

139. ~~INSTALLMENT~~ CREDIT SCHEME - NAAFI

1. NAAFI have had under examination a scheme whereby domestic appliances and other durable goods are made available to entitled customers on instalment credit terms. This examination has been completed, and NAAFI now propose to introduce an experimental scheme in MALAYA and SINGAPORE.

/ . 2. THE EXPERIMENTAL

ROUTINE ORDERS PART I (continued)

2. The experimental scheme must necessarily be limited in some respects so that NAAFI can satisfy themselves that the terms of credit offered are competitive, and that interest and the additional costs of the administration and accountancy inevitably incurred in such a scheme will be covered by the "service charge" mentioned below. After a suitable period of trial it is hoped that it will be possible to extend the scheme, with such modifications as may be necessary, to all Commands at home and abroad where NAAFI operate.

3. In broad terms, the proposal is to include in the scheme goods retailing at £10 or more. Service personnel (except, for the time being, unmarried or unaccompanied personnel below the rank of Sergeant), units and messes and civilians entitled to deal will be able to buy such goods on payment of a deposit of at least 20 per cent of the retail price, on signature of an Agreement requiring payment of the balance of the retail price over eight months in weekly, fortnightly or monthly instalments. A discount at the rate of 5 per cent will be allowed in the amount of the deposit only; the retention by NAAFI of the discount on the balance of the retail price represents a "service charge" to meet the additional administrative and accountancy costs of the scheme and interest on the outstanding debt.

4. It is proposed, at least initially, to place the following limits on the amount of debt which each category of customer may incur under this scheme:-

- (a) Officers, and civilians of officer status entitled to deal.....£120
- (b) Warrant Officers and Sergeants, and civilians of equivalent status.....£80
- (c) Married personnel below the ranks of Sergeant, accompanied by their families.....£40

These limits refer to the amounts which may be repaid by instalments over eight months, and are equivalent to a sale before deduction of the deposit of 20 per cent of £150, £100 and £50 respectively. No limit is placed on the amount of debt which units and messes may incur except that it must be reasonable in relation to the size of the unit or mess.

5. The Agreement which the customer signs will give NAAFI the right to take appropriate action to recover the debt in the event of default by the customer. NAAFI will take all possible steps to avoid bad debts arising - the limitation on the amount of credit referred to above is one such step. In exceptional circumstances however, it may be necessary to invoke the provisions of Article 4 (b) of the Pay Warrant. While intending purchasers may draw on their credits to make payment of the deposit required under the scheme, it must be clearly understood that no advances of pay may be made for this purpose. Participants must also make their own arrangements for remitting deposits and periodical instalments to NAAFI.

133. DOCUMENTATION - AAF A129

1. Coys will ensure that all promotions or reductions in rank are correctly entered on members AAF A129.

/2. EXTENDED TOURS OF DUTY-FARELF...

134. EXTENDED TOURS OF DUTY - FARELF

1. The AHQ policy on this subject is that as many soldiers as possible should be given experience in MALAYA. Consequently, applications for extended tours will NOT normally be approved.
2. In elaboration of this policy the following points are made:-
 - (a) An application based on compassionate grounds which are outside the member's control will receive sympathetic consideration.
 - (b) An application based on grounds which have resulted through the member's own actions will NOT be approved. An example of this is where a member applies for an extension to enable him to meet a hire purchase debt.

135. VENEREAL DISEASE

- A. 1. Under no circumstances will the infection itself with venereal disease be the subject of disciplinary action.
 2. Every member of the Australian Military Forces suffering from any form of venereal disease, as soon as he becomes aware that he is so suffering, will report the fact to his commanding officer or other proper military authority.
 3. Disciplinary action will be taken under Section 11 of the Army Act against any member who, having contracted venereal disease, fails to report the fact to proper military authority. "Proper Military Authority" will include, where applicable, a medical officer of the RAAMC or RAMC. It does NOT include a civilian practitioner.
 4. No financial penalties will be imposed on a member because he is absent from duty on account of venereal disease, whether or not due to misconduct.
 5. Although infection itself will not be the subject of disciplinary action, repeated infections may well justify consideration being given to the desirability of discharging the member under AMR 184 (1) (iv) (Unfit for the duties of his Corps)
- B. Members who fail to report infection with venereal disease will be charged as follows :-

136. SECURITY OF ARMS - TRAVEL THROUGH KUALA LUMPUR RAILWAY STATION

1. An arms Kote has been opened on KUALA LUMPUR Railway Station to accommodate arms of all military personnel travelling to and from SINGAPORE and PENANG.
2. All persons in transit through KUALA LUMPUR Railway Station will deposit their arms in this arms kote on arrival at the Railway Station, and withdraw weapons before departure. In the case of formed drafts or parties of 20 or over, arms will be stacked under unit arrangements near the RTO's office and guards will be found from units.
3. This arms kote is being manned by Army Depot Police. A tally will be given in exchange for each weapon. The tally must be surrendered in order to withdraw the weapon. If a soldier cannot produce a tally the Army Depot Police has been instructed not to issue the arm but to take the individuals personal particulars and bring the weapon to Central MALAYA Sub District. Central MALAYA Sub District will write to the unit concerned to verify that the weapon is on their charge.

137. EXTRACTS OF 3 RAR STANDING ORDERS FOR MALAYA

SECURITY OF ARMS AND AMMUNITION - PARAS 10, 12, 42 and 46

INDIVIDUAL RESPONSIBILITY FOR SAFE CUSTODY OF ARMS AND AMMUNITION

10. Arms and ammunition, once withdrawn from unit or sub-unit central custody (e.g. arms kote, armoury or Q Store) become the personal responsibility of the individual to whom they are issued from such central custody, until properly returned.
12. Whilst in individual custody (VIDE PARA 10) weapons and ammunition will never be left unattended at any time, i.e. they will either be carried by the individual or otherwise left continuously in his sight at a range of NOT more than 6 feet. Immediate and severe disciplinary action will be taken for breaches of this order, and officers and NCOs will constantly be alert to detect offenders. Particular attention will be given during daily barrack room inspection to ensure that arms and ammunition are not left lying about.

LOSSES OF ARMS AND AMMUNITION

42. Any member of 3 RAR discovering the loss of arms and/or ammunition on issue to him or to any other member of such unit, will immediately report the loss by the quickest means to his Company Headquarters.

DISCIPLINARY ACTION

46. An individual who is responsible for the loss, through negligence, of arms will normally be tried by court martial. Loss of ammunition is a lesser offence, provided an immediate report is made. The most stringent action will be taken where unreported losses are subsequently discovered.

AMBUSH/CONTACT REPORT 26/27 Jul 58 BY ASLT PNR PL

1. Afternoon 23 Jul 58 :- Scout car ptl and discovery of approx 70 lbs of sweet potatoes by OC B Coy at VD 928008.
2. Afternoon 24 Jul 58 :- Jeep ptl and indication to Pl Comd Aslt Pnr Pl of food dump and recce of area by OC B Coy.
3. 25 Jul 58 :- Briefing for ambush. First ambush from 1900 hrs to 2400 hrs by Pl Comd and two NCO's Aslt pnr pl. Smaller lot of sweet potatoes (approx 20 lbs) missing.
4. 26 Jul 58 :- Second ambush by one NCO from first ambush and two remaining NCO's from Pl.
5. 27 Jul 58 :- Third ambush by Sec Comd Two Sec and two Pte's from Two sec.
6. Third ambush was successful and the fol info is reported:-

Four CT were seen and fired on at 2145 hrs 27 Jul 58, from the mangling mill at VD 928008. Three were identified as Chinese males, ^{see} these being killed. Two of the three killed were dressed in KD's while the third CT killed wore a KD shirt and dark trousers. All wore hockey boots, home made web equipment, and were carrying packs. Only two were found with caps of CT standard pattern bearing red stars. The first and third CTs carried No 5 Rifles, while the second CT carried a pump action Remington Shot Gun. All appeared from the NORTH (see diagram) and the CT who escaped ran off (doubled up), in a NORTHERLY direction along a track. All CTs had had the intention of entering the mangling mill where the ambush lay concealed.

