AIM

1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organization and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

GENERAL

- 2. Entries are to be made daily on AF C 2118 (Adapted) each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.
- 3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties (Australia)", Chapter 2, Section 12.

RESPONSIBILITY

During Non-operational Periods

4. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled by commanders of all formations.

During Operational Periods (1)

- 5. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled in duplicate by:
 - a. Commanders of all formations.
 - b. Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a brigadier or above.
 - c. Heads of services not below the rank of lieutenant colonel.
 - d. Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
 - e. Unit commanders.
 - f. Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

COMPILATION

- 6. Both original and duplicate copies are to consist of:
 - a. Cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted).
 - b. Index as printed on cover.
 - c. Narrative (AF C 2118) (Adapted).
 - d. Annexes as shown in the Index.
- 7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes are to be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer is to be included.
- 8. The annexes are to be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an annex NIL will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters. tarting at B.

DISPOSAL

- 13. Original Commander's Diary. This is to be forwarded monthly, unless otherwise ordered, by the seventh day of the succeeding month direct to AHQ.
- 14. Duplicate Commander's Diary. This must be clearly marked as a duplicate. It is to be sent separately from the original to AHQ one month after the original has been despatched but not before the former has been acknowledged.
- 15. When overseas, both copies of diaries are to be sent through the Army Records organization in the overseas theatre but at different times.
- 16. TOP SECRET Supplementary Diaries.
 - a. The documents referred to in Paragraph 9 together with a list of them made out on AF C 2118 (Adapted) must be placed in separate cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted). 

General

1. The operational situation continues quiet, with little active effort being made by the Indonesians to pursue military confrontation. Incidents that have occurred are minor and are detailed in Annex Λ .

Operations

SECRET

Copy No 50 of HQ FARELF Operations Instruction No 117. The Defence of West Malaysia and Singapore against Indonesian Aggression, has been despatched to AHQ. This Instruction replaces HQ FARELF Operation Instruction No 110 (BAGATELLE) forwarded to AHQ under reference 119/1/38 dated 15 Dec 64, all references to which are now cancelled and should be destroyed.

RESTRICTED

2. 182 Recce Flt. The flight commander and aircraft are expected to be in BORNEO within days. The second pilot, 2Lt ELLIS, required additional theatre familiarisation prior to committal to BORNEO operations. Because the unit title does not identify it with 4 RAR, some difficulties have arisen in communicating with it.

4. Australian Units in EAST MALAYSIA.

D Coy

a. 4 RAR.

(1) The battalion relieved the 1/10 Gurkha Rifles at 1200 hrs on 29 Apr 66 and are deployed as follows:

5. Australian Units in THAILAND.

2 Fd Tp RAE. The troop continued its commitments at CONFIDENTIAL Operation CROWN site. The return of the troop is scheduled for move by air to MALACCA on 13 and 17 May 66.

CONFIDENTIAL 6. Casualty State. The casualty state as at 30 Apr is attached as Annex C.

Staff Duties

7. SAS Relief Programmes.

SECRET

- a. Although FARELF is aware that operational tours by SAS (AS) Sqns are each subject to separate negotiation, and that there is at present no arrangement for Australia to provide a further squadron in 1967, MOD (Army) in a recent signal to FARELF has suggested that the requirement for SAS during the period late Jun 67 to late Oct 67 could possibly be met by an Australian squadron.
- b. As this period would not include the month pre-deployment theatre familiarisation, the period involved outside Australia would be mid May 67 to early Nov 67.
- c. AHQ comments on the proposal are invited.

8. Relief of 2 SAS.

- a. Although the dates proposed for the return to Australia are as yet undecided, there is little doubt that the first group of the squadron will be available for uplift from FARELF by 28 July.
- CONFIDENTIAL
- b. It is planned that the Cl30 courier flights on 29 Jul and 7 Aug be used for the return, with any left over personnel moving by the flight on 12 Aug.
- c. Stores movement would be subsequent to personnel, and be phased over later courier flights.
- 9. Variation to Equipment Table HQ AAF FARELF.

UNCLAS

a. HQ AAF FARELF 205/6/5 dated 11 Apr 66 recommended that permission be granted for immediate purchase of an electric typewriter.

- b. Advice on the progress of this matter would be appreciated: as the alternative, local recruitment of typists would be more expensive, although perversely, within Comd AAF FARELF's delegation.
- 10. Issue of Directives within FARELF.

RESTRICTED

- a. AHQ GS Instr 4/66 paragraph 8 states that a directive is to be issued separately to OC 110 LAA Bty RAA.
- b. My 31-1-8(G) of 6 May 66 draws attention to an apparent departure from previous procedure for the issue of such directives. Currently a difficulty exists because the directive from C-in-C to DOBOPS, by which 4 RAR's current tasks must be governed, has not yet been received by C-in-C.

Training

11. Force Maintenance Area Exercise FLYING MANNA.

RESTRICTED

- a. An exercise similar in concept to Exercise FLYING BISCUIT is planned to be held in the KUANTAN area between 15 Sep 17 Oct. These dates would be exclusive of pre-exercise stocking, but inclusive of withdrawal/recovery. The operational phase, 3 Oct 8 Oct, and possibly the mobilisation and deployment phase, 15 Sep 2 Oct, would be suitable periods for attendance by an Australian observer team such as that sent for FLYING BISCUIT.
- b. Should AHQ wish to exercise the opportunity to send participants/observers, early warning would be appreciated.
- 12. Light Anti-Aircraft Firing Practices 110 LAA Bty RAL.

RESTRICTED

- a. The proposed firing practice to be conducted at CHINA ROCK by 110 LAA Bty RAA, shortly after its arrival in the theatre has been the subject of signal correspondence between 110 LAA Bty and Milcommand ADELAIDE, copies being sent to HQ AAF The difficulties involved in conducting a practice so soon after arriving in the theatre are appreciate and have been catered for. The problem of ammunition resupply has however not been resolved.
- b. This connects with AHQ 1000/R1/11 of 25 Mar 66, whereby AHQ decided not to vary the allotment to the Australian training scale which included 120 rpg blank. It is requested that
 - (1) the decision not to vary the scale be reviewed;
 - (2) the ammunition be provided to 443 BAD SINGAPORE forthwith.

13. A Fd Bty RAA. The battery were involved in a very thorough training schedule during the period under review, taking part in 17 Division Exercise LIONS ROAR 26 Mar - 5 Apr and conducting specialists courses within the unit. A GPO's course was also conducted during April.

Technical

14. Suitability of AR1.5.

SECRET

- Although the lethality of the AR15 has been test proven up to 100 y ls, and ranges greater than 100 yards were only met in BORNEO, in a fifth of all engagements, because of the undesirability of testing one rifle for BORNEO and another for THAILAND, it was hoped that the exercise "KACHORN SOEK" would provide opportunity to assess ranges of engagement in NE THAILAND. A previous visibili study showed that, taking the area as a whole, few enemy are likely to be seen beyond 400 metres Because of the cancellation of the exercise and subsequent lack of opportunity to assess the ranges of engagement, although it is reasonable to use the AR15 in BORNEO, FARELF: G(OR&A) feels that with the present state of knowledge it is not possible to recommend it for THAILAND.
- b. As an additional information source, data on small arms engagement ranges from Australian actions in SOUTH VIETNAM have been requested. G(OR&A) observers intend obtaining supplementary information from an exercise to be staged in MALAYA for this specific purpose.

CONFIDENTIAL 15. Battlefield Surveillance in NE THAILAND.

- a. A current G(OR&A) study on this subject has as its terms of reference the requirement to study the operational conditions likely to prevail during a SEATO action in NE THAILAND. The requirement for the detection and surveillance of the enemy in relation to equipment likely to be available in the time frame 1966/70; and requirements for new equipments which appear technically feasible are to be deduced from the study.
- b. As the study advances, field experiments, using troops on the ground, will be designed.
- c. Further information will be provided when available.

16. Guns - A Fd Bty RAA. Five of the six guns held have been declared BLR. The serviceable gun is the one brought out CONFIDENTIAL of reserve in Nov 65. Most wear has occurred in the carriages. A base repair programme is to commence shortly and A Fd Bty's guns will be given priority. Details of excessive wear are shown at Annex'H'.

Public Relations

17. General.

UNCLAS

- A. In a month of increased Army activity, local PR production showed a corresponding rise.

 Major stories included SAS medical patrols (given a wide coverage in major Australian papers),

 RAE airfield and roadwork in Thailand and Borneo and the visit of the Prime Minister, which was primarily an escorting task.
- b. Local Press continues to feature stories on Australian defence, reporting factually and without comment stories involving anti-Vietnam demonstrations and statements by Government and Opposition leaders on Australia's defence commitments and plans.

