# COMMANDERS DIARIES INSTRUCTIONS

### AIM

1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organization and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

### GENERAL

2. Entries are to be made daily on AF C 2118 (Adapted) each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.
3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties (Australia)", Chapter 2, Section 12.

### RESPONSIBILITY

#### During Non-operational Periods

4. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled by commanders of all formations.

#### During Operational Periods (1)

5. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled in duplicate by:
  - a. Commanders of all formations.
  - b. Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a brigadier or above.
  - c. Heads of services not below the rank of lieutenant colonel.
  - d. Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
  - e. Unit commanders.
  - f. Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

### COMPILATION

6. Both original and duplicate copies are to consist of:
  - a. Cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted).
  - b. Index as printed on cover.
  - c. Narrative (AF C 2118) (Adapted).
  - d. Annexes as shown in the Index.
7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes are to be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer is to be included.
8. The annexes are to be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an annex, NIL will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters, starting at B.

## DISPOSAL

13. **Original Commander's Diary.** This is to be forwarded monthly, unless otherwise ordered, by the seventh day of the succeeding month direct to AHQ.

14. **Duplicate Commander's Diary.** This must be clearly marked as a duplicate. It is to be sent separately from the original to AHQ one month after the original has been despatched but not before the former has been acknowledged.

15. When overseas, both copies of diaries are to be sent through the Army Records organization in the overseas theatre but at different times.

16. **TOP SECRET Supplementary Diaries.**

a. The documents referred to in Paragraph 9 together with a list of them made out on AF C 2118 (Adapted) must be placed in separate cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted). All details must be filled in and the cover clearly marked in red: "ANNEX Z — OFFICER ONLY". It may be convenient to group the papers by appendices.

b. Supplementary diaries must be forwarded under the normal rules for TOP SECRET correspondence, to AHQ. The inner envelope must be plainly marked:

c. The duplicate supplementary diaries must be despatched as shown in Paragraph 14 as soon as receipt of the original has been acknowledged.

NOTICES.

1. R&R and R&C

a. R&R

It is to be pointed out to all soldiers of the unit that R&R to centres allotted are at a premium. Those members of the unit who make application for R&R are expected to take the vacancy allocated on the dates granted by HQ 1 ALSG. Whilst squadron headquarters are aware that cancellations must occur because of welfare problems, which cannot be anticipated, all troops are to be told that, if they are granted a vacancy for an R&R centre, and they decide to change their mind at the last moment, the unit loses this vacancy and it is given to another formation within the theatre. Consequently they are not only causing extra work to the unit HQ, HQ 1 ALSG and HQ AFV but they are causing the loss of an allocation to the unit which will not be remade. Troop commanders and troop NCO's are requested to point out the following pertinent points for soldiers applying for R&R.

- a. That credits showing in the soldiers paybook are adequate to cover his needs.
- b. If proceeding to TAIPEH he must have 2 passport photographs and pass to Sqn HQ together with 200 piastre. He will then be required to complete an application for visa which is obtainable from Sqn HQ orderly room.
- c. When the soldier has been granted a vacancy at a R&R centre, his journey to SAIGON will be arranged by Sqn HQ and a copy of the Movement Order (AAF A19) is passed to the soldiers troop. This in effect is his plane ticket to SAIGON. He is required to hand this to RAAF Movements at "Charlie Ramp" Vung Tau on the date/time of travel. On arrival SAIGON he is taken to HQ AFV and reports to R&R Sgt Clerk at HQ AFV (HQ Coy) orderly room for further instructions. At least 24 hours prior to movement the soldier is to report to the unit pay representative to finalize pay requirement. The soldier is required to carry a current IHC and his Identity Card at all times whilst on R&R. On return from R&R the soldier is allowed a maximum weight of 45 lbs in luggage.

Personal weapons, knives etc are not to be taken to R&C centre Vung Tau. They are to be secured in the unit Q Store.

192. REMITTANCES OF CASH AND POSTAL ORDERS TO AUSTRALIA

- 1. Members wishing to remit sums of \$100 Aust or more to a person in Australia are to obtain the written approval of their CO or OC.
- 2. Paymasters and their staff are not to accept applications for remittances of \$100 Aust or more to a person in Australia without sighting the written approval of the CO or OC of the member.
- 3. Members wishing to purchase postal orders to the amount of \$100 Aust or more in any one transaction are to obtain the written approval of their CO or OC.
- 4. Members of Postal Units are not to supply postal orders to the amount of \$100 Aust or more to members of AFV without first sighting the written approval of the CO or OC.

