2. It is the responsibility of every member of the Battalion, to ensure that, by his conduct, dress and bearing, he, at all times sets an example of good behaviour to the public. A member who does not conduct himself properly brings discredit, not only to the Regiment, but also to the Army and AUSTRALIA.
3. All members of the unit, in and out of uniform are subject to military law.
4. Severe penalties will be imposed on any member found guilty of an offence of this nature.

DISCIPLINE - REDRESS OF GRIEVANCES

- (a) At any time a soldier who thinks himself wronged in any matter may complain to his Company Commander. If he does not obtain redress, he may complain to his Commanding Officer. If he still does not obtain redress, he may complain to his Brigade Commander.
- (b) It is an offence to make a complaint through other military channels. Complaints or grievances made direct to a superior HQ will be returned to the unit for the commanding officer's attention and disciplinary action as he sees fit.
- (c) Anonymous complaints are forbidden and such letters will be investigated with a view to discover the perpetrator so that disciplinary action can be taken.

AMMUNITION (Reference MCRO 106/51)

- (a) In order to ensure that ammunition used on operational service is not defective, the following action has been laid down:
 - (i) All SAA will be withdrawn from operational use and downgraded to use for training only after having been exposed to the air for 2 months.
 - (ii) All pyrotechnics incl No 36M and No 80 grenades will be downgraded to training use after exposure to the air for 1 month.
 - (iii) HE and smoke mortar bombs will be downgraded to training use after exposure to the air for 3 months.
 - (iv) Replacements will be made from sealed boxes or packages as received from ordnance, These on no account will be opened until the contents are actually required for operational use.
 - (v) Oil will not be allowed to contaminate any nature of ammunition. Weapons and magazines will only be lightly oiled. Over oiling will cause deterioration of cap firing compositions which will lead to misfiring.
 - (vi) Personnel handling grenades filled with white phosphorous will be informed of the high fire risk present when these grenades are damaged or rusted. Any grenades found in this condition will be destroyed.

- (b) Sub unit Commanders will ensure that frequent inspections of ammunition for operational use are carried out in order that any rounds which have been rendered unserviceable by damage, over exposure to dampness or by any other reason are withdrawn and returned to Ordnance.

DISCIPLINE - DRESS GEORGETOWN AND BUTTER WORTH

- (a) As GEORGETOWN and BUTTER WORTH within town limits are non-malarial, sleeves may be rolled up in walking out dress after dark within town limits only.
- (b) As Dengue and Sandfly fever are believed to result from a succession of insect bites, the Brigade Commander relies on soldiers having the good sense to roll down their sleeves at once if they find themselves being bitten on the forearm at any time.
- (c) This relaxation does not apply to sentries and soldiers on duty.

VENEREAL DISEASE

- (a) In view of the high rate of Venereal Disease in IPOH and GEORGETOWN, any member of 2 RAR who exposes himself to disease, will make use of the prophylactics available in Company Orderly Rooms.
- (b) As an additional safeguard, use will be made of the facilities necessary for the prevention of Venereal Disease, at the Prophylactic Centres in IPOH and GEORGETOWN and in other leave centres at the first available opportunity after exposure.
- (c) After making use of the facilities available in Prophylactic Centres, each member will obtain a slip from the prophylactic centre orderly, indicating that the member has made use of the facilities available.
- (d) Disciplinary action will be taken against personnel contracting Venereal disease who cannot prove that they have made use of prophylactic treatment. Offenders will be charged under Section 11 Army Act.
- (e) Sub units who may be authorised to operate Prophylactic Centres from time to time will ensure that the counterfoil system of registration is in operation, and will ensure that the counterfoils do not get into unauthorised hands.
- (f) All personnel are reminded that failure to report Venereal Disease when contracted is a punishable offence.

CONDITIONS OF SERVICE MALAYA - ALLOWANCES

1. During the past few months a number of submissions have been made to Army Headquarters Melbourne for alterations to some of the conditions of service governing the Australian force in Malaya.

2. The following extracts from these submissions are published for the information of all ranks:-

(a) MALAYA ALLOWANCE for members in Hospital

The submission was made that, as MALAYA allowance is an allowance payable to members serving in the theatre it should not be deducted when a member is in hospital. This submission was at AHQ when the matter was raised in Australian newspapers. Approval has been received for the allowance to be continued while a member is in hospital; and this has been made retrospective.

