

715. STAND DOWN

(a) Weapons

Each company draft proceeding on stand-down will have their weapons inspected by the OC leave draft prior to departure from KUALA KANGSAR, and OC's leave drafts will inspect weapons immediately before they are handed in to the arms kote at BUTTERWORTH to ensure that they are safe and clean.

(b) Customs

Members proceeding on stand-down to PENANG are warned against trying to push past the customs officers after leaving PENANG. This can result in a summary fine of \$600. Any articles liable for duty (eg cameras) can be registered at PRAI before crossing to PENANG so as to avoid any duty payments on the return trip. Duty on most articles is approximately 20% of the purchase price; duty on liquor is approximately 50-60% of the purchase price.

716. FIXED MILITARY HOLIDAYS - CHRISTMAS 1957

1. The afternoon of 24 Dec 57 will be observed as a holiday, in addition to the days notified in GRO 572/56. The official Christmas Holiday 1957 will therefore be:-

717. EXTRACTS OF 3 PAR STANDING ORDERS FOR MALAYA

SECURITY OF ARMS AND AMMUNITION PARAS 10, 12, 42 and 46 (to be repeated in RO's Pt I monthly)

INDIVIDUAL RESPONSIBILITY FOR SAFE CUSTODY OF ARMS AND AMMUNITION

10. Arms and ammunition, once withdrawn from unit or sub-unit central custody (e.g. arms kote, armoury or Q Store) become the personal responsibility of the individual to whom they are issued from such central custody, until properly returned.

12. Whilst in individual custody (VIDE PARA 10) weapons and ammunition will never be left unattended at any time, i.e. they will either be carried by the individual or otherwise left continuously in his sight at a range of NOT more than 6 feet. Immediate and severe disciplinary action will be taken for breaches of this order, and officers and NCO's will constantly be alert to detect offenders. Particular attention will be given during daily barrack room inspection to ensure that the arms and ammunition are not left lying about.

