

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

Aim

1. To instruct selected students in the art of shooting coaching.

Scope

2. Students will be instructed in the art of coaching as mainly applicable to the rifle but with period also on the MG. The process of training the battle shot will be introduced with emphasis on continuation training as laid down for an Infantry field force unit.

Objectives

3. A rifle coach to be satisfactory should be a battle shot. He must be able to:
 - a. Analyse a firer's target and advise on how the firer's result can be improved.
 - b. Explain the theory of the group and theory of small arms fire and apply that theory in a practical shooting situation.
 - c. Conduct an efficient range practice in accordance with current regulations.
 - d. Explain the process of improved shooting training.

Training Time

4. Five days are available for the course. As 40 students are anticipated it is intended to conduct two separate courses for 20 students each of twenty three 40 minute periods.



10. Coys are to take progressive action to ensure medical requirements are complete in respect of:-
- a. Vaccinations and inoculations.
 - b. Medical examinations.
 - c. Medical documents, F Med 4 and F Med 5.
 - d. International Health Certificates.
 - e. Issue of first field dressings.
11. Medical requirements are to be co-ordinated through the BN RAP.

Dental

12. Coys are to ensure that all soldiers are dentally fit. This is to be done progressively under the system detailed in Unit Routine Orders.

'Q' MATTERS

Unit Maintenance Scaling

13. The QM is responsible for computing the Battalion entitlement for a 3 days maintenance scaling of:-
- a. Spare parts for repair of equipment by unit tradesmen.
 - b. Expendable stores including oils, greases, batteries and stationery.
 - c. Clothing, necessaries and personal equipment.

POL

14. The normal entitlement of one jerrycan per vehicle applies and is to accompany each vehicle.

Clothing and Personal Equipment

15. The entitlement for clothing, necessaries and personal equipment is to be in accordance with authorised block scale and equipment table. DP1 check list Annex 'B' summarises this requirement.
16. Prior to movement all equipment and clothing is to be serviceable. Normal replacement system will apply and items normally maintained by soldiers will be paid for.

.../3.

Cots Folding and Mattress Fibre

17. The QM is to prepare indents for these items on the scale of one per soldier. These indents are to be held by the QM.

Vehicles and Equipment

18. There will be no wholesale replacement of vehicles or equipment prior to movement. Coys are to ensure that vehicles, equipment and stores are maintained at the highest possible standard. Immediate action is to be taken for the repair or replacement of unserviceable vehicles or equipment. Under no circumstances are unserviceable items to be allowed to accumulate.

Unit Stores and Equipment

19. The Battalion entitlement for stores and equipment is being computed and Coy allocations will be advised in the near future.

Technical Inspections

20. Coys are to ensure that instructions issued for the maintenance of weapons are complied with.

21. The Tpt Offr/NCO is to arrange for regular inspections of all Battalion vehicles. Where necessary 1045 action is to be instituted immediately.

Accommodation Stores

22. The QM is to prepare indents for functional accommodation stores.

Ammunition

23. QM is to prepare indents for first line ammunition and will determine details required for inclusion in Unit Movement Data Tables from 2 BOD. First line ammunition for personal weapons is to be carried on the man for light scale only. Standard scale fully packed.

Packing Unit War Equipment

24. Coys are to hold sufficient packing materials to enable them to conduct trial packing exercises. From these exercises Coys are to prepare case contents list and complete all case markings.

25. Standard cases are available on indent and are to be used where possible. Details are contained at Annex 'C'.

26. Cases etc are to be marked with the unit serial number and colour bars. Details Annex 'A'.

Unit Staff Tables

27. Staff Tables in the form of Unit Movement Data Tables are being prepared by Bn HQ. Coys are required to provide information for the compilation of these tables by 20 and 26.

28. Staff Tables are being prepared for Standard and light scale.

29. Coys are to conduct trial vehicle loading for both scales. Load lists are to be prepared.

Stores Accounting

30. 1 RAR is to operate on AAF E2/E2C for war equipment. Entitlement is being computed and operational requirements are to be transferred to Part 1 Account.