(b) Messing Allowance of 9/2 per day

It has been represented that members of a wholly Australian unit (2 RAR) should receive this allowance when rationed on UK rations during operations. (An answer is awaited).

(c) Rationing - accompanied members

A recommendation was made that, where married accompanied personnel are living in hotels and hostels and are unable to return to their places of residence for lunch, there should be provision for them to be rationed by their units. This has been refused, but is being taken up again from a different aspect.

(d) Laundry Charges

A directive was received some time ago that fixed laundry charges of families living in hotels, boarding houses, etc are not a charge to public funds. This matter has been taken further with AHQ and an answer is awaited.

REPORTING INSTANCES OF AMMUNITION FOUND

1. All captured, found and otherwise casually acquired ammunition will be kept apart from service issue ammunition and handed in to Company Headquarters for forwarding to BnHQ for transmission to the Police.

2. On no account will such ammunition even of apparently recent service origin, be retained by individuals or Companies. It is known that the GPs refill and reuse expended service ammunition cases and that such ammunition whilst often indistinguishable from current stocks, can be highly dangerous to the firer.

3. It is most important that these orders are clearly understood by all ranks and that they are strictly obeyed.

ACCIDENTS INVOLVING FIREARMS

1. When an accident occurs involving firearms or other weapons or articles it shall be the duty of the senior officer, NCO or private soldier on the scene to impound such firearm, weapon or article together with any ammunition, expended or unexpended, which may be connected with the accident immediately or at the earliest opportunity after the accident occurs.

2. The person impounding the weapon will :

- (a) note the name of the person from whom he received it,
- (b) endeavour to ascertain who was responsible for the discharge of the firearm or otherwise using the weapon or article in such a manner as to cause the accident,
- (c) note the names and units or addresses of any witnesses,
- (d) examine the firearm, weapon or article noting its condition. In particular note whether there is any evidence of a firearm having been recently discharged, e.g., smell of powder, fouling of the barrel, temperature of the barrel, whether there was or was not an expended round in the firearm or in its vicinity and note any stains on the weapon or article,
- (e) note identifying particulars of the firearm or weapon, e.g., type, weapon number, peculiar markings, and in the case of articles such as ammunition either put them in a sealed packet, signing across the seal or attach a signed label. If no such packets or labels are available small scratches of a distinctive nature may be made sufficient to identify the article but in no way obscuring any peculiar markings already existing. If the peculiar markings are sufficiently distinctive to enable ready identification no other marks should be made,
- (f) retain the firearm, weapon or article in his possession until it can be handed to a responsible investigating authority. Firearms and weapons will not be examined or tested by experts except under authority of MP or SIS and will as far as

possible be kept in the condition in which they were originally impounded,

(g) note the time and date of the occurrence.

3. The person impounding will also, if practicable, make a note of the relative positions of all persons present and, where firearms are recovered from the ground or other place, their relative positions together with a note of witnesses able to verify the positions. Where possible measurements, either exact or by pacing or estimation will be noted.

4. If possible written statements should be taken on the spot from persons witnessing the accident.

5. The accident will be reported to superior authority as soon as possible.

6. The above order is not published as an exhaustive exposition of what action is required on an accident occurring. The senior officer, NCO or private soldier on the scene will take such other action as the case appears to require in addition to ensuring that the matters mentioned in this order are attended to.

7. This order will be republished every three months.

CUSTODY OF ARMS AND AMMUNITION

1. All arms and ammunition when not in use will be stored centrally in unit custody and will not be left in tents or barrack rooms, irrespective of whether or not a billet orderly is on duty.

2. Arms and ammunition once withdrawn from unit custody become the personal responsibility of the individual until properly returned. Arms and ammunition will not be left unattended at any time.

3. Personnel sleeping with their arms, i.e., in certain isolated camps, when travelling by train, during operations or during training will ensure that their weapons are securely attached to their persons by the sling or lanyard.