BARRACK ROOM LAYOUT

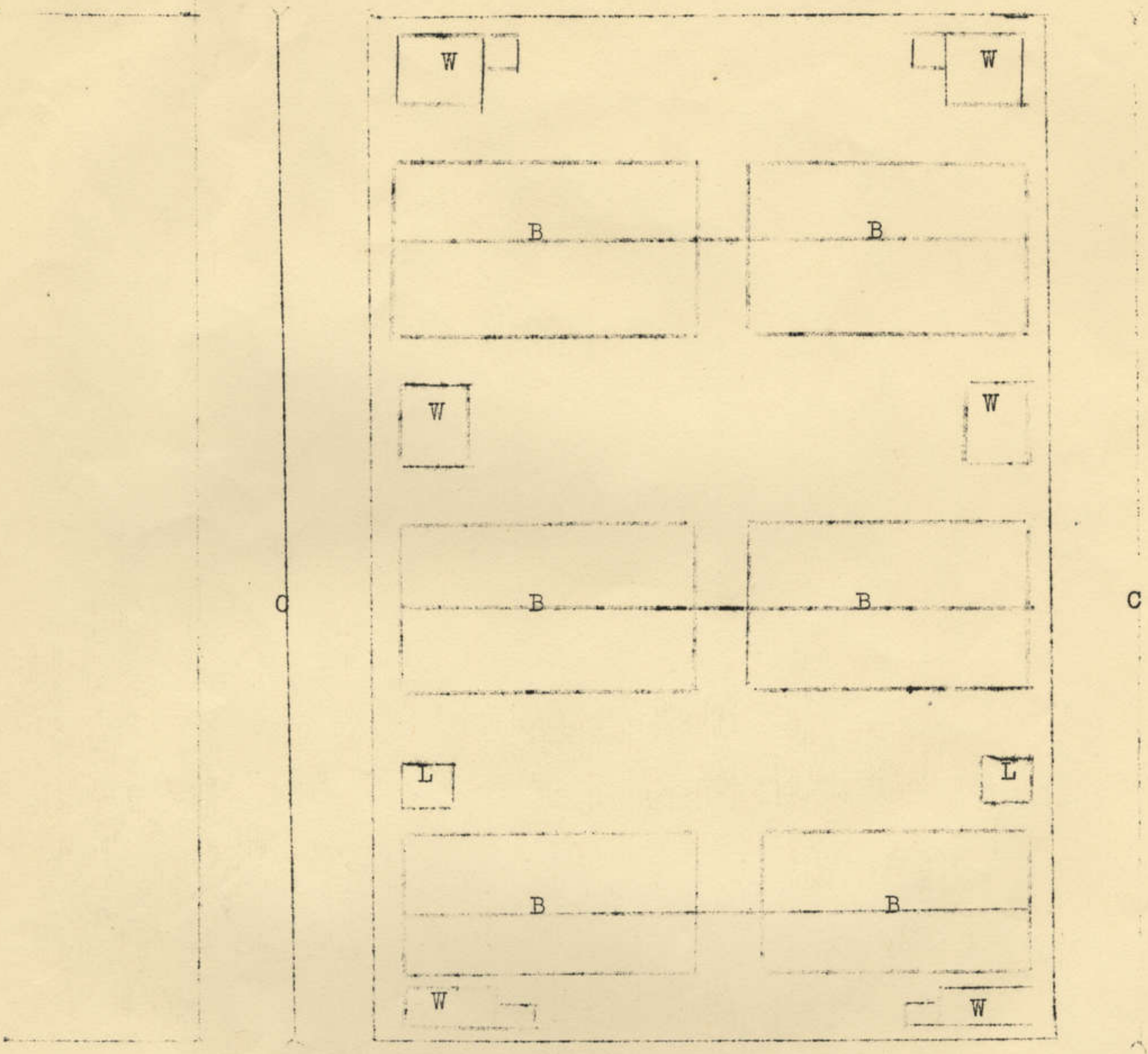

