INSTRUCTIONS

AIM

1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organisation and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

GENERAL

- 2. Entries will be made daily on AF C2118, each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.
- 3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties in the Field", Chapter 5, Section 1.

RESPONSIBILITY

During Non-operational Periods

- 4. A Commanders Diary will be made by commanders of all formations.

During Operational Periods (see note 1)

- 5. A Commanders Diary will be made in duplicate by:—
 - (a) Commanders of all formations.
 - (b) Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a Brigadier or above.
 - (c) Heads of services not below the rank of Lieutenant Colonel.
 - (d) Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
 - (e) Unit commanders.
 - (f) Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

COMPILATION

- 6. Both original and duplicate copies will consist of:—
 - (a) Cover (AF C2119).
 - (b) Index as printed on cover.
 - (c) Narrative (AF C2118).
 - (d) Annexes as shown in the Index.
- 7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes will be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer will be included.
- 8. The annexes will be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an Annex NIL will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters, the relevant papers should be grouped as annexes starting at B.
- 9. Documents concerned with future planning for operations will form Annex "Z", "TOP SECRET" marking the document. It will be prepared and disposed of as follows.
- 19. The duplicate supplementary diaries will be prepared and the original has been acknowledged.

- 1. Definition of Operational Period.—The term "operational period" shall mean:
 - (a) the period between a declaration of war and the cessation of hostilities;

- 2. The War Office or headquarters concerned will be responsible for the conditions of the unit's employment make this clear. 12. The narrative will supplement and connect the annexes but need not give a precis of them.

DISPOSAL

During Non-Operational Periods

13. *Formation Headquarters* will forward the original Commanders Diary annually as at 31st December to reach the War Office Records Centre (through Headquarters Field Records where applicable) as soon as possible after 1st January of the following year. The duplicate will be retained in formation headquarters.

14. *Units* will NOT render a Commanders Diary.

During Operational Periods

15. ORIGINAL COMMANDERS DIARIES

- (a) *Formations and units in the UK* will forward diaries monthly by the seventh day of the succeeding month direct to the War Office (WORC for reports other than medical, AMD 1 for medical reports).
- (b) *Formations and units overseas* will forward diaries monthly by the seventh day of the succeeding month to the OIC Field Records for onward transmission to the War Office.

16. **DUPLICATE COMMANDERS DIARIES.** These will be clearly marked as duplicates and will NOT be sent with the originals. They will be forwarded within two months as follows:—

- (a) *Units in the UK*
To the OIC parent record office.
- (b) *Formation Headquarters in the UK*
To OIC Central Clearing Wing, Infantry Records, Exeter.
- (c) *Units Overseas*
To the OIC Field Records for onward transmission to parent record office.

To the OIC Field Records for onward transmission to the OIC Central Clearing Wing, Infantry Records, Exeter.

18. Supplementary diaries will be forwarded in accordance with the normal rules for TOP SECRET correspondence to the War Office (WORC). The inner envelope will be clearly marked:—

19. The duplicate supplementary diaries will be despatched as in paragraph 16 as soon as receipt of the originals has been acknowledged.

NOTES

1. *Definition of Operational Period.*—The term “operational period” for the purpose of this instruction, means:—
- (a) the period between a declaration of war and the official end of hostilities;
- (b) any period spent in a theatre of operations;
- (c) any period when engaged in any form of military operation.
2. The War Office or headquarters concerned will be responsible for instructing units to submit Commanders' Diaries where the conditions of the unit's employment make this necessary. Wherever possible the beginning and end of the period will be clearly stated. Notwithstanding the above, on the outbreak of global war all units and formations which are not at the time submitting these reports will start compiling them with effect from M day and will thereafter render them in accordance with paragraphs 15 and 16.

The form will be enclosed with the annexes in AF C 2119. If this is not available the cover will be prepared in manuscript.

1. Ex 'LIONS ROAR' will be held in the MARANG area on the NE coast from 28 Mar to 6 Apr 66. 28 Bde is to operate against a controlled enemy. HQ 17 Div/MALAYA District will control the exercise.

