

I ren from the same shell which killed Berthon. His face was unrecognizable from the explosion. He was taken to an American Dressing Station and I heard he died. It was at Busigny about the middle of October. He came in a late draft, and was very quiet. I heard he could read German but I never spoke to him. I was an eye-witness \_ Ground was held. He was short. There was no other man of the same name in the Bn. or Co.

Whilst getting Bty. Wegon Lines into position at Busigny he was severely wounded in abdomen by shell fire.

Casualty occurred on 12/10/18. I was present at the time, and saw him despatched in a critical condition (and unconscious) to American Dressing Station at Busigny on even ing of same date.

O'Donahue, who stated that on October 13th last, they were at Busigny, and he was close to Gunner Berthon, when he was badly wounded by a shell. He was carried to the American Dressing Station, where he died. Gunner O'Donohue added that Onr. Berthon had joined the battalion from a recent draft, and was a very quiet man. We will advise you should we obtain ant further particulars.