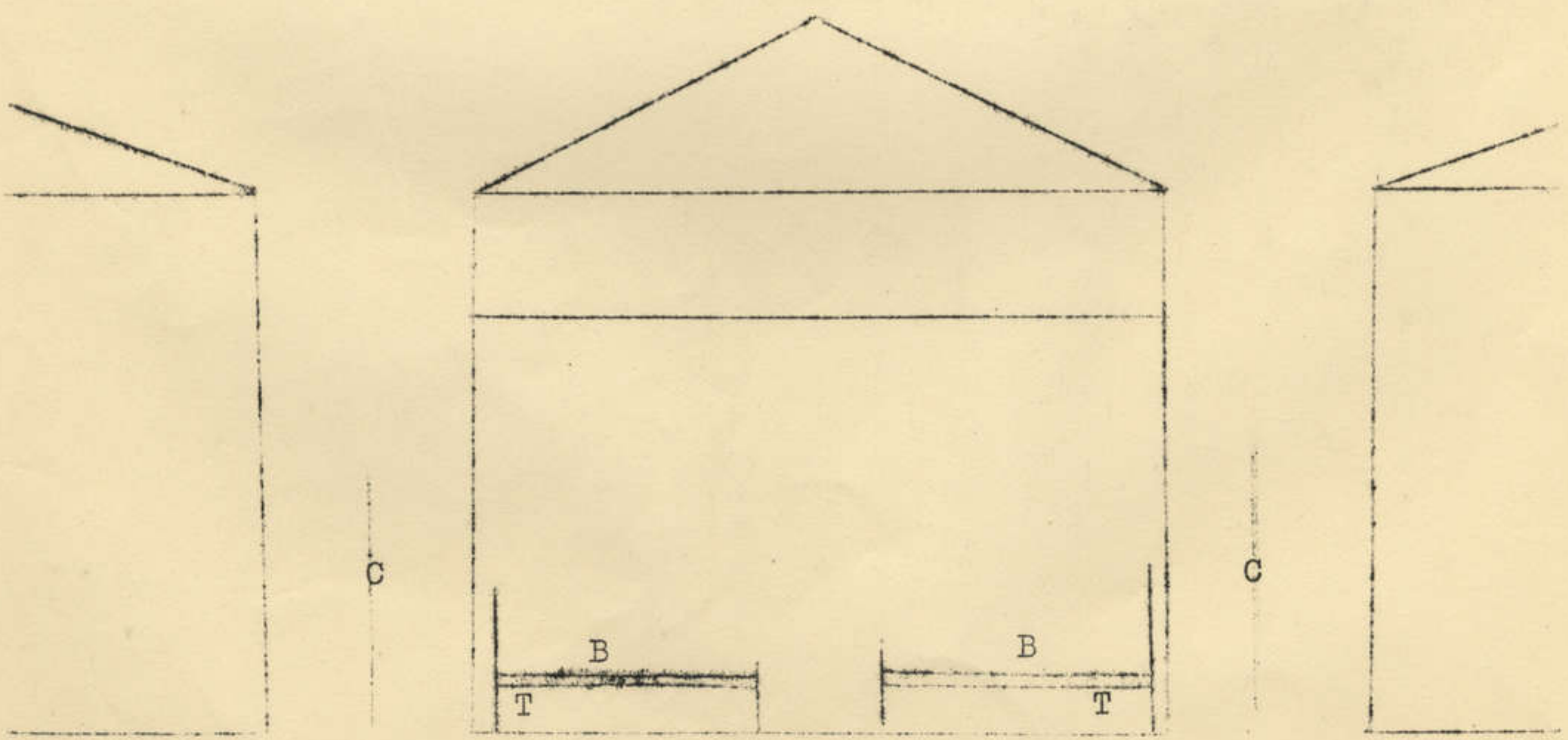

Standing Orders



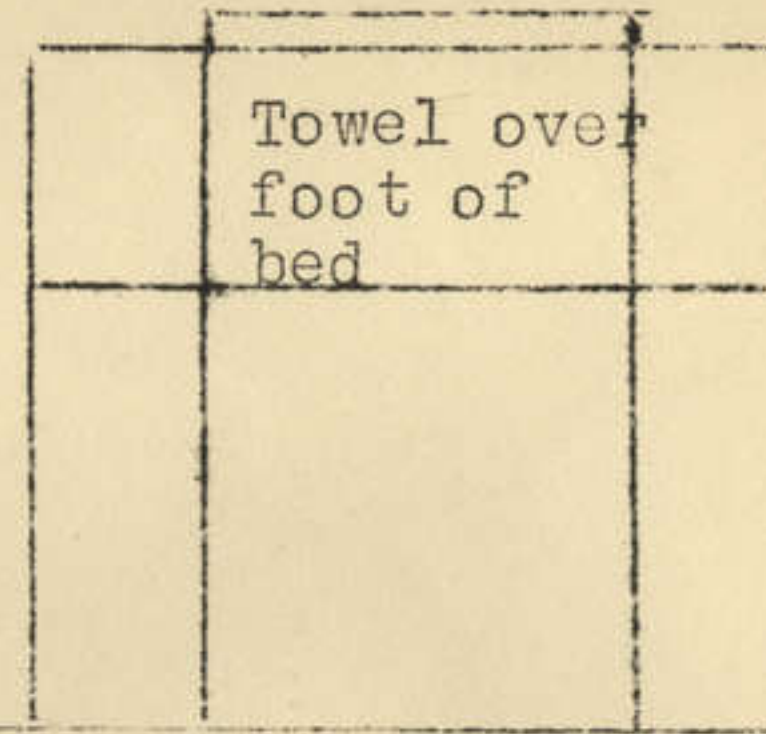