The action ran as fols:-

A dogs barking, which resembled an attempted imitation was heard at approx 2115 hrs from the NORTH. At approx 2140 hrs all was completely quiet. At 2145 hrs, members 1 and 2 of the ambush party (see diagram) saw and heard movement from the direction of the footbridge and saw figures merge into one to enter the door of the mangling mill. No 3 in the ambush party saw and heard 4 CTs leave the darkness of a tree and double towards the bridge, then crossing in single file, and then fanning out, then returning to single file. The fire was opened as the first CT placed his foot inside the mangling mill. all wps opened up as the ambush comd sprang the ambush. Fire was cont until the ambush comd then saw the fourth CT attempting to escape, and himself ran outside the mangling mill, after ordering to cease fire, and fired two shots after the CT as he fled. Neither shot was observed to hit for the figure was doubled up and was running fast. NO wpn was seen to be carried by the fourth CT. NO fire was returned by the CTs.

The ambush party then examined the bodies after the cease fire, and returned to the mangling mill where they fired the Bn recall signal twice. They then returned to the JALONG - SG SIPUT RD and moved down it to the gates at JALONG NEW VILLAGE where they rang and informed the Pl Comd of their contact.

7. The ambush party members were placed as indicated so as to cover all approaches into the shed, and although the actual door used was considered the most possible approach, all entrances were covered. The night of the ambush was three days before full moon and so those in the shed were in darkness looking out into a bright moonlight. Night firing attachments were NOT used after the first night because

7. of the possibility of accidental flicking on. One waterbottle was allowed per gp, the ambush Comd wearing the only webbing which was a belt, waterbottle carrier and waterbottle with NO pannikin. Face veils and one container of mosquito repellent was allowed per gp. Two full magazines were carried by each FN man and three each by the OMC men, spare mags being carried in pockets. Each ambush comprised three wpns, either one or two FNs and one or two OMCs. The successful ambush was armed with two FNs and one OMC. Each ambush Comd carried two M36 grenades. Overshoes were worn by all members both in and out of ambush to conceal tracks. A separate report on these will be handed in.

8. The ambush party was dropped off nightly from a moving scout car at approx 1830 hrs on the rubber edge and moved along a track to be in posn by last light. Each ambush party was picked up by a moving scout car after 2400 hrs each night. To further aid in deception the scout car dawdled from its turn around near JALONG NV gate, after which ambush party members climbed out of the scout car through the drop off point to the RE rd junc where, at normal speed it cruised up and down both RE rd NORTH and RE rd SOUTH, and then returned to the COUNTRY CLUB. At 2400 hrs the scout car repeated this performance, remaining at the COUNTRY CLUB overnight.

