

The Battalion Orderly Sergeant will be responsible for the discipline of the draft and will check the draft prior to leaving for dress and sobriety. He will report any deficiencies in members to the Battalion Orderly Officer, who will then check with companies, and if necessary, amend the railway warrant.

DISCIPLINE - MAX SPEED OF VEHICLES 56.

Attention is again drawn to 2 RAR Routine Order No 236/56. The laid down maximum speed for all vehicles will not be exceeded.

CIVILIAN VISITORS 57.

- 1. Civilian visitors to any camp occupied by elements of 2 RAR will always have credentials checked either by guards at entrances, or at orderly rooms after being escorted there by guards. The check will include obtaining particulars of name, status, purpose of visit, and sighting ID card and/or camp pass. A visitor at night will always be escorted to the member or office he wishes to visit. By day it will be sufficient for any visitor whose status and credentials are beyond suspicion to be given clear directions as to how to find the person or office he wishes to visit. When in doubt an escort will be provided.
- 2. Visitors' particulars vide para 1 will be recorded at either guard rooms at entrances, or at orderly rooms.
- 3. It is the duty of all ranks to question unescorted civilian visitors to 2 RAR lines at night, and if necessary to escort them to the guard room for checking, or to the person they wish to wisit. Discretion, commonsense and politness will always be exercised - but vigilance and security consciousness are even more important. asis od Tilw spivros spounijmos Lia . E

SECURITY OF EQUIPMENTS USED ON OPERATIONS 58.

1. Patrol or operation commanders will ensure, during the immediate pre-operation inspections of their parties, that all equip-

- 58. Continued ments are adequately secured, not only to prevent noise, but to prevent loss.
 - 2. Loss of any equipment through failure to secure it to the person will result in disciplinary action.
 - 3. Specifically this includes the securing to the person, compasses, binoculars, watches, whistles etc by means of lanyard, strap or other strong cord.

59. AUSTRALIAN HOSTEL - DEDUCTION FOR FOOD

- 101. It has been announced that with effect from 1 Dec 56, members living in the AUSTRALIAN HOSTEL will be obliged to pay an additional sevenpence per day for food.
 - 2. Accordingly, members affected by this increase are advised to retain sufficient credit in their paybooks to meet the back payment, pending receipt of instructions from the relative Command Paymasters to increase the allotments for Hostel charges.

60. TRAINING - 3.5 in ROCKET LAUNCHER

- 1. Reports from Touring Teams of the Small Arms Wing, School of Infantry show that 3.5-inch Practice Rockets are sometimes being misused in a dangerous manner.
- 2. The Practice Rocket must NOT be used for drill purposes. This rocket, which has a blue head and a green tail, has the same performance as a HE AT rocket except that it does not explode on impact. It is provided for firing practice on a practice firing range.
- 3. The Drill Rocket is the only type which will be used for drill purposes. This rocket is painted black with the word "DRILL" stencilled on the head in white.
- 4. The attention of companies holding 3.5-inch Rocket Launchers is drawn to the above.

61. DRESS - TRAVEL IN RAF AIRCRAFT

- 1. The correct form of dress for Officers and Other Ranks travelling in RAF transport type aircraft such as Valettas, or Pembrokes, is long trousers, long sleeved shirts or bush jackets with sleeves rolled down. If travelling in operational aircraft, such as Pioneers and Helicopters off L of C routes, the same form of dress will be worn with jungle boots.
- 2. Passengers who present themselves incorrectly dressed will NOT be allowed to travel.

62. DISCIPLINE - DRESS

- 1. Headdress will always be worn with uniform by tps when out of doors, and particularly when out of bks or camp.
- 2. It has been noticed that soldiers frequently remove their head-dress whilst in uniform and driving pte cars. This practice will cease forthwith.

