

## COMMANDERS DIARIES INSTRUCTIONS

#### AIM

1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organization and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

#### GENERAL

- 2. Entries are to be made daily on AF C 2118 (Adapted) each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.
- 3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties (Australia)" Chapter 2, Section 12.

#### RESPONSIBILITY

#### **During Non-operational Periods**

4. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled by commanders of all formations.

#### During Operational Periods (1)

- 5. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled in duplicate by:
  - a. Commanders of all formations.
  - b. Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a brigadier or above.
  - c. Heads of services not below the rank of lieutenant colonel.
  - d. Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
  - e. Unit commanders.
  - f. Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

#### COMPILATION

- 6. Both original and duplicate copies are to consist of:
  - a. Cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted).
  - b. Index as printed on cover.
  - c. Narrative (AF C 2118) (Adapted).
  - d. Annexes as shown in the Index.
- 7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes are to be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer is to be included.
- 8. The annexes are to be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an annex NII, will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters, starting at B.

#### DISPOSAL

- 13. Original Commander's Diary. This is to be forwarded monthly, unless otherwise ordered, by the seventh day of the succeeding month direct to AHQ.
- 14. Duplicate Commander's Diary. This must be clearly marked as a duplicate. It is to be sent separately from the original to AHQ one month after the original has been despatched but not before the former has been acknowledged.
- 15. When overseas, both copies of diaries are to be sent through the Army Records organization in the overseas theatre but at different times.
- 16. TOP SECRET Supplementary Diaries.
  - a. The documents referred to in Paragraph 9 together with a list of them made out on AF C 2118 (Adapted) must be placed in separate cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted). All details must be filled in and the cover clearly marked in red: "ANNEX Z OFFICER ONLY". It may be convenient to group the papers by appendices.
  - b. Supplementary diaries must be forwarded under the normal rules for TOP SECRET correspondence, to AHQ. The inner envelope must be plainly marked:

## LONG TAN DAY PARADE AND MEMORIAL CHURCH SERVICE 18 AUG 72

#### General

- 1. 6 RAR will commemorate Long Tan Day with a parade and church service on 18 Aug 72. After the church service long service awards will be presented to the following:
  - a. RSM MSM;
  - b. WO2 Godfrey MSM;
  - c. WO2 Creagh LS&GCM; and
  - d. WO2 Sheppard LS&GCM.
- 2. The Reviewing Officer is to be Rear Admiral DC Wells CBE, Commander ANZUK Force. He will be accompanied by Mrs Wells and his ADC. Maj M.J. Harris is appointed Escort Officer.
- 3. This instruction covers the detail required for the preparation for, and conduct of, the parade. The form of the parade and sequence of orders is at Annex A. Annex B gives details of the church service. Annex C shows seating and car parking arrangements.
- 4. The location is to be Kangaw Rugby Field No 1.

#### Composition

- 5. All companies, the Pipes and Drums and Regimental Colour, will be on parade. Rifle Companies will consist of OC, 2IC, three pl comds, CSM, CQMS, three pl sgts and 81 rank and file.
- 6. Support Company and Bn HQ Pl to consist of OC, 2IC, four pl comds, CSM, CQMS, four pl sgts and 99 rank and file.
- 7. Admin Company to consist of OC, QM, Tpt Offr, CSM, CQMS and 60 rank and file.
- 8. The Colour Party will consist of the following:
  - a. Ensign for Regimental Colour Lt A.R. Kimpton; and
  - b. Escorts Ssgt Evans, Sgt J.F. Young.
- 9. Additional duties will be provided as follows:
  - a. Colour Orderly (1) Admin Coy;
  - b. Streamer Orderly (1) D Coy;
  - c. Door openers (2) A Coy;
  - d. Ushers (2) B Coy; and
  - e. Spare (1) Spt Coy.

.../10. Those

10. Those not on parade are to attend as spectators.

#### Dress

- 11. No 1 Tropical Dress Ceremonial for all ranks (no Sam Brownes for officers).
- 12. Weapons and side arms to be carried only by the Colour Party.
- 13. The following will wear Sam Brownes:
  - a. CO;
  - b. 2IC;
  - c. IO; and
  - d. RSM.
- 14. The Escort Officer will wear Dacron Safaris, Sam Browne and medals.

#### Guests

15. There are no other official guests. Families and friends of members of the battalion are invited to attend.

#### Timings

- 16. The battalion will march on at approximately 0820 hrs (to be confirmed after rehearsals). Spectators should be seated by this time.
- 17. R Adm Wells will be received on parade at 0830 hrs.
- 18. The parade should be completed by 0930 hrs.

#### Rehearsals

- 19. Rehearsals will be conducted as follows:
  - a. 11 Aug 0900-1130 hrs (RSM and CSMs to conduct); and
  - b. 16 and 17 Aug 0830-1145 hrs (all).

#### Seating

20. As shown at Annex C. Seats for the official party on the dais are to suitably marked by the I Sect who will obtain the seating plan from the Adjt.

