# COMMANDERS DIARIES INSTRUCTIONS

### AIM

1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organization and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

### GENERAL

2. Entries are to be made daily on AF C 2118 (Adapted) each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.
3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties (Australia)" Chapter 2, Section 12.

### RESPONSIBILITY

#### During Non-operational Periods

4. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled by commanders of all formations.

#### During Operational Periods (1)

5. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled in duplicate by:
  - a. Commanders of all formations.
  - b. Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a brigadier or above.
  - c. Heads of services not below the rank of lieutenant colonel.
  - d. Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
  - e. Unit commanders.
  - f. Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

### COMPILATION

6. Both original and duplicate copies are to consist of:
  - a. Cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted).
  - b. Index as printed on cover.
  - c. Narrative (AF C 2118) (Adapted).
  - d. Annexes as shown in the Index.
7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes are to be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer is to be included.
8. The annexes are to be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an annex NIL will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters, the relevant papers should be grouped as annexes starting at B.
9. Documents concerned with future planning for operations form Annex "Z", "TOP SECRET Supplementary Diary" of the formation originating the document. It is to be prepared and disposed of as shown in Paragraph 16.

### CONTENTS

10. The diary is to contain:
  - a. Changes in command, (giving place names as well as map references), establishment, equipment and organization.
  - b. Information received, decisions made and orders given.
  - c. Where applicable, a short summary of the day's fighting, including company movements.
  - d. Opinions and recommendations of the commander with regard to equipment, tactics, organization and morale.
  - e. Progress of defensive works.
  - f. Weapon state.
  - g. Weather and ground conditions, if of potential importance.
  - h. Major causes and number of casualties to officers, men and equipment.
  - i. A note of all prisoners and enemy equipment captured.
  - j. A statement showing how the unit was employed in the time not accounted for. The type of training, etc, should be specified.
11. In order to ensure accuracy and completeness and to save work as much information as possible is to be included in annexes consisting of copies of documents issued and received, routine returns, etc. All annexes are to be referred to in the column provided and the time of receipt or despatch is to be given.
12. The narrative is to supplement and connect the annexes, but need not give a precis of any of them.

## COMBAT DIARIES DISPOSAL

13. **Original Commander's Diary.** This is to be forwarded monthly, unless otherwise ordered, by the seventh day of the succeeding month direct to AHQ.

14. **Duplicate Commander's Diary.** This must be clearly marked as a duplicate. It is to be sent separately from the original to AHQ one month after the original has been despatched but not before the former has been acknowledged.

15. When overseas, both copies of diaries are to be sent through the Army Records organization in the overseas theatre but at different times.

16. **TOP SECRET Supplementary Diaries.**

a. The documents referred to in Paragraph 9 together with a list of them made out on AF C 2118 (Adapted) must be placed in separate cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted). All details must be filled in and the cover clearly marked in red: "ANNEX Z — OFFICER ONLY". It may be convenient to group the papers by appendices.

b. Supplementary diaries must be forwarded under the normal rules for TOP SECRET correspondence, to AHQ. The inner envelope must be plainly marked:

c. The duplicate supplementary diaries must be despatched as shown in Paragraph 14 as soon as receipt of the original has been acknowledged.

## COMPILATION

- c. Narrative (AF C 2118) (Adapted).
- d. Annexes as shown in the Index.

7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit, where covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes are to be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer is to be shown.

8. The annexes are to be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no annexes, an annex NIL will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular formation, the relevant papers should be grouped as annexes starting at B.

9. Documents concerned with future planning for operations form Annex "Z", "TOP SECRET Supplementary Diary" of the formation originating the documents. It is to be prepared and despatched as shown in Paragraph 16.

DFRDB SCHEME (AS)

Reference: HQ ANZUK Spt Gp 52-F12-1 dated 19 Jul 73.

1. The regulations to provide for both gratuities and advances of these gratuities are in the process of being incorporated in Service Financial Regulations.
2. Subject to the new regulations being promulgated, precisely the same amounts and conditions as applied to gratuities and advances of gratuities under the old DFRB scheme are expected to be available to eligible members.
3. Form DB 9 B on which applications for advances were submitted is no longer valid. A new form is being designed and will be distributed shortly.
4. Until the new forms are available applications for advances of gratuities are not to be submitted.
5. The processing of this new form will be much the same as for the old application except that APAC will be the final authorising authority and will arrange payment.
6. As gratuities themselves will be a normal condition of service, eligible members on discharge will not have to make formal application for payment. The member's entitlement, less any advances, will be included automatically in his final payments.
7. Advances of gratuities paid during service are fully taxable whereas on discharge only 5% of gratuities are taxable.
8. On discharge, applications for refund of DFRDB contributions must still be submitted to the office of the DFRDB authority through APAC in accordance with existing procedures.
9. Finance instructions for units will be issued by the Paymaster-in-Chief when the regulations are approved.



General

1. The purpose of this instruction is to coordinate all unit activities, including parade rehearsals, sport, briefings, unit administration and social activities for the period 6-18 Aug 73.

Programme of Activities

2. The programme of all unit activities during the period 6-18 Aug 73 is attached as Annex A.
3. Amendments to the programme are to be issued by 2IC 6 RAR only.
4. No additional activities are to be conducted within the unit, or involving unit personnel, during working hours without prior approval of 2IC 6 RAR.

Activities

5. Major activities are as follows:
- a. 100% Spot Check of Q Account S341
    - (1) Details are given in Reference A.
    - (2) Coordinating conference to be held in Building 81B at 0830 hrs 3 Aug 73.
    - (3) Spot check commences 0830 hrs Mon 6 Aug 73.

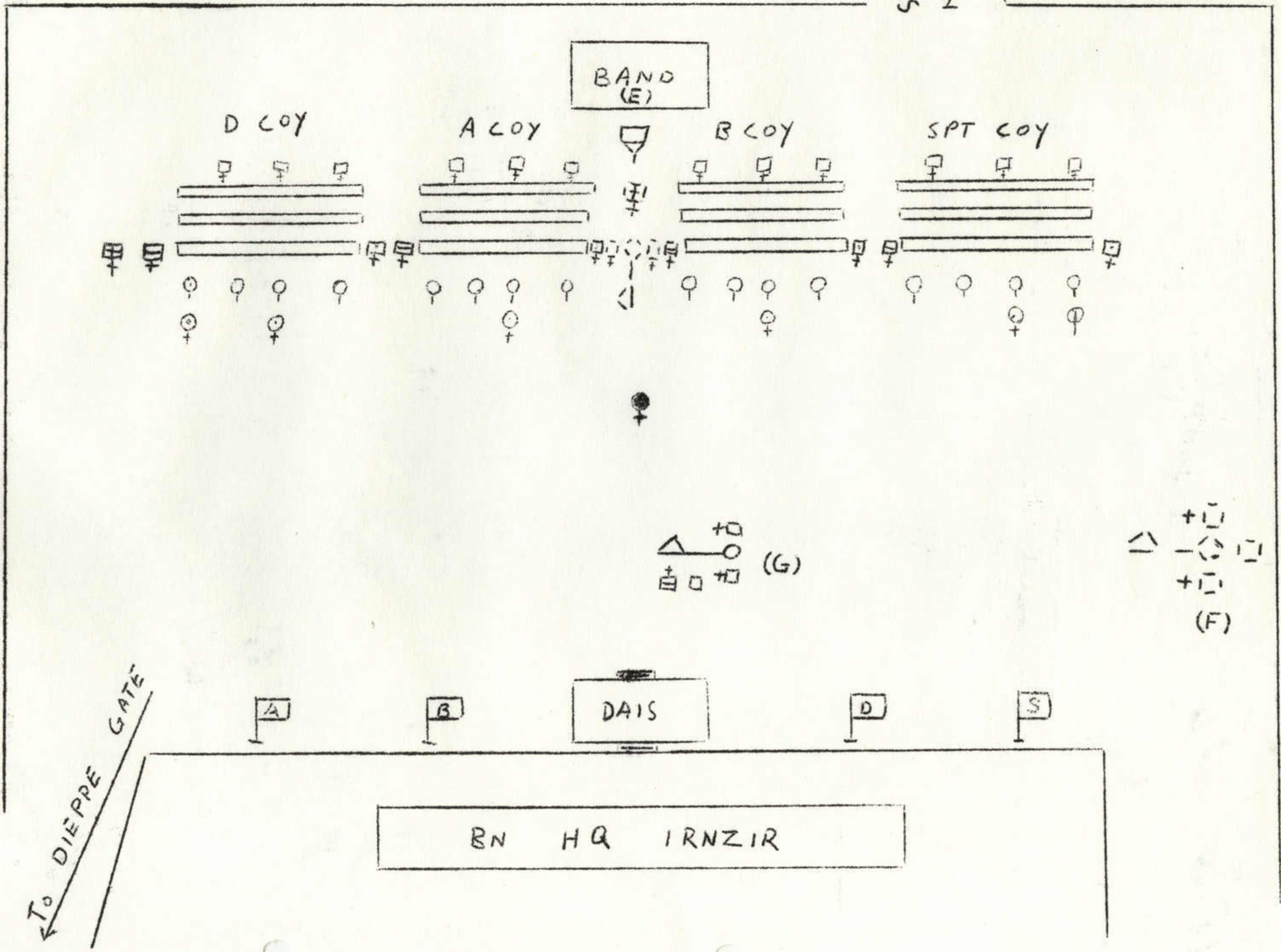

SEATING ARRANGEMENTS

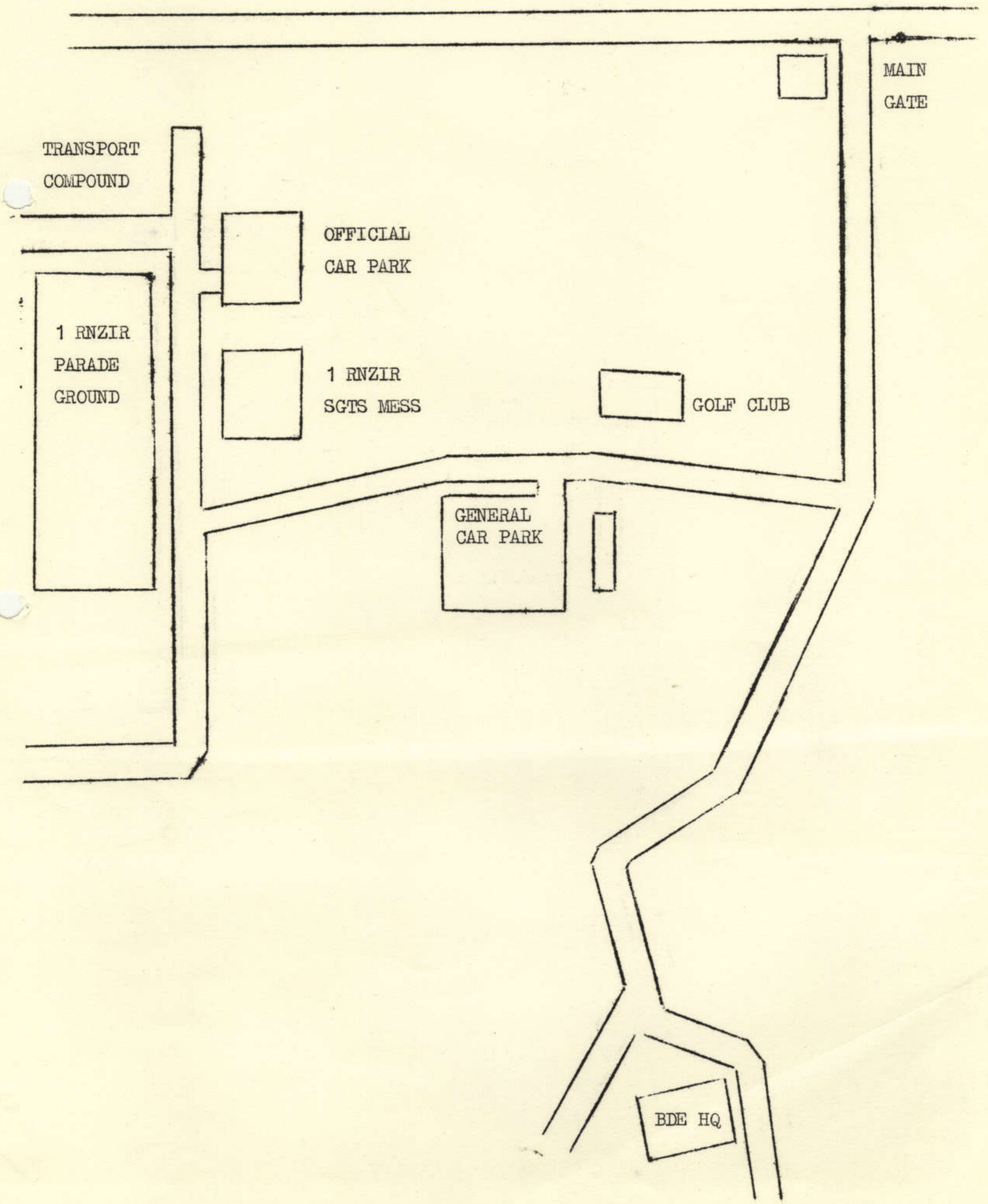
PARADE





Introduction

1. A 100% stocktake of barrack stores on charge to 6 RAR is to be conducted 19 Sep 73.

Unit Stocktaking Officer

2. 17069 Maj K.R. Schlyder is appointed as the stocktaking officer. He is to ensure that the stocktake is conducted in accordance with references A and B.

Reconciliation of Inventories

3. Sub-account inventories are to be reconciled with the 6 RAR main inventory on 12 SEP 73 commencing at 0830 hrs. CQMS/inventory holders are to report to HQMS (Increment) with their respective inventory books at the following times on that day:

b.	B Coy	-	0845 hrs

Identification of Stores

4. Some furniture is marked by 'dymo' tape or white stickers', in addition a photographic record of the principle types of barrack stores on charge has been compiled. Stocktaking teams will each be issued with a set of photo prints prior to 17 Sep 73.

/Movement

Movement of Stores

5. Sub-accounts are to ensure that holdings of stores are stabilised as per barrack room/store/office inventories. No movement of barrack stores is permissible after 14 Sep 73 without the prior concurrence of 2 IC 6 RAR.

Stocktaking Teams

6. Teams comprising checking officers, senior NCO assistants and NCO tally clerks are shown at Annex A attached. The area of responsibility for each team is clearly defined. No change or variation to the composition of these teams is permissible without the express sanction of 2 IC 6 RAR.

Stocktaking

7. Checking officers are to be meticulous in the searching out, identifying and recording of all barrack stores in their areas of responsibility. Rooms, offices and storerooms are to be counted in a logical sequence whereby the chance of overlooking some items of furniture or furnishing is obviated. Ideally each item should be chalkmarked as it is counted.

Recount

8. Should discrepancies appear to be in evidence there may be the necessity to conduct re-counts. Any such recounts are to be determined by the stocktaking officer after perusal of the stocksheets. Specific directions will be given to stocktaking teams as and when these eventualities arise.

Documentation


9. Checking officers are to hand completed signed copies (incl working copies) of pre-printed AAF-F19 to the stocktaking officers at the completion of the count. RQMS (Increment) is to collate and compile total results on AAF-F19-1. QM 6 RAR is responsible for the raising of adjusting vouchers, in accordance with the requirements shown in reference B, Should these be necessary to adjust discrepancies.

Stocktaking Conference

10. A conference is to be held in Building 31B at 0930 hrs 17 Sep 73. QM, checking officers, team members and barrack stores staff are to be in attendance.

Stocktake Control HQ/Information Centre

11. A combined control HQ and information centre is to be established in QM's office. This centre will be staffed by QM and the barrack stores staff. All queries should be directed to either the stocktaking officers, QM or Ssgt R.W. Jones, MM on telephone, extension 3640.

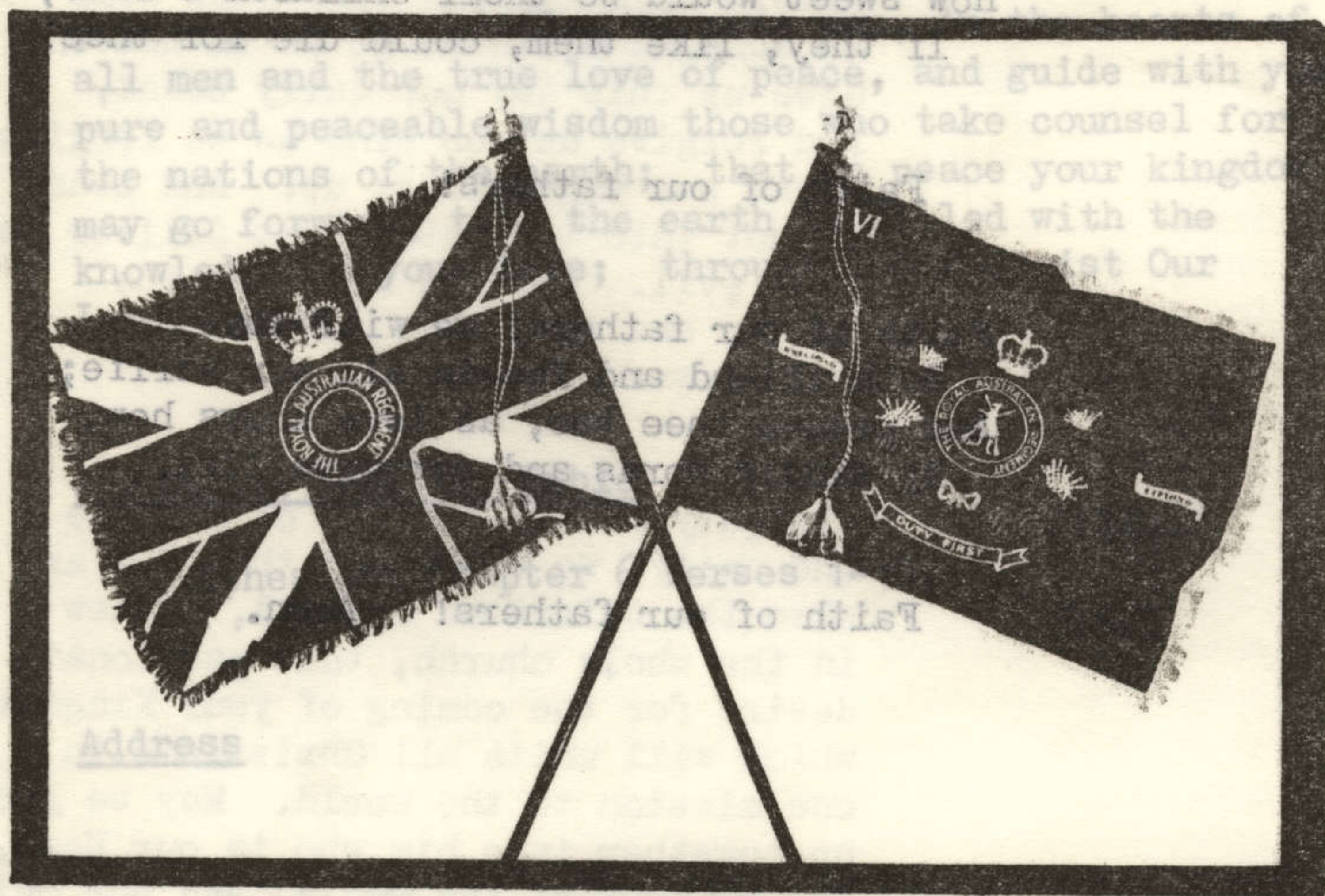

## THE CITATION

The United States Presidential Unit Citation was conferred upon D Company, Sixth Battalion, The Royal Australian Regiment, by the President of the United States of America, Lyndon B. Johnson. He presented the citation to the Prime Minister of the Commonwealth of Australia. The Right Honourable J.G. Gorton, MP, during the Prime Minister's visit to the United States.

The citation reads:

"By virtue of the authority vested in me as President of the United States and as Commander-in-Chief of the Armed Forces of the United States, I have today awarded the Presidential Unit Citation (Army) for extraordinary heroism to D Company, Sixth Battalion, The Royal Australian Regiment, the Australian Army, D Company distinguished itself by extraordinary heroism while engaged in military operations against an opposing armed force in Vietnam on 18 August, 1966. While searching for Viet Cong in a rubber plantation north-east of Ba Ria, Phouc Tuy Province, Republic of Vietnam, D Company met and immediately became engaged in heavy contact. As the battle developed, it became apparent that the men of D Company were facing a numerically superior force. The platoons of D Company were surrounded and attacked on all sides by an estimated reinforced enemy battalion using automatic weapons, small arms and mortars. Fighting courageously against a well-armed and determined foe, the men of D Company maintained their formations in a common perimeter defence and inflicted heavy casualties upon the Viet Cong. The enemy maintained a continuous intense volume of fire and attacked repeatedly from all directions. Each successive assault was repulsed by the courageous Australians. Heavy rainfall and a low ceiling prevented any friendly close air support during

the battle. After three hours of savage attacks, having failed to penetrate the Australian lines, the enemy withdrew from the battlefield carrying many dead and wounded, and leaving 245 Viet Cong dead forward of the defence position of D Company. The conspicuous gallantry, intrepidity and indomitable courage of D Company were in the highest tradition of military valour and reflect great credit upon D Company, Sixth Battalion, The Royal Australian Regiment and the Australian Army."

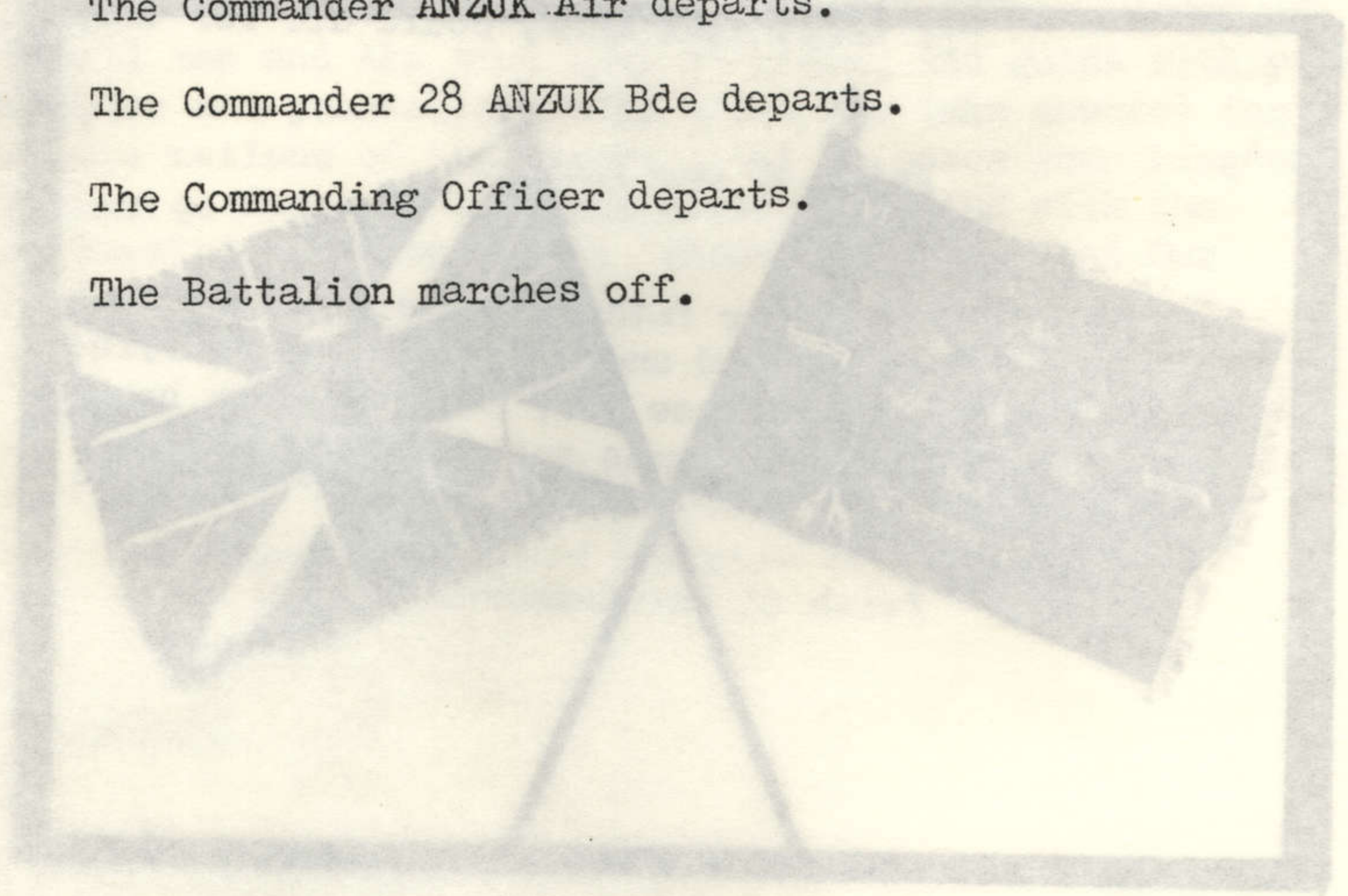

RECREATION LEAVE (AS)

Reference: HQ ANZUK Spt Gp 487-F1-1 dated 24 Apr 73.

1. Approval has been granted for one additional week of recreation leave per year. This increases the standard element to four weeks recreation leave per year for all ranks.
2. The additional week is applicable to all members serving on and after 1 Jan 73 and is in arrears for service from 1 Jan 72.
3. Action for serving members
  - a. Members with continuous service from 1 Jan 72 to 30 Jun 73 are to be credited as at 1 Jul 73 with nine days additional recreation leave. The nine days comprises three days for the period 1 Jan 72 to 30 Jun 72 and six days for the period 1 Jul 72 to 30 Jun 73.
  - b. Members who enlisted on and after 2 Jan 72 are to be credited with the pro-rata amount of an additional half day for each completed calendar month of service up to 30 Jun 73.
  - c. These additional leave credits are to be entered before 30 Sep 73 in the leave record pages of the AAB 83.
  - d. Instructions for crediting four weeks recreation leave in subsequent years are contained in Amendment No 11 to MBI 128-1 which is to be issued shortly.
  - e. 

AHBS DENTAL BENEFITS SCHEME

1. The AHBS Committee of Management has received many enquiries regarding the introduction of a Dental Benefits Scheme. Such a scheme has been under consideration for sometime and AHBS members will recall that a survey was conducted late last year.

2. The survey indicated that a large percentage of AHBS members would join an AHBS Dental Benefits Scheme. The Committee of Management has examined the scheme as a result of the survey and has changed some of the benefits that were originally proposed. Some benefits have been increased and some decreased. The total yearly benefit has been set as follows:

166. BOUNDS - PLACES, AREAS AND PREMISES OUT OF BOUNDS

1. The following places are out of bounds to all ranks at all times:
  - a. brothels (including 'Male brothels');
  - b. opium dens and all other places used in connection with or for indulgence in harmful drugs eg; opium, heroin, cocaine, morphine, Indian hemp, marijuana etc;
  - c. all tattooist shops;
  - d. Unregistered massage establishments;
  - e. bars and restaurants of the Sembawang Village area between 0145 hours and 0600 hours daily;
  - f. all married quarters, hirings and married families estates/areas except for:
    - (1) lawful occupants;
    - (2) properly authorised personnel on duty;
    - (3) guests duly invited by the occupants; and,
    - (4) visitors having the permission of such person in authority or having a legitimate reason for making a visit; and,

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g. all places used for the unauthorised presentation of shows, films etc.

2. In addition, from time to time certain areas will be placed out of bounds by the Service authorities. All ranks are to move out of such areas when so ordered and are not to return.

3. "Out of Bounds" signs are not displayed and it is the duty of all ranks to ensure that any area or premises they enter has not been placed out of bounds by this Order.

4. 6 RAR Routine Order 117/73 is cancelled.

167. IMPROPER POSSESSION OR CARRYING OF ARMS AND AMMUNITION

1. Civil and Military Law imposes severe penalties in respect of unauthorised carriage or possession of arms, explosives, etc.

2. All ranks are therefore forbidden:

a. to carry or to be in possession of any private firearm, ammunition or explosives whether serviceable or otherwise unless the possessor holds a current licence granted by the civil authorities for the said firearm, ammunition or explosives; and

b. to carry or to be in possession of any service firearm, ammunition or explosives of any kind except when in connection with a specific duty or when ordered by the appropriate service authority.

168. SECURITY - OFFICIAL SECRETS

The attention of all ranks is directed to those parts of the Crimes Act 1911-1960 and of the Defence Act 1903-1966 which deal with the safeguarding of official secrets and to the severe penalties which may follow the unauthorised disclosure, intentional or unintentional of official information. Extracts from the Acts are set out in Annex A to Chapter 11 of ANZUK Force Security Instructions.

169. BATTALION HEADQUARTERS OFFICE MACHINERY

1. The office machinery in the 6 RAR Bn HQ buildings, including typewriters, duplicators, printing and heat developing machines and adding machines, are not to be used by unauthorised persons.

2. Any person requiring the use of the above office machinery is to obtain prior approval of the chief clerk. In cases where the office machinery of Bn HQ is required for use in a locality other than 6 RAR Bn HQ buildings, prior approval is to be obtained from the QM 6 RAR.

170. ACCESS THROUGH MAYFLOWER GARDENS ESTATE

1. The above estate is frequently used by ANZUK personnel as a short-cut to and from Changi.

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2. All personnel are reminded that within the estate:
  - a. The speed limit is 20 mph (this is mandatory in all housing estates whether limit signs are posted or not).
  - b. Passage by lorries (i.e. vehicles of 1 ton and above) is prohibited.
  - c. Particular care must be exercised to ensure the safety of children.

171. DISPOSAL OF MOTOR CARS IN SINGAPORE

Reference: A. GRO 40/68.

1. If a vehicle is sold or given away within the Republic the following course of action is to be followed:

- a. The current owner is to ensure that the vehicle is taxed and insured up to and including the last date of the month of transfer of ownership.
- b. The current owner is to obtain from the ROV a ROV Form No 5 and fill in Part A.
- c. The new owner is required to fill in Part B of this form, together with a ROV Form 6.
- d. Both the old and the new owners are advised then to present themselves at the ROV Office, MIDDLE ROAD, SINGAPORE when the transfer will be made.
- e. The new owner insures the vehicle in his name before transfer.

N.B. If the vehicle is exempt AD VALOREM (Importation) TAX the new owner is to be advised of this before the transfer of ownership is made. This is to enable the new owner, if not exempt to make the necessary cash adjustment at the ROV AD VALOREM Dept.

2. If a vehicle is to be scrapped within the Republic the following course of action is to be followed:

- a. The current owner is to obtain from ROV a ROV Form 8 NOTICE of NON-USER.
- b. The vehicle is to be taxed up to and including the last day of the month of intended scrapping.
- c. The current owner then surrenders the ROV Form 8 together with the vehicle log book to the ROV Office, MIDDLE ROAD, SINGAPORE where the vehicle will be de-registered.

N.B. The owner is NOT, under any circumstances, to give the log book to the scrap dealer.  
It is advisable that the owner takes the ROV Form 8 in person and not send it by post as instances have occurred where the documents have arrived after the end of a month consequently the owner has had to pay a further month's Tax.

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172. MOSQUITO LARVAE SURVEYS - AUGUST 1973

1. ANZUK HMCS is to carry out routine surveys during Aug 73 in accordance with the programme shown below.
2. Surveys are made to detect mosquito breeding and/or potential mosquito breeding in unit/MQ areas. Where mosquito breeding is detected in MQs the occupant is informed, at the time of the visit, in writing.
3. "Domestic" mosquitoes breed profusely in even the smallest collection of stagnant water. Old tins, empty bottles, saucers under flower pots, coconut husks, blocked gutters/drains and old tyres are among the more common sources of trouble. Fire buckets should be emptied at least once weekly. Before refilling they should be thoroughly scrubbed internally and sun-dried. A very sound maxim is "NO STAGNANT WATER - NO MOSQUITOES".
4. HMCS Inspectors and their assistants who carry out these surveys are in possession of a unit "authority" card and wear a green identification badge on their left breast pocket.

- a. Category Limit - \$50 per person per membership year, except that the benefit for upper and lower dentures is \$75 limited to one complete set per person each three (3) membership years.
- b. Membership Limit.
  - (1) Family - \$250 per membership year
  - (2) Single - \$125 per membership year

Introduction of the scheme is still under consideration and the Committee is desirous of recommending to the Military Board the introduction of a dental benefits scheme. However the Committee believe that this cannot be done until the present Government proposals for both dental and health care are clearer. The Committee has therefore written to both the Attorney-Generals Department seeking clarification of certain legal aspects associated with the introduction of a dental scheme, and to the Department of Social Services setting out the medical and hospital aspects of AHBS. Until such time as the Government proposals in regard to dental, medical and hospital care are clearer and the legal **aspects** associated with the introduction of a dental benefit scheme are known the AHBS Committee of Management cannot proceed further with the present dental benefits proposal. However the Committee are well aware of the need for such a scheme in the Army.

185. CRIME PREVENTION - BARRACK ROOM THEFTS

1. The number of thefts that have occurred in barrack rooms within 6 RAR is considerable. The majority were due to carelessness or a lack of reasonable precautions and could have been prevented.

2. Elementary precautions which can and should be taken by all personnel are:

- a. Don't leave your cash and valuables lying about unattended, even just for a few minutes in the middle of the day.
- b. Make a habit of emptying your pockets into a lockable container before going to sleep. Lock the container and put the key out of sight.
- c. Don't leave valuables within reach of an open window, even if the door is locked. Remember the "fishing pole" technique.
- d. Don't draw more cash than you need. If you do have a large amount for a particular purpose, arrange for its safe keeping in a suitable place as permitted by National Service Regulations. Don't put it in your locker - the risk is too great. Don't flash it about and don't tell everyone you have got it.
- e. Watch for strangers around the barracks. Report anybody suspicious to the guardroom.
- f. Think before you leave your room - everything secure? If you are last one out, check the whole room.
- g. Never think "it won't happen to me".

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

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189. SECURITY - LETTER BOMBS

1. The attention of all ranks is drawn to the recent spate of letter bomb incidents. It is stressed that absolute care is needed in opening all official or private mail. Packages and letters must be regarded as suspect if:

- a. originator cannot be satisfactorily identified;
- b. incorrectly addressed;
- c. bulky in one part;
- d. a wire may be felt or seen;
- e. it smells of almonds; or,
- f. bears an Irish postmark not familiar to the recipient.

2. Any package or letter which conforms to any of the above, or which is in any way suspicious, must not be opened, or put in water or in sand. It must be left strictly alone and the HQ ANZUK Spt Gp Duty Officer at Force Headquarters (591141 Ext 5313) must be informed immediately.

190. ROAD CLOSURE - 7TH SEAP GAMES CYCLING 1973

1. The Road Cycling Event will take place on the Sembawang Circuit on 4 and 6 Sep and the roads listed in paragraph 2 will be closed to all traffic as follows:

- a. 4 Sep - 0830 hours to 1300 hours inclusive.
- b. 6 Sep - 0830 hours to 1600 hours inclusive.

2. The roads that will be closed are:

- a. Upper Thomson Road from exclusive junction with Transit Road to inclusive junction Jalan Pandan.
- b. Old Upper Thomson Road complete.
- c. Sembawang Hills Circus in all directions.
- d. Mandai Road inclusive of the junction with Seletar Reservoir Road (near Track 7) and inclusive of the junction at Upper Thomson Road.

3. Personnel should make arrangements to avoid the circuit approaches.

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191. DOMICILIARY TRANSPORT

Introduction

1. Many instances have been found recently of members not completing the work ticket satisfactorily. This is particularly obvious when taxis carrying out identical journeys vary greatly in both mileage and time. Enquiries have shown that, either the passengers do not fill in the work ticket or the drivers apply verbal pressure to have either or both figures extended. Although there may be only one mile per trip per taxi involved, it can be seen that at the rate of 40 cents per mile, multiplied by two trips per day by 240 taxis could result in \$184 excess expenditure per day or \$46,368 per year. Some discrepancies are considerably more than one mile.

Entitlements

2. The following personnel are entitled to the provision of transport for their conveyance from their place of residence to place of duty:

- a. ANZUK Service personnel.
- b. Australian and New Zealand Public Service Officers.
- c. Locally Employed Civilians (Expatriate).

