

COMMANDERS DIARIES INSTRUCTIONS

AIM

1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organization and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

GENERAL

- 2. Entries are to be made daily on AF C 2118 (Adapted) each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.
- 3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties (Australia)" Chapter 2, Section 12.

RESPONSIBILITY

During Non-operational Periods

4. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled by commanders of all formations.

During Operational Periods (1)

- 5. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled in duplicate by:
 - a. Commanders of all formations.
 - b. Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a brigadier or above.
 - c. Heads of services not below the rank of lieutenant colonel.
 - d. Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
 - e. Unit commanders.
 - f. Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

COMPILATION

- 6. Both original and duplicate copies are to consist of:
 - a. Cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted).
 - b. Index as printed on cover.
 - c. Narrative (AF C 2118) (Adapted).
 - d. Annexes as shown in the Index.
- 7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes are to be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer is to be included.
- 8. The annexes are to be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an annex NIL will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters, arting at B.

DISPOSAL

- 13. Original Commander's Diary. This is to be forwarded monthly, unless otherwise ordered, by the seventh day of the succeeding month direct to AHQ.
- 14. Duplicate Commander's Diary. This must be clearly marked as a duplicate. It is to be sent separately from the original to AHQ one month after the original has been despatched but not before the former has been acknowledged.
- 15. When overseas, both copies of diaries are to be sent through the Army Records organization in the overseas theatre but at different times.
- 16. TOP SECRET Supplementary Diaries.
 - a. The documents referred to in Paragraph 9 together with a list of them made out on AF C 2118 (Adapted) must be placed in separate cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted). All details must be filled in and the cover clearly marked in red: "ANNEX Z OFFICER ONLY". It may be convenient to group the papers by appendices.
 - b. Supplementary diaries must be forwarded under the normal rules for TOP SECRET correspondence, to AHQ. The inner envelope must be plainly marked:



MOUNTING INSTRUCTION FOR THE MOVE TO KANGAW BARRACKS

References:

- A. 6 RAR A 456 of 28 Sep Warning Order.
- B. 6 RAR R8-1-1 dated 29 Sep Take over of

6 RAR Lines at Kangaw.

C. 6 RAR R8-1-1 dated 22 Oct - Outline Planning for the Evacuation of Selarang Garrison. (timings amended by this instruction).

General

- The battalion will move to Kangaw Barracks during Nov Dec 71. Most movement will take place between 29 Nov and 3 Dec. Selarang Garrison will be handed to the Singapore Government in the week 13 17 Dec 71. The battalion will continue to foster 108 Fd Bty RAA until its RTA on 14 Dec 71, and will foster the moves of 28 Fd Cash Office, the AAF Band and elements of ANZUK Dental Unit.
- The move is to take place in several phases by sub-units. At the discretion of commanders, personnel (including commanders) not gainfully employed during the week 29 Nov 3 Dec should be stood down. No training will take place during that week.
- 3. Bn HQ will close at Selarang 1600 hrs 2 Dec and open at Kangaw 0800 hrs 6 Dec.
- 4. Works services on Kangaw buildings will probably be incomplete as at the time of move. This could present security problems in Q stores and armouries, and ad hoc arrangements may be necessary.

Timings

5. Timetable for the move is:

a. Phase I - 28 Oct to 28 Nov.

- (1) Buildings at Kangaw are to be taken over from 40 Cdo RM and a security platoon is to protect 6 RAR buildings (Ref B refers).
- (2) The RQMS (Incr), Sgt Stephens, and two Cooks are being detached to Sembawang Garrison during this period.
- (3) The RQMS (Incr) is to take over 6 RAR's buildings, compile a key register and maintain furniture inventories.
- (4) COMSs, and Platoon Sgts of Spt Coy platoons are to return to Selarang from Ex TEST BED on 23 Nov. Rifle Coy 2ICs are to return to Selarang on 22 Nov and take over buildings at Kangaw from RQMS (Incr) 23-25 Nov.
- (5) The QM stores complete and all ammo are to move during Ex TEST BED under Admin Coy arrangements.

.../(6) CQMSs

- (6) CQMSs are to move non-essential items on charge to coys (incl public and regimental property and sports eqpt) on 24 Nov, with transport arranged by Admin Coy.
- (7) On Sat 27 Nov the Officers' Mess holds its farewell Mess Dinner.

b. Phase 2 - 29 Nov to 4 Dec. Sub-units and HQ are to move as follows;

- (1) Mon 29 Nov Bn Adv Party, D Coy, Mor Pl, elms Tpt and Catering Pls;
- (2) Tues 30 Nov A Coy, A Tk Pl, AAF Band;
- (3) Wed 1 Dec B Coy, Sig Pl, elms Tpt and Catering Pls;
- (4) Thurs 2 Dec DPRI store, Aslt Pnr Pl, HQ Spt Coy, RAP.
- (5) Fri 3 Dec Bn HQ, Admin Coy HQ, Pipes & Drums, elms Catering and Tpt Pls;
- (6) Sat 4 Dec Fd Cash Cffice

chase 3 - 6 to 10 Dec

- (1) Officers' Mess, Sergeants' Mess and OR Mess remain open to provide services to rear party and 108 Bty. Officers' & Sergeants' Messes are to progressively thin out property and eqpt under Mess arrangements.
- (2) Property/eqpt is to be stored in the Mess storerooms allocated in Kangaw Building 59 if renovations are complete, and in the Q store if they are not.
- (3) Offrs' and Sgts' Mess bars close 13 Dec.
- (4) Dental Centre moves 7 Dec.
- (5) All sub-units deploy cleanup parties to Selarang. These may consist of married soldiers living in the Changi area.
- (6) The Selarang Country Club moves under Club arrangements. DPRI golf clubs are to be recovered by Sgt P.C. Andersen by 1 Dec.
- (7) JRC ceases trading 2200 hrs Mon 13 Dec.
- (8) Those barracks stores which are to move to Kangaw (details to be advised) are to be concentrated by sub-unit cleanup parties and movt under QM arrangements.

d. Phase 4 - 13 to 17 Dec.

- (1) Rear Party forms and prepares Garrison for handover to Singapore Government.
- (2) 14 Dec 108 Fd Bty RTA.
- (3) 15 Dec all messes close.
- (4) 17 Dec Rear Party moves to Kangaw.

.../Composition

Composition of Parties

- 6. <u>Catering and Tpt Elms.</u> These are to progressively transfer to Kangaw as decided by OC Admin Coy.
- Advance Party. This is to be commanded by OC Spt Coy, and is to incl cooks for all Kangaw Messes, a storeman from each coy (less D Coy) and each Spt Coy pl (less Mor pl), a radio comms team manning a VHF link to Selarang (to be operating by 1000 hrs 29 Nov), at least two Land Rovers and a representative of Bn HQ Orderly Room. Personnel should, if possible, be bachelors and live at Kangaw from 29 Nov.
- 8. Rear Party. This is to be commanded by the Bn 2IC, and is to consist of one Bn HQ clerk, the RQMS (Incr) (who is to commute from Kangaw as nec) plus 1 OR from QM Pl, one Land Rover, the final duties and security guard, CQMSs as required for handover of barracks stores, 1 hygiene dutyman, cooks for messes, and LECs as arranged by OC Admin Coy.
- 9. <u>LECs.</u> OC Admin Coy is to arrange for progressive transfer of LECs as required.

Garrison Duties and Security at Selarang

- 10. From 0800 hrs Mon 29 Nov to 0900 hrs Sat 11 Dec, 108 Fd Bty is to provide 1 NCO and 9 OR for Selarang guards and duties. RSM is to provide the remainder from composite duties. Formal guards cease at Selarang 29 Nov.
- 11. From 0900 hrs Sat 11 Dec until 15 Dec, composite duties are to provide quarter guard and duties at Selarang, and from 15 17 Dec incl are to provide quarter guard only.
- 12. From 0800 hrs Mon 6 Dec, 6 RAR is to mount formal guards at Kangaw.

Charwallahs and Contractors

13. All charwallahs and contractors are to cease trading at 1200 hrs Fri 3 Dec, excepting one who is to remain in business for 108 Fd Bty until 14 Dec. Admin Coy is to coord their move to Kangaw, if applicable.

Q Matters

- Rat and POL Accounts. The Asst QM and 2Lt A. Bevan are to complete internal spot checking of these accounts, up to 30 Nov, by 30 Nov. The QM is to arrange for closure of the 6 RAR POL point at 1200 hrs Tues 30 Nov (the BTU at Kangaw will issue POL to 6 RAR vehicles thereafter, under arrangements to be made by OC Admin Coy), and the 6 RAR POL account is then to be closed, internally checked, and prepared for audit check. The 6 RAR ration account is to close on 15 Dec under QM arrangements, and be internally checked for submission to audit.
- 15. Controlled Stores. All sub-account holders and the QM are to conduct 100% spot checks of controlled stores on the day before sub-units etc depart Selarang and on the day after sub-units etc arrive at Kangaw. Certificates of completion of Selarang spot checks are to be handed to the 2IC and those of Kangaw spot checks are to be handed to OC Spt Coy, in each case on the day of the spot check.

.../16. Barracks

16. Barracks Store

- Ex TEST BED. When buildings have been cleared during the week 6-10 Dec (see para 5 a (4) above), CQMSs are to finally spot check inventories, lock rooms, and hand keys to the RQMS (Incr).
 - b. <u>Kangaw</u>. Coy 2ICs are to take over Kangaw buildings/furniture on inventories from the RQMS (Incr) on 23 25 Nov (see para 5 a (4) above).
- 17. Regt Property. A 100% spot check of Regt Property is to be conducted 14 15 Dec. The QM is to issue instructions and hand the results to the 2IC by 18 Dec.
- 18. <u>Vehicle Movement</u>. Stores vehicles are to be loaded and secured at Selarang under sub-unit arrangements, preferably the day before sub-units move: Initial departure time for personnel moves on each day is to be about 0900 hrs, so that packets are organized at Kangaw by lunchtime; several trips per day for stores may be necessary.
- 19. Mess Property. A 100% spot check of Cffrs' and Sgts Mess property is to be conducted 14-17 Dec. Results of the check are to be handed to the 2IC by 1200 hrs 18 Dec.

A Matters

- 20. Bank Accounts. Messes and Regt Funds are to change bank accounts.
- Parade States. Coys are to advise the Adjt by 26 Nov their estimated parade state breakup Selarang Kangaw for 29 Nov 3 Dec incl. From 30 Nov, the Bn Advance Party is to prepare Kangaw parade states and pass them to Sembawang Garrison HQ, and BN HQ is to prepare Selarang parade states as normal. Adjt is to advise Sembawang Garrison HQ of the estimated Kangaw rationing requirement, by meals by messes, for 29 Nov onwards. All ranks are to be warned in for rations 29 Nov 3 Dec incl. Roll books are to be maintained by the Coy HQ wherever it is located.
- 22. RTA Personnel. Personnel due to RTA between 29 Nov and 3 Dec are to remain in Selarang attached to Admin Coy from Fri 26 Nov.
- 23. Pay. 6 RAR will be paid on 26 Nov for the 2 Dec payday.
- 24. Audit of Funds. Officers' Mess & Sergeants' Mess funds, Regt Funds, Petty Cash and the Official Stamp Account are to be audited up to 31 Dec 71 by the Regt Audit Board between 10 Jan 72 and 21 Jan 72. The President of the Audit Board is to issue directives separately.

General

- 1. The block leave period is now 18 Dec 71 to 9 Jan 72. (This is a change from dates listed in reference A). The leave dates for the A Company group due to move to Butterworth on 6 Jan 72 are 18 Dec 71 to 2 Jan 72. Travelling time is NOT granted.
- 2. Members whose leave credits, including public holidays exceed the designated leave period will take the remaining leave at credit at a later date.
- 3. Leave in Anticipation will not be granted.

Rear Details

- 4. Sufficient command, security and administrative elements will remain in the barracks over the leave period to allow for restricted routine functions of the unit to continue.
- 5. The minimum requirements are as follows:
 - a. Rifle Companies
 - (1) One Officer or senior NCO;
 - (2) One Cpl capable of maintaining the Q Store and Orderly Room; and
 - (3) Ten ORs as GDs.

b. Support Company

- (1) One Officer or senior NCO;
- (2) One Cpl capable of maintaining the Q Store and ? Orderly Room; and
- (3) 10 ORs as GDs.

c. Admin Company

- (1) One Officer or senior NCO;
- (2) Three drivers;
- (3) Storeman/Clerk as required by QM for Q Store;
- (4) One hygiene dutyman;
- (5) Cooks detailed requirement to be ascertained by Admin Coy from Sembawang Garrison.
- (6) One Cpl capable of maintaining the Coy Q Store and Orderly Room.

d. Bn HQ Pl

- (1) Chief Clerk
- (2) Typist (Civil)
- (3) Postal/Pay Clerk
- (4) RP (1)
- 6. Two copies of a nominal roll of those listed in para 5 are to be submitted by companies by 6 Dec. The RSM is to ensure that duties for the first few days are promulgated prior to the commencement of rear details. Thereafter the duties are to be maintained by a NCO nominated by the RSM.
- 7. Duty Field Officers. There will be a Duty Field Officer over the period who, although on leave, will be available in emergencies and who will visit the battalion regularly over the leave period. Details will be advised before leave commences.
- 8. <u>Duty Officer/NCO</u>. The Assistant Adjutant is to promulgate a Duty Officer/NCO roster by 10 Dec.
- 9. Commitments to Sembawang Garrison. Full details are not known but there may be an occasional requirement for
 - a. cinema piquet; and
 - b. pool supervisor;
 - c. NCO + 3 from 3 Jan until 1 Feb for an Armoury at WOODLANDS GARRISON.
- 10. Messes/Canteen. All messes and ORs canteen will operate as normal. Any restrictions of hours will be promulgated to companies.

Leave Administration

11. Free Travel. Reference C details members entitlement to free travel to leave centres in West Malaysia. Companies are to check the entitlement before applications are submitted.

12. Travel Bookings

- a. Rail. All travel by rail in Singapore and West Malaysia will be booked by Bn HQ. Each member will receive 2 travel warrants (Rail). One warrant is for the forward trip and the second for return to Singapore.
- b. Own Means. Members may travel by car to West Malaysia leave centres. AAF Al9s are to be submitted by the companies to Bn HQ for approval.
- can be made by Bn HQ. Travel outside of West Malaysia must be arranged by the member, after approval of the CO. (Annex A to Reference E). A nominal roll of members wishing to travel by Air out of Singapore and West Malaysia must be submitted to Bn HQ by 1 Dec 71. Members wishing to travel out of West Malaysia cannot use Penang or any other airport in West Malaysia as a transit stop over for purposes of claiming assisted travel on ARL. All claims for reimbursement by members who make own travel arrangements (except Rail) must be supported by Air tickets. For members who travel own means hotel accommodation or other receipts must be produced to prove that in fact the trip was made.
- 13. Appendix 1 to Annex A is to be completed by companies and will be used to make bookings. Once submitted the means of travel and destination will not be altered except in extreme cases. Applications for alterations must be accompanied by a written explanation.
- 14. Members wishing to travel at a higher class of rail travel are to follow the procedure outlined below.
 - a. The difference is to be paid to Asst Adjt and the amount and official receipt number is to be recorded on Appendix 1 to Annex A. All payments to be completed by 15 Nov. (D Coy by 17 Nov).
 - b. Excess will be ascertained by Bn HQ Movts Clerk on request by companies.

Members wishing to travel by air irrespective of whether Bn HQ or member made bookings are to pay for tickets themselves.

- 15. Private Transport. Members who wish to travel by own means are to be recorded on a separate sheet as indicated in Annex A. AAF Al9s are to be completed and attached to Appendix 1 and AAF A88s for each member.
- 16. <u>Documentation</u>. Two AAF A88 (Application for Leave) are to be submitted for each member. These are to be used as the basis for the compilation of Appendix 1. Completed Appendix 1 with A88s and A19s where applicable are to reach Bn HQ by 15 Nov 71 (D Coy 17 Nov).
- 17. Companies are to ensure that members proceeding on leave are in possession of:
 - a. Leave Pass (with 6 RAR phone number);

- b. Pay book;
- c. ID Card;
- d. Ticket or warrant;
- e. Mob 3 (if outside Singapore/West Malaysia, granted free or assisted travel, if travelling by public transport outside Singapore.
- f. Al9s (for all movement outside Singapore) other than rail reference D.
- 18. Companies are also to ensure that members travelling outside of Singapore and West Malaysia are in possession of special items as required such as Passports, Visas and ICVs.



