# COMMANDERS DIARIES INSTRUCTIONS

### AIM

1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organisation and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

### GENERAL

- 2. Entries will be made daily on AF C2118, each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.
- 3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties in the Field", Chapter 2, Section 7.

#### RESPONSIBILITY

# **During Non-operational Periods**

4. A Commanders Diary will be made by commanders of all formations.

# During Operational Periods (see note 1)

- 5. A Commanders Diary will be made in duplicate by:-
  - (a) Commanders of all formations.
  - (b) Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a Brigadier or above.
  - (c) Heads of services not below the rank of Lieutenant Colonel.
  - (d) Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
  - (e) Unit commanders.
  - (f) Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

### COMPILATION

- 6. Both original and duplicate copies will consist of:-
  - (a) Cover (AF C2119).
  - (b) Index as printed on cover.
  - (c) Narrative (AF C2118).
  - (d) Annexes as shown in the Index.
- 7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes will be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer will be included.
- 8. The annexes will be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an Annex NIL will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters, the relevant papers should be grouped as annexes starting at B.

# **During Non-Operational Periods**

- 13. Formation Headquarters will forward the original Commanders Diary annually as at 31st December to reach the Army Records Centre (through Headquarters Field Records where applicable) as soon as possible after 1st January of the following year. - 15. ORIGINAL COMMANDERS DIARIES

  - (b) Formations and units overseas will forward diaries monthly by the seventh day of the succeeding month to the OIC Field Records for onward transmission to the Ministry of Defence.
- 16. DUPLICATE COMMANDERS DIARIES. These will be clearly marked as duplicates and will NOT be sent with the originals. They will be forwarded within two months as follows:—
  - (a) Units in the UK

- (b) Formation Headquarters in the UK
  - To OIC Central Clearing Wing, Infantry Records, Exeter.
- (c) Units Overseas

To the OIC Field Records for onward transmission to parent record office.

(d) Formation Headquarters Overseas

To the OIC Field Records for onward transmission to the OIC Central Clearing Wing, Infantry Records, Exeter.

## SECURITY

- 17. Documents concerned with future operational planning will be listed on AF C2118 and placed in a separate AF C2119. All details will be filled in and the cover will be clearly marked in red:—ANNEX Z—OFFICERS ONLY. It may be convenient to group the papers by annexes.
- 18. Supplementary diaries will be forwarded in accordance with the normal rules for TOP SECRET correspondence to the Ministry of Defence (ARC). The inner envelope will be clearly marked:—

# NOTES

  - (a) the period between a declaration of war and the official end of hostilities;
  - (b) any period spent in a theatre of operations;
  - (c) any period when engaged in any form of military operation.
- 2. The Ministry of Defence or headquarters concerned will be responsible for instructing units to submit Commanders' Diaries where the conditions of the unit's employment make this necessary. Wherever possible the beginning and end of the period will be clearly stated. Notwithstanding the above, on the outbreak of global war all units and formations which are not at the time submitting these reports will start compiling them with effect from M day and will thereafter render them in accordance with paragraphs 15 and 16.

#### INTREP NUMBER FIVE

#### General

- Information on the enemy is becoming increasingly harder to obtain. It is apparent that the publicity given to the ending of Confrontation has effected the attitude of sources and would be informers.
- 2. This INTREP contains information on:
  - a. PASANDA at SELUAS and BABANG.
  - b. Cancellation of the reported withdrawal of 203 BRIMOB Bn.

THE RESIDENCE OF THE PARTY OF THE PERSON OF

- c. A gun reported at BABANG.
- d. Increased trading between SERIKIN and BABANG.
- e. Possible new BRAWIDJAJA camp at PISANG 887041.

#### PASANDA

- B3. 3 Aug. Source described the meaning of the word PASANDA as a unit comprising trained TNI soldiers from any unit, TNKU or PGRS. The members of PASANDA are willing to fight in SARANAK and receive a gratuity of M \$ 300. The PASANDA at SELUAS do NOT appear to be training.
- Twelve members of PASANDA have been stationed at BABANG since mid-July. Nine are regular TNI, three are PGRS. Units and names are NOT known. All are dressed in OGs and carry KALASHNIKOV rifles.
- 5. Comment. The dress and weapons are similar to MANJAR troops. These troops may be either remnants of the MANJAR troops or newly designated 'irregulars' stiffened by RPKAD and/or 514 Battalion. (connect para 11 of 4 RAR INTREP No FOUR).

#### Possible Orders for P.S.MD.

- Chinese were reported to be at SELULS, and both hold the rank of Pl Comd. AJIS, who has an intelligence appointment was to attend a meeting scheduled to last one week with a Colonel in PONTLANAK. This meeting was to start on 1 Aug. One of the reasons given for this meeting was to receive new orders for PASANDA.
- 7. Comment. The pattern for mounting Incursions appears to be
  - a. Training in a rear area.
  - b. Briefing by a senior officer.
  - c. Mounting within seven days of briefing.
- 8. The PASANDA in the SELULS area have had over six weeks to prepare and train. It is not known what the 12 PASANDA at BABANG have been daing. However, it does not appear logical to have highly trained soldiers such as RPKAD on purely routine tasks.
- It is considered possible a further incursion by be planned.

  Allowing time for AJIS to return from PONTIANAK (If this report is true) he should be back in SELUAS on approx 11 14 Aug.

  Allowing a further seven days for briefing and mounting.

  preparations, it is considered that an incursion could be mounted from INDONE II. anytime after 18 Aug.

SECRET

It is probable that the tasks of an incursion party would be to contact local Chinese dissidents in the rear areas, with 10. the aim of causing disturbances which would appear to have been caused by anti-government dissidents already inside SLRINLK.

## BRIMOB in B.B.NG area

- B3. 3 Aug. The intended withdrawal of 203 BRIMOB Bn in Aug has been cancelled due to lack of firm orders for the future role of PusiNDin
- B3. The positions of TNI arty weapons in the BARANG/RISAU 12. area are reported to be:-
  - 3 guns at JUNCTION.
  - 2 guns at RISAU.
  - 1 gun at BiBiNG.

The gun at BARING is reported to be slightly smaller than a Mors No 5 and 6 are reported to be held by BRIMOB in the area. In KORUH, the 40 BRIMOB are accommodated in three new huts with a mor outside each hut.

Comment. The guns are probably 76mm. Further info is being sought to clarify the mor sizes, however as No 2 mors 13. are 2 inch and No 8 are 81mm, it is possible that No 5 mors are 51mm, and No 6 are 60m.

#### Traders

- Trading has continued between BABANG and SERIKIN with an increasing number of traders coming from INDONE In late July, a trading party of 115 arrived at SERIKIN despite a warning to restrict numbers.
- On 2 hug, a meeting was held near SERIKIN to discuss trading between SERIKIN and BABANG. Present were FIO BAU, Tua Kampong SERIKIN, 15. OKP BARANG and six INDONESIAN traders. It was explained that topics discussed should be given a wide circulation in the BABANG area, and that the local BRIMOB be fully informed. The following orders were laid down: -
  - Strength of parties not to exceed 40.
  - The frequency of trading days was immaterial. They b. could come any day.
  - All traders are restricted in their movements when in SERIKIN, they will remain on the main track, and will C. NOT leave the shopping area of SERIKIN.
  - Passes issued by SEKSI in BABING authorising movement d. in SaRAMAK are invalid.
  - Changes in these instructions would be notified by the FIO. e.
  - At this meeting it was ascertained that SEKSI had requested the OKP BARING to visit other kampongs outlined in his pass, in order "to discuss peaceful understanding in the border".
  - Comment. This is further evidence of attempts made by SEKSI 17. to gain intelligence. ..../3

## Possible New BRAWIDJAJA Comp

- 18. C3. 7 Aug. A ne camp has been reported for BRAWIDJAJA soldiers at PISING. This camp is SOUTH WEST of the BRUNEI Range, but NORTH of the Sg. KOEMB., and about 12 hours walk from BINGUM. Strength of troops is not known.
- Comment. The approx location would be 8741. This may 19. account for some of the "mystery" 514 Bn locations.

#### Conclusion

DESCRIPTION OF THE PROPERTY OF

Despite the official ending of Confrontation, there have been 20. NO reports to indicate any withdrawal of border troops opposite 4 RAR. With the continued presence of PASANDA, it is assessed that an external threat still exists.