63. GOOD CONDUCT INCREMENTS

- 1. In order that our memo 150/1 of 4 Mar 57 receives the widest promulgation, a few of the salient points on Good Conduct Increments are reproduced below.
- 2. Male members below the rank of Sergeant will receive Good Conduct Increments as follows:
 - (a) After 5 years service with very good conduct 6d. per day.
 - (b) After 10 years service with very good conduct an additional 6d. making a total of 1/- per day.
- 3. All continuous service will be classed as very good for the purpose of good conduct increments if the member during the period in respect of which his conduct is being examined for grant of a good conduct increment has not been sentenced by a court martial or a civil court to any of the following punishments or awarded

63. Continued any such punishment by a competent military authority, viz:

(a) Penal servitude;

(b) Imprisonment for 7 days or more;

(c) An aggregate of more than 14 days detention or field punishment; (for service prior to 15 May 1952 the aggregate shall be read as 28 days. The amendment to 14 days is effective from 15 May 1952.)

(d) Reduction in permanent rank or to the ranks or reversion

or reduction to permanent rank;

(e) Aggregate penalties of more than £5 imposed by way of fines, forfeitures of pay or deductions from pay other than automatic forfeitures of pay and fines or deductions imposed to make good any loss, damage or destruction.

4. Where there is a break in service all previous continuous service on full time duty shall count in accordance with the provisions of para 3 above, but only a maximum of 4 years continuous fulltime paid service in another arm of the Australian Services or in the UK or other dominion forces is admissable.

- 5. Any member with previous continuous service may apply to count any such "very good service" for good conduct increments on an "Application to Count Previous Service for Good Conduct Increment."
- 6. Good Conduct Increments are due on the day following the completion of the five year period concerned, but are subject to verification by CARO. Pay book entries will be made only from promulgation in Routine Orders Part II.

- 69. EXTRACTS FROM 2 RAR STANDING ORDERS FOR MALAYA NO 2 SECURITY OF ARMS AND AMMUNITION
 - 1. Attention is directed to 2 RAR Standing Orders for MALAYA No 2-SECURITY OF ARMS AND AMMUNITION, paragraphs 10, 12, 43 and 47, reproduced below:
 - (a) Arms and ammunition, once withdrawn from unit or sub-unit central custody (eg. arms kote, armoury or Q store) become the personal responsibility of the individual to whom they are issued from such central custody, until properly returned.
 - (b) Whilst in individual custody (vide para 10) weapons and ammunition will never be left unattended at any time, ie. they will either be carried by the individual, or otherwise kept continuously in his sight at a range of not more than 6 feet. Immediate and severe disciplinary action will be taken for breaches of this order, and officers and NCOs will constantly be alert to detect offenders. Particular attention will be given during daily barrack room inspections to ensuring that arms and ammunition are not left lying about.
 - (c) Any member of 2 RAR discovering the loss of arms and/or ammunition on issue to him or to any other member or sub-unit, will immediately report the loss by the quickest means to his Company Headquarters.
 - (d) An individual who is responsible for the loss, through negligence, of arms will normally be tried by Court Martial. Loss of ammunition is a less serious offence, provided an immediate report is made. The most stringent action will be taken where unreported losses are subsequently discovered.

NO.5 - DISCIPLINE: POWERS OF PUNISHMENT ON ACTIVE SERVICE AUSTRALIAN UNITS

1. The following is an abstract of powers of punishment (Australian units only) on active service (AMR & O 418; AA 46, and AMR & O 423). It is to be noted that this abstract refers to powers of punishment only which are derived basically from AMR & O 418 and AA 46 which on Active Service, operate concurrently. The actual charges must on active service be laid under the Relevant Sections of the Army Act and NOT under AMR & O.

POWERS OF COMMANDING OFFICER (See AMR & 0 4; AMR & 0 389; RP 129 for definitions).