31. Part 2 Account on AAF E2/E2C is to contain those items held for use in Australia and which will not accompany 1 RAR on operations.
32. AAFs E2/E2C are to be raised by the QM for the Coy Gp nominated for contingency plans.
33. To prepare for transfer to the Coy nominated in the Contingency Plan Transfer Vouchers AF G1033 (7 copies) supported by a schedule (AAF F19) will be raised showing items only - quantities to be left blank until receipt of Warning Order.

ACTION ON RECEIPT OF WARNING ORDER

General

34. This section details actions to be implemented on receipt of the Warning Order. Many of these actions can be carried out progressively and wherever possible action is to commence now.

Commanders Diary

35. IO is to ensure diary commences on receipt of Warning Order.

Deficiencies

36. Coys are to advise deficiencies by rank, trade and duty or posting.

Living Out Members

37. On receipt of Warning Order approvals to "live out" are cancelled.

Personal Particulars

38. A personal particulars preforma as per Annex 'D' is to be completed for each soldier and held with his personal documents.

Medical

39. International Health Certificate. The RMO is to ensure that International Health Certificates are held for every member of the battalion. He is also to hold a unused reserve of 100 Certificates. Entries in the International Health Certificate are to be made progressively by the Medical Officer, signed and stamped and dated.

40. On receipt of Warning Order the RMO is to check AAF Med 4 and 5 and complete inoculations and vaccinations which are not current. He is also to carry out a further medical examination of all personnel to determine their fitness for overseas travel. This examination will be recorded in the members medical documents.

Records Subject to Variation

41. The following records are to be checked progressively with the soldier and again on receipt of the Warning Order.
- a. Particulars of Next of Kin.
 - b. Will,
 - c. Restrictions regarding employment.
 - d. AHBS Form 8.

42. Particulars of check and date are to be included in the soldiers personal documents.

Identity Cards

43. The provisions of 1 RAR Memo "Procedure for Issue, Registration and Withdrawal of Identification Cards" of 14 Sep 66 apply.

44. The IO is to ensure sufficient cards are held for the complete Bn. Plus a reserve of 100 cards.

Family Registration

45. Attached at Annex 'E' is the proforma to be completed by all married soldiers. Coys are to ensure all married soldiers complete this form and are to hold the proforma until receipt of the Warning Order.

46. On receipt of the Warning Order, Coys are to check forms and forward them complete to Bn HQ, who will arrange for their safe hand despatch to A Branch E Comd.

Financial Matters

47. Regimental and Mess Funds. The policy for transfer of funds will be decided at the time of Issue of the Warning Order.

Pay and Other Cash Advances

48. The Adjt is responsible for ensuring that all cash advance or petty cash advance is acquitted with the issuing cash office.

Accountable Forms

49. Accountable forms with the exception of Requisition for Cash (WF 123), are to be returned to the Adjt who will arrange for their return to the Command Paymaster under cover of a Schedule prepared in duplicate.

Postage Stamps

50. Adjutant to arrange for stamp holdings to be refunded to the Command Paymaster.

Leave

51. When sufficient time is available after receipt of the Warning Order, up to seven (7) days pre-embarkation leave may be granted. This leave is not to be counted against ARL credit nor entered in leave records.

52. Soldiers in key postings or where excess travelling time is involved may be granted approval to travel by air.

Unit Movement

53. Unit Movement Data Tables are to be checked immediately on issue of the Warning Order and forwarded to higher authority within 24 hrs.

Stores Accounts

54. If Contingency Plan involves a Coy Gp of 1 RAR then action will be taken to complete transfer procedure.

Part 2 Ledger

55. Part 2 of 1 RAR Ledger and all stores involved are to be left in present location for finalisation by Peace Increment and any additional staff provided by HQ Liverpool Area.

Unit Equipping

56. There should be no deficiencies at this stage. The QM is to arrange for the drawing of full unit war equipment.

Repairs to Vehicles and Equipment

57. On and from the issue of the Warning Order any vehicle which cannot be repaired to be available for movement is to be subject of 114 action. QM is then to arrange for replacement.

Inspection of Vehicles and Technical Equipment

58. This is to be carried out progressively. All vehicles and technical equipment are to be subject to inspection prior to movement as arranged by the QM.

