# COMMANDERS DIARIES INSTRUCTIONS

#### AIM

1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organization and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

#### GENERAL

- 2. Entries are to be made daily on AF C 2118 (Adapted) each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.
- 3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties (Australia)" Chapter 2, Section 12.

#### RESPONSIBILITY

#### **During Non-operational Periods**

4. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled by commanders of all formations.

#### **During Operational Periods (1)**

- 5. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled in duplicate by:
  - a. Commanders of all formations.
  - b. Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a brigadier or above.
  - c. Heads of services not below the rank of lieutenant colonel.
  - d. Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
  - e. Unit commanders.
  - f. Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

#### COMPILATION

- 6. Both original and duplicate copies are to consist of:
  - a. Cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted).
  - b. Index as printed on cover.
  - c. Narrative (AF C 2118) (Adapted).
  - d. Annexes as shown in the Index.
- 7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes are to be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer is to be included.
- 8. The annexes are to be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an annex NIL will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters,





#### GENERAL

- 1. The pressure of work has been constantly high, making September a busy month, with October promising to be even busier.
- 2. Highlights of the month were:
  - a. Conduct of a Radiotelephone lecture and exercise for HQ 1 ALSG staff and users of the 1 ALSG Defence Net.
  - b. An outbreak of shooting by War Veterens in Saigon causing Saigon Det to keep heads down.
  - c. Cancellation of most work on the Works Programme because of shortages in labour and materials.
  - d. The shooting and subsequent search for civilian intruders who attempted to break into the 1 ALSG area.
  - e. Commencement of MEDCAP visits to the ARVN School of Signals.
  - f. Provision of Public Address facilities for the AATTV Ceremonial Parade, official opening of the Kevin Wheatley Stadium and the Grand Final of the 1 ALSG Basketball Competition.
  - g. A grenade practice.
  - h. A Children's "Tet" party given for two hundred children at the An Phong Orphanage.
  - i. Participation in the occupation of Night Defensive Position "ISA" in the 1 ATF TAOR.
  - j. Successful tradetesting of five Linemen Fd as Linemen PL.
  - k. Two unit lectures.

#### TAPE RELAY TRAFFIC

#### Traffic Figures

- 3. MRS Saigon Traffic Summary is attached as Annex A.
- 4. Traffic in MRS Saigon again decreased slightly by 2.16% to a total of 88730 transactions.

#### - 2 -

- 5. Tributary traffic has fluctuated. Percentage variations over 5% in comparison with last month's figures are:
  - a. From AFV Comcen. A 5.4% decrease.
  - b. To AFV Comcen. A 7.2% decrease.
  - c. To Nui Dat. A 15.7% increase.
  - d. From Long Binh. A 5.1% decrease.
  - e. From 1 ALSG Comcen. A 5.1% decrease.
  - f. From 1 OSU. An 8.5% increase.
  - g. To 1 OSU. A 7.2% increase.

#### Traffic Analysis

- 6. Rerun Summary. Annex B.
- 7. Long Term Trends. Annex D.
- 8. The traffic to Nui Dat recovered after a decrease of 21.2% last month.
- 9. Traffic figures to and from AFV Comcen continues to fall over two reporting periods.
- 10. 1 OSU traffic figures are building up.
- 11. The MRS average for reruns increased again with IN traffic up 0.3% and OUT traffic up 1.4%. The rerun figures are disconcerting, however there are always valid reasons for the high percentages, and they are gradually becoming a fact of life. A day with good rerun figures is a good day indeed.

#### OTHER COMMUNICATIONS

#### 1 ALSG Switchboard (EMU)

- The number of local and trunk calls remained steady, however the EMU was resuscitated from near death back to life on several occasions, and continues to limp on barely coping with the situation. The operators are now "EMUNE" to complaints. Thirty-nine cords were replaced during the month. This was good. Fifty were replaced last month.
- 13. Unfortunately at this stage two new operators have joined the switchborad team, and the combination of the old switchboard and new operators does nothing to enhance the unit's reputation.
- 14. SO(Sigs)2 AFV is in constant touch with US Depot Long Binh over the delivery of the AN/MT1 shelters. These have been delayed because of CES shortages, and are still expected daily.

## Signal Dispatch Service

- 15. 1 ALSG.
  - a. SDS figures were:
    - (1) Dispatches out 4815
    - (2) Dispatches in 486

5301 Total

- b. The total vehicle mileage was 2158 miles shared by two DR vehicles (Landrovers).
- 16. <u>HQ AFV</u>. Two landrovers shared 550 vehicle miles in the Saigon area delivering official mail and ADS and safehand bags.

#### Air Dispatch Service

- 17. ADS figures were:
  - a. ADS Bags. 178.
  - b. Safehand Bags. 78.

#### Radio

- 18. The following activities were carried out:
  - a. 2 Sqn RAAF Phan Rang. The HF RTT back-up circuit was tested weekly, and used to pass twenty-four messages on one occasion during an outage of the normal telegraph channel.
  - b. AFV Emergency Frequency. Permanent listening watch was maintained on this frequency.
  - c. Vung Tau-Nui Dat-Saigon. AN/GRC-106 back-up communications were tested regularly.
  - d. Shipping. Schedules were worked with:
    - (1) HMAS Hobart.
    - (2) HMAS Jeparit.
    - (3) AV Harry Chauvel.
    - (4) AV Brudenell White.
  - e. Radio Australia. This was monitored with good results.
  - f. 1 ALSG Defence Net. This net was monitored nightly. Net discipline has improved since the Radiotelephone lecture and exercise.

## g. Security Monitoring.

- (1) 110 Sig Sqn Comsec Det (3) remains attached to 104 Sig Sqn. Twenty-one breaches of security were reported for the month.
- (2) Radio Section Vung Tau continues to sample monitor 1 ALSG nets.
- (3) Random monitoring of trunk telephone calls reveals that there are relatively few breaches of security since the tighten up last month, but bad language is used constantly.

#### Communication Centres

- 19. Both HQ AFV and 1 ALSG Comcens are running efficiently.
- 20. It is interesting to note that Teletypewriters TT-4A/TG in 1 ALSG Comcen could not cope with 75 band working, and have been replaced with two TT-98D/FG (150 CKP) equipments acquired from US sources.
- 21. 2 AOD traffic arrives at 1 ALSG Comcen in batches of fifty and more despite all arrangements tried to even out the flow. The Comcen will continue to work closely with 2 AOD, however it is apparent that such a large customer should be served by a tributary station once the Vung Tau MRS opens and settles down.

#### ENGINEERING

#### General

- 22. Telegraph Circuit Availability Summary. Annex C.
- 23. The availability of all circuits remained at a satisfactory level.
- National Rear Link. The increase in Melbourne availability was due to less loss in propagation.
- 25. Technical Maintenance. The back-log in equipment for repair has disappeared, and the workshop staff is busy testing 1851 modules and other equipment ready for the opening of the new Transmitter Station and MRS.

#### Vung Tau Transmitter Station

- 26. The feeder-route poles, and antenna masts have been installed for the second VLPA.
- 27. Further work on Phase 2 of the installation, the move of a second transmitter to Vung Tau, has been curtailed due to the non-arrival of certain VLPA stores. SO(Sigs)2 has this in hand, but this project may now clash with other activities and be further delayed.
- 28. The generator shed has been RF screened and the generators have been reinstalled for easier maintenance. Rewiring is proceeding, and the installation is to be tested and handed back to the unit from RAE on 6 Oct 70.

#### Vung Tau MRS

- 29. The squadron took delivery of six AN/TGC-5AX transmit, and six AN/TGC-5AX receive/monitor consoles on 22 Sep on loan from US Signal Corps. These have been installed in place of Australian equipment in MRS Saigon, releasing this equipment ready to move to and be installed in MRS Vung Tau.
- 30. Engineer work is all but complete in the MRS. Jobs outstanding are installation of three new air-corditioners, and the last of the power wiring.
- 31. Ducting has arrived at last, and is being fitted. The last major worry the engineering panel should arrive daily.
- 32. The target date for opening the MRS remains at 28 Oct 70.

#### Line and Antennae

- 33. Line. Apart from general maintenance tasks, the line section:
  - a. Replaced the line from HQ AFV to "The Buis" (Officer Accommodation) in Saigon. The run was about two miles through city streets.
  - b. Built a 15 pair run from 1 ALSG to Vung Tau township to replace the old cable to SIB HQ, R and C Centre, and the CA Office.
  - c. Replaced eight cables in the 1 ALSG area.

## 34. Antennae. Rigging tasks were:

- a. Maintenance of antennae at Nui Dat.
- b. Maintenance of antennae, mast and feeders at Saigon.
- c. Replacement of guys on Jamaica and Delta antennae for Radio Section.
- d. Erection of masts and feeder route poles for the second VLPA at the Transmitter Station Vung Tau.

#### Deployment Troop

- Deployment Troop detachments remain at Nui Dat and the Horseshoe providing five telephone channels for whoever occupies the Horseshoe. Currently this is HQ 7 RAR again.
- The total outage time for the month was 10 hrs 52 mins, that is 98.5% circuit availability the worst for some time, and mainly through 10KVA generator faults. The generator problem is under consideration now, and at first glance will not be easy to solve. The faults divide roughly into three with no particular pattern appearing:
  - a. Water in the fuel causing motor failure.
  - b. Various mechanical failures in the motor.
  - c. Electrical problems.

### Recording of Courts Martial

37. A second trial recording is scheduled for 12 Oct when DAAG, DADLS AFV and staff will enact a Court Martial in the Court Martial Room 1 ALSG for the benefit of our technicians.

38. It is hoped to develop a simple recording system for use by HQ AFV legal staff, and thus obviate the need to call in civilian specialists from Australia.

#### Public Address Systems

- 39. The squadron installed and operated public address equipment for:
  - a. 1 ALSG Basketball Grand Final 28 Sep.
  - b. AATTV Ceremonial Parade for the presentation of the Meritorious Unit Citation 30 Sep.
  - c. The official opening of the Kevin Wheatley Stadium.

