COMMANDERS DIARIES INSTRUCTIONS

AIM

1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organization and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

GENERAL

2. Entries are to be made daily on AF C 2118 (Adapted) each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.
3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties (Australia)", Chapter 2, Section 12.

RESPONSIBILITY

During Non-operational Periods

4. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled by commanders of all formations.

During Operational Periods (1)

5. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled in duplicate by:
 - a. Commanders of all formations.
 - b. Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a brigadier or above.
 - c. Heads of services not below the rank of lieutenant colonel.
 - d. Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
 - e. Unit commanders.
 - f. Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

COMPILATION

6. Both original and duplicate copies are to consist of:
 - a. Cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted).
 - b. Index as printed on cover.
 - c. Narrative (AF C 2118) (Adapted).
 - d. Annexes as shown in the Index.
7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes are to be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer is to be included.
8. The annexes are to be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an annex NIL will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters, the relevant annexes are to be included starting at B.

DISPOSAL

13. **Original Commander's Diary.** This is to be forwarded monthly, unless otherwise ordered, by the seventh day of the succeeding month direct to AHQ.

14. **Duplicate Commander's Diary.** This must be clearly marked as a duplicate. It is to be sent separately from the original to AHQ one month after the original has been despatched but not before the former has been acknowledged.

15. When overseas, both copies of diaries are to be sent through the Army Records organization in the overseas theatre but at different times.

16. **TOP SECRET Supplementary Diaries.**

a. The documents referred to in Paragraph 9 together with a list of them made out on AF C 2118 (Adapted) must be placed in separate cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted). All details must be filled in and the cover clearly marked in red: "ANNEX Z — OFFICER ONLY". It may be convenient to group the papers by appendices.

b. Supplementary diaries must be forwarded under the normal rules for TOP SECRET correspondence, to AHQ. The inner envelope must be plainly marked:

1. LONG SON ISLAND (YS2856) comes under control of the VC Province of BARIA. It is probably part of the CAN GIO District. In common with the other VC Districts of the province the CAN GIO District Commission probably commands a VC District Company but it has never been identified. If no district company exists then a district platoon is likely.
2. Local guerilla squads are known to exist and operate amongst the fishermen and villagers on the island.
3. No main force VC units are known to be on the island but there have been reports of up to battalion size units passing through LONG SON between PHUOC TUY PROVINCE and LONG AN PROVINCE WEST of the RUNG SAT SPECIAL ZONE (RSSZ). The last such report was on 28 Oct 66. This battalion was reported at YS266585. Contact with main force VC is unlikely.
4. No identifications of VC administrative units have been made but elements of the VC Group 84 (Rear Services Group supporting 5 Div) certainly operate from the island.
5. LONG SON ISLAND is used by the VC as a staging area for men and supplies moving from the LONG AN area through the RSSZ to PHUOC TUY PROVINCE and to VC WAR ZONE D.
6. The location of VC installations are unknown, but sites close to the coast on the NORTH WEST corner of the island are most likely.
7. The most likely course of action by the local VC guerillas is to conceal their weapons and mingle with the civilian population. CAN GIO district troops and administrative units will probably avoid contact but harrass 1 ATF operations by sniping and booby trapping. Some VC will attempt to flee the island on sampans and other small craft.
8. There have been many reports of friendly radio transmissions being interfered with by a VC radio, thought to be located on LONG SON.

 - (d) Community Relations: A CA team consisting of one WO2 and Cpl and private and a linguist will seek out and where possible give assistance to those in apparent need. A small amount of food will be available and used for this purpose, but will be distributed in the minimum of amounts to reduce risk of it reaching VC.
 - c. LONG SON Island: During the search and destroy operation on LONG SON Island the CA team will be attached to 1 ATF Fwd HQ and will conduct civic action and Psy Ops tasks as directed by the staff. These tasks will include arrangements for MEDCAP, food distribution and the issue of PSYOPS leaflets and papers.
 - d. Coordinating Instructions: The CA team will be adjacent to 1 ATF Fwd HQ.