- 2. Unless limited under AMR & 0 394 a CO may award the following summary and minor punishments.
- 3. SUMMARY PUNISHMENTS (Accused must be given right to elect trial by Court Martial before award is made).
 - (a) NCOs (includes LCpls)
 - (i) SSgts and under

 Reduction or reversion to permanent rank. (AMR & O 418(2) (da)). See notes (J), (M), below.
 - (ii) Cpls and ICpls

 Reduction to the ranks. (AMR & O 418(2)(da)(ii)). See note (M) below.
 - (b) PRIVATE SOLDIERS
 - (i) <u>Detention NOT exceeding 28 days</u>. (AMR & O 418(2)(a)(i)). See notes (A), (G), (I), (K), (M), below.
 - (ii) Field Punishment NOT exceeding 28 days. (AMR & O 418(2) (b)(i)). See notes (B), (C), (G), (M), below.
 - (iii) Forfeiture of all ordinary pay NOT exceeding 28 days. (AMR & O 418(a)(b)(ii)). See notes (C), (G), (M), below.
 - (iv) Fine NOT exceeding £5. (AMR & 0 418(2)(e)). See notes (D), (G), (M), below.
 - (v) Deduction to make good compensation for expense, loss, damage or destruction up to £5. (AMR & O 418(2)(g); AA 138(4)). See notes (E), (F), (G), (H), (M), below.
 - (vi) Deduction to make good loss of or damage or destruction done to arms, ammunition, equipment, clothing, instruments or regimental necessaries on issue to him NOT exceeding £20. (AMR & O 418(2)(g)). See notes (F), (G), (M), below.

- (vii) Any punishment involving automatic forfeiture greater than £3. See notes (L), (M), (O), below.
- (viii) Any conjoint awards of minor punishments other than those specifically permitted as minor punishments under AMR & 0 418(7)(b)(i). (AA 46(2)(e)). See notes (M),(P), below.

NOTES.

- (A) Detention involves automatic forfeiture of pay for each day of detention. (DA 119; see also AMR & 0 490).
- (B) Field Punishment (unless soldier is in custody) does NOT involve forfeiture of pay. (AMR & 0 490(1)(g)).
- (C) Field Punishment and forfeiture of pay may be awarded conjointly. (AMR & 0 418(6)).
- (D) Fine may be awarded conjointly with any other punishment(s). (AMR & O 418(7)(b)(i)).
- (E) Deduction to make good compensation for expense, loss, damage or destruction up to £5 may be awarded conjointly with any other punishment(s). (AMR & O 418(7)(a)).
- (F) Deduction to make good the loss of, damage or destruction to arms etc above £5 can NOT be awarded conjointly with any other punishment. (AMR & O 418(7)).
- (G) Punishments 3(b)(i) (iv) above may be awarded conjointly with each other and deduction up to £5. (AMR & 0 418(7)(b)).
- (H) Punishment 3(b)(vi) above in excess of £5 can NOT be awarded to an NCO. Deduction up to £5 is a minor punishment for an NCO. (AMR & C 418(5)(da)).
- (I) Where detention exceeding 7 days is awarded the only other minor punishments which can be added are fine and deduction. This does NOT prohibit allowable combinations of Summary punishments. (AMR & O 418(8)).
- (J) Reduction to permanent rank means to that rank only. It does NOT include reduction to intermediate ranks. Thus if a Pte, (T/Sgt) is convicted, he cannot be reduced to a Cpl. He must first be reduced to a Pte and then later promoted to Cpl. This does NOT apply to administrative reduction under AMR & O 223.
- (K) Detention up to 7 days should be awarded in hours. (AMR & 0 421).
- (L) If any deduction of greater than £3 whether automatic (eg.AWOL) or by way of punishment is incurred it can NOT be the subject of a minor award.
- (M) The award of any of the above summary punishments entails automatic forfeiture of pay as follows:-
 - (i) NCOs for each day in close or open arrest or under suspension unless ordered to perform duties other than those consequential on the charge.
 - (ii) Private soldiers for each day in close arrest unless ordered to perform duties other than those consequential on the charge. (DA 119; AMR & 0 490(1)(b)(c)(e)).
- 4. MINOR PUNISHMENTS (Accused may NOT have right to trial by Court Martial before award is made).
 - (a) NCOs (includes LCpls)
 - (i) Severe reprimand (AMR & O 418(5)(d)). See notes (N), (P), below.

- (ii) Reprimand (AMR & 0 418(5)(d)). See notes (N), (P), below.
- (iii) Admonition (AMR & O 418(5)(e)). See notes (N), (P), below.
 - (iv) Deduction to make good compensation for expense, loss, damage or destruction up to £5. (AMR & O 418(5)(da); AA 138(4)). See notes (N),(O),(P), below.

(b) PRIVATE SOLDIERS

- (i) CB up to 14 days. (AMR & 0 418(5)(a)). See notes below.
- (ii) Fine NOT exceeding £3. (AMR & O 418(5)(aa)). See notes below.
- (iii) Extra guards and picquets for minor irregularities when on or parading for a guard or picquet. (AMR & O 418(5)(c)). See notes below.
- (iv) Deduction to make good compensation for expense, loss, damage or destruction NOT exceeding £3. (AMR & O 418(5) (aa); AA 138(4)). See notes below.
 - (v) Admonition (AMR & 0 418(5)(e)). See notes below.

NOTES

- (N) Minor punishment 4(a)(iv) with 4(a)(i), (ii), or (iii) and 4(b) (i) (iv) above may be awarded conjointly. (AMR & 0 418(7)(b) (i)).
- (0) In the case of private soldiers and NCOs where automatic or other ferfeitures total more than £3 it is NOT a minor punishment and accused must be given right to elect trial by Court Martial. This does not apply to deductions from the pay of NCOs under MAR & O 418(5)(da)).
 - (P) Any combination of minor punishments other than those authorised above is invalid as a minor punishment but may be awarded as a summary punishment under AA 46(2)(e)). In practice such an award is not likely to be given and should be avoided.

POWERS OF COMPANY &c COMMANDER (See AMR & 0 4, 389(6) for definitions).

- 5. Unless limited by his CO (AMR & O 394(4)) a Company etc Commander may award the following punishments.
- 6. (a) NCOs (including Kopls). Below the rank of Sgt.
 - (ii) Admonition. (AMR & O 423(1)(a)(ii)).

(i) Reprimand. (AMR & 0 423(1)(a)(i)).

(b) OTHER RANKS

- (i) CB, not exceeding seven days. (AMR & 0 423(1)(b)(ii)). See notes (Q),(R),(T), below.
- (ii) Extra guards or picquets. (AMR & 0 423(1)(c)). See notes (Q),(T),(V), below.
- (iii) Admonition. (AMR & O 423(1)(b)(iii)) See notes (R), (T), below.
- (iv) Fine for drunkenness not exceeding £3. (AMR & 0 423(1) (b)(i)). See notes (R),(S),(T), below.
 - (v) Deduction from pay to make good compensation for expense, loss, damage or destruction not exceeding £3. (AMR & 0 423(1)(ba)). See notes (T),(U), below.

NOTES

- (Q) CB and extra guards or picquets may be awarded separately or conjointly with each other. (AMR & 0 423(2); AMR & 0 418(7)).

 - (S) This is a fine for drunkenness only and cannot be awarded for any other offence. The limitations of AIR & O 444 do not apply on active service.
 - (T) Deduction from pay may be awarded conjointly with any other punishment. A company etc commander cannot award deduction of pay to a NCO.
 - (U) When a finding of guilty on a charge will result in the accused incurring an automatic forfeiture of pay in excess of £3, the accused must be given the right of electing trial by Court Martial notwithstanding that only a minor punishment is contemplated. Hence, he cannot be dealt with by company etc commander.
 - (V) This power can be exercised only for minor irregularities in connection with guard or picquet duties.

