2. Entries are to be made daily on AF C 2118 (Adapted) each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.

3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties (Australia)", Chapter 2, Section 12.

RESPONSIBILITY

During Non-operational Periods

4. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled by commanders of all formations.

During Operational Periods (1)

5. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled in duplicate by:

- a. Commanders of all formations.
- b. Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a brigadier or above.
- c. Heads of services not below the rank of lieutenant colonel.
- d. Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
- e. Unit commanders.
- f. Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

COMPILATION

6. Both original and duplicate copies are to consist of:

- a. Cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted).
- b. Index as printed on cover.
- c. Narrative (AF C 2118) (Adapted).
- d. Annexes as shown in the Index.

7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes are to be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer is to be included.

DISPOSAL

All details must be filled in and the cover clearly marked in red: "ANNEX Z — OFFICER ONLY". It may be convenient to group the papers by appendices.

b. Supplementary diaries must be forwarded under the normal rules for TOP SECRET correspondence, to AHQ. The inner envelope must be plainly marked:

EXERCISE HARD GRIND
19 FEB - 9 MAR 73

General

1. An inter company military competition known as exercise HARD GRIND is to be conducted during the period 19 Feb - 9 Mar 73.
2. The competition involves a total of 11 platoons.

Aim

3. The aims of the competition are to:
 - a. assess the standard of military skills, warfare techniques and efficiency within sub units; and
 - b. determine the champion platoon/company of the battalion.

Conduct

4. General Outline. The competition is to be conducted in two parts. Part One involves platoon activities with emphasis on military skills and teamwork. Part Two conducted in the field is designed to test both the platoon and the company in tactical situations. It should be noted that only three rifle companies are involved in Part Two of the competition.
5. Part One 19-23 Feb 73. This period is designed to test both the soldier's individual military skills and teamwork/efficiency within the platoon. Platoons are to be tested in the following activities:
 - a. cross country run;
 - b. obstacle course;
 - c. battle practice;
 - d. quiz;
 - e. weapon handling/military skills; and
 - f. the claymore mine.
6. Part Two 26 Feb - 9 Mar 73. This period is in two phases:
 - a. Phase One. An exercise designed to test the platoon in tropical warfare techniques and procedures with emphasis on:

- (1) ambushes;
- (2) patrols;
- (3) quick assaults;
- (4) protection/harbouring drills; and
- (5) battle procedure.

b. Phase Two. An exercise designed to test the company in tropical warfare techniques and procedures with emphasis on:

- (1) area ambushes;
- (2) advance to contact;
- (3) assaults;
- (4) battle procedure; and
- (5) use of air support.

Scoring

7. Platoon Competition. To determine the champion platoon all six activities in Part One and the platoon tactical exercise in Part Two are to be assessed and points awarded for each of the seven activities. The scoring for each event is related to placings. First gains 22 points, second 20 points and so on with the platoon in last place gaining two points. From this it can be seen that the highest possible score a platoon could obtain is 154 points. (Seven events x 22 equals 154).

8. Company Competition. Scoring to determine the champion company covers both parts of the competition. As there is an evident need to add more weight to the company tactical exercise the following point system has been decided:

- a. The company tactical exercise has been allocated 45, 30 and 15 points respectively for first, second and third placings.
- b. In each of the other events the final placing of the three platoons are totalled and points awarded to the parent companies accordingly. Six, four and two points for first, second and third placings respectively.
- c. Assuming a company gained first place in each event the maximum number of points obtained would be 87 points. That is 45 points for the company exercise and seven by six points (42) for the other events.

9. Dead Heats. Where two platoons dead heat for a placing both are to be awarded the normal points for particular placing. For example if two platoons tie for first place on an event they both receive 22 points while the next platoon being in third position is awarded 18 points.

10. The majority of officials are to be provided by HQ 6 RAR, Spt Coy and Admin Coy. Names of officials are to be confirmed by the operations officer as soon as possible.

- a. 12 Feb 73 for Part One; and
 - b. 19 Feb 73 for Part Two.

23. Sub Unit Emplaning Officers (SUEO). Each company is to provide their own SUEO.

Administration

24. Rubbish. No rubbish is to be left in the exercise area. All sub-units are to carry sandbags. Rubbish is to be centralised at:

- a. the concentration area prior to phase two;
- b. control headquarters on completion of phase two; and
- c. the concentration area on completion phase three.