## 240. OFFICERS WITNESSING DOCUMENTS

Reference: HQ AAF FARELF RO 64/66.

- 1. Attention is directed to Part 1V of the Defence Force Regulations whereby it is provided that an officer of the rank of Captain or above may administer oaths, take affidavits of and attest the execution of documents by a member of the Defence Force while on service outside AUSTRALIA. The document must relate to matters arising under a law of the Commonwealth or a State of AUSTRALIA.
- An officer after signing the document must legibly write type or stamp after the signature his name and rank.
- 3. The Regulations governing the administration of Laths etc are contained in Part 3 of the Army Law Manual. In effect, an authorised officer in FARELF may sign any document requiring signature before a J.P., Commissioner for Declarations or Commissioner for taking affidavits.

## 241. SPECIAL OVERSEA LIVING ALLOWANCE

Reference: HQ AAF FARELF RO 66/66

- 1. Many applications, which have been received by this HQ, are unsatisfactory. The following errors are prevalent:
  - a. Illegible handwriting.
  - b. Incorrect date of application for married quarters.
  - c. Incorrect gross daily rate of pay.
  - d. Soldiers grouping omitted.
  - e. Inadequate and unsupported reasons for wife and family remaining in Australia.
  - f. Recommendation by unit OC being signed by a junior officer.
- 2. With effect from receipt of this order units are to ensure that:
  - a. All applications are typed and two copies forwarded to this HQ.
  - b. Gross daily rate of pay and grouping shown in paybook, are entered correctly.
  - c. Full Christian names of all children and dates of birth are entered.

- d. Reason for wife and family remaining in Australia (para 8 of application) to be endored "see attached". Attachment is to be endorsed and comprehensive statement by member. Medical, compassionate, or educational reasons must be supported by certificates from a relevant authority.
- e. Recommendation by CO/OC must be signed by the unit commander or officer not below field rank.

#### 242. DISCIPLINE - DRESS

Reference: 28 COMWEL Inf Bde RO 177/66.

- 1. Male personnel subject to Military Law of 28 Commonwealth Infantry Brigade/Terendak Garrison are not to wear sun or glare protection spectacles or gogles whilst in uniform. The only exceptions to this order are;
  - a. When spectacles/goggles are issued by the Army Department and are being worn for the specific purpose for which they were issued.
  - b. Civilian pattern spectacles worn for reasons of health, when the wearer possesses a certificate from a medical officer stating he/she is obliged to wear them.
  - c. COs/OCs may authorise drivers only to wear civilian pattern spectacles when driving vehicles on journeys of beyond 80 miles or lasting more than two hours. Drivers allowed this privilege are not to wear the spectacles within the Garrison nor beyond the time when the journey is completed.

#### 243. PREVALENT OFFENCES

Reference: 28 COMWEL Inf Bde RO 179/66.

The following offences are prevalent offences in this Brigade/, Garrison.

Loss of Identity Cards.

## 244. PROMOTION QUALIFICATIONS - ARA SERVICE IN OPERATIONAL AREAS

- 1. Approval may now be given for ARA officers and soldiers to be granted certain promotion qualifications where they have served in an operational area for periods of less than six months.
- 2. Conditions for such approval are set out in draft AROs attached as Annexes A and B.
- 3. When published these will replace AROs 99/65 and 3/65.

- 1. Live ammunition, grenades etc have been found by BLH SINGAPORE in the kit of casevac personnel from Borneo.
- 2. The persons and kit etc of patients evacuated at short notice must be examined as soon as practicable after sustaining an injury.

## 247. PRECEDENCE OF INFORMATION ADDRESSEES ON SIGNALS

Reference: HQ LAND BOR ADMIN RO 155/66.

- 1. There a message has both action and information addressees, it is incumbent on the originator to assign either:
  - a. One precedence for all addressees.
  - b. One precedence for action addressees and another (normally a lower precedence) for information addressees.
- 2. With the abolishing of the precedence DEFERRED and in the absence of specific instruction from originators to the contrary, some communication staffs have been assuming that the precedence allotted to . tion addressess has been allotted to information addresses,. Hence many signals to the information addressess are being given precedence which is neither intended nor merited.
- The Message Form (F Sigs 52) will, when it is reprinted, bear the word "ROUTINE" in the PRECEDENCE INF( space where the word "DEFERRED" now appears. Therefore, until stocks of the new form appear, communication staffs are authorised, in the absence of instructions from the ori instruction to the contrary, to assume that all information addressees on messages have been allotted the precedence ROUTINE.

## 248. CARRIAGE OF WET BATTERIES IN AIRCRAFT

Reference: HQ LAND BOR RO 156/66.

- 1. A case has recently occurred of a helicopter being grounded for five days due to acid damage resulting from an incorrectly packed wet battery.
- 2. Units are to ensure that emplaning and baggage officers know the regulations published in HQ FEAF pamphlet 'Carriage of Dangerous Vent Caps' (AF 830 Vol 2 Leaflet F2). For their information relevant extracts are reproduced below.

- a. Rubber vent caps must be fitted to all vent plugs.
- b. The batteries should be packed in a woc case with batteries placed to prevent movement and leave dequate space for neutralising agent to be packed all round.
- c. The neutrolising agent is a mixture in the proportion of 10 to 1 by volume of sawdust and boras powder for alkaline batteries. The proder can be obtained through RAOC.
- d. The following markings are to be painted on the outside of the box:-
  - (i) Hazardous Stores on two sides.
  - (ii) Electrical Battery Acid or Alkaline as appropriate on the top and two opposite sides.
- 3. Whenever possible batteries should be drained before packing. The only exception to this rule is when batteries are required to operate radio sets shortly before loading or shortly after unloading.
- 249. CROSSING CAUSEWAY SINGAPORE SINGAPORE

Reference: -4 RAR RO 222/66.

Singapore intends to apply the same restrictions.

250 INTERNATIONAL HEALTH CERTIFICATES

In future IHCs are to be issued on signature only. Moss of an IHC is, of now, a punishable offence as for loss of ID card.

The second thing we all went to say is what a tremendous experience it was to be within the Battalian. That this feeling is so strong in everyone is due to you all either in Bn HQ or in the coy bases. I refuse to believe that any gunners, anywhere, have ever been made to feel so welcome and so much a part of a real team.

## 4. EXTRACT OF LETTER TO CO 4 RAR FROM MINISTER OF SOCIAL SERVICE

"On behalf of the members of the Australian Parliamentary Delegation, I would extend to you, your officers and men, my grateful thanks for the kind hospitality you so recently extended to us.

Our visit to Sarawak was one of the high lights of our tour. The optitunity to see the local scene has given each of us a far better appreciation of the difficulties of the political and military situation there. To you all I would extend my congratulations on the outstanding way you are representing your country and for the effectiveness of your work in such arduous circumstances."

#### 5. DEBTS DUE BY MEMBERS

Reference: HQ AAF FARELF notice contained in RO Serial 23.

It is apparent that members serving in FARELF obtain considerable credit for goods and, as a result, numerous firms and persons complain to HQ AAF FARELF, concerning members who are not honouring their obligations to pay accounts.

In most of these cases the debt was probable incurred with every intention on the part of the member to pay the amount when due. Whatever the original intention, many members find themselves in the position of being threatened with legal action and unable to pay the sum due because their budget will not meet any payments beyond their day to day living expenses. It is obvious that persons who have these overdue accounts have been living beyond their means and some thought at the time of incurring the debt would avoid this embarrassment to themselves.

If a member is on a fixed salary he should budget according to that salary. By obtaining credit he is merely planning to reduce his income later, if he intends to pay.

Obviously it would be more practical to reduce his income by savings in accordance with his budget and so save the future worry and embarrassment of an account which he cannot pay.

If creditors are forced to take legal action to recover debts additional costs are added to the account. Once a judgment is obtained the creditor is usually entitled to about 8% interest on the amount of the judgment, so that the debtor may find himself paying for considerable charges.

The creditor who has a judgment may issue a further summons to the debtor and the debtor must then attend court to answer how he will pay the debt. If the debtor does not attend, or in certain cases if he does not pay, the creditor can obtain an order for his imprisonment.

