### COMMANDERS DIARIES INSTRUCTIONS

#### AIM

1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organization and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

#### GENERAL

- 2. Entries are to be made daily on AF C 2118 (Adapted) each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.
- Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties (Australia)", Chapter 2, Section 12.

#### RESPONSIBILITY

### **During Non-operational Periods**

4. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled by commanders of all formations.

### **During Operational Periods** (1)

- 5. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled in duplicate by:
  - a. Commanders of all formations.
  - b. Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a brigadier or above.
  - c. Heads of services not below the rank of lieutenant colonel.
  - d. Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
  - e. Unit commanders.
  - f. Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

#### COMPILATION

- 6. Both original and duplicate copies are to consist of:
  - a. Cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted).
  - b. Index as printed on cover.
  - c. Narrative (AF C 2118) (Adapted).
  - d. Annexes as shown in the Index.
- 7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes are to be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer is to be included.
- 8. The annexes are to be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an annex NIL will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters. starting at B.

### DISPOSAL

- 13. Original Commander's Diary. This is to be forwarded monthly, unless otherwise ordered, by the seventh day of the succeeding month direct to AHQ.
- 14. Duplicate Commander's Diary. This must be clearly marked as a duplicate. It is to be sent separately from the original to AHQ one month after the original has been despatched but not before the former has been acknowledged.
- 15. When overseas, both copies of diaries are to be sent through the Army Records organization in the overseas theatre but at different times.
- 16. TOP SECRET Supplementary Diaries.
  - a. The documents referred to in Paragraph 9 together with a list of them made out on AF C 2118 (Adapted) must be placed in separate cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted). All details must be filled in and the cover clearly marked in red: "ANNEX Z OFFICER ONLY". It may be convenient to group the papers by appendices.
  - b. Supplementary diaries must be forwarded under the normal rules for TOP SECRET correspondence, to AHQ. The inner envelope must be plainly marked:





### COMMS REPORT - JUL 66

### General

1. This report covers the period 9 Jul 66 - 9 Aug 66 except when other wise indicated.

### Point to Point Circuits

- 2. Circuit Data Summaries are at Annexes 'A' to 'E'.
- 3. Aust TRC-24 system is generally satisfactory no change to channel allocations on deployment of detachments.
- 4. Remaining voice circuit to 6 RAR rear elms closed 1 Jul 66.
- 5. TRC-75 dets ability to provide RTT back-up is improving but is limited by high equipment fault incidence.
- Keying lines to Austean VIETNAM transmitter and receiver sites still subject to failures generally due to accidental damage. They remain a major source of outages on MELBOURNE SAIGON circuit.

### Area Comms

### 7. SAIGON

- a. Graph of traffic handled by combined major relay station and sigcen HQ AFV is at Annex 'F'.
- b. With increase in tfc handled, operating areas are becoming very cramped. Building of huts to house HQ 145 Sig Sqn at Austean VIETNAM transmitter site has been commenced with a view to expanding Austean VIETNAM installations in the FWMAO building.
- c. Installation of a teleconference room adjacent to the HQ AFV Sigcen has begun.
- d. Installation of HQ AFV Inter-communications system (initially serving Comd, C of S, G2 and registry) was undertaken.

### 8. VUNG TAU

- a. Planning for a comcen installation has commenced.
- b. A detailed breakout of traffic is at Annex 'G'.

Details of faults on BUCKNELL generators as they occur at dets are at Annex 'J' together with a summary of comments by 101 Fd Wksps on generators evacuated to them. The failure of BUCKNELL generators is particularly serious - for example, 15 of 18 generators were unserviceable as at 8 Aug 66.

Availability of mainttenance spare parts to 101 Fd Wksps is a major problem and urgent staff action is being taken on this. Subject to adequate spare parts and RAEME support being available to evacuate and replace eqpts/major assemblies it is considered that four to five dets can be kept operational for most of the time.

### 11. AN/PRC-47

Fault rate remains high - as a trial, some defective equipments are being evacuated to US repair installations.

### 12. Gen

The fault rate on telegraph, cipher, swbd and AN/PRC-47 equipments remains high. This must be accepted as a normal situation in this theatre. Attention is being given to amending maintenance scales to reflect this.

### Frequencies

13. Authority for frequency management in the 20 mcx to 75.95 mcs band has passed from USARV to II FFORCEV. A re-allocation was made to AFV resulting in more frequencies being available.