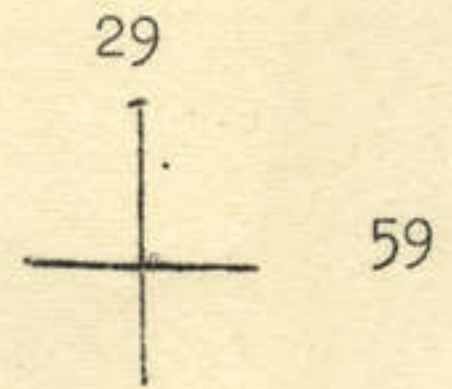
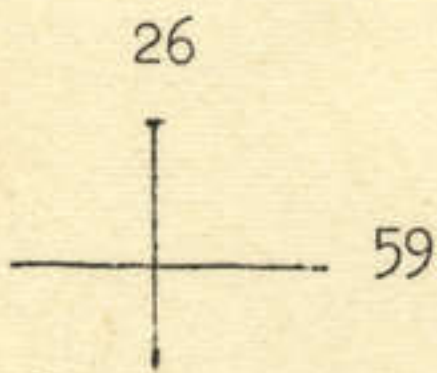

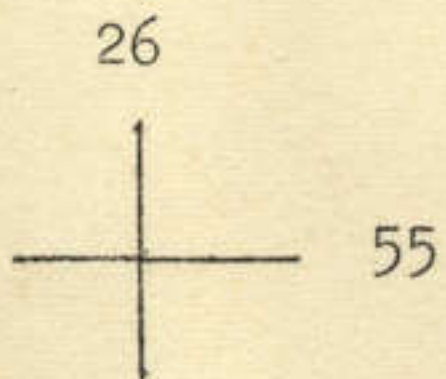

Annex A (Enemy) to OPOD 22-66 (OP YASS)

1. General.

The area of flat ground to the WEST and SOUTH WEST of PHUOC TUY is of considerable importance to the VC. This region links the sea transport routes of the RUNG SAT with the system of foot and cart tracks which run through the HAT DICH area and to other bases NORTH of Route 15.

VC activity is concentrated in the area PHU MY - PHUOC HOA - LONG HUONG, - LONG SON ISLAND. The island is situated near the junction of several sea routes leading into landing points and is ideally situated for use as a staging area, a refuge, and a rest centre. The main routes for water borne traffic are the SONG THI VAI, the SONG MHO NHAT, the RACH RANG, the RACH BA and the RACH TRE. These rivers fan out on the NORTHERN side of LANG SON ISLAND. The incoming supply routes which divide into these feeder channels at the island come from the WEST, from LONG AN province.

The most direct route into PHUOC TUY lies through PHUOC HOA. This village is also the one best served by land and sea routes and harbour facilities. Hence it is the scene of the most significant VC activity which passes through into WESTERN PHUOC TUY.

The WESTERN strip of the province is also of interest to the VC because of Route 15. The VC have made several attacks in this area, in order to establish domination of their supply routes by crushing villages who resist them and by coercing villages which are sympathetic. This is a likely scene of similar activities in the future.

The numerous ARVN posts in the area are largely ineffective because their troops are contained in a chain of forts. The VC have a regular patrol system which covers the whole area at night, usually with a platoon strength patrol, although company sized patrols have been reported.

The VC also use the area for gaining intelligence concerning Allied movements and this position is particularly favourable for obtaining information about large scale movements of men and supplies destined for other parts of Vietnam.

There is much civilian activity in the area. Woodcutters move far inland with carts and fishermen cover the waterways. Theoretically, night movement is forbidden but this has never been policed, particularly on the water. Many fishermen work at night and it is impossible to tell a VC sampan from an innocent one. This is of tremendous assistance to the VC, but because of the impracticability of enforcing the night curfew, the area is not a free fire zone and fire cannot be opened without definite indications of hostility being presented

2. PHUOC HOA.

PHUOC HOA is a village of some 500 people who are engaged mainly in wood cutting and fishing. It contains a n RF Company but many of its inhabitants are VC or VC sympathisers. The village is well served with communications by the RACH TRE and the main track running NORTH EAST towards the mountains. Many sampans use the harbour and several families probably including VC engaged on turn around, live on these sampans permanently

3. EXAMPLES OF RECENT ENEMY ACTIVITY NEAR PHUOC HOA.

a. On 28 Oct 66, a VC battalion with cadre personnel from NORTH VIETNAM prohibited traffic on Route 15 by setting up road blocks at PHUOC HOA and LONG HUONG.

