AIM

1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organization and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

GENERAL

2. Entries are to be made daily on AF C 2118 (Adapted) each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.

3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties (Australia)" Chapter 2, Section 12.

RESPONSIBILITY

During Non-operational Periods

4. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled by commanders of all formations.

During Operational Periods (1)

- 5. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled in duplicate by:
  - a. Commanders of all formations.
  - b. Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a brigadier or above.
  - c. Heads of services not below the rank of lieutenant colonel.
  - d. Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
  - e. Unit commanders.
  - f. Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

COMPILATION

- 6. Both original and duplicate copies are to consist of:
  - a. Cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted).
  - b. Index as printed on cover.
  - c. Narrative (AF C 2118) (Adapted).
  - d. Annexes as shown in the Index.
- 7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes are to be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer is to be included.
- 8. The annexes are to be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for the unit, the name of the unit will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters, they are to be entered on the cover starting at B.

**DISPOSAL**

13. **Original Commander's Diary.** This is to be forwarded monthly, unless otherwise ordered, the seventh day of the succeeding month direct to AHQ.

14. **Duplicate Commander's Diary.** This must be clearly marked as a duplicate. It is to be sent separately from the original to AHQ one month after the original has been despatched but not before the former has been acknowledged.

15. When overseas, both copies of diaries are to be sent through the Army Records organization in the overseas theatre but at different times.

16. **TOP SECRET Supplementary Diaries.**

a. The documents referred to in Paragraph 9 together with a list of them made out on AF C 2118 (Adapted) must be placed in separate cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted). All details must be filled in and the cover clearly marked in red: "ANNEX Z — OFFICER ONLY". It may be convenient to group the papers by appendices.

b. Supplementary diaries must be forwarded under the normal rules for TOP SECRET correspondence, to AHQ. The inner envelope must be plainly marked:

- 1845 hours - Stand To - M113's and Listening Posts.  
(Other personnel to be in tents and quiet).
- 1900 hours - Stand down.
- 1930 hours - Wet and Dry Canteens open.
- 1915 hours - Movies
- 2115 hours - Wet and Dry Canteens close.
- 2145 hours - Bed Check.
- 2200 hours - Lights Out.

## 13. FIELD PUNISHMENT AND CB.

a. Fd punishment and CB parades will be held daily at SHQ. They will be conducted by the SSM/CSM as applicable, at 0800 hrs and 1645 hrs.

b. All soldiers awarded fd punishment or CB will attend these parades except when excused for the following reasons:

(i) When the soldier is out on operations or absent from the C Sqn area on duty.

(ii) As authorised by the OC C Sqn.

c. Soldiers, on return to normal duty, will complete the unfinished portion of their sentence if it was not completed whilst they were on operations.

d. SSM/CSM will inform the Adjt of any soldier who has not attended a fd punishment or CB parade.

e. Dress.

(i) Field Punishment

Greens

Boots

Beret or bush hat

Basic Webbing, to include - basic pouches, water bottle.

Field Pack, to contain - set of greens, messing equipment, pair of socks.

Personal weapon with ammo carried as ordered.

Unless otherwise approved by the OC C Sqn, fd punishment personnel will wear the above equipment at all times between the morning Stand To and the evening Stand Down.

(ii) Confined to Barracks. Dress as for fd punishment for each parade otherwise normal dress for the soldier's normal duties.

/f.



f. Soldiers on CB or fd punishment will not:

- (i) Consume alcoholic liquor.
- (ii) Attend the theatre.

g. The SSM/CSM will read these orders to soldiers awarded fd punishment or CB immediately the award is given.

h. Fd punishment and CB is to commence on the date of the award, (AMR 257 (2) ).

i. Failure to attend any one parade, without prior approval, or failure to observe any of the above instructions will render the soldier liable to further disciplinary action.

j. Soldiers on field punishment will, between daylight and dusk, move around the camp at the double.

#### 14. ALCOHOLIC LIQUOR

a. Sales. The individual beer ration is 3 cans per person per day. On no account will any person consume more than his entitlement. All cans or bottles purchased are to be opened by the barman. No unopened cans or bottles are to be taken from the canteen.

b. Bounds. C Sqn Camp Standing Order number 230 states:- "Members and attached members of C Sqn 1 Armd Regt will not be in possession of or consume any alcoholic liquor of any nature in unit lines!".