3. The domiciliary journey must be taken at the official start and end of a working day or period of duty. When a member using domiciliary transport is detained late on duty or is required early on duty, separate transport will be provided for the additional journey subject to the requesting procedures as laid down in paragraph 8a. or b. being carried out.

Use of Contract Taxis

4. Under no circumstances are units or individual members to deal direct with the taxi contractor or his representatives (drivers). ATCCO, HQ ANZUK Spt Gp is the only agency authorised to deal with the contractors.

Taxi - Work Ticket

5. Members allocated taxis for domiciliary use are to ensure that all details are entered correctly at the beginning and end of each journey. Names of passengers travelling, residence, unit and place of duty must be entered on the work ticket. It is essential that members enter the vehicle mileage and time at the start and finish of each journey. At the end of each journey the work ticket is to be checked and endorsed with the member's name in block letters and signed in the column provided by the last passenger to alight from the vehicle. In addition a passenger of the taxi must complete the certificate at the bottom right hand corner of the form.

6. If passengers encounter instances where drivers of domiciliary taxis will not conform with these regulations then the vehicle number is to be reported to ATCCO forthwith. It is the responsibility of all members using domiciliary, duty taxis and shift-workers taxis to ensure that they carry out the procedures laid down.

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7. Other than in emergencies, taxis are not to deviate from the authorised route or have waiting time added without the prior authority of ATCCO. ATCCO have available routing and mileage information for all journeys. Failure to observe these instructions renders the passenger(s) liable for the cost of the whole journey.

Duty Taxis

8. Provision is made for members to obtain duty taxis where either the time, mileage and or pick-up/destinations vary from the normal daily requirement by carrying out the following procedures:

- a. During duty hours the member will request to ATCCO (Military Extension 51283) for transport supplying the reason, details of the journey, number of passengers and the time required:

Hours of Duty - Mon to Fri 0600 - 1800 hours  
Sat 0800 - 1300 hours

- b. In emergency out of duty hours the member will request to the HQ ANZUK Spt Gp Duty Officer (Military Extension 5313) requesting transport.

9. On receipt of this request ATCCO will arrange the duty taxi with the contractor and allocate a Transport Control Number authorising the journey. To minimise any inconvenience the member requesting a duty taxi should, where possible, place the request with ATCCO well in advance of the date and time the vehicle is required. This is not only to assist ATCCO but also to give the contractor a reasonable time to arrange a vehicle.

10. Failure to obtain a Transport Control Number will render the member liable for the cost of the journey. Members allocated duty taxis are to observe the instructions laid down in paragraphs 4, 5, 6 and 7.

Reporting Fee

11. Failure to utilize an ordered taxi causes a penalty payment by ANZUK of \$7 to the contractor. All instances will be closely investigated.

Shift-Workers Taxis

12. Unit Transport Officers are to request shift-workers taxis on a monthly basis. The request is to be submitted at least one week prior to the date of commencement. Each vehicle will be allotted a number prefixed by the letters SW. ATCCO will where possible fill all taxi seats with shift-workers, however these will not necessarily be from the same unit. Any personnel amendments to the monthly schedule are to be notified to ATCCO immediately they are made. No taxi timings or routing are to be changed without prior permission of ATCCO. A taxi not allocated by ATCCO in this way will not be paid for and the bill will be returned to the unit for payment. Members allocated shift-workers taxis are to observe the instructions laid down in paragraphs 4, 5, 6 and 7.

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192. MOSQUITO LARVAE SURVEYS - SEPTEMBER 1973

1. ANZUK HMCS is to carry out routine surveys during Sep 73 in accordance with the programme shown below.
2. Surveys are made to detect mosquito breeding and/or potential mosquito breeding in unit/MQ areas. Where mosquito breeding is detected in MQs the occupant is informed, at the time of the visit, in writing.
3. "Domestic" mosquitoes breed profusely in even the smallest collection of stagnant water. Old tins, empty bottles, saucers under flower pots, coconut husks, blocked gutters/drains and old tyres are among the more common sources of trouble. Fire buckets should be emptied at least once weekly. Before refilling they should be thoroughly scrubbed internally and sun-dried. A very sound maxim is "NO STAGNANT WATER - NO MOSQUITOES".
4. HMCS Inspectors and their assistants who carry out these surveys are in possession of a unit "authority" card and wear a green identification badge on their left breast pocket.

193 SPORTS SAFETY

Reference: A. ANZUK FRO 359/73

1. Units, ANZUK Sports Clubs and all personnel are warned that it is their responsibility for ensuring that they have sufficient information to mount searches for personnel who may be late returning from recreational training or sports.
2. As a guide the following action should be taken:
  - a. Before setting out:
    - (1) Notify a responsible member of the unit, club or other organisation of:
      - (a) intended area to be used; and,
      - (b) estimated time of return - normally to be in sight of the place by dusk.

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- (2) Check equipment is serviceable and there is sufficient fuel.
- b. On discovering that a person is overdue the unit, club or organisation should immediately mount a search on the way to and in the area notified. If the person is not found, the Duty Officer of the unit, HQ ANZUK Spt Gp, HQ 28 ANZUK Bde (if appropriate) and ANZUK Pro Unit are to be informed.
3. If it is after dark before it is ascertained that a person is missing it is unlikely that a full scale search can be mounted until daylight on the following day.

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
