

In reply to your letter, I have made enquiries, but can get no news of this man. He was before my time.

K.G.\.Brown was in A.IV. I don't remember his number. He was about 5ft 7, inclined to be dark, clean shaven and about 26 or 27. He was mortally wounded on the night of the 4th Oct near Zonnebeke. The same shell that killed him also killed two others and wounded four. I saw him after he had been wounded and his arm had nearly been blown off. He was then taken down by S/Bs to an aid post, and I heard he had D/W the next day. I believe he was buried near Poperinghe. I saw the cross which was made for his grave. A few days before he met his death he had been made a L/Cpl. and was incommand of his section.

No were coming back to di clots; Brown was just in front of me. I saw him hit by a part of a shell; he was hit in the body and one of his logs was shattered. I saw S/Beavers take him away. This was close to Anzac house. I heard later on that he died of wounds.

Brown was wounded in the left side near Anzac House. I brought him into Anzac House, used as a D/S, and he got as far as C.C.S. at Popperinge and died there. They sent word back to say he was buried, but I forget where. By the same shell Pte. Buckingham (J. I think) was killed outright. The lads went out to bury him on Westhock Ridge. Grave marked with a cross.
