 - f. If arms are being carried by personnel accompanying the vehicles, the types of arms being carried should be mentioned.

438. DISCIPLINE - COMMON TEALTH CLUB

The following extracts from Garrison Standing Orders are republished for information and strict compliance:

a. DRESS

Dress to be worn by male military personnel within the Club is as follows:-

(1) By Day

Either

(a) Slacks, socks and shoes or sandals, or "flip-flops" without socks, shirt with collar attached or 'T' shirt

or

(b) Shorts, stockings and shoes or sandals, or "flip-flops" without stockings, shirt with collar attached or 'T' shirt.

(2) By Night (ie After 1900 hrs)

Slacks, socks and shoes, shirt with attached collar, sleeves need not be rolled down and a tie need not be worn, but ends of the shirt must be tucken into the waist of the trousers.

- (3) Items of uniform must not be worn with civilian clothing, nor may "flip-flops" or 'T' shirts be worn after 1900 hrs.
- (4) The wearing of swimming apparel is not permitted in the club after 1830 hrs.

b. OPENING HOURS

- (1) Daily except Saturdays 1000 hrs to 2300 hrs
- (2) Saturdays 1000 hrs to 2359 hrs
- (3) Bar times
 - (a) Mon Fri (incl) 1200 1400 hrs 1800 - 2230 hrs
 - (b) Sat 1200 1400 hrs 1900 - 2230 hrs
 - (c) Sun/Public 1200 1430 hrs
 Holidays 1900 2230 hrs
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(4) Closing

All members and guests must vacate the Club and be clear of it and the immediate area:

- (a) By 2300 hrs Daily except SATURDAY NIGHT
- (b) By 2400 hrs SATURDAY NIGHT
- (5) An extension may be authorised in suitable circumstances.

c. CHILDREN

Water Hard

- (1) No child under 11 years of age is allowed on the Club premises or in the pool or immediate area unless accompanied by a parent or other responsible adult.
- (2) No children under the age of 17 years will be allowed in the Club after 1900 hrs.

d. ANIMALS

No animals are allowed in the Club or in the outside area where meals are served. All animals found in the Beach Club will be taken away and destroyed.

e. SWIMMING POOL

- (1) The Swimming Pool will be open from 1000 hrs to 1900 hrs daily, except Tuesday from 0900 1100 hrs when the pool is closed for cleaning and maintenance.
- (2) Rules for the Swimming Pool, which are prominently displayed, must be complied with.
- (3) Parents are to exercise strong control of their children as there are no life savers at the pool,
- (4) The Club Committee accepts no responsibility for any incidents resulting from lack of parental control, over children using the Pool.

f. PRIVATE PROPERTY

No liability will be accepted by the club for articles lost on the club premises.

g. ADMITTANCE

Members of the public and paid employees with the Garrison are NOT permitted access to the Club or its facilities unless invited and escorted by a member of the Club.

h. ALCOHOLIC LIQUOR

- (1) All alcoholic liquor must be consumed within thirty minutes of bar closing times and all liquor not consumed in this time will be confiscated.
- (2) Bottles of spirits will not be brought into the Club.
- (3) Bulk buying of beer and liquor is not allowed.
- (4) No child will be served with beer or spirits in any circumstances.
- (5) Members are not to take alcoholic liquor onto the beach or away from the Club premises.

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j. DISCIPLINE

- (1) The Duty NCO will order anyone out of the Club who is either misbehaving or not complying with the Club rules.

4 RAR TRAINING DIRECTIVE

Reference: A. 4 RAR Training Directive 1967

B. Supplement No 2 dated 13 Jun 1967

Anned H. J. Brillows

Introduction

- This Directive will deal with the problems of reorganisation and training of 4 RAR in preparation for operations in SOUTH VIETNAM in 1968. It will cover Phase II and Phase III referred to at para 2.b. and c. of reference B, and will be read in conjunction with both documents at reference above.
- 2. The paper will be divided into two parts. PART I will deal with the reorganisation which has a vital bearing on and is a necessary backdrop to Part II which deals with the training programme in AUSTRALIA prior to departure.

Aim

3. To bring 4 RAR to the highest degree of operational readiness by 20 May 68.

Execution

4. General Concept - A period from Oct to Dec 67 in which the battalion is reorganised in accordance with the AFV establishment concurrent with the conduct of individual training and attendance at cadres and courses. Commencing Jan 68 an intensive training programme will be put into effect culminating with a battalion exercise in Apr 68 prior to departure to VIETNAM in May/Jun.

PART I - REORGANISATION

General

- This phase will cater for the progressive discharge of National Service Intakes 1/66, 2/66 and 3 /66 and the absorption of Intakes 1/67, 2/67, 3/67 and 4/67 in addition to drafts of ARA. It will be noted that Intake 4/66 will accompany 4 RAR to VIETNAM.
- 6. Major aspects of policy with regard to the reorganisation are:
 - a. Each National Service Intake complement will be posted throughout the battalion and will NOT be concentrated as a sub unit or major part thereof.
 - b. Those National Servicemen NOT accompanying 4 RAR to VIETNAM will remain in their present platoons and become supernumerary to establishment.
 - c. All companies will be reformed and built up to strength concurrently. In general terms the battalion is expected to be approaching full establishment during Dec.

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- d. The personnel earmarked as Theatre Supplement 4 RAR will be allotted to platoons and sections.
- e. Promotions will generally be made from within unit resources.

Execution

- 7. General Outline This will be effected progressively in three phases as follows:
 - a. Phase I The allocation of National Service Intakes 1/67 and 2/67 and available ARA soldiers to sub units.
 - b. Phase II The allocation of National Service Intake 3/67 and remaining ARA.
 - c. Phase III The allocation of National Service Intake 4/67.
- 8. Phase I All sub units will retain National Servicemen currently posted and accept reinforcements in accordance with the scale at Annex A.
- 9. Phase II See Annex & for reinforcement scale.
- 10. Phase III The allocation of Intake 4/67 and the balance of ARA drafts will be advised. By the conclusion of Phase II all sub units should be at effective strength for operations. Soldiers from Phase III will constitute part of 4 RAR Theatre Supplement and make good shortfalls resultant on normal wastage.

11. Co-ordinating Instructions

- a. Timings
 - (1) Phase I Begin 1 Nov 67 Conclude 15 Nov 67
 - (2) Phase II Begin 14 Dec 67 Conclude 18 Dec 67
 - (3) Phase III Begin NOT before 15 Mar 68 Conclude 27 Mar 68.
- b. Residual Service Requirement for AAFV as follows:
 - (1) NS 4 months.
 - (2) ARA 4 months.
- c. Movement of Intakes
 - (1) NS Intake 1/66 Due for discharge in Feb 68; will remain 4 RAR until mid Dec 67.
 - (2) NS Intake 2/66 Due for discharge early Apr 68; length of duty with 4 RAR to be advised.
 - (3) NS Intake 3/66 Due for discharge Jul 68; to be advised.
 - (4) NS Intake 4/66 Due for discharge in Sep 68; will remain and move with 4 RAR to VIETNAM.
 - (5) NO movement of soldiers will take place unless authorised by Bn HQ 4 RAR.

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Command and Control

- 12. Command of 4 RAR will pass to Lt Col L R GREVILLE on 8 Jan 68. The proposed officer appointment table is attached at Annex B.
- 13. The recently concluded NCO Cadre will provide the battalion with sufficient junior NCOs. Final action on senior NCOs and warrant officers is deferred pending the receipt of posting orders, the results of warrant officer qualification courses in AUSTRALIA and some personal considerations. Based on certain assumptions a provisional first key plan for Warrant Officers, Staff Sergeants and Sergeants is attached at Annex C.
- Responsibility for the Australian Infantry Battalion 28 COMWEL Inf Bde passes from 4 RAR to 8 RAR at 1000hrs 16 Oct 67. 4 RAR will open at ENOGGERA BRISBANE at 1200hrs 23 Oct 67.
- 15. Currently 4 RAR Australiah Component and subsequently 4 RAR will come under the immediate command of HQ 6 TF.

PART II - TRAINING

General

- Time is short and the ideal progressive sequence of training to battalion level will not always be possible to achieve. Certain set periods have been ordered by higher authority for certain types of training, e.g. sub unit training at JTC CANUNGRA, battalion exercises and other activities. Commanders at all levels must be imbued with a sense of urgency and take advantage of every opportunity to carry out necessary training individual or collective. The responsibility will devolve to a great extent on company commanders to ensure that the training syllabus is fully met.
- 17. The block training syllabus for 4 RAR is attached at Annex D. It includes the JTC programme which can NOT be altered. It includes the complete range of training from individual to collective training. On this company commanders will base their sub unit training programmes.
- 18. A timetable of training for major activities is attached at Annex E. Company timings and sequence for attendance at JTC are included.
- 19. In the next part of this paper I have drawn attention to those aspects of training where I consider special emphasis should be placed. I have also laid down guidelines for sub unit commanders from Support and Administration Company which I want observed.

Special Aspects of Training

- Shooting I have spoken to you about this subject before. Our shooting is bad and MUST improve if we wish to achieve results in operations. Accurancy can only be achieved by continual practise and every effort will be directed to obtain this in AUSTRALIA. Your bible for this is as outlined in 4 RAR 234-1-37 of 8 Aug 67 and TIB 13. I want hits on the fleeting target with the first round, and I want accurate shooting at short ranges by night.
- 21. Fieldcraft Scouting is still poor and our instruction must emphasise the mechanics of movement, the use of cover and the interpretation of terrain coupled with enemy movement. The ability to navigate is of the utmost importance and this is doubly important at night. These aspects of training must have high priority for attention by all platoon commanders.

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- Field Engineering/Mines and Booby Traps There have been far too many casualties caused by both enemy action and our own ignorance in VIETNAM. This subject should not need any reminders from me as to its importance. Because 4 RAR Aslt Pnr Pl will not be at the required standard before 20 Feb 68, training in this area for companies will be sought from outside sources. Company commanders must ensure that a review of this type of training is made during the latter stages of the training programme so as to ensure that all ranks are trained in these skills.
- 23. Field Firing/Battle Inoculation Exercise HOT SHOT is a priority activity for every rifle company to complete. It is an exercise at platoon and company level prepared by Battalion Headquarters, and includes live firing and battle inoculation. It is a most important part of the preparation of men and sub units for operations and I want all officers to put the maximum effort into making it a success.
- Air Support and APC Training The aim of this training is to familiarise all ranks with the procedures and drills currently in use in 1 ATF, so that the ninimum of theatre familiarisation on arrival is necessary. The success of this training will hinge largely on the degree of support made available to us from external sources, but this aspect will be investigated as early as possible.
- 25. Medical Training Every soldier must have reached as a minimum level that of Military Skills Group 6. Only2 days have been allotted for first aid and this must be fully utilised. Every soldier must have practised and be capable of rendering first aid in the field. Health training only has 2 periods allotted, and therefore I expect all officers and NCOs who know the standard to which this battalion works, to continually check and enforce health discipline.

JTC Sub Unit Training

- 26. 4 RAR officers and NCOs will train their own sub units with JTC staff overall control and supervision. To this end a BE (Basic Efficiency) Cadre of officers and NCOs from all companies will attend preliminary instruction at JTC during Nov/Dec 67.
- 27. The training period is for four weeks progressing from individual training through section and platoon, and culminating with company level exercises. The training is based on the experiences gained from operations in VIETNAM and it is most important that the full benefit is obtained from this experienced instruction.
- 28. Specialist Training The individual training of our specialists is already in hand. (See 4 RAR 235-4-4 dated 8 Sep 67). Much still remains to be done and collective training must be fitted in to all our other commitments.
 - a. Mortar Platoon The Mortar Platoon Commander is to ensure that:-
 - (1) MFCs are fully trained and can call down mortar fire at the minimum safety distance.
 - (2) Command post(s) can compute and control quickly and accurately under pressure.
 - (3) Deployment drills, including the use of madio orders and transmission of task tables, are effective and skilled.
 - (4) Mortar drills are correct, quick and produce accurate fire in the shortest time.
 - (5) Trained reserves are available for key positions within the platoon.

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- b. Signals Platoon The Regimental Signals Officer is to ensure that:-
 - (1) All regimental signallers attain the highest possible standard of voice procedure and VHF techniques. HF techniques will receive attention but the priority remains with VHF.
 - (2) All company operators are proficient and follow up training whenever necessary is co ordinated with the company commander.
 - (3) His functional groups, such as forward control detachment and rifle company teams, are formed early and train with their sub unit.
 - (4) The line section is formed and trained in its duties as well as in those of reserve radio operators.
 - (5) The capability and capacity exists to deploy an efficient signal centre.
 - (6) In conjunction with the Training Officer, to see that officers and NCOs reach an acceptable standard of voice procedure.
- c. Anti Tank/Tracker Platoon The anti tank requirement has yet to be advised. It is sufficient here to note that the 106MM RCL is on establishment and training will need to be conducted for this role. The emphasis however is to be on tracker training, and the OC Tracker Platoon is to ensure that:
 - (1) Four six man/one dog teams can be deployed by 1 Mar 68.
 - (2) The teams are maintained at an acceptable level of training after centralised training, probably at Inf Centre, has been completed.
 - (3) The basic principles of tracking are covered with rifle companies. (Serial 12 of Annex D), and the teams deploy with rifle platoons whenever possible (Serial 6 of Annex D).
 - (4) Teams can move lightly equipped over long distances for a minimum of 48 hours.
- d. Assault Pioneer Platoon The Assault Pioneer Platoon Commander is to ensure that:-
 - (1) He reorganises on a four (4) section basis within his establishment.
 - (2) A regular assault section/rifle company affiliation is established as soon as possible.
 - (3) Sections are effectively trained and expert on all pioneer skills and flame throwing.
 - (4) The platoon is trained to also operate as a fifle platoon.
- e. Quarternaster Platoon The Quarternaster is to ensure that a 50, pool of "Q" clerks and storemen are trained and held within the battalion.

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- f. Transport Platoon The MTO is to ensure that all drivers on establishment are Group 4 driver standard and that a 50% pool of trained drivers are held in the unit.
- g. Medical Platoon The RMO is to ensure that:-
 - (1) The stretcher bearer element is raised and trained fully as quickly as possible.
 - (2) In conjunction with company commanders, the minimum standard stated in para 25 is achieved and maintained.
- h. "A" Clerks The assistant adjutant is to ensure that clerk vacancies are filled by course trained personnel and that a 50% pool is in existence.
- Operations Officer is to produce for me a training plan for the CP catering for individual and team skills and procedures. The CP is to be functional by 1 Har 68. Co operation with Supporting Arms and the RAAF is to be included in the plan. 4 RAR current SOPs remain the basis for this training.
- 30. Officer Training This will take place but will be the subject of a separate instruction when the commitments become clearer at BRISBANE.
- Motivation Training The soldier must be briefed and instructed as to the background of the VIETNAM war and why we are involved. It is important that he understands why he is fighting, whom he is fighting and what to expect if he is unfortunate enough to become a prisoner. The training programme provisionally caters for this including an exercise dealing with Code of Conduct. The implementation of this aspect will be dependent on the availability and provision of qualified Intelligence personnel, and approval from higher headquarters.
- 32. Other Activities I warned you earlier that there would be very little time for sport at BRISBANE, certainly not on the scale we have been fortunate enough to enjoy in MALAYSIA. However, every opportunity will be taken to play sport to counter staleness and to keep physically fit. Similarly, the scale of ceremonial will be kept to a minimum but I expect the same standard of discipline, smartness and precision for which we are rightly renowned in TERENDAK. This only means that officers and NCOs must work harder at it with less opportunities than before to keep the standard high.

Conclusion

- 33. I am writing this Directive to you but will not be there to see you put it to the test in VIETNAM. If you give your new Commanding Officer the loyalty and effort that you have given me, I am sure that your tour of duty in the operational area will be above average.
- 34. Once your leave in AUSTRALIA is over, get back on the job and pull out all the stops time is very short for you.
- 35. I gave you your unofficial motto in Nov 66. You have the guns you are going to travel see that you shoot straight. Good luck to you all.