Aims

2. The aims are related to the current SEATO role.
 - a. To practise the deployment, on arrival, in a river watching and general area security role, in the face of both a mounting guerilla threat, and enemy infiltration across the obstacle.
 - b. To practise the Bn in dealing with both minor and major crossings, of the obstacle in particular by the employment of air mobile reserves.
 - c. To practise offensive air sp procedures.

3. Friendly Forces 4 RAR is part of BLUE force and consists of:

- a. 4 RAR minus rear party (see App 2 to Annex A for details).
- b. Tp 4 RTR

GENERAL IDEA

Introduction

1. The year is 1966. The MALAYA peninsula is divided into TWO mythical countries:
 - a. MISA - A member of SEATO
 - b. BARBARIA - An aggressive Communist country.
2. The frontier between MISA in the SOUTH and BARBARIA in the NORTH is the S TRENGGANU up to its source, and thence westward along the inter-state boundaries between KELANTAN and PAHANG and PERAK and SELANGOR.
3. The sector of the frontier with which this exercise is concerned is the S TRENGGANU.
4. VANDALLA is an Asian Communist World Power to the NORTH OF BARBARIA.

The Threat

5. The threat to MISA is twofold:
 - a. Internal. Over the years BARBARIANS have settled in NORTH EAST MISA, particularly along the coast and up the larger rivers. They are farmers and fishermen. The MISA Communist Party is strong amongst these settlers and many young men and women have received guerrilla training in BARBARIA. A force of 1,000 armed guerrillas is ready to take the field in the MARANG - S TRENGGANU area alone when orders are received from BARBARIA. The indigenous MISA populations is basically anti-communist, but although numerically much superior are easily terrorised by the tough BARBARIAN settlers.
 - b. External
 - (1) Land threat. Two divisions of the BARBARIAN Army are deployed in SOUTH EAST BARBARIA, facing MISA on the S TRENGGANU front. We can plan on seven days' warning of an intended overt offensive.
 - (2) Air threat. Two squadrons of MIG 17 fighter-ground attack aircraft, of the VANDAL Air Force, plus a number of reconnaissance aircraft, have "volunteered" for service with the BARBARIANS, and are based at BUTTERWORTH.
 - (3) Sea threat. Limited to a few BARBARIAN gun boats. The BARBARIANS, however, have available a large number of native craft with crews experienced in local conditions.

Defence Plans

6. Contingency plan, LIONS ROAR - PLAN V for the defence of MISA involves the deployment of TWO Divisions, FOUR US Divisions and 1 Commonwealth Division. 1 Commonwealth Division has 3 Commando Brigade RM, 28 Commonwealth Infantry Brigade and C Squadron 22 SAS under command.
7. The tasks given to 1 Commonwealth Division are :
 - a. To relieve 1 MISA brigade on the line of the S TRENGGANU and to deny that line to the enemy.
 - b. To ensure the road DUNGUN - KUALA TRENGGANU.
8. To achieve these tasks the plan for initial deployment is:

- a. 3 Commando Brigade RM to move by sea and deploy into the KUALA TRENGGANU sector.
- b. 28 Commonwealth Infantry Brigade to move by air into MARANG and deploy on the left of 3 Commando Brigade RM.
- c. C Squadron, 22 SAS to be dropped in depth WEST of the S TRENGGANU in front of 1 Commonwealth Division.

9. 1 MISAN Brigade, normally stationed in the TRENGGANU - DUNGUN area will cover the deployment of 1 Commonwealth Division. As 28 Commonwealth Infantry Brigade and 3 Commando Brigade RM reach their positions on S TRENGGANU, elements of 1 MISAN Brigade thus relieved will regroup and assume responsibility for the defence of the frontier on the left of 28 Commonwealth Infantry Brigade pending arrival of 29 Infantry Brigade sometime after D + 15.

10. Outline Timings

D day - is the day when LIONS ROAR - PLAN V is activated.

Task

11. The initial task of 28 Commonwealth Infantry Brigade on arrival in the area is to secure the line of the S TRENGGANU within its boundaries.

HQ 1 COMWEL DIVISION INTELLIGENCE SUMMARY No. 34/66

BARBARIA

Political

1. It is now clearly only a matter of days before BARBARIA attacks MISA with or without a declaration of war.
2. There has been a complete clamp down by the frontier control and traffic at all airports has been severely restricted. MISA citizens resident in the main town are being interned.
3. Increasing number of demonstrations against British and American presence in SE Asia have been taking place. On 21 Mar the British Consulate in KUALA KRIS was besieged by mobs demanding the expulsion of the Consul. The car of a visiting US official was greeted by a hail of durians and the passenger managed to gain refuge in the Consulate only with the greatest difficulty.
4. The MISA government have, as expected, confirmed their request for Commonwealth and American support under LIONS ROAR Plan V.

Land Forces

5. General. In the past three days it has become certain that overt major attacks by land forces against MISA are being put in train. It is estimated that the crossing of the frontier can be expected about 28/29 Mar.
6. West Coast. Apart from confirmation of a Divisional HQ having moved into TAPAH within the last two days little positive information has been forthcoming from this area. Unidentified regiments have been reported to TELOK ANSON and TANJONG MALIM.
7. East Coast. There has been considerable activity in the rear areas and Main HQ 5 Corps has been identified near KOTA BAHRU. Large quantities of stores and equipment are reliably reported to have been delivered by rail from LANDALLA. Evidence so far indicates that two divisions are moving south to the frontier area on the Sg. TRENGGANU. Other identifications to date are:
 - a. Battery of 329 AA Battalion reported near KOTA BAHRU.
 - b. An Engineer Battalion reported (on 18 Mar) in the rly yards at KUALA KRAI.
 - c. 454 Engineer Battalion reported near the major road 15 miles WEST of K. TRENGGANU.
 - d. Elements of 5 Reconnaissance Battalion seen on the frontier river line about 20 miles SW of K. TRENGGANU.

Communications

8. MISA Frontier Force and police posts have reported the jamming of their VHF radio nets during the past week. It is certain that MISA military communications are being frequently monitored.
9. There has been a considerable increase in traffic in Barbarian rear area during the past week but little has been heard from forward units.

Air

10. At BUTTERWORTH the presence of two squadrons of Vandalian FRESCO type D has been confirmed. Reliable reports state that external fuel tanks are being fitted.

Comment: External fuel would increase the combat radius of these aircraft sufficiently to bring the North-East coast of MISA within range for ground attack.

Naval

11. Little naval activity has been reported but on the EAST coast the clandestine contacts along the Misan coast by a variety of motorised craft seem to be continuing despite the efforts of the MISA authorities.

MISA

Political

12. There is cause for serious concern in the frontier coastal areas especially in the north east where the dissident Barbarian settlers are particularly active, despite the long standing ban on the UMPF (United Misan Peoples' Front) party. I MISA Brigade report three clashes with guerrillas in the MARANG area during the past two days.

13. Special Branch reports confirm the expansion of the underground organisation already flourishing around K TRENGGANU which is based on District Committees at MARANG and K DUNGUN. MARANG District is generally taken as the area between the rivers SG TRENGGANU and S. MARANG. Strong village committees are known to exist in K BRANG (WB 3229), AJIL (WB 3131) and BUKIT PAYONG (WB 3349).

14. Since the MISA authorities can provide little consistent security outside the major towns the countryside is dominated by the dissident elements.

15. Caches of automatic arms and explosives have recently been found near the coast road and Bt TEMLANG (WB 3837). The strength of insurgent groups in the district ready to take the field with arms is currently estimated at between 900 and 1,100.

COMD ASPECTS

1. Due to restrictions imposed by the terrain, limitations on the use of tracks and the insurgent setting the following initial deployment of Bn HQ is necessary.

- a. A small CP Gp fwd.
- b. A large Ech/Gun area adjacent to the CP.

