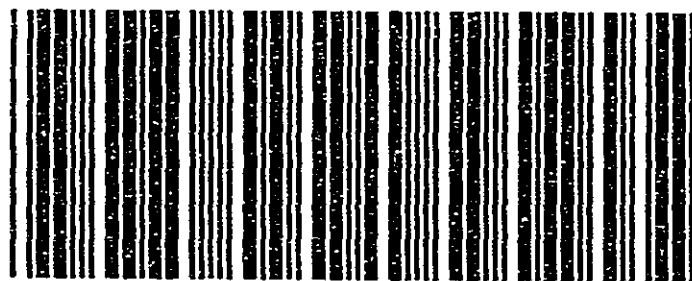

Bennett was a Sergeant. He was in the landing. He is regarded as dead. His brother, Colonel Bennett, believes him to be dead. Witness picked up Bennett's cigarette-case on the Peninsula, soon after the landing and a few weeks ago gave it to Colonel Bennett. Witness saw Bennett a few minutes after the landing, but that is the last he knows about him.
