COMMANDERS DIARIES

INSTRUCTIONS

AIM

1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organization and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

GENERAL

2. Entries are to be made daily on AF C 2118 (Adapted) each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.
3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties (Australia)", Chapter 2, Section 12.

RESPONSIBILITY

During Non-operational Periods

4. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled by commanders of all formations.

During Operational Periods (1)

5. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled in duplicate by:
 - a. Commanders of all formations.
 - b. Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a brigadier or above.
 - c. Heads of services not below the rank of lieutenant colonel.
 - d. Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
 - e. Unit commanders.
 - f. Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

COMPILATION

6. Both original and duplicate copies are to consist of:
 - a. Cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted).
 - b. Index as printed on cover.
 - c. Narrative (AF C 2118) (Adapted).
 - d. Annexes as shown in the Index.
7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes are to be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer is to be included.
8. The annexes are to be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an annex NIL will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters, starting at B.

COMMANDER'S DIARIES
DISPOSAL

13. **Original Commander's Diary.** This is to be forwarded monthly, unless otherwise ordered, by the seventh day of the succeeding month direct to AHQ.

14. **Duplicate Commander's Diary.** This must be clearly marked as a duplicate. It is to be sent separately from the original to AHQ one month after the original has been despatched but not before the former has been acknowledged.

15. When overseas, both copies of diaries are to be sent through the Army Records organization in the overseas theatre but at different times.

16. **TOP SECRET Supplementary Diaries.**

a. The documents referred to in Paragraph 9 together with a list of them made out on AF C 2118 (Adapted) must be placed in separate cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted). All details must be filled in and the cover clearly marked in red: "ANNEX Z — OFFICER ONLY". It may be convenient to group the papers by appendices.

b. Supplementary diaries must be forwarded under the normal rules for TOP SECRET correspondence, to AHQ. The inner envelope must be plainly marked:

MONTHLY REPORT - JULY 1968

GENERAL

1. The month of July saw preparation in hand for a change of command of the Squadron. These were progressing satisfactorily when on 21 Jul 68 the Commander AFV made the decision that the date for the movement of the Squadron Headquarters to VUNG TAU and the Transmitting Station to NUI DAT should be put forward from 15 Oct 68 to 1 Sep 68 respectively with the area at PHU THO to be clear no later than 14 Aug 68. As a result Squadron planning was moved to include the necessary administrative arrangements to effect the new target dates and the handover/takeover stocktake, with the exception of attractive stores was deferred for approximately two months.
2. By the months end the revised plan was being implimented with target dates as follows:
 - a. Movement of Squadron Headquareters to VUNG TAU to be completed no later than 0800 hrs on 8 Aug 68.
 - b. Commence transmission on SAIGON - MELBOURNE Circuit no later than 7 Aug 68.
3. On 30 Jul 68 the OC designate arrived in theatre and thereafter began a period of orientation capably directed by the OC incumbent.

COMMUNICATIONS

Saigon Sigcen/MRS

4. The traffic volume handled by the Sigcen and MRS fell from 84,494 in June to a total of 70,568 messages for the period under review. This drop may possibly be accounted for by the general lull in enemy activity during this time.

Vung Tau Sigcen/MRS

5. July brought an increase in traffic from 25,722 messages in June to 28,764 messages. These figures probably reflect increased Task Force activity.

Saigon/Melbourne Circuit

6. Availability on this circuit averaged 20.2 hours per diem, which is attributable to quite ionospheric conditions.

Trunk Availability

7. Trunk availability remains high as the figures hereunder indicate
 - a. Saigon - Vung T u 94%
 - b. Saigon - Nui Dat 97%
 - c. Vung Tau - Nui Dat 98.2%
 - d. Nui Dat - Mob Deployment Team 99.8%

HF Radio Detachment

8. All in theatre HF Circuits continued to function well. Voice communications have been possible on a 24 hour basis but CW is still employed on certain schedules so as to keep operators attuned to morse working.

Telephone System

9. Connections at VUNG TAU as at 31 Jul are as follows:

- a. CB - 159
- b. Magneto - 25 (local)
- c. Trunks - 13

This board is now manned on all three positions from 0800 - 1700, at other times it is manned by one operator.