193. RUPTURED CARTRIDGE CASES - M16/M16A1 RIFLES

- 1. Recent reports of ruptured cases with the M16/M16A1 rifles indicate the ruptures could have resulted from water trapped in the barrel.



2. Extensive tests indicate that M16A1 (M16) rifles exposed to rain or fording operations trapped water in the bore and, subsequently, experienced cartridge case ruptures when fired, due to over-pressure. This occurred even though muzzles were depressed below the horizontal to drain water before firing. Conclusions of tests stated:

- a. Surface tension and capillary action will retain sufficient water in the barrel of an M16A1 (M16) rifle to cause overpressure when weapon is fired.
- b. Weapons of .25 cal. or larger do not retain water in the bore as do those of small calibre.
- c. Water can only be removed from the M16A1 (M16) barrel bore (loaded weapon) by depressing the muzzle below the horizontal and partially retracting the cartridge from the chamber.

3. All users of M16/M16A1 rifles are to be advised of this potential hazard.

#### NOTICES.

#### 1. MAIL CLEARANCE & PICKUP

##### General

1. Mail is cleared from 1 ALSG 2400 hrs daily except Saturday when it is cleared at 1600 hrs.
2. Mail is cleared from 17 Const Sqn mail box at 1600 hrs daily except Sat (1500 hrs) and Sunday (not cleared).
3. Members with letters which they require to reach their destination in the shortest possible time which do not reach the squadron mail box at the times stated may post them directly into the Post Office. It is stressed however that the Post Office can handle only a limited amount of such mail as it has to be stamped "Forces Concession" and bundled by states - a task which unit postal clerks perform for the bulk of the mail. On week nights (Mon to Fri inclusive) members may check at the picquet hut to see if there is a vehicle which may take the letter to the Post Office.

4. A box will be placed in the picquet hut for mail written Sunday which members require to be cleared as soon as possible. The picquet Cpl is to ensure that this mail is taken to the Post Office and posted at 2130 hrs on Sundays. Once again members should not overload this system unnecessarily as the Post Office cannot handle large quantities. Because of the anxiety caused by mail going astray the picquet Cpl is to take great care that this does not happen.



5. The duty officer on Sundays is to clear 17 Const Sqn Box at the Post Office at 0830 hrs on Sundays and personally supervise the break up into troop lots. Once again great care is to be taken that mail does not go astray.

6. The mail is not to be picked up at any other time without the knowledge and consent of the duty officer. In general the mail clerk will be responsible. This is to ensure that mail is not lost through mishandling by this unit.

2. NOTES ON 1 ALSG MESSING CONFERENCE 2 SEP 67

1. The following is a summary of points of interest to members of 17 Const Sqn arising at the above mentioned conference.

Points from Previous Meeting

2. a. Ice cream Not yet up to full entitlement but being issued twice weekly.
- b. Custard Powder May not be obtained from Aust as it appears on US condiment list and will be obtained when available.
- c. Bread Mix Also on US condiment list & therefore may not be obtained from Aust. Issued as supplies become available.
- d. Tea Aust tea currently being issued. An increase has been approved & will be made when stocks are available.
- e. Cooks Clothing Supplies have run out & several units have not received any. White 'T' shirts are not available but units may consider purchasing them from Regt Funds.

Points Arising from the Conference

3. a. Condiment Issue At present the US supply system could not meet the entitlement. The matter was being closely watched by the supply platoon.
- b. Menu Changes There is very little scope in the US system of obtaining in lieu items for items not acceptable to the Australian palate which are part of the US menu and issued as rations. Where this is possible it is being done but items such as corn, spinach, sauerkraut and certain sausages will have to be accepted to a certain extent. Also the US foods sometimes require quite sophisticated cooking equipment to make them presentable and this equipment is not obtainable. ALSG catering and ration people are aware of these problems and are doing all that can be done.

Kitchens

4. Existing kitchens may be replaced before the end of the year and the new kitchens would have gas cooking equipment.



3. A sewing machine is available from Sqn Q Store for minor clothing alterations and sewing of badges of rank. All jobs to be passed through Cpl SLATTER.

g. The area known as Back Beach, South of the Beach-comber, and all the bars in that area, are out of bounds to all members of the Australian Military Forces between the hours of 1800 and 0800. Members are NOT to visit the Back Beach area between those hours.

