107. FIRE PREVENTION

- 1. A recent tent fire is suspected to have been caused by concentration of the sun's rays by a concave shaving mirror commonly used in theatre. The focal length of the mirror is approximately two feet and it has been demonstrated that material similar to tentage can be ignited in about one minute by this means.
- 2. To avoid a repetition, concave mirrors are not to be left exposed to sunlight where they may cause a fire, but secured in lockers, trunks or wardrobes when not actually in use.

108. SECURITY OF PERSONAL WEAPONS

- 1. There can be no relaxation of the requirement for soldiers to carry their weapons at all times when moving outside their unit areas. It is encumbent on all unit commanders, and in turn all unit officers and NCOs, to constantly stress the individual soldiers responsibility for his weapon.
- 2. Companies are reminded of the requirement of AFV (Army Component) SOPs, Part 3, Chapter 1, Section 4, which states, inter alia:
 - a. All ranks are to be reminded at frequent intervals that the security of a weapon is the personal responsibility of the individual to whom that weapon is issued.
 - b. When out of contact with the enemy, weapons are not to change hands without a receipt being given of the change being officially recorded; it is the responsibility of the person handing over the weapon to check that either action is taken.



you that Private Robert GALE of A Coy made such progress in the first two weeks with us, that we arranged for him to stay an extra fortnight. From the luxury home unit at the Dunes, on the Esplanade at Surfers Paradise, that he shared with Ian SQUIRES and Chris FACKENDER of your Battalion, we moved him to a more luxurious home unit, right on the beach, about three quarters of a mile south of Surfers Paradise. This unit has been made available to our Scheme by the Chairman of Directors of one of Australia's largest Construction Companies. He was joined in his unit by Corporal John and Mrs BRIGGS. John, of course, comes from A Coy and was brought by air from Adelaide on Monday 23rd June. Bob GALE has now returned to 1 Military Hospital, much sun tanned and many pounds heavier in weight. John BRIGGS is also gaining weight rapidly and both he and his wife are much more relaxed than when they first arrived.......

......Another of your men that we have seen a great deal of recently is Sgt Fred CRAWFORD. Fred and his family are residents of the Gold Coast. Its operations in many areas of the AO were limited due to boggy conditions. The troop had a deal of maintainance problems caused by tanks breaking down, and many large field repairs were carried out. Released to parent unit on 19 Jul.
- (2) Sect B Sqn 3 Cav Regt The section also was based primarily at FSPB FLINDERS and conducted operations from that location concentrating mainly in the de COURTNEY RUBBER plantation area. Released to parent unit on 19 Jul.
- (3) US DUSTERS These were allotted for two days and remained in FSPB FLINDERS when not operating in conjunction with the APC section in patrol tasks in the de COURTNEY RUBBER area.

b. Artillery

- (1) 161 Fd Bty The battery was located at FSPB FLINDERS then moved one section by APC to FSPB BUFFALO (YS 4489). One section moved by air from FSPB FLINDERS to FSPB DAMPIER (YS 3686) and one section by air from BUFFALO to DAMPIER. Due to the large area of operations the battery was forced to split its resources and this was achieved successfully but could not be maintained for long periods.
- (2) Sect B Bty 2/35 US Arty This battery was located at FLINDERS and provided general support from that area. It had no responsibility for perimeter defence in FLINDERS hence its siting in that area provided some difficulties, nevertheless its perimeter defence was adequately catered for by use of armour particularly and infantry to flanks.
- c. Engineer Splinter teams were attached to each company and where necessary reinforced by combat engineer teams for specific tasks.
- d. Aviation 161 (Indep) Recce flt provided a direct support H13 which was used for liaison, communication and minor resupply. All resupply was by air either CH47 or UH-IH aircraft flying from NUI DAT.

Concept of Operations

- 9. a. Operation MATTHEW A Coy moved by road to FLINDERS and from that area were to move generally south west. B and D Coys flew into YS 560390 and B Coy were to move south and D Coy south east then south by selected stages to concentrate at the general area of CU MY (YS 580873). At each stage coys were to halt and ambush tracks to ensure familiarization of the area of operations and detect the pattern of enemy movement. This was designed to allow detection and elimination of what intelligence sources reported as large bodies of enemy, either supply parties or troop reinforcements. It was then intended to search the remaining area of the AO for likely supply areas of 84 Rear Services Gp.
- b. Operation HAT DICH This operation which followed immediately after operation MATTHEW was designed to trap elements of 274 Regt believed to be in the alotted AO and in conjunction with ARVN Marine Bde op further to the west. C Coy approached from the WEST while A Coy ambushed to the north. B Coy moved from the south against the target area and D Coy moved west then north against other possible target areas and to locate possible routes from the main target area of SOUI CA. On 27 Jul redeployment of C and D Coys took place to provide protection for land clearing elements.

