He was at Battalion Headquarters on guard on the 1st September between Mont St. Quentin and Percense in a big railway outling. Fritz was shelling us and a piece of shell hit him in the body and killed him instantly. I was quite close and saw him hit. It was about 6.30 a.m. I was hit about five minutes leter, and do not know what become of him. He was a Pte. in "B. Coy, but attached to Headquarters, fairly tall, thin, inclined to be dark, clean shaved, initials were 4.1., but I don't remember his number. Don't know any other man of the same name in Battalion.

I made a large memorial cross for effection to all the men who were killed on September 1st. 1918. near Peronne. It is in the French Cametery there. There was a Photo. of it in the Ansac Bullet of November 8th. Both these mames are on that cross. I carried the bodies of Lieut. Lamerton, Lieut. Davis. Lieut Sherwood, and Private Bennett and buried them in a French Cometery near Peronne. I cannot remember the name of the village. I fancy that our Adjutant, Lieut. Elliott, who was a personal friend of Lieut Lamerton will have written home to his people.

I saw him being taken back on a limber but I did not see him buried, and can't say where he was buried.

Bennett crossed with me in the "Euripides" in Cct. 17. He was about 26, an up country lad, had travelled about in Australia, a farm hand shearer, horsebreaker, could do anything. He was in A Co.

At Peronne on the 1st Sept.1918 we lost about 50 chaps by M.G. Fire. I did not see them killed as I was at HQ that day, but I afterwards saw the big cross that was put up over the whole of the grave, the officers' names in a circle and the mens' in straight lines. It was in a ravine just cutside Peronne. I had a photo of it one time. I think all the men you have in the list K. on Sept.1 were buried in this grave, but these four were friends of mine, that is why I know.