Stores Held Surplus to TET

59. 1 RAR is NOT to hold stores surplus to TET. Coys which require stores for specific activities are to arrange for their issue on F1A through the QM.

Accommodation


60. On issue of Warning Order all items on the Register of Assets become the responsibility of the Peace Increment or Camp Staff Officer as directed.

Married Quarters

61. Families of members moving overseas are permitted to remain in the married quarters which they occupy.

Disposal of Privately Owned Motor Vehicles

62. The Army will not accept any responsibility for storage of privately owned vehicles. Owners are responsible for the removal of vehicles from Barracks area prior to departure.

MARKING OF CLOTHING AND EQUIPMENT

Personal Military Clothing and Necessaries

1. The scale is as laid down in the DP1 Check List.
2. All items are to be clearly and indelibly marked on the inside with the owners' Army Number, Initials and Surname only. Special forms of marking apply to:-
 - a. 1937 Pattern Pack - Appendix 3.
 - b. Bag Kit Universal - Appendix 3.
3. Where possible items are to be crated in standard crates. If this is not possible they will be bundled and labels attached. Unit and sub-unit markings apply. In addition sub-unit package number and total weight in pounds is to be marked.
4. Unit serial number, unit and sub-unit colour bars and method of marking is shown at Appendix 1.

Case Numbering

5. For ease of reference to crates a letter prefix is to be used before the package number. Prefix allotted shown in Appendix 1.

Method of Case and Bundle Marking

6. At least two distinguishing marks are to be used on each case, crate or bundle; One on the end and one on one side.
7. Articles not cased or otherwise impossible to be marked are to have wired to them wooden plates measuring 6" x 4" with appropriate markings painted on both sides.
8. All existing markings particularly those containing unit titles are to be erased.
9. Sample case marking Appendix 2.
10. Stencils and paint for marking are to be obtained through the QM.

Codewords, Nicknames, Changing frequency and Closing down.

Codeword. A single word used for security purposes only. It is only transmitted over the air in special circumstances.

Nickname. Consists of two words neither of which must be a colour. They can be transmitted over the air only once and must not be used a second time. They must not be used to identify units or persons.

They are used for the following communications drills:

Changing frequency
Changing system
Closing down
Imposing radio silence on unit nets
Break radio silence on unit nets
Lifting radio silence on unit nets

Changing frequency

Frequency changes are of two kinds:-

Security
Technical and Tactical

Security changes are large scale pre-arranged changes intended to deceive the enemy. All details are contained in the preliminary instructions and no warning transmission is made over the air.

Technical and Tactical changes are made due to the changing tactical situation and/or changes in radio working conditions. Each frequency is given a NICKNAME. Example:

Control : Hullo all stations this is O Brazen Hussy over

- 1 : One Brazen Hussy over
- 2 : Two Brazen Hussy over
- 3 : Three Brazen Hussy over

Control : Zero Brazen Hussy out

Closing Down

Where possible this will normally be done by secure means. If this is not possible then the same procedure will be used as for changing frequency using a Nickname.

Types of Messages.

They are:-

The Unregistered Message

This is a message, the construction of which consists essentially of a CALL - TEXT - ENDING. It is not normally written on a message form.

Formal Message

A message which must be written on a message form and signed by the originator. They are processed and registered in a Commcen.

Offer.

An offer is a short transmission made to warn the station(s) concerned that a message follows.

Short U.R. message.

A message lasting less than a half minute.

Example of a short U.R. being sent without an offer:-

- 1 : Hullo two this is one Information as requested has been sent over
- 2 : Two roger out

When a short U.R. is offered it may take one of the following forms:-

The operator does not need to write the message down.

Control : Hullo one this is zero over

1 : One send over

Control : Zero Request granted over

1 : One roger out

Must write the message down.

3 : Hullo zero this is three message over

Control : Zero send over

3 : Three Enemy at Grid 246453 and Grid 240460 over

Control: Zero roger out

To indicate that orders are about to be given.

Control : Hullo four this is zero orders over

4 : Four wait out (sends for a responsible officer)

4 : Hullo zero this is four send over

To indicate the use of a special proforma.

