5 July 15th. 1918.

We were at Fromelles and there was a heavy bombardment which started at about 8 p.m. and lasted for about 2 hours. Norman Bryant was killed by a shell during the bombardment. I believe that he was in a dug-out at the time. I know that he was taken out and buried in the cemetery at Fromelles.
