INSTRUCTIONS

AIM

- 1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organization and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

GENERAL

- 2. Entries are to be made daily on AF C 2118 (Adapted) each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.
- 3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties (Australia)", Chapter 2, Section 12.

RESPONSIBILITY

During Non-operational Periods

- 4. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled by commanders of all formations.

During Operational Periods (1)

- 5. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled in duplicate by:
 - a. Commanders of all formations.
 - b. Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a brigadier or above.
 - c. Heads of services not below the rank of lieutenant colonel.
 - d. Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
 - e. Unit commanders.
 - f. Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

COMPILATION

- 6. Both original and duplicate copies are to consist of:
 - a. Cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted).
 - b. Index as printed on cover.
 - c. Narrative (AF C 2118) (Adapted).
 - d. Annexes as shown in the Index.
- 7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes are to be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer is to be included.
- 8. The annexes are to be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an annex NIL will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters, starting at B.

COMMA **DISPOSAL** DIARIES

13. **Original Commander's Diary.** This is to be forwarded monthly, unless otherwise ordered, by the seventh day of the succeeding month direct to AHQ.

15. When overseas, both copies of diaries are to be sent through the Army Records organization in the overseas theatre but at different times.

b. Supplementary diaries must be forwarded under the normal rules for TOP SECRET correspondence, to AHQ. The inner envelope must be plainly marked:







ROAD SAFETY

Introduction

1. The National Safety First Council of Singapore under Singapore Government sponsorship, is conducting a road courtesy campaign from now until 12 May. As a major operator of motor vehicles, ANZUK Force has been requested to assist this campaign by ensuring that ANZUK drivers are educated in and observe road safety and courtesy rules.

Aim

2. The purpose of this brief is to make 6 RAR Officers and Senior NCOs conversant with driver responsibilities and their part in supervising driving safety

Supervision

3. Officers and Senior NCOs are to conduct spot checks on 6 RAR drivers whenever they are travelling as a passenger or have control of a vehicle. Some points to assist are shown.

a. Before a Journey

(1) The following points should be checked before any vehicle is moved.

(a) The driver must be in possession of a current AAF G11 (Certificate of Competence only), and is conversant with local road laws.

(b) The driver must be in possession of an authorised G2 (Authority to move a vehicle), and any other relevant documents required for the journey.

(c) Check obvious points of safety, such as, tyres, clean windscreens and loads secured so that they will not shift whilst the vehicle is in motion.

(d) If a trailer is being towed check that the canopy is firmly tied down, and the light cable of the trailer is connected to the towing vehicle.

(2) Action should be taken immediately over-loading is detected, and the vehicle should not move until it is correctly loaded.


b. During the Journey

- (1) The points that should be checked whilst moving are.
 - (a) That current traffic laws and rules of the road are not broken, particularly in relation to speeding, taking unnecessary risks, and traffic obstruction.
 - (b) Passengers remain seated and do not distract the driver.
 - (c) Driver or passengers have no part of their body protruding outside the vehicle.
 - (d) A constant watch is kept for driving fatigue.

c. At completion of the journey

- (1) When a task has been completed a driver will normally report back to the Transport Compound for re-assignment. However, if a long or strenuous journey has just been completed the driver should be allowed to rest and have time to carry out the necessary servicing of his vehicle. Officers and Senior NCOs should ensure that this is strictly enforced.

4. Conclusion 6 RAR drivers have a good reputation within the ANZUK Force to date. This supervisory period by Officers and Senior NCOs is important so that our high standard can be maintained.



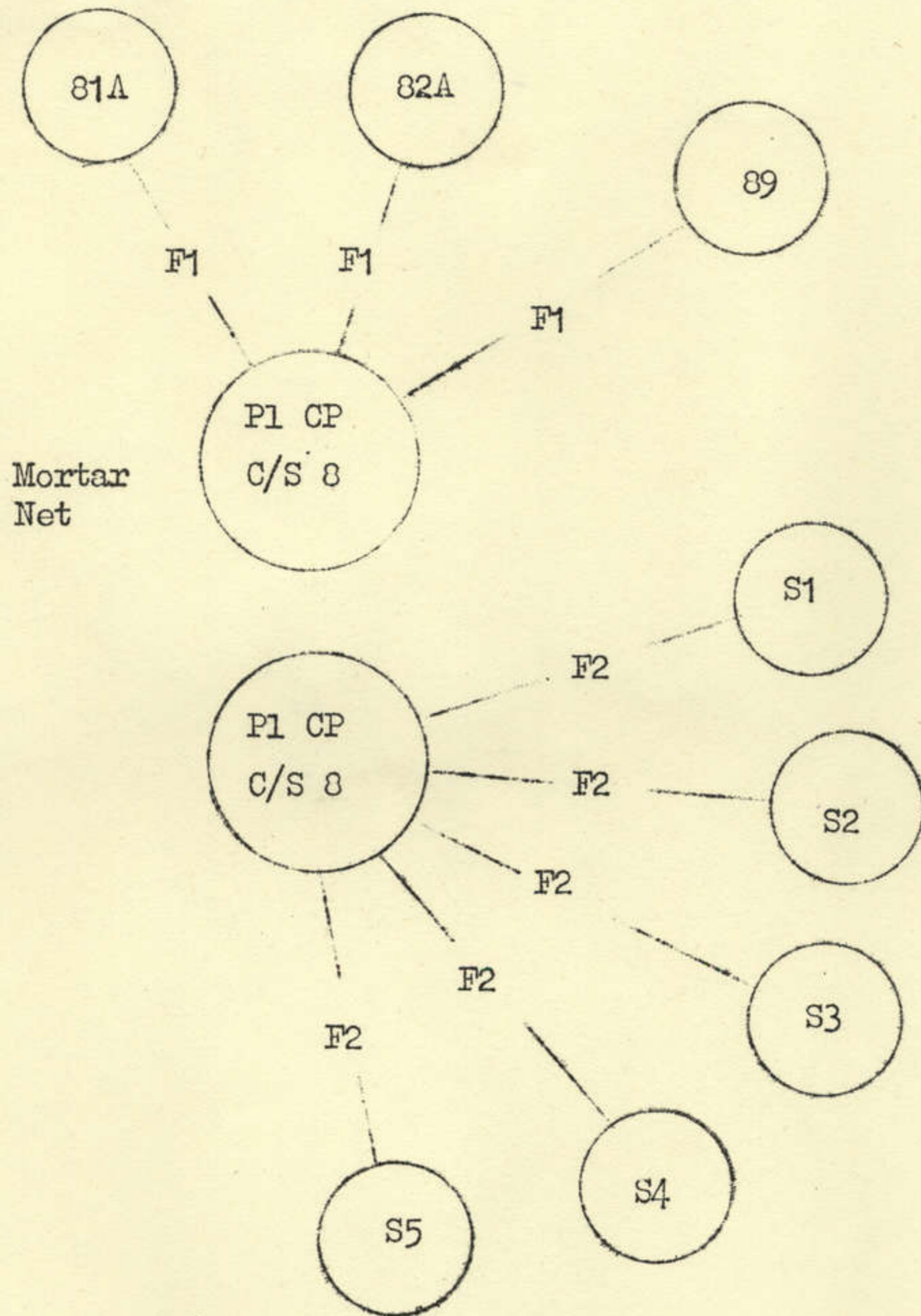

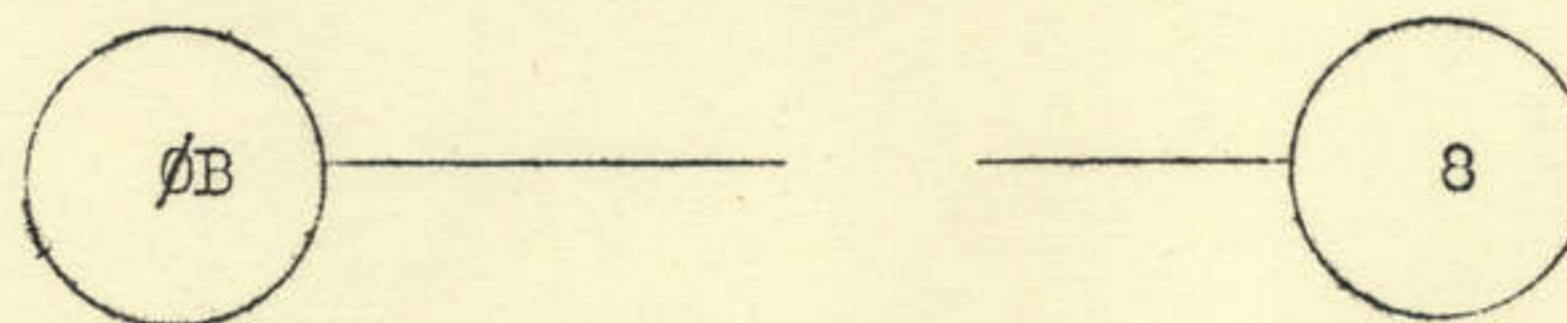
RADIO DIAGRAM

Points

3. A side will be allotted 10 points for a win in any sport.

4. Tie. In the event of any match being tied, teams will change ends and play 5 minutes extra time. A further 5 minutes extra time will be allowed, teams again changing ends, if no result has been reached after the first extension. If still no result after the second extension, points will be halved.

Rules

5. General. Rules will be as per Games and Sports in the Army and Potted Sports unless otherwise indicated in this instruction.
6. Substitutes. Up to but not more than two substitutes will be allowed in any sport at any time during a match.

166. MOSQUITO LARVAE SURVEYS -- MAY 1972

1. ANZUK HMCS is to carry out routine surveys during May 72, in accordance with the programme shown below:

2. Surveys are made to detect mosquito breeding and/or potential mosquito breeding sites in unit/MQ areas. The attention of units/occupants of MQs will be drawn to such locations in order that action can be taken to eliminate the sites.

3. "Domestic" mosquitoes breed profusely in even the smallest collection of stagnant water. Old tins, empty bottles, saucers under flower pots, coconut husks; blocked gutters/drains and old tyres are amongst the more common sources of trouble. Fire buckets should be emptied at least once weekly. Before refilling they should be thoroughly scrubbed internally and sun-dried. A very sound maxim is "NO STAGNANT WATER - NO MOSQUITOES".

167. ANTI MALARIA CONTROL

1. Frequent reports are received from Health Inspectors concerning the failure of units and individuals to take normal precautions to prevent the spread of mosquitoes in unit lines and housing estates.

2. Units and householders are to ensure that:

- a. Receptacles such as tins, jars and flower pots in which water might accumulate are removed.