Execution

- a. General The initial deployment developed within the concept without any problems. C Coy remained under comd 1ATF working in conjunction with 2/48 ARVN battalion in AO GUDGEON and joined OP MATTHEW on 3 Jul 69. Due to going and almost complete lack of substansiation by ground action of the intelligence previously provided, the initial concept was not strictly followed and much effort was then put into endeavouring to locate suspected large numbers of enemy or signs of his supply complexes rather more quickly than first thought. The lack of enemy activity in the area allowed the battalion to be deployed into AO PORPHRY against another suspected concentration of enemy troops. This concentration was located within AO PORPHRY and the enemy forced to move.
 - b. 29 Jun 17 Jul (OP MATTHEW) 29 Jun The move by 9 RAR group to AO TOM THUMB was completed seccessfully, however one UH-IH developed engine trouble and landed in an insecure area. A platoon of A Coy was lifted from FLINDERS and secured the aircraft wntil it was recovered. A Coy remained in the area of FLINDERS and B and D Coy commenced to move south and south west respectively from the LZ at YS 567939.
 - 30 Jun 6 Pl contacted 3 enemy at YS 563933 at 0800 hrs. The enemy approached on a track. 5 Pl later sighted 5 en further to the west and they were engaged with artillery. A Coy patrolled in the general area of FIINDERS. B Coy as result of contact located 5 packs including 200 lbs of rice. D Coy continued to move SE and located two old camps each underwater.
 - 1 Jul A Coy continued to patrol in FLINDERS area. 4 Pl were contacted at YS 563935. The enemy moved along a track and sentry was seen by the enemy who fired into the general area. At the same time the sentry fired a claymore. D Coy continued to patrol in the east.
 - 2 Jul Two dusters returned to NUI DAT and replacement tank was brought forward with escorting convoy. Sect of APC escorted the convoy from route 2 to FLINDERS. D Coy located a wpn cache at YS 587909. D Coy was still in waterlogged area and moving slowly.
 - 3 Jul A Coy moved east from FLINDERS and B Coy continued to search in the general area of YS 565926. Both A and B Coys located some tracks but not recently used. At 1430 hrs HQ 1ATF reported a SAS sighting at YS 622865 believed approx 60 en. C Coy arrived at FLINDERS from NUI DAT having completed task with 2/48 ARVN Bn and were ordered to react to SAS information. SAS ptl co-ordinated

/4. to marry CONFIDENTIAL

to marry up with C Coy at LZ 4 Jul,

4 Jul C Coy lifted to LZ at YS 612880 by 0800 hrs and married up with SAS by 0850 hrs. B Coy continued to search in the same area as 3 Jul and A Coy continued to east as far YS 553900. D Coy continued in the cast but found nothing of significance. It was apparent that there was little enemy movement hence new company boundaries were ordered generally in company present areas and B and D Coys were told to search their areas while A Coy moved NW to detect any possible enemy movement in that area. C Coy remained on task with SAS although to date nothing found.

5 Jul 2/48 ARVN was deployed into AO TRANSVERSE and to FSPB BUFFALO. Assistance was provided by tanks and APC's from 9RAR gp. In moving into the area 2 Tp B Sqn (Cav) contacted enemy and killed 1 VC. D Coy in general area of YS 565881 continued to search and found signs about 24 hrs old of small en parties. 11 Pl heard 3 shots from 100 m away when located at YS 561886. C Coy moved to YS 605 874 and searched extensively in the area of reported sighting but located no signs. 11 Pl reported movement to their NW and the area was engaged by artillery. A Coy found no fresh sign of en in their move to NW.

6 Jul 11 Pl investigated area of noise heard 5 Jul but negative result. 10 Pl were contacted as they withdrew from ambush at YS 561881. Enemy approached through bush from the west. C Coy continued to thoroughly search the area of suspect siting but located no sign of the enemy or occupied camp. B Coy continued their search and located some unoccupied camps plus track systems in the general area YS 5690. Some of these tracks and camps had been used by groups of en approx 4 - 6 about 36 hours ago. A member of A Coy was evacuated from YS 528908 because of bee stings.

