Thence to DA NANG VIP C123. Discussed officer position enroute. Lunch at US SF B Team, where most DA NANG centered AATTV were assembled. AG announced that a new British GSM was about to be issued, in which AATTV would share. To HUE where we looked over DONG DA. AG spoke to assembled AATTV personnel, giving them the latest Australian developments. Much appreciated. Captain TEAGUE reports situation in QUANG NGAI very bad - a large VC attack on town is planned for mid-month. AG stated that prior to the death of WO CONWAY Defence simply could not understand that AATTV personnel were in any physical danger, because they are "advisors". I wonder what they think the 200+ dead Americans were in, if it wasn't danger. AG visited Gen THI (Comd 1 Div) at HUE and Lt Col THU (Province Chief). Dinner with THI/THU and some province officials.	
	3		Inspected training at DONG DA. Quite good. Weather OK. No battalions in as yet.

GENERAL

1. Militarily the deterioration of the GVN position, noted earlier continues, with a sustained high VC incident rate, and little evidence of GVN success in any field.

2. Politically the month has been used to attempt the formation of a new government. This was achieved in the closing days of the month, and immediately came under attack from dissatisfied elements. We wish it well, and hope for its stability.

WELL BEING

3. Severe flooding in I Corps area has made living and working conditions difficult, but AATTV is well equipped to cope.

4. It will have been noted, from separate reports, that occasional domestic problems of compassionate nature are arising. This was to be expected with the increase in numbers, but the nature of one or two of these suggests that unit COs should be asked to check a man's domestic circumstances in some detail (in particular pregnancies and the financial basis of his wife's maintenance) before he comes to AATTV.

PAY

5. The dispersed deployment of battalion and sector advisory personnel has called for a new approach to the method of paying. Following a most helpful visit by Capt YEEND, pay representative from Austarm Singapore. I have proposed to Paymaster-in-Chief that authority be given to establish dollar piastre holdings at DONG DA and DA NANG to enable members to draw pay as needed when they return from operations. A fixed pay day is no longer workable.

HEALTH

6. WO SIMPSON, with the co-operation of the US Authorities, and the approval of the Adjutant General, has been moved to Japan for convalescence from his leg wound. All AATTV members appreciate the generosity of COMUSMACV in this matter, and the appropriate response of AHQ.
7. WO YOUNG, with intestinal bleeding, has made an emergency evacuation to CLARK AFB Hospital. We await word on the necessity to operate. His condition is good.
8. GENERAL. Several cases of gastric troubles, common to new arrivals have been reported among the increment. Worms are reported among battalion advisors living under field conditions. Appropriate action is in hand.
9. HEPATITIS. All MACV personnel are programmed to receive a prophylactic injection of heamaglobin against hepatitis.

MORALE

10. Excellent. Increased activity in the I Corps area is to everyone's taste.
11. Advice on AATTV participation in the new scale of allowances has not yet come to hand.
12. The Adjutant-General's visit was greatly appreciated not least the care and trouble he took to brief the team on current and likely future developments etc. the close personal interest he displayed in occasional matters of individual concern, and rapid results therefrom.

SECURITY

13. DONG DA. Active situation. The Centre despatches trainees with tanks to assist hamlets during day and night attacks.
14. DUC MY. VC small unit activities on the outskirts of NINH HOA and NHA TRANG continues.
15. SPECIAL FORCE CAMPS. TA KO, A RO, ASHAU report frequent harassing fire. KHE SANH airfield occasionally harassed. Patrolling has improved, but is not yet satisfactory.
16. BATTALIONS No problem.
17. SECTORS. The concept of deploying AATTV personnel with Districts in I Corps area (two per Sector) is temporarily bogged down. In the selected areas some districts are no longer in GVN hands. Meanwhile, they are making a very effective contribution as members of the Sector staff. They will be deployed to Districts as soon as the situation makes this practicable.

COMMENDATION

18. WO PATCH, attached QUANG TRI sector, has made on outstanding effort in moving the exposed AN DONG Popular Forces Training Centre to DONG HA, and re-establishing it, under great difficulties at the new site. He is at present engaged on planning and securing the defence of CUA village.
19. WO PENMAN, of 2/2 Regt has taken a leading part in recent successful operations of this battalion. His award by GVN of Cross of Gallantry has been reported separately.
20. WO G.D. HARRIS. of LONG THO Popular Forces Training Centre. This recently moved centre, complete with a maze of VN training and administrative difficulties, is being ably and competently handled by W.O. HARRIS.
21. WO HUSBAND has most successfully completed his assignment as Training Advisor (Weapons Committee) at DONG DA. He is now active with 2/5 Regt.

ATTACHMENTS.

22. WO CERDA-PAVIA of DONG DA was attached to 2/1 Regt for Operation LAM SON 131, period 11-28 Oct, QUANG TRI area.
23. WO CHERRY of QUANG TRI Sector was attached for the same operation.
24. WO SIGG was attached to 3/1 Regt over period of 18 Sep-1 Oct for a "search and destroy" operation on QUANG TRI coast.
25. WO PATCH of QUANG TRI Sector, was attached to 1/1 Regt for the same operation.


ROTATION: Most US SF teams in I Corps area in the process of

CONCLUSION

34. The month's most sensational event occurred half an hour after  
the close of the reporting period-the mortar attack on BIEN HOA airfield.  
This, while serious in its personal and material effects, and in its psy-  
chological impact, does not reveal any unexpected capability on the part  
of the VC. They could have done it any time over the last several months.  
The worry is that it may further frighten GVN into a more static defensive  
position.