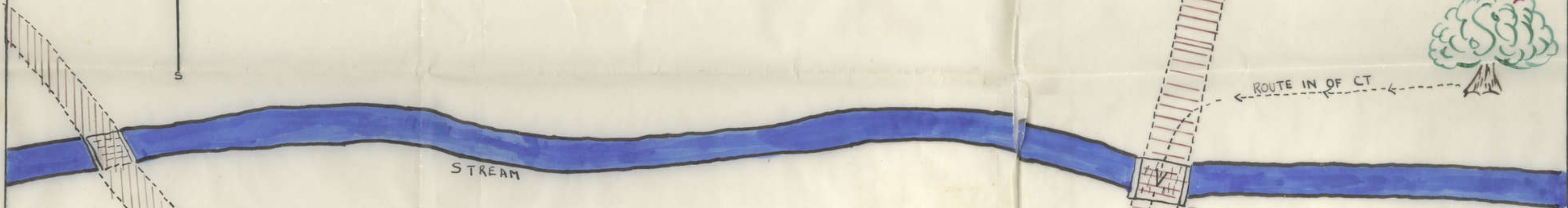

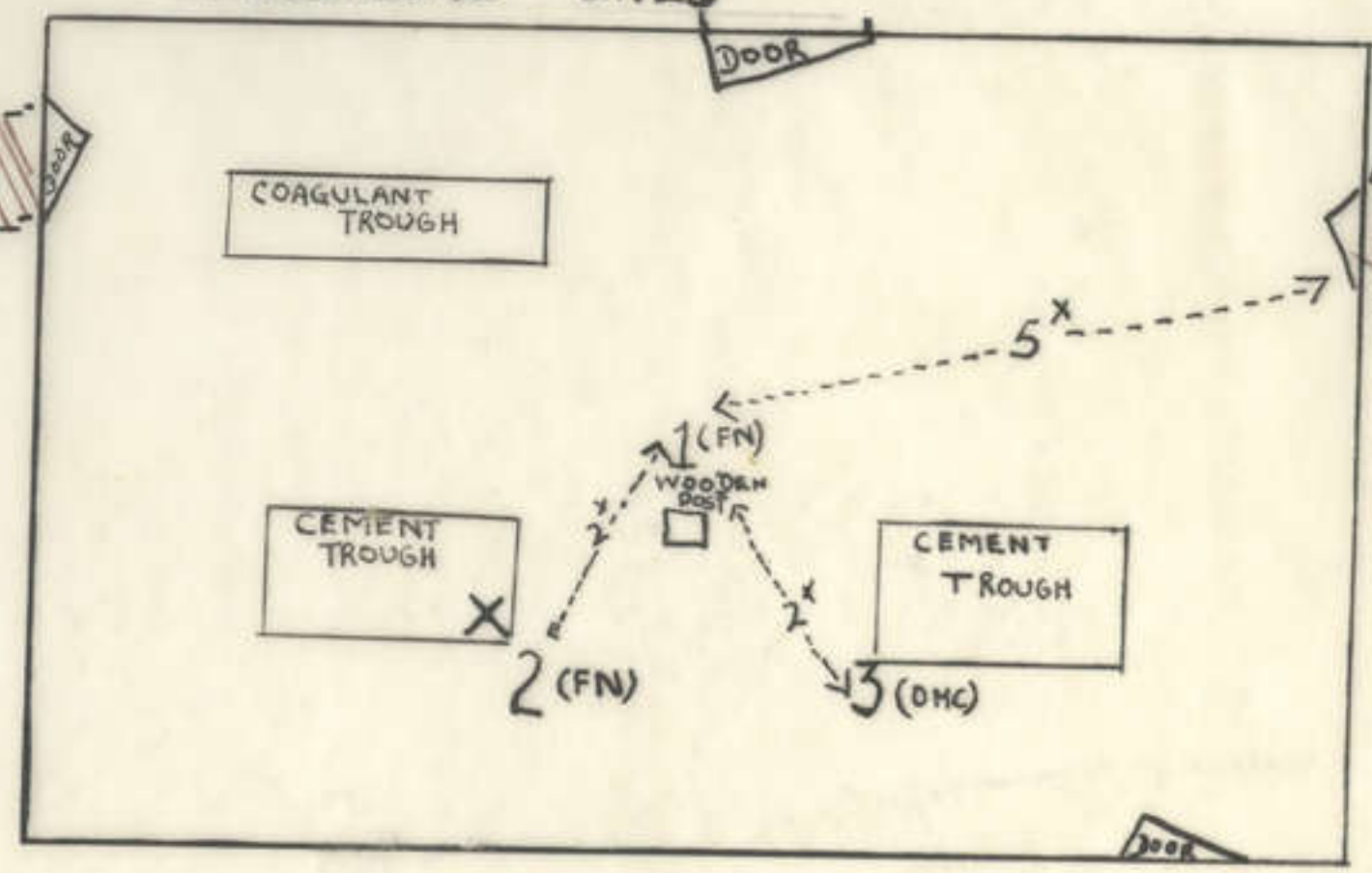

F. Terrain. Gen. Normal jungle country. The NORTH - SOUTH ridge can be best negotiated by climbing the ridge lines leading to the 1318 and 1470 features respectively.
LZs Apart from the EAST bank of the SG KERBAU there are very few flat areas and a good LZ could NOT be located well EAST of the Sg KERBAU. I feel a good LZ could be made on the 1318 feature which would enable a cas evac from the high ground, resup for troops operating from the main ridge and facilitate bringing in a dog. At VE035076 (an old CT campsite) a difficult LZ could also be prepared.

G. En.

3 July

1. See annez A for INCIDENT REPORT.

4 July

2. Follow up 1 barefooted CT to VE010086. CT called in at old CT camp (see para 3 below) which may have been a possible RV after the camp had been compromised. The tracks when lost were heading ESE.