/b. An assassin

- b. An assassin team of two guerillas specially trained has been infiltrated into PHUOC HOA with the intention of killing any AMERICANS who offer themselves as targets.
- c. The VC guerillas on LONG SON island plan to infiltrate another assassin group to kill local officials, searchers and advisers.
- d. Periodically during October, VC in sampans have declared certain areas on or adjacent to the RACH TRE to be prohibited to local inhabitants. The VC have picquetted these areas and used them as overnight bases, turn around points and temporary storage areas.
- e. 30 VC were seen at YS 326642 at 030800 Oct wearing black. All were armed. Two automatic rifles were carried.
- f. 30 VC were seen at YS 264649 and YS 285687 at 060700. They established a tax collection point near Route 15 and taxed carts of firewood at 500 P per cart.
- g. 16 VC in four sampans were reported moving between LONG SON Island and PHUOC HOA along the RACH ONG BEN, the SONG MHO NHAT and the RACH TRE on the night of 23/24 Oct 66.
- h. One VC guerilla platoon was reported to be at YS 350678 at 211200. This platoon had come from the NORTH EAST and members disclosed that the platoon would increase VC activities in PHUOC HOA and LONG HUONG villages. The VC carried rice, machetes, knives and signal cable.
- j. At 301200 two children who live in PHUOC HOA were captured by some VC near 320640 and were taken away to a VC force for questioning. The VC asked about the number of Popular Force soldiers guarding the RACH VANG bridge YS 303612 and if Allied troops had been on the road. The children said that they did not know and were released at 301500.
- k. At 301000 one VC platoon in ferries stopped a civilian at YS 335598 and asked him about the local administration. The VC included five women, wore mixed uniforms, and carried personal weapons

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4. ENEMY UNITS IN THE VICINITY OF PHUOC HOA.

The main unit in the area is the C2 guerilla company. This company has three platoons, each of three squads with a total strength of 110 men. They are armed with one 60 mm mortar, 1 MMG, 4 LMGs, 19 SMGs, 2 revolvers and the remainder of the company carry carbines or AK 44s. The members of the company are drawn from LONG SON Island, PHUOC HOA and LONG HUONG villages. One member of a recce group of this company was captured at YS 284650 on the morning of 26 Oct 66. The task of the unit was to observe the ARVN posts along Route 15 and gather information about bridges with emphasis on the PHU MY (YS 254743) and the NUOC NGOT bridges (YS 274653). The company was also to transport rice from AP BEN DA (YS 257583) on LONG SON Island. The company base was located on the eastern side of NUI THI VAI at YS 303705. Each platoon had three thatched huts, 5mx10m, well camouflaged. The morale of the company is fair. They have no food stored but receive sufficient for their daily use. The company took part in the attack on LONG CAT in mid 1965 and ambushed Route 15 between YS 297617 and YS 305612. They lost 2 KIA and some weapons. In August 1965, the company took part in the DONG XOAI battle near the Cambodian border with the following casualties:

It is probable that some sea transportation members and their companies will be at PHUOC HOA overnight. It is also possible that a medium sized VC force is staging through the area at the time of our operation.

5. PROBABLE ENEMY REACTIONS.

The C2 company may carry out harrassment by sniping and booby traps. Other VC in PHUOC HOA probably will try to flee by sampan into the mangroves or by track to the NORTH EAST.

6. LONG SON ISLAND.

LONG SON Island has offered refuge, communication and staging facilities to the VC for several years. Several reports have been received of VC radio stations on the island. The main approaches to the island are via the RACH TRE channel YS 2860, and from the WEST via the RUNG SAT. The channels are difficult to follow and it is very easy to run aground onto thick mud. VC craft are sometimes motor driven. The VC appear to have made an arrangement with local RF platoon on the island whereby the RF troops keep to the eastern village, XA LONG SON 1, while the VC control the remainder of the island. The VC have a machine gun post on the hill top of YS 293561 and use fire to restrict the movement of RF squads if they move too far to the WEST. The population of the island is 3000. Most of the men are fishermen. There are no restricted areas and VC mix freely with civilians.

7. ENEMY ACTIVITY ON LONG SON ISLAND.

Continual reports are received about the movement of sampans to and from the island. The chief VC port is AP BEN DA YS 259584. Air recce has shown that there are very few houses there. Also XA LONG SON 2 YS 275552 is used by the VC. There are many tracks connecting possible base area on the island. Air photos have indicated no hard installations although there are some peculiar tin huts on the southern shore in squares YS 2554 and 2654. The VC radio station transmits Radio Peking and jamming waves.

Some few months ago the island was used for training guerillas in two locations, YS 281549 and YS 281569. Approximately one platoon was in each area. There are two VC guard posts at YS 241575 and YS 258585 whose duty is to give warning of any allied approach across the water. The area of AP BEN DA is the scene of most VC staging activity. The pattern of movement established during this year is that at approximately three monthly intervals one battalion spends two or three nights in the area for a rest. These battalions come from the area of NUI THI VAI. The most recent sighting of a battalion at AP BEN DA was on 28 Oct. It is believed that this battalion has departed from the island. At shorter intervals individual VC companies spend two or three nights on the island. There have been no reports of a company at AP BEN DA since September.

8. ENEMY UNITS ON LONG SON ISLAND.

The island is maintained by an understrength platoon of local guerillas which belongs to C2 Company. These guerillas man the machine gun on the hilltop mentioned above. They are chiefly local fishermen. Several members of the C2 Company have lived on LONG SON Island, viz:

It is improbable that there is a battalion on LONG SON, it is possible that there is a company staging there but probably there is only a platoon.

9. PROBABLE ENEMY REACTIONS.

Any VC force staging on the island will realise after initial reconnaissance that it has been trapped and thus may be expected to fight hard. The local guerilla platoon will attempt to lay low or escape into mangroves in flat bottomed craft. The training areas may conceal snipers and booby traps.

1. SITUATION:

a. Enemy Forces:

- (1) The objective area vicinity YS5768 includes portions of three GVN districts of PHUOC TUY Province. These are DUC THANH, XUYEN MOC, and DAT DO. It is remote from the headquarters of these three districts but control of the objective area gives the Viet Cong easy access to large numbers of peasant farmers living outside the sphere of government control and influence.
- (2) The area overlooks the main rice producing region of the province and is one of the main points of entry into the VC controlled area of PHUOC TUY. It is astride the SONG RAI waterway and close to the VC controlled Route 328; both of these routes are extensively used by the VC.
- (3) Substantial rice caches were found in this area close to streams and rivers during Operation ABILENE 30 Mar 66 - 15 Apr 66 and Operation TOLEDO in Sep 66.
- (4) There was considerable VC activity in the area between 27 Oct 66 and 9 Nov 66. The activity indicated that the VC were moving large quantities of stores, probably rice, to their main force units further NORTH; possibly even to War Zone D. Most of this movement was conducted by night using both ox-carts and human labour.
- (5) Enemy forces known to operate in the area are D445 Bn, C300 (Transportation Unit of Group 84), C23 (XUYEN MOC District P1) and squads of local guerilla forces.
- (6) During September 1966 one battalion of 274 Regt was employed for approximately ten days on a rice transportation task in this area and there are indications that another main force unit was similarly employed during late October 1966 and early November 1966. This could re-occur at any time.
- (7) 274 Regt is believed to have moved from vicinity YS 3880 to the EAST of Inter-Provincial Route 2, and to be located to the NE of BINH GIA (YS4977). Being only 15,000 metres from the objective area there is a possibility of interference by this regiment but such action is unlikely.

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- 2 -

(8) 275 Regt has moved back into PHUOC TUY from the MAY TAO Secret Zone and is located approximately 10,000 metres north of XUYEN MOC (YS6668) and approximately 15,000 metres from the objective area. Its intentions are unknown but could include tasks in support of VC plans to secure the PHUOC TUY rice harvest in December. Contact with elements of 275 Regt is possible but it is unlikely that the regiment will launch a major operation against 1 ATF forces.

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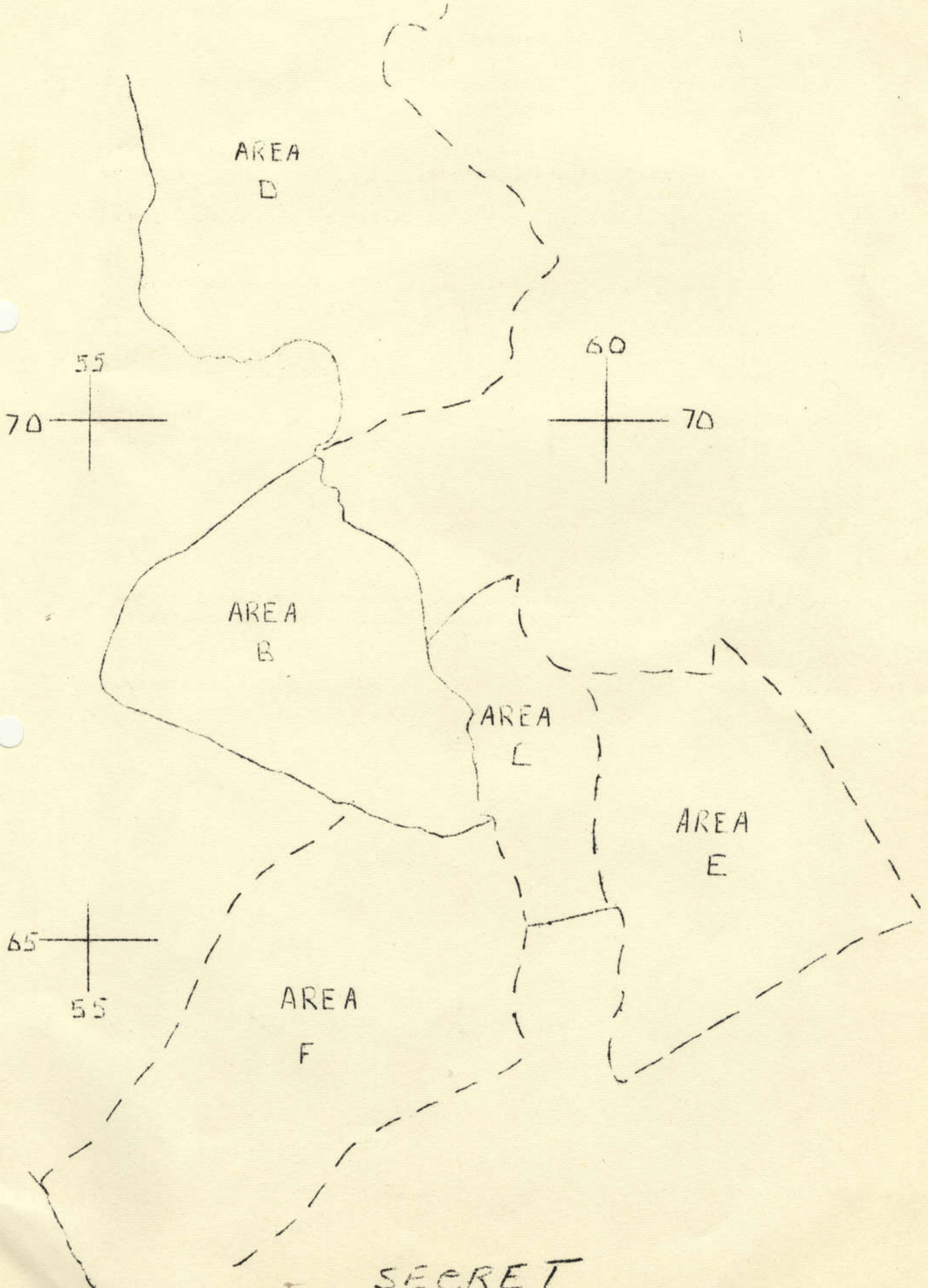

