PART III

COMMANDERS DIARIES INSTRUCTIONS

AIM

1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organisation and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

GENERAL

2. *Entries will be made daily* on AF C2118, each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.

3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties in the Field", Chapter 2, Section 7.

RESPONSIBILITY

During Non-operational Periods

4. A Commanders Diary will be made by commanders of all formations.

During Operational Periods (see note 1)

5. A Commanders Diary will be made in duplicate by:—

- (a) Commanders of all formations.
- (b) Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a Brigadier or above.
- (c) Heads of services not below the rank of Lieutenant Colonel.
- (d) Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
- (e) Unit commanders.
- (f) Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

COMPILATION

6. Both original and duplicate copies will consist of:—

- (a) Cover (AF C2119).
- (b) Index as printed on cover.
- (c) Narrative (AF C2118).
- (d) Annexes as shown in the Index.

7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes will be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer will be included.

8. The annexes will be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an Annex NIL will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters, the relevant papers should be grouped as annexes starting at B.

9. Documents concerned with future planning for operations will form Annex "Z", "TOP SECRET Supplementary Diary" of the formation. The document. It will be prepared and disposed of as

12. The narrative will supplement and connect the annexes but need not give a precis of them.

DISPOSAL

During Non-Operational Periods

13. *Formation Headquarters* will forward the original Commanders Diary annually as at 31st December to reach the Army Records Centre (through Headquarters Field Records where applicable) as soon as possible after 1st January of the following year. The duplicate will be retained in formation headquarters.

14. *Units* will NOT render a Commanders Diary.

During Operational Periods

15. ORIGINAL COMMANDERS DIARIES

- (a) *Formations and units in the UK* will forward diaries monthly by the seventh day of the succeeding month direct to the Ministry of Defence (ARC for reports other than medical, AMD 1 for medical reports).
- (b) *Formations and units overseas* will forward diaries monthly by the seventh day of the succeeding month to the OIC Field Records for onward transmission to the Ministry of Defence.

16. **DUPLICATE COMMANDERS DIARIES.** These will be clearly marked as duplicates and will NOT be sent with the originals. They will be forwarded within two months as follows:—

- (a) *Units in the UK*
To the OIC parent record office.
- (b) *Formation Headquarters in the UK*
To OIC Central Clearing Wing, Infantry Records, Exeter.
- (c) *Units Overseas*
To the OIC Field Records for onward transmission to parent record office.
- (d) *Formation Headquarters Overseas*
To the OIC Field Records for onward transmission to the OIC Central Clearing Wing, Infantry Records, Exeter.

SECURITY

17. Documents concerned with future operational planning will be listed on AF C2118 and placed in a separate AF C2119. All details will be filled in and the cover will be clearly marked in red:—ANNEX Z—OFFICERS ONLY. It may be convenient to group the papers by annexes.

18. Supplementary diaries will be forwarded in accordance with the normal rules for TOP SECRET correspondence to the Ministry of Defence (ARC). The inner envelope will be clearly marked:—

19. The duplicate supplementary diaries will be despatched as in paragraph 16 as soon as receipt of the originals has been acknowledged.

NOTES

1. **Definition of Operational Period.**—The term “operational period” for the purpose of this instruction, means:—
 - (a) the period between a declaration of war and the official end of hostilities;
 - (b) any period spent in a theatre of operations;
 - (c) any period when engaged in any form of military operation.
2. The Ministry of Defence or headquarters concerned will be responsible for instructing units to submit Commanders' Diaries where the conditions of the unit's employment make this necessary. Wherever possible the beginning and end of the period will be clearly stated. Notwithstanding the above, on the outbreak of global war all units and formations which are not at the time submitting these reports will start compiling them with effect from M day and will thereafter render them in accordance with paragraphs 15 and 16.

