COMMANDERS DIARIES INSTRUCTIONS

AIM

1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organization and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

GENERAL

2. Entries are to be made daily on AF C 2118 (Adapted) each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.
3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties (Australia)", Chapter 2, Section 12.

RESPONSIBILITY

During Non-operational Periods

4. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled by commanders of all formations.

During Operational Periods (1)

5. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled in duplicate by:
 - a. Commanders of all formations.
 - b. Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a brigadier or above.
 - c. Heads of services not below the rank of lieutenant colonel.
 - d. Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
 - e. Unit commanders.
 - f. Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

COMPILATION

6. Both original and duplicate copies are to consist of:
 - a. Cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted).
 - b. Index as printed on cover.
 - c. Narrative (AF C 2118) (Adapted).
 - d. Annexes as shown in the Index.
7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes are to be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer is to be included.
8. The annexes are to be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an annex NIL will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters, starting at B.

COMMA DISPOSAL DIARIES

13. **Original Commander's Diary.** This is to be forwarded monthly, unless otherwise ordered, by the seventh day of the succeeding month direct to AHQ.

14. **Duplicate Commander's Diary.** This must be clearly marked as a duplicate. It is to be sent separately from the original to AHQ one month after the original has been despatched but not before the former has been acknowledged.

15. When overseas, both copies of diaries are to be sent through the Army Records organization in the overseas theatre but at different times.

16. **TOP SECRET Supplementary Diaries.**

a. The documents referred to in Paragraph 9 together with a list of them made out on AF C 2118 (Adapted) must be placed in separate cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted). All details must be filled in and the cover clearly marked in red: "ANNEX Z — OFFICER ONLY". It may be convenient to group the papers by appendices.

b. Supplementary diaries must be forwarded under the normal rules for TOP SECRET correspondence, to AHQ. The inner envelope must be plainly marked:

c. The duplicate supplementary diaries must be despatched as shown in Paragraph 14 as soon as receipt of the original has been acknowledged.

If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer is to be indicated.

8. The annexes are to be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no annexes, the word NIL will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are submitted for a particular period, they are to be numbered in sequence with the previous ones.

DEPLOYMENT OF D COY 6 RAR COMPANY GROUP TO BUTTERWORTH - GENERAL INSTRUCTION

Reference. A. HQ 28 ANZUK Bde AB 579/2/7 dated 28 Sep 72 (General Instruction for Butterworth Company).
B. 28 ANZUK Bde OPO 1/72 (Orders for Butterworth Company).

General

1. D coy 6 RAR with attached personnel is to deploy to Butterworth during the period 12/13 Jan 73 - 13/14 Feb 73.

Objectives.

2. The objectives of the deployment are to:
 - a. Provide an Australian Army presence in Malaysia.
 - b. Supplement normal protective security of the Air Base Butterworth and RAAF families when approved by 28 ANZUK Bde.
 - c. Carry out training as directed by CO 6 RAR.

Grouping

3. The company grouping for the deployment is as follows.
 - a. Advance Party departs Singapore by air 9 Jan 73.
 - b. Road Party departs Singapore by vehicle 10 Jan 73.
 - c. Main Body departs Singapore by air over period 12/13 Jan 73.
 - d. Rear Details personnel not moving to Butterworth.
4. The detailed composition of the above parties will be shown in an Annex to be issued with the A & Q instruction which is to follow.

Training

5. The outline training programme is shown as Annex A. This Programme is subject to change. A training conference will be held at a date to be advised.
6. Instruction for Ex "High Rise" and duties are to be issued in due course.
7. The overall deployment of the company groups to Butterworth is to be known by the Exercise nickname "Mountain Stream".
8. 38611 Maj C.N. Titmarsh is appointed Safety Officer for the duration of the deployment. He is to be conversant with all relevant Safety Orders and Standing Orders for the training facilities to be used.

THE THREAT FROM LETTER/PARCEL BOMBS

The following is notified for the attention of all ranks, their dependants and LEC:

"LETTER/PARCEL BOMBS"

Although it is considered unlikely that ANZUK personnel will be subjected to attack by letter/parcel bombs, the following information on the devices is given so that all personnel are made aware of the associated dangers.