25. Ammunition. All sub-units are to carry first line blank ammunition. The RP sect is responsible for:

- a. movement of ammunition by road from Kangaw Barracks to the concentration area;
- b. issue to companies on their arrival in exercise area;
- c. collection of all live ammunition prior to the companies departing the exercise area;
- d. holding a reserve for emergencies;
- e. ensuring only platoon sergeants are issued with live ammunition; and
- f. issue of ammunition to the enemy group.

26. Water. All water is to be sterilised.

27. Rations

- a. Companies are responsible for drawing their own combat rations, including those for the FO party.
- b. Spt Coy is to provide rations for control, umpire and enemy organisations.
- c. Admin coy is to provide rations for all staff located at the concentration area. This includes the sioux helicopter detachment. (Numbers not yet confirmed)

28. Malaria Precautions. Normal malaria precautions are to be observed.

29. Transport. The transport officer is to prepare the movement of the unit to the exercise area. A movement table is to be completed and submitted to HQ 6 RAR by 16 Feb 73. The operations officer is to provide outline details. In the event of no air support there will be a requirement for all movement to the exercise area to be by road.

30. Medical.

- a. A medical assistant with ambulance is to be located at the concentration area.
- b. Medical assistants are to be attached to the companies.
- c. Section medical kits are to be carried by all sections.

31. Dress and Equipment

37. Stores. Stores as required for the concentration area and control headquarters are to be arranged by OC Admin Coy and Capt Lunny.

Communications

38. Net Diagram. See annexes B and C.

39. Radios. Radios are to be issued at the concentration area to all companies. They are to be returned on completion of phase three.

Safety

40. Normal safety precautions are to apply. All troops are to be briefed on:
- a. action on snake bite;
 - b. action if hostile wildlife encountered; and
 - c. action if lost.
41. Fire fighting equipment is to be located within the concentration area.
42. No smoking signs are to be positioned next to the fuel dump located at the concentration area.

Conduct of The Course

5. Training is to be conducted daily Mon - Fri.

6. Each training day is to commence with a course administration parade at 0750 hours. This is to be followed by seven training periods, each of one hours duration. The hour which has been allotted for each period is intended to allow for the conduct of the lesson, the assessor's comments and discussion. It also includes the "break period" and time for movement between training areas. Each period is to commence at the time laid down in the training programme.

Syllabi

7. Are attached as follows:

Subject "A"

8. This subject is intended to assess the student's general knowledge of drill, weapon handling and his ability to instruct. Training is to be conducted largely on a mutual instruction (MI) basis within squads. Each squad will comprise ten (10) students under a squad instructor and assistant. Other details are as follows:

- (2) Drill. Hard standing east parade ground (Gurkha Square) Nee Soon.

d. Training Programme. See Annex B.

e. Dress.

- (1) Drill. Unit dress of the day, plus SLR/M16 complete with belt and side arms.
- (2) Weapon Training. Unit dress of the day, plus the following equipment and assessories; Belt pistol 56 patt, suspenders field pack, pouches ammo large (2), right puch containing rifle cleaning kit, left pouch containing drill rounds and two magazines, field pack (worn on belt) containing note books, hat JG, black belt 37 patt, mugs canteen, bottles water and necessary training publications required for the day.

f. Assessment/Examination. This is to be conducted as follows:

- (1) Part I. Students are required to prepare and teach the lessons indicated below.
 - (a) Drill. Mutual Instruction (MI)
Student Instruction (SI)

- (b) Weapons. As for drill.
- (c) Students will be given ample notice of the lesson to be taught and are required to produce a lesson plan for each lesson, assessment is based on:
 - (i) lesson plan, stores and training aids used;
 - (ii) knowledge;
 - (iii) presentation and instructional ability;
 - (iv) leadership; and
 - (v) power of command.
- (2) Part 2. A written examination based on subjects covered in the training programme.
- (3) Assessment. 300 marks are allotted as follows:
 - (a) Part 1. 200 marks are allocated of which 100 is allotted for each of the assessed (SI) lessons. Students must obtain 50% of each assessed (SI), ie; Drill and Weapons to pass Part 1.
 - (b) Part 2. 100 marks are allocated. 50 marks to qualify. STUDENTS MUST PASS BOTH PARTS 1 AND 2 TO QUALIFY SUBJECT "A".