TECHNICAL/EQUIPMENT ASPECTS

Long Binh

10. Antennas: The rigger detachment progressed well on the installation of two Type 1 Rhombics at LONG BINH in the early part of the month. Trenching is completed to one antenna and all but twenty yards has been dug for the second whilst power and coaxial cable has been laid to the head mast of the former and power cable partly laid to the head mast of the latter. One mast has been completely erected and although work has commenced on all the others much remains to be done. It is anticipated that work will take 3 - 4 weeks to complete when rigger effort becomes available.

11. VHF Bearer: With the change in timetable of the Sqn HQ move, a further examination of the VHF bearer frequencies has occurred. The link to PHU THO transmitters has now closed down, and the two best frequencies selected out of the allocation. The equipment at Free World and Long Binh have now been re - aligned on these frequencies except for minor adjustments to be made at each area.

12. Alternative Bearer: The spiral 4 run to PHU LAM was again cut on 1 Jul. Investigation showed that a complete 440 yd length had been physically removed and stolen. The line crew, only two men at this stage replaced the cable and the system was again in operation by 1400 local time.

Phu Tho

13. Transmitter Ancillary Equipment: With the sudden revision of the Sqn movement timetable, it has become necessary to commence dismantling of the installation at Phu Tho. So far, the double drive cabinet, the master oscillator/monitor unit cabinet and the MT2 and power supply have all been removed and flown to Nui Dat for installation in the new transmitter building. As at 31 Jul 68, the Phu Tho site is capable of single transmission SSB emission only. By approximately 14 Aug 68, the station will be closed.

FWMAO Area

14. HQ AFV Intercom: On 7 Jul 68, the installation of the 'Telecall J' intercom system was completed. At the same time the wiring necessary for dual operation of the GS02 exclusive channel, the HQ AFV defence net and other communication facilities from the GS02 office and the Duty Room were also completed.

15. Sqn HQ Movement: The drastic alteration to the timetable of movement by Sqn HQ and the installation of the new transmitter building at Nui Dat has caused several problems in the Free World Building Area. Although already desperately short of working space extra accommodation has now to be found for a 'Q' Store and staff and an increased orderly room staff. In addition, a new transport office has to be built and suitable parking space provided for the vehicles.

Vung Tau

16. Tech Maint: The workshop moved into its new building during the week 8 - 13 Jul. The air conditioner had not been installed by the end of the month but should be during the first week in August. Once this is done the working conditions will improve tremendously.
17. The old Tech Maint Workshop building has been re-allocated half to Deployment Troop and the other half to the Workshop Stores Account. Spare parts for our fixed station equipment continue to flow in so the timing of the move was most opportune, much more storage space now being available.
18. Sound System: A sound system was installed for 1 Aust Fd Hosp. The system comprises three Sansui Tuner/amplifiers, a tape recorder and fifty bedside units.
19. Nui Dat System Control: Lining of this area has been completed and an air conditioner installed although it has not yet worked. Planning for the new installation is almost complete and is expected that this task will be undertaken by the Project Sqn detachment before they RTA.

CO's Parades and CO's Hours

21. Normal CO's Parades, CO's hours and Pardre's hours were held during the month. On the 19 Jul 68 DADLS HQ AFV spoke to members of Saigon Detachment on the Geneva Convention and treatment of POW's.

'Q' Store

22. As outlined in the opening comments of this report the majority of the month of July was occupied in preparations for a 100% stocktake which was to commence on the 22 Jul 68. Although the stocktake did not take place the work carried out in preparation was not wasted as many faults in equipment accounting were found and if not immediately corrected will be corrected prior to the 100% stocktake scheduled to be held within 3 months of the handover.

23. It is considered that the move of the Unit 'Q' Store to Vung Tau will greatly assist in improving the efficiency of the 'Q' system. The Vung Tau location places the 'Q' Store adjacent to the locations where the majority of unit equipment is either moved, stored or used.

Manning

24. The movement of Sqn HQ and the Austcan Transmitter site from Phu Tho required a change in the unit manning. This was necessary to provide personnel to man the Transmitter Station at Nui Dat and also the enlarged Detachment Headquarters at Saigon.