- b. Blocked drains are reported to HQ Sembawang ANZUK Base or HQ Nee Soon Wing as appropriate and that where possible remedial action is taken from unit resources.

168. POLICY - CARPORTS/GARAGES AND FENCES - ANZUK MARRIED QUARTERS

1. General

As a general statement no Carports/Garages or Fences will be erected (On/At/Adjacent to) ANZUK Married Quarters at Public Expense. The exception is the erection of Fences to a maximum length of 200 ft to protect life and limb of Pre-School Children where an actual hazard exists immediately adjacent to the MQ. These will be exceptional cases based on the recommendation of the appropriate Base Commander.

2. Members may, at their own expense, erect Garages/Carports and Fences providing the following guide lines are adhered to:

a. Garages/Carports

- (1) Permission to erect a structure must be granted by the appropriate Base Commander.
- (2) Design of the proposed structure and its place of erection must be agreed to by the CE's Branch HQ ANZUK Spt Gp. This Branch holds a plan of an approved Carport which would currently cost \$S750. Drawings are available on request.
- (3) Whilst the design does not have to conform specifically with that held by this Branch it generally must be of an acceptably high standard and its erection must be effected to a reasonable standard of workmanship. In addition it must blend with the environment etc of the surrounding assets.
- (4) In selection of the proposed erection point due consideration must be given to the grounds, the drive way, gutters and drains, the length of the driveway (is it SAF or ANZUK property) and its position in relation to neighbouring quarters.

b. Fences

- (1) Permission to erect a Fence at the members expense must be granted by the appropriate Base Commander.
- (2) The design of the Fence will only be that design currently held by this Branch. Details are available on demand.
- (3) The selection of the proposed fence line must be agreed to by the CE's Branch HQ ANZUK Spt Gp.

3. Carports/Garages which have been erected or "inherited" by members will be, in due course, inspected by a representative of this Branch and the member and the respective Base HQ advised on our recommendations as regards suitability etc.

172. WHOLE BLOOD SUPPLIES FOR THE ANZUK FORCE

1. Because of the size and establishment of the Pathology Department, ANZUK Military Hospital, it is not possible to operate a Blood Bank there. The function of collection, typing, testing and storage of large quantities of donor blood is done by the Singapore Blood Transfusion Service (SBTS).
2. SBTS will supply blood free of charge to the Force, on the understanding that they are assured of regular donations from Service sources. 6 RAR may anticipate a visit about once every three months.
3. However, because of racial differences in the incidence of certain blood groups, SBTS will be unable to supply the Force with large quantities of blood of these types. It will therefore be necessary for the Force to maintain an emergency Blood Donor Panel, so that life saving Blood Transfusion will be available for all servicemen and their families at all times.
4. Coys are to:
 - a. Give maximum publicity and encouragement to members when SBTS visit their area.
 - b. As at 1 Jun and 1 Dec each year, forward to 6 RAR RAP a list of volunteers for the Emergency Blood Donor Panel, setting out:

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- (1) Number, rank, name of Donor (relationship to serviceman if a dependant).
- (2) Blood Group of Donor.
- (3) Home address and telephone number of Donor.
- (4) A firm proposal for the method of contacting Donors in out-of-duty hours.
- (5) Date of RTA of Donor.

5. The RAP is to forward a consolidated list to HQ Sembawang ANZUK Base by 14 Jun and 14 Dec each year.

173. OFFICER CADET SCHOOL - EDUCATIONAL REQUIREMENT

Reference: A. MBI 166-2

1. The educational requirement for entry to the Officer Cadet School, Portsea has recently been raised and is to have effect from July 1972 entry:

"Normal Entry - Members of the Permanent Forces

The standard is SGCE or equivalent. The Selection Board may, however, accept applications from members who hold the AACE I certificate or equivalent qualifications with passes in English and four other subjects (excluding craft subjects) provided they possess some exceptional compensating qualifications or experience."

2. The entry standard requires passes in English and three other subjects at SGCE level or their civilian equivalents.

3. MBI 75-1 gives details of the SGCE and lists at Annex A the acceptable civilian equivalents.

174. EDUCATIONAL REQUIREMENTS FOR AACE I

The following conditions are to apply with effect from 1 Feb 72 when granting complete exemption from AACE I.

- a. Civilian Qualifications Gained before 1 Feb 65.
A member who enlisted before 1 Feb 72, and who can produce documentary evidence to show that he had passed State Intermediate or Junior or equivalent or higher examinations, in four subjects including English and a mathematics subject before 1 Feb 65 may apply to the Command Education Officer to be granted AACE I.
- b. Civilian Qualifications Gained between 1 Feb 65 and 31 Jan 72. A member who enlisted before 1 Feb 72 and who can produce documentary evidence to show that he had passed State Intermediate or Junior or equivalent, or higher examinations, including English and a mathematical subject and between 1 Feb 65 and 31 Jan 72 may apply to the Command Education Officer to be granted AACE I.

2. In this order civilian includes dependants of service personnel, members of the ANZUK civilian component and their dependants, and servicemen from countries other than Australia, New Zealand and United Kingdom.

ARMY HEALTH BENEFITS SOCIETY (AHBS) - COMMAND LIAISON OFFICERS

Reference: A. MBI 27-1

1. Reference A provides for the Committee of Management of AHBS to be assisted in its administration of the Society by the Secretary and his staff and also:

- a. Command AHBS Liaison Officers appointed by GOCs/Comds; and
- b. Unit representatives appointed by Commanding Officers.

2. In conjunction with the membership campaign now being conducted, the Committee of Management desires that liaison officers and unit representatives should provide all practicable assistance in publicising the Society, in advising potential members of its advantages and in linking the Society management with its 19,000 members.

3. To achieve its aim, the Committee of Management requests that Comds, Army Component, PNG, ANZUK Spt Gp, and local administration elements of AHQ Canberra and AHQ Melbourne examine the current appointments of Command AHBS Liaison Officers and confirm or amend them. The following information is offered as a guide:

- a. The AHBS Liaison Officer (AHBSLO) should be a member of the Society.
- b. The AHBSLO may be either military or civilian. Rank/status of the appointee is at the discretion of the GOC/Comd. Appointees will receive annually an amount allotted from AHBS funds to cover any out-of-pocket.
- c. It is suggested that the AHBSLO should be a staff member performing family liaison, welfare, personnel or similar functions on the Command Headquarters. In particular, AHBSLOs should be:
 - (1) Readily available to members or prospective members by telephone or visit.
 - (2) In a position to arrange dissemination of knowledge of the Society among Army and civilian members, prospective members and dependants; and
 - (3) In a position to arrange for new civilian entrants to the Department to be informed about the Society by personal approach and through civilian training courses.

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- d. Only one AHBSLO is to be appointed for each Command or equivalent. An assistant LO may be provided under Command arrangements if desired. Where the AHBSLO is military, it is suggested that the assistant be a civilian staff member and vice versa.
 - e. The particulars, location and telephone number of the AHBSLO should be promulgated in Command Routine Orders at least annually.
 - f. The duties which the Committee of Management desires AHBSLOs to undertake are set out in Annex A.
 - g. Local Administration elements of AHQ Canberra and AHQ Melbourne should appoint AHBSLOs in accordance with the foregoing guidelines. All other units and establishments should be served by unit AHBS representatives.
4. Channels of communication of AHBS matters are to be as follows:
- a. Appointment and Changes of AHBSLOs. Comd etc, to AHQ. PS (B) is the responsible Directorate within Pers Branch.
 - b. General AHBS Policy. Comd etc, to AHBS Committee of Management through Secretary AHBS. Correspondence should be addressed to:

 - c. Detailed Administration of AHBS (including all matters affecting individuals). AHBSLO direct to Secretary AHBS. Secretary AHBS is authorized to communicate direct with AHBSLOs on matters connected with the duties listed in Annex A. Signal communications for Secretary AHBS should be addressed to ARMY MELBOURNE and the text prefixed by the words "For Secretary AHBS".
5. Commands are requested to stress to units the need to appoint unit AHBS representatives in accordance with Reference A, to ensure that their AHBSLO has a current list of unit representatives and that these representatives are encouraged to communicate with him on AHBS matters.
6. Attention is invited to the AHBS publicity poster, which advises members to obtain details of AHBS from:
- a. Unit orderly rooms - Military members.
 - b. Personnel Officers - civilian members.

Commands should ensure that unit orderly rooms and civil personnel offices hold up-to-date details of unit AHBS representatives.

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MOVEMENT OF UNACCOMPANIED PERSONAL EFFECTS BY SEA ON RTA

1. A mistaken impression exists concerning the delivery time of unaccompanied effects moved by sea from Singapore to Australia. Many personnel wrongly assume that it is approximately six weeks.
2. A recent investigation has revealed that a more realistic time is 8-10 weeks, depending on Port of discharge. Listed below is the average timing for a consignment of personal effects.

- a. Uplift by Packers and delivery to ATMA Godown. - 3 days
- b. Receipt, request for shipping space, documentation and delivery to PSA Godown by ATMA, for loading to vessel. - 15 days
- c. Loading and sailing of vessel. - 1 day
- d. Sailing time Singapore to Sydney (for Brisbane deduct 8 days, Adelaide deduct 1 day, Fremantle deduct 12 days and Melbourne add 4 days). - 18 days
- e. Clearance from wharf and delivery to Department of Supply Bond Store. - 3 days
- f. Clearance by customs and quarantine. - 21 days
- g. Delivery by Department of Supply to residence - 7 days

Total : 68 days

3. It is accepted that some of the above timings appear to be unduly long, particularly in paragraph 2.f. and 2.g., however every effort is being made by all concerned to reduce these timings.

4. To facilitate the clearance of effects through Australian customs and quarantine by Detachment 10 MC Gp the member should:

- a. Ensure that Australian Customs Form G93 is correctly compiled and handed to the packing contractor in Singapore when effects are packed.
- b. Contact the appropriate Movement Control Detachment immediately on arrival in Australia.