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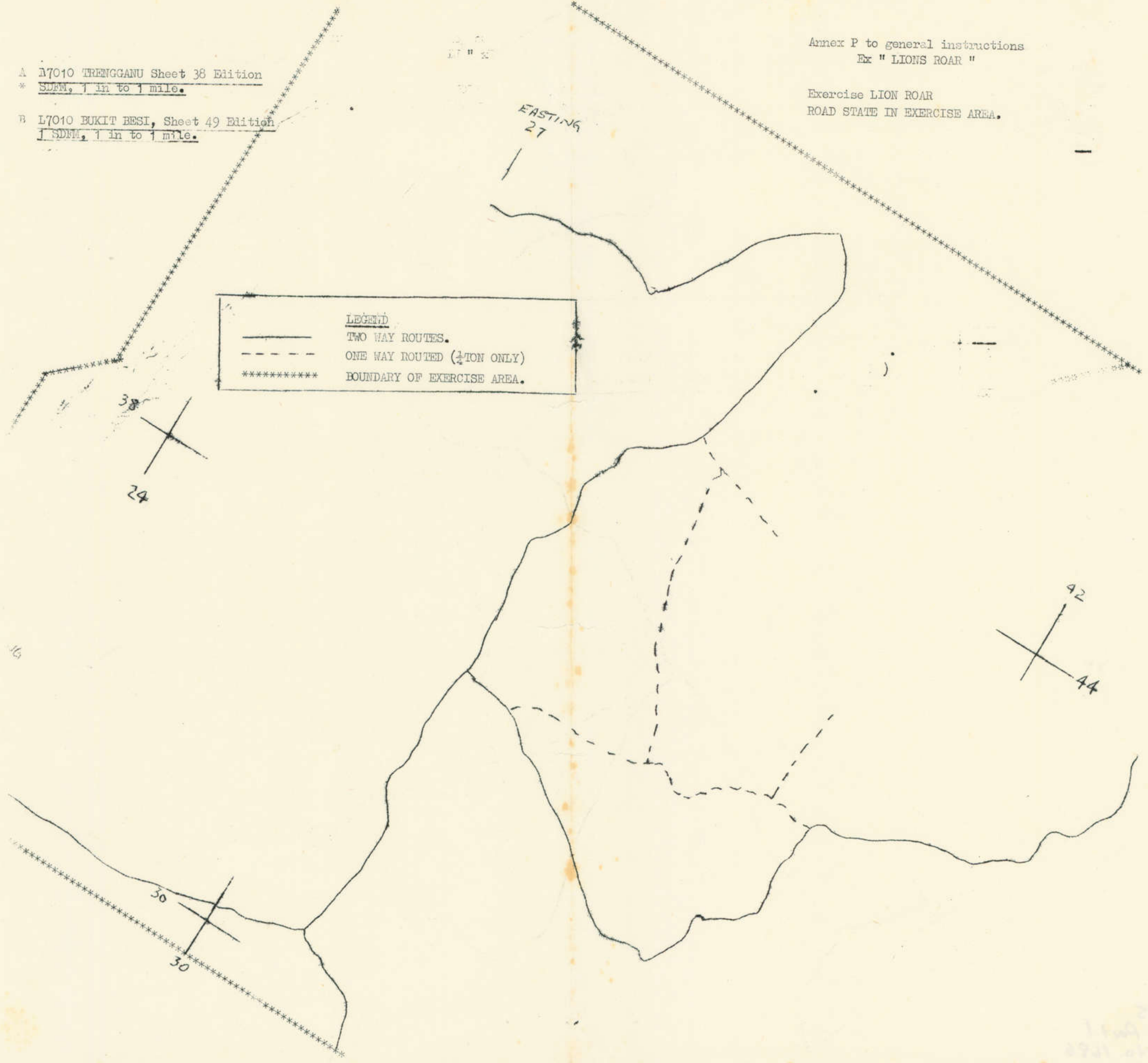

ADMINISTRATION ASPECTS

Deployment Scales

1. The bn less rear party plus nominated personnel will take part in the exercise. The composition of the rear party is shown in Appendix 2.

AMMO

2. Sub units are to draw the following ammo on Sat 26 Mar 66.
7.62 mm blank 25 per man
Thunderflashes 10 per coy incl echelon gp.
3. The Assault Pioneer platoon commander is to carry as much explosives as can be obtained up to the air portable scale.
4. No ball or drill ammo is to be carried. (1SG first line reserve is to be held in the BMA).

POL

5. MT 74 will be stocked controlled and issued by 3 Sqn RCT. Replenishment will be a one for one exchange of jerrycans in the BMA. The Tpt Sgt is to ensure each vehicle carries sufficient MT 74 for the journey to Bn conc area.
6. 3 Sqn RCT will establish a PP in the Bn concentration area by 1200 hrs on 28 Mar 66.

