  - f. Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

  - b. Index as printed on cover.

SUMMARY OF OPERATIONS - MAY 1967

General

1. Command. On 1 May 67 110 Sig Sqn assumed responsibility for all theatre communications held and provided by 145 Sig Sqn.

2. Personnel.

a. On arrival in South Vietnam 110 Sig Sqn was 50 men under strength. This deficiency was not immediately apparent as the greater part of 145 Sig Sqn was still in the theatre. The lack of manpower became critical when 145 Sig Sqn returned to Australia and this factor combined with major transmitter failyre on the Melbourne link was instrumental in causing a "minimise" to be issued on 12th May.

b. A conference of all officers of 110 Sig Sqn was held on 4 May at Phu Tho. Discussion was centered around squadron policy with reference to the functional reorganisation. Future communication requirements and the presently operating shift system were also discussed at length. Other topics brought to notice were the efficiency of the "Q" system and the welfare of the troops, including the responsibilities of the officers and NCO's.

3. Enemy Activities

a. Terrorist activities were expected to increase considerably during the period of Ho Chi Minh's Birthday (19 May). Intelligence reports indicated that a rocket attack on VC Hill was imminent. If the repeater on VC Hill was lost a HF radio backup using AN/PRC 47 sets was to be used, working either CW or RTT depending on the quality of the circuit. In the event of the equipment on VC Hill being destroyed the reserve AN/MRC 69 held at Vung Tau was readied to be lifted in. The rocket attack did not eventuate and therefore the emergency procedures were not tested.

b. From intelligence reports received it was believed that a VC force, approximately platoon size, was located about 2000 yds south of Tan Son Nhut Airport. Further information located this force in a rubber plantation situated approximately 1000 yds from sqn HQ at Phu Tho. The threat remained for several days during which time the guard at night was doubled.

4. Defence and Deployment. Following the VC threat at sqn HQ, the vulnerability of the station was realised. Two courses of action were immediately taken.

a. In response to the squadron's requests, HQ Coy AFV agreed to supplement the existing guard. The guard at sqn HQ at night now consists of three men from 1ATF and three from HQ Coy.

b. Sandbagging of the transmitter building and construction of permanent bunkers was commenced.

/5. Casualties

5. Casualties. 58746 Cpl B.J. Humphries who received radio frequency burns while repairing the rear link transmitters was evacuated to Australia on 23 May.

6. Squadron Headquarters, Phu Tho

a. Drainage and Flood Control. The site of sqn HQ and the transmitter building is situated on low ground adjacent to a swamp. During the "wet" much of the area is inundated and the remainder transformed to a bog. In a reply to a request for assistance the Chief of Staff, HQ AFV and the SORE 1 visited the area to ascertain the extent of the problem. A formal request from HQ AFV to US engineers for area improvement was later submitted.

b. Perimeter Fence. Since the occupation of the site at Phu Tho the area allocated to the squadron has been steadily encroached from all sides. On the north boundary by Vietnamese refugees and on all other sides by US forces units. In an attempt to halt the infiltration by American Forces the US Transportation Motor Pool, who occupy the majority of the area, were requested to re-establish the squadron perimeter fence which had been knocked down, stolen or disposed of as seen fit. It was agreed after some debate that the Americans rebuild the fence using stores provided by 110 Sig Sqn.

7. Vung Tau Detachment. All accomodation has been moved to the new location on Logan Hill. The tentage has been re-erected on the concrete bases laid down for the construction of permanent quarters. The signal centre and the tape relay station are still located in the old area.

#### Communications

8. Rear Link

a. Receiver Station. The keying lines from receivers were again cut on the 5th May by civilian contractors working on extensions to the Tan Son Nhut Airport. AN/PRC 25 sets used as the emergency back up failed to work. An attempt was made to make contact through Vung Tau using a R391 and a CV 157. This was unsatisfactory because of tuning difficulties with the CV 157.

b. Transmitter Station. On the 12th May both transmitters were severely damaged when lightning hit the aeriials.

9. Traffic. The lack of manpower resulting in the departure of 145 Sig Sqn coupled with major equipment faults culminated on May 12 with a "minimise" being issued.

10. New Tape Relay Station - Saigon. With the increase in the Australian Force in Vietnam it has become quite apparent that the existing signal centre and tape relay station are totally inadequate to efficiently carry out the tasks demanded. In response to requests by 110 Sig Sqn a new signal centre and tape relay station is being planned. To meet this end a planning team from 127 Sig Sqn arrived in theatre on 6 May to finalise the user requirement. 127 Sig Sqn has been allocated the task of detailed planning and installation of this project.

11. Radio Relay Repeater Site - VC Hill. The radio relay repeater equipment on VC Hill is presently located within the US Stratcom Compound. This location achieves an ideal path to Saigon, but the circuit to 1ALSG is barely marginal. The summit of VC Hill was reconoitered on 16 May with a view to relocating the repeater station at a more favourable site. A satisfactory site was found to be available and a request for this site to be obtained was submitted to HQ AFV on 24 May (Attached as Annex A).

/12. Additional



12. Additional Communications. In order to satisfy the HQ AFV request for a voice circuit to 1ATF in event of a failure in the radio relay system a comprehensive aerial system, comprising four half wave dipoles, has been erected at the transmitter station site at Phu Tho. This circuit was satisfactorily tested, both at night and during the day on 23 and 30 May. However until similar aeriels are constructed at 1ATF the circuit remains suitable for CW only.

13. Equipments

a. Generators. At present the signals installations in the Vung Tau area are powered by a multitude of 5KVA generators. Due to the arduous conditions encountered and the age of these machines the failure rate exceeds the rate of repair. On 2 May the battle to maintain communications reached its lowest when out of 10 machines normally in use only 4 were available for use. A crisis was averted when 2 Comp Ord Depot released two new machines for use by Det 110 Sig Sqn at Vung Tau.

14. b. Aerials. The "Deeco" type masts supporting the transmitting rhombic aeriels were at one stage enclosed within substantial fences, but with the ravages of time and neighbouring US forces these fences have been reduced to a few star pickets and a couple of lengths of barbed wire. Without these fences the masts become extremely vulnerable to the large amount of motor transport operating in the same compound. On 2 May a US Army operated truck backed into one of the guy wires inflicting a severe bend at about the 80 foot level. Prompt action by the rigger detachment prevented the mast from collapsing and it was returned to service within four hours. To prevent further mishaps the US authorities placed several large earth filled drums around each set of guys.