Control : Hullo three this is zero MORTREP over

3 : Three send over

Long U.R. Message

A long message is one which takes longer than 30 seconds to transmit. It will always be offered. It is split into portions, each lasting approximately 30 seconds. At the end of each portion a receiving operator will, if necessary, ask for and obtain repetitions. After receipts have been given for a portion the sender will pause for five seconds before continuing with the next portion. This allows any other

station on the net to break in with amore urgent message.

Verification

At times it is necessary for an officer (addressee) to query the meaning of a portion of a message which does not make sense to him. This is done by asking the sending station to verify with the originator that the portion of the message in question is in fact correct or otherwise. This must not be confused with the procedure for asking for a repetition. Remember you ask for a repetition when you have missed something, but you only ask for a verification when you are in doubt as to the meaning of the message.

Example: Original message is correct.

(the addressee consults his map, finds that the position does not make sense, and tells the operator to request a verification)

Cancellations and Acknowledgements

If a sender wishes to cancel a message before he has finished sending it, he uses the proword "Cancel".

If he wishes to cancel a message sent some time previously he makes a reference to the transmission in question.

It is often necessary to ensure that information passing between two stations on a net is brought to the attention of other stations on the same net. This is done by using the proword "Acknowledge".

Example: Immediate Acknowledgement.

Control : Zero roger OUT TO YOU Hullo one and three this is zero
acknowledge over

1 : One no over (indicating message not received)

Control : Zero callsign two reports bridge blown no signs of enemy over

Appointment Titles

These titles are authorised only for use on Army and/or Royal Air Force links. They are not to be used in communications to Royal Navy authorities, or when communicating direct to a Naval station on a joint net.

The title designates the senior representative or appointment holder of that branch of the headquarters or unit concerned. The title is not to be qualified in any way except:-

To indicate junior appointments, 'minor' may be added, e.g. 'Sunray Minor' - 2IC
When it is necessary to distinguish between similar appointment holders of different formations, 'my', 'your', 'his', 'our', or 'their' may be used before the title e.g. 'my Pronto', 'your Watchdog'.

The address group or callsign may follow the title e.g. 'Starlight address group WMA' -- The medical representative whose headquarters has the address group WMA.

When confusion is likely between similar appointment holders of different services, one of the following may be used before the title;

- Sea - (Royal Navy)
- Land - (Army)
- Air - (Royal Air Force)

e.g. Air Acorn - RAF intelligence officer.

Misuses.

One title is not to be used to qualify another or as an adjective. For example the Officer Commanding a (Field) Squadron of the RAF Regiment

would be 'Sunray' in respect of his unit, or 'Fireguard' if required to act as an adviser at a headquarters; 'Sunray Fireguard' or 'Fireguard Unit' would not be used.

There is no security value in talking of tanks as 'Ironsides', infantry as 'Foxhounds', artillery support as 'Shelldrake support' or in asking for 'Starlight' when medical aid is required. These are examples of typical misuses of the titles, that stem from a misunderstanding of their purposes and give a false sense of security, which may lead to disastrous results.

A time signal may be sent out periodically by control, or a substation may request a time check using the proword "Send Time".

The initiating station announces "Time Signal" followed by the time and then, on the minute, the word "NOW".

