PART I - G MATTERS

GENERAL

- 1.1. Location: A Sect 1 Topo Svy Tp remains in location YS 4345 6671.
- 1.2. Enemy Contact: Nil.
- 1.3. Command: Capt J.BULLEN assumed command on 19 Feb 68.

SURVEY SECTION

- 1.4. Field Work: Due to increased enemy activity during this month, field work was restricted to some extent, however the following tasks were undertaken:-
 - A field party of 4 surveyors went with 7 RAR on Operation CLAYTON on 20-21 Feb. This was a cordon and search of LONG DIEN. The surveyors could not start work until the village was secure, and by then insufficient time remained for the survey task. Although no mapping was done, the survey party performed civil aid work while the village was being rendered secure.
 - h. Happing of 3 RAR perimeter wire.

 A field party of 4 surveyors with protection from

 RAR carried out a tacheometric traverse along the 3 RAR

 perimeter wire on 22 Feb. This traverse provided a plot

 of the wire for the NUI DAT (Special) 1:10000 map.
 - 4 field parties were positioned on various stations on 29 Feb in order to fix Ba Ria radio mast to 3rd order accuracy. Parties were positioned as follows:-

AASOO1, NUI DAT, YS 433 673, positioned by vehicle.

AASO17, HORSESHOE, YS 491 621, " RAAF.

The line AASO27 - AASO17 was measured. The angle between AASO01 and AASO27 was observed at AASO17. The angle between AASO01 and Ba Ria radio mast was observed at THANH. The position of the radio mast is now being computed from trese and previous observations. This will be of use both to RA Svy and to USAECV(P). The mast will be used as a DECTA station.

- d. RA Sigs aerials, Long Binh.
 On 21-22 Feb, the siting of 2 rhombic aerials for
 RA Sigs in the LONG BINH area was done by a 2 man party at
 the request of SO Sigs AFV. This involved determination of
 azimuth by sun observation, setting out the site, and some
 levelling. This work was done in an insecure area, and a
 clearing patrol was necessary first.
- 1.5. Computing: The following computations and records were completed:
 - a. HOA LONG tacheometric traverse. This is to provide control for the HOA LONG (Special) 1:5000 map which is on programme.
 - b. All check computations and compilation of records outstanding from Jan 68 were completed.

1.6. Compilation;

- a. DAT DO (Special) 1:10000 map. Slotted templates have been cut and are being laid. Photos have been office annotated. Limited field annotation will be carried out.
- b. HOA LONG (Special) 1:5000 map. Boundaries of this sheet have been revised to suit new operational requirements. Compilation has commenced.

AIR PHOTOGRAPHY

1.7. No aerial photography was received during Feb 68.

CARTOGRAPHIC SECTION

- 1.8 No aid from other units has been possible during February.
- 1.9. Operational Happing:
 - a. LANG PHUOC HAI (Special) 1:5000 map. Drawn and passed to Reproduction Section for printing.
 - b. NUI DAT (Special) 1:10000 map. Fair drawing 50% complete at 1:7500.
 - c. BA RIA (PHUOC LE) 1:2850 sketchmap. compiled for dyeline reproduction.
 - d. AP LONG TUAN 1:1969 (1 inch to 50 metres) sketchmap compiled for dyeline reproduction.
 - e. Operation MACKAY map overprint.

 Enemy activity information was drawn for overprinting onto two L8015 series map sheets. This operation has not yet taken place. Further details will be provided after the operation.

1.10. Miscellaneous Tasks:

This is a series of 26 maps for a forthcoming publication by 2 RAR. A Sect 1 Topo Svy Tp is providing the repromat for reproduction by AHQ Svy Regt.