277. ROUNDS 7.62 MM BALL - LODGED ROUNDS

1. The attention of all officers and warrant officers in charge of range parties is to be drawn to the following drill.
2. In the event of a bullet being found lodged or a rifle/gun damaged, the following action is to be taken:
 - a. Arm concerned to be grounded. (As for dangerous conduct in Fire with Movement Practices). See Infantry Training Volume III, Pamphlet 34, page 91, General Rule 200 (Army Code 70404).
 - b. Soldier ordered to stand back from the weapon and remain on guard.
 - c. OIC range party to order the weapon and surrounding area to be covered carefully with service groundsheets.
 - d. Ammunition Technical Officer or the Formation Duty Officer to be contacted immediately by telephone.
3. Under NO circumstances must the weapon, fragments, cases or even the surrounding ground be disturbed.
4. It is fully realised that the weapon is left, in these circumstances, in a loaded condition. Provided the action in paragraph 2 a.b.c. and d. is followed to the letter this is acceptable.
5. On being informed the Ammunition Technical Officer will immediately commence the investigation.



CIVILIAN IDENTITY CARDS - MALAYSIA

1. The regulations concerning the requirement for all visitors to Malaysia to be in possession of Civilian Identity Cards are not entirely clear.

2. To assist sub units and individuals, these regulations are reproduced and amplified below:

- a. All visitors to Malaysia for a period of more than one year, require a Civilian Identity Card issued by the Malaysian Registration Department. This requirement includes children aged 12 years and over. Members of the Commonwealth Armed Forces do not require Identity Cards in respect of themselves, but these are required for their families and dependants.

Children who visit their parents in Malaysia on Schoolchildren's holiday visits from UK/Aust do not require Malaysian Identity Cards. Children who attend Boarding School in Singapore and whose parents reside in West Malaysia require Malaysian Identity Cards on attaining the age of twelve.

- b. Civilian Identity Cards are to be obtained within 30 days of arrival in Malaysia or, for a child, within 30 days of attaining its 12th birthday. Failure to comply with this rule may result in civil prosecution. As an alternative to prosecution the Registration Officer may make an offer to compound the offence on payment of a fine, the rates of which are shown below:

(1) For a period not exceeding two months from date of arrival	\$3.00
(2) For a period not exceeding three months from date of arrival	\$5.00
(3) For a period not exceeding six months from date of arrival	\$10.00
(4) For a period not exceeding twelve months from date of arrival	\$20.00

(5) Periods exceeding a year are considered individually.

- c. On RTA. Civilian Identity Cards are to be handed to the Q (Mov) representative at the airport before embarkation. Q (Movement) are to return the Cards to the Malaysian Registration Department within 30 days of the departure of the family.

3. Sub-units are to ensure that:

- a. Each head of the family, or wife, is instructed to report to the Local Registration Office as soon as possible and in any case within 30 days of their arrival in Malaysia and obtain a Civilian Identity Card.

- b. Appropriate instructions to the above effect are published periodically in the Unit Orders.

4. The cost of the Civilian Identity Cards (including photographs, stamps etc), obtained by dependants of officers and soldiers will be permitted as a charge against public funds.

5. Claims for refund should be made on AF 01771 and must include the names of the Identity Card holders and the number of the Cards issued. Payment of claims submitted by officers will be made by the paying authority as in Manual of Pay Duties paragraph 1263. Claims by soldiers may be paid through the unit imprest account.

Execution

5. General Outline and Concept. This programme will comprise three major components, namely, military training, sport and administrative preparations for the relief in Malaysia and the move to Australia.

Military Training

6. The principal activities are illustrated with timings in a graph attached at Annex A. Certain items are also included in a chronological sequence of events (which includes other than military activities), at Annex B. Specific subjects in the field of military training are enlarged upon hereunder:

7. Official Training. The officer training programme prior to Ex GEDJELY has been executed. For the remaining period in Malaysia the emphasis will be on a lower level of instruction, that of the platoon commander. At the moment I am NOT satisfied with the standard of platoon leading and this has been highlighted during Ex SOUTHERN SWAN at KOTA TINGGI. A centralised officer training programme for platoon commanders will be conducted during the period 10 Jul to 29 Sep, with the aim of teaching officers to appreciate ground, to execute standing battle procedure including the necessity for adequate reconnaissance and to command and lead their platoons. This will be practised during platoon exercises in August codenamed Exercise SWANSONG.

8. Junior Leaders. 4 RAR is fortunate in possessing a large number of capable section commanders. However, there is both a requirement for more NCOs from the private soldier ranks and a need to improve on current capabilities. To meet this need I am attaching high priority to the running of an NCO Cadre in Aug/Sep which I hope will provide us with the basis for our junior NCO structure for Vietnam in 1968.

9. Battle Procedure. The mastery of a smooth flowing battle procedure is essential in operations. There are still areas in which this battalion has room for improvement. Recently issued to all officers is the revised 4 RAR SOP, and an instruction entitled "Trg/Ops Policy Statement 4 RAR" which is designed to obtain uniform drills and procedures to achieve this. Ensure that those documents are understood and practised.

10. Command Post. The CP is the hub and nerve centre of battalion operations. It is essential that the efficiency of this command element is maintained. The Operations Officer is responsible directly to me that not only are all ranks of the CP trained during this period in Malaysia, but that planning and preliminary training and earmarking of personnel for 4 RAR CP for Vietnam is in hand.

11. Support Company Platoons. The battalion has suffered the loss of many trained support platoon rank and file recently, and platoons are only now returning to their earlier levels of combat efficiency. To speed up this process, I am attaching the Tracker Platoon to JWS for the period 16 Jun - 12 Aug, while the Mor Platoon will culminate its training with a field firing exercise at Asahan in August. The Assault Pioneer Platoon will train on a variety of projects including Operation Gotong Royong, the supervision and part implementation of the reconstruction of the Fortified Village and other tasks. The Signal Platoon in addition to ensuring internally that it is capable of fulfilling its role of providing signal communications for the battalion, will assist in the training of all officers, and selected NCOs in Voice Procedure.

12. Voice Procedure. We must pay more attention to this subject. The PSO in conjunction with the Training Officer is responsible to me for drawing up a programme of training for officers and NCOs during this Phase.

Introduction

1. This will be the final training supplement produced for 4 RAR in Malaysia, and is designed to cover the period from the conclusion of Ex GEDJELY on 30 Jun 67 to 30 Sep 67, when the main body begins to move to Australia.

2. The battalion has received the news it has been waiting and training for, that is, a Warning Order to prepare for operations in South Vietnam in May 1968 as part of 1 ATF and with our sister battalion 3 RAR. Between now and May of next year the battalion will undergo a considerable turnover of private soldiers due to the discharge of NSM from a number of intakes currently posted into 4 RAR. It is to be hoped that the basic officer and NCO structure remains intact. The next ten months may be roughly subdivided as under:-

a. Phase 1

Jul - Oct : Final period in Malaysia including the air move back to Australia.

b. Phase II

Oct - Dec : ARL - Regrouping and recognition at Enoggera, Queensland.

c. Phase III

Dec - Apr : Training.

d. Phase IV

May : Operations in Vietnam.

3. This supplement will deal with Phase I only. The remaining Phases will be the subject of subsequent instructions.

Aim

4. In the light of our projected operational tasks, I have expanded the Aim of my Training Directive 1967 as under:-

a. To ensure that 4 RAR remains operationally ready at short notice to be employed as part of the Commonwealth Strategic Reserve in Counter Revolutionary War anywhere in South East Asia; and

b. To organise and train the command and control elements of 4 RAR, specialist cadres and NCOs down to section level for operations in Vietnam in May 1968.

.../2

21. Commonwealth Week or Exercise CONCORD will provide the battalion with the opportunity for successful competition against other units of the brigade in a great variety of sports. I expect us to do well. Finally, I want the junior officers to get in and both lead and play with their men in as many sports as possible.

22. 2/67 Unit PTI Course will be held by Sgt RYAN in Aug and I want companies to take advantage of this opportunity to obtain a nucleus of trained PTIs. Organised PT will continue to feature as a regular part of the training programme during this period of Phase I.

Administration and Preparation RTA

23. Planning has already begun in conjunction with HQ AAF for the relief in Malaysia of 4 RAR by 8 RAR. Our aim is to ensure:

- a. a smooth march out/hand over/takeover at Terendak.
- b. an equally smooth RTA involving movement on ARL, assembly after leave at Enoggera, and settlement of families in suitable accommodation.

24. It is of absolute importance that both a. and b. are achieved and that 4 RAR leaves this theatre without any administrative reproaches levelled from any quarter. It is of equal importance that planning and reconnaissance is adequate to ensure that no distress or upsets are occasioned in the routine flight or in the subsequent occupation of Enoggera Barracks and married quarters/hirings.