 - 1. Despatching units will send AF G1033 to CRAOC/ADOS/DADOS (as applicable) who will issue disposal instructions in consultation with the ultimate receiving depot.
 - 2. Should the stores be returned in any way other than by road transport, the despatching unit will notify the despatch details by PRIORITY signal to the receiving depot. This will be done before the ETA of the stores.
 - 3. Attention is drawn to Equipment Regulations 1955, Pamphlet 3 (WO Code No 4048) paras 31 to 33 inclusive. The Free From Explosive certificate referred to in para 32 will be endorsed on the reverse of the AF G1033. In addition each package returned will contain a packing note (AF G904) showing rank, name and unit of:-
 - (a) The person by whom the cartridge cases were sorted and packed.
 - (b) The responsible person by whom the sorting and packing were supervised.
 - 4. All items returned will be clean.

"PROCEDURE

- 1. No ammunition will be returned to RAOC without an inspection by the formation IOO or his representative. During his inspection, the IOO will complete a "Safe to Move" certificate (see appendix 'A').
- 2. After action in para 1, AF G1033 will be submitted to CRAOC/ADOS/DADOS (as applicable) who will issue disposal instructions in conjunction with the ultimate receiving depot.
- 3. On receipt of the AFG 1033, the depot will notify the unit that the proposed date of return is suitable or otherwise.
- 4. Should the ammunition be returned other than by road transport, the despatching unit will notify, by PRIORITY signal, details of despatch to the receiving depot.
- 5. A copy of the "Safe to Move" certificate will accompany all consignments.
- 6. A number of accidents have occurred because sufficient care has not been taken when returning live ammunition to RAOC Ammunition Depot. The following procedure will be strictly observed:-
 - (a) GRENADES will NOT be returned with detonators or igniters in position. Exposed igniter sets or detonators will be repacked in their original containers wherever possible.
 - (b) MINES A tk will not be returned with fuzes in position. Fuzes will be returned in their original packages. Units must ensure that the safety pin and shear wire are in position and in no way rusted or corroded.
- (c) PACKING. When ammunition cannot be returned in its original package, advice will be sought from the IOO as to method of packing."

- 8. As the mov of automatic and FN wpns out of the Bn is not permitted, the fol measures will be adopted, with regard to pers proceeding out of the Bn on courses, detention or to hosp:

 - (b) As a matter of policy all pers are entitled to one rest day per week in addition to ARL etc. The object of this rest day is to give freedom from liability for op or adm duties to members of the Bn so that they are able to remain at concert pitch whilst the unit is committed to ops. Normally these rest days will be taken once a week.

 - (iii) in the event of co-ord of tpt not being arranged by the Tpt Sec, the coy concerned will arrange direct with OC 2 RAR Duty Pl Minden Bks for tpt to meet the leave pers at, and return them to Church St Pier, GEORGETOWN.
 - (iv) as far as practicable Bn Tpt Sec org tpt will depart KUALA KANGSAR 1500 hrs; coys will therefore arrange to have pers concerned at Bn Tpt Lines by that time.

(b) KUALA KANGSAR

- (i) coys in residence at KUAIA KANGSAR will info the Bn TO by 0800 hrs each Mon similar details as for sub sub para 10 (a)(i) above.

The max use will be made of vehs returning to Minden Bks or BUTTERWORTH, and departure timings will be co-ord to fit leave timings.
- (iii) as far as practicable Bn Tpt Sec org tpt will depart
 KUALA KANGSAR 1500 hrs; coys will therefore arrange to
 have pers concerned at Bn Tpt Lines by that time.
- (c) Pers for stand down tpt returning after long weekend may require separate tpt. Pers should be named in returns so that a check can be made at KUALA KANGSAR for stowaways and errors in coy returns.

11. The max use should be made of pte tpt and as a matter of principle pers proceeding on leave should arrange a car load. This should be taken into consideration when assessing coy tpt demands.

- 12. Attn is drawn to sub para 9(f) of this instr.
- 13. The attn of all ranks will be drawn to 2 RAR RO Part I No 23/57 "Arms and ammo of pers on leave or stand down", and to 2 RAR SOs for MALAYA Nos. 1 and 2.
- 14. The attn of all ranks will be directed to 2 RAR ROs 29/57 and 233/56 relating to Out of Bounds areas in local leave centres. In addition, 2 RAR RO 134/56 relating to special Out of Bounds areas in KUALA KANGSAR, eg. Istana Grounds will be promulgated.
- 15. In addition to offrs' leave plans which are called for from time to time, offrs will invariably apply in writing on the proforma provided (in duplicate), setting out the details of their leave. Such applications will be fwd to Bn HQ with a min notice of 14 days.

LOCAL LEAVE TO KUALA KANGSAR, SUNGEI SIPUT, IPOH, TAIPING, ETC

- 20. All outstanding ARL will be cleared by 31 Aug 57 (MBI 61/57 para 19 refers) excl pers granted special auth to accumulate, eg. UK enlistees accruing credits for leave to UK. INTRODUCTION

1. This instr confirms and supplements pts made at Coy Comds' conference of 19 Mar 57.

OP POLICY - GEN

- 2. Subj to SB info justifying the mounting of a Bn level op in any area, Coy Comds remain responsible for anti CT ops within their present bdrys. As a gen guide only the fol will be the routine allocation of effort:-
 - (a) One pl operating (or aval at short notice) on SB info.
 - (b) One pl jungle ptls on "history", "hunch" or "clue".
 - (c) One pl trg and stand down.

LONG RANGE OP PLANNING

- 3. IO will prepare brief for 1907 LL Flt giving:-
 - (a) List of areas in priority over which detailed VR is required to loc CT camps for investigation vide para 2(b). In particular, the likely routes or habits of 31 Pl and 13/15 Pl will be given priority.
 - (b) List of areas in priority on which LZs should be loc to facilitate rapid fol up or sealing escape routes in event of any incident. Ptls vide para 2(b) will, in due course, be required to work on these LZs with the aim of developing a comprehensive chain in bn area.

KILL TO CONTACT RATE

- 4. The unit record in this respect is not good, and MUST be improved. The fol are the maj factors:-
 - (a) Men must be able to shoot quickly and accurately when under nervous tension.
 - (b) We must be able to take advantage of ANY sign left by CT in order to loc them.
 - (c) The enemy must be seen first, i.e. until we fire they must not be a ware of SF presence.

SHOOTING

- 5. Adjt to effect liaison with 1 RSF with a view to developing night firing aids and distribute to coys with full instrs for use ASP.
- 6. Shooting practice at coy bases to be continuous and progressive. (It is anticipated that ranges at C Coy and D Coy bases will be developed in the very near future). To accustom tps to nervous strain a high percentage of practices must be competitive. Such competitions

will be comprehensive in scope ensuring all men take part, both as individuals and in gps, e.g. between leading scouts, between LM gnrs, between NCOs, between secs, etc. All wpns to be involved. To give pt to the competition the financial aspect should be exploited. I would like to see inter coy challenges at an early date. Win, lose or draw, the spirit of competition is the aspect to be developed. The ultimate competition is with the CT, and the aim is a cool, quick shot.

- 7. Imagination and variety are essential to ensure proficiency and interest. OC HQ Coy immediately will put unit tdn to work constructing "pull up" and running tgts for installation at each coy base.
- 8. Any man consistently poor at the "fancy" practices will be taken back to the first principles and reinstr in all phases of musketry.

LOC THE CT

- 9. Ultimately not less than one man in four must be capable of tracking as effectively as an IBAN and recent courses at FAREIF Trg Centre
 have demonstrated that this is a perfectly reasonable aim. This will
 take time and the fol will be the progressive steps:-
 - (a) Estb a Bn Tracking Team.
 - (b) Bn Tracking Team, whilst immediately aval for ops, to train Coy Tracking Teams in succession.
 - (c) Coy Tracking Teams to train selected individuals within coys.