REPRODUCTION SECTION

- 1.11. Are lamp and vacuum france are new working again.
- 1.12. LANG PHUOC HAI (Special) 1:5000 map. Printing is complete. The following matters are worthy of mention:
 - a. Cpl SNELSON spent 3 days with 66 Engr Coy (Topo) at LONG BINH on 12-14 Feb. This visit was necessary for the performance of tasks associated with the LANG PHUOC map as follows:-
 - (1) Use of larger copy board for contact photography.
 - (2) Use of more accurate camera.
 - (3) Use of a Cronaflex based photographic film.
 - (4) Use of a suitable stipple.
 - b. Two blue colours have been used in printing a pale blue solid infill for the sea and a darker blue for the drainage detail on the land. This was because a suitable stipple is not held here for use with the screen mesh available. Procurement of finer mesh is now being attempted.
- 1.13. Operation Mackay overprint. Task complete.
- 1.14. Commander's Diary covers. Task complete.

FUTURE TASKS

- 1.15. Revision material L8015 series. This is almost complete and will be despatched when recdy.
- 1.16. PHUOC LOI (Special) 1:5000 map. No change from previous report.
- 1.17. AP SUOI NGHE cadastral survey. It is expected that this project will be resumed in Mar 68 after more clearing work has been done by RAE.

LEAVE

2.8. R&C: R&C leave was suspended while enemy activity was at its strongest. It has since been re-instituted, but priority is given to convalescents. No member of the Tp took R&C leave during Feb 68.

ATTACHMENTS AND DETACHMENTS

2.10. Due to the strong enemy activity during February, especially in the LONG BINH - BIEN HOA area, no exchange of personnel with 66 Engr Coy (Topo), LONG BINH, has been possible, except for the special visits listed above in paragraphs 2.4., 2.5., 2.6.. Early in Feb, 66 Engr Coy(Topo) bore the brunt of an unsuccessful attack by two VIET CONG battalions. Several minor incidents have occurred there since, and the atmosphere is still tense.

DUTIES

2.11. A Sect 1 Topo Svy Tp now has to provide one Spr for general duties in the 1 ATF HQ Coy kitchen every third week for one week. This matter has been under discussion since Dec 67 and the above decision has been made. Should the occasion arise where technical commitments cannot be mat as a consequence of this, the matter will be re-opened by OC A Sect.

MEDICAL

- 2.12. Health has been good during Feb 68. A few members have reported sick for minor stomach upsets. This is not abnormal.
- 2.13. Some difficulty and delay was experienced in obtaining replacement spectacles for one member. It is recommended that all personnel wearing spectacles and posted to A Sect be provided with at least one spare pair of spectacles prior to leaving AUSTRALIA.

MORALE

2.14. The only problem appears to be uncertainty of return date to Australia for some members. This is caused by late arrival of posting orders or late advice of impending arrival of replacements and by difficulties in booking on flights to Australia. Flights to Australia are usually fully booked out several weeks in advance, whereas notice of only a few days is usually given of the arrival of a replacement.

PART 3 Q HATTERS

- A handover stocktake was conducted during this period. There was one minor discrepancy, not of technical equipment. This has been adjusted.
- 3.2. Replacement vacuum frame and arc lamp have arrived. The old equipment was returned to 2AOD and will probably be repaired and held in theatre stock.
- 3.3. Two rifles, complete equipment, were taken on charge, these being issued to new members before departure from Sydney. Following the recent enemy activity causing unarmed new members to be almost involved in fighting while on the way, all new members are now being armed in Australia. Departing members new over armed and carry the samples.
- 3.4. At the moment there is little inward movement of expense items. This is causing some concern, especially in regard to Cronaflex. The supply due on 1 Jan 68 has still not arrived by 1 Har 68. RAAOC has taken action to hasten delivery but this has not yet had any affect.
- 3.5. From samples of nylon mesh used at AHQ Svy Regt and brought up by Capt Bullen it is apparent that AHQ Svy Regt is using a finer mesh than A Sect I Topo Svy Tp for screen printing. Indent action for the finer mesh has been taken.
- 3.6. The FRIDEN SBT 10 Electric Calculating Machine has given minor trouble. Local repair took 2 weeks. Fortunately this occurred during a light work period in the Survey Section.
- 3.7. Bearing in mind that a major breakdown of key items of equipment could easily occur unexpectedly and cause operational embarrassment, it has been requested that the following items be held as reserve stock in theatre:
