

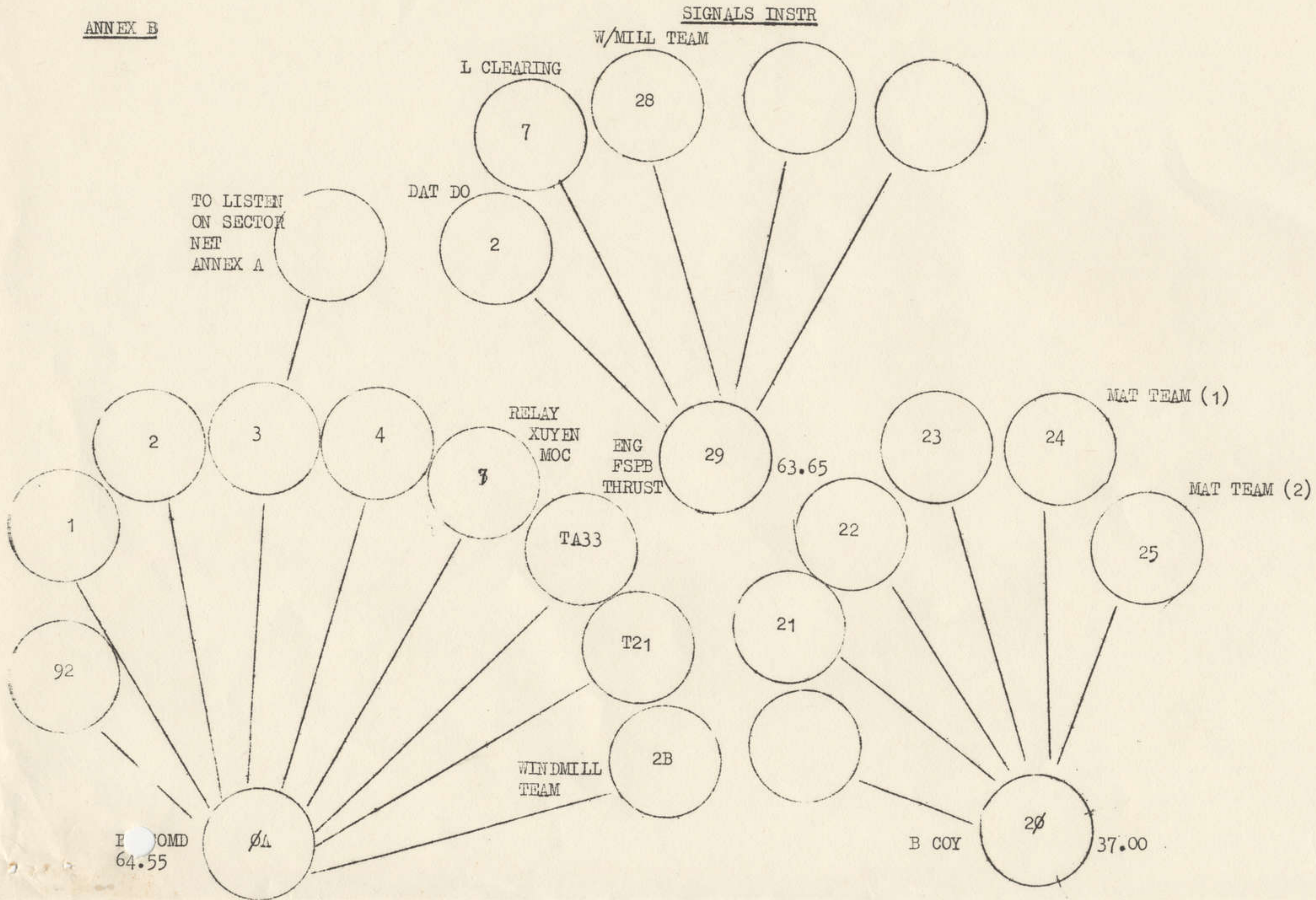

REVIEW OF THE INTELLIGENCE AND FRIENDLY FORCES SITUATION
FOR OPERATION ESSO

Topography

- 1. Maps are gen accurate. Land clearing is shown on the overprinted maps issued seperately. Terrain is dominated by the LONG HAI mountain complex.
- 2. The low lying areas are gen inundated and armd mov will be severely restricted.

Vegetation

- 3. Most of AO ALDGATE is either padi, or has been land cleared. The SOUTH EASTERN portion yet to be cleared is covered by secondary growth varying mostly between three and twenty ft high.

Weather

- 4. The SW monsoon is in full force during Jun. Regular daily shower and thunderstorm activity can be expected. Increasing wetness will cause soil tractionability to decrease. Rainfall will be between 8 to 14 inches. Temperatures will vary between 72 and 90 degrees.

- 7. The LONG HAI complex is a traditional haven for local geurilla units. It is a base for harassment of DAT DO and LONG DIEN.
- 8. Recently 9 RAR have been engaged in land clearing and pacification tasks in the area. For base data see Trace 1 to this review.
- 9. Land clearing tasks at this stage are about 50% complete and these teams are being harassed by the en. When finished, the land clearing will deny the en covered access to the population centres.

Summary

15. The land clearing in AO ALDGATE is cutting the en in the LONG HAI's off from the population and resupply centres. He may be expected to avoid contact where possible and use mines, booby traps and attacks by fire to delay and demoralize 5 RAR.

5 RAR COACHING COURSE FOR SUBJECTS A & C
FOR PROMOTION TO THE RANK OF CPL AND SGT
2 JUN - 12 JUN 69 (INCLUSIVE)

General

1. A promotion course for subjects A and C for promotion to the rank of Cpl and Sgt, will be conducted by 5 RAR from 2 Jun 69 to 12 Jun 69 dates inclusive.

Aim

2. The aims of the course are:
 - a. To qualify selected temporary NCO's in subjects A and C for promotion to Cpl and Sgt.
 - b. To qualify selected substantiated cpls in subjects A and C for promotion to Sgt.

Scope

3. The subjects to be covered on this course are as laid down in Part 3 of the AMF Promotion Manual and in addition one complete day has been set aside for recapitulation of tactical subjects which will not be covered for qualification.

General Outline

4.
 - a. Periods

The course has been designed for 8 instructional periods per day plus 3 night instruction periods. In addition 11 night periods have been set aside for controlled study and lesson preparation and two periods for a written examination for Subject A. Two further day periods have been added for a written examinations for subject C.
 - b. Programme

The programme is based on a maximum of 40 students in 5 squads of 8 students. Each squad will be controlled by a squad instr (WO2)
 - c. Student Instruction (Drill)

Each student is required to teach after seeing one Demonstration Drill Lesson and Mutual Instruction Lesson (MI) he will participate in seven other MI Lessons before he is required to teach a Squad Instruction Drill Lesson (SI) which is to count for qualification in Subject A.
 - d. Student Instruction (Weapons)

As per para 4 c
 - e. Military Law and Administration

There are 18 periods set aside for lectures 3 periods for a written exercise and discussion, 1 period for demonstration and discussion and 2 periods for a written examination in Subject C. In addition 3 periods at night are set aside for controlled study.

f. Duration of Periods

Each period is to be of one hours duration to provide for basic instructional flexibility eg. criticism, discussion, 'smoko' and movement of squads to the next lesson

5. Coys are to submit nominations for the course to the RSM by 0800 hrs 31 May 69. Coys are to ensure that students nominated for Subjects A and C for Sgt are in fact qualified to sit for the examinations in accordance with the promotion manual requirements. All company vacancies are to be filled.

6. Pamphlets and Publications

- a. There could be a shortage of some pamphlets required for the course. Students who can provide pamphlets from their own resources would ease the present shortage. There will be a shortage of the Army Law Manual and Financial Instructions, ARO's and MBI's, companies are requested to loan a selected student the company copy of these publications.
- b. Annex C details the pamphlets required for the course. These are to be issued by Course HQ at 1600 hrs on 1 Jun 69 at the Bn Conference Room.

7. Stationary and Training Aids

Students are to provide their own note books, pencils pens erasers, rules and clue boards. The last item will be essential for taking notes when tables or desks are not available. Students are to use their initiative and commonsense in the preparation of having aids they may require. There will be no issue of materials for this purpose. Local materials must be used eg. ammo boxes, newspaper and industrial markers, chalk boards, wrappings and brown paper etc.

8. Administrationa. Accommodation

All students will live in Sp coy area in two marquees which will be erected on the 'Digger Campbell' oval. Students will be required to bring a bed, bedding and a steel trunk, these will be collected by vehicle at the times laid down in para h of these instructions on 1 Jun 69. Students will assemble these items at their respective coy Q Stores prior to the arrival of the vehicle and will accompany their own items to the Digger Campbell oval. It is stressed that all students below the rank of Sgt will sleep in the marquees provided. Students of the rank of Sgt will be accommodated in the Bn HQ lines.

b. Meals

All coys will arrange for adjustment of ration figures. All students of the rank of Cpl and below will be rationed for with Admin Coy and will eat in the Admin Coy OR's mess for the duration of the course as from the evening meal on 1 Jun 69. DUTIES FOR THE COURSE DUTY STUDENT

1. You are overall responsible for the general conduct of the students.
2. You will ensure the course is present for each instruction period where the full course is required at the time and place laid down on the Detailed Programme.
3. You will hand the course over to the instructor at all course lectures and demonstrations ensuring correctness of numbers and of students.
4. You will ensure that all Lecture Rooms and squad areas used by the course are clean and set up for the next day at the completion of the days training.
5. You will ensure that all weapons drawn from the course store (End of Chapel) are correctly cleaned and oiled before being handed back in.
6. You will supervise and sign out from the course store weapon which may be required for private study and lesson preparation overnight you will ensure that they are returned undamaged and clean prior to the breakfast parade in the morning.
7. You will carry out any duties in addition to these prescribed duties given to you by the RSM.
8. You will supervise squad duty students as required.
9. You will ensure that the following routine is complied with and take action to ensure that it is carried out.
 - a. Reveille 0600 (Course will be woken by duty student)
 - b. Sick parade 0630 (Duty student will make out RAP chits and march sick students to the RAP)
 - c. PARADE AND RATION STATE (The duty student will complete the course roll book and give it to the ord room cpl of Admin Coy along with a ration state by 0730 hrs daily)
 - d. COURSE PARADE 0745 (The duty student will ensure the course is ready to march on parade by 0745 hrs daily)
 - e. Cleaning Parade 0715 (Duty student will supervise cleaning of store weapons)
 - f. Lights out 2215 (Duty student will ensure all lights are extinguished at this time and students are quiet and in bed)
10. Your tour of duty will be for 24 hrs 0600 hrs until 0600 hrs daily.

DUTIES FOR SQUAD DUTY STUDENT

1. You will be responsible for the overall general conduct of the members of your squad.
2. You will ensure the squad is present for each squad lesson lecture or demonstration at the time and place laid down on the detailed programme.
3. You will ensure your squad training areas are clean at the completion of the days training.
4. You will march your squad to their training areas when required.
5. You will hand your squad over to your squad instructor before the start of all squad lessons ensuring the numbers are correct. For course lectures you will report your squad present or otherwise to the course duty student.
6. You will carry out any additional duties given to you by your squad instructor.
7. You will assist the course duty student as required.

FORM OF EXAMINATION AND QUALIFICATION
REF : AMF PROMOTION MANUAL

1. Subject A

This examination is held in two parts - practical and written:

- a. Practical (Weapons) Students are required to teach a weapons lesson. They are to be answered on:
- (1) Lesson Plan, stores and trg aids
 - (2) Knowledge
 - (3) Method of presenting lesson and ability to instruct
 - (4) Leadership and Command ability.

100 marks are allotted and students must obtain at least 50 marks to qualify.

- b. Practical (Drill) Students are required to teach a drill lesson and exercise squad in various movements and formations. They are exercised on:
- (1) Lesson planning and presentation
 - (2) Knowledge
 - (3) Words of command
 - (4) Fault checking
 - (5) Front and Flanks
 - (6) Bearing Power of Command and ability.

100 marks are allotted and at least 50 marks are needed to qualify

- c. Written test 200 marks are allotted, 100 marks are required to qualify.
- d. To pass Subject A students must qualify in both practical and written tests.

2. Subject C

This is a written examination in Administration and Military Law.
50% of marks allotted must be obtained to qualify.

WITHDRAWAL OF CLOTHING AND EQUIPMENT FROM MEMBERS RTA

1. The principle to be observed when a member is RTA is that the maximum amount of personal equipment is to remain in the theatre and;

a. As a minimum, soldiers RTA are to have in their possession all items of clothing and necessaries applicable to Block Scale 3002/01;

b. As a maximum, items on issue against Block Scale 3002/14, except items shown as unit stores, may be retained by the member if he wishes to do so. This does not include combat clothing tropical, which is to remain in AFV.

2. Any items withdrawn from members before their RTA that are in a satisfactory condition are to be laundered and reissued as field dress. Members' AAB 83 are to have items withdrawn entered in red, initialled by the member, signed by the Q representative and AFV SOPs Part 3 Section 8 quoted in lieu of an AAF F25A. Blank spaces are to be ruled through. It is essential that items shown in a member's AAB 83 as being on issue to him are physically in his possession. Failure to ensure this will cause those members being discharged on RTA to be debited for any apparent deficiencies.

3. Items in addition to Block Scale 3002/01 are not to be replaced by new items, just prior to RTA. In particular, boots GP are not to be replaced with new boots, as these are not a normal issue in Australia. The member may however take with him one pair of boots which he has on issue.

4. Items shown as non-expendable in Block Scale 01/31 are to be retained in this theatre.

5. If items of clothing and necessaries rendered unserviceable by climatic or operational conditions cannot be replaced by the unit to bring the member's issues to the entitlement under Block Scale 3002/01, the unit is to withdraw the items from the member's AAB 83. The AAB 83 is to be processed as in paragraph 2 above.