All members are advised that this order is to be rigidly adhered to. Disciplinary action will be taken against any member found in possession or consuming liquor within unit lines including weapon pits.

#### 15. PERSONAL WEAPON SAFETY WITHIN 1 ATF

a. Personal weapons will be carried at all times or when stationary will be readily available.

b. Except in the case of the F1 SMC the loaded magazine is to be on the weapon with the working parts forward and the safety device applied. NO round will be in the chamber.

c. F1 magazine are to be carried in the pocket until further notice.

d. Grenades within 1 ATF area will have the pin splayed, the striker lever taped to the body of the grenade and the grenade is to be carried in its fibre container.

#### 16. DUTIES OF SENTRIES

a. Men manning sentry posts, listening posts or on any form of picquet are to observe the following rules:

- (i) No smoking at night.
- (ii) Books etc. are not to be taken on duty.
- (iii) Transistor radios are not to be taken on duty.
- (iv) Letters are not to be written on duty.
- (v) Alcoholic liquor may not be consumed on duty.

b. In addition, sentries of all types are to maintain a constant watch over their arc of responsibility to the limit of their visibility and remain quiet and alert throughout their period of duty.

/c. Drukeness.

- c. Drukeness on duty is a serious offence. Soldiers will not mount duty under the influence of alcohol.
- d. When two men are posted to a sentry post both will observe the above rules. Two men are NOT posted so that one may watch whilst the other rests. Both sentries are to observe the arc of responsibility.
- e. The procedure for relief is as follows:
  - (i) In the case of single sentries by day, the post will not be left until the relief sentry arrives and has been briefed on his duties.
  - (ii) In the case of two sentries by night, each man will change alternately. One sentry may leave his post to wake his relief. Having woken him, he will return to his post immediately and await the arrival of his relief. He will be absent from his post for the minimum amount of time. Under NO circumstances will both men be absent from the post at the same time.


17. FIRES

No open fires are allowed in C Sqn area at any time except as authorised by the Unit Fire Officer (LT JONES). This does not include kitchens or shower facilities. Laundry facilities and shower burners are not to be left unattended.

18. UNIT INSPECTION, SERVICING AND MAINTENANCE OF EQUIPMENT.

- a. All troop leaders and echelon commanders will read and initial references A and B held at SHQ.
- b. AAF 857 folders will be struck and held by the Tech Offr for all Sqn vehicles.
- c. Troop Leaders and Echelon Commanders will draw 857 forms/pro formas on the first day of each month and by progressive inspection will thoroughly inspect their vehicles by the end of the month.
- d. Access to vehicles in workshops will be requested via the Technical Officer.
- e. Any item found not serviceable will be marked O, A, or B as applicable and if rectified before the 857 is submitted, duly noted in the appropriate column.
- f. Troop Leaders will NOT delegate inspection to any crewman below the rank of Sergeant.



- (ii) Priority 2. - Married Officers.







ENEMY FORCES - OP CLAYTON

1. LONG DIEN is the capital of LONG DIEN DISTRICT and the HQ of LONG DIEN Sub Sector. It is the economic hub of PHUOC TUY PROVINCE and usually has population of some 14,000 persons although presently the population is thought to be about 8,000, concentrated mainly to the north of Route 23.
2. Since the commencement of the TET offensive the VC have harassed the town and occupied and demolished some government installations, particularly to the South of Route 23. Two ARVN battalions and 1 ATF elements had cleared the town by about 10 Feb 67. The last ARVN battalion withdrew from the town on 18 Feb 67. Light contact and harassing is continuing in the southern portion of the village. VC have used AK45s, RPG 2s, RPG 7s and other light automatic and semi auto weapons.
3. Present estimates place about 120 - 150 VC in the area of the northern LONG HAI mountains. The principal fighting units are thought to be C1/D445 with a strength of 20 to 30 armed with AK47s and B40s, and C25 (LONG DAT DIST Coy) with a strength of about 50 to 60.
4. Almost nightly since early Feb 68 there have been squad to platoon size contacts in the area of the RF/PF posts to the south of Route 23. These contacts are thought to be probes against GVN defences or groups of VC entering LONG DIEN in search of supplies.
5. It is most likely that if VC are contacted it will be in the Southern part of the village. This area suffered extensive damage as a result of Allied airstrikes and artillery and was also looted by ARVN units moving in the area. The population is, consequently, a little hostile.
6. Most recent contacts have been:
  - a. 180610H at YS434586  
Squad sized VC group contacted by 52 ARVN Rangers. 3 x AK47 magazines captured. Documents identify group as 1st Pl, C1 Coy, D445 Bn.
  - b. 190820H at YS438588  
6 VC seen, moving south to north, wearing green uniforms and blue scarves. Moved off to south east.
7. A recent agent states that a group of 130 VC were located at YS460568 at 151600H Feb 68. Some 40 of these were reported to be wearing ARVN uniforms. This report cannot be confirmed.