#### Stores

- 21. Chairs. To be set out in accordance with Annex C:
  - a. VIP type for dais 5; and
  - b. Ordinary type for spectators 200.
- 22. TA System. Sgt Wilczek is to instal the TA system as discussed with the Adjt and RSM. A second microphone will be required for the dais.
- 23. Dais. To be obtained from Sembawang ANZUK Base. RSM to arrange.

.../24. Work Parties

#### Work Parties

24. Bids to be coordinated by the RSM. The DTRI Sgt is to ensure that the seating detailed in para 21 is set out and returned to the lines after the parade. He is to liaise with coys for work parties and bid for the transport required.

#### Medical

25. Two med assts are to be present at all rehearsals and the parade. They are to position themselves to the rear of the parade on the edge of the field.

#### Transport

- 26. Early domiciliary transport will be required on 18 Aug. Members will have to arrive in camp no later than 0730 hrs. The Tpt Offr is to advise details of timings to coys.
- 27. If sufficient numbers of families wish to attend the parade transport will be provided. Coys have been asked to inform the Adjt of numbers by 10 Aug.

#### Traffic Control

28. The RT Sect is responsible for traffic control and car parking areas. Details of car parking areas are included in Annex C. No vehicles except the Reviewing Officer's and CO's staff cars and an ambulance vehicle will be allowed into the parade area from 0800 hrs until completion of the parade. Sembawang ANZUK Base have been asked to notify units of this. The RSM will advise the RT Sgt of traffic control requirements for the move of troops to and from the parade.

#### Wet Weather Programme

29. A decision will be made by 0800 hrs on 18 Aug.

#### Morning Tea

- 30. On the completion of the parade morning tea will be served in the respective messes commencing 0945 hrs for all ranks, their families and guests.
- 31. Admin Coy is to arrange the morning tea in the OR's Mess.





Reference: A. ARO 43/72 dated 30 Jan 72.

- 1. Enclosed is an amendment to the safety distances for Battle Noise Simulators.
- 2. Coy Comds are to ensure that all personnel are aware of the new distances.
- 3. Simulators issued to coys for the Bde ex in Nov are to be amended by coys in accordance with para 2 of the above reference.

#### SAFETY IN THE USE OF BATTLE NOISE SIMULATORS

- 1. In order to reduce the chance of damage to hearing being caused by the detonation of Simulator Grenade M116A2 and Simulator Projectile Ground Burst M115A2, the following safety rules will apply, with immediate effect:
  - a. Personnel throwing Simulators M115 and M116 are to wear/use Ear Protectors. Forms of ear protection to be used are listed in the Manual of Army Safety (1970) Chapter 14 paragraph 407.
  - b. No Simulators M115 or M116 are to be thrown within 30 metres of any person who is not wearing ear protection.
  - c. Safety distances for personnel who are wearing ear protection are as follows:
    - (1) Simulator Grenade M116 8 metres;
    - (2) Simulator Projectile Ground Burst M115 16 metres.
- 2. The labels giving the firing instructions which are at present affixed to each simulator are now out of date. Until new labels are issued, it will be necessary for users to be made aware of the following revised wording which is to appear on them:

"HEARING: hearing damage can occur if exploded at less than 30 metres from any person. Throwers are to wear ear protection.

UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES should this device be exploded within 30 metres of any person not wearing ear protection or in confined spaces."

3. The film "Safety in Battle Training" also mentions that the impact area for these battle noise simulators must be at least 25 metres away from troops. When showing this film, attention should be drawn to the fact that the safety distance has been amended to 30 metres.

#### LIVE FIRING - PULADA RANGE 28-29 AUG 72

GENERAL

A Coy is to carry out live firing practices on the Pulada ETR on 28-29 Aug 72. TsOEI's for all personal weapons will also be tested.

b. To assess the standard of weapon handling within the Company.

#### SAFETY

6. 57074 Capt P.J. Langford is appointed Range Safety Officer.
All Officers and NCO's concerned with the conduct of the Cart of the practice are to be conversant with the appropriate Range Safety Orders for the ETR before comencing the practice.

#### DRESS AND EQUIPMENT.

7. Basic order and personal weapons

#### STORES

8. See Annex A

#### AMMUNITION.

9. The acting CSM is to collect the ammunition in the Advance Party vehicle by 0745 hrs each day.

..... Transport

TRANSPORT

10. See Annex B. Coy 2IC to arrange. The only vehicle allowed at the Firing Point will be the safety vehicle.

MEDICAL

11. The Medical Assistant is to move with the Main Body.

MEALS.

The CQMS is to arrange for cut lunches and brews for approximately 90 members. (to include morning tea)

RUBBISH

3. Sufficient sand bags are to be taken for the removal of rubbish.
No rubbish is to be left on the range.

RADIO

A rear link will be established from Pulada to Kangaw. The RSO is requested to provide operator and set to move with the main body on both days.

POST FIRING ADMINISTRATION

The acting CSM is to supervise the inspection and cleaning of weapons and return of weapons, ammunition and produce on completion of each days practice.

## 249. REGISTRATION OF ANIMALS

Reference: A. Dog (Licensing & Control) Rules 1966.

B. The Monkey (Licensing) Order 1971.

1. Singapore legislation makes provision for the licensing and control of dogs and monkeys, and the statutory controls under the legislation are set out in References A and B. This legislation applies to all ANZUK personnel. The purpose of this order is to draw the attention of servicemen to certain parts of the legislation which are of particular importance.

## Registration of Dogs

- 2. Reference A contains the following provisions relevant to dogs in Singapore:
  - a. No person is permitted to keep a dog over three months of age unless the dog is registered, and unless a licence has been issued in respect of the dog. Such licences expire on the 31st December of each year. Failure to register amounts to an offence.
  - b. The licence fee is \$5.00, but where the dog is a bitch and has not been sterilised the licence fee is \$15.00.
  - c. Upon the issue of a licence a metal badge is issued which is to be attached to the dog's collar.
  - d. Any dog found not wearing such metal badges may be seized and destroyed.
  - e. Any person who permits a dog to be at large in a public place without having the metal badge secured to the dog's collar, is guilty of an offence, and is liable to a fine of up to \$100.00.
  - f. Any dog suspected of suffering from a disease may be impounded, treated for the disease and if necessary, destroyed.
  - g. The owner of any dog suffering from an obvious skin disease or distemper is required to keep the dog confined to his premises. Failure to do so confine such an animal amounts to an offence.
  - h. When a dog is sold or where its ownership changes, the licence must be produced at the place where it was issued to be endorsed with details of the transfer.
  - i. Any person who contravens the requirements set out in sub-paragraphs a. and g. above, commits an offence under civil law punishable with a fine not exceeding \$500.

## Registration of Monkeys

- Reference B contains the following provisions applicable to monkeys:
  - a. No person shall keep a monkey unless a licence has been issued in respect of it.
  - b. Any person contravening the above provision commits an offence punishable by a fine not exceeding \$1,000.
  - c. The licence fee is \$5.00 and expires on the 31st of December each year.
  - d. No person is allowed to permit a monkey to be let loose in a public place.
  - e. No person is allowed to permit his monkey to create a nuisance to neighbours or the public.
  - f. Upon sale or transfer of the monkey to another person, the licence must be produced within seven days to the place where it was issued for endorsement of the sale or transfer.
  - g. The Government authorities may seize any monkey found in a public place not under the control of its owner or keeper.
  - h. Any person who contravenes the provisions set out in sub paragraphs d. e. and f. above, commits an offence under civil law and is liable to a fine not exceeding \$500.

### 250. EMERGENCY LEAVE

Reference: A. MBI 128-1 Amdt No 7 dated 30 Jun 72 (complete revise)

#### General

- 1. The approving authority for the granting of Emergency Leave to Australia for members serving in Singapore/Malaysia is now the Senior Officer Australian Army, ANZUK Support Group, with the concurrence of DAS.
- 2. When Emergency Leave is requested by a member, or relatives of a member, who is serving in Singapore/Malaysia, investigation is carried out by the relevant Command in Australia and a report with recommendation forward to HQ ANZUK Spt Gp in accordance with Appendix 1 to Annex D to MBI 128-1.
- 3. Annex D to MBI 128-1 is a guide to conditions under which Emergency Leave may be granted. However, it is only a guide and each case will be considered on its merits by the approving authority. Therefore it is of paramount importance that all relevant details are despatched to the approving authorities.

4. To achieve prompt action it is imperative that the Command undertaking the investigation is provided with early and accurate information to assist the investigation. This is particularly essential for cases of emergency circumstances notified to an Australian Headquarters Overseas. A request to Australia for investigation must contain all relevant information.

## Procedure for Out of Normal Working Hours

- 5. Units are to ensure that Duty Officers are conversant with current instructions.
- 6. All requests for Emergency Leave are to be directed by the Unit Duty Officer to the Duty Officer, HQ ANZUK Support Group.
- 7. Under no circumstances are members to be despatched on Emergency Leave without first obtaining the authority of, at least, the DAAG (AS) or SC 'A' (AS), via the Duty Officer, HQ ANZUK Support Group.

## 253. CHOLERA PRECAUTIONS

- 1. Singapore is not yet free of Cholera, and the precautions outlined in Situation Report No 2 are to be continued. In view of the increased chlorination of the water supply by the PUB, there is no longer any requirement to treat or boil drinking water.
- 2. The precautions to be contined are:
  - a. All vegetables and fruit are to be immersed for 30 minutes in a strong solution of 5 teaspoons of Milton per gallon of water or one teaspoon of WSP per two gallons of water. Rinse well in clean water after immersion.
  - b. Do not buy food or drink from street hawkers.
  - c, Do not eat local fruit such as paw paw, water melons and mangoes.
  - d. Wash your hands before handling food, before eating and after using the toilet.
