He was with a party of Pioneers on 9th Nov. at Flers. They were changing over at night. A shell came over and lobbed between Bird and Pte. Arthur Levy. Neither of them were seen again. They must have been blown absolutely to pieces. Pte. Jas. Humphries, Bn. Pioneer, was near by at the time and I heard him give the facts. I was a pioneer and discussed the case that night. Sgt. R. Fountain, Pioneer Coy. 18th Bn. could also give details.

Received your letter dated 12/3/17 re Pte. Bird J.H. 18th.Bn. A.I.F., who was killed by shellfire on 9.11.16 at Flers and buried on the Field 9/11/16 and the grave roughly marked, with whether it was registered I cannot say. Pte. Bird was about 5ft. 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " in height of medium build clean shaven and rather ruddy complexion and had a habit of stuttering, further particulars I am sorry I cannot give you.