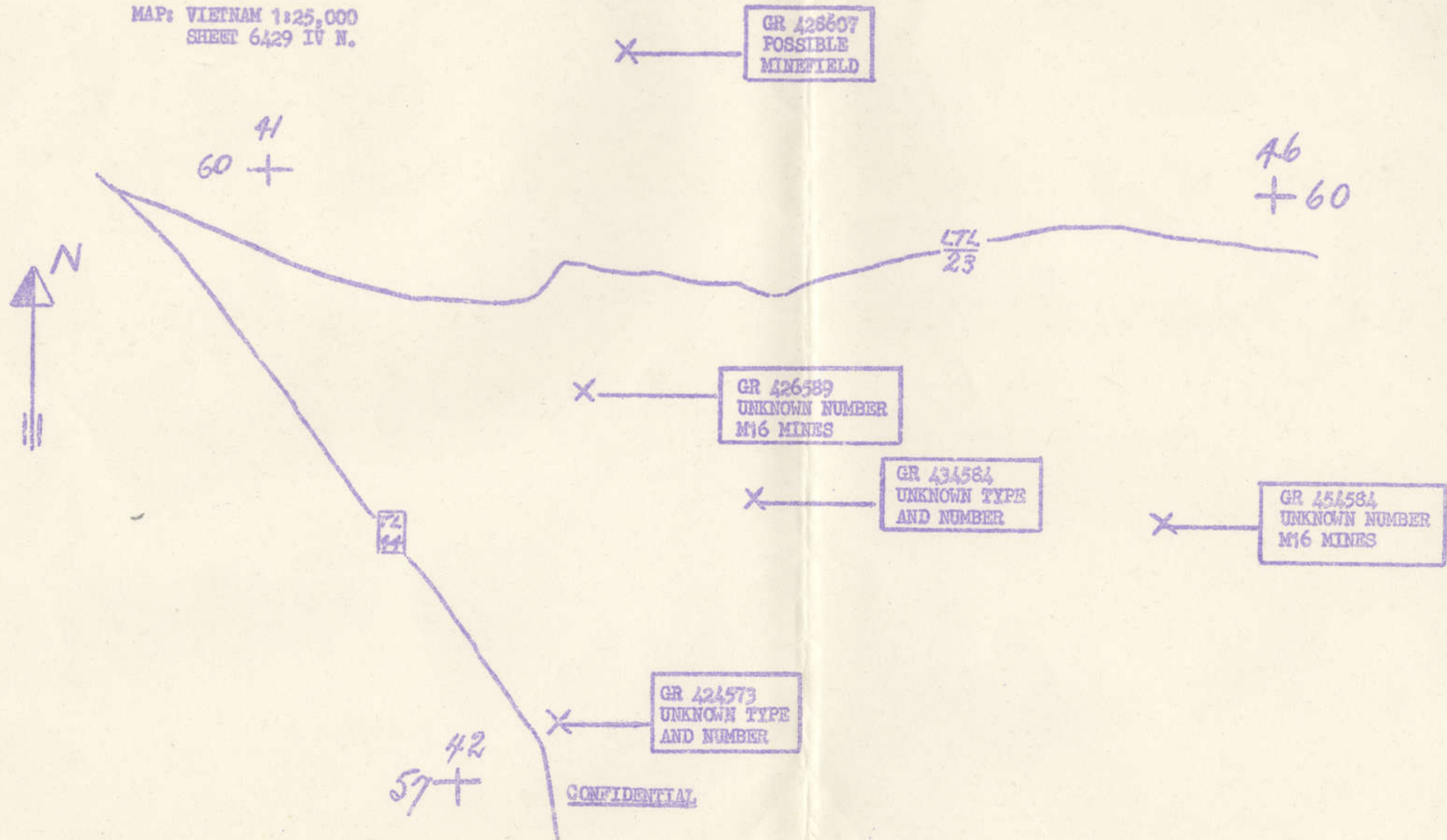