28 BRIGADE EXERCISE - TEST BED GENERAL IDEA - PARTS III & IV

- 1. GANASIA and PALMARIA (See Appendix 1) represent two sizeable SE Asian countires. The former is independent, yet under communist domination from a powerful norther neighbour NORTH TERRABIN (NTB). The latter, PALMARIA, has been fighting insurgent communism for approximately six years. She has been assisted in this struggle by the ANZUK Powers who now have one division in addition to 28 ANZUK Brigade deployed in the country.
- 2. In October 1972 heavy attacks were planned by NORTH TERRABIN against the PALMARIA capital JOHORE BAHRU and the Province capital of KOTA TINGGI. NTB security was bad and, forewarned, the PALMARIA Forces were able to break up these attacks before the were launched. Heavy bombing and interdiction on NTB supply routes through GANASIA finally brought their operations to and end save for those on the smallest scale. By 12 November it was apparent that the NTB High Command had issued orders for the greater part of their forces to disengage and to move NORTH into GANASIA for re-grouping and re-organisation.
- A great opportunity now exists for the NTB Forces to be cut off and destroyed before they reach the border. The dense jungle and hills of NORTH PALMARIA offer the NTB a big advantage. However, if the NTB can be located and destroyed in the more open areas just SOUTH of the lateral road which runs between JEMALUANG and KLUANG, then an important victory could be achieved.
- 4. In the area in question, the guerilla forces, assisted by GANASIA and NTB have built up a local provincial battalion. This battalion is known as the Kangar Provincial Battalion with three companies, VI-Kluang Coy, C2-Jemaluang Coy, C3-Kota Tinggi Coy. It is known that the main task of the Jemaluang Coy is to assist in movement of men and materials through the area, and that in fact they provided assistance to the NTB forces moving south to attack Johore Bahru. It is exepcted that they will provide similar assistance to the withdrawing forces. The main areas of operations for the Jemaluang Coy has been generally in the Bt Gantang Ambin (CR 8870) and eastwards towards Jemaluang. The Kluang Coy remains generally in the KLUANG area while the Kota Tinggi Coy remains to the south in the general area of BUKIT MUNTHAK CR 0328 Kangar Bn HQ moves within the Coy areas. On occasions the coys under the Bn HQ have been known to concentrate into one area for particular tasks.
- 5. On 14th November 72, 28 ANZUK Brigade less 1 RHF and 6 RAR deployed to the area of KANGAR KAHANG. 1 RNZIR was deployed in the area and a fire support base established. 1 RHF and 6 RAR were placed at 24 hours notice to move from their base 60 miles to the SOUTH. The shortage of transport is critical and it is unlikely that more than one battalion a day can be moved NORTH to the Brigade's AO.
- 6. The Brigade Commander called an 'O' Group at 0900 hours 15th November at KANGAR KAHANG. An extract of his orders is given in Annex 'B'

Kangar Provincial Battalion

- 1. According to an agent's report (evaluated C3) elements of the Jemaluang Coy of the Kangar Provincial Battalion are believed to have remained in the Hutan Simpan Lenggor area South of the Jemaluang-Kluang Road on the high ground.
- 2. It is assessed their intention is to protect the resupply and movement routes used to maintain the NTB forces to the south. Should the attack the south fail it is assessed that NTB forces will withdraw to Ganasian via this area.
- 3. The source is not aware if the other battalion elements are in the area, but claims he was told by a member of the unit that his platoon's mission was to hold the Kluang-Jemaluang Road open to provide protection on courier routes. The informat also stated that as they had protected and guided the NTB units moving south he guessed that should the NTB move north again they would have to guide them back and he was afraid of being bombed should that occur.
- 4. It will be recalled that the Jemaluang Kluang and Kota Tinggi coys normally operated in the vicinity of their namesake area. Present whereabouts of the battalion headquarters is unknown. It has always moved quickly and often and last reports (10 days ago) indicated it had moved to the Kota Tinggi area.

SPECIAL IDEA - PART III

- 1. The brigade commander returned to his headquarters at Kangar Kahang late on 14 Nov 72, from a briefing at PALMARIA headquarters Johore Bahru. There was no doubt that the NTB attack on Johore Bahru and failed and that the NTB would withdraw north. It was now important to destroy the withdrawing forces. In conjunction with this, empahsis is to be placed on harassing and destroying the provincial forces which will assist the NTB withdrawal. An ticipated dates of the main withdrawal from Johore Bahru and not known, but it is expected that the main NTB forces, which are currently extricating from the attack, regrouping and preparing for withdrawl, will not reach the Kahang area much before 21 Nov. It is therefore important to move quickly against the provincial forces in that area to harass and destroy their attempts to assist the NTB move northwards to the sanctuary of GANASIA.
- 2. At midnight 14/15 Nov the brigade commander ordered his 'O' Group at Kangar Kahang at 0900 hrs 15 Nov and reduced the notice to move of 1 RHF and 6 RAR to 12 hours from 0600 15 Nov.

ACTION IF LOST OR INJURED

SECTION 1 - ACTION WHEN LOST

GROUP CORRECTLY EQUIPPED

- 1. If lost, don't panic. Sit down and consider:
 - (a) Have you drifted LEFT or RIGHT of your route?
 - (b) Have you gone past the objective (check time and distance covered)?
 - (c) Did the ground conform with the going on the Navigation Data Sheet?
 - (d) Are there any features in the area which will help to fix your position?
 - (e) Could you regain comms by moving to higher ground?
- 2. These considerations should give you an idea of where you are. Confirm your location with recce patrols.
- 3. If you still cannot find where you are and you can't obtain radio contact:
 - (a) Move downhill to the nearest water course and follow it downstream to the first clearing and remain there until help arrives. Light a fire if there is no fire risk.
 - (b) If during this move you meet a fence, road, track or house stop there until help arrives.
 - (c) Do NOT cross fence lines, tracks, large clearings or large streams as this will mean that you will go into an area which will NOT be searched.
 - (d) Blaze or mark your route as you go.
 - (e) When you are nearly 50% overdue and have not yet found a place to halt as described above, stop where there is water and wait for the search parties. Fire blanks or blow whistles every 10 minutes. Search parties will commence operations automatically when you are 50% overdue don't make it harder for them by increasing the area to be searched.
 - (f) Change your radio frequency to 50 KC (VHF) or 5 MC (HF) when 50% overdue.
 - (g) Don't move at night.

GROUP OR INDIVIDUAL NOT CORRECTLY EQUIPPED

- 4. If lost, don't panic.
- 5. You have probably already tried to find your group without success, so further searching is useless.
- 6. Move downhill to the nearest water course and follow it downstream. As soon as you find water HALT and wait for the search parties. Fire a shot, whistle, or coose every 10 minutes.

- 7. Don't leave water you can live for 7 or 8 days on water alone.
- 8. If you meet a clearing, track, fence or hut before reaching water, HALT and wait for rescue parties. They will quickly find you at these places and water will not become a problem.
- 9. Blaze or mark your route as you go.
- 10. Don't move at night.
- 11. Light a fire when you halt if there is no fire risk.

EMERGENCY FIRST AID

HEAT STROKE - Caused by Body's heat regulating mechanism failing.
Temperature rises to an alarming degree. Patient is unable to sweat and cool himself. Treatment - remove patient to a shady, cool spot. Loosen all clothing. Give cold water to drink. Bath body with cold water. If near a stream immerse patient in water. Rest patient until body temperature has returned to normal.

HEAT EXHAUSTION - Caused by excessive sweating depleting the body fluids. Treatment - stop walking. Rest in a cool, shady spot. Give patient frequent drinks of water. If patient has been sweating over a prolonged period add one salt tablet to each water bottle - make sure salt tablet is dissolved. No walking until patient has recovered and all signs of cramp and muscle weakness have gone.

HAEMORRHAGE (BLEEDING) - Unless an artery is "spurting" haemorrhage can be stopped by elevating the part and applying a firm dressing. If still bleeding apply a second dressing over the first and bandage tightly. If an artery is spurting use a tourniquet stretched around the limb twice OVER the clothing. Release every 20 minutes and only reapply if the bleeding has not stopped. When bleeding has stopped dress wound with a dressing and firmly bandage and elevate the part.

FRACTURES - When a bone is broken it must be splinted and bandaged to immobilize the limb. Splints should be long enough to immobilize the joints above and below the fracture. Flat splints are best and they must be padded to make them fit the limb and prevent excessive pressure on bony protrudences such as the elbow, knees, and ankle. When a leg is broken always tie the two legs together; and when an arm is broken support it by bandaging it firmly to the body. Give the patient plenty of fluids to drink; keep him warm if the night turns cold; and if you have codeine or aspirin give them to the patient every two or three hours.

SNAKE BITE - Reassure the individual. Complete recovery from snake bite is the rule. Keep the individual at rest. Apply a lightly constricting ligature (handkerchief, belt, piece of cloth) to arm or leg between bite and heart. The ligature must be tightened until the veins stand out, but not to stop them pulse at wrist or ankle. It should be released for one minute every 30 minutes. Wash the area of the bite with plain water without rubbing. Immobilize the bitten part by applying a splint as for a fracture and keep it hanging down below the level of the heart if possible. Give mouth to mouth or mouth to nose artificial respiration if breathing stops. Move the individual to the nearest medical installation (with the dead snake if available). If necessary give aspirin, 1 or 2 tablets, for pain but do NOT give alcohol or morphine. If available, apply an ice bag to the surface of the bitten area but do not immerse in ice or iced water. Do not delay treatment or evacuation to catch snake or search for ice.

SHOCK is a condition induced by severe injury, pain, and loss of fluid (blood, plasma from burns, or fluid through sweating, vomiting, etc.). Treatment is to give the appropriate first aid to prevent further damage; give codeine or aspirin, and fluids to drink to replace fluid loss. All shocked patients should be lying down with feet elevated during transportation. Always keep head low and turned to one side. Be prepared for vomiting. Treat an unconscious patient the same but give nothing to drink. If he vomits swab out mouth and make sure he has a clear airway at all times.

Those Lost

- ONE shot, whistle blast or coose every 10 minutes.

Search Parties

- TWO quick shots or whistle blasts every 10 minutes.

Search Radio Frequencies

- VHF - 50KC HF-5MC.

Tree Blazing When Lost

- Mark trees on your RIGHT every 20 yards with an upward cut, then a horizontal cut and ensure chip is cut out.

Lost People Found

- Five single shots or whistle blasts at five second intervals.

Recall Seach Parties

- Detonate 1 slab TNT, then after 1 minute 1 slab TNT.

INTELLIGENCE REPORT 1/71

- 1. The general idea is contained in Reference B.
- 2. The enemy force in the Bde Area of Operations is known to be of battalion strength. This battalion has been identified as the Kangar Provincial Battalion consisting of three companies, the Cl Kluang Coy, the C2 Jemaluang Coy and the C3 Kota Tinggi Coy.
- 3. An NTB force of unknown size is expected to move through the 6 RAR area within the next seven to ten days. This force is expected to be travelling north into GANASIA for regrouping following their losses in operations near JOHORE BAHRU and KOTA TINGGI. The force is not expected in the Kahang Area much before 21 Nov 71. It is thought that the local force C2 Coy will assist the NTB Main Force in the movement of men and equipment through the area.
- 4. In the past, Cl Coy has operated mainly around KLUANG, C2 Coy in the Bt Gantang Ambin (GR 8870) area and C3 Coy around the Bt Muntabak (GR 0328) area. The Kangar Provincial Battalion Headquarters has been known to operate in all three of the above areas. The headquarters was thought to be in the KOTA TINGGI area ten days ago.
- 5. C2 Coy less a platoon is thought to be currently located in the Hutan Simpan Lenggor area on the high ground to the South of the JEMALUANG KLUANG road. A platoon is possibly located in the area GR 9466 and a platoon also possibly located in the area of 870 feature GR 8669 and 772 feature GR 8672. It is probable that the NTB force mentioned previously will withdraw through this area. A platoon of C2 Coy is thought to be located further South acting as guides for the NTB withdrawal.
- 6. A list of known personalities is shown at appendix 1.
- 7. The orbat for the Kangar Provincial Battalion is shown at appendix 2.



GARRISON ORDERS

124. SECURITY OF ARMS, AMMUNITION AND EXPLOSIVES - PRIVATE WEAPONS

- 1. The illegal carriage or possession of private or unauthorised small arms, ammunition or explosives is a most serious offence in SINGAPORE, and carries a maximum punishment, when tried by a Civil Court, of penal servitude for life.
- 2. The expression "small arms" or "arms" includes all firearms, air guns, air pistols, automatic guns, automatic pistols, shot guns and other types of weapon from which any shot, bullet, or other missile can be discharged; together with the ammunition. (Bayonets, swords, daggers, spears, etc can be kept as curios without a licence).

LICENCES

- 3. a. No person may possessess or import private Firearms, ammunition or air guns in or into SINGAPORE without a current licence from the Police Licensing Officer, Arms and Explosives Branch, Hill Street Police Station, SINGAPORE.
 - b. Licences issued abroad or in the Federation of MALAYSIA are NOT valid in SINGAPORE.
 - c. Personnel bringing private arms and ammunition into SINGAPORE are to surrender them as follows:
 - (1) Owners travelling by sea, before disembarkation, to the police officer who comes aboard when the ship docks.
 - (2) Owners entering by other means: to an authorised police officer or in default to the Customs Authorities.
 - d. All such private small arms and ammunition are to be kept in Hill Street Police Station for safe custody pending the issue of a firearms licence or the appropriate permit for sale or export. There is a six months time limit on the storage of weapons in Hill Street Police Station. If no licence has been obtained by the end of this period the weapon are forfeited to the Government of Singapore.
 - e. Licence holders are to note expiry date and renew their licences in good time.

EXPORT

4. a. Owners wishing to take private small arms out of SINGAPORE whether stationed here or in transit, must first obtain an export permit from the Licensing Officer. In the case of owners proceeding to MALAYA, permission to import must first be obtained from the Chief Police Officer of the State concerned.

.../b.

- b. Personnel stationed in SINGAPORE or on normal transit to MALAYA are to apply to the Chief Police Officer of the State in which they will be residing for an import permit. This permit will then be produced to the SINGAPORE authorities to obtain an export permit. Import permits into MALAYA are normally only effective for two weeks from date of issue.
- c. If there is insufficient time to carry out the procedure at para 4b above, private weapons will remain at Hill Street Police Station to be forwarded through police channels to the state where they will reside when an import licence is issued.
- d. Owners wishing to export private arms overseas will normally be given an export licence within 24 hours.

CUSTODY

- 5. a. All private small arms and ammunition are to be kept in Unit armouries when not in use, except as provided for in sub-para b below, and licences are normally issued on this condition.
 - b. In exceptional cases, provided the approval of HQ ANZUK Spt Gp has been obtained, the Licensing Officer may agree to individuals retaining their own weapons. Owners will then be held personally responsible for safe custody and possible loss.
 - c. Procedure for seeking permission to retain personal small arms in private custody is as follows:
 - (1) Applications are to be made to Bn HQ explaining the special circumstances for the CO's consideration.
 - (2) Applicants will certify that arms and ammunition will be kept locked up, when NOT in use, each in a separate place, and that fully responsibility for safe custody is accepted.
 - (3) Applications will be forwarded by Bn HQ to HQ ANZUK Spt Gp and once approval has been given, applicants are to apply to the Licensing Officer.

125. TRAFFIC OFFENCES - TOWING OF TRAILERS

- 1. It is a Civil Police requirement in the Republic of Singapore for vehicles towing trailers of any description to carry a passenger or co-driver. The Assistant Commission of Police advises that although a degree of leniency has been expressed towards Service vehicles, this will no longer be the case. Offenders are liable to a fine of up to fifty dollars.
- 2. All Service vehicles towing a trailer of any kind are to carry a co-driver or passenger.

126. ENTRY INTO MALAYSIA

- 1. Australian Service personnel and their dependants based in Singapore are permitted to enter Malaysia on production of their Service Identity Cards or British Service Identity Cards (BSIC).
- 2. Completion of Disembarkation/Embarkation Cards is not required.

127. CUSTOMS CONCESSIONS ON RTA

- 1. Current Australian Customs Regulations permit all persons to import their household effects into Australia, providing such effects have been owned and used overseas for a period of not less than twelve months. Australian customs duty on such items will be waived.
- 2. Servicemen have no statutory right to exemption from this rule, but Customs will normally give sympathetic consideration to individual cases where a member's tour of duty overseas is cut short due to circumstances beyond that member's control. It is stressed that each case is considered individually on its merits.
- 3. In the case of early return to Australia (RTA), Customs will only give sympathetic consideration to the entry of a member's household effects. Customs are emphatic that no consideration of this nature will be given in respect of motor vehicles, boats, etc.
- 4. Any member who is concerned about his personal situation on RTA, due to the curtailment of his normal tour of duty, is advised to submit the following information to Bn HQ in order that his case for exemption may be submitted through the most appropriate channels:
 - a. number, rank and name,
 - b. unit,
 - c. date of RTA.
 - d. method and place of arrival in Australia,
 - e. items causing concern:
 - (1) description,
 - (2) date of purchase, and
 - (3) cost price.
 - f. date of arrival in Singapore,
 - g. reason for early RTA, and
 - h. marital status and whether accompanied or unaccompanied.

FORD MCTOR VEHICLES

1. The following information regarding preferential prices available to AS personnel has been received from Ford Motor Company of Australia:

"Introduction.

Ford Australia have developed a plan to enable Australian troops serving overseas to place orders through the Australian Services Canteen Organization (A.S.C.O.) for Ford Vehicles at preferential prices.

The plan will enable troops to make progressive payments for their vehicle during their tour of duty overseas, and take delivery from any Ford Dealer they nominate upon return to Australia.

Basin of Plan.

Ford Australia will provide the Australian Services Canteen Organization (hereafter referred to as ASCO) with Retail Order Forms, Price Lists, Brochures etc., covering the Ford Passenger model range. Trained Ford personnel will accept signed retail orders from the troops in Vietnam and other overseas location, to purchase a vehicle either for cash or under hire purchase. ASCO will also

.../arrange

arrange to accept regular payments from the purchaser during his tour of duty which will be tailored to constitute either the full cash payment or a minimum deposit of 33 percent by the time he is due to return to Australia.

As Ford Australia cannot hold public deposits, ASCO will hold payments received from the troops until delivery of the vehicle is to be effected. Money paid to ASCO will be transferred to delivering dealer who will finalise the H.P. or financing contract if sold under hire purchase.

The purchaser will nominate on the order form at date it is completed, the Ford Dealer in Australia from whom he wishes to take delivery of his vehicle.

Ford Australia will, upon confirmation from ASCO that the order is still firm, and 33% cummulative deposit received, six weeks prior to the serviceman's return home, arrange to build the vehicle and advise the delivering dealer the required delivery date and details of the transaction.

Eligible Participants.

The benefits of the plan are available to members of the Australian Armed Forces serving overseas. Should a soldier serving overseas have full cash funds available, he may purchase a car at the preferred rates and arrange for his wife to take delivery on his behalf prior to his return to Australia. This facility would be available to wives only and would not include other relatives or friends. Under this method he is precluded from using hire purchase due to his inability to complete the necessary documentation in Vietnam/Singapore".