Subject "C"

9. This subject is to be conducted as a series of lectures/discussions during the period 30 Apr - 4 May 73, culminating with a written examination. Details are as follows:

- (2) Assistant Instructors

Instruction is to be mainly by lecture, practical application and discussion. The course will culminate with a three day practical testing exercise. Other details are as follows:

b. Location. Training area D (Malaysia).

c. Training Programme. To be issued seperately.

d. Dress. Field order.

e. Examination.

- (1) Part A. A written examination is to be set to assess the students tactical knowledge. This examination will be of three hours duration and students must obtain 50% to qualify.
- (2) Part B. Students are required to reach a satisfactory standard on practical assessment. Students need to pass both parts A and B to qualify.

Administration

11. General. Students attending the course are to be accommodated in parent company lines.

12. Briefing. A briefing of all instructors, assistant instructors and students is to be held in lecture room 4, building 61, Kangaw Barracks at 0900 hours, 5 Mar 73. This will include:

- a. issue of publications; and
- b. other administration matters.

13. Paludrine. Course responsibility under the control of course CSM. Paludrine books are to be maintained.
14. Rationing. Staff and students are to be warned in for the duration of the course. Companies responsibility for promulgation in Unit Routine Orders on 9 Mar 73. Students attending, as may be directed by HQ ANZUK Spt Gp, are to be Mob 3 to Bn HQ 6 RAR no later than 7 Mar 73.
15. Leave. Overnight and weekend leave may be granted, except during subject "B". ANZUK Force Unit stand down and public holidays are to be granted at the conclusion of the course, and then under direction of OC Units/ Sub Units.
16. Pay. This is to be arranged by course headquarters. Paybooks are to be handed to course CSM on the first administration parade Mon 12 Mar 73.
17. Sport. No staff or student will be available for participation in unit or company representation throughout normal working days, unless considered essential. One week notice is the minimum accepted period required.
18. Weapons. These are required for subject A and B only. Students attending are to bring their SLR/M16 complete with CES from parent companies. Weapons are to be kept in the course arms kote. Weapons required for lessons are to be issued from the course "Q" store, arms kote on request.
19. Pamphlets and Publications. These are to be issued with amendments to staff and students if required at the briefing 5 Mar 73. The unit publication librarian is to control all issues.
20. Stationery. Students are required to bring their own note books, clip boards, pens and pencils. Limited writing material is available.
21. Training Aids. These are the responsibility of individual students. Limited assistance will be available from the course staff. Imagination in this subject will be reflected in the course report.
22. Transport. The transport supervisor is to provide the vehicles as indicated.
 - a. One or two domiciliary buses to convey staff and living out students from nominated pick up points to Kangaw Barracks daily by 0730 hours Mon - Fri 12 Mar - 30 Mar 73, and 30 Apr - 4 May 73.
 - b. Nominal rolls are to be confirmed by the operations officer 16 Feb 73 on vehicles required for sub paragraph 22 a.







MINUTES OF CO's CONFERENCE FRI 16 FEB 73

1. Commanding Officer. The CO made the following points:
 - a. Future of ANZUK Force. CO requested that the soldiers be informed that any speculation on the future of ANZUK force has no basis of fact. This unit has no knowledge of any decision having been made in Canberra at this stage. A decision is hoped for within 3 months but it should be stressed that any decision on the future of the Australian commitment will be a political one. The unit does not know the form of the move home; it could be as a complete unit or it could be a "trickle flow" system from Singapore to Australia. With this in mind, any applications for jobex or transfer on RTA should be discouraged at this stage unless they are of a special nature. The CO stated that Col Smith would be spending 3 weeks in Canberra to discuss this and other problems.
 - b. Pay Levels. The CO requested that Coy Comds have a look at the number of personnel who are qualified/not qualified for and receiving/not receiving level 4 pay. The policy for level 4 is that a soldier must have served 18 mths in a mil skills posting and must be recommended by the CO. The ceiling for pay level 4 is 20% of the Corps establishment.
 - c. State of Weapons. A number of weapons have been poorly maintained and this is to improve. Particular attention is to be paid to the gas cylinders in SLR's and to the barrels of M16's.
 - c. Dog Tags. These are to be worn as part of the uniform. Officers and NCO's are to ensure dog tags are worn but are to "police" this in a sensible manner.


2. Second-in-Command. The 2IC made the following points:
 - a. Survey of Cubic Capacities. A survey would be conducted shortly to determine the cubic capacity of all unit stores should the unit stores (in the worst case) ~~PTA~~ as one complete consignment.
 - b. Dacrons. The 2IC stated that clarification on the wearing of dacrons has been obtained. Soldiers are now entitled to two sets of shorts and shirts and one pair of long trousers. Maj Schlyder stated that a conference would be held with coy 2IC's to discuss the Q aspects of the issue of dacrons and the measuring of soldiers for the uniforms.
 - c. Happy Hour. The 2IC reminded all officers of the happy hour on Fri 16 Mar to be held at the Field Regiment.

3. Operations Officer. Maj Mansford made the following points:
 - a. Exercise Hard Grind. A total of eight Malaysian officers from 7 MIB would be visiting Exercise Hard Grind. Details would be promulgated at a later date.

.../b.

- b. 84mm HEAT Range This range has been temporarily closed and coys will be advised when the range is functional.
 - c. Coys were reminded that the Ops Office is to be advised when all troops are back across the causeway at the completion of coy exercises.
 - d. Escorts. MP Escorts are now only required in support of convoys for exercises of Bn size or above.
 - e. Air Loading/Lashing Teams. Coys were asked to look at the number of qualified personnel available. Courses can be arranged at Tengah if required.
 - f. Obstacle Course. The net for this event is not in a good enough state of repair and this event has been deleted from the Bn competition.
 - g. Exercise - Hong Kong. Vacancies exist for an offr, sgt and 2 radio operators for umpiring in Hong Kong from 29 Apr - 11 May 73. Coys were to submit bids.
4. Adjutant. The adjutant stated that several members had been seen walking in the area without hats, probably because their bush hats are required to be handed in prior to RTA. Hats KFF are to be worn with the appropriate uniform if no other headdress is available.
5. Claims. Instances have occurred in the past where claims for October 1972 have not reached 28 Fd Cash Office until February 1973. The Adjt stated that the problem area could be divided into four parts:
- a. The Individual Member. In many cases claims were not submitted to the Bn pay office by the member until well after the occurrence being claimed for had taken place.
 - b. Company Administration. In come cases claims and LOA registers remain unactioned in coy areas for over two weeks. Five working days is the maximum allowed.
 - c. Battalion Pay Office. In other cases claims had remained in this location for eleven days. Two working days is the maximum here.
 - d. Cash Office. Abnormal difficulties were being experienced at times with some claims. These are being investigated.
6. Sport. The IO drew attention to sports bulletin 5/73, stating that the bulletin outlined the CO's policy on sport.
7. Quartermaster. The QM stated that several L&Ds, after processing and a recommendation for "replacement at members expense", had been withdrawn with the excuse that the item had been "found". In future, once an L&D has been processed and registered with such a recommendation, the member will pay.
8. Medical. The RMO drew attention to Standing Orders for the 6 RAR RAP and stated that no member would be seen, except in an emergency, unless in possession of an A46, a restriction chit or a notification of appointment.

- 9. Route from Admin Coy to RAP. The RMO requested that this route be closed as it endangered patients who were using it as a short cut. The CO, after discussion with OC Spt, agreed that the Pnrs could repair the path.
- 10. OC Admin Coy stated that indents for combat rations must be put in at least two weeks in advance.
- 11. Transport. This would be a problem for the last week in February and the first two weeks in March. Early bids should secure transport whereas late bids would have little chance.
- 12. Drivers. Coys were asked to resubmit nominations for drivers for the tpt pl.
- 13. There being no further business the conference concluded at 0945 hrs.

24. MOSQUITO LARVAE SURVEYS - FEBRUARY 1973

1. ANZUK HMCS is to carry out routine surveys during Feb 73 in accordance with the programme shown below.
2. Surveys are made to detect mosquito breeding and/or potential mosquito breeding in unit/MQ areas. Where mosquito breeding is detected in MQs the occupant is informed, at the time of the visit, in writing.
3. "Domestic" mosquitoes breed profusely in even the smallest collection of stagnant water. Old tins, empty bottles, saucers under flower pots, coconut husks, blocked gutters/drains and old tyres are among the more common sources of trouble. Fire buckets should be emptied at least once weekly. Before refilling they should be thoroughly scrubbed internally and sun-dried. A very sound maxim is "NO STAGNANT WATER - NO MOSQUITOES".
4. HMCS Inspectors and their assistants who carry out these surveys are in possession of a unit "authority" card and wear a green identification badge on their left breast pocket.
