I was about 200 yards away when wounded by a shell which blew both legs off and through head he was taken to dressing station where he died. We were outside of Meteren about 2.00 p.m. holding outpost. I saw his grave outside Bôûir marked with cross. Enlisted Western Australia, 1916 as Sergeant. Short thick set about 23. Medium build, nicknamed "Caddy".

On the Meteren Sector, He was an outpost and was killed by a whizz bang instantly about 11 p.m. He was buried at alongside a road near Meteren. It is a mile to the west of Meteren. I saw the grave with cross - name number etc.

"Killed 22-4-18"

He was in D.Coy., and was a L/Cpl. I saw him wounded at Meteren, when he was hit by pieces of a shell on the legs and head, both his legs being blown off. He was unconscious and was taken to dressing station near by, and died soon after. He was in charge of a listening post at the time - nighttime. I knew him well and he came from Maylands, W.Australia. I saw his grave next the aid post on the field. The grave was marked by a Cross having full details marked thereon.

He had both legs blown off and he died later. I saw his body being carried out. He is buried at the O.P. just outside Meteren on the Fletre side.