LETTER BOMBS

Letter bombs discovered to date have originated from such countries as Holland (Amsterdam) Malaysia (Kuala Lumpur and Penang), The Federal Republic of Germany (Karlsruhe), India (New Delhi) and Lebanon (Beirut). Either normal white envelopes or red/blue Par Avion envelopes have been used. Identifying features noted so far are:

The postmark is unusual or strange to the addressee.

The address is written in an unfamiliar or foreign style of writing.

The envelope is either lopsided or weighs too much for its size. The envelope may also have a small pinhole in it or may bear greasy marks (caused by explosives "sweating").

A smell of bitter almonds or marzipan emanates from the letter. These are characteristic of some common explosives.

Parcel Bombs

Parcel bombs, which have the outward appearance of normal parcels, have originated from Yugoslavia (Zagreb) and Austria (Vienna). Charges have reportedly consisted of between 50 and 100 grams of dynamite. Identification features are similar to those for letter bombs.

Receipt of suspect envelopes/parcels should be reported immediately to the Unit Security Officer. All personnel, especially those responsible for the collection, sorting and opening of mail, are warned not to open or tamper with suspect envelopes or parcels.

1. It has been the practice that personnel applying for ARF (Ad Valorem) exemption for motor vehicles could either post or personally submit their application to the Registrar of Vehicles (ROV) for approval. This has allowed little control to be exercised to establish the correct identity of the applicant.

2. In order to reduce the chance of abuse, ROV have advised that in future personnel applying for ARF exemption will be required to go personally to the ROV office with their application, previously certified by their Commanding Officer, and their military identification card. At the time of actual registration of the vehicle they will again be personally required to ensure the vehicle is registered to the correct person.

3. Personnel are reminded that approval of eligibility for ARF exemption must be obtained within three months of arrival in Singapore, but that the vehicle to which it applies may be registered at any time after that.



375. POWERS OF ARREST WITHIN THE ANZUK FORCE

1. As a result of declarations made and directions given under respective National Visiting Forces legislation, there exists complete reciprocity of arrest throughout the entire ANZUK Force based on powers of command by virtue of relative rank.

2. In addition, all Provost personnel within the ANZUK Force are now able to exercise their authority in respect of all other ANZUK servicemen, regardless of nationality, service and, with some exception, regardless of rank.

3. Below is an Order setting out the above matters:

POWERS OF ARREST WITHIN THE ANZUK FORCE

"1. By virtue of Visiting Forces legislation, declarations and orders made thereunder and specific appointments made by Provost Marshals of the Forces of Australia, New Zealand and United Kingdom, there is full reciprocity of arrest amongst all members of the ANZUK Force.

2. All service personnel are therefore to note that:

- a. Any member of the ANZUK Force may lawfully be arrested by another member of the Force, regardless of the service to which they belong, provided that the person effecting the arrest is of senior relative rank.
- b. Any member of the ANZUK Force may lawfully be arrested by a Provost Officer or any provost personnel of the Force acting under the authority of a provost officer, regardless of the service to which they belong and regardless of relative rank, provided that an officer shall not be arrested by any provost personnel except on the specific order of another officer.

.../3.

3. All personnel are therefore warned that any failure to treat personnel of senior relative rank or provost personnel as having powers equivalent to such personnel in their own service may result in the commission of an offence under their own service disciplinary code."

376. CRIME PREVENTION - SALE OF PRIVATE CARS

1. Owners of private cars are warned that when selling their vehicles they should take the following precautions in order to prevent theft:
 - a. Do not allow the potential buyer to test drive the car without being physically present in the car during the drive.
 - b. Do not allow the potential buyer to have possession of the Car Registration Book until such time as the sale is fully completed. The owner should accompany the buyer if the Book is required to complete Hire Purchase formalities.
 - c. Do not allow the potential buyer to obtain possession of the car until such time as any cheque which he has presented in full or part payment for the car has been cleared by a Bank; this normally takes three days unless special arrangements are made.
2. In the event of a car being stolen, the facts should be reported immediately to the Military and civil police.
3. All Ranks are advised that the penalties for litter in SINGAPORE apply also to abandoned cars.