2. HQ 1 ALSG Routine Orders Part 1, Numbers 116/67, 121/67, 141/67, 158/67 and 166/67 are hereby cancelled.

200. ACQUISITION, CONVERSION AND USE OF CURRENCY

1. The acquisition of United States Dollars (Green) is forbidden except at Australian Force Vietnam Cash Offices.

2. The conversion of United States Dollars and Military Payment Certificates (MPC) into any other currency is forbidden except at exchange offices authorised by Commander Australian Force Vietnam, or the Ambassador of the United States of America or Military Assistance Command Vietnam or the Government of Vietnam.

3. The use of US dollars and MPC in any financial transaction except with United States and Australian Facilities is forbidden.

4. Failure to observe the provisions of these orders by members of the Australian Force Vietnam in Vietnam is to be treated as a serious offence.

5. To be Re-promulgated in unit routine orders.

201 REMITTANCE OF MONEY FROM AUSTRALIA

1. There are three methods by which money can be remitted from Australia to personnel serving in South Vietnam. 1. These



These methods are:

- a. By bank draft or other bills of exchange.
- b. By Australian Postal Orders.
- c. By Credit Advice Note through a paybook.

2. Bank drafts cannot be cashed at the AFV Cash Office Detachments but must be cashed at a bank. This normally requires the bearer to go to a bank in Saigon and the draft is cashed at the official rate of 80 Piastres to one dollar Aust. This method is not recommended.

3. Postal orders can be cashed at the AFV Cash Office Detachments, but as the Post Office charges a fee for each postal order it is not economical for large amounts and is only recommended for small amounts.

4. For large amounts the most advisable way is by means of a Credit Advice Note drawn by a CPM in Australia. The sender should either take cash or a cheque to an area cash office or a CPM giving the regimental number, rank, name, unit and address of the person to whom the cash is remitted. Cheques may also be posted to a CPM. Bank cheques are preferred to private cheques as the latter are subject to clearance before the credit advice is issued. This method should take 7 to 10 days from the time the money is lodged until the credit advice is received.

WEARING OF WEDDING AND OTHER RINGS

1. A recent accident occurred where a soldier almost had a finger amputated by an accident caused by his wearing of a wedding ring.

2. The wearing of rings when employed on some types of duties is a safety hazard. It is an offence to wear a ring whilst playing team sports or on duties involving:

- a. Repairing equipment.
- b. Driving, loading or unloading vehicles.
- c. Operating plant or equipment.
- d. Packing or unpacking stores.
- e. Weapon handling.

204. LEAKAGE OF INFORMATION

1. There have been reports in the Australian newspapers recently of a number of matters affecting the Force. The topics were still under discussion within the Force, with AHQ and/or MACV. The information could have come from the Services in Australia.
2. Members on enlistment signed an undertaking to preserve official secrets in which they undertook to safeguard all official information and not to communicate the same to unauthorized persons.
3. Members are to be reminded of their responsibilities to their service and advised that any act, omission or neglect on their part which results or could result in an unauthorized person obtaining such information, may render them liable to disciplinary action.



205. BEHAVIOUR ON R AND R

1. A number of reports have been recently received of poor behaviour by some members on R and R.
2. Serious misconduct by any member on R and R will result in either:
  - a. His trial and punishment by the courts of the country in which the misconduct occurs.
  - b. His immediate return to SVN.
3. It is to be emphasised that the above alternatives will not be available as a choice but will depend entirely on the practice which applies in any particular country. Disciplinary action will be taken where applicable.
4. Members on leave in a foreign country are representative of their country. The behaviour of members is expected to reflect credit on Australia and Australians.

2. Whilst this has in certain cases had an attraction for married members it has presented quite a significant workload in the Army Pay Accounts Centre in the calculation and expression of adjustments resulting from allotment variations. This in turn has retarded production of paybook adjustment advices putting into effect members instructions regarding variations.

3. Furthermore Unit Pay Representatives and in many cases the members themselves have found difficulty in understanding the financial effect of the adjustments due to the varying dates of application.

4. In the interests of efficiency it has therefore been decided to bring the allotment payday into line with the Service payday. This will simplify calculation of variations at all levels and provide a more understandable adjustment for the member.

5. The actual date of introduction of the new procedure has not yet been finalised but will not be earlier than October 1967. Further advice in this regard will be furnished in due course.

6. In the meantime it is desirable that the impending change in procedure should be given as much publicity as possible so that all members and their allottees will be aware of the new procedure when it is implemented.



ACQUISITION, CONVERSION AND USE OF CURRENCY

1. The acquisition of United States Dollars (Green) is forbidden except at Australian Force Vietnam Cash Offices.
2. The conversion of United States dollars and Military Payment Certificates (MPC) into any other currency is forbidden except at exchange offices authorised by Commander Australian Force Vietnam, or the Ambassador of the United States of America or Military Assistance Command Vietnam or the Government of Vietnam.
3. The use of US dollars and MPC in any financial transaction except with United States and Australian facilities is forbidden.
4. Failure to observe the provisions of these orders by members of the Australian Force Vietnam in Vietnam is to be treated as a serious offence.
5. To be re-promulgated in unit routine orders.

REMITTANCE OF MONEY FROM AUSTRALIA

1. There are three methods by which money can be remitted from Australia to personnel serving in South Vietnam. These methods are:
  - a. By bank draft or other bills of exchange.
  - b. By Australian Postal Orders.
  - c. By Credit Advice Note through a paybook.
2. Bank drafts cannot be cashed at the AFV Cash Office Detachments but must be cashed at a bank. This normally requires the bearer to go to a bank in Saigon and the draft is cashed at the official rate of 80 Piastres to one dollar Aust. This method is not recommended.
3. Postal orders can be cashed at the AFV Cash Office Detachments, but as the Post Office charges a fee for each postal order it is not economical for large amounts and is only recommended for small amounts.
4. For large amounts the most advisable way is by means of a Credit Advice Note drawn by a CPM in Australia. The sender should either take cash or a cheque to an area cash office or a CPM giving the regimental number, rank, name, unit and address of the person to whom the cash is to be remitted. Cheques may also be posted to a CPM. Bank cheques are preferred to private cheques as the latter are subject to clearance before the credit advice is issued. This method should take 7 to 10 days from the time the money is lodged until the credit advice is received.
5. This order is to be reprinted in unit routine orders.



  - f. 1 Aust CA Unit will acquit the AF G1033 in the usual manner, but will mark the vouchers NO LEDGER ENTRY.

1. CHANGE OF ARMY ALLOTMENT PAYDAY

1. For many years now the Army allotment payday has been the alternative Thursday to that on which members themselves are paid.
2. Whilst this has in certain cases had an attraction for married members it has presented quite a significant workload in the Army Pay Accounts Centre in the calculation and expression of adjustments resulting from allotment variations. This in turn has retarded production of paybook adjustment advices putting into effect members instructions regarding variations.
3. Furthermore Unit Pay Representatives and in many cases the members themselves have found difficulty in understanding the financial effect of the adjustments due to the varying dates of application.
4. In the interests of efficiency it has therefore been decided to bring the allotment payday into line with the Service payday. This will simplify calculation of variations at all levels and provide a more understandable adjustment for the member.
5. The actual date of introduction of the new procedure has not yet been finalised but will not be earlier than October 1967. Further advice in this regard will be furnished in due course.
6. In the meantime it is desirable that the impending change in procedure should be given as much publicity as possible so that all members and their allottees will be aware of the new procedure when it is implemented.
7. This RO is to be reproduced in Unit ROs.

1. A number of reports have been recently received of poor behaviour by some members on R and R.
2. Serious misconduct by any member on R and R will result in either:
  - a. His trial and punishment by the courts of the country in which the misconduct occurs.

b. (1) Size 4 dozer serviceability was very poor during the month. Three dozers were disposed of and replaced by two new ones just received from AUSTRALIA. Due to a mix up in supply of fuel and oil filters which are different from those in earlier model these machines were grounded at 25 hours when the filters were required to complete the initial 25 hour service. This occurred at a time when the remaining five older dozers were suffering poor serviceability also. The situation has now improved and the new machines are again operational using filters from idle machines in depot. The supply of filters from AUSTRALIA is being sorted out. 5 ton dump serviceability is improving and a reasonable level has been achieved.

7. The troop under command 1 Fd Sqn is to be increased slightly in personnel and equipment to enable them to perform the following tasks with as little call on the resources of 1 Fd Sqn as possible:

- Continue buildings as per master plan.
- Operate quarry and rock crushers.
- Operate well boring rig.

2 Comp Ord Dep Warehouse

8. Construction has commenced of a 200' x 45' warehouse which provides a clear span for the 45' and 15' or more clearance for the central 35'. It is of timber trussed, three-pinned arch construction designed to withstand the strong prevailing winds which are beam-on.

Water Supply

9. The graphs showing fluctuations of water table level at various points in the area of 1 ALSG generally follow the graph of water point level. Their information is not yet conclusive since some variations occur. These variations occur usually after rain. It is thought that they may be caused by local run-off. The aim of the measurement is to determine the effect of pumping on the water point level. It is thought that the long term effect is nil, and that variations in water point level reflect changes in the overall water table only. A period without rain, allowing sufficient time for the water table to settle, is required to verify this hypothesis.