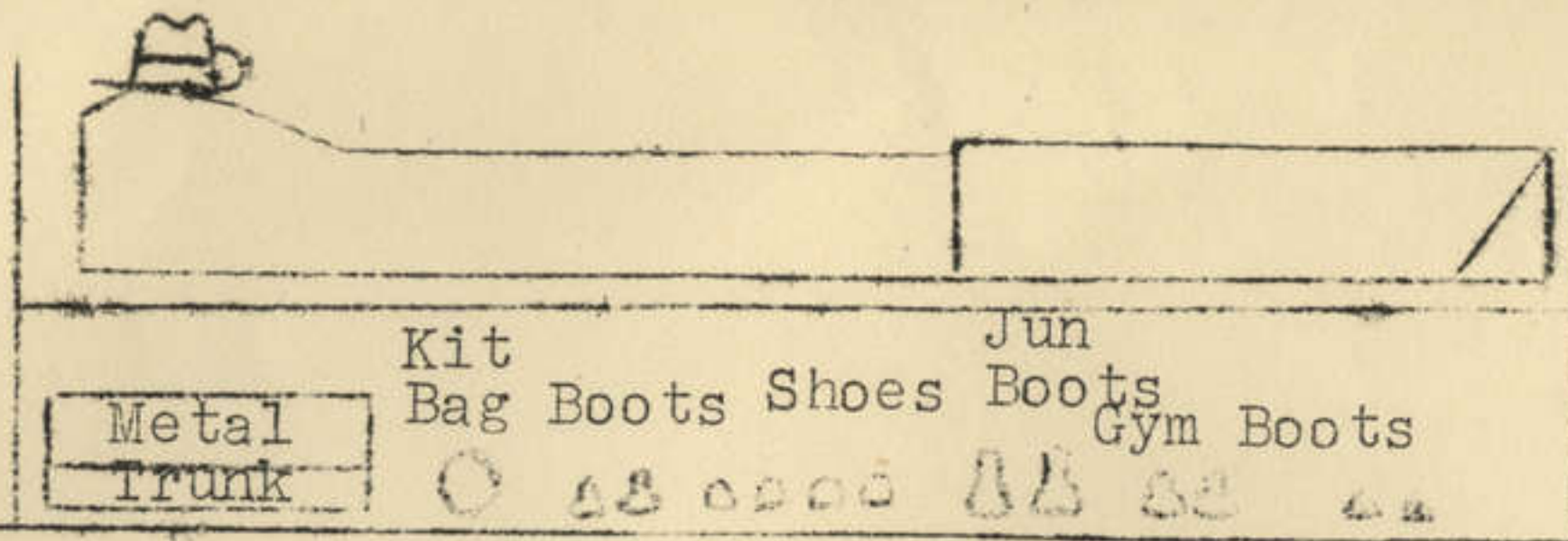
PLAN VIEW



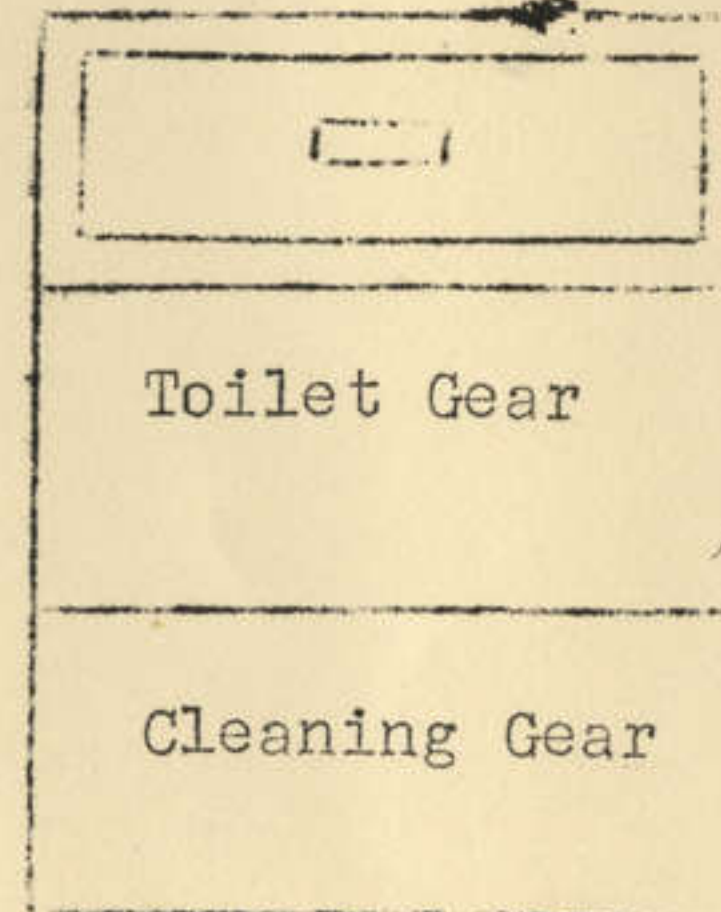
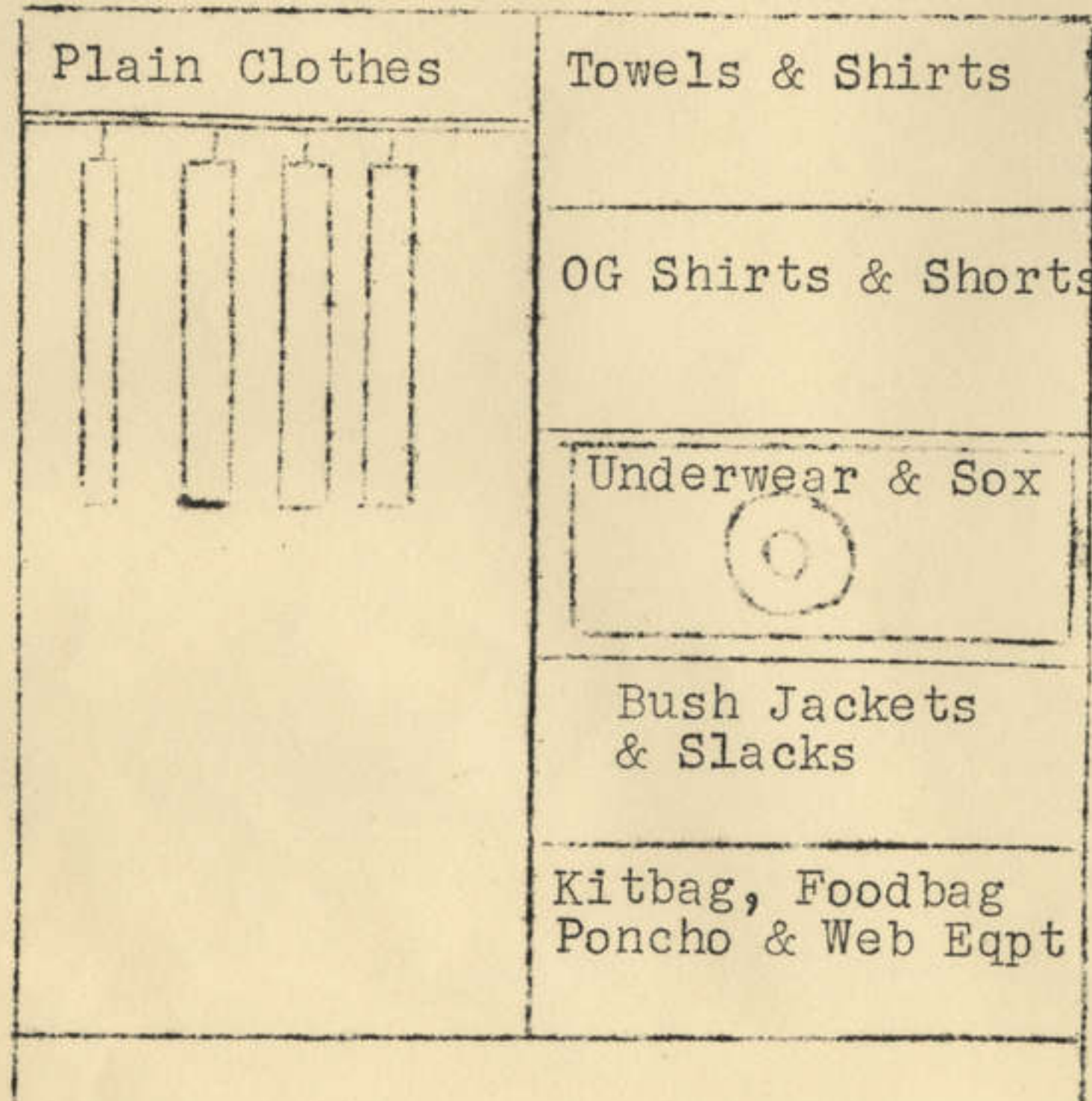
ELEVATION VIEW

