewell dinner for General and Mrs. TIMMES at Caravelle by MACV/MAAG staff. Rush of anti-KHANH posters by Buddhists in SAIGON. Secretary McNAMARA departs.		
	14		Senior Advisors conference, conducted by General WESTMORELAND. Much stress on additional items of equipment approved during Sec. of Def visit. Letter received from Paymaster-in-Chief on allowances and dollar expenditure. Places ceiling of \$US6500 monthly. This is halfway between their suggested \$5000 and our \$8000. Not enough. We will have to force this up.

	25		Completed proposals on AATTV program and despatched to CGS. Briefed Ambassador on AATTV proposals.		
	26		Captain BOILEAU rang to say DANANG house in jeopardy. Arranged for DE SILVA to signal telling them to hold it. Conferred with JG MACV on use of MATS space available for AATTV. Proceeding. Large Buddhists procession through SAIGON, 0730 to about 1000. Part of the week-long Buddha Birthday celebrations. Speeches by RUSK and STEVENSON indicate that US is aiming at broadening the war by political action.

GENERAL:

1. No change in the pattern of trends. The situation remains serious. Each weekend brings its crop of coup rumors, which never materialize, but are indicative.
2. VC pressure is intensifying around SAIGON, with significant VC troop movements away from the Southern Delta, which they now regards as theirs.
3. An interesting facet of their operations is the sharp increase in terrorism. This I read as consistant with their apparent desire to bring the war to a decision, (not to say completion) by 3 November 64.
4. Meanwhile, GVN initiated pressure is waning.

HEALTH:

5. Captain DE LA HUNTY, while accompanying a patrol from AN DIEM suffered an internal pain which caused his helicopter evacuation. After rest, he returned to duty.

MORALE:

6. Good.

7. The advice of the Military Secretary on the Decorations and Awards position has been noted with appreciation.

COMMENDATION:

8. I have observed with great satisfaction the outstanding work of the small group at DUC MY Ranger Training Centre, under the leadership of Major R.G. KENNEDY. Over the last twelve months, an increasing quantity and variety of tasks has been placed with this installation, which now handles simultaneously, the training of Ranger Battalions, Leaders (Jungle, Mountain, Swamp Course) and Recruits.

9. Major KENNEDY has been well supported by Captain IRVINE, whose work has earned my earlier commendation. Particular note should now be made of the work of WO D.C. DALTON, who has recorded a splendid sustained effort in his handling of the complex and physically arduous Jungle, Mountain, Swamp Course; and WO D.J. NAVILLE, who, first in Basic Ranger Training, and more recently in Unit Training, has put the stamp of his own personnel excellence on several thousand ARVN elite troops.

LOG OF INCIDENTS

Date	Location	Occurrence
2 May 64	AN DIEM	The AN DIEM patrol, which Capt DE LA HUNTY is accompanying as training advisor, engaged two VC platoons at 0650 hrs. Two Strike Force KIA and three WIA. An airstrike was requested through the overflight L-19 which was in the vicinity and four AD-6 fighters struck the VC areas with rockets and MG fire. The casualties were evacuated by USMC H-34 helicopters escorted by armed UH-1B's
5 May 64	AN DIEM	Our AN DIEM patrol suffered six Strike Force casualties in two separate fights. WIA were evacuated by USMC H-34 helicopters supported by armed UH-1B helicopters.

INFORMATION RECEIVED FOLLOWING SUBMISSION OF REPORT NO 21

On 18 Apr 64 Capt R. CLARK and WO1 G. CHINN were attached as observers to 32 Ranger Battalion. The battalion was taking part in an operation in the BALONG Area. On 28 Apr 64 the losses suffered by the enemy included the following: Ten KIA, 50 ha of Manioc and corn, 3 ha of crops, 2,000 kilos of corn, 3,000 kilos of rice, 2,000 kilos of manioc, 2,000 kilos of paddy, 17 buffalo, 32 houses, 10 huts, 1,000 bamboo spikes, flags, carbine magazines with ammo, and a number of documents.