25. It is therefore essential that companies and other sub units note carefully and abide by the contents of 4 RAR memorandum "Q Planning for RTA" dated 9 Jun 67 and to pay particular attention and adherence to the timings laid down. There is adequate time for preparations for RTA, but the success of the operation is dependent on the co-operation of all ranks and families.

26. With regard to movement of families and as stated earlier, the passage of all information relative to the movement and conditions at Enoggera/Brisbane will be passed as promptly as possible through normal command/unit channels. This will be supplemented by the Families News Letter, and when appropriate by a personal briefing from myself or designated officers of 4 RAR.

27. Finally, on this subject every priority and assistance will be given to the Quartermaster and his staff to ensure a successful hand over and move.

Conclusion

28. I wrote in my initial Training Directive of our unofficial motto "Have guns - prepared to travel". Higher authority has now given us the chance. If we wish to use these guns to the best advantage we must take every opportunity to use what little time is actually left to master our various skills.

29. Remember, the ultimate aim of every combat infantryman is to be able to join the Returned Servicemen's League!!

13. Shooting. I have spoken and written on this before. We badly need practise, both in day and night shooting. Both Ex DEADEYE and the RUR Trophy Competition will be a good test of our ability in this field. Consistent with the availability of training ammunition which I know is low, I want sub unit commanders to devote maximum attention and ingenuity to improving our ability to shoot straight, particularly at combat targets at short range by day and night.

14. Fieldcraft. Under this heading is the requirement by all ranks to appreciate and to use ground. I am concerned at the general low standard of scouting and this must be improved and the scout group in each section trained to operate as such. The ability to navigate is of the utmost importance and the capability and technique of movement by night is one which I believe we must master.

15. Admin Coy and Bn HQ. When a battalion is referred to, many people think only in terms of the men in the rifle sections or mortar platoon. We in 4 RAR understand that the success or otherwise of operations and training is entirely dependent on team work, and that the rifle section is rendered useless or comparatively ineffective if the administrative and supply back up is not available.

16. It is extremely important therefore that the officers and senior NCOs of the support elements of the battalion appreciate that I expect them to maintain a high level of efficiency and training so that the battalion aim is always achieved. I refer to all members of Administration Company including the Quartermaster Platoon, the Transport, Medical Platoons and Band plus Battalion Headquarters with its clerks, Regimental Police and Intelligence Section. The LAD, 182 Air Recce Flt, the cooks of the Catering Corps and Army Education Corps staff all have their part to play and I expect nothing but the highest standard of them. Do NOT forget however, that ALL members of the battalion or its attached units are expected to be physically fit and achieve the one uniform regimental standard of smartness that 4 RAR stands for.

17. Parade and Ceremonial. A unit is judged by allsorts and levels of people and by different standards and categories of military conduct. This unit, while in 28 COMWEL Bde particularly, is judged by units of the garrison, senior foreign officials and senior officers and high ranking visitors, on its smartness in turnout, outward signs of discipline and performance on parade and ceremonial. I also believe that smartness on the parade ground is complementary to skill and efficiency on operations.

18. 4 RAR will continue therefore to maintain the high standard it has reached on parade in ceremonial here. The RSM will ensure that this is achieved through regular battalion parades, guard mounting and other means. The adjutant will ensure that the officers are equally proficient in this field. We are second to none in this department at Terendak now and we will leave the Garrison in October at the same level of efficiency.

Sport

19. There should be no excuse for any member of 4 RAR to be unfit during the next Phase. A detailed sporting programme has been organised to cater for inter company, inter unit and miscellaneous social competitions in a great variety of sports. The detail of this programme is contained in 4 RAR Sports Instruction 1/67 dated 10 May 67.

20. The aim of the Sports Programme is to ensure that by playing at least one sport regularly, all ranks become physically fit, and as a result, more efficient soldiers. I strongly advise everyone to make the most of this opportunity as the emphasis will switch very drastically on our return to Australia.





307. LIFE INSURANCE FOR MEMBERS OF THE FORCES

Ref AROs 10 May 67.

1. Members will have observed reports that in life insurance matters they are at a disadvantage by comparison with civilians.
2. Life insurance policies are written for a definite period and all terms and conditions are set out in the contract when it is effected. There is, therefore, no question of existing policies being re-written without the consent of the policy holder so as to vary the protection afforded by those policies.
3. Members are advised that:
 - a. Insurance policies effected prior to their enlistment under ordinary peace-time conditions at normal premium rates should not be affected by their posting to a battle zone or combat area; these policies should, however, be read carefully to find out the exact scope of the cover provided.
 - b. Most insurance companies will continue to issue policies to servicemen on the same basis as if they were civilians, provided that they are not under notice of posting to a battle zone or combat area and are not subject to any other form of special or extra risks.
 - c. New policies sought by a member after receiving notice of posting to a battle zone or combat area can be expected to include war risk clauses limiting the benefit payable on death due to war unless a substantially higher premium is paid while the member is exposed to war risks.

It will be seen, therefore, that if prior to notice of posting to a battle zone or combat area, a member has effected a policy up by the insurance company when the member actually commences to render service which exposes him to war risk. On the other hand, difficulties can be expected by those who choose to delay effecting insurance until after receipt of notice of such a posting.

5. Whilst the matter of life insurance is essentially a matter between the individual member and the insurance company, the foregoing is brought to notice so that those members who might wish to effect life insurance are fully aware of the real advantages of effecting insurance prior to being given notice of posting to a battle zone or combat area.



311. PARKING AND DRIVING OF VEHICLES ON HQ BDE PARADE GROUND

1. No military or private vehicles are to be parked or driven over the HQ Bde Parade Ground with the following exceptions:

a. Cars of personnel attending presentations in the Bde Presentation Hall.

b. Landrovers and trailers loading and unloading at HQ 28 Bde and Sig Sqn stores.

312. SOLDIERS EMPLOYING AMAS PRIVATELY

1. The attention of all sub unit commanders is drawn to ARO 245/64, particularly para 4, 6, 7 and Annexure 'A'. A requirement within the terms of entitlement to Married Accompanied rates of Local Overseas Allowance is that where a soldier employs a servant privately he MUST protect himself against claims by his employee for injury arising out of such employment by means of Employers Liability Insurance. Provision for this is included within the rate of Local Overseas Allowance.

2. a. Every married soldier is to sign the following certificate as part of his arrival document:

"I certify that when I employ a domestic servant I will take out an Employment Liability Insurance policy in the terms of para 6 of ARO 245/64 and is to be witnessed.

b. The certificate is to be filled with the soldier's documents.

3. Once a quarter sub units are to call in policies and check that they are current. Where a policy is found to be lapsed (or does not exist) insurance is to be effected forthwith by the soldier or if he fails to do so his allowance stopped as at the date of check.

4. Personnel who have not yet completed certificate required by para 2 above are to do so forthwith.

313. ARMY AVIATION - PASSENGERS' CLOTHING

1. One of the main reasons why pilots wear an overall when flying is to minimise the risk of serious burns in the event of a fire. It is also mandatory for them to fly with sleeves rolled down for the same reasons.

2. It is not generally known that DACRON material and NYLON socks or stockings present a particularly serious risk in the event of fire because of low temperature at which these materials ignite or melt.

3. All passengers in army aircraft are advised not to wear DACRON uniforms when flying, and, when wearing normal OG, to roll down their sleeves before getting into aircraft. This is not a new development but is brought to your notice because more and more DACRON is being worn and, like fastening seat belts in motor cars, these are sensible precautions to be taken.

314. CARRIAGE OF EXPECTANT MOTHERS IN AIRCRAFT

1. Movement Regulations and Instructions (Army Code 14466) paragraph 263(b) (iv) restricts the number of expectant mothers in trooping flights to 4 per cent of the total passenger load. It is a responsibility of HQ 17 Div to tell an aircraft captain of a flight under their control, how many expectant mothers he has on board.

2. So that this information can be passed to the captain it is essential for the Expected Date of Confinement (EDC) to be given on the Application for Movement - Form F 2768 (FE) (The Yellow Card).

3. With immediate effect, therefore, all Forms F 2768 (FE) in respect of expectant mothers will be endorsed IN RED under "Remarks" with the EDC, irrespective of the journey to be taken.

315. DISCIPLINE - BOUNDS

1. The battalion ovals adjacent to the JRC are not to be used as a thoroughfare. Soldiers are to walk around and NOT across the ovals.

2. The ovals are NOT to be used as driving ranges by golfers.

1. The attention of all sub units is drawn to reference which states that Paludrine should be continued for 28 days after leaving the malarious area.
