PART I G MATTERS

Present Location

I. A Sec I Topo Svy Tp remains in location at YS4345667I.

Enemy Contacts

2. There were no enemy contacts during the reporting period either at the base camp or whilst engaged on survey operations.

Tasks

- Were fully employed during the reporting period, however only two tasks were printed due to technical and resupply difficulties with the silkscreen press.
 - A summary of major tasks undertaken is given in Annex A and a description of tasks commenced during the reporting period given in Annex B.

Silkscreen Printing

During the reporting period only 760 impressions were taken from the silkscreen press. This delay was initially due to lack of Ulano film and then due to technical difficulties with the press. The ink was drying too rapidly on the screen and despite all efforts the trouble persisted. These difficulties are the subject of correspondence with D Survey and R COLLIE AND SONS Ltd. Resupply will be covered more fully under Q (para 22)