7 Jul Anti Tank Pl patrolled south from FLINDERS and located a 4 hr old track at YS 522884, and followed up but negative result and returned to FLINDERS. B Coy continued to search in the area YS 5589, 5690, 5689, 5789, 5790. Indications were found that a small party of en had moved through the area from NORTH to SOUTH. A Coy moved to NW area of AO and C Coy continued in and around area of SAS siting.

8 Jul A Coy were lifted by air back to FLINDERS and C Coy across the SONG RAI to YS 576871. D Coy continued to search in general area of yesterday then moved west to YS 559887, while B Coy continued in their area.

9 Jul A Coy moved east from FLITDERS and located some old bunker systems. D Coy located some old systems and one new used bunker at YS 559893.

10 Jul Anti tank Pl again patrolled south of FLINDERS and although fresh tracks were found no enemy were contacted. D Coy located a camp with caches including a tape recorder at YS 559893.

11 Jul At YS 557896 12 Pl located large old bunker systems, probably a hospital for medical stores found. C Coy (-) after flying into FLINDERS moved to FSPB BUFFALO (YS 4489) and into AO TRANSVERSE to replace 2/48 ARVN which had withdrawn. A Coy found some old bunker systems not used for months in the area YS 5488, 5489 Section of APC which moved to BUFFALO detonated a mine at YS 444892.

12 Jul 7 Pl and 9 Pl joined C Coy at BUFFALO and commenced ops in AO TRANSVERSE to south and west of BUFFALO. 11 Pl moved into bunker system and were fired at from the system resulting in 2 members killed. The en withdrew south west and north west from the camp after being struck by light fire teams and artillery and mortars. As a result of SAS report on HQ 274 at YS 345890 orders were given for A Coy to move by air to attack and C Coy ordered to protect FSPB elements incl sect of 161 Bty which would move to BUFFALO. B Coy continued to search in northern area of AO and found old tracks and camps.

/5. <u>13 Jul</u>

- 13 Jul A Coy moved by foot to FLINDERS then by air to YS 354900. C Coy secured BUFFALO area and received defence stores from NUI DAT and FSPB elms from FLINDERS in Sect APC escorted by Tp tanks. APC's remained at BUFFALO and tanks returned to FLINDERS. Elms 2 Pl contacted 3 en and killed one at YS 349901. They were in ambush on tracks believed to connect two newly constructed camps. B Coy continued to find old large camp complexes and signs that 12 en had occupied portion of one camp this morning. D Coy continued in same area in an endeavour to follow up from last contact. A relay station was positioned on high feature at YT 6010 to provide comms with A Coy.
- 14 Jul At 0940 hrs 2 Pl again contacted en on its track system at YS 352094 1 VC was KIA. A bushmans scout working with C Coy indentified apparent civilians in their area as active resupply agents for 84 Rear Services Group. These people were detained and sent to Duc Thanh district post. C Coy found small caches of clothing and SA ammo in its area south of BUFFALO. A Coy located a small fresh camp with heavy blood trails in it just north of 2 Pl contact area. This was not camp reported by SAS which has not yet been located.
- 15 Jul A Coy camp extended to larger camp hurriedly evacuated by en early that morning. Among other items A Coy located one Chicom HF radio in the camp which was at YS 352904.
- 16 Jul C Coy located unnamed village at YS 442875. District Chief Duc Thanh to investigate. A Coy unable to locate SAS camp at grid reference given but believe that one previously found by them to be SAS camp. B Coy moved from their loc by air to secure area of FSPB DAMPIER. Recce elms of FSPB were also moved to DAMPIER. This move was prior to Bn group (less tanks and APC which were to revert to their parent commands on 19 Jul) moving to AO FORPHRY for operation HAT DICH.
- ambushed generally in that area having two contacts with small en parties, 3 VC KIA. B Coy remained protecting FSPB DAMPIER and FSPB elms moved by air from FLINDERS to DAMPIER. C Coy continued to secure BUFFALO then BUFFALO abandoned when guns moved to DAMPIER. T Force took over responsibility for AO TRANSVERSE and C Coy moved on foot westwards from BUFFALO to the general area of YS 3989, 3990. D Coy flew into DAMPIER then moved west.
- 19 Jul B Coy moved north from DAMPIER toward SONG CA. D Coy after moving west crossed the FIRESTONE trail at YS 3485 then moved north towards SONG CA in vicinity of YS 3488. B Coy investigated fresh tracks south of Song Ca and north of Firestone in area of YS 3687. 7 Pl contacted en at a water point at YS389906. One VC KIA. 7 Pl followed up the track located at water point and came under heavy fire from en in bunkers at YS 385906. One Aust KIA could not be recovered together with some weapons before the platoon was forced to withdraw. Dustoff was completed after dark also a resupply was requested but cancelled. C Coy was approx 75 m from en camp.
- 20 Jul C Coy moved into camp after engagement by arty. Airstrike and light fire teams not able to operate due to low cloud ceiling. The body of Aust KIA was recovered, (less "dog-tags" and watch) also quantities of eqpt left in contact area. En took all sleeping gear from packs and took all weapons although some were known to be extensively damaged. No en cas were found but many blood pools and tracks were located in the bunker system.
- 21 Jul 11 Pl located an old cache of films (destroyed by water) projector and transformer at YS 326898. Films appeared to be physical culture and propaganda. B Coy found more tracks in the vicinity of Song Ca Soui Soc YS 5688. Warning order received from 1 ATF of intention to move US land clearing team into AO PORPHRY. C Coy commenced to destroy the bunker system and search the general area to follow up tracks and locate any adjoining bunker systems.

/6. 22 Jul

- 22 Jul 6 Pl located an occupied bunker system at YS 373886 and engaged one enemy. The camp was struck from the air and by arty. The system was extensive and well used. C Coy continued to destroy camp at their loc. Also located another camp unoccupied approx 400m further north. A report was received from an agent that elms 274 Regt were located on Song Ca.
- 23 Jul Received report from Task Force of en intention to mortar DAMPIER or coy locs. Also Task Force advised a thorough search of B Coy and C Coy bunker areas for caches. They believed too that en wounded located near one of those bunker systems. A Coy ordered to move south-east to YS 372892 on 24 Jul.
- 24 Jul A Coy moved quickly to new area and contacted en at YS 367891 at 1630 hrs. A Coy also contacted one en unarmed approx 600m north of pervious contact. A Coy believed a camp to their north and south. B Coy prepared demolitions in bunker system while D Coy patrolled northwards in NW sector of AO. C Coy continued to patrol in the vicinity of their bunker systems. Task Force warned that land clearing operations would start 28 Jul and coy required to secure proposed base area on 26 Jul and reinforce with another coy on 27 Jul.
- 25 Jul. A Coy cleared area of suspect camp to north then moved to take resupply before clearing the south area from the west. C Coy completed search in present area and moved further SW.
- 26 Jul B Coy located a signal cable running north from their bunker system. C Coy found another bunker system approx 800m west of their other system. D Coy flew into the area of land clearing base at YS 301817 and secured the area. C Coy unable to destroy present bunker system due to time required to move to PZ area for move next day to land clearing base. A Coy located large fresh bunker system at YS 365888 when searching south of contact area. While searching the bunker area RPG fired at A Coy elements. Area was attacked but en withdrew quickly by covered route.
- 27 Jul C Coy moved to land clearing base by air. B Coy patrolled in bunker area and continued to provide blocks to south from A Coy area. B Coy followed signal cable to A Coy area. A Coy prepared bunkers for demolition. Land clearing team escorted by armd elements moved to base from route 15.
- 28 Jul C Coy and D Coy continued to provide security in land clearing base area. A and B Coy continued search in camp areas and destruction tasks. Orders given for return to NUI DAT.
- 29 Jul D Coy returned to NUI DAT and two coys 5 RAR plus Tac HQ moved to land clearing base. C Coy moved from land clearing base by foot to sewure area FSPB POLLY for fly in of 5 RAR FSPB 31 Jul. A Coy moved to FSPB DAMPIER for move to NUI DAT.
- 30 Jul A Coy moved by air to NUI DAT. B Coy moved to DAMPIER to secure it for fly out 31 Jul. C Coy were in loc at POLLY (YS3283).
- 31 Jul DAMPIER was abandoned by FSPB elms and B Coy. C Coy relieved by 5 RAR and returned to NUI DAT.

Results

11. The results of the operation are shown in Annex A.

Administrative Matters

- 12. a. The long distance for resupply by air meant economy was required in all respects. The three day cycle of resupply for fire base and coys was effective.
 - b. TFMA provided operators for the water point and pertol point. These commodities were resupplied direct to the fire base from TFMA in bulk as required.
- c. During the early part of operation MATTHEW many soldiers suffered from colds and or bronchial problems. In some cases they required evacuation.

/7. Special Equipment

Special Equipment and Techniques

No special equipment or techniques were used. . .

Lessons Learnt.

14. Enemy movement It became quite apparent that enemy in both AO TOM THUMB and AO PORPHREY moved in relatively small parties parallel to but off obvious tracks.

b. Wet Season

- Bunker systems in low ground become waterlogged and the enemy appear to evacuate them rather than provide stands etc.
- (2) Many caches and cache stands made of timber (incl bamboo) were located above ground.
- Air, both helicopters and strike aircraft are severely handicapped by low cloud and rain. Airstrikes should be programmed to consider cloud cover during parts of the day. Alternate arrangements for fire support should be arranged for all air targets during the wet/cloudy season.
- Explosives Extensive use was made of free dropping explosives from hovering helicopters. Detonators etc were carefully lowered by rope but free drop of C 4 etc made the task of delivery much quicker.
- de "Sniffer Missions" The information provided by sniffer missions, is not accurate for full planning without adequate back up information.
- but cit is doubtful if it is used very much during the wet season. Normal "caretaker" units remain and transit of small parties occurs.
- f. AO TRANSVERSE It seems likely that civilians in this area actively support the VC by providing supplies bought in market areas. They also act as guides and no doubt hide VC within their illegal hamlets and houses.

Commander's Analysis

- 15. a. It was unfortunate that the intelligence provided for AO TOM THUMB could not be fully substansiated by 9 RAR on the ground. It seems that this area at that time was being used only as a transit/staging area for small parties. Larger parties undoubtedly moved through the area previously and it had also been used as a supply area some months ago. The transit movement through the area appears a link between the area west of route 2 and the NUI MAY TAO (YS 7490)/ NUI HOT (Y8 6493) areas.
 - b. Elms 274 Regt again returned to a known area of camps in Song Ca area. They were certainly moved from these camps although apparently they had prepared themselves for a fairly long stay in the area. They were prepared to fight to cover their withdrawal only. OP MATTHEW - OP HAT DICH

General

- 1. 9 RAR deployed on OP MATTHEW in AO TOM THUMB (See appendix 6) from the 29 June to 18 July 1969 in accordance with 9 RAR OP 0 15. C Coy was inserted into AO TRANVERSE (See appendix 7) on the 11 July. The battalion was subsequently deployed on OP HAT DICH into AO PORPHRY (See appendix 8) from 18 July to 31 July 1969.
- 2. This summary covers the two operations in detail separately.

OP MATTHEW

Background

- As given in Annex A to 9 RAR OP 0 15, AO TOM THUMB to the EAST of route 2 and the COURTENAY rubber was believed to have been the home of 84 RSG and the BA LONG Province HQ.
- 4. Installations found and documents captured indicated that elements of both these units were located in the area, but the operation failed to locate enemy in large numbers. The evidence was that 84 RSG had moved possibly NORTH out of the given AO.
- The heavy EAST-WEST movement reported by SAS patrols in the area in May/June and the sensor patterns at the same time failed to produce large groups of enemy during the operation. Track patterns and movement whilst difficult to read accurately, because of the rain, indicated that the enemy had moved out of the AO to the N and NE.
- 6. There is no doubt that the area was used by 84 RSG as a maintenance and resupply base, but indications from the age of installations, caches and documents are that the area is no longer logistical base, but rather a transit area.

Enemy Activity

7. This was sparodic and no pattern evolved, indicating that caretaker groups and couriers were mainly using the area. Eight contacts occurred with squad and lesser sized enemy groups. Only one of these contacts occurred in a bunker system (See appendix1&2 for details).

Installations and Caches

- A large number of old camps and caches were located. Besides the normal systems and unoccupied and old workshop and hospital complex was discovered again indicating 84 RSG. There were recently constructed living bunkers in the AO, but these were not predominant.
- 9. Signs of recent occupation from 24 hours in the latter mentioned systems indicated that were nainly used by caretaker and transit personnel.
- 10. No caches of significant size were located. Generally catered for the needs of caretaker groups. The one large weapons cache located at YS 587909 by D Coy was old and obviously a "left over" from 84 RSG elements.

11. Details of installations and caches are contained in appendix 1, 2 and 3 of this annex. See also appendix 6.

Documents

- 12. These were located in camps and caches and were dated from 1962 to 1969. Some details are given below:
 - a. Documents found by B Coy at YS 567916 were undated nut obviously 6 to 12 months old. They identified 84 RSG.
 - b. Documents located by D Coy at YS 559893 included a report by the 2IC of D445 MF Bn on the attack on DAT DO 14-15 May 69.
 - c. Other documents from YS 559893 gave dispositions and strengths of RF/PF units from BARIA to VUNG TAU. It is possible that the BA LONG Province HQ had been located in this area, but no concrete evidence was found to substantiate this.