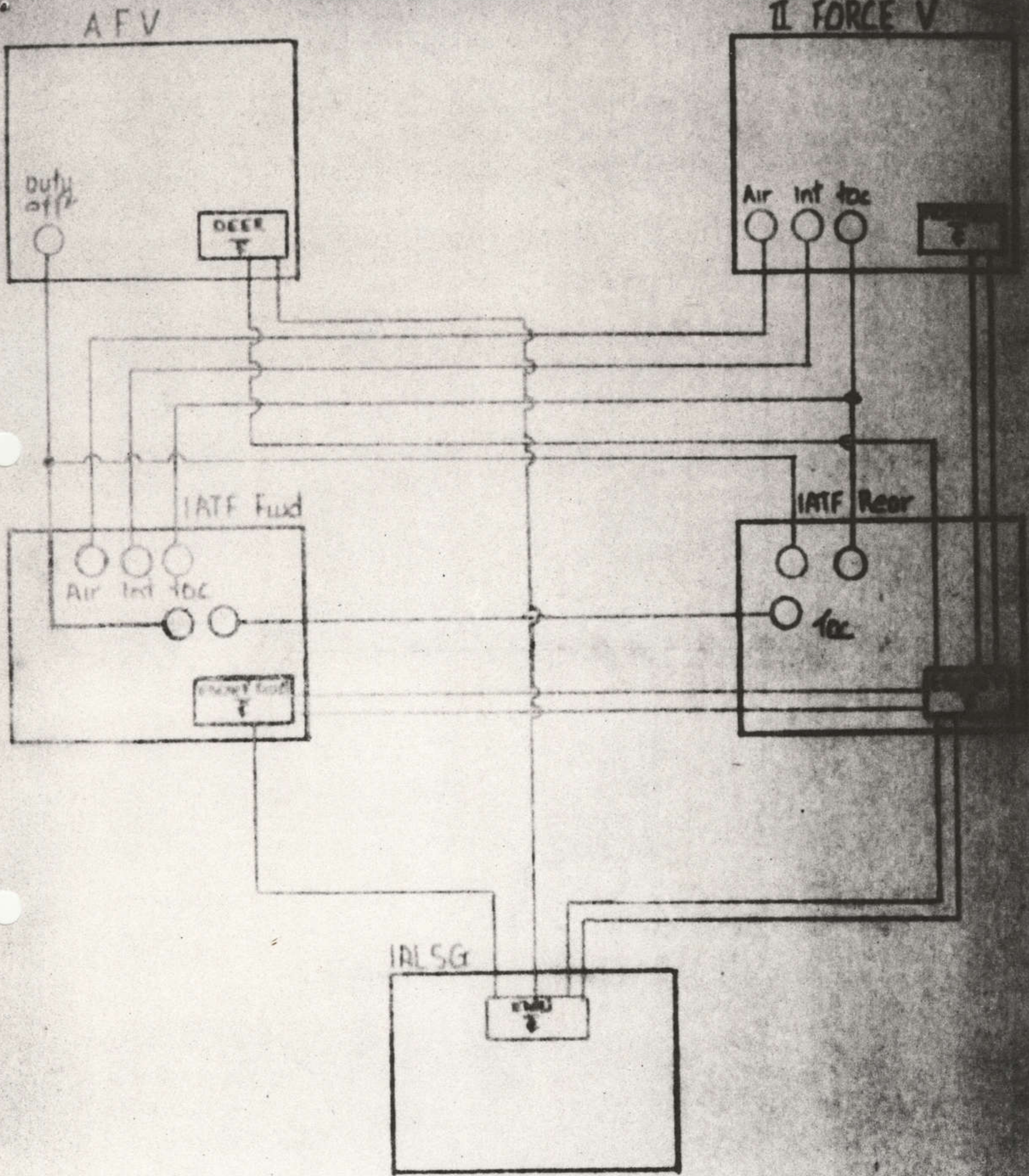
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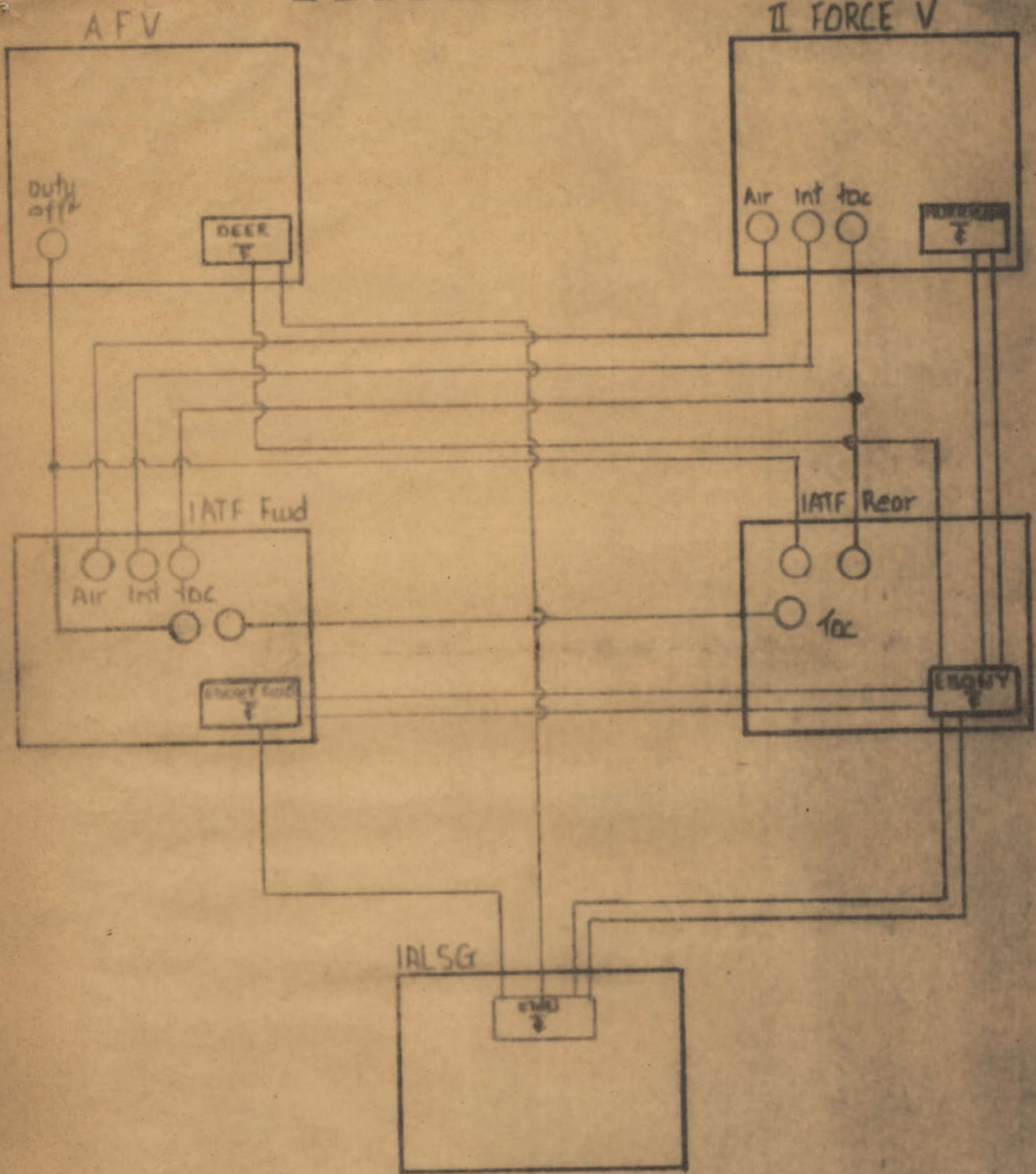
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VOICE CIRCUITS



