**PART 3****COMMANDERS DIARIES  
INSTRUCTIONS****AIM**

1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organization and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

**GENERAL**

2. *Entries are to be made daily on AF C 2118 (Adapted) each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.*
3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties (Australia)", Chapter 2, Section 12.

**RESPONSIBILITY****During Non-operational Periods**

4. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled by commanders of all formations.

**During Operational Periods (1)**

5. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled in duplicate by:
  - a. Commanders of all formations.
  - b. Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a brigadier or above.
  - c. Heads of services not below the rank of lieutenant colonel.
  - d. Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
  - e. Unit commanders.
  - f. Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

**COMPILATION**

6. Both original and duplicate copies are to consist of:
  - a. Cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted).
  - b. Index as printed on cover.
  - c. Narrative (AF C 2118) (Adapted).
  - d. Annexes as shown in the Index.
7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes are to be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer is to be included.
8. The annexes are to be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an annex NII will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters, starting at B.

## COMMANDERS DIARIES

## DISPOSAL

13. **Original Commander's Diary.** This is to be forwarded monthly, unless otherwise ordered, by the seventh day of the succeeding month direct to AHQ.

14. **Duplicate Commander's Diary.** This must be clearly marked as a duplicate. It is to be sent separately from the original to AHQ one month after the original has been despatched but not before the former has been acknowledged.

15. When overseas, both copies of diaries are to be sent through the Army Records organization in the overseas theatre but at different times.

16. **TOP SECRET Supplementary Diaries.**

a. The documents referred to in Paragraph 9 together with a list of them made out on AF C 2118 (Adapted) must be placed in separate cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted). All details must be filled in and the cover clearly marked in red: "ANNEX Z — OFFICER ONLY". It may be convenient to group the papers by appendices.

b. Supplementary diaries must be forwarded under the normal rules for TOP SECRET correspondence, to AHQ. The inner envelope must be plainly marked:

a. Recording. The taking of Paludrine and Dapsone tablets is to be supervised by an officer or NCO and is to be recorded in the sub-unit roll book. The morning entry is to show the taking of both dapsone and paludrine.


b. Dress. Between 1900hrs and 0500hrs within the Vung Tau area, all members of the Australian and NZ Armies are to be dressed in shirts (not necessarily long sleeved) long trousers, socks and boots or shoes. Shirts must be worn should the hours of darkness extend beyond the nominated limits.

c. Showering. Showering is not permitted between 1900 hrs and 0500hrs, unless in a mosquito proof shower block.

d. Mosquito Nets. Mosquito nets are to be used by all personnel sleeping between 1900hrs and 0600hrs. Nets are to be erected in such a manner as to prevent contact between the body and the net.

e. Other Areas. When members of 1 ALSG visit other areas of RVN, they are to observe any additional local malarial precautions. In 1 ATF area long shirt sleeves buttoned at the wrist are required during the hours of darkness. At all times the taking of malarial suppressives in accordance with this instruction is to continue. The dress instruction stated in sub-paragraph b above, are the minimum requirement for any part of RVN.

1. Advice has been received from Australia that the number of articles damaged in transit is increasing, caused mainly by poor packaging. Greater care in the packaging of fragile goods will avoid disappointment to the recipient and financial loss to the sender.

2. PMG Department has advised that it will not consider claims for compensation where the packaging is inadequate, even though the parcel is registered.

3. Australian FPOs are not to register parcels, unless according to the declaration of contents, they conform reasonably to the conditions set out in Section 2 of the Post Office Guide.

4. This is to be republished in unit routine orders quarterly.

RO 37 MAIL COLLECTION - AUST FPO 3

1. All mail passes previously issued by Aust FPO 3, are hereby cancelled.

2. With effect from 10 Feb 69 only personnel in possession of a mail pass will be permitted to collect mail, other than personal mail, from Aust FPO 3.

3. There are two mail passes available as follows:

a. Form A.

To be held by the CO/OC, or his representative, and issued to a member of the unit to collect ordinary mail at irregular intervals.

b. Form B.

To be issued to a specific member of a unit. It is designed to permit the nominated member to pick up ordinary mail and/or registered etc mail.

- c. It is suggested that one Form A pass, and no more than two Form B passes, be held by each unit.
4. Units authorising members to collect registered mail are to ensure that a AB-426, Postal Orderlies Receipt Book for Registered Articles and Parcels, is maintained. This book is to be available for inspection when required.
5. Mail passes, available from Aust FPO 3, are to be completed in duplicate, both copies to be returned to Aust FPO 3 for Date/Stamp impression. One copy is returned to the unit, and the other retained by Aust FPO 3. No mail pass is valid without the Aust FPO 3 Date/Stamp impression thereon.
6. It is anticipated that the pro-forma type passes initially issued will be withdrawn and a card issued as soon as printing is completed.

