Informant states he saw Bradshaw shot at Pine Hill by a machine gun. He was severely wounded in the head, nose shoulder and foot. He helped to bind him up and put him on a stretcher and the stretcher bearers took him away.

Informant states that on Aug. 8th at New Sap trench, Lone Pine, Gallipoli, Bradshaw was very badly wounded. He nose was broken, also his jaw, right hand and left foot wounded. Informant had last seen him in Hospital in Malta.

Witness states that he knew a man named Bradshaw in the 3rd.Bn. He was in D.Co. and came over with the 3rd.Reinforcements. Witness does not know his initials or Christian name but says there was only one Bradshaw in the Bn. This man was an Englishman and had not resided long in Australia. He was about 5 ft.8 in height, dark, aged about 35.

This man was wounded on the Peninsula early in May, 1915, and went away. Witness was there when he was wounded. He received wounds in the foot, the arm and the face.

Witness says he saw this man in England in Feb.1916. He was then convalescent at the Harrofield Hospital.
