## COMMANDERS DIARIES INSTRUCTIONS

### AIM

1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organization and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

### GENERAL

2. *Entries are to be made daily on AF C 2118 (Adapted)* each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.

3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties (Australia)" Chapter 2, Section 12.

### RESPONSIBILITY

#### During Non-operational Periods

4. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled by commanders of all formations.

#### During Operational Periods (1)

5. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled in duplicate by:

- a. Commanders of all formations.
- b. Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a brigadier or above.
- c. Heads of services not below the rank of lieutenant colonel.
- d. Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
- e. Unit commanders.
- f. Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

### COMPILATION

6. Both original and duplicate copies are to consist of:

- a. Cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted).
- b. Index as printed on cover.
- c. Narrative (AF C 2118) (Adapted).
- d. Annexes as shown in the Index.

7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes are to be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer is to be included.

8. The annexes are to be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an annex NIL will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters, starting at B.

DISPOSAL DIARIES

13. **Original Commander's Diary.** This is to be forwarded monthly, unless otherwise ordered, by the seventh day of the succeeding month direct to AHQ.

14. **Duplicate Commander's Diary.** This must be clearly marked as a duplicate. It is to be sent separately from the original to AHQ one month after the original has been despatched but not before the former has been acknowledged.

15. When overseas, both copies of diaries are to be sent through the Army Records organization in the overseas theatre but at different times.

16. **TOP SECRET Supplementary Diaries.**

a. The documents referred to in Paragraph 9 together with a list of them made out on AF C 2118 (Adapted) must be placed in separate cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted). All details must be filled in and the cover clearly marked in red: "ANNEX Z — OFFICER ONLY". It may be convenient to group the papers by appendices.

b. Supplementary diaries must be forwarded under the normal rules for TOP SECRET correspondence, to AHQ. The inner envelope must be plainly marked:

c. The duplicate supplementary diaries must be despatched as shown in Paragraph 14 as soon as receipt of the original has been acknowledged.

6. Both original and duplicate copies are to be forwarded:

c. Message (AF C 2118) (Adapted).  
d. Details as shown in the Index.

7. All details of the unit to be forwarded (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the unit and the number and rank of the commander are to be shown on the cover) and the name of the commanding officer and where the date of appointment by the new commanding officer.

8. The annexes are to be numbered in the groups shown on the cover. If there are more than 100 annexes, the number will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are enclosed, they are to be numbered starting at 11.

1 ARU REINFORCEMENT TRAINING

General

1. All infantry reinforcements are required by Comd 1 ATF to undergo 14 days theatre training before reaching their unit.

Concept

2. Reinforcement Training is designed to allow the soldier to take his place as an effective member of an operational unit.

3. Training covers the following aspects :-

- a. Acclimatisation
- b. Orientation
- c. Special to Theatre Training
- d. Battle Innoculation
- e. Revision Training

Conduct

4. Reinforcement Training is conducted in a TWO week training period. Reinforcements held by 1 ARU on completion of training are employed on operational duties and Continuation Training.

5. Physical Fitness. All reinforcements undergo ONE period of PT per day. Emphasis is on the following :-

- a. Endurance Training
- b. Unarmed Combat
- c. Rifle Exercises

Training Coordination

6. The Training Officer produces Platoon Weekly Training Programs as required. The Training Officer is responsible for the planning and coordination of Training; the Platoon Commander is responsible for its execution.

Training Doctrine

7. Reinforcement Training is to be directly related to the practices, experience and operational requirements of the Infantry Battalions. Effective and close liaison is to be maintained with the Infantry Battalions on training matters. Periodic unit discussions of training doctrine will be conducted.

1 ARU TRAINING INFORMATION BULLETIN NO 1INTRODUCTIONAim

1. The aim of this writing is to standardise training doctrine within 1 ARU so that it is relevant to the requirements of the Infantry Battalions.

General

2. Generally, the subject matter has been culled from standard teachings, Battalion practice and staff experience. Those deviations from normal training in AUST are thought to be necessary in VIETNAM.

3. Discussion by 2 RAR and 7 RAR is invited on any of the topics raised.

WEAPON HANDLINGStripping and Cleaning

4. Additional stripping should be taught on all weapons. Stripping is an aid to cleaning and small assemblies should NOT be stripped unless necessary.

5. The gas cylinder on the GPMG M60 should be cleaned after firing and at least TWICE a week.

6. Stripping of the M79 is to be taught.

7. Oiling. More oil should be used than is normally required in AUST. Graphite grease is NOT to be used.

Immediate Action Drills

8. SLR

a. Magazine off, Magazine on. Cock go on firing.

b. Gas Stoppage - adjust gas, cock and go on firing.

9. M16 Armalite

a. Look, Magazine off, Magazine on, Cock and go on firing.

b. Hard Extraction - Remove Magazine, Cock, Push out empty case with cleaning rod.

c. When stripping the M16 trigger mechanism, the change lever must NEVER be on AUTO.

Tracer

10. Tracer will NOT be used in 1 ARU except in M60 belts.

Carriage of Weapons

11. Weapons are to be carried by the firer in the natural hand ie ; Right handed shooters are to carry the weapon with the right hand around the pistol grip.

Shooting

12. a. The soldier is trained to fire from the SHOULDER whenever possible (This includes the assault).

b. Training emphasis is to given to shooting galleries and sneaker ranges.

c. The firer must observe his fall of shot and make corrections until the target is struck.

d. The firer should go to ground when carrying out an IA.

MINOR TACTICS

Field Signals

13. a. Field Signals are to be revised and practiced. Booby Traps are indicated by the hand held palm uppermost, fingers indicating mine prongs.

b. A stop signal means move off the track and take cover. A halt signal should NOT be given for a prop in movement.

Formations

14. a. Single file should only be used when the country does NOT allow for other fmns.

b. TWO scouts should be used whenever possible. ONE scout may be used when navigation and control is difficult.

c. The Sig is to travel immediately behind the pl comd.

d. In close country the Pl Sgt should travel between the second and third sections.

Harbour Drills

15. The leading section normally secures from 10 to 2 along the line of march.

Movement

16. Only treat fences, tracks and creeks etc as obstacles when a definite threat exists.

DRESS AND EQUIPMENT

17. No less than THREE water bottles are to be carried. Shell Dressings are to be attached to the butt of the soldiers weapon.

18. M60 Belts. Link belt is to be carried in pneumatic mattress insert as an interim solution.

19. Radios should be carried concealed in packs.

20. Consideration should be given to the use of body camouflage.