#### RO 38 VIETNAMESE BAKERIES

1. A hygiene inspection of the AN PHONG and BINH DINH Bakeries was carried out on 22 Jan 69. The results of the inspection are as follows:
  - a. AN PHONG. The conditions of hygiene were found to be below the required standard. The bakery is now out of bounds to all 1 ALSG units.
  - b. BINH DINH. A high standard of hygiene now exists at this bakery. The bakery is inspected regularly by the American Veterinary Service Section to ensure that the present standard of hygiene is maintained. The bakery, also known as the VIET HUNG ELECTRA Bakery, is in bounds to all 1 ALSG units.

#### RO 39 1 ALSG SWIMMING BEACH - USE AND TIMINGS

1. The 1 ALSG Surf Beach is open for general use between 0800 hrs and 1800 hrs daily.
2. Amenities and Welfare unit is to ensure that the beach is cleared of all personnel before the Beach Gate is secured.
3. The Beachmaster may restrict swimming for any period when dangerous swimming conditions apply.
4. At all times when swimming is restricted, a black flag will be clearly displayed at the top of the Beach Tower and a sign will be exhibited at the main Beach Gate.
5. At all times other than para 4 above, red and yellow flags will indicate the approved swimming area.
6. Swimmers are not to swim outside the area defined by the beach flags.
7. The surfboard and boating areas will also be marked.

#### RO 40 USE OF BEACH AREA BY GO-KARTS

1. GO-KARTS may only use that section of the beach which is between small beach gate and the northern extremity of the perimeter wire.

2. GO-KARTS are not to race or practise on any area south of the small beach gate (opposite HQ/RAAF Barbecue sites).

RO 41 CIVILIAN LABOUR - GIFTS

1. For the purpose of this order, gifts include:-

a. Bonafide gifts purchased from 2AFCU or US PX sources not exceeding ten dollars(US \$10.00) in value.

b. Newspapers, books, periodicals, magazines etc.

2. For security reasons, none of the above articles may be carried through the West Gate Guard checkpoint by civilian employees. The procedure to be adopted if a gift is to be given to a civilian employee is:-

a. Donor ascertains the employees' correct name and AMF pass number.

b. The name, pass number, unit and contents is endorsed upon the gift's wrapper.

c. An officer from the unit certifies that the parcel contains no classified material.

d. The parcel is then delivered to the Civil Labour Office who will pass the gift to the employee after gate clearance.

RO 42 MAIL TO AUSTRALIA

On the top right hand corner of the envelope will be written the word 'free'. Name No Rank and Unit postal address will be written on the back of the envelope.

RO 43 PARCELS

1. The unit postal clerk will be available in the ord room from 0830 hrs to 1000 hrs daily for receipt of outgoing parcels.

2. Parcels are not to be left on the postal desk when the clerk is absent at other times during the day.

3. Troop clerks are to collect outgoing parcels from troop members who are unable to arrange dispatch personally during the above timings due to works.







WELL BORING REPORT

SUMMARY

1. Well 20: sited SE from 21 Sp Tp stores yard, was completed and handed over to DCRE. Well 21, E from 110 Sig Sqn transmitter shed was abandoned. Well 22 at Heavyweight was completed and is producing. The two rigs are presently set up on sites 23 and 24, adjacent to site 20.

Well No 20: Site SE from 21 Sp Tp stores yard.

2. In late January the well was cased to 90 ft with screening from 90 ft to 112 ft depth. Pump tests were carried out giving a 900 gph return and the well was blown for three days before being handed over to DCRE.

Well No 21: Site E from 110 Sig Sqn Transmitter shed

3. Work at this site was held up for two days when the stay braces bent and broke during erection. Basalt was struck at 25 ft. At depth 30 ft the rig had to be moved and the hole restarted. A small section of the bailer non-return valve had broken off in the hole and was preventing the bit from striking the rock.

4. The second hole went down four feet from the first. At 22 Ft depth the bit began veering of line when it struck a basalt layer, probably a boulder. The hole was gravel pumped in an attempt to break into the rock but no impression was made. The rig was resited in the same area.

5. At the third site basalt was found at 17 ft on the first days drilling. A further 14 days drilling advanced the hole to a depth of 27 ft, still in basalt. Time was lost continually through subsidence as well as the hardness of the rock. The hole was abandoned.

Well No 22: Site at Heavyweight.

6. In four days drilling was stopped at a depth of 59 ft in basalt. Broken rock was encountered from 47 ft to 56 ft, where the basalt commenced. A water layer encountered at 52 ft gave a yield of 20 gpm on bailer test. The well was cased to 43 ft and screened from 43 ft to 59 ft. A local pattern airlift pump was installed driven by a 6 cfm compressor supplied by the unit. Production from this was 250 gph when the well was handed over.

Well No 23: Site SE from 21 Sp Tp store yard

7. The rig was spudded in on 26 Feb 69. Casing was found necessary after moving sand was encountered at 16 ft and 50 ft. River gravel was found at 57 ft and basalt at 58 ft. Drilling was continuing in rock at 61 ft on 28 Feb 69.

Well No 24: Site adjacent to Well 23

8. The rig was spudded in on 28 Feb 69 and reached a depth of 12 ft in blue clay on that day.