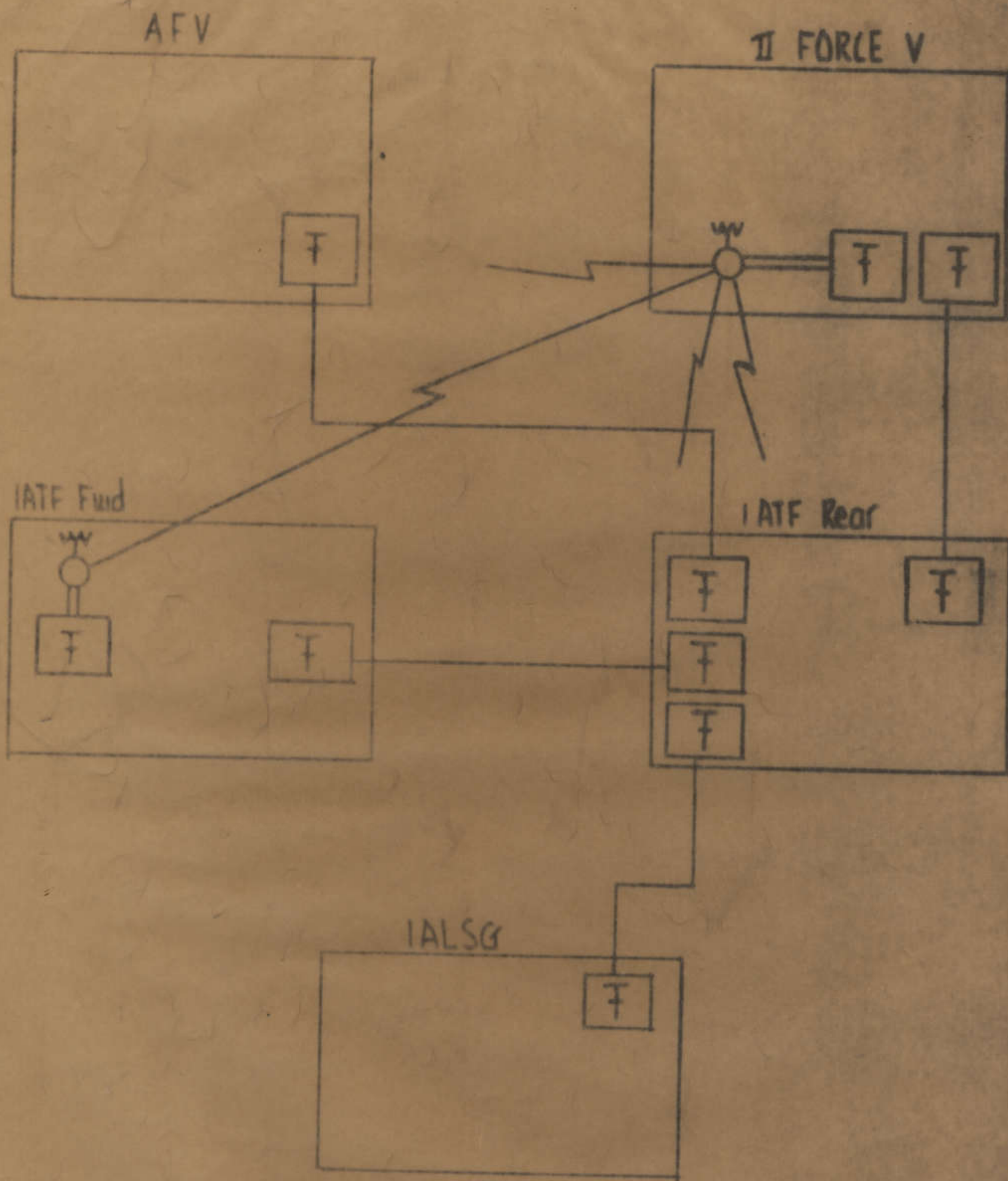
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TELEPRINTER CIRCUIT