4. Losses of arms and ammunition are normally court martial offenses.

- (a) Arms and amn will NOT be taken into a non-mil establishment by any member unless his specific duty requires him to do so, (e.g. members of the SF on a legitimate house search authorized to do so under the Emergency Regulations.)
- (b) Pers carrying arms and amn and proceeding on leave will report to the nearest prescribed mil unit at their leave destination where arms and amn will be handed in on signature for safe custody. The prescribed mil units will be endorsed on members leave docs in each specific instance where leave is being taken at mainland leave centres.
- (c) Members proceeding from op areas on leave to PENANG/BUTTERWORTH area will hand their arms and amn in to either of the following notes :

(1) HQ 28 Comvel Indep Inf Bde Gp arms kote at BUTTERWORTH, or

(ii) 2 RAR Minden Bks arms kote.

(d) On NO account will married pers returning to married accn take arms and amm into such accn. For the purpose of this order "married accn" includes married quarters, private hirings hostel and hotel accn.

ARMY HEALTH BENEFITS SOCIETY - 2 RAR MEMBERS STILL CONTRIBUTING

REST DAYS

1. In amplification of 2 RAR RO 121/56 and 2 RAR A9 of 4 May 56 the following procedure relating to the granting of stand down leave and transport arrangements connected thereto will be put into effect from the publication of this order.
2. As a matter of policy all personnel are entitled to one rest day per week in addition to Annual Recreational Leave etc. The object of this rest day is to give freedom from liability for operational or administrative duties to members of the unit so that they are able to remain at concert pitch whilst the unit is committed to operations. Normally these rest days will be taken once a week.
3. However, so that families in PENANG may be visited by husbands, approval is given for these rest days to be accumulated - normally up to 2 weeks entitlement - but as special cases 3 or 4 weeks may be accumulated.

The accumulation of 2 rest days permits a "short week end" leave to be granted, 3 or 4 rest days becoming a "long week end."

The duration of these week ends is as follows :-

- "Short week end" - From 1500 hrs D Day until 1200 hrs D + 3
- "Long week end" (3 Days) - From 1500 hrs D Day until 1200 hrs D + 4
- "Long week end" (4 Days) - From 1500 hrs D Day until 1200 hrs D + 5

4. The expression "week end" does not mean Saturdays and Sundays only. There are no "week ends" as such on operations, and rest days will be granted at any time during the week.

5. (a) In special cases approved by Company Commanders, single men who have made satisfactory accommodation arrangements may be allowed to accumulate up to 2 rest days, or in the event of their being committed to operations from which it is impossible to allow stand down days within the 2 weeks period, to accumulate 3 rest days. It is emphasised that single men of companies other than the resident company at Minden Bks will not be accommodated at Minden Bks.

(b) Such cases will be exceptional and where ever possible every effort should be made for one day a week to be taken, such stand-down extending from 0600 hours to 0600 hours on the following day.

6. As laid down in 2 RAR RO 135/56 the total number of personnel absent on leave at any one time will not exceed 20 % of the effective strength of the Company.

7. The following transport arrangements will be made for the movement of personnel from areas as under :-

(a) KROH

- (i) Transport will be provided from Company resources for movement to and from Mitchell Pier
- (ii) Direct liaison will be effected with CC Rear Details Minden Barracks for co-ordination transport to meet personnel at Church Street Pier and return to Church Street Pier on completion of stand down period.

(b) LINLANG
SUNGGI SIPUT

- (i) Companies in residence in these areas will inform this HQ by 0800 hours each Monday the number of personnel being granted leave for the forthcoming week, such information to show date of departure and return.
- (ii) The information will be collated by this HQ and companies will be informed whether co-ordinated transport will be made available from KUALA KANGSAR or whether the provision of transport will be the responsibility of the company concerned. This will depend on the members involved in each case.
- (iii) In the event of co-ordination of transport not being arranged by this HQ the company concerned will arrange direct with CC Rear Details for transport to meet the leave personnel at and return them to Church Street Pier.

(c) KUALA KANGSAR

- (i) Companies in residence at KUALA KANGSAR will inform this HQ by 0800 hours each Monday similar details as for 7 (b)(1) above.
- (ii) The information will be collated as for 7 (b)(1) above. Whether these personnel are included in a co-ordinated leave party or not, Battalion Transport Officer will be responsible for the provision of the necessary transport to Mitchell Pier. The maximum use will be made of vehicles returning to Minden Barracks or Datterworth and departure timings will be co-ordinated to fit leave timings.

8. The maximum use should be made of private transport and as a matter of principle personnel proceeding on leave should arrange a car load. This should be taken into consideration when assessing company transport demands.