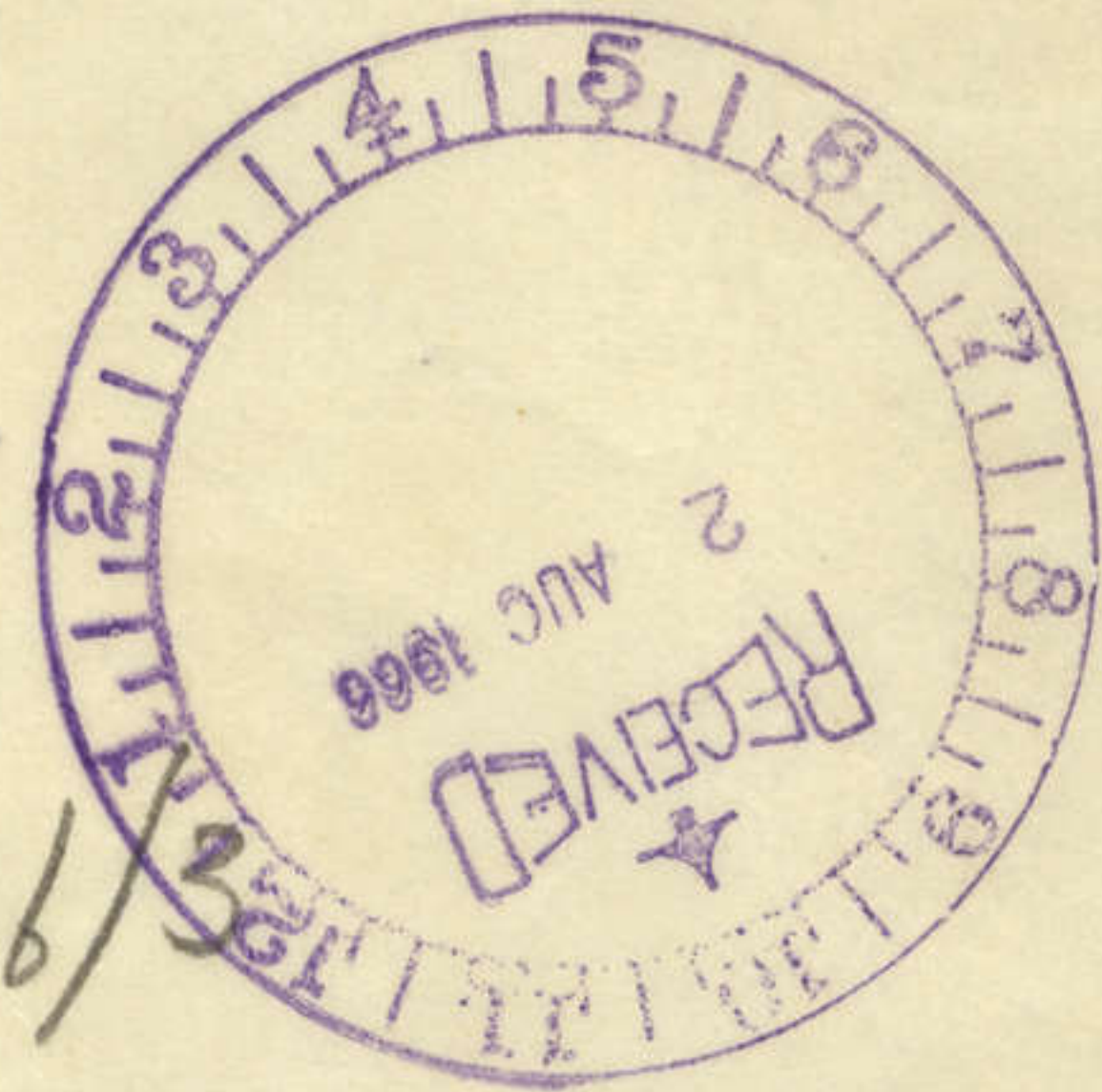

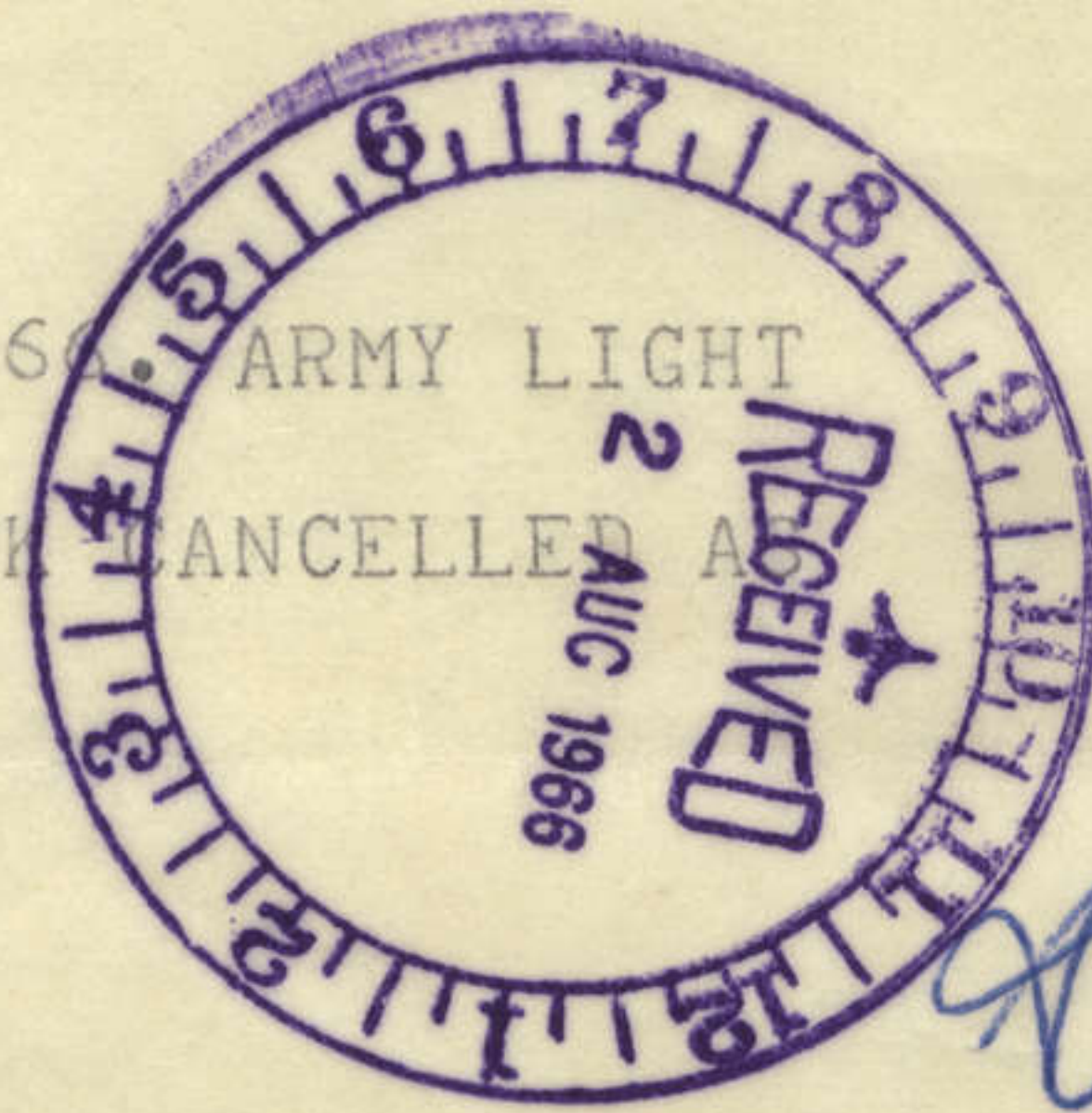

PREPARATION AND MOUNTING INSTRUCTION
FOR
OPERATIONS

General

1. This instruction is designed to provide sufficient information to enable 1 RAR to complete its preparation for mounting operations overseas.
2. The provisions of this instruction are to be implemented without delay.
3. As far as possible this instruction is to apply for Battalion Exercises.

'A' MATTERSEligibility for Service

4. The following conditions for overseas service apply. Soldiers
 - a. Must be FE and dentally fit.
 - b. Have reached the age of:-
 - (1) 19 years - for service in an operational area;
 - (2) 18 years - for service in a non-operational area.
 - c. Be re-engaged in advance if residual service at the time of embarkation/emplanement is less than that prescribed for the particular operation. Normally minimum residual service required is six months

Nominal Rolls

5. Coys are to maintain a nominal roll of those ineligible for overseas service. This roll is to show number, rank, name, trade, duty or posting and reason for ineligibility. Reasons for ineligibility are:-
 - a. Residual Service.
 - b. Medical.
 - c. Under age.
 - d. Compassionate.
6. A copy is to be forwarded to Bn HQ as soon as possible and Coys are responsible for ensuring bn and Coy records are kept up to date. In any case records are to be reconciled as at 28 of each month.
7. Coys are also to maintain a list of personnel deficiencies by rank, trade and duty or posting. This list is to be reconciled in the same manner as the ineligibles roll.