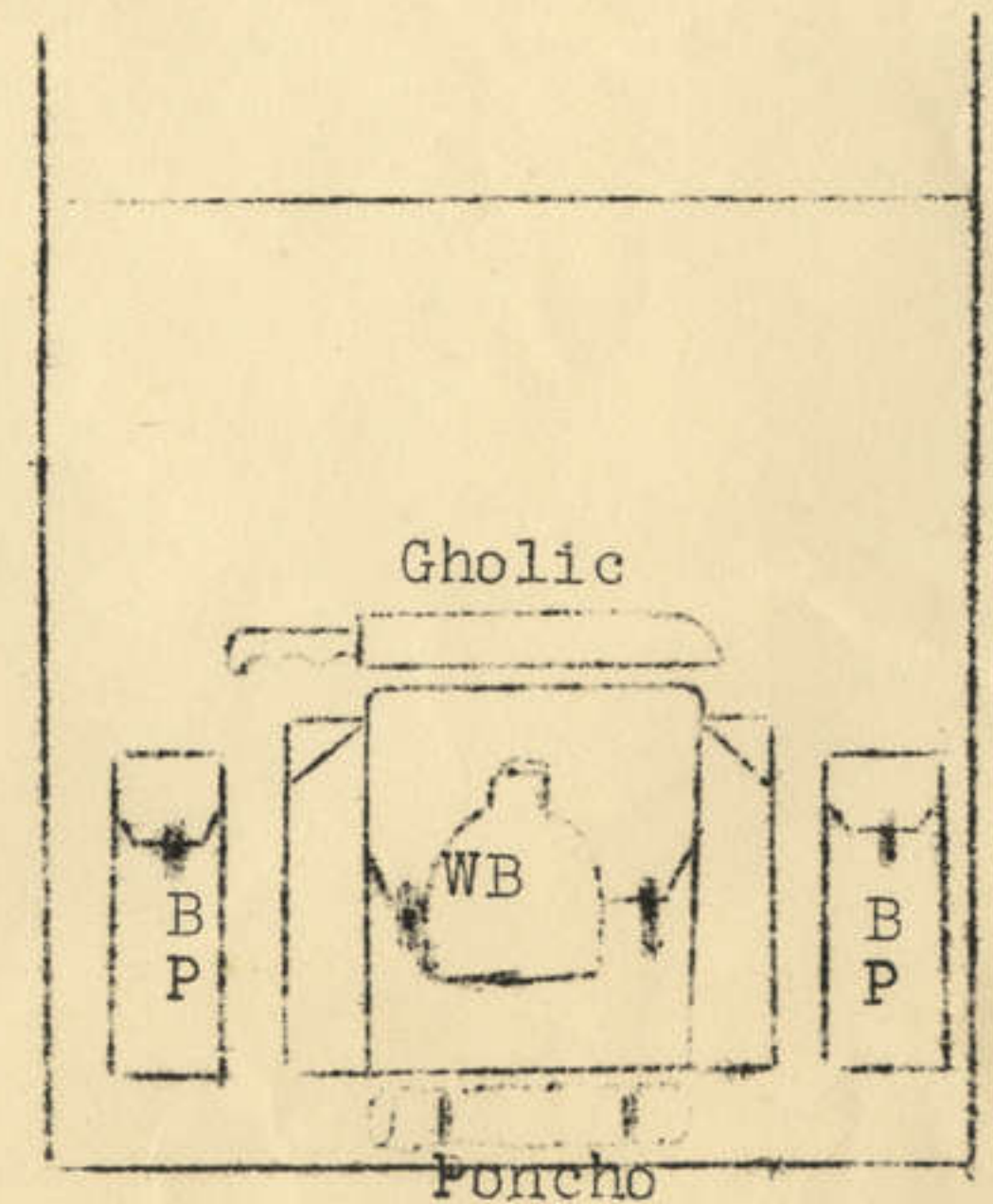

709. CIVIL DEBTS (QM/5)

1. A member shall not, without just cause or excuse, refuse or fail to pay on demand any debt lawfully due and owing by him to a civilian in MALAYA/SINGAPORE.

3. In addition, members are warned that the Army can NOT and will NOT assist members to pay their civil debts.





697. CUSTODY OF ARMS AND AMMUNITION - SAFE HANDLING WHEN TRAVELLING BY ROAD AND RAIL IN MALAYA

1. GENERAL

- (a) Once arms and ammunition are issued they become the personal responsibility of the individual. Losses are normally Court Martial offences.
- (b) Unless in an arms kote or equivalent, weapons or ammunition will NOT be left unattended at any time.
- (c) Personnel sleeping with their arms will ensure that weapons are securely attached to their person by the sling, lanyard, etc.
- (d) All personnel travelling by road or rail from PENANG will be issued with 10 rounds of ammunition.

2. DEGREE OF READINESS

3 RAR SOs give details for all weapons in common use on their safe handling under three separate conditions or degrees of readiness. These are NORMAL, ALERT and DANGER, and the degree of readiness necessary will be decided by the senior rank present. Study the detail for the particular weapon or weapons which you handle.

