COMMANDERS DIARIES INSTRUCTIONS

AIM

1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organisation and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

GENERAL

- 2. Entries will be made daily on AF C2118, each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.
- 3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties in the Field", Chapter 5, Section 1.

RESPONSIBILITY

During Non-operational Periods

4. A Commanders Diary will be made by commanders of all formations.

During Operational Periods (see note 1)

- 5. A Commanders Diary will be made in duplicate by:-
 - (a) Commanders of all formations.
 - (b) Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a Brigadier or above.
 - (c) Heads of services not below the rank of Lieutenant Colonel.
 - (d) Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
 - (e) Unit commanders.
 - (f) Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

COMPILATION

- 6. Both original and duplicate copies will consist of:
 - (a) Cover (AF C2119).
 - (b) Index as printed on cover.
 - (c) Narrative (AF C2118).
 - (d) Annexes as shown in the Index.
- 7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes will be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer will be included.
- 8. The annexes will be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an Annex NIL will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters, the relevant papers should be grouped as annexes starting at B.

- 2. The War Office or headquarters concerned will be responsible for instructing units to submit Commanders' Diaries where the conditions of the unit's employment make this necessary. Wherever possible the beginning and end of the period will be clearly stated. Notwithstanding the above, on the outbreak of global war all units and formations which are not at the time submitting these reports will start compiling them with effect from M day and will thereafter render them in accordance with paragraphs 15 and 16.

GENERAL IDEA

Introduction

- 1. The year is 1966. The MALAYA penintula is divided into TWO mythical countries:
 - a. MISA A member of SEATO
 - b. BARBARIA An aggressive Communist country.
- 2. The frontier between MISA in the SOUTH and BARBARIA in the NORTH is the S TRENGGANU up to its scurce, and thence westward along the inter-state boundaries between KELANTAN and PAHANG and PERAK and SELANGOR.
- The sector of the frontier with which this exercise is concerned is the S TRENGGANU,
- 4. VANDALIA is an Asian Communist World Power to the NORTH OF BARBARIA.

The Threat

C UH FL

- 5. The threat to MISA is twofold:
 - a. Internal, Over the years BARBARIANS have settled in NORTH E.ST MISA, particularly along the coast and up the larger rivers.

 They are farmers and fishermen. The MISA Communist Party is strong amongst these settlers and many young men and women have received guerrilla training in BARBARIA. A force of 1,000 armed guerrillas is ready to take the field in the MARANG S TRENGGANU area alone when orders are received from BARBARIA. The indigenous MISAN populations is basically anti-communist, but although numerically much superior are easily terrorised by the tough BARBARIAN settlers.

b. External

- (1) Land threat. Two divisions of the BARBARIAN Army are deployed in SOUTH E.ST BARBARIA, facing MISA on the S TRENGGANU front. We can plan on seven days' warning of an intended overt offensive.
- (2) Air threat. Two squadrons of MIG 17 fighter-ground attack aircraft, of the VANDAL Air Force, plus a number of reconnaissance aircraft, have "volunteered" for service with the BARBARIANS, and are based at BUTTERWORTH.
- (3) Sea threat. Limited to a few BARBARIAN gun boats. The BARBARIANS, however, have available a large number of native craft with crews experienced in local conditions.

Defence Plans

- 6. Contigency plan, LIONS ROAR PLAN V for the defence of MISA involves the deployment of TWO Divisions, FOUR US Divisions and 1 Commonwealth Division. 1 Commonwealth Division has 3 Commando Brigade RM, 28 Commonwealth Infantry Brigade and C Squadron 22 SAS under command.
- 7. The tasks given to 1 Commonwealth Division are:
 - a. To relieve 1 MISAN brigade on the line of the S TRENGGANU and to deny that line to the enemy.
 - b. To ensure the road DUNGUN KUAIA TRENGGINU.
- 8. To exchieve these tasks the plan for initial deployment is:

a. 3 Commando Brigade RM to move by sea and deploy into the KUAIA TRENGGANU sector.

- b. 28 Commonwealth Infantry Brigade to move by air into M.R. NG and deploy on the left of 3 Commando Brigade RM.
- c. C Squadron, 22 SAS to be dropped in depth WEST of the S TRENGGANU in front of 1 Commonwealth Division.
- 1 MISAN Brigade, normally stationed in the TRENGGANU DUNGUN area will cover the deployment of 1 Commonwealth Division. As 28 Commonwealth Infantry Brigade and 3 Commando Brigade RM reach their positions on S TRENGG.NU, elements of 1 MISAN Brigade thus relieved will regroup and assume responsibility for the defence of the frontier on the left of 28 Commonwealth Infantry Brigade pending arrival of 29 Infantry Brigade sometime after D + 15.

D day - is the day when LIONS ROLR - PLIN V is activated.

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Task

The initial task of 28 Commonwealth Infantry Brigade on arrival 11. in the area is to secure the line of the S TRENGG NU within its boundaries.

BARBARIA

Political

- 1. It is now clearly only a matter of days before BARBARIA attacks
 MISA with or without a declaration of war.
- 2. There has been a complete clamp down by the frontier control and traffic at all airports has been severely restricted. MISAN citizens resident in the main town are being interned.
- Increasing number of demonstrations against British and American presence in SE Asia have been taking place. On 21 Mar the British Consulate in KUALA CRIS was beseiged by mobs demanding the expulsion of the Counsul. The car of a visiting US official was greeted by a hail of durians and the passenger managed to gain refuge in the Consulate only with the greatest difficulty.
- 4. The MISAN government have, as expected, confirmed their request for Commonwealth and American support under LIONS ROLR Plan V.

Land Forces

- General. In the past three days it has become certain that overt major attacks by land forces against MISA are being put in train. It is estimated that the crossing of the frontier can be expected about 28/29 Mar.
- West Coast. Apart from confirmation of a Divisional HQ having moved into TAPAH within the last two days little positive information has been forthcoming from this area. Unidentified regiments have been reported to TELOK ANSON and TANJONG MALIM.
- East Coast. There has been considerable activity in the rear areas and Main HQ 5 Corps has been identified near KOTA BAHRU. Large quantities of stores and equipment are reliably reported to have been delivered by rail from V.NDALIA. Evidence so far indicates that two divisions are moving south to the frontier area on the Sg. TRENGGANU. Other identifications to date are:
 - a. Battery of 329 AA Battalion reported near KOTA BAHRU.
 - b. An Engineer Battalion reported (on 18 Mar) in the rly yards at KUALA KRAI.
 - c. 454 Engineer Battalion reported near the major road 15 miles WEST of K. TRENGGANU.
 - d. Elements of 5 Reconnaissance Battalion seen on the frontier river line about 20 miles SW of K. TRENGGANU.

Communications

- 8. MISAN Frontier Force and police posts have reported the jamming of their VHF radio nets during the past week. It is certain that MISAN military communications are being frequently monitored.
- There has been a considerable increase in traffic in Barbarian rear ar a during the past week but little has been heard from forward units.

Air

10. At BUTTERWORTH the presence of two squadrons of Vandalian FRESCO type D has been confirmed. Reliable reports state that external fuel tanks are being fitted.

The CV Andrews of the Land Company of the Land Comment: External fuel would increase the combat radius of these aircraft sufficiently to bring the North-East coast of MISA within range for ground attack.

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Naval

11. Little naval activity has been reported but on the EAST coast the clandestine contacts along the Misan coast by a variety of motorised craft seem to be continuing despite the efforts of the MISAN authorities.

Political

- There is cause for serious concern in the frontier coastal areas especially in the north east where the dissident Barbarian settlers are particularly active, despite the long standing ban on the UMPF (United Misan Peoples' Front) party. I MISAN Brigade report three clashes with guerrillas in the MarkaNG area during the past two days.
- Special Branch reports confirm the expansion of the underground 13. organisation already flourishing around K TRENGGANU which is based on District Committees at MARANG and K DUNGUN. MARANG District is generally taken as the area between the rivers SG TRENGGANU and S. MARANG. Strong village committees are known to exist in K BRANG (WB 3229), AJIL (WB 3131) and BUKIT PAYONG (WB 3349).
- Since the MISAN authorities can provide little consistent security 14. outside the major towns the countryside is dominated by the dissident elements.
- Caches of automatic arms and explosives have recently been found near 150 the coast road and Bt TEMIANG (WB 3837). The strength of insurgent groups in the district ready to take the field with arms is currently estimated at between 900 and 1,100. The second section of the second section of



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ADMINISTRATION ASPECTS

Deployment Scales

1. The bm less rear party plus nominated personnel will take part in the exercise. The composition of the rear party is shown in Appendix 2.





103. DISCIPLINE - DRIVING LICENCES, INSURANCE AND ROAD TAX

BATTLIJON ORDERLY DUTIES

- 1. The attention of all Military personnel and their dependants is drawn to Garrison Standing Orders para 21 h (7) (e) which states:
 - (1) All motor vehicles, motor-cycles and scooters in Terendak Garrison belonging to Service Personnel and their dependants, UK based civilians and civilian Army and NAAFI employees must, when used within Terendak Garrison, be covered by tax and insurance in accordance with the laws of the Federation of Malaya.
 - (2) All crivers thereof must be in possession of a current Malayan driving licence.
- 2. Several instances have occurred of soldiers and families not complying with this order. It should be pointed out that serious disciplinary action will be taken against Military personnel not complying with these orders and in the case of dependants they will not be allowed to drive vehicles in the Garrison.

104. WITHDRAWAL OF PASSES FROM CIVILLIN EMPLOYEES ON TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT

- 1. Paras 15, 16 and 17 of Annex '0' to Garrison Standing Orders are reproduced below:
 - "15. When an employee is dismissed, declared redundant, voluntarily terminates his service or for any reason leaves his job, his pass must be withdrawn and forwarded to 22 Int Pl (Bde) by the quickest means.
 - 16. This is the sole responsibility of the Unit Civil Labour Officer, MQI, or the employer. In the case of private servants the responsibility rests with the employer, but Unit Civil Labour Officers/MQI should ensure that anyone employing servants is aware of his responsibilities in this respect.
 - 17. Cases have come to notice where dismissed employees have handed their passes to union officials. These officials are well aware that they have no right to hold such passes and any cases of this type should be reported at the earliest opportunity to OC 22 Int Pl (Bde)."
 - 2. Numerous cases are occurring of personnel failing to withdraw their amah's pass when she is no longer employed by them. It

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must be understood that it is obligatory for the husband/wife to withdraw the pass on dismissal, or resignation, and hand it in to the Pass Office of 22 Int Pl (Bde) at the Main Gate.

- 1. Personal weapons, and controlled stores on personal issue will be entered in AAB 83 and details recorded before departure from TERENDAK on Rifle Register (F7K) and Record of Record Numbers (F7B)
- 2. Members of the Band will carry their instruments onto the ships as hand luggage.
- 3. Cooks clothing will be taken.
- 4. Suitcase will not be taken by rank and file.
- 5. Kitbags will be carried.
- 6. Steel helmets will be carried in kitbags.
- 7. Officers, Sergeants and Echelon personnel may require additional civilian clothes.

LOCALLY EMPLOYED TRACKERS

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General

- 1. Authority has been given for up to 24 local civilians to be employed as trackers in each battalion in this Brigade.
- 2. They are recruited under Brigade arrangements in the Third Division of Sarawak.

Detailed Conditions

3. Status These trackers do not, as a result of their employment with the British Army, acquire any special military status; they remain civilians. They are in no sense of the word enlisted. They will carry at all times their normal civilian identity papers.

4. Term of Service

- a. The trackers are being employed for an initial period of six months subject to their being satisfactory.
- b. After the first three months they are to be told that they are satisfactory, or action is to be taken to return them home.
- c. If desired they may be offered a second period of six months employment. In this event they will be entitled to "inter-tour leave".
 - d. Employment beyond the 18 month point is not authorised.

5. Pay

- a. The daily rate of pay is \$6, for a seven-day week.
- b. It is to be paid at regular intervals as mutually agreed between the unit and the trackers, probably monthly.
 - c. A record of individual payments will be kept.
- d. The money will be drawn from the unit imprest account and charged to vote 4A2 (1).
 - e. The trackers will be included as a separate item in the normal monthly civilian strength return.

6. Compensation

- a. Injury or death arising as a direct result of enemy action, or as a direct result of employment as a tracker in a security area will be compensated by the Federal Authorities under rules promulgated in the Internal Security (Civilian Injuries Compensation) Regulations 1960.
- b. Injury or death arising from other causes will be dealt with under the Workmen's Compensation Ordinances.
- c. Minor injuries under para 6a above will be reported by the unit to its local Divisional Executive Committee. Major cases, including fatalities, will be reported to this HQ giving full details.
 - d. Cases under 6b above will be reported as normal for any civilian employee.
- e. In cases considered appropriate by a CO, immediate compensation may be paid. This will be without detriment to formal compensation sation later.

7. Leave

- a. 10 days plids travelling time will be admissible after 6 months and again after 12 months service.
- b. No other paid leave will be granted.
- 8. Movement Travelling between the Brigade area and SIBU for leave and on discharge will be as arranged by Bn HQ at Army expense. Travel by RAF aircraft is authorised on an opportunity basis.
- 9. Clothing and Equipment Bn HQ will equip each tracker up to the scale shown at Appendix 1.
- 10. Weapons Each tracker will be issued with a shotgun by Bn HQ from the unit holding. When carrying this shotgun each tracker must be in possession of a Sarawak Constabulary pass authorising him to do so. These passes will be obtained from Bde HQ as required.
- 11. Rations The trackers are responsible for feeding themselves and their rate of pay takes this into account. However, when on patrol or when it is not possible for them to purchase fresh rations locally, compo rations may be issued to them free.
- 12. Medical Normal medical treatment within the unit is authorised. If evacuated from the unit, a tracker will receive treatment from the nearest civil hospital.
- 13. NAAFI No entitlement to duty free goods exist.

- 3. The allowance paid under provisions of paragraph 1 a. (2) (a) above are not contingent upon possession of furniture and effects. The only condition for eligibility is a posting to another locality.
- 4. The condition of eligibility for the allowance on moves to unfurnished premises in the case of married and unmarried members, is for removal to comprise furniture and effects valued at an amount of not less than \$1000 (£500).