The creditor may also issue a warrant of execution. This means that the bailiff can come along and seize goods belonging to the debtor. If the amount is not then paid, the goods are sold by auction. This auction price is often much less than the value of the goods, and therefore a debtor very often is forced to satisfy a debt by the loss of valuable property from his home.

It should be remembered that a judgment obtained in this area can be transferred to Australia and enforced there. The costs of this are added to the judgment and, of course, they would be very heavy.

The above means of collecting debts are normal civil means which exist in addition to the military regulations which provide that a member is required to state how he will pay an admitted debt or a judgment of the court.

## 255. RADIO AND TELEVISION LICENCES

- 1. Information has been received that the Malaysian Ministry of Information and Broadcasting has issued instructions to all local offices that persons operating a television set or radio set without a licence are in future to be prosecuted.
- 2. Under existing regulations, contraventions of the following regulations concerning the operation of televisions or radios are punishable.
  - a. No person shall establish, install or work a radio or T.V. without a licence.
  - b. A person who is in possession of a Radio or T.V. is deemed until the contrary is proved to have worked the set.
  - c. A T.V. licence exempts this licensee from holding a separate radio licence.
  - d. The licence must be produced on demand. It is not transferable.
  - e. A separate licence is required for a Radio or T.V. installed in a motor vehicle.
  - f. Any permanent change of address of the licensee must be communicated promptly to the radio and T.V. licence section, postal services department, Kuala Lumpur.
  - g. The licence must be renewed on or before the date of expiry.
  - h. Only portable radio and T.V. sets are allowed to be used in other than the place specified in the licence.
- 3. Two cases have recently been reported by Radio Malaysia of personnel of 28 Bde failing to comply with the regulations regarding licences.
  - b. Any further contravention can only result in these authorities exercising their right to enter Camp for the purpose of checking that all T.V. sets are fully licenced.
  - e. Sub-units are to ensure that this order is brought to the notice of all personnel.

#### 256. B VEHICLE ECONOMY - POL ACCOUNTS

- 1. The attention of all sub-units is drawn to the following points on which observations on POL accounts are frequently raised.
  - a. Column 2 of AF G3518 not being completed to show precise details of the duty and for whom it is performed.
  - b. Column 3 of AF G3518 not showing the exact starting point and destination.
  - c. Columns 4 and 7 of AF G35id not showing the "time out" or "time in".
  - d. Separate lines not used for each journey. The following entry is often seen: Unit Admin, 0800 to 1700 hrs. When endeavouring to analyse movement of B Vehicles so that economy can be achieved, this sort of entry is worthless.
  - e. Journeys not authorised at the proper level.
  - f. Large vehicles used to collect small loads.
  - g. The certificate referred to in para 17 of Army Transport Regulations not sent with the account.
- All sub-units are now to take action to ensure that such faults do NOT occur.

#### 257. MOVEMENT OF STORES TO SINGAPORE BY ROAD FROM MALAYA

- 1. To facilitate the clearance of consignments of stores moving from South JOHORE into SINGAPORE, Customs and Excise Department, SINGAPORE are establishing an office at Woodlands Customs Control Point under Mr YANG CHEONG HONG. This office is open from 0700 hours 1900 hours daily Monday to Saturday excluding public holidays. Units are to ensure that consignments of stores are forwarded only during these hours, unless for a special reason it is necessary to move stores at other times in which case prior authority of HQ SINGAPORE Area is necessary.
- 2. Sub-units are now required to present the following forms properly completed to the Customs office at Woodlands for clearance at the time the Stores are being despatched:
  - a. Form A Customs Ordinance No 44 of 1960 (one copy)
- b. Customs Form S C E110 W1322 Declaration of Dutiable Goods for Removal Under Exemption Or on Payment of Duty (three copies).
  - 3. Both these forms are available from HQ RAOC (Ord 2) at HQ 17 Div and may be had on application. The conditions require that each consignment of dutiable goods must be entered on the forms as shown at para 2.
  - The above procedure is required only in the case of consignments of stores despatched from unit in MALAYA to a store holding establishment in SINGAPORE (i.e. stores that come from MALAYA and will remain in SINGAPORE) and excludes arms and ammunition. It does not apply to units carrying their own equipment through SINGAPORE, or to SINGAPORE and return. Only stores that are dutiable in SINGAPORE are affected, other stores need not be shown. The list of such stores varies from time to time but a current list of the items most likely to affect units in MALAYA is shown at Annex A.