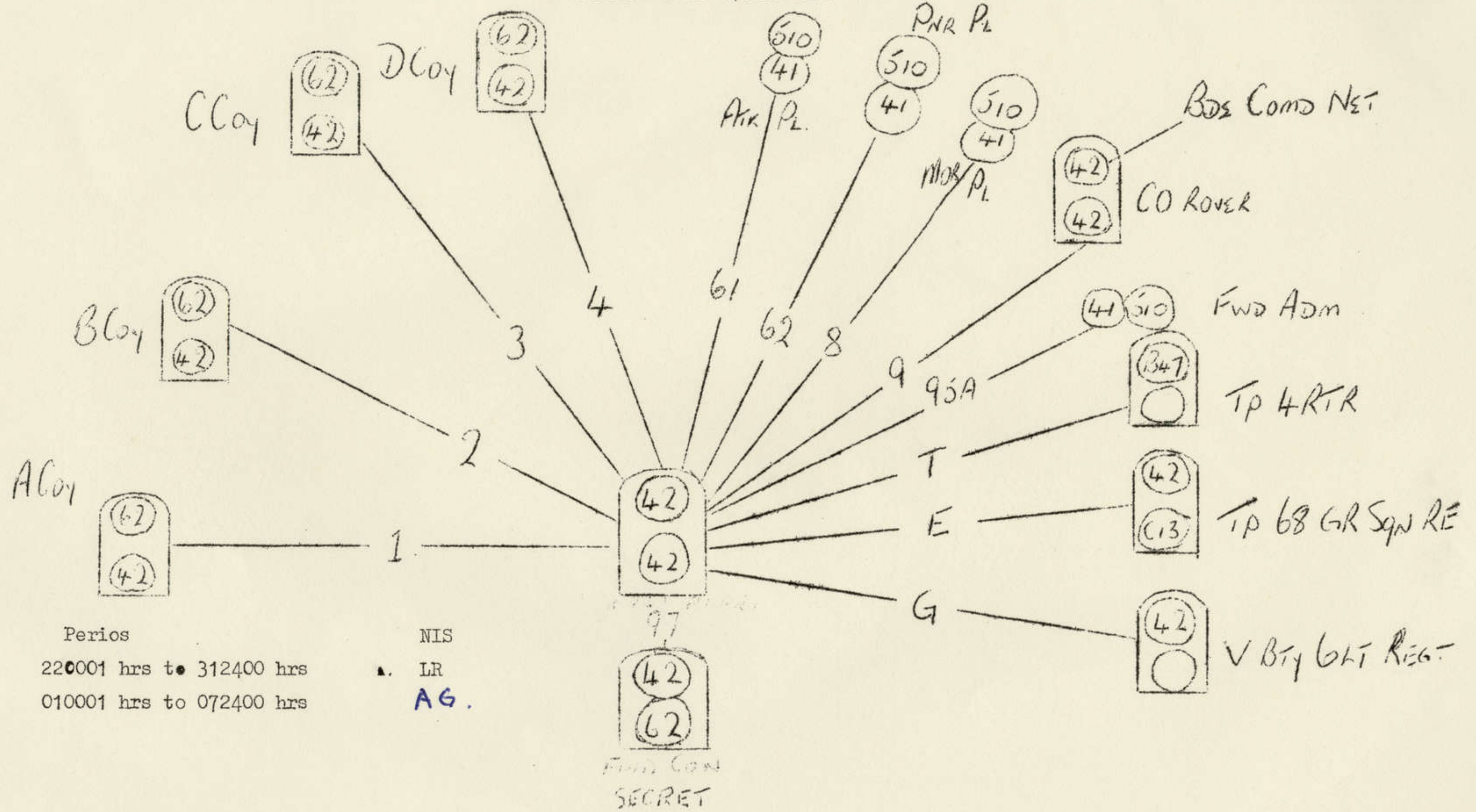

103. DISCIPLINE - DRIVING LICENCES, INSURANCE AND ROAD TAX

1. The attention of all Military personnel and their dependants is drawn to Garrison Standing Orders para 21 h (7) (e) which states:

- (1) All motor vehicles, motor-cycles and scooters in Terendak Garrison belonging to Service Personnel and their dependants, UK based civilians and civilian Army and NAAFI employees must, when used within Terendak Garrison, be covered by tax and insurance in accordance with the laws of the Federation of Malaya.
- (2) All drivers thereof must be in possession of a current Malayan driving licence.

2. Several instances have occurred of soldiers and families not complying with this order. It should be pointed out that serious disciplinary action will be taken against Military personnel not complying with these orders and in the case of dependants they will not be allowed to drive vehicles in the Garrison.

104. WITHDRAWAL OF PASSES FROM CIVILIAN EMPLOYEES ON TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT

1. Paras 15, 16 and 17 of Annex 'O' to Garrison Standing Orders are reproduced below:

"15. When an employee is dismissed, declared redundant, voluntarily terminates his service or for any reason leaves his job, his pass must be withdrawn and forwarded to 22 Int Pl (Bde) by the quickest means.

16. This is the sole responsibility of the Unit Civil Labour Officer, MQI, or the employer. In the case of private servants the responsibility rests with the employer, but Unit Civil Labour Officers/MQI should ensure that anyone employing servants is aware of his responsibilities in this respect.

17. Cases have come to notice where dismissed employees have handed their passes to union officials. These officials are well aware that they have no right to hold such passes and any cases of this type should be reported at the earliest opportunity to OC 22 Int Pl (Bde)."

2. Numerous cases are occurring of personnel failing to withdraw their amah's pass when she is no longer employed by them. It

must be understood that it is obligatory for the husband/wife to withdraw the pass on dismissal, or resignation, and hand it in to the Pass Office of 22 Int Pl (Bde) at the Main Gate.

(BRO 60/66).

105. VISITING HOURS - MATERNITY WARDS

With immediate effect the visiting hours to the Maternity Wards, Military Hospital Terendak are as follows :-

Soft drinks ONLY after 2230 hrs.

c. Bar Times

- 1200 - 1400 hrs) - Mondays to Saturdays
- 1800 - 2230 hrs)
- 1200 - 1330 hrs) - Sundays and Public Holidays
- 1800 - 2230 hrs)

Clearing

a. All members and guests must vacate the Club and be clear of it and the immediate area :

- (1) Nightly, except SATURDAY NIGHT - By 2300 hrs
- (2) SATURDAY NIGHT - By 0030 hrs
Sunday.

b. An extension may be authorised in suitable circumstances.

Alcoholic Liquor

- a. All alcoholic liquor must be consumed within thirty minutes of bar closing times and all liquor not consumed in this time will be confiscated.
- b. Bottles of Spirits will not be brought into the club.
- c. Bulk buying of beer and liquor is not allowed.
- d. No child will be served with beer or spirits in any circumstances.
- e. Members are not to take alcoholic liquor onto the beach".

Any members of the Garrison, including dependants, who contravene these orders are liable to have disciplinary or administrative action taken against them.

115. REGULATIONS REGARDING "FRUIT MACHINE"

1. Applications for permits to operate a "fruit machine" will be considered only from clubs, societies or associations.

- a. whose activities would be predominantly of a sporting and social character,
- b. which have exclusive ownership of the machine (it should not be on hire or loan from the third party) and
- c. which restricts the use of the machine to its members.

2. "Fruit Machines" have been defined as a type of mechanical gambling device whereby money or money's worth may be won or lost

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in a manner dependent on chance.

3. Applications will not be considered from individuals, or from clubs, societies or associations whose objects are purely of a social character and/or include political or trade union activities.

4. Applications should be submitted in quadruplicate in the prescribed form and should be accompanied by:

- a. a copy of the by-laws or rules of the club, society or association,
- b. a copy of the latest annual report and statement of accounts, and
- c. documentary evidence to prove ownership of the machine.

5. Separate applications should be made in respect of each machine. Permits for more than two machines per club, society or association will not be granted.

6. A flat rate of duty varying from \$25 to \$50 a month will be imposed in respect of each machine. Such duty shall be payable in advance for a period of 6 months (minimum) or 12 months as the club, society or association would prefer and permits will be granted for the period for which duty is paid.

MOVEMENT TO SARAWAK

1. Situation - 4 RAR returns from Exercise LIONS ROAR on 5 Apr. Elements of 1/10 GR will move from their present location in SARAWAK on 14 Apr and the complete unit will have been relieved in the line by the end of Apr 66.
2. Mission - 4 RAR is to relieve 1/10 GR in the BAU District of the 1st Division of SARAWAK during the period 14-28 Apr 66.
3. Execution
 - a. General Outline

The move of the battalion will be carried out in four phases:-

 - (1) Phase 1 : Air Adv Party ex SINGAPORE 14 Apr.
 - (2) Phase 2 : Sea Adv Party ex SINGAPORE 16 Apr.
 - (3) Phase 3 : HQ, Vehs & Stores ex PORT DICKSON 23 Apr.
 - (4) Phase 4 : Mainbody ex PORT DICKSON 25 Apr.
 - b. Composition of Parties - see Annexures 'A' to 'F'.
 - c. Initial Grouping
 - (1) A Coy, B Coy and D Coy will each have the following attachments:

All attachments to comply with the initial grouping will take effect from 1330hrs 12 Apr. Soldiers will remain in present accommodation. Personal documents will remain with parent company clerks.

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4. Administration and Logistics

a. Documentation

- (1) Rough but accurate nominal rolls/nominations from all companies for all movement parties (Annexures 'A' to 'F') will be forwarded to the Adjt in duplicate ASP and not later than 24 Mar.
- (2) UEO/Embarkation Officers are responsible to the Adjt for all aspects of preparation of manifests/rolls/load lists for their respective movement serials, for passengers, freight and vehicles.
- (3) Bn HQ Orderly Room will provide the facilities to assist UEO/Embarkation Officers in this task.
- (4) During the move, all ranks will retain their ID Card and International Health Certificate. As soon as possible after arrival in KUCHING, International Health Certificates will be collected under company arrangements and retained by parent company clerks at Bn HQ (except rear company). ID Cards will not be carried on operations and should not be carried forward of BnHQ. ID Cards of members of forward company groups will be collected under company arrangements and retained by parent company clerks at Bn HQ (except rear company).
- (5) Personal documents will be retained throughout the move and the tour in BORNEO by the parent company clerks.
- (6) Medical documents (Med 4 and Med 5) will be retained by the RAP in parent company groups.
- (7) Adjt will determine and keep up-to-date information on the strengths to be moved. This must show officers/WOs and Sgts/rank and file for each company group in each party.

b. Transport

- (1) Details of vehicles and the tentative allocation for loading are shown at Annex 'G'.
- (2) All vehicles are to carry Operational CES with reduced fuel.
- (3) Doors are to be removed from all vehicles after arrival in the new location.
- (4) Drivers may be rotated in their duties as required by Tpt Offr.
- (5) All vehicles will remain centralized as a pool under Tpt Offr.
- (6) Duty vehicles ($\frac{1}{4}$ ton) will be provided constantly at Bn HQ (Ops) and Rear Coy HQ.

c. Stations Stores - details of total battalion holdings (incl by locations) are held by QM.

d. Packing of Company Stores

- (1) The selection and packing of stores will be co-ordinated to avoid excessive air lift requirements and double handling on change of company bases.

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- (2) The stores and also the scale of weapons taken by rifle coys will be identical. Neither rifle company nor specialist platoons are limited to the airportable list. However, these should be used as a guide, but the recent reconnaissance experience will dominate all decisions.
- (3) Rifle companies are to submit to Bn 2IC by 0800hrs Fri 18 Mar, a draft load list of stores for BORNEO. A co-ordinating conference will issue detail of the agreed load list.
- (4) A trial pack by a selected rifle company will be conducted on 22-23 Mar, using this standard list.
- (5) Specialist platoons and Bn HQ/Sp Coy HQ will conduct a trial pack and submit Load Lists for each vehicle and each box of crated freight to Bn 2IC not later than 0800hrs Wed 23 Mar.
- (6) Crates for band instruments will be taken empty on the LSL "Sir Lancelot".
- (7) Fibre-board boxes are available from QM and will be used for stores carried on vehicles where necessary. Wooden crates must be used for stores which are not loaded on unit vehicles.
- (8) Vehicles and stores are to be packed and ready for movement as follows:
 - (a) Air and Sea Advance Parties : 0900hrs 12 Apr.
 - (b) Mainbody : 0900hrs 21 Apr.

e. Personal Clothing and Equipment to be Taken - see Annex 'H'.

f. Ammunition

Without exception, all keys to doors, cabinets, cupboards and safes in company/specialist platoons headquarters will be lodged with the Orderly Officer and a receipt obtained, before departure of the last elements of the sub-unit. A register of all keys held will be maintained by OC Rear Party.

n. Safes TERENDAK

All will be completely emptied before departure.

o. Unit Files TERENDAK

NOTES

1. Personal weapons, and controlled stores on personal issue will be entered in AAB 83 and details recorded before departure from TERENDAK on Rifle Register (F7K) and Record of Record Numbers (F7B)
2. Members of the Band will carry their instruments onto the ships as hand luggage.
3. Cooks clothing will be taken.
4. Suitcase will not be taken by rank and file.
5. Kitbags will be carried.
6. Steel helmets will be carried in kitbags.
7. Officers, Sergeants and Echelon personnel may require additional civilian clothes.

LOCALLY EMPLOYED TRACKERS

General

1. Authority has been given for up to 24 local civilians to be employed as trackers in each battalion in this Brigade.
2. They are recruited under Brigade arrangements in the Third Division of Sarawak.

Detailed Conditions

3. Status These trackers do not, as a result of their employment with the British Army, acquire any special military status; they remain civilians. They are in no sense of the word enlisted. They will carry at all times their normal civilian identity papers.

4. Term of Service

- a. The trackers are being employed for an initial period of six months subject to their being satisfactory.
- b. After the first three months they are to be told that they are satisfactory, or action is to be taken to return them home.
- c. If desired they may be offered a second period of six months employment. In this event they will be entitled to "inter-tour leave".
- d. Employment beyond the 18 month point is not authorised.

5. Pay

- a. The daily rate of pay is \$6, for a seven-day week.
- b. It is to be paid at regular intervals as mutually agreed between the unit and the trackers, probably monthly.
- c. A record of individual payments will be kept.
- d. The money will be drawn from the unit imprest account and charged to vote 4A2 (1).
- e. The trackers will be included as a separate item in the normal monthly civilian strength return.

6. Compensation

- a. Injury or death arising as a direct result of enemy action, or as a direct result of employment as a tracker in a security area will be compensated by the Federal Authorities under rules promulgated in the Internal Security (Civilian Injuries Compensation) Regulations 1960.
- b. Injury or death arising from other causes will be dealt with under the Workmen's Compensation Ordinances.
- c. Minor injuries under para 6a above will be reported by the unit to its local Divisional Executive Committee. Major cases, including fatalities, will be reported to this HQ giving full details.
- d. Cases under 6b above will be reported as normal for any civilian employee.
- e. In cases considered appropriate by a CO, immediate compensation may be paid. This will be without detriment to formal compensation later.

7. Leave

- a. 10 days/^{paid leave} plus travelling time will be admissible after 6 months and again after 12 months service.
- b. No other paid leave will be granted.

8. Movement Travelling between the Brigade area and SIBU for leave and on discharge will be as arranged by Bn HQ at Army expense. Travel by RAF aircraft is authorised on an opportunity basis.

9. Clothing and Equipment Bn HQ will equip each tracker up to the scale shown at Appendix 1.

10. Weapons Each tracker will be issued with a shotgun by Bn HQ from the unit holding. When carrying this shotgun each tracker must be in possession of a Sarawak Constabulary pass authorising him to do so. These passes will be obtained from Bde HQ as required.

11. Rations The trackers are responsible for feeding themselves and their rate of pay takes this into account. However, when on patrol or when it is not possible for them to purchase fresh rations locally, compo rations may be issued to them free.

12. Medical Normal medical treatment within the unit is authorised. If evacuated from the unit, a tracker will receive treatment from the nearest civil hospital.

13. NAAFI No entitlement to duty free goods exist.

122. DISTURBANCE ALLOWANCE

1. AHQ Canberra advise that new rates of the above allowance are approved as follows :-

3. The allowance paid under provisions of paragraph 1 a. (2) (a) above are not contingent upon possession of furniture and effects. The only condition for eligibility is a posting to another locality.

4. The condition of eligibility for the allowance on moves to unfurnished premises in the case of married and unmarried members, is for removal to comprise furniture and effects valued at an amount of not less than \$4000 (£500).