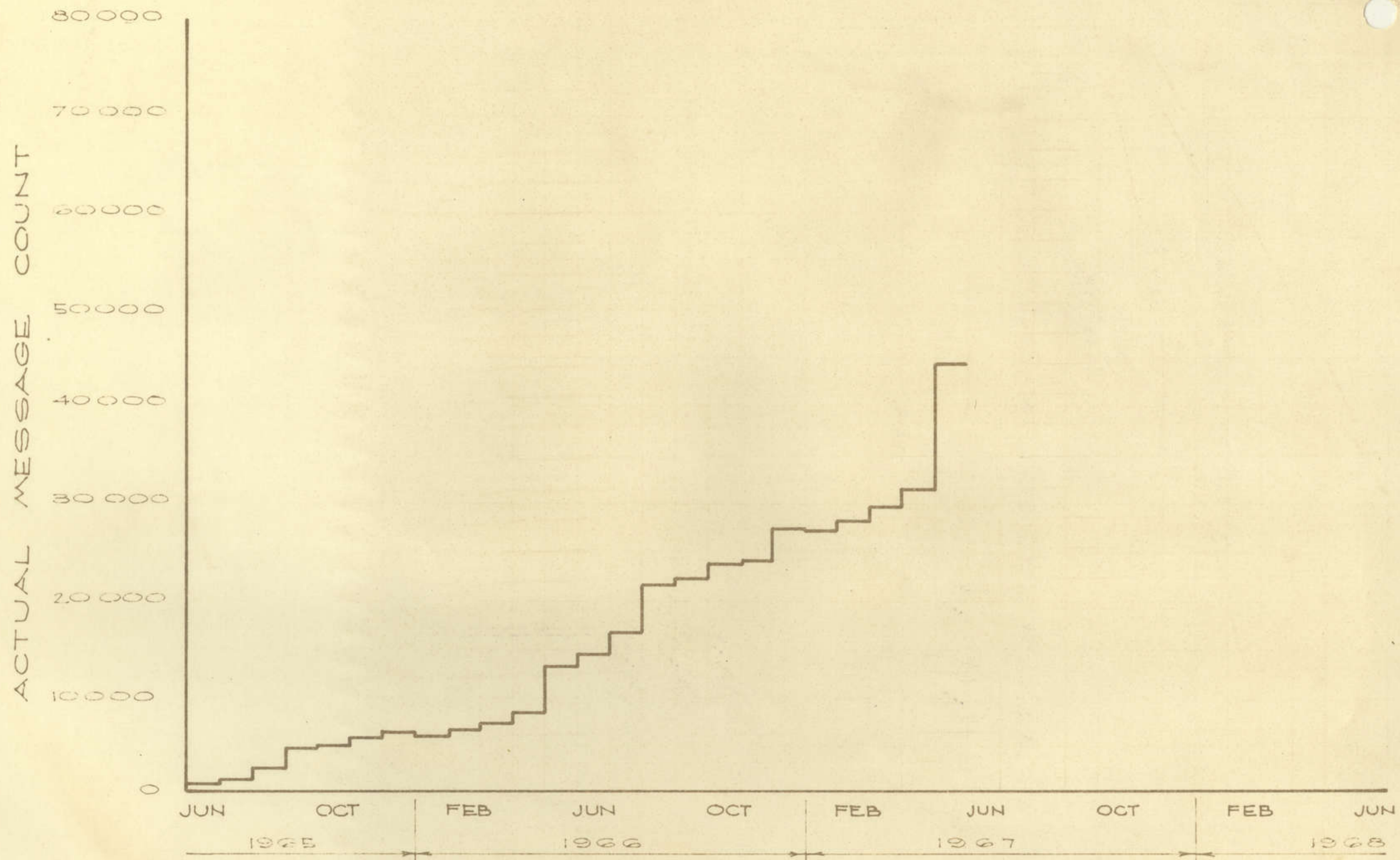

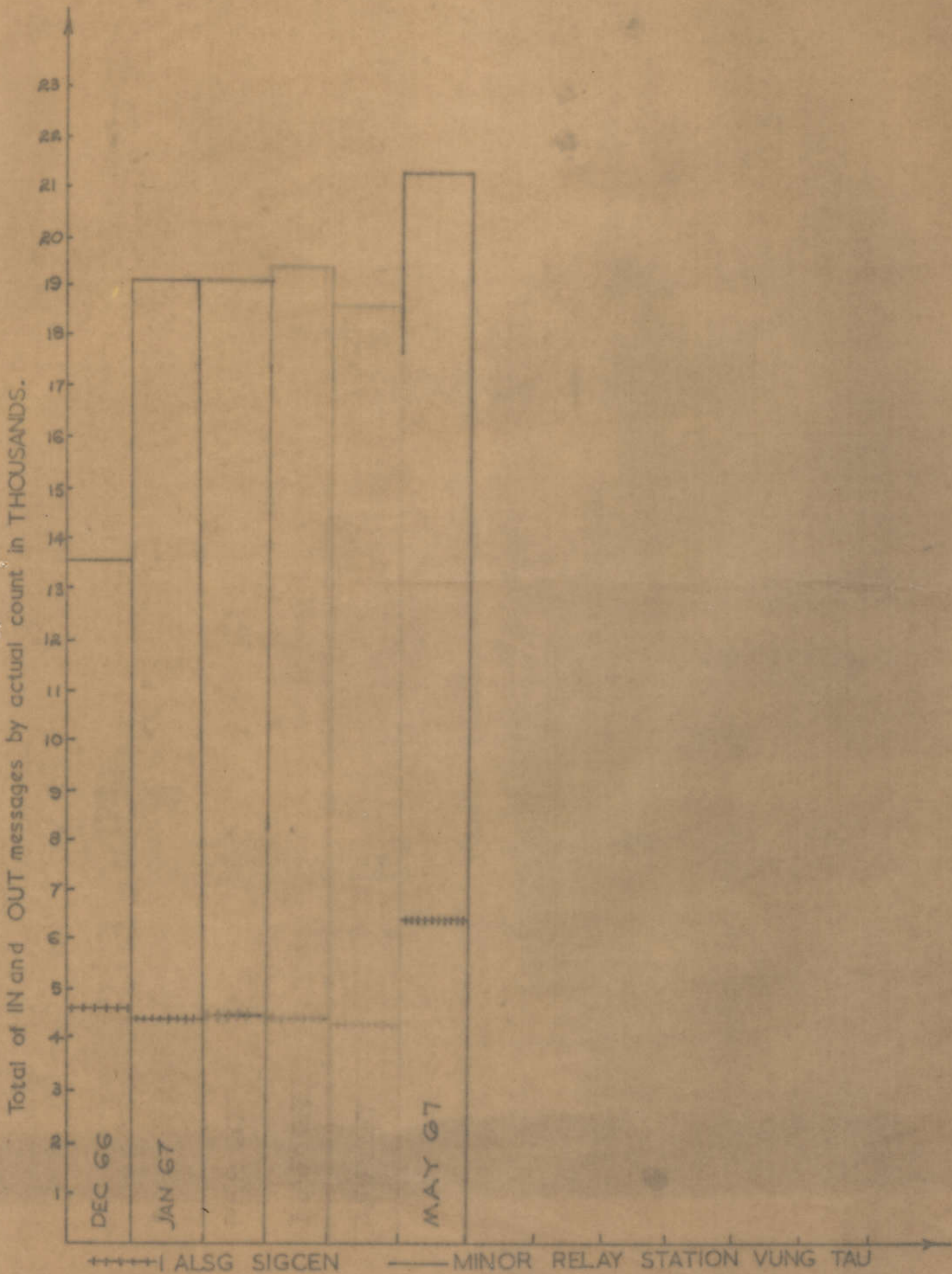
# TRAFFIC VOLUME — MAJOR RELAY STATION SAIGON

TRAFFIC VOLUMES MINOR RELAY

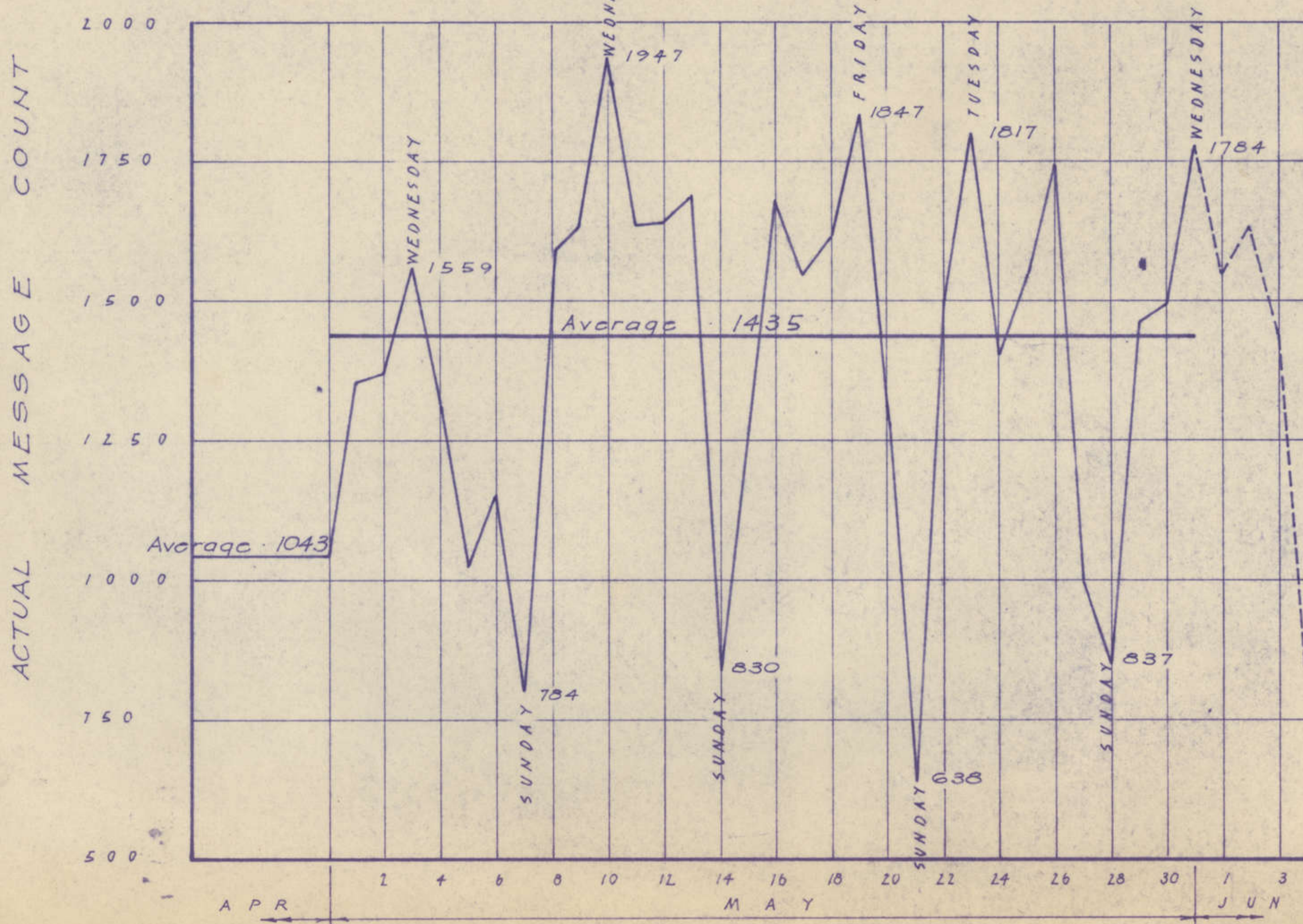
STATIONS VUNG TAU & I ALSG SIGCEN

RE-LOCATION RADIO RELAY REPEATER TERMINAL - VC HILL

Reference: Map Vung Tau scale 1:12,500 (attached)

BACKGROUND

1. The VC Hill Repeater Terminal manned by this sqn, is of vital importance to the theatre Radio Relay System. All channels from Saigon to 1 ALSG and 1 ATF are relayed through the terminal.
2. For the past 12 months, the terminal has been located within the US STRATCOM compound (GR 268455) on the southern peak of VC Hill, which is the highest and most prominent feature on the Vung Tau Peninsular. Because of it's prominence, the compound has attracted a mass of US troposcatter, microwave and radio relay detachments.
3. The location of the sqn terminal is ideal for the shot back to Saigon, but is screened from the 1 ALSG area on the beach by higher ground outside the compound. Theoretically, the circuit should not work, but due to "obstacle gain" characteristics and the high conductivity of the soil in the area, sufficient signal is reaching the terminal at 1 ALSG to provide a marginal circuit. The weakness of this signal and the consequent need for constant level adjustments by detachment technicians, is probably the main cause for the unsatisfactory telephone and RTP circuits which currently exist to 1 ALSG and 1 ATF.
4. A recce of the area has been made and an excellent site from a communication viewpoint has been selected for the terminal's re-location. This site (GR 2675 4535) is the only one on the feature satisfying the line of site criteria for both Saigon and 1 ALSG. However, it is outside the US compound and does require limited development and defensive works before it can be activated.

REQUIREMENT

5. A sketch of the area is attached as Annex A, which shows the southern half of the US installations on VC Hill and the present and proposed sites for the MRC 69(R) terminal.
6. To install the terminal on the new site, a helicopter lift would be necessary, as the size of the feature is too small for both a truck and a recovery vehicle. A concrete base with 4' walls exists on the site which would be an ideal base for the shelter.

7. To give limited access to the site for personnel and equipment other than the shelter, a track would have to be cut as per the attached sketch. The task has been assessed by an RAE representative as follows:-

- 1 day for movement of bulldozer to and from site
- 4 days for digging track
- 3 days to finish off route (additional gravel is available from point 200 m from site)

8. It is considered impractical to tie in the defensive perimeter of the new site with the US compound because of the distance involved. It is recommended that Dannaet be constructed 40 ft from the site as shown on the sketch. Trip wires should be laid in the area between the site's defensive perimeter and the Vietnamese compound. An engineer estimate of the work involved is:-

- 20 Man Days - Clearing undergrowth on site to beyond wire perimeter
- 50 Man Days - Installation of Dannaet

9. The land involved belongs to the local Government Authority and it is understood that approval for it's use should be sought through the US Advisory Team 79, based at Vung Tau.

10. It is requested that action be taken to obtain approval for the use of the site and that the works required, including the helicopter lift, be approved as a matter of urgency. Discussion with US STARCUM personnel on VC Hill indicate that the site is likely to be taken by other US detachments in the future if not first acquired for Australian use.

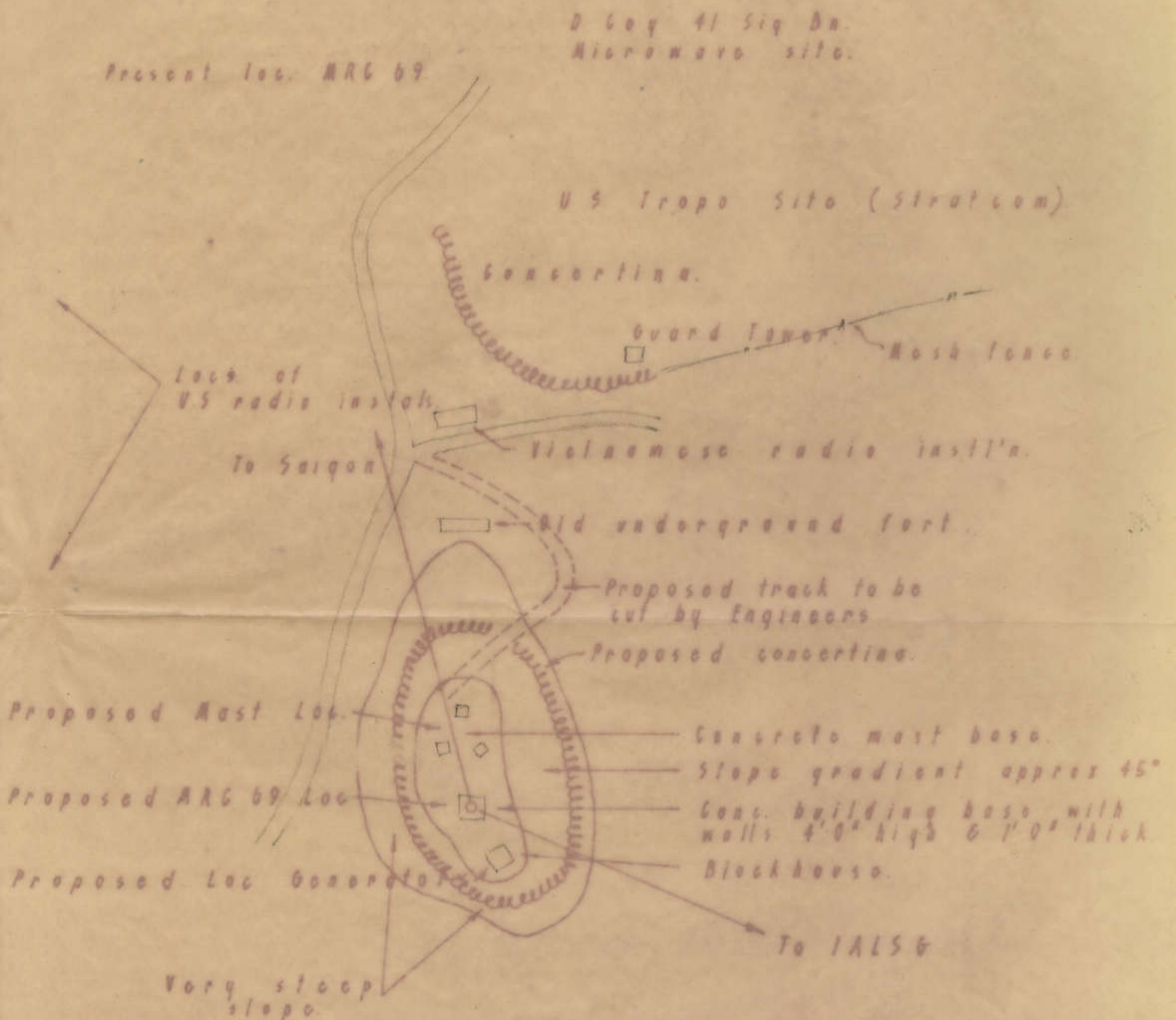

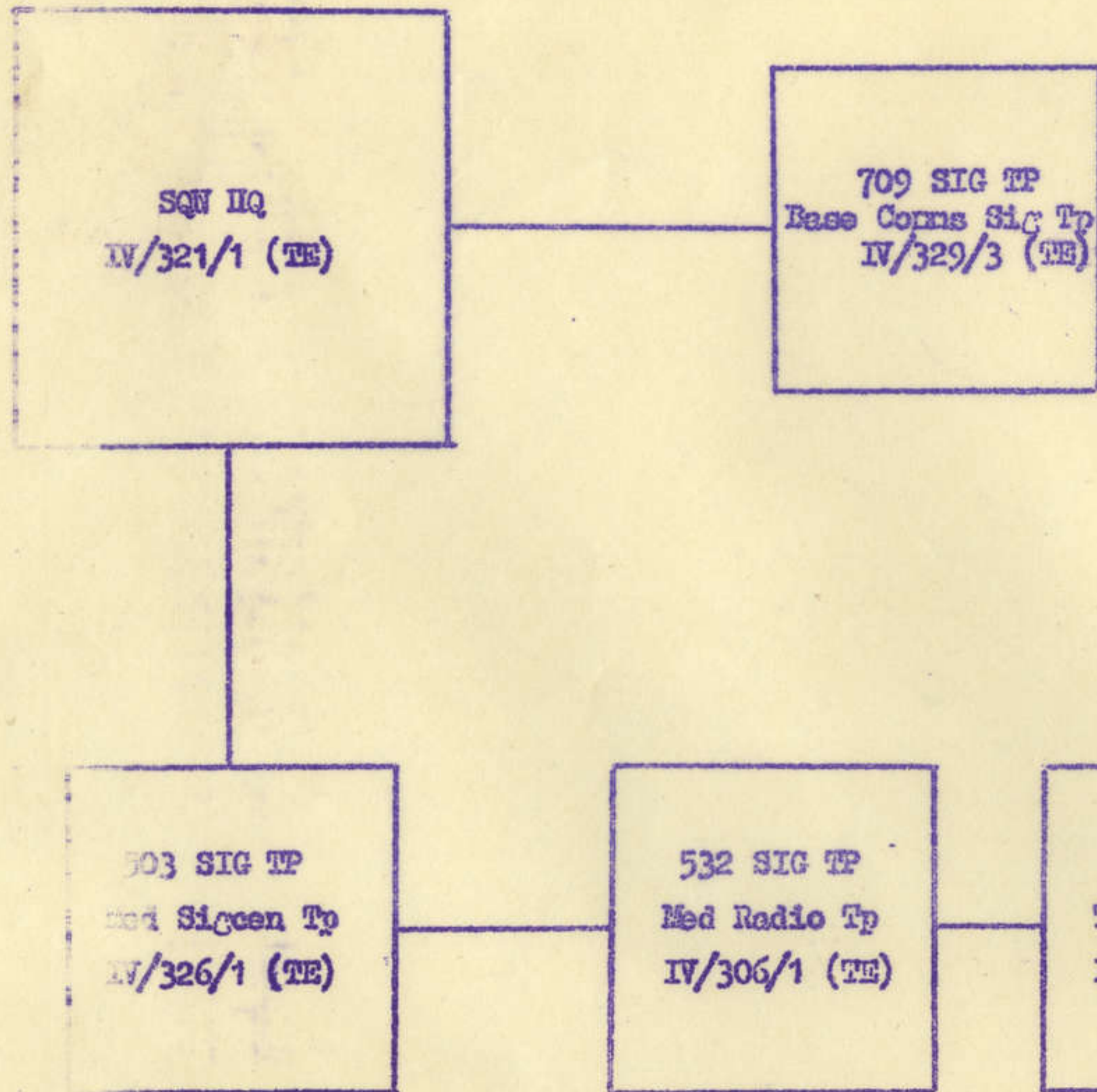
SKETCH OF PROPOSED RADIO RELAY SITE