Operations

Early this month Main HQ 1 ATF deployed away from the base area for the first time on Operation HAYMAN. This was a search and destroy operation on LONG SON Island (2756) just off the coast to our WEST. Movement was by CHINOOK helicopter and we were deployed for five days. I will give more details later in the letter.

The other operation this month was Op INGHAM. This is a 6 RAR search and destroy operation out on the EASTERN edge of our TAOR. It is still continuing. The main interest from our point of view is that the operating range for the TF Comd Net is about 15,000 yards, and the battalion is operating in quite thick country. We get them comfortably whenever they are static and put up any kind of a reasonable antenna, but when they are on the move with a 3 ft whip aerial, communications become intermittent. For this reason we have an aerial re-broadcast aircraft set up on standby in case of any urgent requirement for the bn HQ to keep moving and still maintain communications.

Deployment

The voice and telegraph circuits we planned to operate from the main and rear HQ on Op HAYMAN are shown in annexes A and B. In addition to these, we had stations on the task force command and telegraph nets at both HQ. In the deployment, the task force command net station and its operators travelled as part of HQ 1 ATF, the remainder were organised by the squadron. An aircraft loading list is attached as annex C for the loading of personnel and stores on the CHINOOKS.

Signon and cipher. The signon group was housed in two 16' x 16' tents, erected in prolegation of each other as one tent. This contained the signon clerk, SDS clerk, Tg terminal, switchboard and Sgt OK by day/Signs duty officer by night. One 3/4 ton GS veh and tlr were taken to carry signon, cipher, swbd and line stores on the deployment and to act as a general purpose vehicle while in position. Equipment for the telegraph terminal was carried loose in the vehicle and set up on an F.S. table for operation. The cipher office was set up in an 11' x 11' tent immediately behind the signon.

/Switchboard and line

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- 2 -

Switchboard and line. Two SB-22A/PT were used for the switchboard at the Main HQ. I believe that, as the equipment will be available, for the next move I will take an SB-86 (30 lines only) for convenience and ease of operation. Line was laid to subscribers within Main HQ and to HQ of the company providing protection. On this particular occasion as HQ 5 RAR was adjacent to Main HQ & ATF, line was also laid to them.

SDS NO SDS operated in the fwd area during the operation, but the serial SDS called at the Main HQ as well as the Rear HQ.

Radio The Command Net and Tg Net stations were placed together in one 11' x 11' tent for convenience and to keep manpower requirements down to a minimum. The Command Net was operated remotely from the TOC.

Radio relay Links were operated to the rear by 145 Sig Sqn and by 53rd (US) Sig Bn, providing circuits for Australian requirements and to II Force V respectively.

HQ, Q and kitchen The main part of the orderly room was left in base camp. A clerk and a typewriter was about all that was taken forward. A limited supply of basic replacement items and spares was taken forward by the Q. The kitchen operated with Australian 10 man ration packs, one cook and an M-37 cooker.

Tech Maint We took one of each type of technician forward and left the rest in base camp. Anything which could not be simply fixed on the spot by the technicians taken forward was backloaded for repair.

Officers Three officers went forward and one remained in base. On this occasion the Ty Offr TP HQ Ty remained behind but in future I intend that the TIC should remain in base and the others go forward.

Manpower In all, a total of 39 of our people, 4 from 145 Sig Sqn and 10 from 53 (US) Sig Bn were deployed with the Main HQ. We found this was adequate to provide the facilities required, although some ad-hoc arrangements had to be made with tradesmen, for the short period of this operation. I think we would have greater trouble if the operation lasted a longer time.

Equipment Squadron holdings of telegraph machines and cipher equipment are inadequate for a deployment of this type and it was necessary to borrow from 145 Sig Sqn and 53rd (US) Sig Bn.

Miscellaneous

Our signal building is about half finished. At the present rate of progress we should be able to begin our installation some time next week.