Bn Tracking Team, under comd Lt McFARLANE, will be formed on Thu 21 Mar 57 at D Coy. Separate instrs have been issued. D Coy Tracking Team will commence trg on Mon 25 Mar 57 for a period of two weeks. The Bn Tracking Team will then move to another coy loc (to be announced later).

- 10. It is apparent that we are not handling our present tracking facilities correctly, and concurrent with above (para 9) the fol action will be taken by coys:-
 - (a) IBANS will NOT permanently be allocated to pls, but will be conc on coy level. They will not be det with pls to duties at MINDEN Bks or KUALA KANGSAR, although they can be given normal coy adm duties subj to the fol.
 - (b) IBANS and dogs must be practiced daily in their art. A track will be set each day for each IBAN or dog to fol. These tracks should vary in age. Control of this trg will be vested in one man of not less than lcpl rank who should be OC elect of the Coy Tracking Team. Whilst the Bn Tracking Team is working with a coy control of this trg will be in the hands of the OC Bn Team.
 - (c) IBAN WT and shooting practices will be coord with above. It should be borne in mind that the recentlyjoined IBAN rfts have had no mil trg prior to joining the Bn.
 - (d) Records of IBAN tracking, WT and range practices will be maint, preferably by OC (elect) Coy Tracking Team. Only thus can we make concrete recommendations to Comdt SARAWAK Rangers regarding suitability etc.

GETTING THE FIRST SHOT

- 11. In planning area recce on limited or mil info coys will give attn to the fol pts discussed at conference:-
 - (a) Need for small (4 man) ptls, working slowly. As trg (particularly tracker trg) develops these ptls can work close to CT without attn, which is not so likely with full sec or pl ptls.
 - (b) A decision must be made as to whether to search areas where CT camps may be (e.g. near WPs etc) or to loc tracks. If the latter, "cross graining" will be the system adopted.

- (c) Clear orders must be issued respecting -
 - (i) action when sign loc i.e. to cfm, to fol, to report.
 - (ii) avoiding clashes between ptls which may loc connected tracks and fol them.
 - (iii) comms. It always will be highly unlikely that such small ptls can be provided with WS, and a plan for reporting/action must be made.
- 12. Quiet mov close to the CT must be perfected, i.e. fd craft, crawling, selection of fire posns, coolness, etc. This can best be developed by inter ptl competition for a stake.

TRG - GEN

- 13. Vide para 2 a proportion of each coy will be constantly on trg. Pls awaiting action on SB info must also spend all waiting time on trg. Idleness is a criminal waste of time which is getting more valuable in 2 RAR with every passing day and leads to discontent and lowered morale.
- 14. The fol will be covered by each man between ptls -
 - (a) TTs
 A high proportion of current NCO Cadre could not pass TTs, clearly indicating that this subj is being neglected. TTs will incl safety aspects. A concocted TT list which will cover all relevant aspects of wpn handling.will be issued separately.
 - (b) WT Resulting from TTs. It is not nec to repeat every lesson in the book.
 - (c) Range Practices
 Incl snap and moving tgts and from the full variety of posns
 likely to be encountered in CT contact. Ni firing will be incl.
 - (d) IA Drills
 Vide ATOM. In particular, counter ambush (track) will be covered.
 - (e) <u>Drill and Discipline</u>
 Particular emphasis on posture and saluting. The first period of EVERY trg day will be a drill period.

PART IV GENERAL COMMENTS

New CT Unit

118. It has been possible to obtain some preliminary information from CEP LAU AH CHUNG (who is still under surgical treatment in hospital). The information which has just come to hand, is: -

(a) 27 Section of 31 Independent Platoon

This Section, under the command of CHAN FEI (WL 00045) is 24 -26 strong. The arms include 2 Brens, 2 Stens, 1 Carbine and the remainder have Rifles or Shot-guns.

(b) New CT Unit

DCM LO CHAU (WL 00048) has, since 1 Jan 57, formed a new unit, described by the CEP as a 'mobile fighting unit', with himself as Commander. This unit spent a month in camp on intensive training, including drill, jungle training, lectures, etc, the emphasis being on ambush tactics. At this time the unit was 16 strong and arms included 1 Bren, 1 Sten, 1 Carbine and the remainder Rifles and Shot-guns. 10 Mar 57

(c) Ambush of RSF

Following this training, the unit mounted its first ambush which was the ambush of the Ro. on 5 March. About five days beforehand, Part IV the CTs saw an air-drop taking place in the jungle. They therefore sent out a patrol to investigate and the information with which this patrol returned (and on which the ambush was mounted) included the strength of the SFs as 6 or 7.

COMMENT

New There is clearly much more that this CEP can tell when time and his condition permit. His information about LO CHAU's new unit is most interesting in view of certain items in the SIU TIT documents (recovered 24 Jan) which showed that he (LO CHAII) had been taking part in an ambush in the jungle was about to take over command of a Combatant Unit, - thought possibly to be 27 Section. It is yet too early to say whether the formation of this new unit indicates a change in CT policy - eg. to more aggressive tactics to replace their increasing shortage of weapons - but see para 119 below.

It is possible that for the time being the CTO, particularly COMMENT the Combatant Units operating in 10th District, have as their main target SF patrols operating inside the jungle. Since they are unlikely to know when and where a SF patrol will enter the jungle, the most likely way for them to mount an ambush is to locate the SF base camp (air-drops being a useful guide) and then to ambush either the likely routes that patrols will take when they finally abandon the base camp to leave the jungle. These tacticts could equally apply to SF patrols returning to a jungle Fort.

So far there have been no reports that this method is being used in other parts of the FEDERATION. It is interesting to note, however, that the Terrorists are using signs to locate their dumps and all patrols should be on the look out for similar or other methods.





AN APPRECIATION BY THE DIRECTOR OF INTELLIGENCE FOR FEBRUARY 1957

- There has been a further reduction in terrorist activity. Security Force contacts and eliminations also were fewer this month, though a high proportion of ranking terrorists were eliminated. Not unexpectedly, the new major operations in South Perak and North Johore have not yet begun to pay a dividend: only one of the 24 eliminations occurred in these areas. Intelligent exploitations of SEPs have led to a series of eliminations in the KULAI district of Johore and the BATU GAJAH district of Perak.
- 2. Documents issued by the North Johore Regional Committee have recently been recovered. No change has been noticed in the policy that they contain. Amongst them a document on Village Councils is interesting as it shows the importance that the CTO places on the penetration of rural community leaders. In SE ENYIH (Selangor), which is quoted as a fine example to the MCP, the "representation of the interests of the public to the Government" by the community leaders was in the form of agitation against those Food Denial measures that were preventing the Masses Organisation in the village from performing their essential supply task to the hungry terrorists in the neighbourhood.
- 3. As for many months past, pro-Communist activities amongst students have been of a local nature, but there are increasing signs of inspiration from Singapore. There have been several reports from Negri Sembilan that during the school holidays Federation-domiciled students of Singapore Middle Schools taught Self-Study and strike techniques to pupils of local schools. - 4. There have also been some cases of close association between Trade Unionists and Students of a pattern that culminated in Singapore in the November, 1956 riots. The most significant activity is that of a number of left-wing intellectuals believed to be founding a Federation association of ex-members of the University of Malaya Socialist Club. The latter organisation was very closely allied with the Middle Read Unions of Singapore.

TERRORIST ACTIVITIES

1. Terrorist activity has continued to decline and is now at the lowest level since the beginning of the Emergency. Security Force pressure has been maintained, but both contacts and eliminations have been at a lower rate this month. However, the number of ranking terrorists eliminated is creditable, and nearly half of them are of District Committee rank. The quantity of ammunition recovered has risen appreciably, but about 4,700 rounds were found in old dumps and were unserviceable.