#### TRAINING AND DEFENCE

- 40. Range Practices. Normal weekly range practices were conducted such that each soldier fires once per month.
- 41. Weekly Runs. Weekly runs of one and a half miles in boots by all members under forty years of age continued.
- 42. Grenade Practice. A squadron grenade throw was conducted on 15 Sep.
- 43. US Signal Corps Courses at 1st Sig Bde Long Binh.
  - a. One member attended 02/71 Cable Splicers' Course 10 Aug 4 Sep 70.
  - b. One member attended 02/71 AN/GRC-106 Maintenance Course 7 Sep 2 Oct 70.
  - c. Both students obtained high marks, were graded "Honours Students" and topped their respective courses. This has become the rule and not the exception.
- Subject C Coaching. The unit is planning a coaching course for Subject C for promotion to Cpl and Sgt. Coaching sessions are to be held weekly after normal working hours, and culminate in a two day coaching course before the exam is attempted 30 Nov.
- 45. Trade Testing. Five Linemen Fd were successfully trade-tested as Linemen PL on 21 Sep.
- 46. Practice Fire Alarm. A practice general fire alarm was held on 18 Sep. The results were pleasing.
- 47. Unit Lectures. Two unit lectures were conducted during the month. They are:

- a. "Malaria" by the 1 ALSG Hygiene Inspector on 14 Sep.
- b. "Security" by the OC, Ops Offr and WO1 Spvr Comcen on 29 Sep.
- 48. Patrols. The following patrols were successfully completed during the month:
  - a. Day patrol 3 Sep.
  - b. Day patrol 8 Sep.
  - c. Night patrol 24/25 Sep.
  - d. Night patrol 30 Sep/1 Oct.

## 49. Incidents.

- a. The "War Veterens" demonstrated against poor conditions, especially the government's housing policy, in Saigon 3 Sep. Shots were exchanged with the police and the army, and personnel of Saigon Det were forced to avoid certain areas of the city and to keep their heads down.
- b. On 7 Sep, one Vietnamese civilian was shot dead, another wounded and a third captured after attempting to break into the 2 AFCU compound near the Sigs Lines. A search of the swamp area immediately outside the perimeter wire was made by a low-flying helicopter using a powerful search-light for about two hours. The incident stressed the need for 110 Sig Sqn picquets to remain alert.
- 50. Night Defensive Position "ISA". The squadron contributed three operators to assist in the 1 ALSG occupation of NDP ISA about three miles South of DAT DO mid Sep to 8 Oct.

#### CIVIL AFFAIRS

#### 51. General.

- a. General support to CA projects continued during the month.
- b. Twenty-two boxes and cartons of clothes, toys and "Pentavite" donated by The Pearce Church Ladies and the Farrer Primary School of Canberra, were given to the An Phong Orphanage.
- c. A world globe donated by The Pearce Church Ladies was presented to the Vung Tau Protestant Primary School.
- d. Four cartons of medical supplies, baby food, childrens' clothing and toys were received from AVCAP ready for delivery to the An Phong.

Childrens' Tet is a festival for small children when they receive presents and are encouraged to play games and be happy.

- 55. Eighteen personnel marched into the squadron and twenty-one marched out on return to Australia.

- 57. Three members were returned to Australia prematurely during the month. These were:

#### Amenities

- 59. The squadron recorded 277 Amenities tapes during the month.
- 60. This service may come to a stand-still if Amenities do not provide funds for the purchase of new master and slaves tapes soon. The quality of the recording is begining to drop for the want of new tapes.

#### Sport

61. Volleyball and Rugby football continued during the month, but the unit did particularly well in water polo and basketball by staying in the competition almost to the last.

## Q ADMINISTRATION

62. Boards of Survey. The value of boards was \$338.75.

## 63. New Works.

- a. Renovation of the MRS is nearing completion.
- b. The new Troop HQ/Tape Library Building is erected and the office space is available. The Tape Library is yet to be fitted with equipment benches and air-conditioning.
- c. One new barrack hut is complete, the second is about two-thirds complete.
- d. The squadron has managed to obtain approval for the erection of a 60 ft by 20 ft Q Store. This should be ready for use by mid December, and will mean that harrassed Q personnel will be able to set out their stores in clean, secure and weather-proof surroundings. At present there is grossly inadequate storage space.

## 64. Spot Checks and Internal Auditing.

- a. Weekly spot checks and internal auditing continued.
- b. Sub-account holdings at Saigon and Nui Dat are gradually being whittled down.
- c. The QM is presently conducting a check of Vung Tau sub account documentation and stores.
- 65. CES Accounting. A 100% check of all CES equipments is being carried out and due for completion by 30 Oct.
- 66. Transport. The unit can only manage to keep nine of its fourteen light vehicles on the road due to the time taken in maintenance, repairs and servicing. HQ AFV jas been approached to release the restrictions on three of the light vehicles imposed earlier in the year. With the full entitlement of seventeen vehicles, the unit should be able to maintain vehicles for:
