I saw him killed at messines Hill by a shell which caught him in the body, killing him instantly. I do not know place of burial, but he was taken to the Mortuary, near the corner of Wrelverghin Road. and is sure to have been buried there. I cannot refer to anyone for further details.

"I saw Eutt's grave in the Kandahar cemetery, on the Woolbiggin-Messines Rd., alongside the dressing station. Crosses were being erected over a number of graves, Butt's being amongst the number. It is quite easily found. He was in the first German line, and was about to take shelter with several others, and had just reached the doorway of a dug-out, when a shell exploded near by, killing him instantly."

I knew Butt his name was Oven, he was a married man and had a farm I believe, he was middle aged, and medium height and a good living chap. I was gassed at Yessines, but whilst in Dartford hospital a mate in 3rd Pioneers called Tibby Pratt came and told me that he was alongside of Owen Butt when he was killed as they were going into a dug out on the Messines ridge at a date later than the big attack. Pratt told me this in July 1917. There was only one Butt in the 3rd Pioneers. Pratt knew Butt.well.

Informant states that on 2.7.17 the Battalion was doing pioneering work such as digging in, after an engagement near Varneton France. At about 4 a.m. Butt was going into a German dug-out when a shell burst am hit the dug out killing Butt immediately. At the time informant was about 300 yards away.

I knew Butt personally. He and I and a stretcher bearer were on a working party near Messines building a road from Cutty dump to the first line of trenches. We had just left off work at about day-break when a shell came over and got us all. He died instantly, the stretcher bearer died next day and I was badly wounded. He was married and a very good fellow. He had been with us since March. I should like to see his people.