- Department that; in the case of units in MALAYA outside the boundaries of SINGAPORE Area, specimen signatures of officers authorising the despatch of stores need not be held. The forms must be signed individually by the officer (carbon copies will not be accepted), who must not be below the rank of Captain. His designation must be shown on the form (signatures "for" OC Unit are not acceptable); and the forms must carry the unit stamp. The unit telephone number should also be shown.
- There is no change in procedure for the move of stores from SINGAPORE to SOUTH JOHORE.

## 258. SINGLE ACCOMODATION - SOLDIERS

- 1. Soldiers Single Accommodation in either the HO FARELF Sgt's Mess or the Junior Ranks Berrack Rooms is not provided unless the Camp Orderly Room HQ FARELF/HQ SA have initially received an incoming posting or detachment authority.
- 2. Camp HQ FARELF/HQ SA is not a transit unit and it is repeated that personnel who are authorised as above may only be permitted to be accommodated in the Tanglin Sgt's Mess/Barrack Rooms if accommodation is available, and the requirement has been cleared with the Admin Offr HQ AAF.

## 259. DISCIPLINE - REPORTING TO THE BMH SINGAPORE

- 1. Cases have been reported whereby soldies are reporting to the BMH for appointments, admission, and treatment in civilian clothes.
  - 2. Standing Orders clearly state that when reporting sick, uniform is to be worn.
  - 3. Disciplinary action is to be taken against future offenders.

#### 260. WEAPONS SOUVENIRS

- Weapons bought as souvenirs, which includes daggers and knives; if carried unwrapped or worn can be regarded as showing intent to use. This may well result in a civil police charge, it being against the law in SINGAPORE to carry weapons or arms.
- 2. Servicemen should make sure on the purchase of such souvenirs that they are properly wrapped by the seller and are not unwrapped in a public place.

#### 261. SHUGGLING

- 1. During July, 1966, seven British Serviceman have been apprehended by the Malaysian Customs Authorities and held on charges of smuggling.
- 2. It is apparent that a syndicate is operating in SINGAPONE and approaches are made to Servicemen, particularly to those who have recently arrived in this Command.
- 3. It is also clear from the number of recent arrests that the Malaysian authorities are aware of the identity of the Syndicate and their method of operation. It is for that reason that Servicemen are being approached.

- 4. On 20th July, 1966, two sailors, who pleaded guilty to charges of smuggling, were given the alternative of paying a \$M4,000 fine or serving a year's imprisonment. (The car use: was also forfeited). Three soldiers are at present in custody, awaiting trial for a similar offence.
- 5. It should be understood that any serviceman, who is awarded a fine, is given a short time in which to pay, and this may be as little as thirty minutes. In default of payment he will serve a prison sentence in a Malaysian Civil gaol.

# 263. EXPLOSIVE DEVICES USED FOR FERIMETER DEFENCES, AMBUSHES, AND BOOBY TRAPS

- 1. The attention of all units is drawn to the July rewrite of DOBOPS Instruction No.8.
  - 2. In the interests of safety, units are to ensure that when they hand over, they pass on to the incom ng unit all RAOC Ammunition Bulletins, Pamphlets, and other local information on explosives devices.

  - a. Accurate positions of all devices must be known.
  - b. They must be regularly inspected. .
  - c. Only trained person el should set up and disarm devices.
  - d. Nobody is to a proach an electrically initiated device without first ensuring that the source of electrical energy is disconnected and wires taped back.
    - e. Where supply permits, and as advised by Ordnance representatives at Bde HQ's, devices should be destroyed by out-going units. When they are not destroyed accurate maps or records must be handed over to the incoming unit.

# 264. CARRAIGE OF ARMS IN TROOPING LEAFT

- It is stressed that LRT Aircraft, both RAF and Charter, are pressurised, and the carraige of arms loose in the passenger cabin could result in damage to the skin of the aircraft with disastrous results. For safety reasons, therefore, arms, when carried, must be properly packed in bundles of five, wrapped in hessian and stowed in the freight hold.
- Arms carried by individuals will be hessian wrapped, as above and also stowed in the freight hold.