3. LOADING OF WEAPONS

(a) Travelling by Road

(i) In White Areas and on Unrestricted Roads

Weapons and ammunition will NOT normally be carried except when in transit out of such an area or to a road with a lower degree of safety classification. If so carried the degree of readiness will be NORMAL and armed drivers will NOT travel alone. This is to prevent the weapon being stolen if the driver is injured in an accident.

(ii) On White Roads - Degree of Readiness: NORMAL

Arms and ammunition will be carried when travelling in military vehicles, whether or not on duty, and in civilian vehicles on duty. There will always be an armed man in addition to the driver.

(iii) On Black Roads - Degree of Readiness: ALERT

Arms and ammunition will be carried under the same conditions as for white roads. Weapons will be at ALERT except for vehicle sentries who may be, at the discretion of the convoy or vehicle commander, at DANGER.

(iv) Town Board Limits

When in transit through such limits the degree of readiness dictated by the road on which the town is situated will NOT be changed. On arrival at a town at the conclusion of a journey, or on arrival at a unit, the vehicle will be halted and weapons unloaded and inspected by the senior rank.

(b) Travelling by Rail

Before entraining magazines will be charged under supervision. On NO ACCOUNT WILL A ROUND BE PLACED IN THE BREECH. Weapons will be unloaded under supervision immediately on detraining.

4. FIRING OF WEAPONS(a) Travelling by Rail

Weapons will only be fired on the orders of an officer, WO or NCO.

(b) Travelling by Road

Each vehicle will have a vehicle commander appointed. Each vehicle commander will appoint two sentries who will be alert at all times. If the vehicle is ambushed the driver will attempt to drive through the ambush and sentries will open fire. When clear of the ambush, or as soon as practicable, the remainder of the troops will debus under the covering fire of the sentries. When all other troops are clear of the vehicle the sentries will debus. The vehicle commander will then counter attack the CT ambush position from flank and rear.

698. TAKING OF PALUDRINE

1. There has been a marked increase in the incident rate of malaria among units of the Bde/NMSD. In nearly all cases soldiers contracting malaria have admitted that they took Paludrine at irregular intervals or not at all.
2. Company Commanders are personally responsible for ensuring that all men take Paludrine daily, and wherever possible on a parade.



3. All ranks must pay strict attention to personal protection against the bites of mosquitoes and mites.
4. These are avoided by:-
 - (a) Sleeping under mosquito nets at night.
 - (b) The use of mosquito repellent (DMP) on exposed skin surfaces after dusk and during the night.
 - (c) The use of miticide (DBP), impregnated into clothing worn during jungle operations.
 - (d) The use of Knockdown spray (aerosol dispensers) in living quarters, particularly at dusk and dawn.
5. Mites responsible for the spread of diseases such as **SCRUB TYPHUS** commonly live on rodents which thrive in secondary scrub and lallang. Destruction of rodents and removal of scrub and lallang in the neighbourhood of camps will also assist in the control of mite borne disease.

/6. The taking

6. The taking of PALUDRINE daily for the suppression of MALARIA must never be relaxed in MALAYA.

1. A - Post Graduate Scholarships - 1958

The Trustees of the Services Canteens Trust Fund are inviting applications for two post graduate scholarships, one for study overseas and the other for study at an AUSTRALIAN University.

The fields of study in which the scholarships may be awarded are:-

(a) For study overseas

- (i) Any course at any approved University throughout the world;
- (ii) Aeronautics in ENGLAND and AMERICA;
- (iii) Travelling scholarship in any field;

An applicant wishing to pursue any other branch of study may apply to the Trustees for a scholarship in that field.

The Scholarship is open to a child (including step-child, adopted or ex-nuptial child) of a person who was at any time between 3rd September, 1939 and 30th June, 1947:-

- (a) a member of the Naval, Military or Air Forces of the Commonwealth.
- (b) a member of any nursing service or women's service attached or auxiliary to any branch of the Defence Force of the Commonwealth; including
- (c) members of the Canteens Staff of any ship of the Royal Australian Navy, and any person duly accredited to any part of the Defence Force who served in an official capacity on full time paid duty.

Selection

Selection will be entirely on merit and will be competitive. A scholarship will be granted only to an applicant who, in the opinion of the Trustees, has outstanding ability, is of suitable character and is likely to obtain lasting benefit to himself or herself and to AUSTRALIA by further study. The scholarships will not necessarily be awarded each year.