377. STOCK/AUTOCROSS CARS

1. Stock car owners are advised that:
 - a. Any person who possesses a stock car commits an offence unless the vehicle is licenced under the Road Traffic Act 1970.
 - b. Any person who uses a stock car on a public road commits an offence under the Motor Vehicles (Third Party Risks and Compensation) Ordinance of 1960 unless he has insured as required. Use of a stock car on a reclaimed industrial site may not be "use" on a "public road", but the towing of a stock car on a public road will amount to "use" on a public road. In this case the law requires the owner to insure.
2. No ANZUK facilities or services are to be used to modify, improve or maintain any stock car, and in particular no ANZUK motor transport is to be used for the purpose of towing or otherwise conveying a stock car from one point to another.

378. AIR TRAVEL - SECURITY

All personnel are advised that when travelling by air, either Civil or Service, parcels, packages or other containers should not be accepted for transit on behalf of any person not travelling on the flight.

379. BANK ACCOUNTS - DEPENDANTS AND SELF ALLOTMENT

1. It is essential that when a private bank account is closed which is used for payment of an allotment, the member or dependant advises the date of closure of the account to the Allotments Clerk, Aust Army Accounts Office. This advice should be given at least seven days prior to the next pay day.
2. The above is particularly required of members and/or dependants returning to Australia.

380. INSURANCE OF SERVANTS

1. Recent Singapore Legislation amending the Workers Compensation Act makes it compulsory for an employer to carry insurance against employers liability in respect of any workman employed by him. A penalty of a fine of up to \$4000 and/or one years imprisonment is provided for non-compliance.
2. Kebans (gardeners) come within this definition, and All Ranks employing such must now take out this insurance at their own cost.
3. Domestic servants (amahs/cooks) are exempt from this requirement, but all ranks are strongly advised for their own protection to include them in such insurance cover. There have been cases in the past of the representatives of deceased amahs claiming extensive damages from servicemen and civil cases reveal that damages for death or personal injury can be well in excess of \$300,000.

381. CUSHION COVERS AND CURTAINS

1. There have been supply problems in providing cushion covers and curtains in married quarters and single accommodation.
2. The situation has now improved with the receipt of 17,000 yards of curtain material and 18,000 yards of cushion cover material. Both are available in a number of different patterns and colours.
3. Two contractors have been tasked with converting the cushion cover material into covers and this will be completed progressively by mid Feb 73. It is expected that all Married Quarter Exchange Stores will be receiving stocks of cushion covers in the near future.
4. Married quarter occupants requiring unserviceable curtains replaced are to contact their Barrack Inventory Accountant. It is emphasised that a change purely on colour scheme grounds cannot be authorised.

382. TAILORING OF GREEN POLYESTER/DACRON UNIFORMS

1. Commencing 30 Nov 72 the pattern for polyester/dacron uniforms which are tailored in Singapore is to be the same as the existing khaki polyester uniform issued in Australia with the following exceptions:

- a. Shorts

- (1) Small belt loops (for belt trousers $1\frac{1}{4}$ ") will not be incorporated.

- (2) Three large belt loops, positioned one at each side and one at central back, will be incorporated. Loops will be buttoned with the button at the bottom of the loop.
- (3) The length of leg will be such that when standing the bottom of the shorts leg is 4 inches above the top of the knee cap.

- (1) Shirts are to have short sleeves with simulated $2\frac{1}{4}$ " cuff/fold. The length of sleeve will be to the crook of the arm when the arm is bent at a right angle at the elbow.
- (2) A top button and button hold (at neck) are not to be incorporated.

c. Trousers

- (1) Cuffs will not be incorporated.
- (2) Patterning of fly and hip pocket (including flap) will be the same as for khaki polyester.
- (3) Bottoms of trouser legs are not to be less than 16 inches nor more than 18 inches in circumference.
- (4) Belt loops as for shorts.

d. The pattern for Safari jackets will be the same as for Australia.

2. Each individual will be responsible for taking his Khaki polyester uniform to the tailor (for use as pattern) and ensuring the patterning of green polyester/dacron uniforms is as directed by this RO.

3. The only types of material and threads to be used in the tailoring of AS Polyester/Dacron green uniforms are:

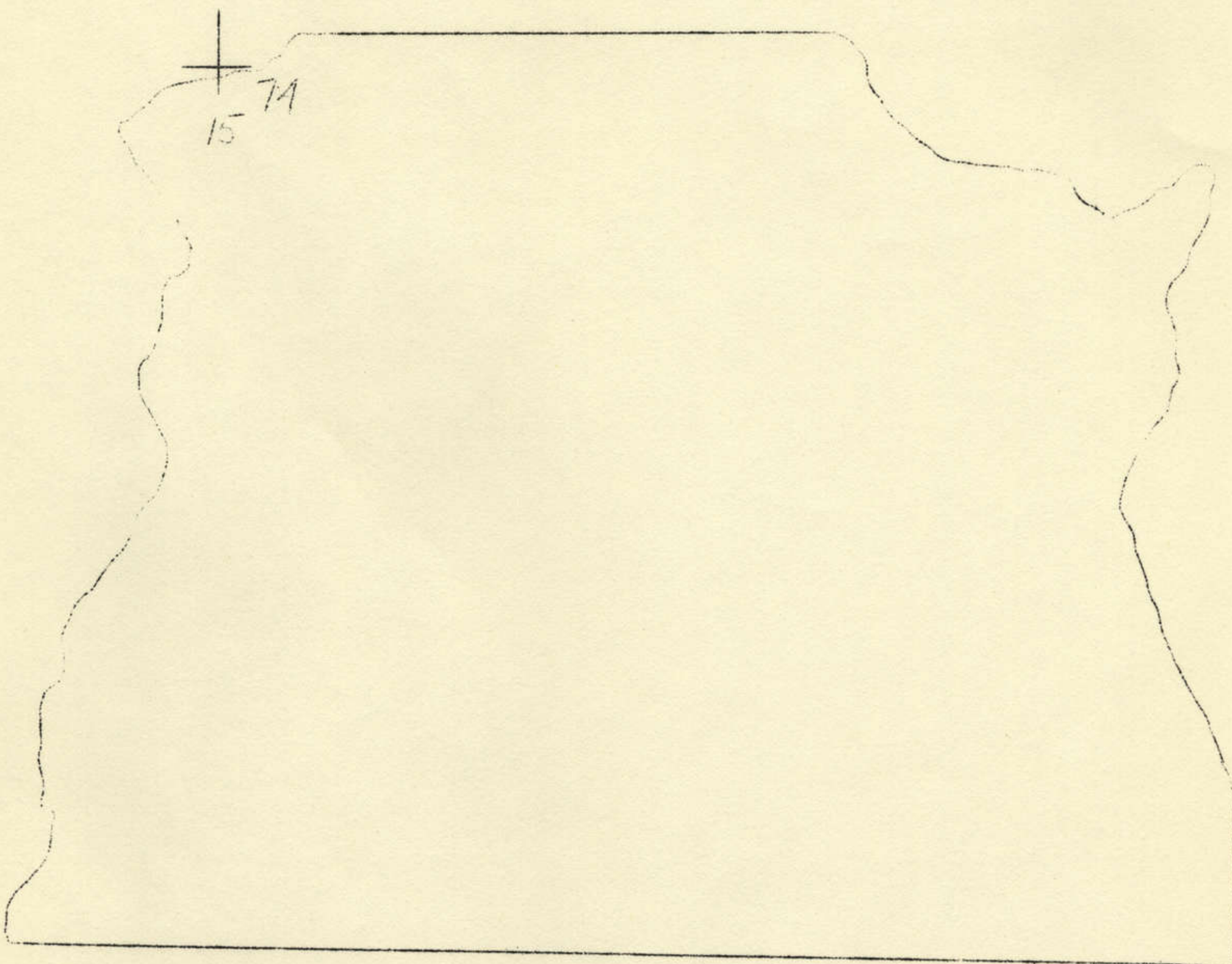

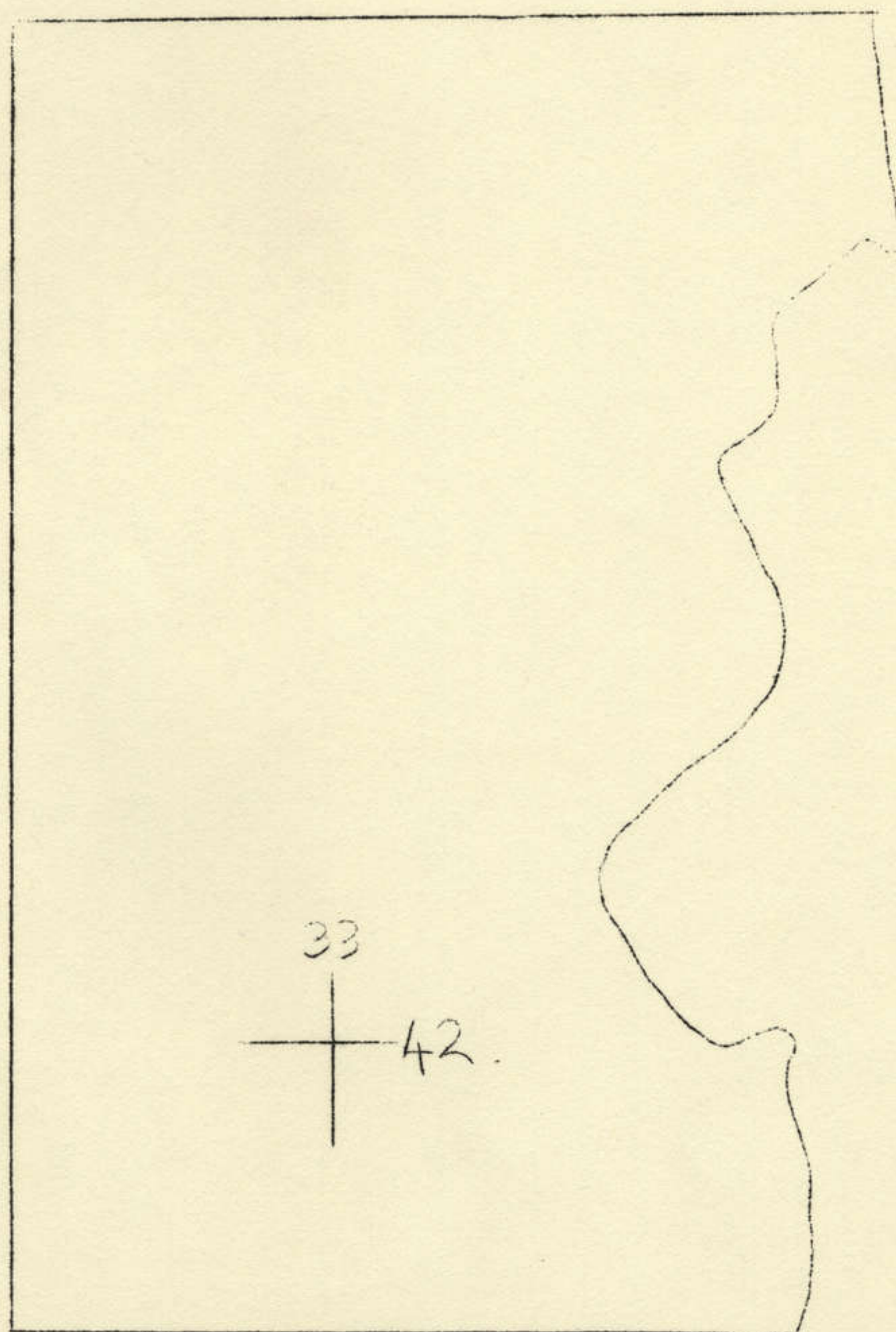

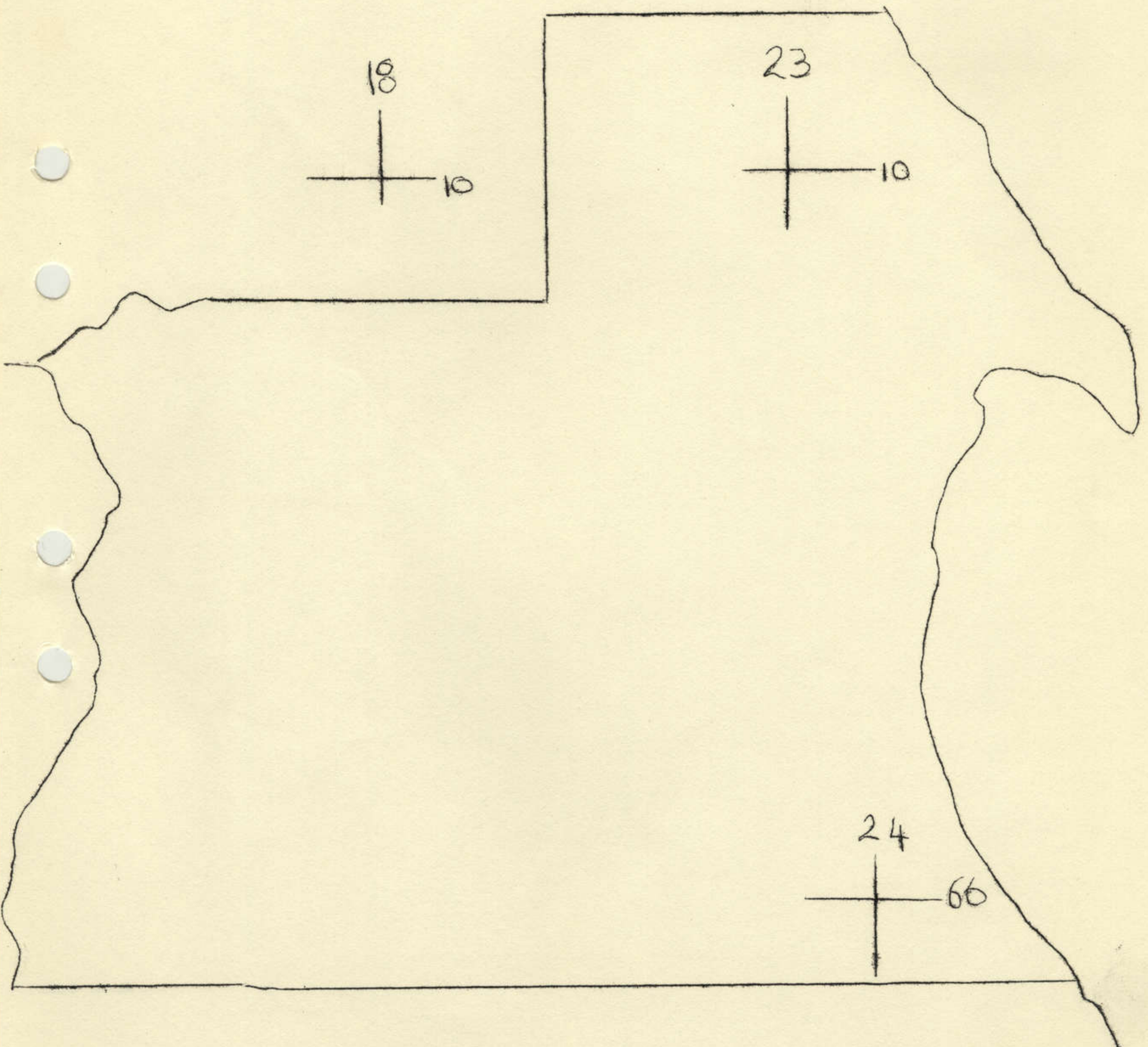

EX SWAMP FOX 2

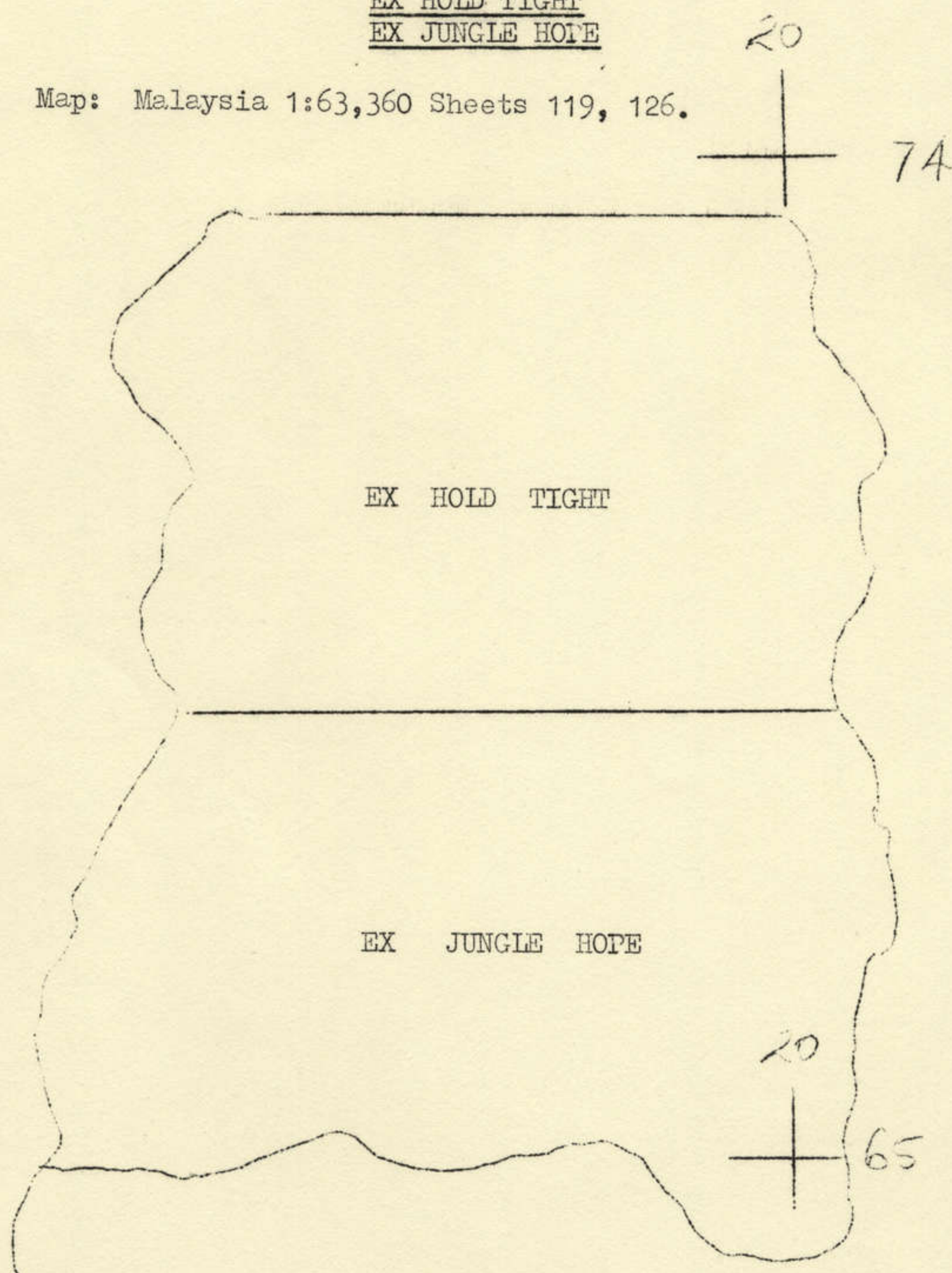
