1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organization and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

GENERAL

2. *Entries are to be made daily on AF C 2118 (Adapted) each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.*

3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties (Australia)", Chapter 2, Section 12.

RESPONSIBILITY**During Non-operational Periods**

4. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled by commanders of all formations.

During Operational Periods (1)

5. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled in duplicate by:

- a. Commanders of all formations.
- b. Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a brigadier or above.
- c. Heads of services not below the rank of lieutenant colonel.
- d. Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
- e. Unit commanders.
- f. Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

COMPILATION

6. Both original and duplicate copies are to consist of:

- a. Cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted).
- b. Index as printed on cover.
- c. Narrative (AF C 2118) (Adapted).
- d. Annexes as shown in the Index.

7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes are to be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer is to be included.

8. The annexes are to be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters, starting at B.

DISPOSAL

13. **Original Commander's Diary.** This is to be forwarded monthly, unless otherwise ordered, by the seventh day of the succeeding month direct to AHQ.

14. **Duplicate Commander's Diary.** This must be clearly marked as a duplicate. It is to be sent separately from the original to AHQ one month after the original has been despatched but not before the former has been acknowledged.

15. When overseas, both copies of diaries are to be sent through the Army Records organization in the overseas theatre but at different times.

16. **TOP SECRET Supplementary Diaries.**

a. The documents referred to in Paragraph 9 together with a list of them made out on AF C 2118 (Adapted) must be placed in separate cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted). All details must be filled in and the cover clearly marked in red: "ANNEX Z — OFFICER ONLY". It may be convenient to group the papers by appendices.

b. Supplementary diaries must be forwarded under the normal rules for TOP SECRET correspondence, to AHQ. The inner envelope must be plainly marked:

Introduction

1. 1 ARU has been allocated the task of conducting refresher training for 3/48 ARVN battalion located in the DAT DO district.

Conduct

2. Training is to be conducted in TWO phases :-

a. Phase 1

- (1) Weapon Training
- (2) Shooting
- (3) Navigation
- (4) Demolitions

b. Phase 2

- (1) Minor Tactics to platoon level
- (2) Fieldcraft

3. ONE company is to be trained at a time. Phase 1 for the complete battalion is to be completed prior to commencement of phase 2.

4. Where possible training will be conducted close to Company bases. Range and training facilities within 3/48 TAOR are to be used.

Concept of Instruction

5. The organic 3/48 chain of command is to be maintained. Company officers and NCO's are to attend training and assist as required. Non cooperation and disciplinary irregularities are to be referred to the US Advisory Team.

Instructional Team

6. The 1 ARU Instructional Team is additionally organised as a demonstration squad. The team consists of:-

- a. Officer in charge
- b. Interpreter (Lt)
- c. Chief Instructor
- d. Platoon Instructors (3)
- e. Squad Instructors (6)

Syllabus

7. The outline syllabus is attached as Annex A.

Coordination

8. Matters pertaining to routine administration and organisation of the training program are to be referred to the US Advisory Team.

9. Matters of policy, ground clearances and any extraordinary matters are to be referred to 1 ATF (GSO 3).

Interpreters

10. 5 Interpreters are to be allocated on a permanent basis.

Communications

11. The Instructional Team is to be on listening watch on the Horseshoe Coy internal frequency using 1 ARU Comd Net C/S suffixed by ALPHA.

Administration

12. Ammunition. Training ammunition is to be provided by 3/48 ARVN.

13. The instructional team are authorised to carry US personal weapons.

14. Accommodation. When required the Instructional Team is to be accommodated at Horseshoe Company.

15. Transportation. Normal means of transportation is by vehicle. Single vehicles are NOT to travel.

16. Hours of Work. Hours of work are as follows:-

a. 0800 hrs - 1100 hrs

b. 1300 hrs - 1630 hrs

17. Medical. A medical kit is to be carried by the Instructional Team. DUSTOFF for AUSTRALIAN casualties will be on request to Horseshoe Company.