Tracks

13. Numerous trails were located, the general pattern of movement appeared to be SOUTH to NORTH, whilst WEST to EAST movement was also observed. Newly cut tracks were found indicating that the enemy in the area were avoiding contact. Track details are contained in appendix 3 and 6.

Redeployment

- 14. On the 4 July 69 C Coy was inserted to the EAST of the SONG RAI river to investigate a report by a SAS patrol of 50 VC and a possible enemy installation at YS 622865. Signs of recent movement was detected but no base camp was located.
- 15. C Coy on 11 July was then redeployed into AO TRANSVERSE, reacting to information agained from a HOI CHANH. The rallier proffered information on the location of elements of 84 RSG and their caches. The information proved to be reliable and assa result the following were located:
 - a. Two caches in the area YS 4389.
 - b. Two detainees, one male and one female, both working for 84 RSG. (See appendix 5).
- 16. C Coy also found at YS 442875 a village, unmarked on the map which contained 25 women, about 100 children and 10 houses. DUC THANH authorities were notified and arranged re-settlement. While it was not firmly established, there is no doubt that these illegal squatters were linked with 84 RSG.
- 17. On the 13 July 69 A Coy was extracted from OA TOM THUMB and inserted into AO TAMUNDRA on reaction to a SAS patrol which reported enemy movement NORTH EAST SOUTH WEST along a track system and an occupied bunker complex in the vicinity of YS 352902. The information was accurate and A Coy had two contacts before entering the installations which had been vacated a few hours earlier. Elements of 274 Regt were identified.

Topography

18. The topography in AO TOM THUMB conforms accurately with the picto map and the information contained in Annex A to OP 0 15.

/3.

19. The going generally was very slow and difficult because of the thick secondary growth. Whilst all perennial streams were obstacles, the SONG RAI was the only stream not fordable. As predicted the low areas to the EAST of the AO and WEST of the SONG RAI were waterlogged.

Enemy Forces

20. Details of enemy losses are contained in appendix 4.

Conclusions

- 21. Whilst installations and cache systems were located and indicated the presence of 84 RSG it is apparent that the area of AO TOM THUMB particularly the area of the SUOI LE and NUI BE MOI have been vacated by this unit. Signs indicate that the en has moved possibly NORTH and EAST into NUI HOT area.
- 22. The area around CAM MY in the vicinity of YS 460 920 support the VC by providing foodstuffs, in particular rice. The VIET COUNG YS 4390 is a rice cache area. The illegal squatters in AO TRANSVERSE do support the VC and should be resettled and their farmlets destroyed.

AO PORPHRY - OP HAT DICH

Background

- 23. 9 RAR deployed into AO PORPHRY on information that HQ 274 Regt was located with at least one battalion along the line of the SUOI CA. This information was substantiated by A Coys contacts in the area prior to the battalion deployment.
- As A, B, and C Coys patrolled towards the SUOI CA signs and contacts indicated that enemy base locations would be found in the area. All Coys did locate large well constructed base installations along the SUOI CA. (See appendix 1 and 2 for details). These systems were occupied by 274 Regt, but no detailed identification was made.

Enemy Activity

This was confined to two localities. The area of A Coys initial deployment in the vicinity of YS 352902 and the area NORTH and SOUTH of the SUOI CA from the 36 to 39 EASTING. D Coy operating in the NW portion of the AO made no contact and saw little sign of recent enemy activity. The en moved on tracks in this area and contacts occurred on tracks leading into and out of the major installations.

Installations

As mentioned the most notable systems were found along the SUOI CA and in these instances these systems were occupied. The major camps were located at YS 389906, YS 372885, YS 367891 and YS 365888. These systems were new, very large and well constructed. Where occupied the enemy was prepared to fight with lay back parties to cover the withdrawal of men and material.

Tracks

27. Details on tracks are contained in Appendix 3 to this

Documents

28. Few documents were recovered however what were captured indicated the enemy generally as 274 Regt. The only sub-unit identified was 75 MM RR Coy (C17) at YS 389907.

En losses

29. Details of en equipment captured is given in appendix 4.

Conclusions

- 30. The enemy suffered only minor losses as a result of the operation. In line with the pattern of en activity throughout the province the enemy avoided contact and in all cases chose to withdraw.
- 31. The movement patterns from these installations suggest that 274 Regt withdrew to its alternative base area in the vicinity of the BINH SON rubber.