NOTE

The tracker dog CARL did NOT arrive at the scene of the incident until dark and although tried several times would NOT track the CT. (3 Jul)

3. At VE009087, found CT camp for 20 - 25 CTs. Apart from the 1 CT mentioned above, last used 12 mths ago. Camp contained only two bashas in poor condition with a fireplace which indicated central cooking had been used. The camp had good security being on a spur leading to water with asentry at the rear. There were thick logs providing cover. A few pieces of old plastic and two cig lighters were recovered.

5 July

4. At VE011085 found CT camp for 20 - 25 persons last used 12 mths ago. Used by same gp as used camp mentioned in para 3 above as camp was almost identical in layout.

9 July

5. 2 Ct pig traps were found at VE010099 and another ~~and another~~ trap at VE007100. The latter which was near the CT camp water point contained a live pig. All traps were destroyed.

12 July

6. At VE035076 found CT camp for 25 - 30 persons last used about 18 mths ago. Probably the same gp as mentioned in paras 3 and 4 above. Camp had ~~XX~~ 7 basbas and 4 slit trenches. Loc on a spur and would NOT be found easily. Camp delapidated through age and ~~d~~ NOT require destroying.

H. Any Map Corrections.

The high country is quite accurate on the 2N1 map. The lower portions are inaccurate in detail. Ptl's must expect the minor streams to vary in shape from the map.

J. Misc Info

1. Comms
Comms were ~~not~~ loud and clear for most of the daylight hours through the op. However when I was trying to pass on info after the incident, I was deliberately cut out by a non-military station which necessitated lengthy messages bt CW to LASAH by an inexperienced morse operator.

K. Result of encounters with en. See annex A for INCIDENT REPORT.

Condition of Ptl.

- L. NO cas were inflicted on the pl. Some members of the pl were suffering from a slight fever during the pt 1 and many were unusually tired towards the end of the ptl. Ptl was generally clear from skin complaints.

M. Conclusions and Recommendations.

1. The CTG has been using the area searched by 6 Pl for some time as is indicated by the three large camps found.
2. If the JALONG AWF have a main base camp it must be in the NE or EAST of the site of the incident. Although our area was thoroughly searched NO further fresh sign of CT were found.
3. On a ptl of this nature where a pl has to search according to a timed programme, I think it is imperative that one day be allotted for rest after about six days patrolling. I think five days rations is the limit that troops can carry in hilly country. We had difficulty in fitting seven days rations in our packs on having to move after the re-supply.

5. Description of Area
- (a) CT camp was in primary jungle with very thick undergrowth.
- (b) CT waterpoint was about 200 yds upstream from Pl Base (VE 005101) which was about 250 yds NORTH of CT Camp. The camp was shielded on two sides by ~~fig~~ ^{THICK} logs.
- (c) Visibility was about 25 yds.
6. No of CTs @ (MAKE)
- (These were actually seen by SARAWAK Pte SUNBANG. There was no evidence to suggest that there were more than 4 CTs in the camp at the time of the incident.)
7. Nationality of CT 1 Chinese 3 probably Chinese
- (Pte SUNBANG saw one CT manning an LMG and the bare backs of the two others as the CT evac their camp). Consider this info unreliable.

The Pl was fan patrolling to the EAST and SOUTH of its base (VE005101) for a distance of about 1500 yards as part of the B Coy plan to locate the JALONG AWF camp.

14. A 3 man platoon commanded by Cpl HENSCHKE (first platoon) moving on a bearing of 180° was passing the CT camp (VE006099) at approx 1255 hrs when they were sighted by the CT in the camp. The CT hastily withdrew one heading EAST the other three in a SSE direction. The two AUST members of the platoon did NOT immediately realize they had struck a CT camp until they heard some rapid scuffling in the undergrowth away from them. They then charged into the camp which had been evacuated.
15. The SARAWAK member (moving last) saw a CT manning a LMG resting on a log pointing in the direction of the FIRST PLATOON. As he brought his OMC up to fire the oil bottle clip caught under his jacket. Meanwhile he saw 4 CTs scatter very quickly. As he cannot speak ENGLISH he could NOT pass info on to his platoon command as quickly as might have been hoped.
16. As the CT withdrew they fired two shots with a short pause in between from an unidentified weapon. (NO brass was located despite an extensive search in the area for brass so that the weapon could be identified.)
17. Meanwhile the platoon adopted the following drill - those in the very close proximity freeze and cover in the direction of the fire (this was well carried out by the 3 man platoon command by SGT MOYLE) those further away move to the scene of the fire as quickly as possible. (The remainder of the Platoon incl L/CPL WHEATLEY's platoon arrived at the scene in a few minutes).
18. One CT headed EAST towards SGT MOYLE's platoon which had been moving on a bearing of 160°. PTE CLAUSEN saw some movement in the bushes and alerted the other two members who then saw a CT who was clad only in blue shorts. SGT MOYLE then ordered PTE O'BRIEN to shoot what now became an easy target at a range of 25 yds. The CT died instantly after receiving the only shot fired at him through the temple.
19. The remainder of the Platoon sweeping in extended line from their base arrived at the scene of the kill and then again swept with the second platoon towards the CT camp being guided in by CPL HENSCHKE.
20. The Platoon then did an immediate follow up with the aid of the rangers for about 400 yds. We could hear what appeared to be a CT walking carefully in thick undergrowth.
21. The three remaining CTs moved separately in a SSE direction through difficult country. The last sign of evidence was marked in anticipation of the early arrival of the tracking team requested at 1300 Hrs.
22. The camp was immediately ambushed by majority of Platoon as it was thought possible that other CT might arrive due to the amount of readily cooked food in the camp. Only three shots had been fired.
23. The discovery of the CT camp by one of our platoons and the killing of a CT by other platoon is attributed to the following factors:-
 - (a) Surprise - the CTs obviously thought they had a safe camp and could NOT have expected SF in the area. Arty fire in ASH may have led them to believe that we were working in that area.
 - (b) SF silence - the platoon had been based within 250 yds for the previous 20 hrs. One platoon had actually passed within about about 40 yds of the CT camp an hour previous to the incident.

- (c) Luck - had the CT not fired the two warning shots the other fan patrols and those remaining in base would NOT have been attracted so quickly.
- (d) Good info gained by B Coy during Op KING HIT which led us to believe that the CT had a camp in this area.
- (e) Clear thinking by Sgt MOYLE and an excellent shot by Pte O'BRIEN.

24. CT Camp

(a) The Age and Capacity.

The camp had been in existence for about five months. The four CTs mentioned above had been using the camp for about two to four weeks although there was room for the whole JALONG AWF in several cleared patches. There was NO recent evidence of the other six having used the camp in the preceding few days.

(b) Security

The camp had security by virtue of the thick undergrowth surrounding the camp giving early warning of anyone approaching. Due to the flat nature of the country there was little cover from fire except for two large logs, on NORTH and WEST edges of the camp. As only four CT were using the camp they could hardly afford outside sentries but a LMG was placed on NW corner of the logs. It is unlikely that the camp would be recognised from the air.

(c) Tracks

There were NO obvious tracks leading into the camp. The CT had obviously used great care; perhaps approaching their camp in bare feet. Further EAST there were tracks leading towards the camp, probably used by CTs checking pig traps. The camp is in close proximity to the tracks bordering the Sg KERBAU and a heavily laden CT could travel from JALONG TINGGI Estate in a day.

(d) ~~SIX~~ FOOD

There was a permanent fire place erected with bamboo sticks where the CT smoked their meat. Two ~~two~~ billies of stew were ready for eating as the camp was evac. In addition there were large quantities of cooked monkey and pork chops ready on top of the stove. The CTs had eaten monkey, wild pig and snails. Most portions of the various animals were eaten. The dead CT had just previously been engaged in washing the entrails of a pig. Perhaps these are used for ~~xx~~ sausage casings. In the general area of the camp wild game was plentiful - particularly monkey and pig. Six days after the incident two pig traps were found about four hundred yards EAST of the camp and a further one near the scene of the kill. They had been in existence for nearly a month. One had a freshly trapped live pig which was destroyed with the traps. There was NO evidence that the CTs had revisited these traps after the contact. Other food in the camp included small quantities of flour, tapioca and rock salt.

- (e) sleep Three of the CTs had slept in hammocks (these had been slung many times during the existence of the camp) while the fourth had slept on the ground.

(f) Fuel

The CTs had been using bamboo which was plentiful nearby; thus they did NOT have to chop. Furthermore they were in possession of a saw as one of the trees had been sawn off to create a chopping block and to allow more sunlight into the camp for drying of cloths.

(g) Utensils

There were several cooking utensils in the camp incl two mess tins all were destroyed. The CTs had plaited some bamboo for plates.

(h) Water point

The camp was about 100 yds from a good stream. The water point was NOT improved, the dead CT had been washing his cloths and some entrails at the river around the time of the contact as these items were recovered at the water point. Two pairs of trousers were drying near the fire.

25. CT DRESS

(a) The dead CT clad only in a blue pair of shorts as he had been washing his khaki cloths.

(b) Pte SUNBANG noted the following about the dress of the remaining three CT:-

(i) The Chinese manning the L.M.G was dressed in a pr of green shorts. As he left he placed on his cap slung his pack over his shoulder. He was a strong looking ~~chap~~ MAN.

(ii) One CT wearing a green singlet and ^{on} other a red singlet. (Consider the info unreliable as this contradicts a previous statement in para 7 and he would NOT ~~have~~ have time to note ~~such~~ so much detail.) _{have so much.}

26. CT WEAPONS.

(a) Private SUNBANG saw a LMG. I saw the notches in the log where a LMG had rested over a period.

(b) PRIVATE SUNBANG claims he did NOT see the remaining 2 CT carry any weapons as they fled the camp. (Consider this unreliable).

(c) I checked the dead CT weapon and he did NOT fire the 2 warning shots (the brass could not be found).

27. DEDUCTIONS.

(a) The 4 CTs in this camp are the remaining members of the ~~large~~ JALONG AWF (the dead CT had been ~~charted~~ with this group) the other 6 members had previously left signs of movement and resting places in the ASH area. Possibly they had been left behind to prepare fresh food while LAM POH was making contacts with the masses.

(b) This camp did NOT have the appearance of a permanent base camp. It appeared to be a good place for food and water when the CT considered it was safe to be in this area. They probably shifted just out side ASH due to the intense pressure in that area. If LAM POH had a

permanent base camp (we found NO evidence that he had one in 6 pl area) it must be well to the EAST or N.E. On the other hand it is doubtful that he crosses the main NORTH-SOUTH ridge - this is difficult to cross and NO CTs signs were seen.

- (e) The large quantities of readily cooked food and the fact that the CT fired two warning shots led me to believe that there were more CTs (not necessarily JALONG AWF) in the area. There were enough containers for the CT to carry food away. On the other hand the 2 warning shots fired by after the CT evac the camp may have been fired to warn the CT later killed who in my opinion was washing or checking a near by pig trap at the time of the contact (his pack was the only one left in the camp.)
- (f) The large amount of food obtained from the jungle and the appearance of the dead CT seems to indicate that the JALONG AWF is NOT starving.
- (e) The CTs seemed to be well equipped for arms, ammunition and med supplies. The M36 grenade was ready to throw. Their packs contained normal jungle eqpt and are packed through out the day ready for evac.
- (f) The CT will NOT stay and fight if they think they can evac their camp undetected. The CTs on this occasion had every opportunity to inflict serious cas on our 3 man ptl. Hence we must be very aggressive when attacking a CT camp if we are to catch them.
- (g) It appears that the CT try to move away from their camp very carefully and even freeze rather than make alot of noise by running. The CT that was killed was moving very stealthily and it sounded as if at least one other moved in the same way.
- (h) Tracks found by 8 ~~pl~~ P1 suggested that LAM POH was moving toward the CT camp now being ambushed. He probably noticed numerous signs of SF activity in the area.
- (j) Morale of this group of CTs must be low apart from losing one of their own group for the first time they lost quantities of food and eqpt and their trousers. Tracks later found suggested that they were ~~later~~ split and this would give them an opportunity to surrender if so inclined.
- (k) Despite ~~the~~ an intensive search in our whole area NO further fresh signs of CTs were found after the follow up which would suggest that the CT laid low in the general area of the incident for several days.