The following will be taken into consideration in determining the award of the scholarship:-

- (i) Academic career.
- (ii) Ability for research work.
- (iii) Character.
- (iv) The future value to AUSTRALIA of the subject of research selected.

The selection each year of the scholars to be awarded the scholarships will be made from all applications received from eligible persons by the prescribed closing dates.

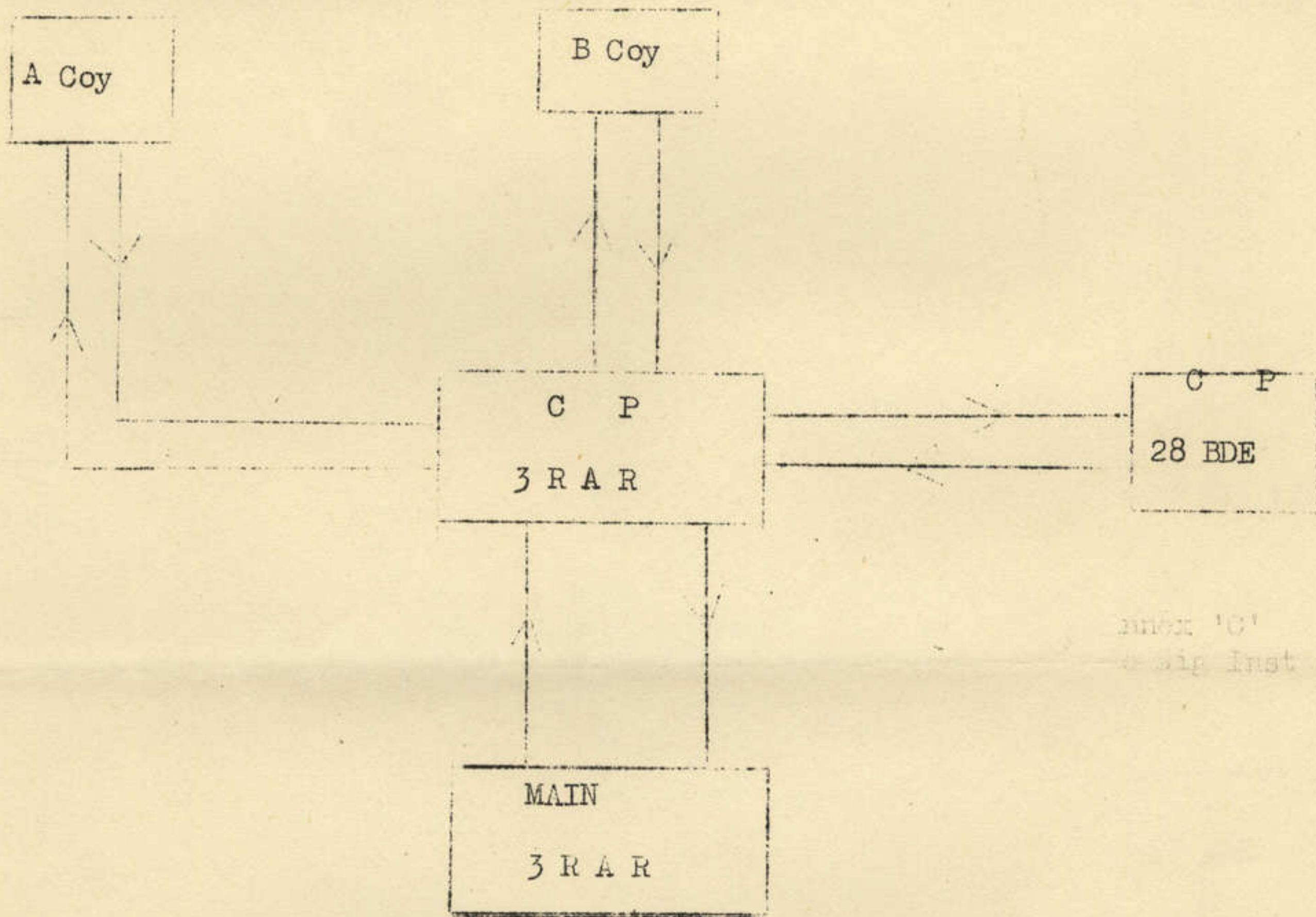