18. Equipment.

UNCLAS

- a. AHQ approval is still being awaited for local purchase of the Mamimya C33 120 mm camera which is on loan from the Nanyang Watch Company on a trial basis. The camera has been on loan for the past eight weeks and has been used in Thailand, Borneo, Malaya and Singapore with good effect. It has already shown its capabilities over the two 120 mm cameras on issue to Austarm PR with a series of pictures on 2 SAS medical patrols, which drew high praise from the pictorial editor of the Melbourne Herald which featured two of the pictures on Page One of its April 28 editions.
- b. As indicated by this headquarters in a minute to AHQ on 24 Mar 66, a requirement also exists on this HQ for a tape-recorder. Its prime use would be for PR work, but the machine would also be of value to other branches, particularly Legal.

PART II - AG MATTERS

Return to Australia of Remains of Aust Soldiers

19. The paper on this subject has been delayed pending receipt of reports from all addressees. It will be forwarded May 66.

Enlistment into the ARA

- 20. The decision in the case of Capt BUTLER's son is noted and it appears that Mrs BUTLER will not let the matter rest there as under similar circumstances Maj YOUNG's son had been accepted.
- 21. As there will undoubtedly be further instances of sons and daughters of servicemen overseas wanting to enlist

it is felt that it may be opportune to examine this particular aspect of recruiting and promulgate relevant instructions.

Burials

- 22. The remains of 6363 WO2 HUTCHINSON, 21 Const Sqn were buried with full military honours in Ulu Pandan Military Cemetery SINGAPORE 14 Apr 66. The return of the remains to Australia as initially requested by the next of kin was not practicable. The proceedings of the Board of Inquiry into the death have not yet been received.
- 23. The ashes of 42352 WO2 PHILLIPS AAFV were interred in TERENDAK Military Cemetery 30 Apr 66.

Ceremonial

24. Anzac Day services were conducted in SINGAPORE, TERENDAK and BUTTERWORTH.

Relief of 21 Const Sqn

25. This is progressing satisfactorily from the personnel aspect, primarily due to the early issue of posting orders by CARO, together with prompt decisions on individual applications for transfer and discharge.

Relief of 111 LAA Bty

26. Comments on the relief of 21 Const Sqn also apply to 111 LAA Bty.

Amenities

- 27. AAF FARELF Amenities Fund. Monies have been allocated at regular monthly meetings based on unit bids, priority being given to units in BORNEO and THAILAND. It is estimated that grants received from Australia will be expended by 1 Jul 66. A report covering the year 1965/66 will be submitted to AHQ after this date.
- 28. So as to budget for 1966/67 an estimate of the anticipated grants both from Army and civilian sources are required.
- 29. Concert Party No. 2. The party spent four days resting in Singapore in transit to Australia after their tour. No difficulties were encountered. The tour was greatly appreciated both in Borneo and Thailand.
- Moral Rearmament Concert Party. Preliminary discussions have been held both with FARELF and the organiser, Mr. COULTER. It is anticipated that concerts will be conducted for Commonwealth servicemen during August 66 in BUTTERWORTH and TERENDAK. Certain details, in particular the payment of accommodation and transport costs, will have to be resolved. Full details will be forwarded shortly.

/Education

: 7 :

Education

- There were no Class II or III Courses during the month, the whole month being taken up by a Class I Course for which 44 members (including 4 from Singapore) in FARELF nominated.
- 32. The course covered six subjects, viz, English, Arithmetic, Geography, Australian History, Current Affairs, and Social Studies, and was of 6 weeks duration.

Legal

- 33. A DCM was convened at N Pandewan, SABAH, 19 Apr 66. The accused, Spr EATHER, 21 Const Sqn, pleaded guilty to all five charges and was sentenced to 55 days detention. He is currently serving this sentence in CME SINGAPORE. Proceedings have been confirmed and are being forwarded to AHQ.
- 34. Certain unsatisfactory aspects of Spr EATHER's confinement while in close arrest were disclosed. These are being formally investigated.
- 35. Cfn HURRELL, 111 LAA Bty, has been charged by civil police with smuggling of drugs from Penang. He was released pending court proceedings. The date of the trial is not yet known but he has engaged civil counsel and has sufficient money to pay the expected fine.
- 36. A Summary of charges heard during Apr is attached as Annex 'E'.

Red Cross

- 37. Miss SPENCE returned from Borneo 4 Apr 66 after a valuable liaison visit to Borneo.
- 38. It is understood that the plan for deployment of Red Cross representatives within the theatre has been changed and that Miss ZINNER is to complete 12 months in SVN. It would be appreciated if changes such as these could be formally advised to this HQ so that the rotation of the representatives could be planned in advance.
- 39. Miss SPENCE visited No 4 Hospital BUTTERWORTH 14 18 Apr 66.

- 41. Staff. Advice was received of the posting of Capts IENNON and MITCHELL to VIETNAM and the provision of one officer replacement only, Capt HASLAU. These postings were both unexpected and create difficulties.
- 42. FARELF Med policy is for Australian Medical Officers to perform one year in a location remote from Singapore (e.g. FMC Terendak) and whenever possible one year at BMH Singapore. There is however no formal agreement on this system, and the postings referred to above have negated planning in this regard.

Dental

- As a result of a submission by 32 Dental Unit, HQ FARELF are considering favourably a proposal to rotate Australian Dental personnel with UK Dental staff in Borneo.
- Capt VADIVELOO is to be detached to a dental unit in Borneo for 3 months in May 66 prior to his RTA.

Records

- 45. SSgt R FAULKNER was detached to HQ AAFV with effect from 20 Apr 66, at AHQ direction, for the purpose of assisting with records duties associated with the relief of AAFV.
- 46. The state of AAF FARELF is attached as Annex 'F'.
- 47. AMF personnel in Borneo is shown in Annex 'B' attached.

PART III - QMG MATTERS

Relief of 21 Const Sqn Gp RAE

- 48. This changeover has commenced with the arrival in the theatre on the 29 Apr 66 of the OC 22 Const Sqn. The advance party 22 Const Sqn arrived 3 May 66.
- 49. Planning for the remainder of the changeover is progressing satisfactorily although a detailed movement order covering the move of 22 Const Sqn to SINGAPORE is still awaited.

Relief - 111 LAA Bty RAA

- 50. Steady progress is being made in this matter, including the acquisition of sufficient additional hirings to accommodate all married members of the relieving battery.
- 51. However, before detailed planning can be finalised, confirmation is still required of some subjects raised in our 165-6-1 of 2 Apr 66 (Relief 111 LAA Bty) to AHQ CANBERRA.
- 52. In addition, we have sought clarification of some aspects of the movement plan. Difficulty in meeting the unit's operational commitment is anticipated if the interval between flights is reduced to less than one week.

Movement of 4 RAR to BORNEO

- The two parties of 4 RAR's main body arrived at KUCHING on 26 and 28 Apr 66 on the LSL "Sir Lancelot" and MV "Auby" respectively.
- 54. On the recommendation of West Bde, the issue of the following items, above normal entitlements, has been arranged:
 - a. 70 pairs secateurs.
 - b. 11440 feet nylon rope.
 - c. 500 escape compasses.
- Maj D.A. MILLER, DAQMG HQ AAF, was attached to HQ. West Bde for the period 15 Apr 66 to 2 May 66 to assist during the units settling in period.

Tractors - 21 Const Sqn Gp RAE

Further to our Liaison Letter 3/66, Caterpillar D8 Reg No 97143 was delivered to the unit on the 18 Apr 66. The anticipated delivery date of the International TD 25 is Jun 66.

Boots

: 10 :

Boots - General Purpose

- 57. The 200 pairs of boots GP forwarded to this theatre to enable trials to be conducted under conditions existing in BORNEO have been allocated to 4 RAR which received them on 16 Apr 66.
- 58. 4 RAR have been instructed to report on the boots at the end of their tour in BORNEO.

Local Purchase

1 0

- 59. Escape Compasses. Due to a delay of approximately two to three months before FARELF acquire escape compasses for issue to troops in BORNEO, a total of 588 have been locally purchased at a cost of \$1.40 each. 500 of them have been issued to 4 RAR and 88 to 2 SAS.
- 60. HITACHI Transceivers CH950R. Approval was obtained from AHQ vide SD 9505 of 1 Apr 66 to purchase 50 transceivers CH941 at a cost of \$67 per set. This set has since gone out of production and has been superseded by the CH 950R at a cost of \$77 per set. An order of fifty has been placed.

RSL Gift Parcels Scheme

- 61. As mentioned in previous liaison letters this is a school under which NAAFI packs and despatches parcels to soldiers as requested by ASCO, on behalf of the RSL. This HQ has been asked by AHQ to assist in the movement of parcels.
- 62. Some problems are now foreseen because:
 - a. this HQ is not aware of the number of orders placed;
 - b. movement to VIETNAM is by air on Army Hercules courier;
 - is up to 150 per month, but 4700 parcels are to be distributed in July to celebrate the RSL's 50th Anniversary.
- 63. A submission has been prepared and will be forwarded in the near future.

PART IV - SECRETARY MATTERS

- 65. Draft Estimates of expenditure forecast for 1966/67 in MALAYSIA have been prepared and submitted to AHQ for inclusion in Departmental Estimates, Division 704, Forces Overseas.
- 66. For the past ten months expenditure has been coded by examiners of accounts and recorded under primary and secondary codes.
- 67. For various reasons it has not been possible to reconcile totals of code cards with total expenditure recorded on field returns. Furthermore it is not known if codings determined by claims examined in FARELF are charged against identical codes by the Accountant AHQ. Generally, recorded expenditure corresponds fairly accurately with expenditure recorded in the Cash Book.
- 68. It is pointed out that certain items of expenditure shown under individual codes such as ammunition, civilian labour, electricity, fuel and water, and freight can be charged under the applicable coding as expenditure incurred in 3 orneo and also be included under the item Capitation and Standing Charges.
 - 69. Capitation etc charges cover only expenditure costshared by units of 28 Commonwealth Brigade, HQ Aust Army Force and integrated officers on HQ FARELF and other formations.

SUMMARY OF OPERATIONS DURING PERIOD UNDER REVIEW

SINGAPORE - WEST MALAYSIA

- 1. On 17 Apr two naval vessels came under enemy fire from RHIO's forward bases. No casualties reported.
- 2. On 22 Apr 3 Indonesian infiltrators landed on TANAH MERAH Beach, MALACCA. All three were captured.

EAST MALAYSIA

3. WEST Brigade.

a. LUNDU District.

- (1) On 2 Apr at Kg BEKAT GR 880083, two locals arrested a Chinese who was armed with a sten gun and grenades. He claims to have deserted from an incursion party of twenty four, of whom nineteen were TNI and the remainder ex-SARAWAK Chinese. The party is stated to have come from BATU HITAM GR 855086 and to have crossed the border near BIAWAK on 27 Mar. The role of the TNI contingent was to bombard BIAWAK, using light mortars.
- (2) On 4 Apr, twenty light mortar bombs fell in the BIAWAK area. The nearest landed three hundred yards from the 42 Commando Royal Marines camp. Fragments indicate two inch mortars were used and the baseplate positions were inside SARAWAK, one to the SOUTH and the other NORTH WEST of BIAWAK.
- (3) On 8 Apr near the 7½ milestone on the LUNDU/ SERAYAN road a party of eight men, armed and carrying packs were seen, two Chinese members of the party were recognised. A follow up was initiated without result.
- b. BAU District. The BAU area has been very quiet during the period under review with no contacts, enemy mortar or artillery fire reported. The only incident occurred when on 18 Apr a Chinese, known to be a resident of SIDING GR 900035 was arrested at GUMBANG.

c. SERIAN District.

- (1) On 4 Apr a plastic anti-personnel mine, believed to be of YUGOSLAV origin, was found on a helipad at GR 953997.
- (2) On 6 Apr a security force patrol had a long range contact with an enemy patrol of six men in the area GR 960995. In the follow up, tracks were found leading across the border.

4. MIDWEST Brigade.

- a. Enemy mortar fire occurred near border on 1 Apr, 5 Apr, 6 Apr, 8/10 Apr; no security force patrols were in the vicinity of the impact areas.
- b. Tracks for ten men heading NORTH to GR 026016 were found by security force patrol on 23 Apr. No further report as a result of a follow up has been received.

5. CENTRAL Brigade.

- a. There was a brief contact on the border of 4th Division on 10 Apr with a lone enemy. Due to thick vegetation he escaped. There were no security force casualties.
- b. On 17 Apr some forty rounds were fired into the area GR 524338 about two thousand yards SOUTH EAST of BAKELALAN.
- c. On 3 May an estimated twenty to twenty five enemy attacked border OP at GR 522324 in WAILAYA area. Security forces had just left OP when attack occurred.
- d. On 4 May Platoon from 1/6 GR moving to ambush position at GR 523327 came under heavy small arms fire. A fire fight developed which ended when enemy withdrew. Enemy used small arms fire and 60 mm mortar. Security forces replied with small arms fire 105 howitzer and claymores. One of security force personnel was wounded in the hand, enemy casualties not known but blood stained tracks were observed.

6. EAST Brigade.

On 7, 8 and 9 Apr enemy fire was opened from area of NUNUKAN in the direction of a Boat OP. Machine gun, LAA and mortar fire was identified. All rounds fell two hundred to four hundred yards short. However, on 8 Apr air bursts were fired over our side of the border. Fire was returned by naval guns and ground artillery in to the water and over and to the right of NUNUKAN town. Enemy fire then ceased. There were no security force casualties.