25. Although NOT approved at this stage the New Unit Establishment was used. All members of the Squadron are now working in an employment vacancy outlined in the New Establishment. The Old Establishment Manning Detail is still being used to show postings and promotions.



29. One of the Tank Shelters from Phu Tho was moved to the Saigon Detachment area to hold stores until the proposed new buildings in that area are completed.

30. The Austcan Transmitter Station at Nui Dat received top priorities from Engineers and at the end of the month was almost ready to start transmissions.

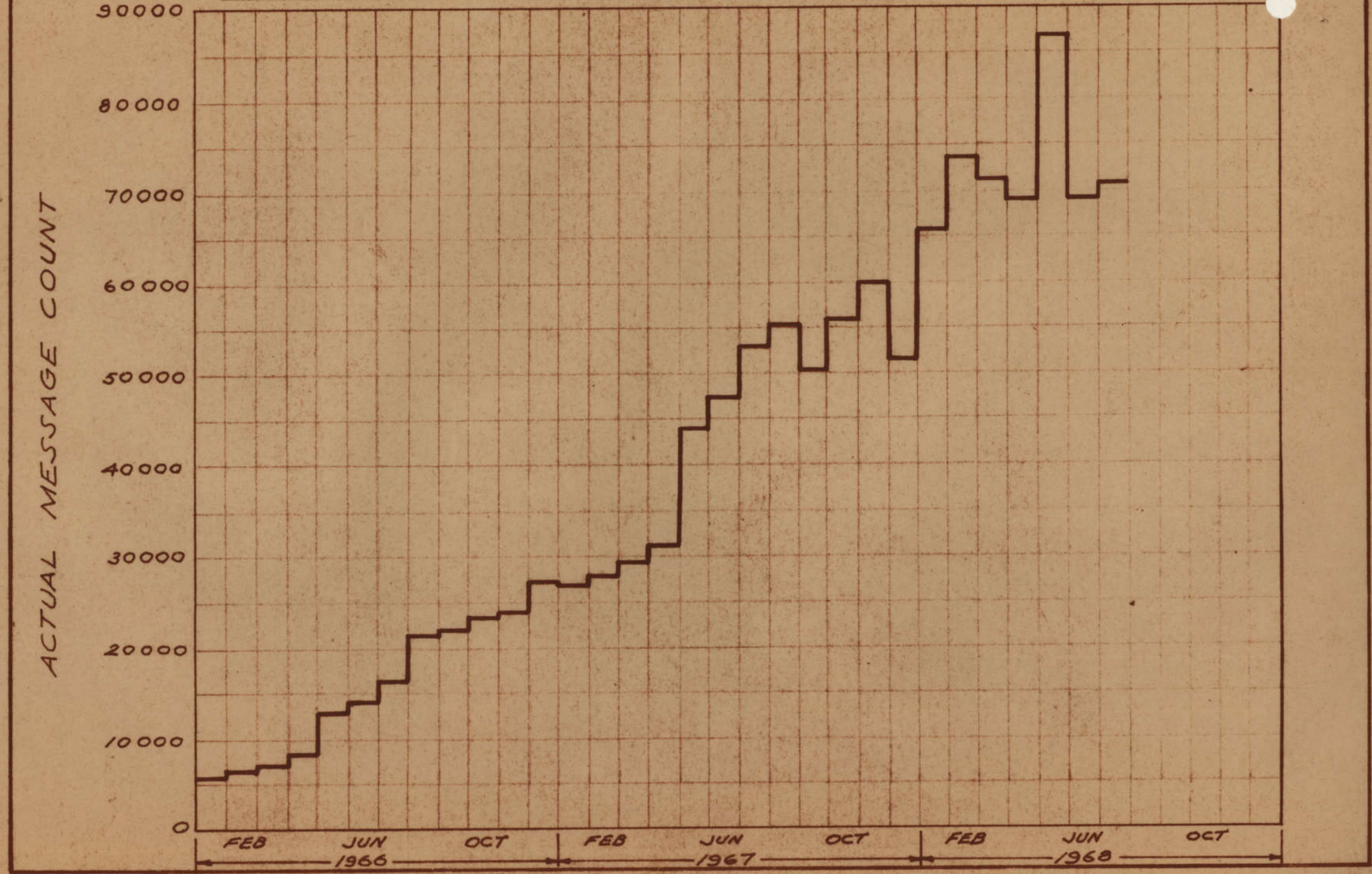

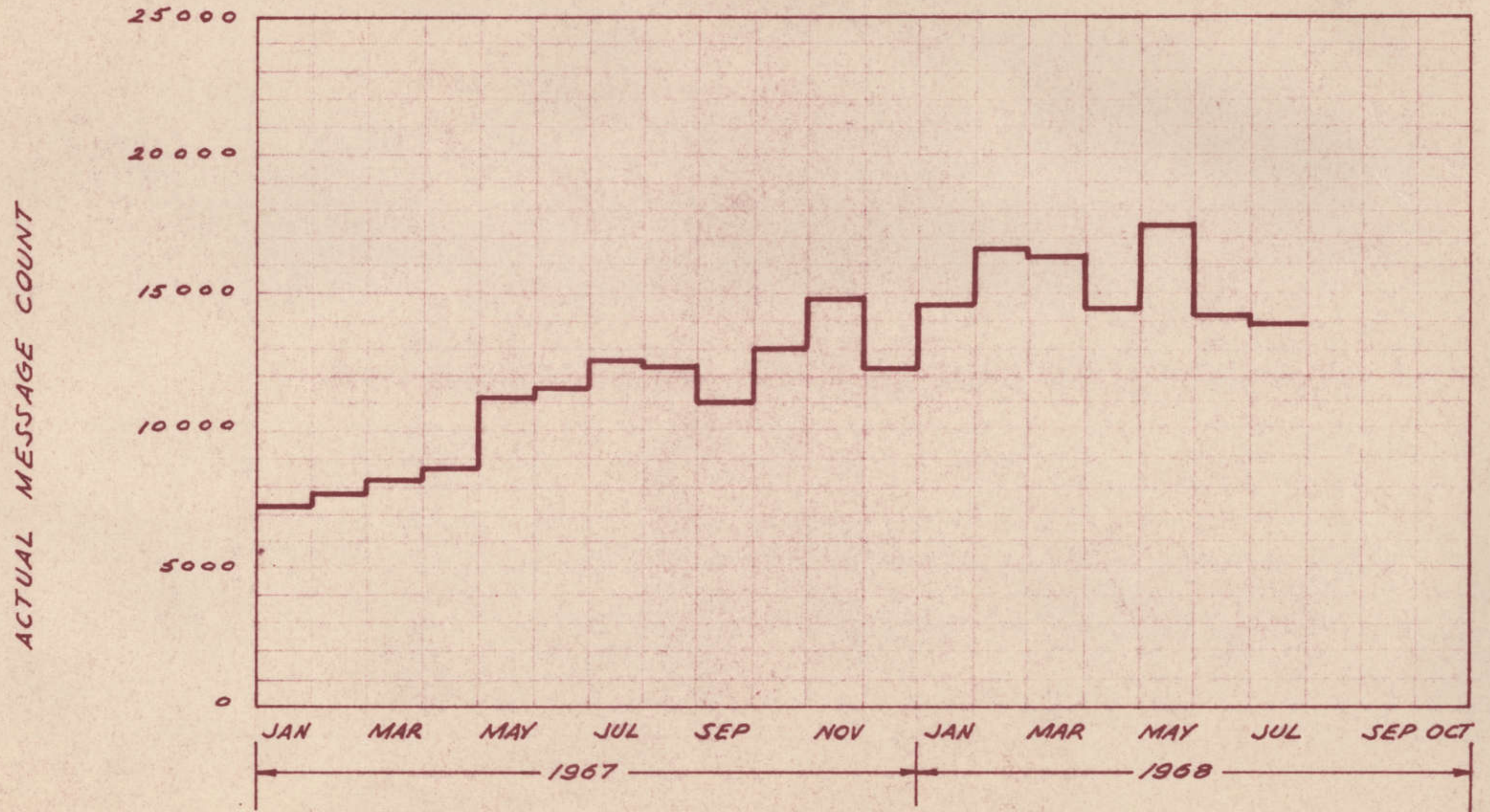

TRAFFIC VOLUME — SIGNAL CENTRE SAIGON



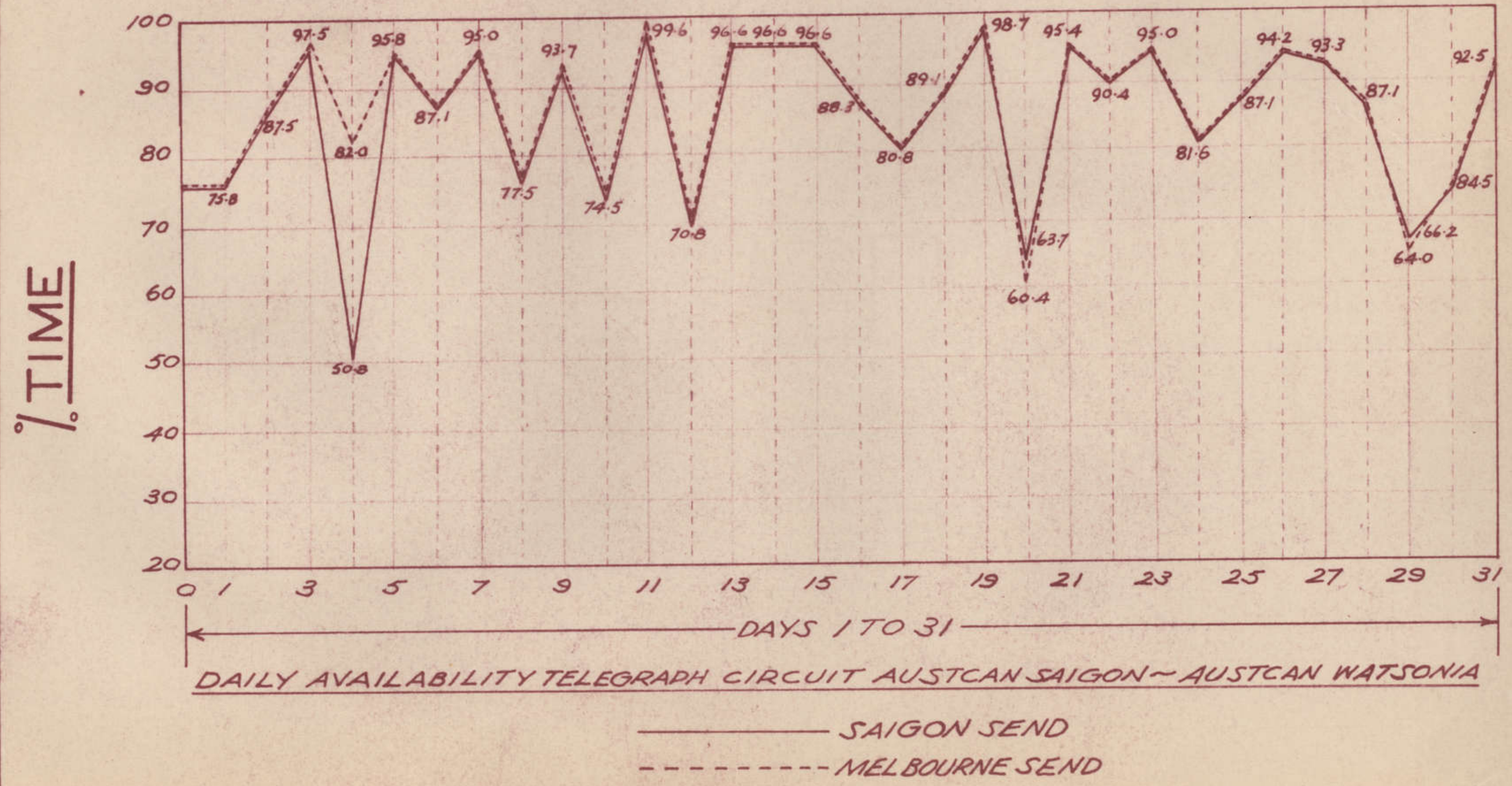

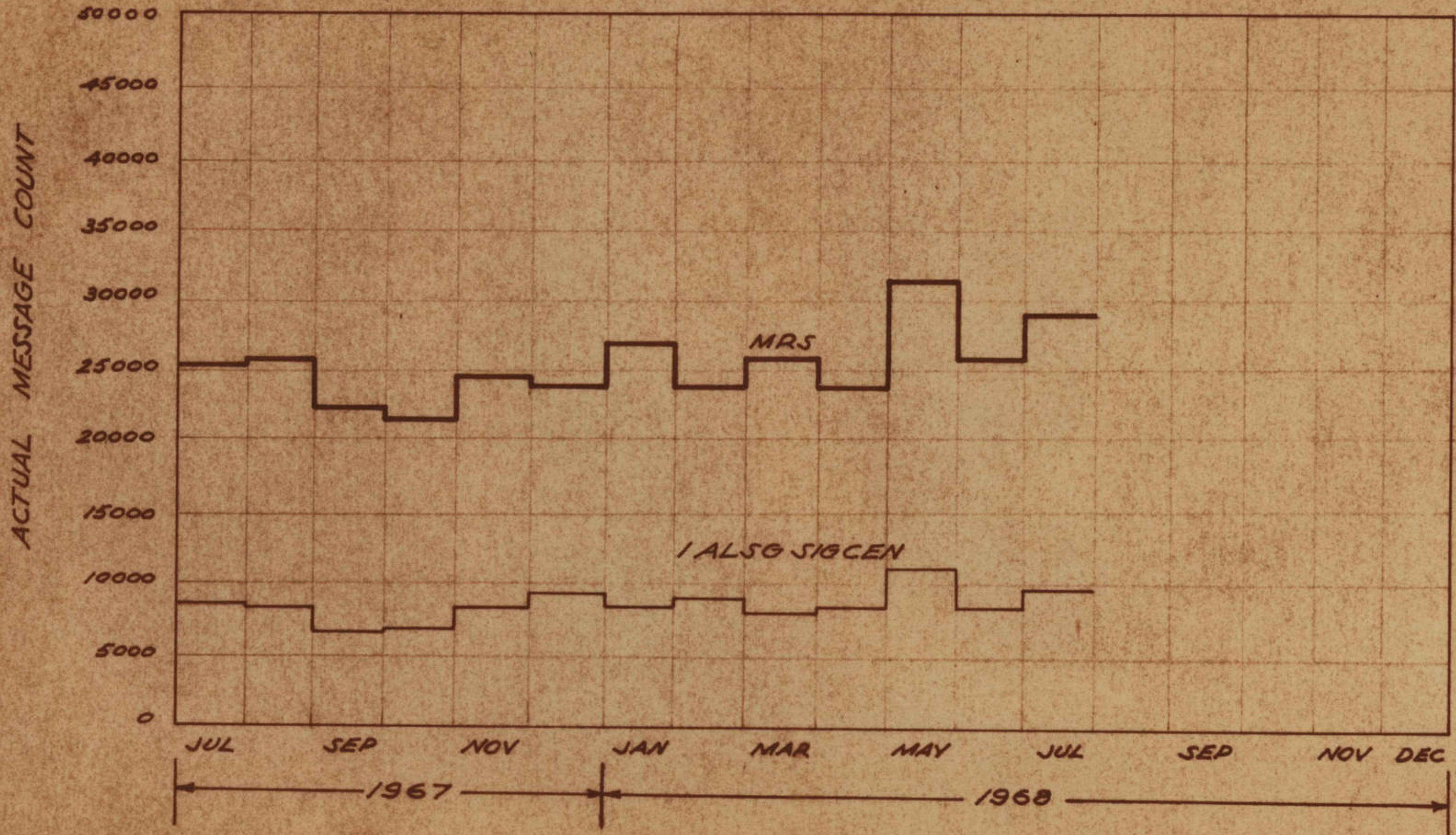
